Mrs. Staebler also expressed her belief that extremism in government is a political evil. "We must repudiate, and work to prevent the extremists and showmen from gaining political power."



State Gets **Bad Drivers**

LANSING-Michigan's problem drivers are receiving the "get tough" treatment from the state's enforcement agencies, a report covering activities in the driver improvement program of the Secretary of State's office revealed.

Secretary of State James M. Hare said revocations and suspensions on Michigan's point system were up more than 2,500 during the first six months of

Of this total, 563 licenses were revoked, while 6,268 were suspended. Totals in 1963 were 289 revocations and 4,030 suspensions. "Vigorous action in suspensions and revocations has brought about a reduction in the number of licenses restricted," Hare

Tempering the tougher treatment of the chronic problem drivers is an acceleration of the positive aspect of driver services . . . the driver improvement program through the multiple interview programs, the newlyestablished conference interview programs, and the warning letters to persons who are at the seven-, eight-, and ninepoint levels.

Multiple interview instructions increased more than 1,000 during the first half of 1964, while warning letters went up from 15,775 last year to more than 40,000 already in 1964.

In the other phase of the driver licensing program, mandatory suspensions for felonies, drunk driving, and reckless driving went up nearly 600 from 2,988 to 3,584. Unsatisfied judgment suspensions under financial responsibility laws jumped from 1,922 to 2,434. Accident suspensions were up from 2,693 to 3,110.







The company's 1964 model year passenger car production totaled 2,068.399, surpassing the company's previous record of 2,033,733 cars built during the 1957 model run.

At its regular meeting last Thursday, the Livonia School Board went on record as supporting a one-mill county tax limitation increase proposal which will be on the Sept. 1, 1964 primary ballot.

Trustee Strelsa Schreiber, who is also recording secretary for the Wayne County Association of School Boards, explained the purpose of the proposal and urged that Livonia voters support it at the ballot box next month.

Mrs. Schreiber moved that the Livonia Board join other school boards in Wayne County in supporting the proposal. After a short discussion the Board gave its unanimous ap-

Board Vice-President Steve Polgar raised the question of the propriety of one governmental unit backing another agency's legislation to obtain additional funds, but Assistant Superintendent of the District Ronald Upton assured Mr. Polgar the County needed the additional funds, and if they could not raise the extra mill to run its countywide program the money would come from the local school board allocations. Mr. Polgar then agreed to vote

"Under the old law the County had a 15-mill limitation," Mrs. Schreiber pointed out. "Under the new constitution the limit is 18 mills. However, instead of requesting a three-mill increase the County is seeking a one-mill addition this fall.

"The County needs these additional funds. If they cannot raise the extra mill to run its county-wide program the money will have to come indirectly from local school board allocations. Having these tax monies flow directly to the County is more efficient than having the funds drained away from Livonia, Farmington, Plymouth, Redford, and other school board coffers," concluded Mrs. Schreiber.

There are 43 school districts represented in the Wayne County Association of School Boards. In a statement sent to all participants early this month recording secretary Schreiber wrote, "that it should be pointed out to our members that all of our districts with the exception of one have had to increase their local millages in order to meet added school costs. Attention was further called to the fact, that in appearances before the Tax allocation Board, school people in all districts have repeatedly stressed to County officials their feeling that the County should request additional millage to meet their increased should request additional millneeds and added costs."

hearted boys in the business. Did the production pay offthat's their concern.

Take "Here's Love", the Meridith Wilson musical that opened here at the Fisher last year, for example. The reviews were fairly good-that is, all but old Wally's. Remember how I blasted this sentimental musical? Well, the record shows that the musical played on Broadway almost a year and still did not pay back its production costs of some 450,000 dollars. When it closed last week, it left \$275,000 yet to be paid to its backers. Or

to put it more succinctly-it

was a financial flop. Out at University of Detroit the summer Festival of plays Director James Rodgers confided to old Wally that the season had been a monetary and an artistic success. All critics had enjoyed the rough and tumble version of "Midsummer Night's Dream" and the gossamer "Glass Mena-gerie". Crowds had packed the U of D tent during the month-long run of the twin bill. Mr. Rodger's spirited direc-

tion of this lyrical comedy by William Shakespeare gave new life to this early work of the Bard. The low comedy sequences had zest and a guffaw quality seldom seen at U of D until Mr. Rodger's appearance. Audiences put their stamp of approval on such shenanigans by their almost constant laughter during the last act of "Dream". Peter Kempel, Thomas St. Charles, William Lightfoot, Robert Gray, Dominic Missimi, and Anthony Peraino aided and abetted the comic directorial machinations of Mr. Rodgers in their astute acting of their low comedy roles.

Paul Wheeler, fugitive from the Plymouth Theater Guild and the Livonia Redford Players Guild, leapt delicately about the stage as the very essence of the world of fantasy. His rendering of the lines showed great potentional for Mr. Wheeler in the field of classical drama. His Puck was a sheer delight.

Over in Dearborn another Summer festival of plays opened amid great fanfare: the American Drama Festival's "Our American Cousin" and "Metamora". "Cousin' had a gala premiere on Thursday night. The evening was special in several

Thursday, July 30 was the 101st birthday of Henry Ford. To celebrate the occasion the Henry Ford Museum Theater was re-lit with a play that skipped gaily along for two hours. 'Our American Cousin" is a delightful comedy about the adventures of a Yankee that inherits an English castle. He falls in love, but not before he has met eight or nine wierd English folk, straightened out their affairs, and proposed marriage to

a Scottish dairy maid. Michael Landrum as Asa Trenchard the Yankee had the choice role of the evening. He made the most of it. His swagger and attack was pretty nigh perfect. He and John Criner as Lord Dundreary fought all evening for the lion's share of the acting honors. Pat Criner was a lovely Florence. Her deft characterization had a moving and engrossing quality to it. Everything about the production of "American Cousin" contained an air of good fun about it.

The opening audience gave the cast 10 curtain calls as a reward for their excellent work. Our town is richer for residents and visitors to the Greenfield Village with such a beautifully comic production on view. Tickets can be reserved for the Monday, Wednesday, Friday performances of this comedy by calling 271-1055. The box office is open every day after 2 p.m. Incidentally, curtain is at 8 p.m. Performances last only until 10 p.m. so bring the entire family. You'll find that American Cousin" and "Metamora" (reviewed in this issue) to be excellent dramatic fare for the youngsters.

Next week old Wally will file his minority report on "Fiddler On The Roof". Although Zero Mostel charmed and cavorted his way through this expensive musical, it still has a long way to go before it will be acceptable to the hard-hearted Broadway critics. As we said earlier the Broadway classification of a hit is purely financial. To sell those tickets you must mix enough of those magic ingredients to attract everyone's attention. The Zero Mostel musical in its present state needs more melodic music and some supporting players that can sing and carry the show when Zero is off-stage.



In recent years Facts and Opinions has become extremely discouraged with the increase in juvenile and teen-age mischief in our communities.

For some time it has been a belief that much of it comes from the breakdown of desire to discipline by parents . . . or at least, a ducking of responsibility

Recently we read of a Judge out west who said he had seen a reduction in the amount of juvenile crime in his community after he instituted a policy of giving his court actions wide newspaper publicity. (As contrasted to the general policy here and in most places of withholding publication of names of offenders if they are 17 years old or younger.)

The Observer always has withheld juvenile names in police matters, but we do it with misgivings. Such a policy protects the parents of delinquents; shields them from public embarrassment and disapproval. And we maintain that the place from which corrective action best can come is the home.

Anyway, Facts and Opinions took the question to Judge James Lincoln, the Wayne County juvenile court expert. Lincoln returned his views in a letter, parts of

"For the most part, newspapers are not interested and make little effort to inform themselves about the day to day problems of Juvenile Court. They are interested in news and from this point of view, the "run of the mill" case is dull.

"The juveniles who give me the most trouble do not read newspapers anyway. Over eighty percent of the juveniles in the Youth Home never graduate from high school. Eighty-six percent of them are two years or more being actual grade placement in reading level. The sixteen year olds average over four years behind grade placement in their reading levels. I am very certain that most of the juveniles in the Youth Home are unaware of the newspaper strike in Detroit and would be unaware of it if they were outside except for a curtailed opportunity to hold up newspaper boys.

"New York treats sixteen year olds as adults. They can print the names of sixteen year olds and they are having more trouble than Michigan.

"What makes you think that the papers would cover Juvenile Court any more than Recorder's or Circuit Court? They only print the names of a few of the 17 or 18 year olds largely in the cases that have some aspect that makes them newsworthy.

"You suggest printing the names of repeaters only. Why not put case-hardened delinquents in training

"I have had to turn loose many boys because of the lack of space, but I never saw one that would be rehabilitated by printing his name. I have seen cases where print-

"One boy who had never been in trouble got his name and picture in the papers on a murder charge. His brother had committed the murder. When I released him he had acquired a reputation due to the newspaper publicity, so he started living up to his reputation by pulling fire alarms, etc.

"Since I have been on the Bench, the papers have printed the names of many boys involved in trouble. In no case has printing the name ever helped, but I know of cases where it hurt.
