The purpose is not to expose corruption or to dig out problems: We simply want to provide answers for the questions you have about our community. Because we think that a better-







A colonoscopy is a procedure done by a gastroenterologist. A long, flexible lighted tube -- a colonscope -- is used to view the entire colon for polyps or cancer. A bowel cleansing preparation is required before the procedure. At the front end of the colonoscope is a tiny camera which can send images of the colon to a TV screen. If a polyp is found, it can be removed during the procedure and sent to a lab to determine if it is cancerous. A colonoscopy requires the patient to be sedated. The procedure takes about 30 minutes.

As a substitute for a colonoscopy, a physician may recommend a double-contrast barium enema. The procedure is done by a radiologist in a hospital on * an outpatient basis. After cleansing the colon, a soft, flexible tube is inserted into the rectum and a barium solution goes through the tube into the colon. Special X-rays follow the flow of barium in the colon and outline any polyps, lumps or other abnormalities. A barium enema is a recommmended substitute for colonoscopy and should be repeated every 10 years. "The importance of regular screening simply cannot be over-emphasized." Dr. Grande said. "Early colon cancer often has no symptoms. As the disease progresses, symptoms of colon cancer may include weight loss. Continued on Page 8

Edward Jones: No Age Restrictions on Roth IRA

Not too many years ago, "retirement" meant a true cessation from work. But today, more and more retired people are choosing to consult, work part time or even open a small business. Do you plan to follow one of these paths? If so, then the money you earn will help you maintain the lifestyle you want in retirement. Plus, you'll receive another bonus from your labor -- you get to continue contributing As you may know, Roth IRA earnings grow completely tax free, provided you've had your account for at least five years. That's a big

plus, but there are other benefits. You can make contributions as long as you're working. With a traditional IRA, you cannot make any contributions past age 70-1/2 However, as long as you continue to earn income, you can contribute up to \$2,000 a year to a Roth IRA. And if you have at least \$4,000 in earned income, you can also contribute to your spouse's Roth IRA, even if he or she doesn't have any earned income. You won't be forced to make withdrawals. Once you reach 70-1/2, you have to make minimum withdrawals each year from a tradiional IRA, even if you don't need the money. Plus, you'll have to pay income taxes on your withdrawals. A Roth IRA has no such reuirement; you can keep the money in your account for as long as you choose.

Your family pays no income taxes on inherited Roth IRA funds. You may not outlive the money you have accumulated in your Roth RA. If that happens, you can leave the assets in the account to your heirs, and they won't have to pay income taxes on it. (However, Roth IRA proceeds may result in increased estate taxes.) On the other hand, your heirs would have to pay regular income taxes on any noney they withdraw from an inherited traditional IRA. Of course, you may already be contributing to a traditional IRA. Should you convert this account to a Roth IRA if you plan to contin-

e earning income during your retirement years? There's no one right answer for everyone. But you need to be aware that you will have to pay income taxes on the entire converted amount. That could be a significant impact on your tax situation: you may be better off withdrawing the funds you need each year from your traditional IRA and paying income taxes on the withdrawals. Even if you choose this route, you can still open a new Roth IRA. Before you make any IRA moves, you'll need to consult with your tax advisor. But if the Roth IRA is appropriate for you, you'll find that it can be an excellent investment for your retirement years -- even if you're not really "retired."
