## Fitness Club may move into vacant Golf Mill Theatre

If given approval by the Zoning Board and the Village of Niles, the long-vacant Golf Mill Theater may become a fitness center.

Joe Whiteside, vice president of Extreme Fitness and Tan, lists the site's possibilities as an NBA-sized basketball court, a five-lane lap pool and a rock climbing wall.

The facility's 40,000 square feet could accommodate more than 100 pieces of cardiovascular equipment plus weights.

approximately 20 tanning beds, a juice bar, pro-shop, day-care center with jungle gym, plus classes in aerobics, martial arts and spinning.

The clubs operate 24 hours per day, seven days per week.

With approvals, Whiteside hopes to begin construction in April, with opening in early fall.

Interior and exterior property improvements would run between \$4.5 and \$5 million.

## Morton Grove urges votes to support tax hike

Morton Grove stands in favor of a March 19 referendum to raise the maximum telephone surcharge from 75 cents to \$1.50.

In fact, the village favors it so strongly that officials proposed a brochure with a cover graphic that reads "Vote Yes," but after discussion, the officials decided to scrap the graphic.

State law allows that public

funds may be used to inform voters on issues, but may not suggest a vote one way or the other.

Since the village will spend about \$1,100 to print the brochures, Corporation Counsel Gabriel Berrafato suggested the wiser course would be for the brochures to merely encourage voting and avoid the words, "Vote Yes."

## MNASR celebrates 30 years of helping disabled

Thirty years ago Maine and Niles Townships recognized a need and combined forces to fill it.

The resulting program for the disabled preceeded the Americans with Disability Act by a decade. Today it is the second-oldest special recreation district in a state with 26 such districts.

Known by its acronym, M-NASR (for Maine-Niles Association of Special Recreation), the organization retains its original seven-district membership from its outset: Morton Grove, Skokie, Lincolnwood, Park Ridge, Des Plaines, Niles, and the Golf Maine Park District.

M-NASR serves about 1,200 disabled persons who participate in about 3,500 programs

annually. Executive Director, Sue Bear, points out that Illinois is one of the leading states to provide programs for the disabled.

Before 1972 there was little in the way of recreational opportunities for the disabled. The Special Olympics, founded in Chicago in 1968, offered programs but not year around.

Bear has heard from families who left the area and regret they no longer have programs available to their disabled family member.

M-NASR offers programs like bowling, swimming, karate, and after-school care, to children as well as to adults.

Costs for such recreation run higher than standard programs because a higher staff-to-stu-

## Payment part of tax break agreement with village; Full amount to be paid by end of year

# ABT to pay \$2 million to leave Morton Grove

By terms of the tax break agreement ABT received from Morton Grove, the electronics firm will repay \$2 million to the village following their move to Glenview, though not in one payment, as assumed.

ABT has requested that repayments be stretched over the balance of 2002.

Village trustees voted 4-2 to accept ABT's proposal.

Village administrator Larry Arft said that while the original agreement clearly requires repayment, it does not state how repayment should take place.

ABT will pay about \$23,000 in interest under the amended agreement with the village.

The new agreement requires ABT to pay \$200,000 the first of the month following its move and \$200,000 the first of every month thereafter.

If the entire amount is not repaid by the end of the year,

ABT is required to pay any balance in one lump sum.

The village also imposed 3 percent carrying charges.

Two trustees, Joe Weiss and Terry Liston, voted against expanding the repayment period.

Even though ABT will pay interest, Liston noted, the village is not gaining anything because interest would have

been earned on the entire deposited amount.

The original agreement granted the tax break on the condition that the electronics giant remain in the village at least four years after final tax break payment.

ABT will move to Glenview when construction at its new facility is complete.

## Five arrested for damaging park

Five men were arrested Monday after three vehicles were reported joy-riding across the lawn of Park Ridge's Woodland Park, at 1200 N. Western Avenue.

Park Ridge Deputy Police Chief Tom Swoboda named the three drivers arrested as Marko Letica, 22, of North Western Avenue in Niles; Erik Grider, 21, of Rowe Avenue in Park Ridge; and Michael Katradis,

22, of Heritage Drive in Mount Prospect. Each is charged with one felony count of criminal damage to property and one misdemeanor count of obstructing a police officer.

Police also charged Scott Grider, 22, also of Park Ridge, and Timothy Bush, 22, of North Parkwood Avenue in Park Ridge with one count each of obstructing a police officer.

## Illinois to offer prescription drug assistance to seniors

The state of Illinois will get in on the ground floor with a federal program to help seniors pay the high cost of prescription drugs.

Those seniors who qualify for the state's Circuit Breaker Program will benefit when Illinois conducts the country-wide pilot program of a Medicare reform package announced last month.

Beginning June 1, \$100 million in Medicaid funds will be available to cover prescription drug purchases for the estimated 368,000 Illinois seniors considered eligible for the state's Circuit Breaker program.

Illinois will benefit because last year its legislators expanded funding for the Circuit Breaker Program by including drugs to treat osteoporosis and raising allowable income.

The expansion of that program provided a funding base that fits the federal program, says Donna Ginther, AARP's legislative director based in Springfield.

The present Circuit Breaker programs provides Illinois seniors, 65 and older, with prescription aid up to annual income levels of \$21,218, or, in the case of couples, \$28,740.

The new pilot program, called SenioRx Care, has lower income requirements but broader coverage. Single seniors with annual incomes up to \$17,200, or couples up to \$23,300, will qualify for the new program's coverage.

SenioRx Care will subsidize the costs of antibiotics, antihistamines, and antidepressants, as well as treatments for gastrointestinal ailments, diabetic testing supplies, hypodermic syringes, ostomy supplies and some over-the-counter medications. Cholesterol treatments may also qualify for financial assistance.

Participants in SenioRx Care will incur a co-pay of about \$3 per prescription, up to a total of \$1,750. Beyond that, the program pays about 80 percent.



**Is ecstasy the answer for many problems of many teenagers?**

When people are on this drug, they have two different kind of personalities, one with the ecstasy and the other with their normal life.

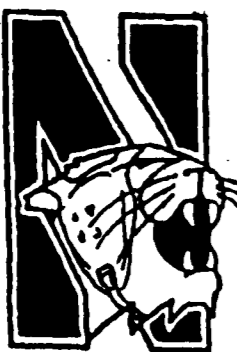

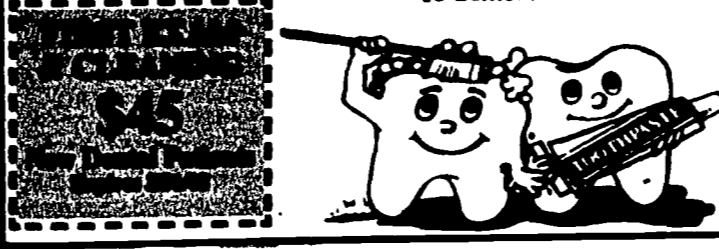

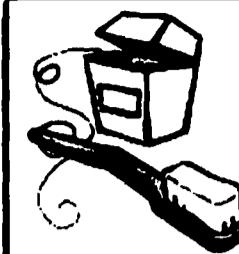

### If You Really Love Me, Don't Leave Me Anything!

This sounds like an odd statement, but it may be very accurate. Leaving assets directly to children or other beneficiaries may cause them problems which could be easily avoided or reduced by leaving them the assets in trust rather than outright. Even if the child is a very capable adult, it is often better to leave the assets in trust. The child can receive the assets in trust and could be trustee of that trust. As trustee, the child could invest the assets as desired, could purchase a home with trust assets and live in it, and could even start a small business. All of this can be done while leaving the assets in the trust. Further, as trustee, the child could make distributions needed for his or her health, education, maintenance and support, or that of his or her own children. Finally, the child can be given a power to determine who should get any remaining assets at his or her own death.

Clearly, the child/trustee can be given a great deal of flexibility while still keeping the assets in trust. The child is not giving up much, but what is he or she gaining by having the assets left in trust?

and wants to convert a traditional IRA to a Roth IRA. The child cannot do so if his or her taxable income is over \$100,000. If the property to be left to the child earns \$10,000 a year, it would disqualify the Roth IRA conversion unless it is left in trust. If left in trust, the income can be taxed to the trust and not appear on the individual return.

Of course, if the child is a minor or does not have financial acumen, a trust can be a good way to give them the benefit of the assets while giving decision-making authority to someone more able. But, in order to gain the tax and asset protection advantages of a trust, it is often better to leave assets in trust even for bright, responsible beneficiaries.

A qualified estate planning attorney can help you determine the best way pass on your wealth to

ensure you protect your children and not lose hard-earned assets to your children's creditors, ex-spouses, or the IRS.

**Estate Tax**  
If the trust is drafted properly, the assets in the trust and any growth on those assets will not be included in the child's estate at his or her death. In other words, the assets will not be subject to estate tax at that point.

**Divorce**  
The assets in the trust and the earnings on those assets will not be considered marital property or community property and will not be subject to division by a court in a divorce proceeding.

**Maintenance and Support**  
In some states, assets left to a child in trust may not be subject to claims for maintenance or child support.

**Lawsuits and Bankruptcy**  
The assets in the trust may not be subject to attachment by the creditors of the child. If the child is a physician and a jury awards millions of dollars in a malpractice claim, the assets in his or her trust may be shielded from that judgment creditor. Note that the degree of creditor protection will vary from state to state and may be enhanced by having an independent trustee or making other changes.

**Income Tax**  
Assets in the trust may generate taxable income, just as they would if they were left outright to the child. Income earned by the assets in the trust will be taxed to the trust unless there are distributions to the child that carry out the income tax attributes. This gives the child/trustee flexibility to determine if taxation to the trust or to the child would be more advantageous. For example, let's say the child had \$95,000 of income

## How Will Your Assets Pass Upon Your Death? Get to Know Your C.O.P.

Have you ever wondered what happens to a person's assets when they pass away? Just about everyone knows about a Will, and the fact that it includes instructions on how to dispose of a decedent's assets upon his or her death. But did you know there are other ways of transferring assets to your loved ones upon your death? You can easily remember three methods by recognizing the acronym C.O.P. - Contract, Operation of Law, and Probate.

**"C" = Contract**  
The first method of transfer-

ring assets upon the owner's death is through the use of various contracts. This is an arrangement to have money and assets transferred upon the asset owner's death to the people previously designated by the asset owner. This form of transferring assets is very common, and includes the following arrangements:

- (1) Trusts;
- (2) Life Insurance Policies;
- (3) Individual Retirement Accounts;
- (4) Partnerships;
- (5) Buy-Sell Agreements.

One benefit to using contractual arrangements for transferring assets is that the right of the beneficiary to receive the assets in question exists at the moment of the owner's death. When executed properly, (barring any extraordinary complications) the transfer can occur rapidly with minimal effort on the part of the beneficiaries. Additionally, the use of a contractual arrangement, such as a Trust, allows you the peace of mind of knowing that, regardless of an incapacitating illness later in the owner's life, his

or her wishes will be followed upon the owner's death.

The key to using contracts to swiftly transfer assets upon the owner's death is to plan far enough in advance to fully reap its benefits. This is especially true of contractual arrangements such as Life Insurance Policies and Annuities, which can become financially infeasible, or even completely unattainable, the older the applicant becomes. Additionally, certain types of contractual arrangements come under close scrutiny if they occur near to the

asset owner's death.

**"O" - Operation of Law**  
A second method of transferring assets upon the asset owner's death is by operation of law. Generally, this technique is applicable to situations where the asset owner holds title to an asset with another person. Forms of holding assets include:

- (1) Joint Tenancy with Rights of Survivorship
- (2) Tenancy by the Entirety
- (3) Community Property with Rights of Survivorship
- (4) Life Estates

The "survivorship" aspect of this type of asset ownership transfers full ownership immediately upon the co-owner's (or life tenant's) death to the remaining owner(s) (or remainder interest holder).

This technique is different from the contract method of asset transfer, as the beneficiary under a contract generally does not have an ownership interest in the asset in question until the owner's death. Conversely, under a transfer by operation of law, the recipient becomes a co-owner of the asset upon taking title to the assets.

**"P" - Probate**  
A third way in which assets are transferred upon the asset owner's death is through Probate. This is the process through which title is changed from the decedent's name into the new owner's name. Probate, (depending upon the state in which the asset owner resides and where property is located) can be an expensive and time-consuming process. Additionally, probate is a public court proceeding, thereby allowing anyone to know your personal details and financial holdings.

Probate is mandated if you die without a Will. The court must determine who is to receive your assets as prescribed by state law. However, what many people do not realize is that Probate is also required if you die with a Will. "Probate" means "to prove a Will." Nevertheless, if you have disposed of your assets through an alternate means of transfer as discussed above, ("Contract" and "Operation of Law"), the process can be expedited in many states.

**The Decision is Yours**

The bottom line is that you do have a choice - you can dictate how your assets are transferred upon your death. Knowing this fact gives you an advantage over many people, but you must use that knowledge to benefit yourself and your family. Consult with a qualified attorney specializing in estate planning to discuss which methods are appropriate for your particular circumstances.

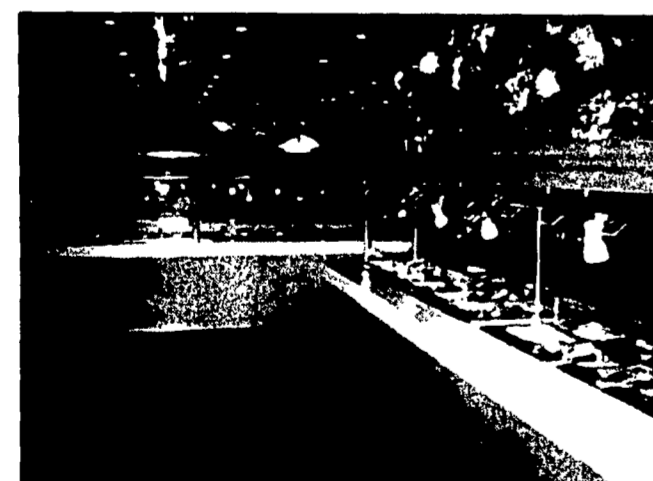

So the brochures will be printed without a "Vote Yes" in large type on the cover.  
Police and Fire Department chiefs, also feeling strongly about supporting 911, will distribute buttons encouraging a "yes" vote; however, each chief will pay for the buttons "privately," so the message won't be illegal.  
If Morton Grove's telephone surcharge is raised, it will be the first increase since 1994. Morton Grove would raise the surcharge to \$1.00 at this time, in line with the other members.  
Morton Grove wants to raise the maximum so it will be positioned the same as other member-partners when it joins Park Ridge, Niles and Des Plaines in a joint-911 dispatching center next year. Those communities have a maximum surcharge of \$1.00.
