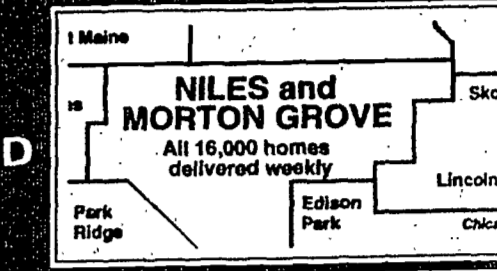

# Mercury testing comes to Niles

The headlines are hitting home these days, as Niles neighborhoods are targeted in Nicor's ongoing mercury investigations.  
Investigative crews began inspecting 184 area homes Monday, Sept. 11, according to Steve Vinezcano, assistant to Niles Village Manager Abe Selman.  
The homes visited have been identified as those where mercury regulators and meters were replaced within the last five years.  
Vinezcano added that his office has not been notified of any conclusive findings at any inspection sites.

### Fort Sheridan House Tour 2000

"A wonderful, unique, once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to see the restoration that is being offered to the public by the Highwood and Highland Park Historical Societies and the Fort Sheridan Historical Preservation Society as they sponsor the Fort Sheridan House Tour 2000 on Sunday, September 24 from 1 - 5 p.m.," points out Lenora Cervac, president of the Highwood Historical Society.

The tour includes ten locations consisting of restored officers family homes, condominium units in the renovated enlisted men's barracks, a newly-constructed Parade Ground home, the Officers Club, the Guard House and the Fort Sheridan military cemetery where Pvt. Michael Keegan, who survived Lt. Col. George A. Custer's battle at Little Big Horn, is buried. That lucky Irishman was left with a detail to guard the supply wagons as 264 of his comrades rode to the battle field

and death.

A detail of the members of the Farragut High School Junior R.O.T.C. in Chicago will be on hand to assist in the tour. Their Military Advisor, Lt. Col. (Ret.) Ned Matulich, is looking forward to returning to his old post to look at the Fort in its new civilian attire.

Roads in north Highland Park. Tickets are \$20 per person/pre sale. \$25 on the day of the event. The fee includes free parking, bus transportation, refreshments, an historic guide and a map.

At present, Congress is considering a five-year extension on the Internet tax moratorium eliminating the collection of local and State collection of sales tax until 2006.

Local retailers have already begun to experience the financial impact created by the inequity affiliated with Internet retail sales.

If this moratorium is passed by Congress and continues for five years, we anticipate a drastic reduction in the ability of local retailers to compete with "e-tailers"

that are not required to collect sales tax.

## The Julia Belle Swain: A Lady of the River

From where I stood on the second deck, it didn't look like a sure thing. We'd have to exit Lock 6 at an acute angle to avoid the barge system awaiting entry. That angle loomed, as the boat inched forward in concert with the thumping paddlewheel. Below us on the first deck the crew watched too, and as our bow passed smoothly in front of the barge, one wag reacted loudly, "Perfect! He's hired."

Which says two things about the atmosphere onboard the *Julia Belle Swain* - high on skill, low on formality. Perhaps that free-spirited atmosphere is why candidates Gore and Lieberman brought their campaign onto a riverboat following the Democratic convention.

The *Julia Belle Swain* is one of the few remaining authentic steam-powered passenger vessels still operating the Mississippi River System. Built in 1971, she's fitted with a steam propulsion system once installed in the ferry, *City of Baton Rouge*, back in 1915. Her reciprocating engine system that drives the 21-foot diameter paddlewheel has logged well over one million miles.

After our 9 a.m. boarding we chose seats in the bow, the better to watch the river, as it comes to meet us. After the captain's wel-

come we settled back to sing-alongs and the feel of the river. Mid-morning snacks (fresh fruit and peanut butter cookies) were made available.

My friend and I already knew how relaxing, yet reviving, two days on board could be. We first traveled the *Julia Belle Swain* in fall of '94, when her homeport was LeClaire, Iowa. Then the bumptious gaming boats closed in, offending her genteel sensibilities and stealing tariffs, so she turned her red wheel to downstream and headed north to LaCrosse, Wisconsin.

Around LaCrosse the riverbanks are irregular with sandy shores and islands. Rental houseboats are common, often pulled up on an island beach, kids and dog wading in the shallows.

On this day, close to 40 passengers gathered in the dining room to lunch on Chicken Kiev with wild rice and steamed vegetable, salad, beverage and dessert. At the back of the room behind a Victorian bar, we saw reddish tints of the paddles slogging downward through opaque, river-splattered windows.

Under routine conditions, the captain will extend an invitation to visit the pilothouse. So we climbed the steep steps up to the pilothouse where we found Captain Carl Henry looking ad-

quately nautical in navy Bermudas, short-sleeved white dress shirt, braid-trimmed visor cap. Add distinguished, with his neatly-platted beard and metal-rimmed eyewear. He extends this hospitality, recognizing that a Mississippi paddle wheeler is not an everyday experience, and that a token visit to its topmost level for a 360-degree view is fundamental to the broadest possible river experience.

As he tends the wheel (only a slight turn gives a quick, sure response, he says), he characterizes his post as pilot of the *Julia Belle Swain*, as "a feather in my cap ... among riverboaters," he confides proudly, "this boat enjoys a following." We watch the river, the banks, the wildlife, the river traffic. We enjoy.

Docking shortly after 2 p.m. in Winona, we boarded a bus that took us to a fine local history museum and, after supper, to an overlook for a river and city lights display.

In the morning the bus took us to a stained glass factory/artisans' workshop - Winona is something of a stained glass center - then to a Polish church where wonderful marbled effects were accomplished with paint and brush. We ended the morning at the store, museum and offices of Watson, Inc., one of the earliest of the home products companies, founded in 1868 as the J.R. Watkins Medical Company.

Watson only sells its wares through representatives.

By noon we're on board and underway, and by 1 p.m. we're lunching on ham steak and au gratin potatoes. Our return passed quickly with some personal reading quickly with some personal reading sandwiched between a crew-member's guitar strumming.

The *Julia Belle Swain* is an off-beat and low-key travel experience that operates from June 1 to mid-October, when they make fall foliage cruises. Other cruises go south to Prairie du Chien. 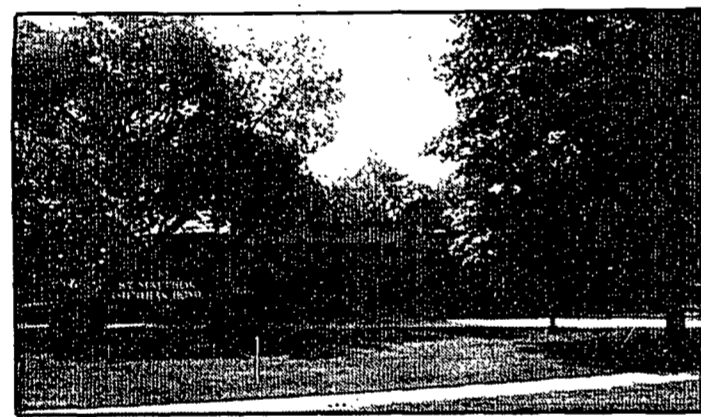

### Diabetics at increased risk for gum disease

Diabetes can weaken your mouth's germ fighting powers - putting the more than 14 million Americans with diabetes at an increased risk for gum disease, warns the Chicago Dental Society.

Studies show that diabetics accumulate increased amounts of plaque (a sticky film of food, saliva and germs), probably because they have less saliva to help remove it. It is this greater accumulation of plaque that is the primary factor that begins the destruction of gums and bone.

"When you have gum disease, the germs in your mouth destroy your gums and the bone around your teeth," said Mary J. Hayes, D.D.S., spokesperson for the Chicago Dental Society. High blood sugar levels can cause gum disease to get worse. "It is very important that diabetics receive regular dental checkups to control plaque buildup. Once an infection sets in, it takes longer for the diabetic patient to heal," said Dr. Hayes.

- Warning Signs of Gum Disease:
- Bleeding gums when you brush or floss.
  - Red, swollen or tender gums.
  - Gums that have pulled away from teeth. Part of the tooth's root may show, or your teeth may look longer.
  - Pus between the teeth and gums.
  - Bad breath.
  - Permanent teeth that are loose or moving away from each other.
  - Changes in the way your teeth fit when you bite.
  - Changes in the fit of partial dentures or bridges.

For the diabetic patient, controlling blood sugar levels and regular dental visits are the best weapons against tooth and gum disease. In addition, the Chicago Dental Society recommends that everyone brush and floss daily, maintain regular dental appointments, and purchase new toothbrushes every three months for optimal oral health care.

The Village of Morton Grove will provide flu and pneumonia shots for residents age 60+. Shots are free if the patient's primary insurance in Medicare Part B. Those enrolled in an HMO or who do not subscribe to Medicare Part B pay \$10 for the flu, and \$20 for the pneumonia shot.

Influenza damages the mucous lining of the lungs, causing susceptibility to pneumonia. This can be dangerous for people with heart disease, diabetes, anemia, lung disease and kidney disease. Influenza shots provide immunity to the most commonly predicted flu strains for the coming winter. Seniors should get a flu shot each year. Pneumonia shots provide life-long immunity to the most common forms of pneumonia. People who have already received this shot do not need another one. Anyone:

- 1) Allergic to chicken, chicken feathers or eggs;
- 2) Allergic to contact lens solution or thimerosal (mercurial antiseptic);
- 3) Allergic to the antibiotic family called amino glycosides (gentamycin, kanamycin or neomycin);
- 4) Who has ever suffered from the illness known as Guillian-Barre Syndrome; or
- 5) Who has cold symptoms the day of their shot; will not be immunized.

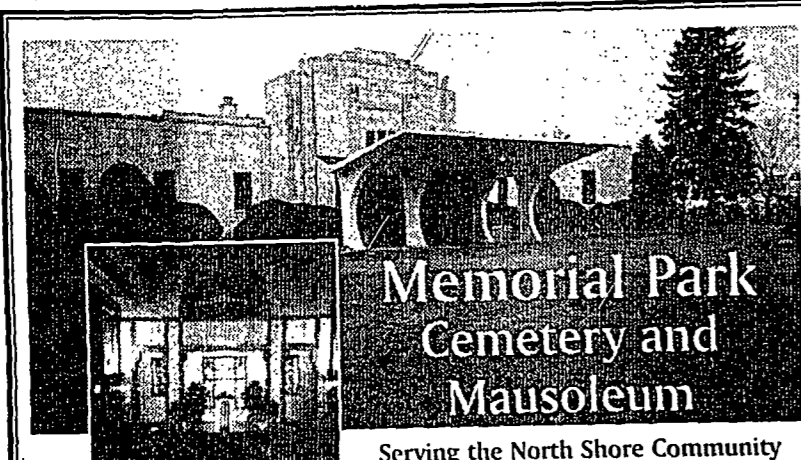

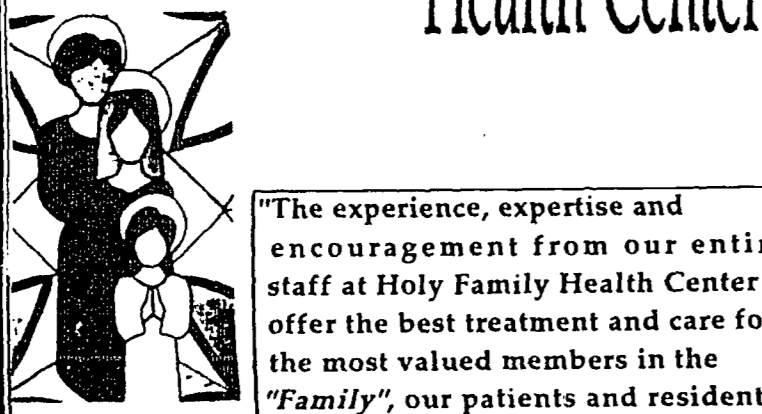

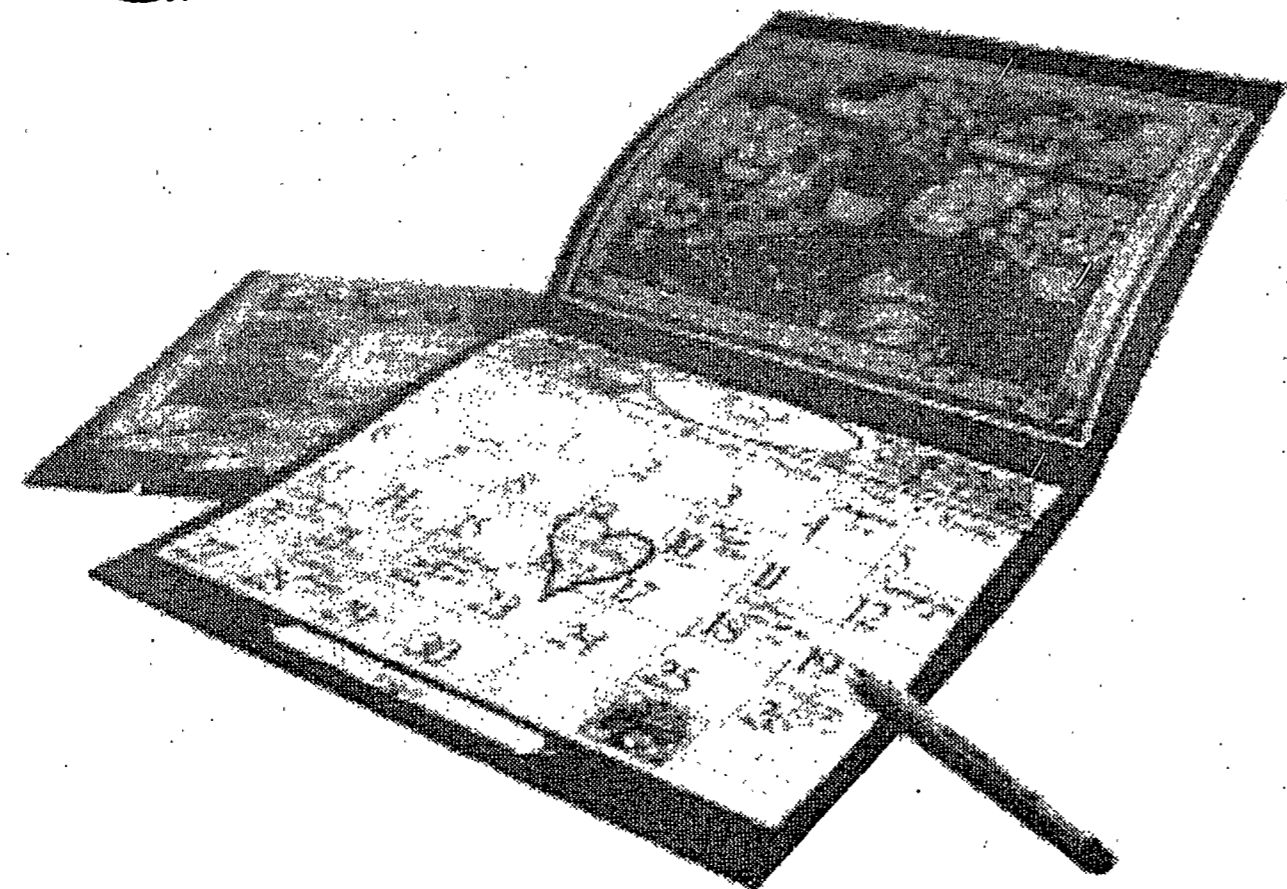

The best-selling Harry Potter series of children's books by J.K. Rowling - the most challenged books of 1999 - is among the 100 most frequently challenged books of the decade, according to the American Library Association (ALA).

The American Library Association's Office for Intellectual Freedom has published its top 100 list as part of the Banned Books Week, September 23-30, which celebrates the freedom to read.

Topping the list is *Scary Stories* (Series) by Alvin Schwartz, accused of "being too scary" and "unsuitable to age group," followed by *Daddy's Roommate* by Michael Willhoite, accused of "promoting homosexuality as a normal lifestyle."

The rest of the 10 most frequently challenged books of the decade were *I Know Why the*

*Caged Bird Sings* by Maya Angelou (3), *The Chocolate War* by Robert Cormier (4), *The Adventures of Huckleberry Finn* by Mark Twain (5), *Of Mice and Men* by John Steinbeck (6), *Forever* by Judy Blume (7), *Bridge to Terabithia* by Katherine Paterson (8), *Heather Has Two Mommies* by Leslea Newman (9) and *The Catcher in the Rye* by J.D. Salinger (10).

Other well-known books on the list include: *The Giver* by Lois Lowry (11), *It's Perfectly Normal* by Robie Harris (13), *Goosebumps* (Series) by R.L. Stine, *The Color Purple* by Alice Walker (17), *Sex* by Madonna (18), *A Wrinkle in Time* by Madeleine L'Engle (23), *To Kill a Mockingbird* by Harper Lee (40), *Harry Potter* (Series) by J.K. Rowling (48), *Brave New World* by Aldous Huxley (54), and *Bless Me, Ultima* by

### Carriage Homes Growing in Popularity

They are not exactly single-family homes and they are not exactly townhomes.

They are a hybrid that combines some of the best features of both -- the comfort and luxury of a detached single-family home and the economics of multifamily construction.

They have different names, like villas and cluster homes. At Lincoln Ridge, Robin Construction Corp.'s master-planned community in north suburban Skokie, they are called Carriage homes.

And Chicago's response to the design gap between single-family homes and townhomes has been very well received, reports Richard Robin, president of the venerable home-building firm.

More than that, they have produced a significant proportion of the new community's sales.

Cynthia Lee, sales manager, reports that approximately 75 percent of Lincoln Ridge is sold out.

Together with two mid-rise condominium buildings, each containing 60 homes, Robin is offering 68 carriage homes designed in the style of single-family homes. They will be contained in 17 structures, each

with two two-bedroom homes on the first floor and two three-bedroom designs on the second floor. Forty-nine of the 68 have already been purchased. The larger, three-bedroom, two-bath plans with a family room contains 2,072 square feet, including a deck.

The large master bedroom suite has a 13-by-18-foot sleeping area and a wardrobe closet in addition to a large walk-in closet. Two other bedrooms -- one of which is likely to pinch-hit as a den -- are slightly larger than 10 by 11 feet and 10.5 by 12 feet. They share a second full bath and are separated from the master suite by the living/dining room, which measures about 21 by 22 feet.

An 8-by-9-foot breakfast room extended from the kitchen, which is 11.75 by 13.5 feet, is awash in natural daylight pouring through glass sliding doors that lead to an 84-square-foot deck.

Sales Manager Lee explains that the first few three-bedroom carriage homes that were built without a family room were more difficult to sell, so it was decided to include them in the remaining units.

The family room, accessible

from both the living/dining room and the breakfast room, increases the size of the residence to nearly 2,100 square feet.

The equally luxurious two-bedroom, two-bath carriage homes weigh in at 1,647 square feet of living area and are base-priced from \$269,900. Prices and availability are subject to change without notice.

Lincoln Ridge is being developed on a nine-acre site that will have a park-like setting approximately two blocks north of Touhy Avenue and just east of the intersection of Skokie Boulevard and Lincoln Avenue.

Carriage home kitchens include a full-size pantry, designer European-style cabinetry and no-wax vinyl flooring. White General Electric appliances include frost-free refrigerators with icemakers, built-in dishwashers, continuous-clean gas ranges and waste disposers.

Each carriage home has a spacious laundry room. Other standards include plush wall-to-wall carpeting in living areas, individually controlled heating and air conditioning, and double-glazed casement windows with screens.

Bathrooms have European-style vanity cabinets, cultured

marble vanity tops, full-width vanity mirrors, theatrical lighting and ceramic tile floors.

Master baths have stepping tubs with separate shower enclosures.

Each carriage home has a private front door entry and a private garage with direct access to the home.

Condominium and carriage home owners will have separate homeowner associations in addition to a master association that

will be responsible for exterior maintenance such as landscaping and lawn care and snow removal, as well as the upkeep of common areas.

## Home Style

### Improve your home videos

Sure you fancy yourself as a filmmaker. But five bucks says when you're not around, friends and family give your home videos two thumbs down.

Don't fret. Summer's a wonderful time to learn the skills you need to create videos folks will want to watch over and over, says Richard A. "Rich" Kuenneke, a television producer who trains young TV news photographers at Southern Illinois University Carbondale.

Jumpstart your videos with "Rich's tips":

- **Get up close and personal.** Don't stand off in the distance and zoom in on the action, Kuenneke says; that just exaggerates camera wobble and makes shaky video. Instead, move closer to your subject and keep the lens on the wide-angle setting.
- **Don't move the camera.** Put it on a tripod. If you don't have one, steady hand-held shots by

bracing yourself against a wall or tree or by placing the camera on a table to get rock-solid shots. Then, let the action unfold in front of the camera. Refrain from following subjects by panning and tilting the lens. Move the lens only when it helps tell a story or shows a relationship between two subjects, Kuenneke says.

- **Capture action and reaction.** "It's difficult to watch the same action for a long period of time," Kuenneke notes. "After you've captured the main subject, turn around and get the reactions of those watching." This is a technique to use when filming ballgames, school plays and the like.
- **Shoot for variety.** "Experiment with a mix of different shots from different angles," Kuenneke says. "Use wide, medium and close-up shots. It makes the video more interesting to watch." To chronicle junior's maiden voyage behind the wheel, for instance, include close-ups of the speedometer, your son's hands gripping the steering wheel, an image of him as seen through the front windshield, and of course, standard footage of him piloting the car.
- **Clean up backgrounds.**

Frame the footage so that phone poles, tree limbs and other objects don't appear to be poking out of somebody's head. How? Move subjects as far away from the wall as possible, rearrange the furniture or try unusual camera angles. Get up high and shoot down. Or get low and shoot up at subjects.

- **Build anticipation.** "To create a video of your daughter learning to water ski, show her slipping into the skis, jumping into the water, getting last-minute instructions, popping up onto her skis, and so on. That helps build anticipation and makes the video more interesting to watch," Kuenneke says.
- **Capture family history:** To chronicle a family reunion, Kuenneke suggests opening with an establishing shot, like a sign, a reunion T-shirt logo or the inscription on your aunt's birthday cake — all of which clarify "where we are and what we're doing."

Joan was a teacher for young children at the children's education center at the Jewish Community Center. She subsequently was instrumental in having the center transferred to the BJBE synagogue on Milwaukee Avenue. When she retired Joan volunteered to read to young children who were first entering Children's Memorial Hospital for immediate care.

On Monday's beautiful September day the funeral attendees did not elicit so much sadness but rather shared a feeling of having been a small part of the life of someone special.

Those who spoke at the funeral spoke of Joan's "joir de vivre," her joy of (with) life.

Rabbi Mark Shapiro remembered her "gorgeous dark eyes." He said her conversation could be deep and she could be fun. She didn't judge - she empathized. She was a teacher who administered with her heart.

She was a feminist who evoked a feminism that was gentle and warm but not of harshness. She had what the Rabbi said was "non-saccharine passion" ... implying a sincerity devoid of pretense.

Joan had advanced degrees and a network of friends. She could spend 6 hours at a Cubs game loaded down with sandwiches from home, and she skied and played golf and tennis and bicycled to work and beat her husband at bowling on their first date 42 years ago.

A second Rabbi said she was dynamic and loving and thoughtful. He said she chose life and was a blessing to so many.

In her last days she said she had no regrets... she had had a good and full life.

In Assistant Rabbi Amy Menis' summation she concluded, "Joan can never die in the hearts of the many who loved her."

the District 68. Morton Grove's Melzer School has converted from Kindergarten only to K-6.

These moves were driven by a growing student population in the district that serves southwest portion of Glenview and parts of Morton Grove, Niles, Des Plaines, Park Ridge and unincorporated Maine Township.

Redistricting resulted in Apollo School, Des Plaines, receiving 80 more students, than expected, according to Principal Nicholas Maldonado.

Neither Niles' Mark Twain School nor Melzer have open classrooms this term, said Principals Piedra and Deaton.

The district also looked at project plans for the addition to Gemini Junior High School. The plans include new gym, music rooms, a multiclass room and food-service facilities on the east side; renovation, classrooms and science labs on the south end, a new entrance and renovated administrative offices on the west. Bids will be taken in September and October, according to Legat Architects.

One problem that needs resolving is storm water retention. "Niles wants us to take into consideration the whole 13 acres," architect Jarold Milligan told the board. "We are trying to (get them to) reduce it to an area closer to the school so you don't have to include 3.4 acres of green space."

The \$5.8 million project would be funded by bond payments. Architectural and engineering fees could reach \$6.5 million.

### Agency serving adults with developmental disabilities opens new home in Park Ridge

For 38-year-old Mark Amidei, a life-long resident of Park Ridge and program participant of Avenues to Independence, there is no place like home.

Amidei, having a developmental disability, was faced with the death of his father in 1998. Because of his disability, he was no longer able to live alone in his boyhood home that he once shared with his father. With the intention of helping Amidei remain in his home, Amidei's brothers contacted Avenues to Independence, a local not-for-profit organization that Mark Amidei was a program participant of that supports adults with developmental disabilities. Together, Avenues and the Amideis worked to resolve the situation, offering Amidei the opportunity to continue living in familiar surroundings, in the community and among the neighbors he knew so well.

As a result of the agency's intervention, today, Mark Amidei shares his home in Park Ridge with two other men from Avenues. Around-the-clock caretakers provided by the agency assist the residents with daily living activities. Mark Amidei's situation is not unfamiliar to the thousands of adults with disabilities living at home with aging parents or family members. As a result of medical advancements, individuals with developmental disabilities such as mental retardation, cerebral palsy or Down Syndrome, who at one time were never expected to live beyond their twenties or thirties, are now entering their fifties and sixties. With this increase in life expectancy arises the issue of who will care for these adults once their parents or family members are no longer able to.

With a handful of alternatives, like Avenues, to residing in state-run facilities, the future for those with developmental disabilities is precarious.

According to Joni Kraft, Avenues Social Services Director, over the next five years 85% of the 250 adults the agency serves will be fifty years of age or older. While more than half of the agency's program participants live outside of Avenues residential programs, housing remains a critical issue, with approximately 100 individuals on the organization's waiting list. The significance of the opening of the home in Park Ridge is that it not only benefited Mark Amidei by allowing him to remain in his home, but provided the opportunity for two other adults to live in a community supported setting.

While the social benefits of living in community residences are vast, financial benefits exist as well. According to Kraft, the annual cost to the state to provide housing for one individual at a state-run facility or institution averages approximately \$80,000. Conversely, for organizations such as Avenues which maintain private residences, the cost to state per individual averages less than half that, approximately \$37,000. Living in community settings allows able individuals the possibility of employment and encourages self-sufficiency and productive participation in the community and its economy. Many of the individuals who participate in Avenues residential and work programs are taxpaying citizens and recipients of employee benefits.

Avenues currently supports 83 adults in its residences throughout several northwestern Chicago communities, including Park Ridge, Niles, Wheeling, Des Plaines and Arlington Heights. In addition to providing housing, Avenues maintains work centers in Wheeling and Des Plaines where training and employment is available, in addition to community job placement services. Avenues continually works to insure program participants develop independent living skills and promotes their involvement in community activities.

For Mark Amidei, being able to remain in his home has provided him with a secure future and the opportunity to continue to be a productive member of society. Most importantly, he is able to live his life as independently as possible.

### Niles Township founding member of new Community Energy Cooperative

Energy curtailment program could yield over \$1 million for local businesses. Last week, 30 Chicago area businesses reduced their electricity use for three hours, and have the potential to earn over \$1 million from Commonwealth Edison (ComEd) through an innovative new incentive program run by the Community Energy Cooperative.

The Community Energy Cooperative (Co-op) started in June, 2000 and is the first program in the country to address problems of peak demand and reliability using consumer-based strategies at a community level, rather than a utility-wide approach, and to work with mid-sized companies. "Reliability is a local issue, especially in geographical areas that have a history of outages," said Kathy Tholin, general manager of the Community Energy Cooperative. "When your electricity goes out, so does your neighbors', and the power outages not only affect the quality of life in a community, but they impact safety, too." Co-op members agree to cut the amount of ComEd's electricity they use during peak times, such as hot summer days, and in turn ComEd compensates the Co-op for the reduction. The Co-op compensates its commercial and industrial members at the rate of \$100 per Kilowatt of reduction per year. This curtailment was the first test for this new pilot program.

One member, Niles Township municipality, has the potential to earn \$80,000 for its participation. "When I first heard their pitch I thought they were trying to sell me the Brooklyn Bridge, but then I listened and realized that this makes a lot of sense," said Abe Selman, Village Manager for Niles Township. "The Co-op sent engineers over to meet with our public service people to identify strategies that we could use to reduce our energy loads, while maintaining our operational capacity. In addition to switching our biggest facilities off the ComEd grid and on to our own back-up generators, they suggested turning off lights, computers, and coffee makers and showed us ways to save money by raising the set points for our air conditioners. The latter are strategies we now employ daily to reduce energy costs."

Niles Township's two wastewater treatment plants, several pumping systems and the administration building all switched to back-up generators for the three hour curtailment period. "We first got the call from the Co-op at 11:45 a.m. and by 1 p.m. the curtailment plan was in effect. The Co-op installed a special meter and phone line so they can take continuous readings remotely and post them on a web site for monitoring. Our total cost is the ongoing cost of a phone line -- \$12 per month," said Selman. "This is a big win for the village."

It's a big win for business too as companies discover how joining the Co-op can improve both long-term cost saving and reliability during an emergency. "One member, a graphics company in Niles, decided that it was in their best interest to reduce their energy usage far beyond the Co-op's recommendation and actually stop production during the curtailment period," said Al Pipkin, Director of the Co-op's Industrial/Commercial program. "They realized that compensation from the Co-op

meant they would 'come out ahead.' The difference between the Community Energy Co-op and traditional ComEd curtailment programs is that the new Co-op is targeting its efforts to specific places where ComEd is seeking to improve electric service quality. The Community Energy Cooperative is a project of the Center for Neighborhood Technology and sponsored by ComEd. To the extent that this initiative is successful, ComEd will have an important new cost-effective tool to provide reliable electric service and CNT will take a significant step in achieving its community development mission. The Co-op works with Illinois residential, industrial and commercial energy customers in the first initiative of its kind designed to help improve reliability by changing behavior and energy-use patterns in communities. This summer it also piloted its first residential program in the Pilsen community of Chicago.
