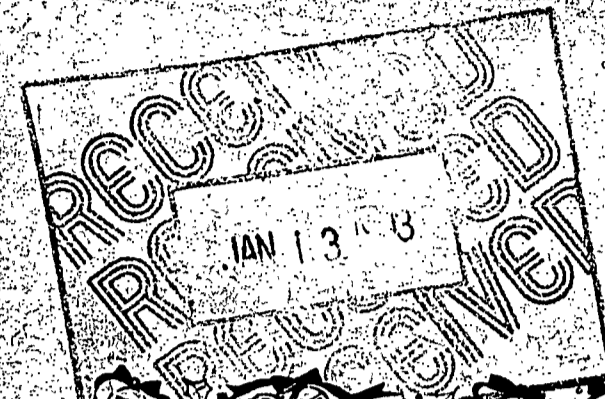

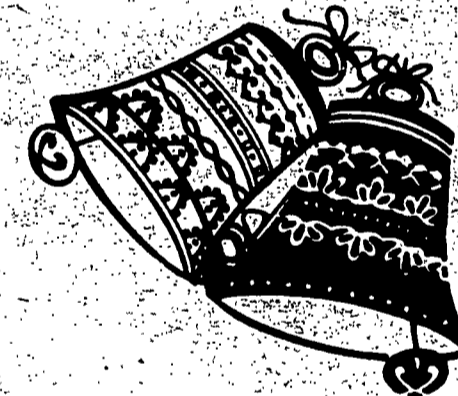

### Blase sets meeting with Suburban mayors on water suit

Niles Mayor Nicholas Blase has set a meeting for Wednesday, Jan. 14 with 7 other mayors of

local communities who are on the Chicago Water Suit Committee with Blase.

The suit which was instituted 3 years ago by 47 suburbs began after Chicago raised suburban water rates by 21 per cent. The inter-suburban legal action was spearheaded by Blase requesting reduction of \$10 million in the rate for water from Chicago.

The scheduled meeting for Jan. 14 was called after the City of Chicago adopted a new water rate schedule increasing water rates by 53 per cent going in effect approximately May 1, 1981. The attorneys handling the suit have indicated that legal action cannot take legal action until the City adopts an ordinance effectively raising the water rate.

### Morton Grove offers low interest mortgages

Low interest mortgage loans are presently available to Morton Grove homeowners as a result of participation by the Village of Morton Grove in a federally subsidized low interest loan program. Though current home mortgage loans are running at 15 to 16 per cent, homeowners qualifying for these loans will pay only 11 7/8 per cent interest.

Morton Grove has received \$10,000,000 of federal money which will be used for 140 mortgages, according to Morton Grove business manager Fred Huber. Huber stressed this program is designed to help young couples who are presently unable to buy property in Morton Grove because of high interest rates.

The low interest mortgage loans will be distributed by the First National Bank of Morton Grove and First Federal Savings of Wilmette. Huber said the loans will be given on a first come basis and he expected they would last only a few weeks.

To qualify for a low interest loan, an applicant must have a maximum yearly income of \$50,000. The maximum mortgage issued will be \$100,000 and ten per cent of the loan monies will be allocated for condominium purchases. Huber added that the two

participating banks will distribute the loans and "handle them like any other mortgage."

It was decided to participate in the program for the second year when the Village Board met on Dec. 22. Last year \$13,500,000 was available to homeowners and divided into 200 mortgage loans. Participants in this program last year received mortgage loans at 8.3 per cent. Huber added that this will be the last year Morton Grove will offer these loans as the federal government has discontinued the program.

#### Des Plaines resident to receive degree

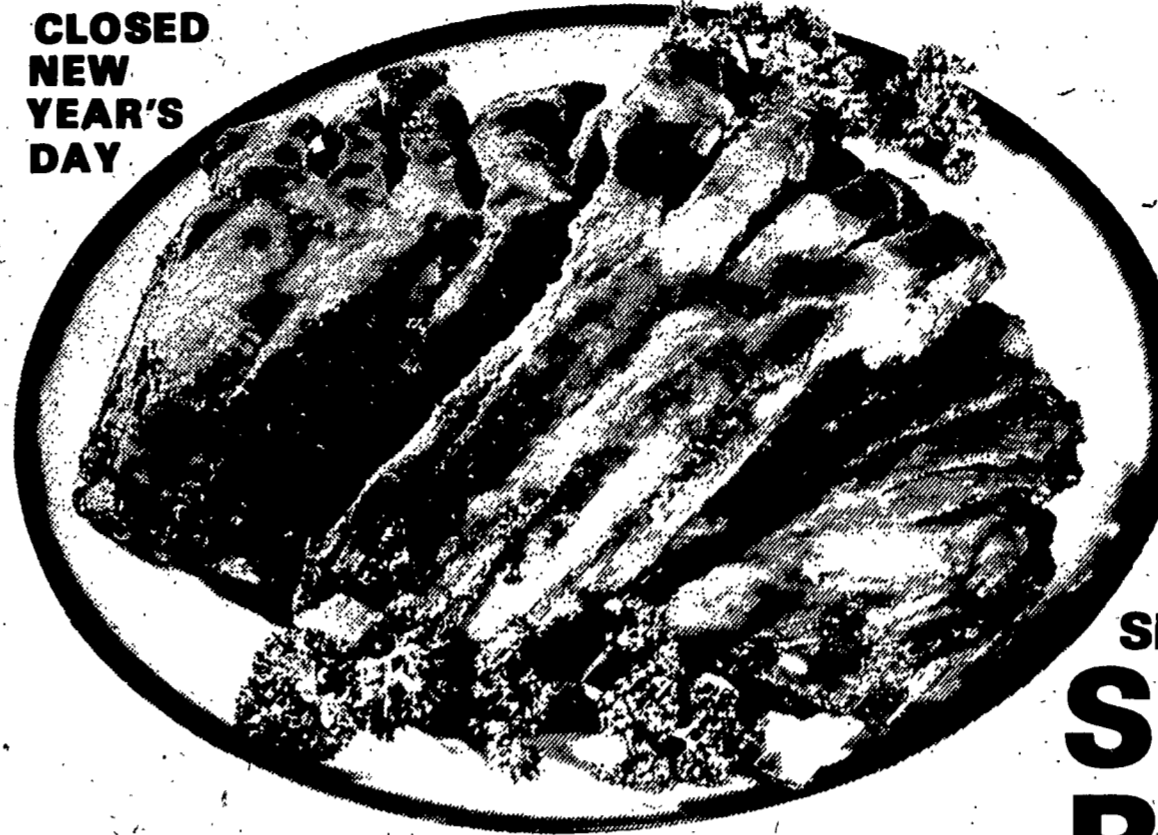

## District 207 acting on asbestos problem in schools

Renovation work at Maine East High School, Park Ridge, to seal off asbestos materials and bring the school into full compliance with U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) standards, is scheduled to be completed during the school semester break, Jan. 16-18, 1981.

Bids for the work will be acted on by the Board of Education of Maine Township High School District 207 at its January 5 meeting, Dr. Richard Short, Superintendent of Schools, reported. He added that work to encapsulate the asbestos materials in Maine Township High School West, Des Plaines, and in Maine Township High School South, Park Ridge, will take place during the summer of 1981.

Dr. Short noted that air samples were monitored in early November, as a precautionary measure, in areas of Maine East, Maine South, and Maine West,

where asbestos materials exist.

He said: "The results of these tests showed that concentration of airborne asbestos fibers per cubic centimeter measured during an eight hour period were less than .01 fibers per cubic centimeter. This level is significantly below the 2.00 fibers per cubic centimeter which is currently the federal Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) established safe threshold level for asbestos."

"The results of these air concentration tests will not alter the plans to complete renovation work at Maine East in January 1981 and at Maine West and Maine South during the summer of 1981," Dr. Short emphasized.

Asbestos was used widely in the 1950's and the 1960's to fireproof and insulate school buildings. Dr. Short commented that immediately upon identification of the problem of asbestos in

schools, District 207 investigated each high school to determine the extent of the problem. He added that the District has been in position to correct the problem for some time but has been required to postpone work because the State of Illinois has not yet provided the authority to do so.

Eager to eliminate any concern over the asbestos problem in its schools, the District decided to conduct the renovation work following U.S. EPA standards, Dr. Short said.

The District has allocated \$257,000 in life safety funds for the renovation work.

Actions taken by the Board of Education and the administration to remedy the asbestos problem have been lauded by the Park Ridge League of Women Voters who addressed the Board of Education at its December meeting.

### Keeping Warm

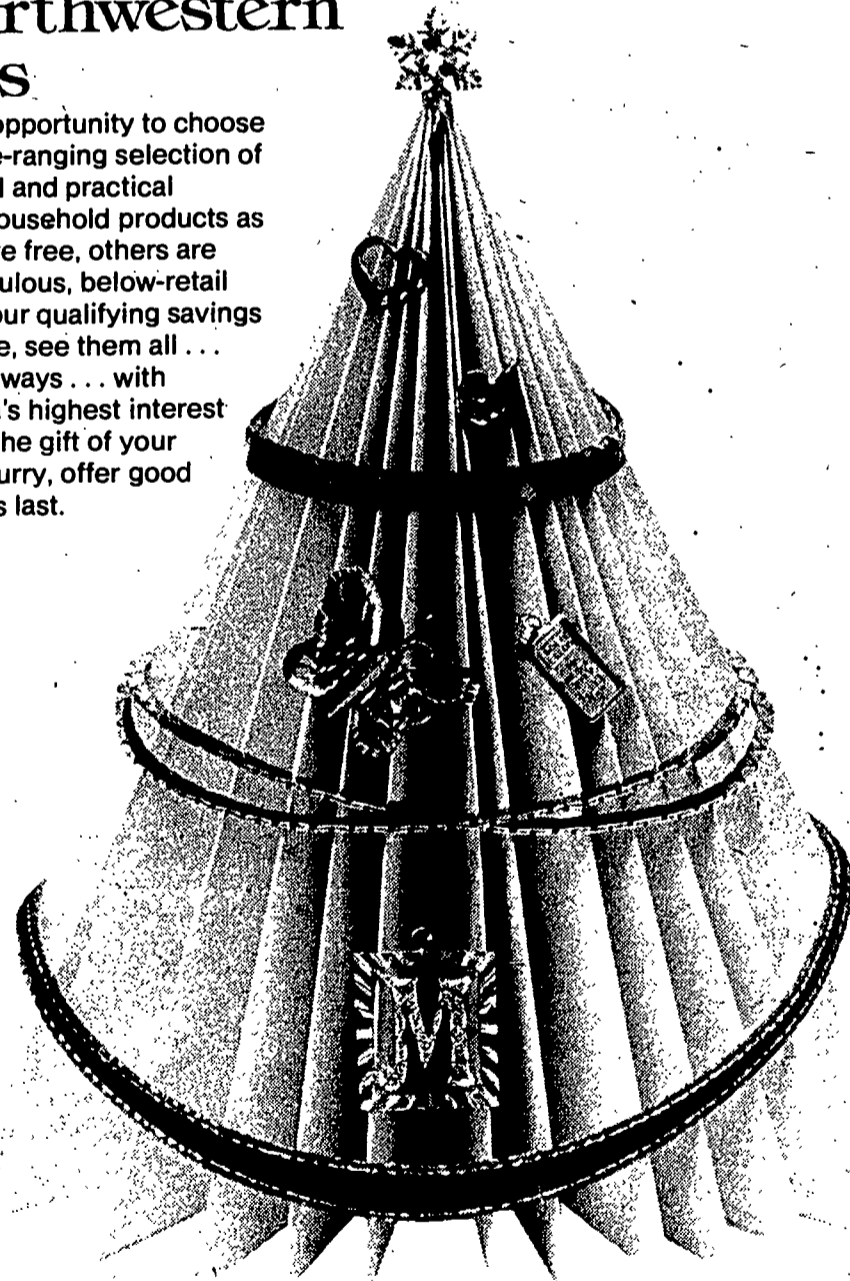
