MR. BALLEW A NATIVE OF INMAN, SOUTH CAROLINA ATTENDED INMAN ELEMENTARY AND HIGH SCHOOLS. IN THE ARYXXX ARMY SPECIALIZED TRAINING RESERVE PROGRAM HE ATTENDED THE ALABAMA POLYTECHNIC INSTITUTE IN AUBURN, ALABAMA FROM JULY 1944 TO MARCH 1945. HE RECEIVED HIS A.B. DEGREE FROM WOFFORD COLLEGE IN SPARTANBURG, SOUTH CAROLINA. HIS GRADUATE WORK WAS DONE AT SOUTHERN BAPTIST THEOLOGICAL SEMINARY WHERE HE RECEIVED THE BACHELOR OF DIVINITY IN RELIGIOUS EDUCATION DEGREE.

MR. BALLEW ACCEPTED CHRIST AND JOINED THE INMAN MILLS BAPTIST CHURCH INMAN, SOUTH CAROLINA, AT THE AGE OF ELEVEN. DURING THE SENIOR YEAR IN COLLEGE HE WAS CHOIR DIRECTOR AND YOUTH DIRECTOR OF THE OAK GROVE BAPTIST CHURCH IN SPARTANBURG, SOUTH CAROLINA. HE WAS EDUCATIONAL DIRECTOR DURING THE SUMMER ON 1949 AT THE WEST SIDE BAPTIST CHURCH IN GREENWOOD, SOUTH CAROLINA.

WASHINGTON (BP)--TWENTY-ONE SOUTHERN BAPTIST LEADERS HAVE BEEN NOMINATED TO PARTICIPATE IN THE NATIONAL STUDY CONFERENCE ON CHURCH AND STATE AT COLUMBUS, OHIO, FEB. RXX -4-7/XXXX FEB. 4-7, ACCORDING TO ANNOUNCEMENT BY C. EMANUEL CARLSON, EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE BAPTIST JOINT COMMITTEE ON PUBLIC AFFAIRS HERE.

THE STUDY CONFERENCE IS UNDER THE SPONSORSHIP OF THE NATIONAL COUNCIL OF THE CHURCHES OF CHRIST IN THE U. S. A. AND UNDER THE DIRECTION OF DEAN M. KELLEY, EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE DEPARTMENT OF RELIGIOUS LIBERTY OF THE NATIONAL COUNCIL.

INVITATIONS TO PARTICIPATE IN THE STUDY CONFERENCE WERE SENT TO MEMER XXX MEMBER COMMUNIONS OF THE NATIONAL COUNCIL OF CHURCHES AND TO NON-MENMXX NON-MEMBER ELIGIBLE COMMUNIONS. THE INVITATION TO THE SOUTHERN BAPTIST CONVENTION, WHICH IS NOT A MEMBER OF THE NATIONAL COUNCIL, WAS SENT TO THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE IN NASHVILLE, TENN. THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE REFERRED THE REQUEST TO THE BAPTIST JOINT COMMITTEE ON PUBLIC AFFAIRS FOR ACTION.

THE AMERICAN BAPTIST CONVENTION, THE NATIONAL BAPTIST CONVENTION OF AMERICANXX AMERICA AND THE NATIONAL BAPTIST CONVENTION, U. A.// U. S. A, INC. ARE MEMBERS OF THE NATIONAL COUNCIL OF CHURCHES.

IN ITS CALL FOR A NATIONAL STUDY CONFERENCE ON CHURCH AND STATE THE NATIONAL COUNCIL OF CHURCHES MADE IT CLEAR THAT THE CONFERENCE "WILL SPEAK FOR ITSELF AND NOT FOR THE NATIONAL COUNCIL OR ANY OF ITS MEMBER COMMUNIONS."

CARLSON WROTE TO SOUTHERN BAPTIST STATE CONVENTION EXECUTIVES, AGENCY AND INSTITUTION HEADS FOR NOMINATIONS FOR PARTICIPATION IN THE NATIONAL STUDY CONFERENCE. THESE NOMINATIONS WERE SENT TO THE NATIONAL COUNCIL OFFICE WHICH IN TURN ISSUED THE INVITATIONS AND SENT THE STUDY MATERIALS.

CARLSON HAS BEEN ACTIVE IN PREPARATIONS FOR THE NATIONAL CONFERENCE. HE SERVED ON THE PLANNING COMMISSION AND WROTE ONE OF THE SIX PREPARATOR PAPERS.

THE CONFERENCE WILL PULL TOGETHER 450 DELEGATES AND 50 OBSERVERS AND CONSULTANTS REPRESENTING THE MAIN STREAM OF AMERICA'S RELIGIOUS LIFE, ACCORDING TO ANNOUNCEMENT FROM KELLEY'S OFFICE. PARTICIPANTS WILL BE FROM 17 PROTESTANT, ANGLICAN AND ORTHODOX MEMBER COMMUNIONS OF THE NATIONAL COUNCIL AND NINE PROTESTANT BODIES NOT IN THE COUNCIL.

KELLEY SAID THAT "THE RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN CHURCH AND STATE IS BEING REDEFINED IN THIS DECADE." THE NATIONAL CONFERENCE, HE CONTINUED, "IS AN EFFORT ON THE PART OF THE CHURCHES TO DECIDE THEIR STAND AND THE DIRECTION WHICH THEY THINK CHURCH-STATE RELATIONS SHOULD FOLLOWS."

CONFEREES WILL COME TO GRIPS WITH SUCH MATTERS AS THE TAX EXEMPT STATUS OF CHURCHES, AID TO CHURCH-RELATED INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION AND WELFARE, AND ASPECTS OF THE CIVIL RIGHTS STRUGGLE.

I IT IS NOT KNOWN AT THE TIME OF THIS WRITING HOW MANY OF THE 21 SOUTHERN BAPTIST LEADERS WIL FIND IT POSSIBLE TO ACCEPT THE INVITATION TO THE CHURCH-STATE CONFERENCE.

J. C. BALLEW WAS ONE OF THE MOST MAGNETIC CHRISTIANS I HAVE EVER KNOWN. HIS POISE AND PERSONALITY ALWAYS REMINDED YOU OF JESUS. HIS PATTERN OF LIFE REFLECTED THE DEEP CONSECRATXXX CONSECRATION OF HIS HEART. HIS LIMITLESS COURAGE DREW ADMIRATION FROM ALL WHO CAME IN CONTACT WITH HIM.

THE "BAPTIST STUDENT" IS PUBLISHED NINE MONTHS OF THE SCHOOL YEAR BY THE BAPTIST SUNDAY SCHOOL BOARD, NASHVILLE.

IN "I KNEW THEM WHEN" DR. PRESTON RECALLS HOW STUDENTS WITH HIGH IDEALS, CONVICTIONS AND A PURPOSE IN LIFE HAVE GONE ON TO BECOME GREAT HUMANITARIANS. JOHN GORDON NIEN, A GRADUATE OF GEORGETOWN (KY.) COLLEGE IS NOW ASSISTANT AMBASSADOR IN BRAZIL. HIS BROTHER, DAVID, A VANDERBILT GRADUATE, IS PRESIDENT OF THE NORTH BRAZIL BAPTIST SEMINARY IN RECIFE, BRAZIL AND UNTIL RECENTLY PRESIDENT OF THE BRAZILIAN NATIONAL BAPTIST CONVENTION.

DR. PRESTON ALSO CHOOSES FROM AMONG THE STUDENT OF FORMER YEARS PAUL GEREN, A BAYLOR UNIVERSITY GRADUATE, WHO IS NOW A HIGH RANKING STATE DEPARTMENT OFFICIAL IN AFRICA. MISS JOSEPHINE SCAGGS, A UNIVERSITY OF ARKASAS GRADUATE AND MISSIONARY TO AFRICA, RECEIVED FROM QUEEN ELIZABETH ON FEB. 7, 1956, THE TITLE "MEMBER OF THE BRITISH EMPIRE," THE HIGHEST HONOR POSSIBLE FOR ANYONE WHO IS NOT A SUBJECT OF THE BRITISH EMPIRE.

HE ALSO RECALLS A FORMER CAMPUS LEADER AT THE UNIVERSITY OF ALABAMA, ROBERT A. HINGSON, WHO IS WITH THE WESTERN RESERVE UNIVERSITY IN CLEVELAND, OHI, AS HEAD OF THE DEPARTMENT OF ANESTHESIA AND A LEADING DOCTOR IN PREVENTIVE MEDICINE.

DR. PRESTON WILL BE 68 ON HIS LAST DAY AT WORK, FEB. 28. AFTER RETIREMENT HE WILL BE ENGAGED IN RECRUITING COLLEGE GRADUATES TO GO TO PIONEER AREAS AS TEACHERS AND AS PROFESSIONAL LEADERS IN OTHER CAPACITIES. HE WILL ALSO HAVE COLLEGE CONNECTIONS WHICH WILL BE ANNOUNCED EARLY IN 1964.

ASSEMBLY PERSONNEL FOUGHT THE FIRE WITH HAND EXTINGUISHERS BEFORE THE ARRIVAL OF THE PECOS, N. M. FIRE TRUCK. NO ONE WAS HURT. ONE WORKMAN WAS DOWNSTAIRS IN THE BUILDING AT THE TIME OF THE FIRE. THE EXPLOSION OCCURRED IN AN UPSTAIRS ROOM.

ESTIMATES ARE BEING OBTAINED IMMEDIATELY CONCERNING THE ACTUAL EXTENT OF THE DAMAGE AND THE TIME IT WILL TAKE TO REBUILD THE UNITS. THE LOSS WAS COVERED BY INSURANCE, ACCORDING TO DR. HAROLD E. INGRAHAM, DIRECTOR OF THE SUNDAY SCHOOL BOARD'S SERVICE DIVISION, WHICH HAS SUPERVISION OF THE ASSEMBLIES.

OTHER FUNDS WILL COME FROM THE SALE OF THE PRESENT OFFICE BUILDING IN BALTIMORE. IT'S ANTICIPATED THE CONVENTION WILL HAVE A BUILDING DEBT OF \$250,000, ACCORDING TO ROY D. GRESHAM OF BALTIMORE, MARYLAND EXECUTIVE SECRETARY.

NOW, AT 77, HE HAS RETIRED AGAIN. HE PLANS TO CONTINUE TO MAKE HIS HOME IN NEARBY RALEIGH, WHERE HE AND MRS. WEATHERSPOON (THE FORMER EMILY K. LANSDALL, ONCE PRESIDENT OF CARVER SCHOOL OF MISSIONS AND SOCIAL WORK IN LOUISVILLE) HAVE LIVED SINCE THEIR MARRIAGE IN 1962.

WEATHERSPOON SAID HE LOOKED FORWARD TO FREEDOM FROM THE PRESSURE AND HURRY OF CLASS BELLS, AND WANTS TO WRITE AND PREACH MORE.

BORN IN NEARBY DURHAM COUNTY, N. C., IN 1886, WEATHERSPOON WAS ORDAINED TO THE GOSPEL MINISTRY WHILE A STUDENT IN WAKE FOREST COLLEGE, (BAPTIST), WHICH THEN OCCUPIED THE CAMPUS NOW BELONGING TO SOUTHEASTERN SEMINARY.

FROM WAKE FOREST COLLEGE HE WENT TO SOUTHERN SEMINARY IN LOUISVILLE AND ACQUIRED THE DOCTOR OF THEOLOGY DEGREE. HE SERVED SEVERAL CHURCHES IN KENTUCKY AND NORTH CAROLINA DURING THIS TIME.

TEXAS BAPTIST PRESIDENT
WARNS OF FEDERAL CONTROL

DALLAS (BP)--THE PRESIDENT OF THE BAPTIST GENERAL CONVENTION OF TEXAS, ABNER V. MCCALL, WARNED THAT IF THE GOVERNMENT CONTROLS RELIGION, "AS IT IS SLOWLY DOING," THEN RELIGION WILL BE DEAD, BUT NOT BURIED."

MCCALL, PRESIDENT OF BAYLOR UNIVERSITY, IN WACO, TEX., MADE THE STATEMENTS IN A SERMON ON RELIGIOUS LIBERTY AT THE NATION'S LARGEST SOUTHERN BAPTIST CHURCH, FIRST BAPTIST CHURCH OF DALLAS.

GOVERNMENT FINANCIAL AID MEANS GOVERNMENT CONTROL, MCCALL SAID, AND GOVERNMENT CONTROL MEANS LESS PERSONAL FREEDOM AND LIBERTY.

MCCALL, PRESIDENT OF THE WORLD'S LARGEST BAPTIST UNIVERSITY, CITED THE COLLEGE AID BILL RECENTLY PASSED BY BOTH HOUSES IN CONGRESS AS "A FURTHER ENCROACHMENT OF GOVERNMENT IN RELIGIOUS LIBERTY."

THE COLLEGE AID BILL, ALREADY SIGNED BY PRESIDENT LYNDON B. JOHNSON, PROVIDES FOR DIRECT GRANTS AND LOANS TO CHURCH-RELATED COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES FOR ACADEMIC FACILITIES.

MCCALL PLEDGED THAT BAYLOR UNIVERSITY WILL NOT SEEK AID THROUGH THE NEVER-ENDING LIST OF GRANTS, LOANS, AND FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE AVAILABLE FROM THE GOVERNMENT.

"IT IS IMPOSSIBLE TO RUN A SCHOOL, HOSPITAL OR ORPHAN'S HOME WITHOUT SOME TYPE OF CONTROL FROM AUSTIN (THE TEXAS STATE CAPITAL) OR WASHINGTON," HE SAID.

MCCALL DECRIED THE TENDENCY FOR GOVERNMENT TO TAKE OVER WELFARE WORK DONE BY THE CHURCHES IN THE PAST. "ABOUT 90 PER CENT OF THE WORK DONE BY THE CHURCH IN EDUCATION, HOSPITALS, ORPHANAGES AND OTHER NON-PROFIT FIELDS HAS BEEN UP TO THE GOVERNMENT IN RECENT YEARS," HE SAID.

CHURCHES DID NOT RUSH TO THE AID OF FLOOD VICTIMS IN THE RECENT TRAGEDY IN LOS ANGELES, CALIF., MCCALL SAID. "INSTEAD TOWN OFFICIALS ISSUED AN APPEAL TO WASHINGTON TO DECLARE IT A DISASTER AREA."

IF THE TREND FOR CHRISTIANS TO TURN OVER THE CHURCH'S WORK OF SOCIAL SERVICE AGENCIES TO THE GOVERNMENT CONTINUES, THE CHURCH WILL BECOME "ONLY A SHELL AND WILL LOSE THE INFLUENCE IT HAS GAINED THROUGH THE AGES," MCCALL SAID.

AS THE PEOPLE DEPEND LESS ON THE CHURCH AND MORE ON THE GOVERNMENT, THE IMPORTANCE OF THE CHURCH WILL BE STEADILY DIMINISHED.

WASHINGTON (BP)--A THIRD MAJOR EDUCATION PROGRAM GOT CONGRESSIONAL APPROVAL IN THE SENATE PASSAGE OF THE VOCATIONAL EDUCATION BILL. THE PRESIDENT'S SIGNATURE WILL MAKE THE BILL LAW.

THE MEASURE, A COMPROMISE BETWEEN DIFFERING SENATE AND HOUSE VERSIONS PASSED EARLIER THIS YEAR, WON SENATE APPROVAL IN A VOTE OF 82-4. THE HOUSE HAD ALREADY PASSED THE COMPROMISE BILL.

THE CONFERENCE REPORT ON THE BILL WOULD (1) EXPAND THE CURRENT VOCATIONAL EDUCATION PROGRAM BY AN ADDITIONAL \$1.6 BILLION OVER A FOUR-YEAR PERIOD; (2) EXTEND FOR TWO YEARS THE PROGRAM OF AID TO FEDERALLY IMPACTED AREAS BY AUTHORIZING AN ADDITIONAL \$319.6 MILLION; AND (3) EXTEND FOR ONE YEAR THE STUDENT LOAN PROVISION OF THE NATIONAL DEFENSE EDUCATION ACT BY INCREASING THE AMOUNT AVAILABLE IN LOANS AND INCREASING THE AMOUNT AVAILABLE TO STUDENTS IN ANY ONE COLLEGE.

CONGRESS PASSED EARLIER THIS YEAR A MEDICAL SCHOOL AID BILL AND A COLLEGE AID BILL. BOTH OF THESE MAKE FUNDS AVAILABLE TO CHURCH INSTITUTIONS.

SUNG BY SOEUR SOURIRE OF FICHERMONT, BELGIUM.

THIS SONG IN THE ALBUM OF SINGING NUNS RECALLS WITH PRIDE THE
INQUISITION BY WHICH THE DOMINICAN ORDER UNDER THE TWO BULLS OF POPE
GREGORY IX ISSUED APRIL 20, 1233, PERSECUTED THE ALBIGENSIANS AS HERETICS.
WITH CYNICAL AWARENESS OF THE INABILITY OF AMERICANS TO TRANSLATE THE
BELGIAN FRENCH OF THE LYRICS OF THE SONG, DOMINIQUE, THE PUBLISHERS HAVE
GIVEN IN THE ALBUM A TRANSLATION INTO ENGLISH WHICH DOES NOT FOLLOW THE
FRENCH.

IN THE SECOND STANZA, THE ENGLISH TRANSLATION SAYS "DOMINIQUE WAS...
FIGHTING SIN LIKE ANYTHING." A CORRECT TRANSLATION OF THE FRENCH WOULD
READ, "DOMINIQUE... WAS FIGHTING THE ALBIGENSIANS."

THE ALBIGENSIANS ARE DESCRIBED BY THE ENCYCLOPEDIA BRITANNICA AS
"AN ANTI-SACERDOTAL PARTY IN PERMANENT OPPOSITION TO THE ROMAN CHURCH,
AND RAISED A CONTINUED PROTEST AGAINST THE CORRUPTION OF THE CLERGY OF
THEIR TIME." THEY DESIGNATED THEMSELVES AS THE "CATHARI" OR PURITANS.

LITTLE IS KNOWN OF THE PRECISE BELIEFS OF THE ALBIGENSIANS,
EXCEPT THROUGH THE WRITINGS OF THEIR ENEMIES. EVEN SO, THE PURITY OF
THEIR LIVES LIMITED THE CHARGES AGAINST THEM TO "INAPPROPRIATE THEOLOGI-
CAL SPECULATIONS."

WHILE I WOULD CHALLENGE SOME OF THE THEOLOGICAL SPECULATIONS BY
VARIOUS SECTARIAN GROUPS OF THE 12TH AND 13TH CENTURY WHO WERE LABELED
ALBIGENSIANS BY THE ROMAN CHURCH, I MUCH PREFER THEIR CHARACTER PRO-
DUCED BY THEIR CONVICTIONS TO THE CHARACTER OF THEIR ACCUSERS.

INCIDENTALLY, THE ROMAN CHURCH USED THE TERM "ALBIGENSIANS" TO

INDIANAPOLIS (AP)--NOTHING ABOUT THE PHYSICAL SETTING INDICATED ANYTHING HISTORIC WAS TAKING PLACE.

THE SMALL, CONCRETE BLOCK BUILDING HAD ONCE HOUSED A VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT ON THE EXPANDING NORTH SIDE OF SUBURBAN INDIANAPOLIS. THE DATE WAS TWO DAYS BEFORE 1963 CLOSED ITS RECORD, AND THIS MONDAY NIGHT WAS CAUGHT IN 8-BELOW-ZERO TEMPERATURE.

MOST OF THE OTHERS ARE IN THE STATE CONVENTION OF BAPTISTS IN OHIO, WHICH ALSO INCLUDES PARTS OF WESTERN NEW YORK AND WISCONSIN. ONE IS REPORTED IN WISCONSIN AND MINNESOTA AFFILIATED WITH THE BAPTIST GENERAL CONVENTION OF TEXAS.

QUITE OFTEN DURING THE SERVICES, SPEAKERS REFERRED TO THE POSSIBILITY OF HAVING 2,000 CHURCHES IN THE AREA SOON. INDIANA EXPECTS TO DOUBLE ITS CHURCHES BY 1968, AND ILLINOIS WILL EXCEED 900

WISDOM MISSION INVESTMENT
IS CHALLENGED, SAYS CAUTHER

THE MAJOR LESSON TO BE LEARNED FROM THE HISTORY OF THE LAST 25 YEARS OF FOREIGN MISSIONS IS THAT, IN VIEW OF NATIONAL AND INTERNATIONAL CIRCUMSTANCES WHICH CAN GREATLY AFFECT THE WORK BEING DONE IN ANY LAND, THE MOST INVESTMENT OF MISSIONARY RESOURCES IS IN THE CULTIVATION OF NEW TESTAMENT CHURCHES," DR. WALTER S. CAUTHER, EXECUTIVE SECRETARY, SAID IN HIS REPORT TO THE SOUTHERN BAPTIST FOREIGN MISSION BOARD DURING THE REGULAR MONTHLY MEETING IN RICHMOND, VA., JANUARY 9.

THE BOARD TOOK A NUMBER OF ACTIONS WHICH CARRY FORWARD PLANS FOR SPECIAL PROJECTS IN EVANGELISM AND CHURCH GROWTH IN EUROPE AND THE ORIENT. THESE INCLUDE A STEWARDSHIP CAMPAIGN IN SPAIN IN APRIL AND MAY, AN EVANGELISTIC CRUSADE IN PORTUGAL IN OCTOBER, AN EVANGELISTIC CRUSADE IN MALAYSIA IN APRIL, 1965, AND A SUNDAY SCHOOL CRUSADE IN ASIA IN APRIL, 1965. IT IS LIKELY THAT BAPTISTS IN OTHER COUNTRIES OF SOUTHEAST ASIA WILL JOIN TROOPS IN MALAYSIA IN EVANGELISTIC CRUSADES IN THE SPRING OF 1965.

THE FUNDING FOR THE VARIOUS PROJECTS RELATED TO SPECIAL PROJECTS CAME FROM THE BOARD'S COMMITTEES FOR THE ORIENT AND PRXX FOR EUROPE AND THE MIDDLE EAST AND FOLLOWED THE REPORT OF REV. JOSEPH S. UNDERWOOD, CONSULTANT IN EVANGELISM AND CHURCH DEVELOPMENT WHO HAS MADE RECENT TRIPS TO THE AREAS INVOLVED.

THE BOARD APPOINTED ONE MISSIONARY, MRS. JACK E. TOLAR, JR. AND HUSBAND, A MEDICAL DOCTOR, WAS APPOINTED FOR NIGERIA IN AUGUST, 1964, SEVERAL MONTHS BEFORE THEY SET OFF WHILE ATTENDING SOUTHWESTERN BAPTIST THEOLOGICAL SEMINARY, FORT WORTH, TEX. THEY WERE CARRIED LAST MAY. MRS. TOLAR IS THE FORMER BARBARA CORNINGTON, OF HOT SPRINGS, ARK. DR. TOLAR IS A NATIVE OF SAN ANTONIO, TEX.

THE BOARD'S OVERSEAS STAFF NOW TOTALS 1,302 (INCLUDING 25 MISSIONARY ASSOCIATES).

DR. JOHN D. HUGHEY, JR., AT BOARD HEADQUARTERS FOR A ROUND OF CONFERENCES, GAVE HIS FIRST REPORT AS EXECUTIVE SECRETARY FOR EUROPE AND THE MIDDLE EAST. SUMMARIZING THE BACKGROUND AGAINST WHICH HE WILL WORK, HE SAID: "EUROPE AND THE MIDDLE EAST FORM A VERY VARIED AREA. IN IT ARE GERMANS, GREEKS, SWEDEN, SLAVS, JEWS, ARABS, TURKS, IRANIANS, AND OTHER ETHNIC GROUPS. THERE IS A GREAT VARIETY OF LANGUAGES, CULTURES, AND RELIGIONS.

"THE AREA IS VERY STRATEGIC FROM THE STANDPOINT OF RELIGION. IT INCLUDES THE HEART OF THE ROMAN CATHOLIC WORLD, THE HEART OF MODERN ORTHODOXY, THE TRADITIONAL HEART OF PROTESTANTISM, THE HEART OF THE JEWISH WORLD, AND THE HEART OF ISLAM. COMMUNISM, THE GREATEST THREAT TO CHRISTIANITY SINCE THE RISE OF ISLAM, ALSO CENTERS IN THE AREA FOR WHICH I HAVE BEEN GIVEN RESPONSIBILITY."

IN NOTING THAT BAPTISTS HAVE FOUND THE AREA A DIFFICULT ONE IN WHICH TO WORK, DR. HUGHEY CONTINUED: "WE MUST BEAR OUR WITNESS IN EUROPE AND THE MIDDLE EAST. THE REASON FOR THIS IS NOT EVEN IN THE POWER OF STONY GROUND. THERE WILL BE SOME RESPONSE TO THE GOSPEL, FOR IT IS THE POWER OF GOD UNTO SALVATION. FURTHERMORE, PATIENT WITNESSING WITH LITTLE RESPONSE NOW MAY PREPARE THE WAY FOR A FUTURE HARVEST."

DR. HUGHEY WILL MAINTAIN AN OFFICE IN RUSCHLIKON, SWITZERLAND, UNTIL SUMMER, WHEN HE AND HIS FAMILY WILL MOVE TO RICHMOND.

EUROPE AND THE MIDDLE EAST BECAME A SEPARATE AREA OF MISSION ADMINISTRATION LAST YEAR WHEN THE FORMER AREA OF AFRICA, EUROPE, AND THE MIDDLE EAST WAS DIVIDED. DR. G. FERNELL SWINER, WHO CARRIED ADMINISTRATIVE RESPONSIBILITY FOR THE ENTIRE AREA, IS NAMED AS SECRETARY FOR AFRICA.

DR. FRANK S. STANLEY, SECRETARY FOR LATIN AMERICA, REPORTED THAT THE SOUTHERN BAPTIST MISSIONARIES TO THE FRENCH WEST INDIES, REV. AND MRS. WILLIAM S. CAIN, HAVE COMPLETED A PERIOD OF FORMAL LANGUAGE STUDY IN FRANCE. APPOINTED FOR THIS AREA IN OCTOBER, 1961, THE CAINS HAVE COMPLETED A PERIOD OF FORMAL LANGUAGE STUDY IN FRANCE.

DR. STANLEY SAID REPORTS FROM MACHIL INDICATE THAT THE POLITICAL, ECONOMIC, SOCIAL, AND ECONOMIC CRISIS DISRUPTING THE NORMAL PACE OF LIFE THERE HAVE POINTED UP A CORRESPONDING SEARCH FOR SOMETHING STABLE AND TRUE IN WHICH MAN CAN PUT HIS CONFIDENCE.

BAKER J. CAUTHEN, EXECUTIVE SECRETARY, SAID IN HIS REPORT TO THE SOUTHERN BAPTIST FOREIGN MISSION BOARD DURING ITS REGULAR MONTHLY MEETING IN RICHMOND, VA., JANUARY 9.

1 THE BOARD TOOK A NUMBER OF ACTIONS WHICH CARRY FORWARD PLANS FOR SPECIAL PROJECTS IN EVANGELISM AND CHURCH GROWTH IN EUROPE AND THE ORIENT. THESE INCLUDE A STEWARDSHIP CAMPAIGN IN SPAIN IN APRIL AND MAY, AN EVANGELISTIC CRUSADE IN PORTUGAL IN OCTOBER, AN EVANGELISTIC CRUSADE IN MALAYSIA IN APRIL, 1965, AND A SUNDAY SCHOOL CRUSADE IN ASIA IN APRIL, 1966. IT IS LIKELY THAT BAPTISTS IN OTHER COUNTRIES OF SOUTHEAST ASIA WILL JOIN THOSE IN MALAYSIA IN EVANGELISTIC CRUSADES IN THE SPRING OF 1965.

2 RECOMMENDATIONS FOR THE VARIOUS ACTIONS RELATED TO SPECIAL PROJECTS CAME FROM THE BOARD'S COMMITTEES FOR THE ORIENT AND FRXXX FOR EUROPE AND THE MIDDLE EAST AND FOLLOWED THE REPORT OF REV. JOSEPH B. UNDERWOOD, CONSULTANT IN EVANGELISM AND CHURCH DEVELOPMENT WHO HAS MADE RECENT TRIPS TO THE AREAS INVOLVED.

THE BOARD APPOINTED ONE MISSIONARY, MRS. JACK E. TOLAR, JR. HER HUSBAND, A MEDICAL DOCTOR, WAS APPOINTED FOR NIGERIA IN AUGUST, 1962, SEVERAL MONTHS BEFORE THEY MET WHILE ATTENDING SOUTHWESTERN BAPTIST THEOLOGICAL SEMINARY, FORT WORTH, TEX. THEY WERE MARRIED LAST MAY. DRXXX MRS. TOLAR IS THE FORMER BARBARA CORRINGTON, OF HOT SPRINGS, ARK. DR. TOLAR IS A NATIVE OF SAN ANTONIO, TEX.

THE BOARD'S OVERSEAS STAFF NOW TOTALS 1,802 (INCLUDING 25 MISSIONARY ASSOCIATES).

DR. JOHN D. HUGHEY, JR., AT BOARD HEADQUARTERS FOR A ROUND OF CONFERENCES, GAVE HIS FIRST REPORT AS EXXX SECRETARY FOR EUROPE AND THE MIDDLE EAST. SUMMARISXXX SUMMARIZING THE BACKGROUND AGAINST WHICH WXXX HE WILL WORK, HE AXXX SAID: "EUROPE AND THE MIDDLE EAST FORM A VERY VARIED AREA. IN IT ARE LATINS, GREEKS, GERMANS, SLAVS, JEWS, ARABS, TURKS, IRANIANS, AND OTHER ETHNIC GROUPS. THERE IS A GREAT VARIETY OF LANGUAGES, CULTURES, AND RELIGIONS.

"THE AREA IS VERY STRATEGIC FROM THE STANDPOINT OF RELIGION. IT INCLUDES THE HEART OF THE ROMAN CATHOLIC WORLD, THE HEART OF EASTERN ORTHODOXY, THE TRADITIONAL HEART OF PROTESTANTISM, THE HEART OF THE JEWISH WORLD, AND THE HEART OF ISLAM. COMMUNISM, THE GREATEST THREAT TO CHRISTIANITY SINCE THE RISE OF ISLAM, ALSO CENTERS IN THE AREA FOR WHICH I HAVE BEEN GIVEN RESPONSIBILITY."

1 NOTING THAT BAPTISTS HAVE FOUND THE AREA A DIFFICULT ONE IN WHICH TO WORK, DR. HUGHEY CONTINUED: "WE MUST BEAR OUR WITNESS IN EUROPE AND THE MIDDLE EAST. THE SEED MUST BE SOWN EVEN IF MUCH OF IT FALLS ON STONY GROUND. THERE WILL BE SOME RESPONSE TO THE GOSPEL, FOR IT IS THE POWER OF GOD UNTO SALVATION. FURTHERMORE, PATIENT WITNESSING WITH LITTLE RESPONSE NOW MAY PREPARE THE WAY FOR A FUTURE HARVEST."

2 DR. HUGHEY WILL MAINTAIN AN OFFICE IN RUSCHLIKON, SWITZERLAND, UNTIL SUMMER, WHEN HE AND HIS FAMILY WILL MOVE TO RICHMOND.

EUROPE AND THE MIDDLE EAST BECAME A SEPARATE AREA OF MISSION ADMINISTRATION LSXXX LAST JUNE WHEN THE FORMER AREA OF AFRICA, EUROPE, AND THE NEAR EAST WAS DIVIDED. DR. H. CORNELL GOERNER, WHO CARRIED RESPONSIBILITY FOR THE ENTIRE AREA, CONTINUES AS SECRETARY FOR AFRICA.

DR. FRANK MEANS, SECRETARY FOR LATIN AMERICA, REPORTED THAT THE FIRST SOUTHERN BAPTIST MISSIONARIES TO THE ISLAND OF GUADELOUPE, REV. AND MRS. WILLIAM H. CAIN, HAD JUST LEFT TO TAKE UP RESIDENCE ON THE ISLAND OF GUADELOUPE. APPOINTED FOR THIS WORK IN OCTOBER, 1961, THE CAINS HAVE COMPLETED A PERIOD OF FORMAL LANGUAGE STUDY IN FRANCE.

DR. MEANS SAID REPORTS FROM BRAZIL INDICATE THAT THE POLITICAL, MILITARY, SOCIAL, AND ECONOMIC CRISES DISRUPTING THE NORMAL PACE OF LIFE THERE HAVE POINTED UP A CORRESPONDING SEARCH FOR SOMETHING STABLE AND TRUE IN WHICH MAN CAN PUT HIS CONFIDENCE.

A GROUP OF TWELVE MISSIONARIES, BOTH APPOINTEES AND EXPERIENCED WORKERS, WILL COMPOSE THE FIRST CLASS FOR THE INTENSIVE, NINE-MONTH INSTRUCTION.

THE PROJECT WILL USE SPACE DONATED BY THE FIRST BAPTIST CHURCH OF THE CITY.

LOYD CORDER OF ATLANTA, SECRETARY OF THE LANGUAGE MISSIONS DEPARTMENT OF THE MISSION AGENCY, SAID THIS WAS PART OF A GENERAL MOVE TO INCREASE THE LANGUAGE CAPABILITY OF THE MISSION FORCE.

HE ALSO ANNOUNCED THAT ONE NICOPAN BY WILL STUDY ITALIAN IN ITALY, ANOTHER RUSSIAN IN MOSCOW, U.S.S.R., AND ONE COUPLE IS IN BRAZIL STUDYING PRAX PORTUGUESE.

"THE NEED FOR LANGUAGE INSTRUCTION HAS EXISTED FOR YEARS," HE SAID. "WE HAVE SCHOOLS IN COSTA RICA, GUATEMALA, AND OTHER FOREIGN MISSION BOARD SCHOOLS IN COSTA RICA AND OTHER SCHOOLS IN THE UNITED STATES, BUT NONE HAVE EXACTLY MET THE NEED FOR PERSONNEL WHO WILL SERVE IN THE UNITED STATES.

DECIDED STRESSING CONVERSATION, THE INSTRUCTION WILL INTRODUCE LATIN CULTURE AND PHILOSOPHY AND STRESS SIGNIFICANT DIFFERENCES IN POINT OF VIEW OF LATIN AND ANGLO-AMERICAN PERSONS IN CULTURE, POLITICS, ECONOMICS, MORALS, AND RELIGION.

"WE WILL EVALUATE THE INSTRUCTION BY HOW IT ACCOMPLISHES OUR OBJECTIVES RATHER THAN ACCREDITATION," CORDER SAID.

THE MISSION BOARD WILL MOVE THE MISSIONARIES TO SAN ANTONIO FOR THE SCHOOLING AND CONTINUE THEM ON MISSIONARY STATUS.

IN PANAMA UNHARMED

CANAL ZONE, PANAMA (BP)--A SOUTHERN BAPTIST MISSION OFFICIAL IN THE CANAL ZONE REPORTS MISSION PERSONNEL AND PROPERTY UNHARMED FOLLOWING THE FIRST DAY'S RIOTING THERE.

THE RIOTING, WHICH HAD TOUCHED POINTS AS FAR APART AS 200 MILES, BROUGHT ARMED CONFLICT BETWEEN UNITED STATES FORCES AND PANAMANIAN. DEATHS WERE REPORTED AMONG BOTH GROUPS.

L. D. WOOD, SUPERINTENDENT OF SOUTHERN BAPTIST MISSION WORK IN THE REPUBLIC OF PANAMA, CALLED HIS HEADQUARTERS REPORT TO HOME MISSION BOARD OFFICES IN ATLANTA.

WOOD, A LIEUTENANT COLONEL IN THE UNITED STATES ARMY RESERVE CHAPLAINCY, WAS CALLED TO ACTIVE DUTY FOR THE CRISIS. HE LIVES IN THE CANAL ZONE AND THE OFFICE OF SOUTHERN BAPTIST MISSION WORK IS IN THE ZONE.

WOOD REPORTED THE US EMBASSY IN PANAMA CITY ABANDONED, THE SEARS STORE BURNED, AND AUTOMOBILES OVERTURNED AND BURNED.

"I CAN DEFINITELY REPORT THAT OUR FORCES DID NOT FIRE ON THE PANAMANIAN UNTIL AFTER SOME OF OUR MEN HAD BEEN KILLED," HE SAID.

THE CRISIS PLACED IN JEOPARDY AN EVANGELISTIC CRUSADE WHICH CHURCHES AND MISSIONS OF THE PANAMA BAPTIST CONVENTION HAD PLANNED FOR THE FIRST WEEKS OF FEBRUARY.

PASTORS AND MUSIC DIRECTORS FROM THROUGHOUT THE UNITED STATES ARE SCHEDULED TO VISIT THE REPUBLIC FOR THE TWO-WEEK CRUSADE.

IN AN EARLIER REPORT TO ATLANTA, WOOD HAD SAID, "COMMUNIST INFILTRATION IS TREMENDOUS IN THE REPUBLIC. AT THIS TIME WE DO NOT KNOW WHAT WILL HAPPEN TO US IN THE MATTER OF COMMUNISM AND A THOUSAND OTHER THINGS. WE'VE CALLED IT COMMUNIST HOLDING A TORCH TO OUR NECK."

SOUTHERN BAPTISTS SUPPORT 18 MISSIONARIES FROM THE UNITED STATES IN THE REPUBLIC, AS WELL AS NEARLY 100 NATIONAL WORKERS. THE WORK IS SCATTERED THROUGHOUT THE 400-MILE ISTHMUS AND THE SAN BLAS ISLANDS, WITH THE LARGEST CONCENTRATION AROUND THE CANAL ZONE.

IN ADDITION THERE ARE CHURCHES IN THE ZONE WHICH SERVE THE UNITED STATE PERSONNEL.

MISSIONARIES FROM THE UNITED STATES WHO SERVE IN THE AREA INCLUDES THE FOLLOWING:

RAY M. DOUGLAS, NATIVE OF TEXAS, WHO IS AREA MISSIONARY FOR THE CHAGRES RIVER AND THE GATUN LAKE AREAS AND PASTOR OF THE CHAGRES RIVER BAPTIST CHURCH, AND MRS DOUGLAS, NATIVE OF TEXAS.

BERT O. HURT, NATIVE OF MISSISSIPPI, SERVES AS DEAN OF THE BAPTIST THEOLOGICAL INSTITUTE IN ARRAIJAN, REPUBLICA DE PANAMA. MRS. HURT IS A NATIVE OF TEXAS.

CANAL ZONE, PANAMA (BP)--A SOUTHERN BAPTIST MISSION OFFICIAL IN THE CANAL ZONE REPORTS MISSION PERSONNEL AND PROPERTY UNHARMED FOLLOWING THE FIRST DAY'S RIOTING THERE.

THE RIOTING, WHICH HAD TOUCHED POINTS AS FAR APART AS 200 MILES, BROUGHT ARMED CONFLICT BETWEEN UNITED STATES FORCES AND PANAMANIAN. DEATHS WERE REPORTED AMONG BOTH GROUPS.

L. D. WOOD, SUPERINTENDENT OF SOUTHERN BAPTIST MISSION WORK IN THE REPUBLIC OF PANAMA, CALLED FRIDAY TO REPORT TO HOME MISSION BOARD OFFICES IN ATLANTA.

WOOD, A LIEUTENANT COLONEL IN THE UNITED STATES ARMY RESERVE CHAPLAINCY, WAS CALLED TO ACTIVE DUTY FOR THE CRISIS. HE LIVES IN THE CANAL ZONE AND THE OFFICE OF SOUTHERN BAPTIST MISSION WORK IS IN THE ZONE.

WOOD REPORTED THE US EMBASSY IN PANAMA CITY ABANDONED, THE SEARS STORE BURNED, AND AUTOMOBILES OVERTURNED AND BURNED.

"I CAN DEFINITELY REPORT THAT OUR FORCES DID NOT FIRE ON THE PANAMANIAN UNTIL AFTER SOME OF OUR MEN HAD BEEN KILLED," HE SAID.

THE CRISIS PLACED IN JEOPARDY AN EVANGELISTIC CRUSADE WHICH CHURCHES AND MISSIONS OF THE PANAMA BAPTIST CONVENTION HAD PLANNED FOR THE FIRST WEEKS OF FEBRUARY.

PASTORS AND MUSIC DIRECTORS FROM THROUGHOUT THE UNITED STATES ARE SCHEDULED TO VISIT THE REPUBLIC FOR THE TWO-WEEK CRUSADE.

IN AN EARLIER REPORT TO ATLANTA, WOOD HAD SAID, "COMMUNIST INFILTRATION IS TREMENDOUS IN THE REPUBLIC. AT THIS TIME WE DO NOT KNOW WHAT WILL HAPPEN TO US IN THE MATTER OF COMMUNISM AND A THOUSAND OTHER THINGS. WE'RE ON A KEG OF POWDER HOLDING A TORCH IN OUR HAND."

SOUTHERN BAPTISTS SUPPORT 16 MISSIONARIES FROM THE UNITED STATES IN THE REPUBLIC, AS WELL AS NEARLY 100 NATIONAL WORKERS. THE WORK IS CONCENTRATED THROUGHOUT THE CANAL ZONE AND THE SAN BLAS ISLANDS, WITH THE LARGEST CONCENTRATION AROUND THE CANAL ZONE.

IN ADDITION THERE ARE CHURCHES IN THE ZONE WHICH SERVE THE UNITED STATE PERSONNEL.

WACO, TEX. (BP)--A BAPTIST LITERACY WORKSHOP FOR GROUPS DEDICATED TO EVANGELISM THROUGH TEACHING ILLITERATES HOW TO READ WILL BE HELD AT BAYLOR UNIVERSITY JULY 13-17.

THE WORKSHOP, PLANNED AS A PILOT PROJECT FOR FUTURE SUCH CHURCH-CENTERED LOCAL PROGRAMS, IS JOINTLY SPONSORED BY THE LANGUAGE MISSIONS DEPARTMENT OF THE BAPTIST GENERAL CONVENTION OF TEXAS AND BAYLOR UNIVERSITY.

THE WORKSHOP WILL TIE IN CLOSELY WITH THE STATEWIDE LATIN AMERICAN BAPTIST NEW LIFE CRUSADE SPONSORED BY TEXAS BAPTISTS. THE CRUSADE WILL UTILIZE ABOUT 1,500 LAYMEN AND 600 MINISTERS AND SINGERS THROUGHOUT TEXAS AUGUST 30-OCTOBER 11.

HARDIN-SIMMONS VOTES TO DISCONTINUE FOOTBALL

FALLS, TEX. (SP)—The Hardin-Simmons University board of trustees is voted here to discontinue the Baptist school's intercollegiate football program.

The action was taken in order to stop a mounting deficit in the athletic program and to "accelerate progress of the university's academic objectives," said board chairman W. B. Lott of Dallas.

During the past ten years, losses in the Hardin-Simmons athletic program have mounted to nearly \$1 million.

Hardin-Simmons, although it is dropping football, will seek to continue basketball, track, and other sports.

Hardin-Simmons president James H. Conzel said that the athletic financial problem has been critical for several years, and that the board of trustees has pledged to solve the problem itself "prior to the acceptance of the presidency." Landes, former Wichita Falls, Tex., Baptist pastor, became president April 2, 1966.

The board announced no decision on what will happen to the school's two football coaches, Floyd Hughson and Joe Gray.

HARDIN-SIMMONS, ALTHOUGH IT IS DROPPING FOOTBALL, WILL SEEK CONTINUED MEMBERSHIP IN THE NEW TEXAS CONFERENCE FOR COMPETITION IN BASKETBALL, TRACK, AND OTHER SPORTS.

HARDIN-SIMMONS PRESIDENT JAMES J. LANDES SAID THAT THE ATHLETIC FINANCIAL PROBLEM HAD BEEN CRITICAL FOR SEVERAL YEARS, AND THAT THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES HAD PLEDGED TO SOLVE THE PROBLEM ITSELF "PRIOR TO MY ACCEPTANCE OF THE PRESIDENCY." LANDES, FORMER WITCHITA FALLS, TEX., BAPTIST PASTOR, BECAME PRESIDENT APRIL 2, 1963.

WASHINGTON (BP)--FIFTY BAPTIST COLLEGE EDUCATORS VOTED TO REQUEST A SEXY SPECIAL STUDY ON THE EFFECT OF FEDERAL AID TO HIGHER EDUCATION ON BAPTIST EDUCATION IN AMERICA.

(THE HIGHER EDUCATION FACILITIES ACT OF 1965, ENACTED BY THE FIRST SESSION OF THE 89TH CONGRESS AND SIGNED BY PRESIDENT JOHNSON, PROVIDES \$1.2 BILLION FOR THE NATION'S COLLEGES BOTH PUBLIC AND PRIVATE. THE ACT PROVIDES BOTH GRANTS AND LOANS FOR ACADEMIC FACILITIES.)

THE ACTION WAS TAKEN AT THE CLOSE OF A FELLOWSHIP MEETING OF AMERICAN BAPTIST AND SOUTHERN BAPTIST COLLEGE REPRESENTATIVES AT THE MAYFLOWER HOTEL HERE. THEY WERE IN WASHINGTON TO ATTEND A MEETING OF THE COUNCIL OF PROTESTANT COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES, WITH WHICH MANY OF THE BAPTIST SCHOOLS ARE AFFILIATED.

THIS WAS THE SECOND JOINT MEETING OF THE AMERICAN AND SOUTHERN BAPTIST EDUCATORS. THE OTHER TOOK PLACE IN CLEVELAND TWO OR THREE YEARS AGO. THE PURPOSE OF THE MEETINGS IS FOR FELLOWSHIP AND DISCUSSION OF MUTUAL PROBLEMS AND ISSUES IN HIGHER EDUCATION.

WALTER L. BRANTLEY IS EXECUTIVE SECRETARY OF THE SOUTHERN BAPTIST EDUCATION COMMISSION. ROBERT EVA DEVI. IS DIRECTOR OF THE DIVISION OF CHRISTIAN HIGHER EDUCATION FOR THE AMERICAN BAPTIST CONVENTION.

J. ORIN CORNETT, DIRECTOR OF THE DIVISION OF HIGHER EDUCATION OF THE UNITED STATES OFFICE OF EDUCATION, ADDRESSED THE BAPTIST EDUCATORS. THE OFFICE OF EDUCATION HAS CONDUCTED SIMILAR ORIENTATION SEMINARS IN OTHER PARTS OF THE NATION TO HELP COLLEGE ADMINISTRATORS UNDERSTAND THE NEW COLLEGE AID BILL.

THE DECISION TO ASK FOR A STUDY ON THE EFFECTS OF THE NEW PROGRAM OF FEDERAL AID TO COLLEGES CAME AFTER REARAS BY WEINER JXX K. MICKS, PRESIDENT OF KALAMAZOO (MICH.) COLLEGE, WHICH SERVES AN AMERICAN BAPTIST CONSTITUENCY. J. OLLE EDWARDS, PRESIDENT OF STETSON UNIVERSITY AT DE LAND, FLA., A SOUTHERN BAPTIST SCHOOL, MADE THE PROPOSAL FOR THE SEXY STUDY.

MICKS TOLD THE GROUP THAT KALAMAZOO HAD NEVER ACCEPTED A DIME OF AID FOR ANY PURPOSE FROM THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT. BUT NOW THE COLLEGE BOARD HAS VOTED TO MAKE APPLICATION FOR FEDERAL FUNDS. THE REASON THAT THE SCHOOL CHIEFTED ITS POSITION, EXPLAINED MICKS, IS IMPROVING TIME. "OUR BOARD HAS TAKEN ON THE RESOLUTION THAT IF WE DON'T GET FEDERAL AID, WE JOIN THEM," HE SAID.

EDWARDS SAID THAT STETSON UNIVERSITY WOULD HAVE BEEN THE ONLY PRIVATE SCHOOL IN FLORIDA THAT IS NOT ASKING APPLICATION FOR FEDERAL GRANTS. HOWEVER, HE SAID, "WE ARE GOING TO MOVE RAPIDLY AT STETSON TO GET LOANS FROM THE GOVERNMENT. HE DID NOT INDICATE WHAT THE FUTURE POLICY OF THE SCHOOL MIGHT BE TOWARD FEDERAL GRANTS.

WASHINGTON (BP)--FIFTY BAPTIST COLLEGE EDUCATORS VOTED TO REQUEST A SEXX SPECIAL STUDY ON THE EFFECT OF FEDERAL AID TO HIGHER EDUCATION ON BAPTIST EDUCATION IN AMERICA.

(THE HIGHER EDUCATION FACILITIES ACT OF 1963, ENACTED BY THE FIRST SESSION OF THE 88TH CONGRESS AND SIGNED BY PRESIDENT JOHNSON, PROVIDES \$1.2 BILLION FOR THE NATION'S COLLEGES BOTH PUBLIC AND PRIVATE. THE ACT PROVIDES BOTH GRANTS AND LOANS FOR ACADEMIC FACILITIES.)

THE ACTION WAS TAKEN AT THE CLOSE OF A FELLOWSHIP MEETING OF AMERICAN BAPTIST AND SOUTHERN BAPTIST COLLEGE REPRESENTATIVES AT THE MAYFLOWER HOTEL HERE. THEY WERE IN WASHINGTON TO ATTEND A MEETING OF THE COUNCIL OF PROTESTANT COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES, WITH WHICH MANY OF THE BAPTIST SCHOOLS ARE AFFILIATED.

R. ORIN CORNETT, DIRECTOR OF THE DIVISION OF HIGHER EDUCATION OF THE UNITED STATES OFFICE OF EDUCATION, ADDRESSED THE BAPTIST EDUCATORS. THE OFFICE OF EDUCATION HAS CONDUCTED SIMILAR ORIENTATION SEMINARS IN OTHER PARTS OF THE NATION TO HELP COLLEGE ADMINISTRATORS UNDERSTAND THE NEW COLLEGE AID BILL.

THE DECISION TO ASK FOR A STUDY ON THE EFFECTS OF THE NEW PROGRAM OF FEDERAL AID TO COLLEGES CAME AFTER REMARKS BY WEIMER JXX K. HICKS, PRESIDENT OF KALAMAZOO (MICH.) COLLEGE, WHICH SERVES AN AMERICAN BAPTIST CONSTITUENCY. J. OLLIE EDMUNDS, PRESIDENT OF STETSON UNIVERSITY AT DE LAND, FLA., A SOUTHERN BAPTIST SCHOOL, MADE THE PROPOSAL FOR THE SDXX STUDY.

HICKS TOLD THE GROUP THAT KALAMAZOO HAD NEVER ACCEPTED A DIME OF AID FOR ANY PURPOSE FROM THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT. BUT NOW THE COLLEGE BOARD HAS VOTED TO MAKE APPLICATION FOR FEDERAL FUNDS. THE REASON THAT THE SCHOOL SHIFTED ITS POSITION, EXPLAINED HICKS, IS IXXYY SIMPLE. "OUR DECISION WAS BASED ON THE REASONING THAT IF YOU CAN'T BEAT THEM, JOIN THEM," HE SAID.

EDMUNDS SAID THAT STETSON UNIVERSITY WOULD PROBABLY BE THE ONLY PRIVATE SCHOOL IN FLORIDA THAT IS NOT MAKING APPLICATION FOR FEDERAL GRANTS. HOWEVER, HE SAID, "WE ARE GOING TO MOVE RAPIDLY AT STETSON TO GET LOANS" FROM THE GOVERNMENT. HE DID NOT INDICATE WHAT THE FUTURE POLICY OF THE SCHOOL MIGHT BE TOWARD FEDERAL GRANTS.

IN CALLING FOR THE SPECIAL STUDY EDMUNDS SAID THAT THE FINDINGS SHOULD BE MADE AVAILABLE TO PASTORS AND LEADING LAYMEN IN THE STATES. "AN IMPARTIAL, FACTUAL STUDY MIGHT GIVE US OPPORTUNITY TO SAY SOME THINGS COLLECTIVELY THAT WE WOULD HESITATE TO SAY INDIVIDUALLY," HE SAID.

THE FLORIDA COLLEGE PRESIDENT SAID THAT THIS STUDY SHOULD BE DONE BY THE EDUCATORS THEMSELVES. HE SAID THAT THE CONFERENCES SPONSORED BY THE BAPTIST JOINT COMMITTEE ON PUBLIC AFFAIRS WERE NOT REPRESENTATIVE OF THE VIEWS OF THE EDUCATORS. HE FELT THAT THE EDUCATORS WERE ABLE TO EXPRESS ONLY A MINORITY VIEW IN THESE CONFERENCES. (IN 1962 THE BAPTIST JOINT COMMITTEE ON PUBLIC AFFAIRS CONDUCTED A CONFERENCE ON CHURCH-STATE RELATION PROBLEMS IN HIGHER EDUCATION. BAPTIST LEADERS IN THE NATION WERE INVITED, INCLUDING THE COLLEGE PRESIDENTS. MANY OF THEM WERE PRESENT AND PARTICIPATED IN THE CONFERENCE.)

"I WOULD HATE FOR US TO STAND BY AND SEE A GREAT PROCESSION FOR EDUCATION MOVE BY AND THEN FOR US TO SAY THAT WE WON THE BATTLE FOR A PRINCIPLE (SEPARATION OF CHURCH AND STATE) BUT LOST IT FOR EDUCATION," EDMUNDS SAID.

THE REQUEST FOR THE STUDY OF FEDERAL FUNDS AND BAPTIST EDUCATION WAS REFERRED TO THE SOUTHERN BAPTIST EDUCATION COMMISSION AND THE DIVISION OF CHRISTIAN HIGHER EDUCATION OF THE AMERICAN BAPTIST CONVENTION INDICATIONS WERE THAT THE STUDY WOULD BE UNDERTAKEN IMMEDIATELY.

CORNETT EXPRESSED THE OPINION THAT A SUBSTANTIAL AMOUNT OF THE FEDERAL FUNDS WOULD GO TO PRIVATE COLLEGES. HE REPORTED THAT ONE STATE AT LEAST WAS CONSIDERING DIVIDING ITS ALLOTMENT 60 PER CENT TO PRIVATE AND 40 PER CENT TO PUBLIC SCHOOLS. THE REASON, HE EXPLAINED, IS THAT THIS WOULD SAVE THE STATE THE PROBLEM OF BUILDING MORE PUBLIC COLLEGES IN CERTAIN AREAS.

DURING THE MEETING THE VIEW WAS EXPRESSED THAT THE PATTERN OF POLICY ON BAPTIST SCHOOLS AND FEDERAL FUNDS WOULD BE UNEVEN AND CHANGING. SOME STATE BAPTIST BODIES MAY ALLOW THEIR COLLEGES TO ACCEPT FEDERAL FUNDS WHILE OTHERS MAY REFUSE. IT WAS POINTED OUT THAT AMERICAN BAPTIST COLLEGES WOULD BE FREER IN THIS RESPECT BECAUSE MOST OF THEM ARE INDEPENDENT AND LOOSELY RELATED TO THE DENOMINATION. MOST SOUTHERN BAPTIST COLLEGES ARE OWNED DIRECTLY BY THE BAPTIST STATE CONVENTIONS.

SCHOOL OFFICIALS EVACUATED THORNDIKE HALL, THE PRESENT ADMINISTRATION BUILDING, BUT DID NOT INTERRUPT CLASSES IN NEARBY SHAWNEE HALL, EXX WHERE 1XX FINAL SEMESTER EXAMINATIONS WERE IN PROGRESS.

BOZEMAN SAYS REACHING THIS MILESTONE IN LIFE OCCURRED "THROUGH THE GOODNESS AND MERCY OF GOD. IT'S NOT BECAUSE OF ANYTHING I'VE DONE," HE COMMENTED. "WHY HE KEEPS ME HERE SO LONG, I DON'T KNOW--BUT THAT'S HIS BUSINESS."

HIS ACTIVE LIFE INCLUDES CLOSE TO 70 YEARS AS A DEACON IN A BAPTIST CHURCH AND OVER 30 YEARS AS A SUNDAY SCHOOL TEACHER, ACCORDING TO HIS PASTOR, BEVERLY V. TINNIN OF FIRST BAPTIST CHURCH HERE. BOZEMAN'S OWN FATHER WAS PASTOR OF THE SAME CHURCH FROM 1871 TO 1885.

BOZEMAN WAS BORN IN 1864 DURING THE CLOSING DAYS OF THE WAR BETWEEN THE STATES. HE RECALLS RIDING ON A TRAIN OUT OF RICHMOND, VA., ON WHICH BROBERT E. LEE, THE CONFEDERATE COMMANDER, ALSO WAS A PASSENGER.

TOO, BOZEMAN REMEMBERS WHEN HE MET PRESIDENT JEFFERSON DAVIS OF THE CONFEDERACY DURING DAVIS' VISIT IN MERIDIAN.

JOHN W. MCCALL OF MEMPHIS, FATHER OF SEMINARY PRESIDENT DUKE K. MCCALL AND LONG-TIME MEMBER OF THE BROTHERHOOD COMMISSION OF THE SOUTHERN BAPTIST CONVENTION, KNOWS BOZEMAN. "JUDGE" MCCALL, AS HE IS KNOWN, SAID HE LOST ONE OF HIS FIRST TRIAL CASES AS A LAWYER BECAUSE OF THE EFFECTIVE ARGUMENT OF THE OPPOSING COUNSEL, BOZEMAN.

BOZEMAN IS THE OLDEST LIVING ALUMNUS OF MISSISSIPPI COLLEGE (BAPTIST) IN CLINTON, FROM WHICH HE GRADUATED IN 1883. MISSISSIPPI COLLEGE 63 YEARS LATER CONFERRED ON BOZEMAN THE HONORARY DOCTOR OF LAWS DEGREE.

THREE HUNDRED PERSONS, INCLUDING THE GOVERNOR OF MISSISSIPPI, SENATORS AND CONGRESSMEN, AND STATE SUPREME COURT JUSTICES, ATTENDED A BIRTHDAY BANQUET FOR BOZEMAN WHEN HE TURNED 100. THE BANQUET WAS HELD IN THE CHURCH HERE.

REMINISCING ABOUT HIS CHURCH WORK, BOZEMAN SAID, "IN MY 84 YEARS AS A CHURCH MEMBER I HAVE FILLED EVERY POSITION FROM JANITOR TO THE PULPIT --EVERYTHING, THAT IS, EXCEPT ORGANIZT AND WOMAN'S MISSIONARY UNION PRESIDENT."

ON HIS 99TH BIRTHDAY A YEAR AGO, A NEWSPAPER REPORTER ATTEMPTED TO CONTACT BOZEMAN FOR AN INTERVIEW, BUT LEARNED BOZEMAN HAD GONE ON A SHORT BUSINESS TRIP. LATER, THE REPORTER FOUND OUT THE SHORT BUSINESS TRIP MEANT BOZEMAN HAD DRIVEN HALFWAY ACROSS THE STATE.

WASHINGTON (BP)--THE WORDS "IN GOD WE TRUST," NOW APPEARING ON \$1 FEDERAL RESERVE NOTES, WILL APPEAR ON OTHER CURRENCY IN 1964 AND 1965, ACCORDING TO THE BUREAU OF ENGRAVING AND PRINTING.

THE SCHEDULE FOR INCORPORATING THE MOTTO ON ALL U.S. CURRENCY AND FEDERAL RESERVE NOTES WAS PLACED IN THE CONGRESSIONAL RECORD BY REP. ~~XXXXXXXXXXXX~~ LEONOR J. SULLIVAN (D., MO.), CHAIRMAN OF THE HOUSE SUBCOMMITTEE ON CONSUMER AFFAIRS. ~~MRS. SULLIVAN'S SUBCOMMITTEE HAS~~ RESPONSIBILITY FOR BILLS DEALING WITH COINS AND CURRENCY, ON ASSIGNMENT FROM THE HOUSE COMMITTEE ON BANKING AND CURRENCY.

THE SUBCOMMITTEE HAS RECEIVED INQUIRES FROM CONGRESSMEN, MRS. SULLIVAN SAID, "ABOUT THE STATUS OF A RUMORED PROPOSAL TO REMOVE THE MOTTO 'IN GOD WE TRUST' FROM OUR COINS OR CURRENCY." SHE SAID THERE IS NO BILL PENDING IN CONGRESS TO REMOVE THE MOTTO AND CITED 1955 ACT MAKING IT MANDATORY TO PUT THE MOTTO ON ALL COINS AND CURRENCY.

PRIOR TO THE 1955 LAW, THE MOTTO HAD BEEN REQUIRED ONLY ON CERTAIN COINS, THOUGH THE PRACTICE OF THE TREASURY HAD BEEN TO USE IT ON ALL COINS, MRS. SULLIVAN SAID. THIS LAW MADE IT MANDATORY TO PLACE THE MOTTO ON ALL COINS AND ON ALL CURRENCY ISSUES "AT SUCH TIME AS NEW DIES FOR THE PRINTING OF CURRENCY ARE ADOPTED...."

THE \$1 SILVER CERTIFICATE CARRIED THE MOTTO BEGINNING 1957. THE SILVER CERTIFICATE WAS REPLACED IN NOVEMBER 1963 BY THE \$1 FEDERAL RESERVE NOTE, WHICH ALSO CARRIES THE WORDS "IN GOD WE TRUST." NO OTHER DENOMINATION OF CURRENCY NOW IN CIRCULATION BEARS THE MOTTO.

MRS. SULLIVAN SAID THE BUREAU OF ENGRAVING AND PRINTING IS NOW ADOPTING NEW DIES FOR SEVEN ADDITIONAL DENOMINATIONS OF CURRENCY, AND THESE WILL BEAR THE MOTTO.

ACCORDING TO THE SCHEDULE FROM THE BUREAU OF ENGRAVING AND PRINTING, FOUR DENOMINATIONS OF CURRENCY WILL BEGIN CARRYING THE WORDS "IN GOD WE TRUST" DURING 1964. THE \$2 AND \$5 U.S. NOTES WILL BEGIN IN MARCH, THE \$10 FEDERAL RESERVE NOTES IN APRIL, THE \$20 FEDERAL RESERVE NOTES IN SEPTEMBER, AND THE \$5 FEDERAL RESERVE NOTES IN NOVEMBER. BY JANUARY 1965 THE \$50 AND \$100 FEDERAL RESERVE NOTES WILL ALSO CARRY THE MOTTO.

POAU DASKS WHITE HOUSE
DENY PAROCHIAL AID PLAN

HOUSTON, TEX. (BP)-PROTESTANTS AND OTHER AMERICANS UNITED FOR SEPARATION OF CHURCH AND STATE APPEALED TO THE WHITE HOUSE FOR PROMPT DENIAL OF REPORTS THAT PRESIDENT JOHNSON WILL ASK FEDERAL AID FOR PAROCHIAL SCHOOLS IN BLIGHTED AREAS AS PART OF HIS "WAR ON POVERTY."

DIRECTORS OF THE ORGANIZATION MADE THE APPEAL FOLLOWING PRESS REPORTS FROM WASHINGTON.

THE POAU STATEMENT SAID:

"THE AMERICAN PEOPLE WILL NOT PERMIT THIS COUNTRY'S LONG STANDING TRADITION OF CHURCH-STATE SEPARATION TO BE SCUTTLED. THEY UNDERSTAND THAT SUBSIDIES TO PAROCHIAL SCHOOLS UNDER ANY PRETEXT ARE SUBSIDIES TO THE CHURCHES WHICH OWN AND CONTROL THEM. SUCH A PROPOSAL WOULD DEMOLISH RELIGIOUS AMITY IN THIS COUNTRY, PITTING CHURCH AGAINST CHURCH AND BROTHER AGAINST BROTHER.

"THE AMERICAN PEOPLE--PROTESTANT, CATHOLIC, JEW AND UNBELIEVER ALIKE-- SHOULD LET PRESIDENT JOHNSON KNOW THEY EXPECT HIM TO UPHOLD THE CONSTITUTION,. THEY SHOULD REGISTER THIS DEMAND AT THE WHITE HOUSE. THEY SHOULD DO IT QUICKLY BEFORE CONGRESS AND THE COUNTRY ARE THROWN INTO TURMOIL."

THE BUSINESS SESSION AT WHICH THE STATEMENT WAS ADOPTED FOLLOWED THE ANNUAL CHURCH-STATE CONFERENCE. THE BUSINESS ACTION ALSO INCLUDED PLANS FOR AN EXPANDED WASHINGTON STAFF AND FOR A MILLION-DOLLAR HEADQUARTERS BUILDING.

THE ANNOUNCEMENTS OF ACTION WERE MADE BY LOUIE D. NEWTON, BAPTIST PASTOR OF ATLANTA, WHO WAS RE-ELECTED AS NATIONAL PRESIDENT.

NEWTON SAID "WE HOPE TO ERECT WITHIN THE NEXT YEAR" THE WASHINGTON BUILDING WHICH WILL REPLACE INADEQUATE FACILITIES THERE. HE SAID THE EXPANDING STAFF WILL BE INCREASED BY ADDITION OF AN ATTORNEY, RESEARCH SPECIALISTS AND EDITORIAL ASSISTANCE.

THE ORGANIZATION, ALSO KNOWN AS POAU, APPROVED USE OF "M AMERICANS UNITED" FOR A SHORTER NAME. IT WILL MAINTAIN THE LONGER NAME FOR LEGAL PURPOSES.

AMERICAN'S UNITED EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR, GLENN L. ARCHER, SAID IN AN ADDRESS AT THE CHURCH-STATE CONFERENCE THAT THE ECUMENICAL MOVEMENT HAS BECOME A "THREAT TO CHURCH-STATE SEPARATION IN THE UNITED STATES."

PROTESTANT LEADERS "IN THE ECUMENICAL MOVEMENT ARE SO AFRAID OF BEING CALLED BIGOTS," HE SAID, "THEY SOFT-PEDAL THEIR ADVOCACY OF PROTESTANT DISTINCTIVES, INCLUDING THE SEPARATION OF CHURCH AND STATE."

THE ASSOCIATE DIRECTOR, C. STANLEY LOWELL, SAID THE 1963 SESSION OF THE VATICAN COUNCIL FAILED "INSOFAR AS THOSE ISSUES CLOSEST TO THE HEARTS OF PROTESTANTS WERE CONCERNED." HE EXPLAINED THAT "CONSIDERATIONS OF RELIGIOUS LIBERTY AND CHURCH-STATE DID NOT RECEIVE FULL DISCUSSION AND THERE WAS NO VOTE ON THE PROPOSED SCHEMA."

LOWELL ADDED THAT "PROSPECTS OF A NEW PRONOUNCEMENT IN REGARD TO RELIGIOUS LIBERTY AT THE 1964 SESSION CANNOT BE CONSIDERED TOO BRIGHT." HE SAID IT "WOULD BE WRONG TO CALL THE COUNCIL ITSELF A FAILURE" BECAUSE "THE MERE FACT THAT RELIGIOUS LIBERTY RECEIVED SOME ATTENTION AND DISCUSSION AT THE COUNCIL WAS ITSELF A FAVORABLE OMEN."

BROWNWOOD, TEX. (BP)--TRUSTEES OF HOWARD PAYNE COLLEGE HERE AUTHORIZED ITS ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICIALS TO DECIDE ON A RACIAL INTEGRATION POLICY WHENEVER NEGRO STUDENTS APPLY FOR ADMISSION.

GUY D. NEWMAN, PRESIDENT OF THE BAPTIST COLLEGE, SAID FOLLOWING THE BOARD ACTION THAT DECISIONS TO ADMIT STUDENTS WILL BE MADE "ON AN INDIVIDUAL BASIS."

ALTHOUGH THE PRESIDENT DID NOT SAY SO SPECIFICALLY, OBSERVERS SPECULATED THAT THE ADMINISTRATION WILL QUIETLY ADMIT QUALIFIED NEGRO STUDENTS WHEN THEY APPLY.

PRESIDENT NEWMAN SAID THERE HAVE BEEN NO REQUESTS FOR ADMISSION BY NEGROES LATELY, AND THAT NO SUCH APPLICATIONS ARE PENDING.

THERE ARE, HOWEVER, STUDENTS FROM MANY NATIONS AROUND THE WORLD ATTENDING HOWARD PAYNE, HE SAID. "THESE HAVE EACH BEEN ADMITTED ON AN INDIVIDUAL BASIS, AND THIS WILL CONTINUE TO BE OUR POLICY," NEWMAN SAID.

WHEN AND IF NEGROES ARE ADMITTED TO HOWARD PAYNE, IT WILL BECOME THE FIFTH TEXAS BAPTIST COLLEGE TO DROP ITS RACIAL BARS.

BAYLOR UNIVERSITY IN WACO, HARDIN-SIMMONS UNIVERSITY IN ABILENE, WAYLAND BAPTIST COLLEGE IN PLAINVIEW, AND THE UNIVERSITY OF CORPUS CHRISTI HAVE ALL ADOPTED POLICIES OF RACIAL INTEGRATION.

IN OTHER ACTION DURING THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES MEETING HERE, THE HOWARD PAYNE TRUSTEES RE-AFFIRMED ITS CONFIDENCE IN THE ATHLETIC PROGRAM AND MEMBERSHIP IN THE LONE STAR CONFERENCE AND VOTED TO DROP FOOTBALL PROGRAM SIMMONS UNIVERSITY FOUND IT NECESSARY TO

THE TRUSTEES ALSO HEARD PROGRESS REPORTS ON CAMPUS EXPANSION, AND LET A CONTRACT TO DEMOLISH AND REMOVE HOWARD PAYNE HALL.

BY BAPTIST PR MEMBERS

FORT WORTH (BP)--A CODE OF ETHICS OUTLINING PROFESSIONAL STANDARDS FOR BAPTIST PUBLIC RELATIONS PRACTITIONERS WAS ADOPTED HERE BY MEMBERS OF THE BAPTIST PUBLIC RELATIONS ASSOCIATION.

~~THE 12-POINT CODE, FIRST PROPOSED IN 1962 BY W. C. FIELDS OF THE SOUTHERN BAPTIST EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE, CALLED FOR EACH MEMBER OF THE ASSOCIATION TO BE "FIRST AND FOREMOST A SPIRITUAL LEADER."~~

THE CODE ALSO STATED THAT MEMBERS SHOULD NOT COMPETE WITH OTHER MEMBERS FOR A PARTICULAR JOB, AND THAT MEMBERS SHOULD NOT INTENTIONALLY INJURE THE PROFESSIONAL REPUTATION OF OTHER MEMBERS.

COMPLETE TEXT OF THE CODE OF ETHICS STATED:

1. A MEMBER SHALL BE FIRST AND FOREMOST A SPIRITUAL LEADER, WITH THE ULTIMATE OBJECTIVE OF ALL HIS WORK BEING TO LEAD MEN TO GOD THROUGH JESUS CHRIST.
2. A MEMBER SHALL SEEK TO MINISTER RATHER THAN TO BE MINISTERED UNTO, PLACING SERVICE ABOVE SALARY AND PERSONAL RECOGNITION, SEEKING THE LEADERSHIP OF THE HOLY SPIRIT IN DISCOVERING AND DOING HIS CHRISTIAN DUTY.
3. A MEMBER SHALL WORK CONSTANTLY TO TRY TO REACH THE HIGHEST POSSIBLE LEVELS OF PROFESSIONAL COMPETENCE.
4. A MEMBER SHALL ADHERE TO THE HIGHEST STANDARDS OF TRUTH, ACCURACY, AND GOOD TASTE.
5. A MEMBER SHALL NOT ENGAGE IN ANY PRACTICE WHICH TENDS TO CORRUPT THE INTEGRITY OF ANY OF THE CHANNELS OF PUBLIC COMMUNICATION.
6. A MEMBER SHALL SEEK TO KEEP BEFORE THE AGENCY EMPLOYING HIM THE NEED OF RESPECT FOR THE FREEDOM AND DIGNITY OF THE INDIVIDUAL, THE OPINIONS OF ITS CONSTITUENCY, AND WELFARE OF THE PUBLIC AT LARGE.
7. A MEMBER SHALL NOT INTENTIONALLY INJURE THE PROFESSIONAL REPUTATION OF PRACTICE OF ANOTHER MEMBER, AND WHERE DIFFERENCES DEVELOP HE SHALL GO "THE SECOND MILE" IN OBJECTIVITY AND CHRISTIAN FORBEARANCE IN ORDER TO RESOLVE SUCH DIFFERENCES.
8. A MEMBER SHALL NOT KNOWINGLY OR THROUGH PERSONAL INITIATIVE COMPETE IN AN AGGRESSIVE MANNER WITH ANOTHER MEMBER FOR A PARTICULAR JOB.
9. A MEMBER SHALL DO HIS WORK USING METHODS THAT ARE NOT DEROGATORY OR DETRIMENTAL TO THE WORK OF OTHER MEMBERS.
10. A MEMBER SHALL STRIVE FOR EFFICIENCY AND EFFECTIVENESS WITHOUT EXTRAVAGANCE, BEARING IN MIND THE NEED TO ACHIEVE THE GREATEST POSSIBLE BENEFITS FROM THE RESOURCES OF HIS AGENCY AND THE DENOMINATION.
11. A MEMBER SHALL NOT WORK FOR AN AGENCY IF HE DOES NOT SINCERELY BELIEVE IN THE PURPOSES AND OBJECTIVES OF THE AGENCY.
12. A MEMBER SHALL NOT USE HIS INFLUENCE TO ALIENATE HIS AGENCY OR ANY PART OF ITS LIFE FROM ITS LOYALTY TO AND SUPPORT OF THE DENOMINATION.

**SBC POLISH WORK GROWS
WITH BUFFALO MISSION**

ATLANTA (BP)--THE ORGANIZATION OF THE POLISH BAPTIST MISSION IN BUFFALO, N. Y., HAS ACCEPTED SOUTHERN BAPTISTS' RECENT MISSION WORK AMONG SLAVIC PEOPLES IN THE UNITED STATES.

THE BUFFALO CONGREGATION WILL BE THE THIRD TO AFFILIATE WITH THE CONVENTION IN RECENT MONTHS. THE OTHERS ARE IN NEW YORK CITY AND CLEVELAND, OHIO.

TO ESTABLISH THE BUFFALO WORK, THE HOME MISSION BOARD OF THE SBC PURCHASED PROPERTY IN THE CITY AT 821 FILLMORE AVENUE, WITHIN A TWOPXX TWO-MILE RADIUS OF 30,000 POLISH SPEAKING PEOPLE.

THE BOARD IS COOPERATING IN THE EFFORT WITH THE STATE CONVENTION OF BAPTISTS IN OHIO, THE FRONTIER BAPTIST ASSOCIATION OF NEW YORK, AND THE POLISH BAPTIST ASSOCIATION OF THE UNITED STATES.

E. L. GOLONKA OF ATLANTA, GENERAL FIELD WORKER IN THE LANGUAGE MISSIONS DEPARTMENT OF THE MISSION AGENCY, SAID A MISSIONARY PASTOR WILL BE SECURED TO LEAD THE WORK.

IN THE MEANTIME, CHARLES E. MAGRUDER OF TONAWANDA, N. Y., AREA MISSIONARY FOR THE FRONTIER ASSOCIATION, WILL LEAD THE CONGREGATION UNTIL A PASTOR IS APPOINTED.

MAGRUDER SAYS THIS IS THE FIRST WORK SPONSORED BY SOUTHERN BAPTISTS WITHIN BUFFALO. THE CITY'S POPULATION IS MORE THAN A HALF MILLION, AND 47,000 ARE POLISH.

GOLONKA, HIMSELF A NATIVE OF POLAND AND EASILY AT HOME WITH SIX LANGUAGES, SAYS THERE ARE MORE THAN SEVEN MILLION PEOPLE IN THE UNITED STATES WHO WERE BORN IN POLAND OR DESCENDED FROM POLISH PARENTS AND SPEAK POLISH.

HE IS HELPING ESTABLISH A SOUTHERN BAPTIST MINISTRY AMONG THESE PEOPLE, MOST OF WHOM ARE CONCENTRATED IN STATES BORDERING THE GREAT LAKES.

GOLONKA IS PRESIDENT OF THE POLISH BAPTIST ASSOCIATION. HE HAS BEEN PASTOR OF AN ENGLISH-SPEAKING CHURCH IN MINNESOTA AND A POLISH-SPEAKING CHURCH IN CHICAGO.

HE SAYS THE FIRST NEED IS TO ENLIST A YOUNG GENERATION OF POLISH DESCENT TO BE TRAINED IN THE COLLEGES AND SEMINARIES OF SOUTHERN BAPTISTS FOR MISSIONARY WORK AMONG THE POLISH PEOPLE.

**SURVEY SHOWS GADSDEN
BELOW NATION'S AVERAGE**

GADSDEN, ALA. (BP)--A RELIGIOUS SURVEY OF ETOWAH COUNTY, OF WHICH GADSDEN IS THE PRINCIPAL CITY, SHOWS ONLY 62.8 PER CENT OF ITS NEARLY 100,000 PEOPLE MEMBERS OF A CHURCH. THE NATIONAL AVERAGE IS 64.3 PER CENT.

"THE SURVEY FINDINGS CAME AS A SURPRISE TO MOST OF US WHO THOUGHT THE COUNTY ABOVE OR AT LEAST EQUAL TO THE NATIONAL AVERAGE IN CHURCH MEMBERSHIP," SAID SURVEY COORDINATOR, HUGH CHAMBLISS OF GADSDEN.

CHAMBLISS, CITY SUPERINTENDENT OF MISSIONS FOR ETOWAH BAPTISTS, SAID, "THERE WAS EXCELLENT COMMUNITY RESPONSE IN THE SURVEY, AND OF THE 20,000 HOMES CONTACTED ONLY 174 REFUSED US INFORMATION."

NEARLY 1900 WORKERS FROM 82 CHURCHES OF VARIOUS DENOMINATIONS PARTICIPATED IN SECURING INFORMATION FROM 67,800 RESIDENTS.

WILLIAM A. POWELL OF ATLANTA, A SURVEY SPECIALIST FOR THE HOME MISSION BOARD OF THE SOUTHERN BAPTIST CONVENTION, DIRECTED THE SURVEY.

POWELL RELEASED THESE FIGURES ONLY 58 PER CENT BELONG TO A LOCAL CHURCH (ONE CLOSE ENOUGH TO ATTEND REGULARLY), AND 24.6 PER CENT OF THESE DO NOT ATTEND AS OFTEN AS ONCE A MONTH.

THE DENOMINATIONAL STRUCTURE OF THE COUNTY SHOWS BAPTISTS WITH 60.3 PER CENT OF THE CHURCH MEMBERS, METHODISTS WITH 20.4 PER CENT, THE CHURCH OF CHRIST WITH 3.3 PER CENT, PRESBYTERIANS WITH 3 PER CENT, CHURCH OF GOD WITH 2.4 PER CENT, CATHOLICS WITH 2.1 PER CENT, AND ALL OTHERS WITH LESS THAN TWO PER CENT.

CHAMBLISS SAID THE BAPTIST CHURCHES OF THE COUNTY WOULD USE THE INFORMATION WITHIN THE NEXT TWO MONTHS IN A UNIFIED SUNDAY SCHOOL WITNESSING CAMPAIGN AND IN SIMULTANEOUS REVIVALS.

ALTHOUGH INVITED, THE NEGRO CHURCHES OF THE AREA DID NOT PARTICIPATE AND WERE NOT INCLUDED IN THE SURVEY.

OF THE 183 MINISTERS WHO WITHDREW FROM ACTIVE PARTICIPATION IN THE ANNUITY BOARD'S RETIREMENT PROGRAM, 108 SAID THEY WERE TURNING TO SECULAR WORK. ANOTHER SIX SAID THEY WERE LEAVING THE MINISTRY, ALTOGETHER, REED SAID.

THE TRUSTEES ALSO ELECTED OFFICERS: WALLACE BASSETT, PASTOR OF CLIFF TEMPLE BAPTIST CHURCH, DALLAS, AS PRESIDENT; W. J. BLACKWELL AND GUS) L. BERRY, BOTH LAYMEN, OF DALLAS, W. A. CRISWELL, PASTOR OF DALLAS' FIRST BAPTIST CHURCH, AND CARLTON S. PRICKETT, PASTOR OF FIRST BAPTIST CHURCH, BURLINGTON, NORTH CAROLINA, AS VICE PRESIDENTS. BEN C. BALL AND E. G. BROWN, PRESENT VICE PRESIDENTS FROM DALLAS, WILL REMAIN ON THE BOARD UNTIL MAY WHEN THEY LEAVE UNDER CONVNITION RULES

IN HIS REPORT, REED SAID THAT MORE THAN \$3 9 XXX \$3 1/4 MILLION WERE PAID IN BENEFITS DURING THE PAST 12 MONTHS TO ALMOST 6,000 BAPTIST MINISTERS, CHURCH AND DENOMINATIONAL EMPLOYEES. THIS SUM BROUGHT THE TOTAL BENEFITS PAID SINCE THE BEGINNING OF THE BOARD IN 1918 TO MORE THAN \$43,650,000, REED SAID.

FUNDS HELD IN TRUST FOR FUTURE PAYMENTS TO ALMOST 28,000 BAPTIST MINISTERS OR DENOMINATIONAL EMPLOYEES OR THEIR WIDOWS ROSE TO \$119,546,779, IN 1963, SOME \$14 MILIXX MILLION OVER THE PREVIOUS YEAR, REED SAID.

HE ADDED THAT 3,067 NEW MEMBERS JOINED THE RETIREMENT PLANS WITH 1,987 OF THEM BEING MINISTERS. WITH THIS INCREASE, 18,571 MINISTERS ARE NOW PROTECTED IN ONE OF THE PLANS THE BOARD ADMINISTERS, REED SAID.

BY CONTRAST, REED POINTED OUT, THE RELIEF ROLL DECREASED TO 722 PERSONS FROM A L 1962 HIGH OF 768. THESE RELIEF BENEFICIARIES, WHO WERE GIVEN \$201,421, ARE OLD MINISTERS OR THEIR WIDOWS WHO DID NOT JOIN THE RETIREMENT PROGRAM.

OTHER HIGHLIGHTS OF THE TWO-DAY MEETING INCLUDED THE APPROVAL OF BY-LAWS CHANGES TO COINCIDE WITH RE-ORGANIZATION CHANGES MADE LAST YEAR; AND A SPEECH BY HENRY W. WICKENHISER OF UNITED STATE S TRUST COMPANY, INVESTMENT COUNSEL FOR BOARD, WHO TOLD THE TRUSTEES "YOU CAN BE PROUD OF YOUR FUND. IT IS DOING VERY WELL INDEED," AS HE NOTED JTHE INTEREST RETURN ON INVESTMENTS MADE BY THE BOARD.

THE FINAL SESSION HIGHLIGHTED A SPEECH BY CHARLES BURRALL OF HUGGINS AND COMPANY OF PHILADELPHIA, ACTUARIAL FIRM FOR THE BOARD.

BURRALL CALLED THE THREE PLAN PROGRAM--SOUTHERN BAPTIST PROTECTION PLAN, AGE SECURITY PLAN AND VARIABLE ANNUITY FUND--THE "MOST UNIQUE PACKAGE OF PROTETTION FOR PASTOR IN THE DENOMINATIONAL PENSIONS FIELD."

"YOU CAN PUT YOUR BELIEF ON THE BACK FOR THIS, ESPCXXX ESPECIALLY YOUR SUPPLEMENTAL PLANS," BURRALL ADDED.

I THE VARIABLE ANNUITY FUND, A SUPPLEMENTAL PLAN, CLOSED THE YEAR WITH A UNIT VALUEXXXXX A PER UNIT VALUE OF \$1.2625, THE HIGHEST PRICE SINCE THE FUND'S BEGINNING FOUR YEARS AGO. TOTAL INCOME FROM THE 1064 MEMBERS IN THE VARIABLE REACHED A NEW HIGH OF \$1,203,963 AS OF DECEMBER 31.

HOUSE COMMITTEE MAY
HEAR PRAYER ARGUMENT

WASHINGTON (BP)--HEARINGS ON PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS ON PUBLIC SCHOOL PRAYERS AND BIBLE READINGS MAY BE HELD THIS YEAR BY THE HOUSE JUDICIARY COMMITTEE. REP. EMANUEL CELLER (R., N.Y.) IS CHAIRMAN OF THE COMMITTEE.

MANY RELIGIOUS LEADERS AND DENOMINATIONAL GROUPS AGREED WITH THE SUPREME COURT'S DECISIONS AGAINST REQUIRED RELIGIOUS EXERCISES IN PUBLIC SCHOOLS. HOWEVER, MEMBERS OF CONGRESS CONTINUE TO RECEIVE A FLOOD OF MAIL ASKING FOR SOMETHING TO BE DONE TO OVERTURN THE DECISION OF THE COURT.

AS A RESULT OF THIS PRESSURE 110 MEMBERS OF CONGRESS (96 IN THE HOUSE, 14 IN THE SENATE) HAVE INTRODUCED 132 MEASURES PROPOSING CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS ON RELIGION IN THE PUBLIC SCHOOLS. THE MOST AGGRESSIVE CONGRESSMAN FOR AN AMENDMENT IS REP. FRANK BECKER (R., N.Y.) WHO HAS INITIATED A DISCHARGE PETITION TO FORCE THE MATTER OUT OF THE HANDS OF THE HOUSE JUDICIARY COMMITTEE AND BRING IT DIRECTLY TO THE FLOOR OF THE HOUSE. HE HAS SUCCEEDED IN GETTING 125 OF THE NEEDED 218 SIGNATURES FOR THE DISCHARGE.

SEVERAL CIVIC, PATRIOTIC, POLITICAL AND RELIGIOUS GROUPS THROUGHOUT THE NAT

N HAVE BEEN ORGANIZED TO CAMPAIGN FOR A PRAYER AND BIBLE READING AMENDMENT. THESE GROUPS ARE BECOMING MORE MILITANT WHILE THE SUPPORTERS OF THE SUPREME COURT DECISION ARE REMAINING RELATIVELY QUIET.

IN AN EFFORT TO SATISFY HIS FELLOW CONGRESSMEN REP. CELLER HAS ORDERED A JUDICIARY COMMITTEE STAFF STUDY ON THE AMENDMENT PROPOSALS. THE STUDY WILL INCLUDE LEGAL QUESTIONS PLUS HISTORIC AND LEGAL BACKGROUND MATERIAL. IT IS IN THE FINAL STAGES OF PREPARATION.

THE STAFF STUDY WILL NOT BE A PUBLIC DOCUMENT FOR THE TIME BEING, BUT WILL SERVE AS A GUIDE FOR THE 35 MEMBERS OF THE HOUSE JUDICIARY COMMITTEE. THE COMMITTEE MAY, HOWEVER, DECIDE LATER TO MAKE THE DOCUMENT PUBLIC.

THE JUDICIARY COMMITTEE STAFF HAS INDICATED THAT SOME TIME AFTER THE STUDY IS COMPLETED CHAIRMAN CELLER WILL CALL FOR HEARINGS ON THE VARIOUS PROPOSALS. THE STAFF REFUSED TO PREDICT HOW SOON OR WHEN THESE HEARINGS MIGHT BE HELD.

ON JULY 26 AND AUGUST 2, 1962 THE SENATE JUDICIARY COMMITTEE, SEN. JAMES O. EASTLAND, (D., MISS.), CHAIRMAN, CONDUCTED HEARINGS ON SIMILAR PROPOSALS TO AMEND THE CONSTITUTION TO OFFSET THE EFFECT OF THE SUPREME COURT DECISION IN THE NEW YORK REGENTS' PRAYER CASE. ALTHOUGH ONLY A FEW WITNESSES WERE HEARD, ALL WHO WISHED TO SUBMIT TESTIMONY IN WRITING WERE ALLOWED TO DO SO. AT PRESENT THE SENATE SEEMS TO BE CONTENT TO LET THE HOUSE TAKE INITIATIVE ON THE PRAYER AMENDMENTS.

IN SPITE OF THE WIDESPREAD AGITATION OVER RELIGION IN THE SCHOOLS WASHINGTON OBSERVERS DO NOT ANTICIPATE THAT CONGRESS WILL BE CONFRONTED DIRECTLY ON THE AMENDMENT ISSUE THIS YEAR. MANY CONGRESSMEN WANT THE MATTER CONSIDERED IN A LESS EMOTIONAL CONTEXT AND AFTER FURTHER CLARIFICATION OF QUESTIONABLE POINTS BY THE SUPREME COURT ITSELF.

TALLAHASSEE, FLA. (BP)--FIRST BAPTIST CHURCH HERE WILL NOT VOTE ON WHETHER TO OPEN ITS DOORS AT PUBLIC WORSHIP SERVICES TO ALL PERSONS. REGARDLESS OF RACE, COLOR OR CREED.

AT A WEDNESDAY NIGHT PRAYER MEETING, MEMBERS VOTED 640 TO 626 AGAINST A CHURCHWIDE BALLOT RECOMMENDED BY THE DEACONS. THE BALLOT WOULD HAVE TESTED THE CHURCH'S FEELING ON WELCOMING ALL PERSONS TO WROSHIP. THE VOTE LEAVES IN EFFECT THE PRESENT CHURCH POLICY.

LIKE PROTESTANT CHURCHES IN THIS CAPITAL CITY OF FLORIDA, THE FIRST BAPTIST CHURCH MEMBERSHIP: 4464 HAS A POLICY OF SEGREGATION. ONLY THE ROMAN CATHOLIC CHURCH IN TALLAHASSEE IS FULLY INTEGRATED.

LAST YEAR, THE CITY'S LARGEST EPISCOPAL CHURCH LOST ITS MINISTER AFTER DIFFERENCES OF OPINION RELATED TO THE RACIAL QUESTION.

C. A. ROBERTS, PASTOR OF THE FIRST CHURCH, HAS PUBLICLY URGED THE MEMBERS TO VOTE TO CHANGE THE LONG-STANDING SEGREGATED WORSHIP POLICY. HE MADE AN URGENT PLEA FOR THIS CHANGE DURING A SUNDAY SERVICE WHICH WAS ALSO VIEWED BY AN AREAWIDE TELEVISION AUDIENCE.

DEACONS HAD RECOMMENDED THE CHURCH MEMBERSHIP BALLOT ON THE QUESTION AT THE FOLLOWING SUNDAY SERVICE. THE WEDNESDAY NIGHT VOTE, TECHNICALLY, WAS A VOTE TO REJECT THE RECOMMENDATION OF THE DEACONS. HAD THEY VOTED TO ACCEPT THE RECOMMENDATION, THERE WOULD STILL HAVE BEEN ANOTHER VOTE THE FOLLOWING SUNDAY.

FEELING ON THE MATTER RAN HIGH. W. T. MOORE, CHAIRMAN OF DEACONS. MODERATED THE DISCUSSION WHICH HE TRIED TO LIMIT TO EIGHT SPEAKERS--FOUR ON EACH SIDE. HE COULD NOT, HOWEVER, CLOSE DEBATE WITHOUT SOME OTHER STATEMENTS FROM THE AUDIENCE.

CLARK DURRANCE, A MEMBER OF THE DEACONS, AND 11 OTHERS FILED A MINORITY OPINION SAYING THEY DID NOT JOIN IN THE MAJORITY RECOMMENDATION.

BECAUSE TALLAHASSEE IS THE HOME OF TWO STATE UNIVERSITIES, RACIAL FEELING HAS BEEN UNUSUALLY KEEN. ONE UNIVERSITY, FLORIDA A&M, IS ALL-NEGRO. THE OTHER, FLORIDA STATE UNIVERSITY, WAS ALL-WHITE UNTIL TWO YEARS AGO WHEN TWO NEGROES WERE ADMITTED. THERE ARE ABOUT 12 NEGROES NOW AT FLORIDA STATE.

TALLAHASSEE WAS THE SCENE OF RACIAL DEMONSTRATIONS WHICH RESULTED IN MASS ARRESTS LAST YEAR AS NEGROES PICKETED DOWNTOWN BUSINESSES WHICH PRACTICED SEGREGATION.

DURING 1963, MANY TALLAHASSEE STORES DROPPED THEIR RACIAL BARRIERS AT LUNCH COUNTERS AND SOME HIRED NEGRO CLERKS FOR THE FIRST TIME IN HISTORY.

THE RECOMMENDATION FROM THE DEACONS SAID THEY JOINED WITH THE PASTOR "IN RECOMMENDING TO OUR CHURCH THAT WE OPEN THE DOORS OF OUR PUBLIC WORSHIP SERVICES TO ALL MEN, IRRESPECTIVE OF RACE, COLOR, OR CREED."

"SO FAR AS THE ADMINISTRATION IS CONCERNED," SAID MCCALL, "THEY ARE SIMPLY NEW STUDENTS. THE NEGROES WILL RECEIVE NO SPECIAL ATTENTION OR PREPARATION WHATEVER FROM THE SCHOOL."

ABOUT 11 NEGROES HAD APPLIED FOR ADMISSION OR INQUIRED ABOUT ENROLLING IN BAYLOR. THE FEW WHO WERE NOT ABLE TO GAIN ADMISSION COULD NOT MEET THE SCHOOL'S REGULAR ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS, SAID MCCALL.

MOST OF THEM WERE INTERESTED IN GRADUATE STUDY OR NIGHT SCHOOL CLASSES, THE BAYLOR PRESIDENT SAID. "WE SELDOM RECEIVE UNDERGRADUATE STUDENTS AT MID-TERM. SOME NEGRO UNDERGRADUATES ~~WAS~~ MADE INQUIRIES ; APPARENTLY FOR POSSIBLE FUTURE ENROLLMENT." *HAVE*

SEVEN PROFESSORS WHO HAD BEEN GRANTED PERMANENT STATUS SINCE KOINING THE FACULTY SIGNED THE HANDWRITTEN COPY OF THE "ABSTRACT OF PRINCIPLES" DRAWN UP BY THE FOUNDERS OF THE SEMINARY.

WILL PRESIDENT ASK FOR
AID TO CHURCH SCHOOLS?

WASHINGTON (BP)--RUMBLINGS THAT PRESIDENT JOHNSON WILL RECOMMEND TO CONGRESS SOME FORM OF FEDERAL AID TO PAROCHIAL SCHOOLS COULD CONTINUE TO BE HEARD AROUND THE NATION'S CAPITAL.

HOWEVER, A WHITE HOUSE AIDE TOLD BAPTIST PRESS THAT NEWSPAPER STORIES TO THAT EFFECT "ARE FULL OF HOT AIR" BECAUSE "WE HAVE NOT YET DECIDED WHAT WE ARE GOING TO RECOMMEND TO CONGRESS." HE DID SAY, HOWEVER, THAT THE DISCUSSIONS ARE ON UNDERWAY AND THAT THE ADMINISTRATION HOPES TO BELIEVE ITS EDUCATION-POVERTY MESSAGE TO CONGRESS SOMETIME IN FEBRUARY.

THE WASHINGTON POST REPORTED THAT MEETINGS "HELD WITHOUT FANFARE" HAVE INCLUDED THE NATIONAL CATHOLIC EDUCATIONAL ASSOCIATION, THE NATIONAL EDUCATION ASSOCIATION AND THE U. S. OFFICE OF EDUCATION. THE WHITE HOUSE AIDE SAID THAT "NOTHING IS KNOWN AROUND THE WHITE HOUSE ABOUT ANY SUCH MEETINGS."

THIS DOES NOT MEAN, HOWEVER, THAT DISCUSSIONS DID NOT TAKE PLACE BETWEEN PERSONS WITHIN EACH OF THESE GROUPS AND THAT AN INFORMAL MEETING OF MINDS MAY NOT HAVE BEEN ACHIEVED.

PRESIDENT JOHNSON'S BUDGET MESSAGE TO CONGRESS CONTAINED A SECTION ON "EDUCATION" AND ANOTHER ON "HEALTH, LABOR AND WELFARE." THESE TWO SECTIONS CONTAIN MANY AREAS OF OVERLAPPING AND FREQUENTLY "EDUCATION" IS FOUND UNDER THE CATEGORY OF "WELFARE" TO PERSONS. IT HAS BEEN COMPARATIVELY EASY TO PASS WELFARE LEGISLATION AND DIFFICULT TO PASS EDUCATION AID. MR. PRESIDENT JOHNSON HAS COME UP WITH A MASSIVE ATTACK ON "POVERTY." IT IS TO BE EXPECTED THAT MEASURES TO PROVIDE CERTAIN TYPES OF EDUCATIONAL BENEFITS FOR POVERTY AND DISASTER AREAS WILL BE INCLUDED IN WHATEVER PROGRAMS ARE RECOMMENDED. AN ILLUSTRATION OF THE WAY THIS MIGHT WORK IS A REMEDIAL READING PROGRAM. CONTRACTS COULD BE AWARDED TO EITHER PUBLIC OR PRIVATE AGENCIES FOR SUCH CLASSES AND THEY COULD BE PUBLICLY ADMINISTERED EVEN THROUGH THE FACILITIES OF A PRIVATE SCHOOL WERE USED.

ANOTHER POLITICAL FACT OF LIFE IS THAT THE CHURCH-STATE PICTURE IN THE NATION CHANGED OVERNIGHT WITH THE DEATH OF PRESIDENT KENNEDY. C. EMANUEL CARLSON, EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE BAPTIST JOINT COMMITTEE ON PUBLIC AFFAIRS, HAS SPILLED OUT THIS FACTOR. HE SAYS, "THE UNTIMELY DEATH OF THE ROMAN CATHOLIC PRESIDENT, YIELDING THE POST OF CHIEF EXECUTIVE TO A PROTESTANT, HAS PROBABLY SUSTAINED THE JAY OF NATIONAL DEBATE" ON THE WAYS AND MEANS OF AIDING THE CHURCH-RELATED ELEMENTARY AND SECONDARY SCHOOLS.

IN BRIEF, THE REASON FOR SUCH AN OBSERVATION IS THAT THE ROMAN CATHOLIC CANDIDATE NEEDED STRONG PROTESTANT SUPPORT TO WIN THE ELECTION. HENCE, IT WOULD BE NORMAL FOR A RIGID STAND TO BE TAKEN ON POLICIES AFFECTING SEPARATION OF CHURCH AND STATE. ON THE OTHER HAND, THE PROTESTANT SEEKING ELECTION NEEDS STRONG CATHOLIC SUPPORT. NASHVILLE -- THE 58-MEMBER ELECTED BOARD OF THE SUNDAY SCHOOL BOARD IN ITS ANNUAL MEETING HERE JAN. XXIX 27-28 HEARD REPORTS FROM ITS NINE COMMITTEES. EXECUTIVE SECRETARY-TREASURER JAMES L. SULLIVAN LED IN THE REPORT OF THE BOARD'S PROGRAMS OF WORK AS ASSIGNED BY THE SOUTHERN BAPTIST CONVENTION.

HIGHLIGHTS OF THE MEETING INCLUDE THE ADOPTION OF A POLICY TO EXTEND INDEFINITELY THE PRESENT PROGRAM OF SUPPLYING 25 COPIES OF "BAPTIST HYMNAL" TO NEW CHURCHES AND MISSIONS. THIS PROGRAM, WHICH BEGAN FEB. 1, 1958, WAS TO HAVE EXPIRED SEPT. 30, 1964, AT THE END OF THE BAPTIST JUBILEE ADVANCE PERIOD.

DURING THE PAST FISCAL YEAR, 14,925 COPIES OF "BAPTIST HYMNAL" WERE SENT TO 597 NEW CHURCHES AND MISSIONS.

THE FINANCIAL REPORT FOR THE 1962-3 FISCAL YEAR ENDING SEPT. 30 SHOWS NET SALES AND EARNINGS OF THE BOARD'S PUBLISHING, BOOK STORE AND ASSEMBLY OPERATIONS TO BE \$27,952,000. THIS IS AN INCREASE OF \$115,000 OVER THE SAME PERIOD IN 1962.

MORE DETAIL FIGURES WERE GIVEN IN A PRELIMINARY REPORT ISSUED LAST NOVEMBER. FROM NET EARNINGS, \$874,732 WAS MADE AVAILABLE TO THE STATE CONVENTIONS FOR THE PROMOTION OF SUNDAY SCHOOL, TRAINING UNION, STUDENT, CHURCH MUSIC, AND CHURCH ARCHITECTURAL WORK. THE BOARD DOES NOT RECEIVE ANY COOPERATIVE PROGRAM FUNDS.

GROWING EDGE SHARPENED
IN CHURCH SCHOOL ISSUE

WASHINGTON (BP)--THE "GROWING EDGE" IN CHURCH-STATE RELATIONS WAS SHARPENED BY THE PASSAGE OF THE HIGHER EDUCATION FACILITIES ACT OF 1963, ACCORDING TO C. EMANUEL CARLSON IN AN ANALYSIS IN THE REPORT FROM THE CAPITAL FOR JANUARY-FEBRUARY. HE WROTE ON "THE GROWING EDGE OF CHURCH-STATE RELATIONS IN EDUCATION."

CARLSON IS EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE BAPTIST JOINT COMMITTEE ON PUBLIC AFFAIRS HERE. REPORT FROM THE CAPITAL IS A MONTHLY BULLETIN PUBLISHED BY THE COMMITTEE. THE NEW EDUCATION LAW PROVIDES \$1.2 BILLION IN GRANTS AND LOANS FOR CONSTRUCTION OF ACADEMIC FACILITIES (SCIENCE, ENGINEERING, MATHEMATICS, FOREIGN LANGUAGES, AND LIBRARIES) IN BOTH PUBLIC AND CHURCH-RELATED COLLEGES.

THE NEW FEDERAL COLLEGE AID PROGRAM MAY HAVE A TWO-PRONGED LONG-RANGE EFFECT (1) ON THE COLLEGES AND THE FUTURE OF CHRISTIAN EDUCATION AND (2) ON PUBLIC AID TO PAROCHIAL SCHOOLS, ACCORDING TO CARLSON'S ANALYSIS.

AS FOR THE DENOMINATIONAL COLLEGES, HE SAID THAT THERE COULD BE A SHIFT FROM THE TRADITIONAL LIBERAL ARTS FIELD "TO THE MORE FUNCTIONAL APPLIED SCIENCES." IN ADDITION, INCREASED FACILITIES MEAN A SHARP RISE IN OPERATING COSTS WHICH CANNOT BE OFFSET BY TUITION. THIS MEANS THAT MANY CHURCH COLLEGES MAY BE SO PRESSED FOR FUNDS TO OPERATE THIS EXPANDED EMPHASIS THAT THEY WILL BECOME PRIVATE COMMUNITY SCHOOLS IN ORDER TO BE ELIGIBLE FOR PUBLIC FUNDS WITHOUT FACING THE "RELIGIOUS" ISSUE.

IF THERE IS DISCUSSION IN THE NATION, CARLSON INDICATED, THAT CHURCH UNIVERSITIES "HAVE ALREADY OUTGROWN THEIR CHURCH ANCESTRY AND ARE NOW AGENCIES OF PUBLIC POLICY," THIS IS SEEN IN MILITARY RESEARCH PROJECTS, NUMEROUS OTHER CONTRACTS, PROJECTS AND SERVICES THAT "MAKE THESE INSTITUTIONS VITALLY TIED INTO THE WHOLE ECONOMIC AND POLITICAL STRUCTURE."

THE FUTURE OF CHURCH-RELATED COLLEGES IS NOW UP TO THE CHURCHES AND THE SCHOOLS, CARLSON POINTED OUT. IN VIEW OF THE NEW NATIONAL POLICY TO SUPPORT AND DEVELOP EXISTING COLLEGES RATHER THAN TO BUILD NEW ONES, HE SAID, "THE CHURCHES AND THEIR SCHOOLS ARE NOW FREE TO MAKE THEIR CHOICES ON PROGRAMS AND RELATIONSHIPS."

HE FURTHER RAISED "AN UNAVOIDABLE QUESTION FOR THE AMERICAN PEOPLE AND FOR CONGRESS." HE ASKED, "DO THE SAME PRINCIPLES APPLY IN ELEMENTARY AND IN SECONDARY EDUCATION AS IN HIGHER EDUCATION?" HE SAID THAT THE ARGUMENTS THAT THERE IS A DIFFERENCE BETWEEN HIGHER EDUCATION AND ELEMENTARY AND SECONDARY EDUCATION "HAVE LACKED CONVINCING QUALITY BECAUSE OF THE SECTARIAN OWNERSHIP."

HE DISCUSSED THREE FACTORS THAT MAY LEAD TO THE EXTENSION OF PUBLIC AID TO CHURCH COLLEGES DOWNWARD TO PAROCHIAL SCHOOLS.

1. THERE HAS BEEN A SHIFT ON THE POLITICAL LEVEL. THE NEED OF A PRESIDENT WHO WAS A CATHOLIC FOR PROTESTANT SUPPORT WAS A CONTRIBUTING FACTOR IN PRESIDENT KENNEDY'S RIGID STAND ON CHURCH-STATE RELATIONS. NOW THAT THERE IS A PRESIDENT WHO IS A PROTESTANT THE SITUATION IS REVERSED AND STRONG CATHOLIC SUPPORT IS NEEDED. "HE MAY HAVE TO SHOW THEM THAT HE IS CONCERNED ABOUT THEIR ROMAN CATHOLIC INSTITUTIONS AND THEIR INTERESTS NA XXX INTERESTS AND IDEAS," CARLSON SAID.

2. THE PAROCHIAL SCHOOL SPONSORS THEMSELVES "SEE THEIR SCHOOLS AS BEING AS MERITORIUXXX MERITORIOUS OF TAX SUPPORT AS ARE THE CHURCH SCHOOLS AT THE COLLEGE LEVEL."

"THE QUESTIONS ABOUT OWNERSHIP AND CONTROL, ABOUT THE TRUE PURPOSES OF THE INSTITUTION, ABOUT SELECTIVE POLICIES FOR PUPILS AND TEACHERS, ABOUT SYMBOLIC AND CEREMONIAL LIFE IN THE SCHOOL, AND OTHER RELATED QUESTIONS WILL BE BRUSHED ASIDE IN THIS DISCUSSION AS THEY HAVE BEEN IN THE HIGHER EDUCATION DEBATE," HE SAID.

3. THE OPPONENTS OF PAROCHIAL SCHOOLS MAY FAVOR PUBLIC AID TO THEM. CARLSON BASED THIS VIEW ON THE FORMULA, "GIVE THE CHURCH SCHOOLS PUBLIC MONEY AND FOLLOW UP WITH PUBLIC CONTROL." IN THIS WAY "THE PAROCHIAL SCHOOLS MAY ALSO BE ON THEIR WAY TOWARD BECOMING 'PUBLIC-PRIVATE INSTITUTIONS.'"

ALTERNATE IDEAS FOR SOLVING THE RELIGIOUS SCHOOL DILEMMA WERE MENTIONED IN CARLSON'S ANALYSIS. THEY ARE "SHARED TIME" WHEREBY A PUPIL ATTENDS BOTH A PUBLIC AND A CHURCH SCHOOL, AND IN HIGHER EDUCATION AN AFFILIATED SYSTEM OF SCHOOLS AROUND A UNIVERSITY CAMPUS.

SIXTY-THREE PARTICIPANTS ATTENDED A CLINIC ON MENTAL RETARDATION OFFERED BY THE OFFICE OF SPECIAL MINISTRIES, MISSOURI BAPTIST CONVENTION, JANUARY 18-30, AT WINDERNERE BAPTIST ASSEMBLY, ON THE LAKE OF THE OZARKS.

- THIS CLINIC, SHOUTHERNX SOUTHERN BAPTISTS' FIRST STATE-WIDE CLINIC ON MENTAL RETARDATION, BROUGHT AUTHORITIES FROM SEVERAL FIELDS RELATED TO MENTAL RETARDATION TOGETHER WITH PASTORS, EDUCATIONAL DIRECTORS, ASSOCIATIONAL SUPERINTENDENT OF MISSIONS, PARENTS, AND TEACHERS. PRUPOSE OF THE CLINIC WAS TO INFORM PASTORS AND THEIR MEMBERS ABOUT THE PROBLEMS OF MENTAL RETARDATION AND TO HELP THEM SEE HOW THEY COULD EXTEND THEIR MINISTRIES TO INCLUDE THE MENTALLY RETARDED.

PLENARY SESSIONS DELT WITH: ORIENTATION--FACTS AND FANCIES IN MENTAL RETARDATION; BASIC CONCERNS AND ANTICIPATIONS; CASE STUDIES--AND FOLLOW UP; AVAILABLE SERVICES AND HOW TO FIND THEM; PUBLIC AWARENESS AND COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT; AND IMPRESSIONS AND ANALYSIS OF THE CLINIC.

EACH WORKSHOP LEADER LED SEVEN AND ONE-HALF HOURS OF STUDY ON: LEARNING PROBLEMS AND TEACHING TECHNIQUES; BEHAVIOUR PATTERNS OF THE RETARDED CHILD; FAMILY PROBLEMS AND COUNSELING WITH PARENTS; SEGREGATION, INTEGRATION AND GROUPING OF THE RETARDED; AND "SETTING UP EXERCIESXX EXERCISES"--HOW TO BEGIN A MINISTRY WITH THE RETARDED.

TO WELCOME NEGROES

BALTIMORE (BP)--TWO BALTIMORE-AREA SOUTHERN BAPTIST CHURCHES HAVE VOTED THAT RACE WILL NOT BE A FACTOR IN CONSIDERING APPLICANTS FOR CHURCH MEMBERSHIP, FOLLOWING THE LEAD OF SEVERAL AREA CHURCHES WHICH HAD ALREADY TAKEN SUCH A STEP.

THEY ARE THE 1,200-MEMBER GREGORY MEMORIAL BAPTIST CHURCH IN BALTIMORE AND THE 303-MEMBER VALLEY BAPTIST CHURCH AT LUTHERVILLE.

A SIMILAR STAND WAS TAKEN BY THE FIRST BAPTIST CHURCH OF CAMBRIDGE, MD., IN THE MIDDLE OF RACIAL DIFFICULTIES IN THAT CITY LAST OCTOBER. THE MEMBERS VOTED TO WELCOME "ALL PERSONS" FOR ATTENDANCE AND TO RECOGNIZE AS NEW CHRISTIANS "ALL INDIVIDUALS COMING FORWARD ON PROFESSION OF FAITH."

THESE CHURCHES, LIKE ALL OTHERS AFFILIATED WITH THE BAPTIST CONVENTION OF MARYLAND, HAVE NO CONSTITUTIONAL RESTRICTIONS AGAINST ACCEPTING PERSONS OF OTHER RACES. AT THE SAME TIME, LIKE MOST OF THEIR SISTER CHURCHES, THEIR MEMBERSHIPS ARE ALL WHITE.

THE BAPTIST CONVENTION OF MARYLAND ADOPTED A RESOLUTION AT ITS ANNUAL SESSION LAST NOVEMBER "STRONGLY" URSING MEMBER CHURCHES "TO OPEN THEIR SERVICES OF WORSHIP AND INSTRUCTION TO MEN OF ALL RACES, RECEIVING THEM WITHOUT DISCRIMINATION BECAUSE OF COLOR IN REGARD TO FELLOWSHIP AND MEMBERSHIP."

REGARDLESS OF POLICIES AGREED ON IN ADVANCE, A BAPTIST CONGREGATION RETAINS THE RIGHT TO DECIDE ON EACH APPLICATION FOR CHURCH MEMBERSHIP BY MAJORITY VOTE, USUALLY BASED ON A PROFESSION OF FAITH IN JESUS CHRIST OR ON TRANSFER OF LETTER FROM ANOTHER BAPTIST CHURCH.

PRIOR TO THE STATE CONVENTION REQUEST, ONE AFFILIATED CHURCH, EDGEWOOD BAPTIST OF EDGEWOOD, MD., HAD ACCEPTED A NEGRO MEMBER, MRS. ALICE COOK. SHE WAS RECEIVED BY VOTE OF THE CONGREGATION, WITHOUT DISSENT, IN THE SUMMER OF 1962. SHE PRESENTED HERSELF FOR MEMBERSHIP BY LETTER FROM A PITTSBURGH, PA., NEGRO BAPTIST CHURCH.

MRS. COOK CAME TO THE CITY WITH HER SON, AN ARMY CAPTAIN ASSIGNED TO THE EDGEWOOD ARSENAL. SHE HAS BEEN ONE OF THE CHURCH'S "MOST FAITHFUL MEMBERS," PASTOR WENDALL GROSS REPORTED. "SHE SINGS IN THE CHOIR AND ATTENDS ALL OF THE SERVICES OF THE CHURCH," HE STATED.

IN ADDITION, THE 13 SOUTHERN BAPTIST CHURCHES IN METROPOLITAN NEW YORK CITY, AFFILIATED WITH THE MARYLAND CONVENTION, ALL ARE OPEN TO PERSONS OF ALL RACES. ONE OF THESE, FIRST BAPTIST OF BROOKLYN, N. Y., IS PREDOMINANTLY NEGRO. THIS MEANS THAT SOUTHERN BAPTIST DENOMINATIONAL MEETINGS IN THIS AREA HAVE BEEN INTEGRATED FOR SOME TIME.

GREGORY MEMORIAL, BALTIMORE, REVISED ITS CONSTITUTION EARLY IN JANUARY TO SPECIFICALLY OPEN MEMBERSHIP. IT IS NOW PHEASED OUT IN THE CHURCH CONSTITUTION THAT PERSONS WILL BE RECEIVED FOR MEMBERSHIP, "REGARDLESS OF RACE, ANCESTRY OR NATIONAL ORIGIN," PASTOR G. W. BULLARD SAID.

~~THE CHURCH HAS BEEN ADVISED THAT THE CHURCH AND HAVE BEEN DENIED WITHOUT DISCRIMINATION.~~

IN REACTION WHICH BULLARD SAID WAS SEPARATE AND UNRELATED, THE CHURCH VOTED TO DELAY RECEPTION OF NEW MEMBERS UNTIL THEY HAVE BEEN VISITED BY A CHURCH MEMBERSHIP COMMITTEE. THE USUAL POLICY IN SOUTHERN BAPTIST CHURCHES IS TO VOTE ON CANDIDATES FOR MEMBERSHIP IMMEDIATELY.

THE PURPOSE OF THIS POLICY, HE STATED, IS TO ACQUAINT THOSE APPLYING FOR MEMBERSHIP WITH THE CHURCH CONSTITUTION AND TO HELP THEM ASSUME THEIR RESPONSIBILITIES AS CHURCH MEMBERS.

VALLEY BAPTIST CHURCH, LUTHERVILLE, VOTED LAST OCTOBER TO INTERPRET THE CONSTITUTION AS OFFERING MEMBERSHIP TO ALL PERSONS "WITHOUT REGARD TO RACE OR COLOR." THERE WERE NO DISSENTING VOTES. RICHARD O. SAT SATCHELL IS PASTOR.

THE DEACONS OF UNIVERSITY BAPTIST CHURCH, BALTIMORE, AND CALVARY BAPTIST CHURCH, EDISON, MD., HAD VOTED THAT CHURCH MEMBERSHIP SHOULD BE WITHOUT REGARD TO RACE. HOWEVER, THE FULL CONGREGATION HAD NOT FELT THAT

~~XXX THAT ANY ACTION WAS NEEDED BY EITHER CHURCH, AND NEITHER CHURCH HAS HAD A NEGRO APPLICANT FOR MEMBERSHIP.~~

MOST BAPTIST CONVENTION OF MARYLAND CHURCHES OCCASIONALLY HAVE NEGRO VISITORS. THERE HAVE BEEN NO REPORTS OF ANY PERSONS BEING DENIED THE PRIVILEGE OF WORSHIP.

BALTIMORE (BP)--TWO BALTIMORE-AREA SOUTHERN BAPTIST CHURCHES HAVE VOTED THAT RACE WILL NOT BE A FACTOR IN CONSIDERING APPLICANTS FOR CHURCH MEMBERSHIP, FOLLOWING THE LEAD OF SEVERAL AREA CHURCHES WHICH HAD ALREADY TAKEN SUCH A STEP.

THEY ARE THE 1,200-MEMBER GREGORY MEMORIAL BAPTIST CHURCH IN BALTIMORE AND THE 300-MEMBER VALLEY BAPTIST CHURCH AT LUTHERVILLE.

A SIMILAR STAND WAS TAKEN BY THE FIRST BAPTIST CHURCH OF CAMBRIDGE, MD., IN THE MIDST OF RACIAL DIFFICULTIES IN THAT CITY LAST OCTOBER. THE MEMBERS VOTED TO WELCOME "ALL PERSONS" FOR ATTENDANCE AND TO ~~RECOGNIZE AS NEW CHRISTIANS~~ "ALL INDIVIDUALS COMING FORWARD ON PROFESSION OF FAITH."

ATLANTA (BP)--THE USE OF THE MISSIONS COMMITTEES OF CHURCHES AND ASSOCIATIONS IN 1964 WILL DETERMINE THE SUCCESS OF THE FINAL YEAR OF SOUTHERN BAPTISTS' 30,000 MOVEMENT.

THIS STATEMENT WAS MADE HERE BY TWO LEADERS IN THE MOVEMENT, WHICH IS AN EFFORT BY THE DENOMINATION TO START 10,000 CHURCHES AND 20,000 MISSIONS IN THE YEARS 1956-64.

THE LEADERS WERE C. C. WARREN OF CHARLOTTE, N. C., AND M. WENDELL BELOXX BELEW OF ATLANTA. WARREN IS DIRECTOR OF THE 30,000 MOVEMENT EMPLOYED BY THE MISSION AGENCY AND THE SUNDAY SCHOOL BOARD.

BELEW IS SECRETARY OF THE DEPARTMENT OF ASSOCIATIONAL ADMINISTRATION ~~AND CHURCH EXTENSION FOR THE HOME MISSION BOARD.~~

"SOME 9,000 MISSIONS AND CHURCHES MUST BE STARTED THIS YEAR, IF WE ARE TO REACH OUR GOAL," WARREN SAID. "THIS IS AN IMPOSSIBLE TASK UNLESS CHURCHES AND ASSOCIATIONS USE THEIR MISSIONS COMMITTEES IN DISCOVERING AREAS OF NEED AND ENLISTING WORKERS TO START SUCH MISSIONS."

WARREN AND BELEW SAID THE PRIMARY DUTIES OF THE COMMITTEES WERE DISCOVERY OF NEEDS, DISTRIBUTION OF INFORMATION, ENLISTMENT OF WORKERS, AND CORRELATION OF MISSION ACTIVITIES.

THE ALSO ASKED FOR A CHURCH AND ASSOCIATION EMPHASIS ON HISTORY. A STUDY OF HOW BAPTIST CHURCHES HAVE BEEN STARTED AND THE SACRIFICE AND EFFORTS OF OUTSTANDING MINISTERS WILL REVEAL THE PATTERNS OF BAPTIST MISSION ADVANCE, THEY STATED.
