From Father: Conforming Our Sorrows Into His Joy

hat does it mean to believe in the Resurrection of Christ? Personal experiences provide the strongest conviction that something is true. It is more difficult to rely on the testimony of others, as Thomas found himself absent when the risen Christ did appear. In my own faith journey, I can pinpoint a moment not when I could say I saw the risen Christ, but I can attest that I had an *encounter*. Worship is always the gift of *encounter*. After putting forth a spiritual effort to prepare for the coming of Holy Week, the *encounter* takes on a particular intensity like no other time. The early Christians prepared for Pascha with fasting for only one week. Not to discount the prolonged benefits from preparing for forty days, but those who arrive at the eleventh hour are welcome to join those who labored at the first.

Think of fasting not in terms of suffering a loss of the things we love but in terms of discovering the gift of being fed each day by the presence of the Lord. For He said, "I am the bread of life; the one who comes to Me in no wise shall hunger; and the one who believes in Me in no wise shall thirst at any time" (Jn. 6:35). The meaning of our Lord's words can be found in how St. Paul described his life in Christ. "But whatsoever things were gain to me, these I have deemed a loss for the Christ. I also deem all things to be a loss for the excellency of the knowledge of Christ Jesus my Lord, for Whom I suffered the loss of all things, and deem them to be dung, that I might win Christ..." (Phil. 3:7-8). Here, food and all earthly "gains" come to be seen as empty without the knowledge of Christ.

Think of Holy Week, when we remember Christ's Passion, as being given permission to depart from everyday concerns in order to focus our attention on Christ—to spend an entire week immersed in worship and devoted to living obediently to the will of God. This makes possible the quieting of everyday noise and distractions so that our prayer finds its power to bring us into the presence of Christ. Some practical things that can assist in this process are covering the TV, reading scripture, refraining from playing video games, staying off social media, and turning off of mobile devices in the presence of family members. Quieting the noise in our lives renders the soul open to hearing the silent language of God in the heart. It is in this state that we are invited to experience the love of God as He empties Himself through His Passion. Holy Week is an invitation to deepen our experience of the Passion of Christ, the crucifixion before the crucifixion. The mystery of salvation is brought about through the suffering, death, and Resurrection of Christ, the Bridegroom of the Church. Having put forth a Lenten effort to repent and cleanse the stained robes of baptism, we cry out, seeking from Christ the blessing to partake in this life of the Wedding Feast to come. It is in connecting our own sufferings with Christ's which shines the light of joy upon His Resurrection.

St. Paul suffered greatly because of his faith in Christ, yet he never lost faith and even found the ability to rejoice and be thankful for all things, including the evils in his life. He saw all these things as conforming his sufferings as a means to partaking in the sufferings of Christ. He said, "...to come to know Him, and the power of His resurrection, and the partaking of His sufferings, being conformed to His death, if by any means I might attain to the resurrection of the dead" (Phil. 3:10-11). Chrysostom explains: - "He says 'being conformed (συμμορφούμενος) to His death,' that is, 'having partaken.' For, 'even as He suffered under men, in like manner he says, so have I,'. For this reason he said 'being conformed' and again in another place, 'I rejoice in my sufferings on behalf of you, and fill up the things lacking of the afflictions of the Christ in my flesh, on behalf of His body, which is the Church' (Col. 1:24). Therefore, the persecutions and the afflictions and the straits ought not give rise to our clamor, but even the cause for us to be glad; for by means of these we are being conformed to His death....And so he says elsewhere that he is 'always bearing about in the body the dying of the Lord Jesus' (2 Cor. 4:10). This too comes from great faith.... We have become "christs" in this respect. O how great is the dignity of sufferings!" (Hom. 11, P.G. 62:286 [col. 266]).

The unique witness of a Christian is precisely that they carry about in themselves both the crucified and the resurrected Christ. We are called to become co-servants, co-sufferers, co-sharers in the Holy Spirit, co-Sons of God, co-workers of the will of God and co-partakers of His divine nature. Holy Week is the ultimate gift which produces *great faith* capable of transforming our sufferings and persecutions into an *encounter* with the living God.
