Message from the Director of Artillery

Fellow Gunners,

Many will reflect back on 2008 as an important one in our Regimental history. The pace and breadth of Artillery transformation has rarely been so noteworthy other than in times of global conflict. As we continued to support the Canadian Task Force in Afghanistan with the provision of gun batteries, FOO/FAC parties, SUAV troops, FSCCs, ASCCs, and individual staff officers and NCOs, we fielded new capabilities, undertook restructuring in our regiments, welcomed an influx of new soldiers in the quest for further growth, and pushed forward with important projects designed to provide the Army with enhanced capabilities.

I am happy to report that the Royal Regiment remains generally healthy and strongly motivated, despite the almost-chaotic pace of activity. With a small core group of like-minded staff and the active participation of COs and RSMS, we have moved forward with a new force structure model that will hopefully see considerable integration of Reserve Gunners in the taskings/missions of our Regular Force Regiments. Given that we will not see any further appreciable growth in Regular Force personnel after 2010, we have had to "harvest" some of our intended growth and re-direct it to meet future capabilities, such as the new Long Range Precision Guided Rocket System. The Army has been generally supportive in endorsing a number of our new (and not so new) initiatives.

In my first seven months as Director, I have had the opportunity to visit all the Regular Force Regiments and the School. A common theme throughout all of these visits reveals that our soldiers are getting tired, and that it is becoming increasingly difficult to force generate the required personnel to support our expeditionary operations. To our great benefit, the Reserve Gunners have stepped up to the plate in numbers

Mot du Directeur de L'Artillerie

Chers artilleurs,

Nombreux sont ceux qui verront en 2008 une année importante dans l'histoire de notre Régiment. Le rythme et l'étendue de la transformation de l'artillerie ont rarement été aussi remarquables hormis en temps de conflit mondial. Dans la poursuite de notre soutien de la Force opérationnelle canadienne en Afghanistan avec des batteries d'obusiers, des équipes OAA/CAA, des troupes SUAV, des CCFA, des CCEA et des officiers et sous-officiers d'état-major, nous déployons de nouvelles capacités, entreprenons la restructuration de nos régiments, accueillons un afflux de nouveaux soldats en quête d'une croissance accrue et allons de l'avant avec des projets importants afin de doter l'Armée de capacités améliorées.

Je suis heureux de constater que les membres du Régiment royal de l'Artillerie canadienne sont généralement en bonne santé et extrêmement motivés, en dépit de la cadence quasi-chaotique des activités. Avec un noyau animé des mêmes idées au sein de l'état-major et la participation active des cmdt et des SMR, nous évoluons vers un nouveau modèle de structure de force qui, nous l'espérons, apportera une intégration considérable des artilleurs de la Réserve en ce qui a trait à l'attribution des missions et aux missions mêmes de nos régiments de la Force régulière. Compte tenu du fait que nous n'attendons aucune croissance appréciable du nombre de membres de la Force régulière après 2010, nous avons dû « récolter » une partie de notre croissance prévue pour la réorienter afin de répondre aux capacités de l'avenir comme le nouveau lance-missiles de précision à longue portée. L'armée s'est montrée habituellement coopérative en endossant plusieurs de nos nouvelles (et moins récentes) initiatives.

Au cours de mes sept premiers mois en tant que directeur, j'ai eu l'occasion de visiter tous les régiments d'artilleurs de la Force régulière, de même que notre École. Un thème récurrent rencontré lors de ces visites est l'épuisement

that exceed most other Branches, to train and serve alongside our Regular Force brothers and sisters. The overwhelming majority of our Commanders on operations are unable to tell the difference between Regular and Reserve artillery soldiers. This is a great testament to our training methodologies, our leadership and the notion of "one" Royal Regiment.

I am humbled by the support and encouragement received by our Colonel Commandant and the Artillery Council, as well the strong representations made by our broader family in the Royal Canadian Artillery Association. We could not ask for a more caring, vibrant and strategically-focused leadership group to guide us through such a hefty period of transformation and engagement in operations. I am also grateful for the increased participation and engagement by the Artillery leadership in such forums as the Artillery Advisory Board, now held twice per year in order to keep the leadership abreast of current and forthcoming issues requiring resolution.

During the course of 2009 And 2010, Gunners will continue to be challenged to manage the demands placed upon them and their respective units. The Reserve Force units will begin the process of reorienting their mission focus as they come to grips with specified expeditionary and domestic tasks. The STA batteries of the Regular Force units will emerge and establish their capabilities under the pressure of competing priorities. The expected arrival of new capabilities such as the rockets and new radars will see the transition of 4AD Regt into a Tactical Artillery Group, comprising of one battery each of rockets, radars and Ground Based Air Defence assets. This structure and the new capabilities that it represents will cause us to reflect upon and likely revise our various trade structures in a manner that offers the greatest breadth of employment and career opportunities that Gunners have had in half a century. These are exciting times, but not without a few bumps along the road to success. Those familiar with the term "hot planning" will clearly understand what I mean in this regard.

My focus during 2009 will be to solidify the positional gains we have made and create the conditions necessary to begin further transformation beginning in 2011. I will endeavour to visit as many of our Reserve units as possible as part of the continuing mission of "communicate, facilitate and celebrate" our successes and challenges. Finally, I will push hard to ensure that all of our lessons identified in current operations are captured and articulated through revised doctrine- something we tend to leave too late.

I am both honoured and humbled to be your Director during these busy times. It is clear that I need your continued support, understanding and engagement – at all rank levels- to actively move the yardsticks in so many areas. Whether you fill sandbags, fight forest fires, drive troops and supplies to a mission area, drag toboggans on patrol in the Arctic, or send hot steel toward a determined foe, know that your valued contribution brings credit to the entire Gunner family. The sacrifices that you and your loved ones are making continue to be acknowledged and respected from the Army Commander on down.

Cette structure et les nouvelles capacités qu'elle représente nous amèneront à étudier et à réviser nos diverses structures professionnelles de façon à offrir la plus vaste gamme possible d'emplois et de possibilités de carrières à laquelle les artilleurs aient jamais eu accès en un demi-siècle. Nous vivons une période excitante, mais qui ne sera pas dénuée de cahots sur le chemin menant au succès. Ceux qui connaissent l'expression de la « planification à chaud » comprendront clairement ce à quoi je fais référence.

Je mettrai l'accent en 2009 sur la consolidation des acquis et la création des conditions requises pour mener encore plus loin la transformation dès 2011. 1 RCHA – 2008 A Year in Review

2008 proved to be both an exciting and challenging year for the gunners of 1 RCHA. After a long period of work-up training, B Battery (Bty) deployed to Afghanistan as part of Task Force 1-08. In total, B Bty consisted of over 200 soldiers, all eager to get their chance to serve their country abroad. While B Bty accounted for most of 1 RCHA's soldiers in Afghanistan, some deployed as members of the Kandahar Provincial Reconstruction team or the OMLT. For those

not deployed to Afghanistan, the year proved to be busy nonetheless. There was a lot of coordination occurring on this side of the Atlantic to see that the personnel deployed were provided with the support needed to ensure success on the mission. In addition to providing support to B Bty, 1 RCHA carried on with the annual domestic operations by deploying troops on all three rotations to Rogers Pass, British Columbia in order to conduct Avalanche Control as part of Op PALACI. Also, C Bty began to lay the initial groundwork for their deployment as part of Task force 3-09, conducting training and courses to set the conditions for success in future operations. Add to this the normal routine of 1 RCHA, and one can begin to see the hectic pace set in 2008.

The year saw many changes to the faces of the leadership of 1 RCHA as well. In June, Chief Warrant Officer Tony Gilks took over as Regimental Sergeant Major from Chief Warrant Officer Chris Barth. In addition, in August, C Bty saw Major Shawn Fortin take the reins from Major Todd Scharlach, who moved on to assume command of HQ and Svcs Bty from Major David Buchanan. OPERATIONS

The year of 2008 proved itself to be a good year for the guns of 1 RCHA in regards to operations. B Bty conducted its final preparations before deployment and headed to Afghanistan in February of 2008. While deployed, the Bty served as an integral part of the 2 PPCLI Battle Group and provided not only timely and accurate fire support, but also co-ordinated a variety of assets to support Battle Group operations. This included, but was not limited to, Lightweight Counter-Mortar Radar (LCMR), Hostile Artillery Locating System (HALO), Unmanned Air Vehicles (UAV), Close Air Support (CAS) and Aviation assets. The coordination of these elements was critical to mission success.

B Bty did amazing work in bringing together all aspects of the artillery world.

The gun troops of B Bty were relied upon to deploy and support all operations during the tour, which they did with consistency and accuracy. The Forward Observation teams co-ordinated fires, supporting all elements of the BG. They repeatedly used indirect fires and coordinated CAS and Aviation assets, resulting in several air engagements against the Taliban. Their operations ranged from all Light Armoured Vehicle (LAV) based operations supporting the Recce Squadron and the Tank Squadron to dismounted operations supporting the infantry companies. On many occasions they were called upon to engage targets "danger close" to friendly troops to assist in the defeat of the enemy or to break contact. While deployed overseas, Surveillance and Target Acquisition Troop found themselves extremely busy manning all systems. Several highlights included an acoustic detection by the HALO system which detected an IED detonation against the United States Police Mentor Team which allowed the Canadians to move quickly to their location in order to offer assistance. B Bty also deployed a Counter Mortar Radar team to a combat outpost which allowed for the

successful engagement of an enemy mortar base plate position based upon its detections. The Micro Unmanned Aerial Vehicle detachments were very busy supporting every operation. They flew hundreds of flights in support of the various operations and provided real-time footage to the combat teams. It should be noted that in addition to B Bty deploying, 1 RCHA also sent individuals to work as part of the Operational Mentoring and Liaison Team. In this role they helped to mentor the Afghan National Army, conducting numerous operations by their side in order to build up their effectiveness and ability. All in all, while very busy, the tools brought to the battlefield were highly prized by the commanders and helped both to keep Canadian troops safe and to defeat the Taliban at every opportunity. 1 RCHA also deployed personnel to the KPRT which put forth efforts to help rebuild Afghanistan. The KPRT worked on numerous aid projects in an effort to provide the people of Afghanistan with services and projects that have long been impossible due to years of conflict.

While on tour, B Bty experienced the loss of one of its own with the death of Bdr Jeremie Ouellet on 11 March 2008. Bdr Ouellet was remembered by all who knew him as an outstanding friend and colleague. Bdr Ouellet was honoured along with all the fallen of TF 1-08 in a remembrance ceremony held on 14 November. He is missed by all.

Throughout their time in Afghanistan, B Bty held fast to the tradition of 1 RCHA providing unparalleled support to their Battle Groups. While deployed, B Bty had many firsts, including firing the first two Excalibur rounds operationally. Time and time again, the guns of B Bty were called upon to fire in support of troops in contact, and time and time again the guns of B Bty proved themselves by quickly putting down artillery with deadly accuracy. At the end of the tour, B Bty had earned the trust and admiration of everyone with whom they had worked.

EXERCISES

The soldiers of 1RCHA who were not deployed overseas found ways to keep themselves busy. The year kicked off with Ex STRONG CONTENDER, where 1 RCHA sent a team that represented the Regiment well in competition with the other units of 1 CMBG. C Bty began its training in March conducting numerous Bty level exercises, before deploying to Suffield to support 1 PPCLI, providing live fire support to the infantry on Ex THOR'S HAMMER. They provided fire support to both 1 PPCLI and 3 PPCLI again in the fall for Ex SPARTAN WARRIOR and Ex VULCANS FORGE where the FOOs did a superb job coordinating CAS and indirect fires in support of infantry training up to platoon level. The Regiment also deployed a FOO Party (G33) to Hawaii to work as part of Ex RIMPAC in Hawaii. G33 spent close to two months deployed to the island state, living and working onboard the USS Bon Homme Richard working hand in hand with the United States Marine Corps. It was a hardship but sometimes we have to take the good with the bad.

1 RCHA took the opportunity in 2008 to remember its fallen comrades, dedicating a trig marker to Capt Jeff Francis. Jeff was killed in action against the Taliban in July of 2007. The dedication of the trig marker allowed for friends and family to gather together to pay remembrance to Capt Francis. Trig Francis will remain in the Shilo ranges and serve as a permanent reminder to all who pass it of the dedication and sacrifice made by Capt Francis for his country.

1 RCHA also assisted the home station to host the Junior Officer's Course. Due to operational commitments, this was the first time that the JOC had been run in two years. As such, there were 57 students in Shilo, all prepared to become immersed in Regimental heritage, history and tradition. There were many familiar faces of the artillery present for the event, such as the Colonel Commandant, BGen (Retired) Beno, the Director of Artillery and MGen S.A. Beare. Following the many informative lectures by an impressive list of guest speakers, the RCA Officer's Mess hosted an excellent mess dinner. It was here that the Artillery's subalterns lost a hard fought crud tournament to the senior officers of the artillery.

The end of the year bore witness to the 1 RCHA annual Christmas traditions. The joyous season was celebrated through the Soldier's Appreciation Dinner followed by the NCO's at home to the officers for a bit of Christmas cheer. There was also the infamous "Subbies Carolling", where the 1 RCHA subalterns treated the Senior Officers of the Regiment to the melodic symphony of their angelic voices, and were rewarded by exquisite delicacies. To celebrate Saint Barbara's day, 1 RCHA held a military skills competition, where participants tested their pluck in a variety of army themed challenges. Finally there were the traditional hockey games where despite a strong showing by A Bty, B Bty won the Kingston Cup and C Bty managed defeat HQ and Svcs Bty to secure the Hugsweir Cup. Once again the NCOs bested the officers, meaning that the most despised skate trophy will reside in the Commanding Officer's office for yet another year.

2008 proved to be a good year for the guns of the First Regiment. They deployed once again into Afghanistan, where they provided unwavering support to the supported arms, hammering the enemy at every opportunity and bringing much deserved credit to the guns of 1 RCHA. Those not in Afghanistan put training first, developing the skills required to continue to provide first-rate fires when needed in operations. When not fighting or training to fight, 1 RCHA still found time to relax and come together as a regimental family through traditions, sports and social events. This dedication to fighting, training and to each other will mean that regardless of future challenges, the Gunners of 1 RCHA will be prepared to meet them head on.

2nd Regiment Royal Canadian Horse Artillery

Never ones to take a break, 2 RCHA has once again had an exciting and eventful year. 2008 saw the Regiment go from successfully preparing F Bty for deployment on TF 3-08 to planting the seeds within D Bty to go out the door in early 2010.

2008 IN REVIEW

The main effort of the year was the mentorship of and support to F Bty as they were stood up for their deployment to Afghanistan with the 3 RCR Battle Group. The majority of D Bty deployed along with F Bty on their workup training exercises, both Ex SOUTHERN BEAR in Ft Bliss, Texas, as well as Ex MAPLE GUARDIAN in Wainwright, Alberta. This mentorship allowed F Bty to sharpen its Tactics Techniques and Procedures (TTPs) as well as undergo rigorous training through realistic scenarios. BC F Bty, Major Stu Taylor, gives much of the credit to D Bty for their assistance in training his soldiers for the success they have achieved to date in Afghanistan. HQ Bty, as always, was there every step of the way providing the outstanding support required to keep the training pertinent and rewarding.

The Regiment was not only limited to the 'small' task of sending an entire Bty out the door, however. On top of assisting F Bty every step of the way, the limited remainder of the Regiment was able to successfully undertake several other primary taskings. With the large influx of junior officers entering into the Branch, DP1.1 Artillery Officer Courses were exported from CTC Gaagetown to both 1 RCHA and 2 RCHA. The RCAS sent instructors to Petawawa from May to August 08 to instruct and D Bty supported the course through the provision of staff and soldiers. The lucky students who got chosen to conduct their training in Petawawa during an especially hot and humid summer, graduated with a true sense of belonging to "2 Guns". D Bty also organized three iterations of Theatre Mission Specific Training (TMST) for 2 Bde. The aim of this training was to ensure that there were an adequate number of qualified personnel capable of deploying on short notice as the replacement pool for TF 3-08.

2 RCHA's Regimental School Season once again kicked off in September 08 with the Regiment running successful Basic Arty Comms and Command Post Tech courses within unit lines. Morning parades were scarce at times during the fall, with soldiers also attending numerous other national and Bde run PCF courses.

The Christmas festive season arrived with a St. Barbara's Sports Day competition worthy of the old days, when E Bty (Para) used to etch their names onto every trophy on display. Camaraderie, competition, friendship, and fellowship were the catalyst behind this year's Sports Day, with all ranks within

HQ and D Btys participating. In addition to the usual cuts and scrapes, there was the bruising of a few egos as well. HQ Bty, led by the stellar goaltending of Padre Alan Nikkel, came back from a sizeable deficit to win in a dramatic shootout victory over D Bty in hockey. The highly anticipated afternoon match had the Senior NCO and Officer team scoring 15 unanswered goals to win 15-6 over the Junior Ranks. The Regimental Ball and Soldier's Christmas Dinner were also great successes with large turnouts, despite the reduced parade state of the Regiment. The year came to an end with the thoughts and prayers of every soldier in the unit constantly with our brothers in the Fighting Fox overseas and their families here at home.

OPERATIONS

Under Capt Tom Hicks, D Bty sent a FOO party to deploy with TF 1-08 as G24. They trained with the 2 PPCLI BG and deployed in support on 20 Feb 08. They were initially deployed with the C Company Combat Group to FOB Frontenac and

began to develop their AO in the Argandhab and Shah wali-kot districts of Kandahar.

Towards the end of May, after the opium harvest was complete, G24 deployed to the Zhari/Panjway/Pashmul areas alongside the BG manoeuvre force where they began to concentrate exclusively on disrupting the insurgent influences in those areas. Unfortunately, Sgt Power and Bdr Dauphinais were wounded on a platoon-level patrol in the Pashmul area on 4 Sep 08.

Bdr Wilson, Bdr Thompson, and Bdr Dauphinais each received the JTFA Commander's Commendation for their courageous actions in the face of the enemy throughout the tour. They returned back to Canada on 30 Sep 08.

In September, elements of D Bty received a Warning Order to commence with preparations to deploy with the DART to Haiti in order to conduct humanitarian relief operations. Although the DART Coy did not end up being deployed, the event served as an excellent training opportunity and reinforced the requirement to ensure that the Bty remained at a heightened state of readiness for operational tasks at all times. The BC, Major Steve Haire, did however deploy to Haiti with the Joint Task Force HQ on Op HORATIO.

CHANGE OF COMMAND

Continuing on into 2008, most of the senior leadership that took D Bty to Afghanistan in 2006 have been posted to other units. Major Steve Haire took over command of D Bty from Major Dan Bobbitt on 18 July 08, with MWO Robert Beaudry receiving his pace stick from MWO Chad Wagar on 20 July when he took over as Battery Sergeant Major. During APS 08 there were a large number of postings both out of and into D Bty, consequently requiring the building of new teams in preparation for TF 1-10.

The unit extended a farewell to Padre Jean Johns this past summer with her posting to Winnipeg and the unit welcomed newcomer Padre Robin Major as the new Unit Chaplain in August. Padre Major's stay was short lived, however, as he departed for CFB Borden and the Chaplain School to complete his BOTC-Chaplain course. The unit welcomed Padre Alan Nikkel, a reserve chaplain from the Ontario Regiment, on 15 Sept 08. Padre Nikkel served with the upmost dedication in Padre Major's absence through to the end of the year.

SUMMARY

Although many of the faces within the Regiment have once again changed this year, the quality of execution of taskings and the level of professionalism have remained intact throughout. Having successfully sent F Bty out to support the CF mission in Afghanistan, all attention and efforts shift to the support of the families here on the home front and on preparing the D Bty "Dragons" with the same quality training in their preparations to join the fight in early 2010. For all involved this past year, it has been a very rewarding experience and the Regiment extends its warmest wishes and heartfelt thanks to those who continue to support 2 Guns in Petawawa.

Batterie X

Batterie R

Du mois de janvier au mois de mai, la Bie R regroupait la moitié du Régiment non commise sur la FO 3-07. La plupart des membres faisaient partie de l'école régimentaire afin qu'ils acquièrent une instruction individuelle requise en vue du prochain déploiement. La bie a aussi trouvé le temps pour faire des exercices

de bie afin de raffiner ses capacités techniques. Au mois de mai, la Bie R est partie à la BFC Gagetown pour un exercice régimentaire. Pour l'EX SABRE THRUST, un exercice de 14 jours qui a formé de nouveaux CB et IA, le régiment était composé d'effectifs provenant des Bie R, W, et E. L'EX MAPLE GUARDIAN était un exercice très réaliste, et était conçu pour simuler l'Afghanistan le plus possible. Le raffinement des détails et la coopération en tant que bie ont été les meilleures leçons apprises. Avant l'exercice à Wainwright, la Bie R était un rassemblement de tpe sous un seul nom, mais après l'exercice, la Bie R est vraiment devenue, une bie prête pour des opérations de combats. Au retour à Valcartier, la bie a continué d'entraîner son personnel avec l'école régimentaire pour que chacun ait les qualifications nécessaires pour se déployer. La Bie R inclue plusieurs nouveaux artilleurs, plus d'une quinzaine de réservistes et plusieurs de ses membres sont affectés à de nouvelles fonctions. Batterie de Commandement et Service (CS)

L'année 2008 a passé très vite pour la Bie CS. La Bie CS avait aussi du personnel déployé avec la Bie X, et la bie avait aussi du personnel déployé pour un tour de 9 mois en Afghanistan. La Bie

4th Air Defence Regiment

The Royal Regiment of Canadian Artillery

2008 has been another busy and exciting year for the Regt. We force generated soldiers for two Airspace Coordination Centres (ASCC's), two Tactical Uninhabited Aerial Vehicle (TUAV) tps and one Small Unmanned Aerial Vehicle (SUAV) tp for Task Force Afghanistan. The SUAV Tp was stood up on very short notice and tasked with the "no fail" mission of deploying the Interim SUAV to meet the requirements laid out in the Manley report; which called for persistent UAV surveillance to counter the current IED threat in Afghanistan. On Aug 3, the TUAV tp at Kandahar Air Field successfully launched the 1000th operational flight of the CU 161 Sperwer drone in support of CF and ISAF missions in Afghanistan. During the past year the Regt fielded the 400 Series ADATS, TCPs, ASCC Bison vehicles and associated medium capacity radios. We also participated in numerous exercises, Op CONNECTION activities, completed a very successful Regt'l school and ADATS live fire exercise, Ex POTENT KNIGHT, provided sp to the RCAS, conducted pre-deployment training, and found time to send 4 soldiers to participate in the LFAA CFSAC competition.

Changes in Command

2008 saw many changes in the command structure of the Regt. Major Patrice Beauchamp took over the Regt'l 2IC position. The RSM changed from CWO J.D.C Coulombe (now Capt) to CWO E.J.J DeGready. On June 25 Comd of 119 AD Bty changed from Maj J.P. Dorris to Maj R Embree. On July 18 Comd of HQ & Svcs changed from Maj J.R. Gobin to Maj E.D. McCarthy. On Sept 4th BSM of 128 AD Bty changed from MWO Reid to MWO Sénécal and on Oct 1st the BSM of 119 BTY was changed from WO J.A.G Stirney to MWO P.J Lewis.

Deployments

During 2008 the Regt had soldiers deployed on various rotations to Afghanistan. 119 AD Bty ASCC had 7 soldiers on ROTO 3-07 who returned in May 08 and currently have 6 soldiers on 4-08 who will return in 2009. 128 AD Bty force generated tps for TUAV 3-07 (Aug 07 - Feb 08), TUAV 1-08 (Feb 08 - Sep 08) and TUAV 3-08 (Sep 08 - Mar 09) with 23 personnel per rotation and 1 x SUAV Tp 3-08 (Sep 08 - Mar 09) with 14 personnel. In addition, the ASCC for TF 5-09 (6 soldiers) is in training for deployment along with SUAV TF 1-09 (18 soldiers).

Task Force and Army Support

In 2008 4 AD Regt was once again called upon to participate in a variety of taskings. 128 AD Battery and HQ & Svcs Bty deployed to the Gagetown Ranges for Ex ICE FORGE / Ex MANNING on 11 Feb 2008 in sp of the Initial Product Testing for the 400 Series ADATS, TCP, ASCC Bison and associated radio equipment. Ex CBT HAMMER was conducted with 42 Radar Sqn, 4 Wing Cold Lake AB, from 7-15 March at Eglin AFB, Fort Walton Beach Florida. 119 AD Bty sent ASCC elements to conduct Aerospace Control Operations using Link 11 and 16

Tactical Data Link. The SUAV Tp Task Force Afghanistan 3-08 was stood up on 25 March 08 and conducted flight training in Clovis, New Mexico and the Basic Flight Safety Course for the TC and TSM in Winnipeg. The TC and TSM deployed on Ex MAPLE GUARDIAN where they participated in working with the Battle Group establishing important working relationships and gaining a better understanding of the Operational Tempo they would face overseas. The tp deployed in July/Aug 2008. 119 AD Bty force generated the ASCC for TFA HQ which was deployed from July 07 to May 08. The HQ 5-09 ASCC along with other members of the Bty conducted IBTS and TMST training and provided sp to trg and validation exercises such as MAPLE GUARDIAN, MAPLE READY, and UNIFIED WARRIOR. The Regt was also heavily involved with the operational planning for Op PODIUM 2010 Winter Games. We participated in many planning sessions and joint exercises in preparation for this domestic operation.

Royal Canadian Artillery School Support

In 2008 the Regt continued to provide support to the RCAS. 4 AD Regt, in cooperation with the RCAS, conducted the Air Defence Technicians course during the summer months. The Regt also supported the AD Battle Management course FTX, two DP 1 Gunnery courses and the DP 1.2 AD Officers course and FTX.

Canadian Forces Small Arms Competition

Members of the Regt participated as part of the LFAA CFSAC Team and competed in the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association's National Service Conditions Competition (NSCC) and represented the CF in Bisley UK. They deployed from Gagetown to Connaught Range on 05 Sept 08 to compete in the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association's NSCC which serves as a practice for CFSAC. CF competitors can compete against

the top civilian marksman from across Canada in rifle and pistol matches. After a long week competing in NSCC, more competitors arrived and CFSAC began. By the end of the competition, all the long hours on the range had paid off and the team had won a number of awards. Through these competitions Cpl Grondin won the prestigious Queen's Medal for Champion Shot and the Royal New Brunswick Rifle Association competition winning the trophy for aggregate fire and movement. Bdr Burton was the Top Tyro at the NSCC. Cpl D'Andrea won a gold medal for top overall score during the Falling Plates Match. Cpl Grondin, Bdr Burton and Bdr Babin placed in the top 50 Rifle competitors in the CF. All four members significantly contributed to the Top Regular Force 12 Man Rifle Team which won the coveted Letson Trophy.

Awards and Honours

In 2008 several members of the Regt were recognized for their exemplary service and extraordinary dedication. The Col Cndt presented his Commendation and Coin to Maj Hogan and CWO Coulombe for their exceptional work with the RCAA Regt'l Fund, the Lieutenant-Governor of New Brunswick, the Right Honourable Herménégilde Chiasson, awarded the 2007 United Way Spirit Award to Sgt Daniel Robichaud on 18 February 2008 for his work as the battery canvasser for 128 AD Bty. The Comd JTF Afg BGen J.R.M.G. Laroche, OMM, MSC, CD presented Major Dorris his Commendation in recognition of his outstanding work as the OC of the ASCC. Major Andresen was awarded the Comd CEFCOM Commendation for exemplary service as ASCC 2IC. MBdr Sova received the Canadian Land Force Commanders Commendation from the A/CLS Major-General G.R. Thibault, CD for his outstanding leadership, initiative, and emergency on scene management while at the scene of an accident on Highway 2 near Salisbury, NB on 7 June. Maj Gobin was presented the Comd LFAA commendation in recognition of his exemplary dedication and noteworthy accomplishments as the Battery Commander of HQ & SVCS Bty. PO2 Jessome received the Chief of Maritime Staff Bravo Zulu award in recognition of his exceptional service to Maritime Command while deployed on Operation DOLPHIN RECOVERY from 7-28 Oct 2004. Commander LFAA Commendations were also presented to Capt Hobson, WO Vidal, Sgt Robichaud, and Bdr Cyr. The CO presented his Commendation to Capt Robertson, Capt Peddle, MCpl Rohrbach, MCpl Pruski, Sgt Johnson, MCpl (now Ocdt) Garnett, Bdr Lively, Bdr Davidson, and Cpl Scott.

Op Connection Activities

4 AD Regt participated in several Op CONNECTION activities throughout 2008 in order to foster a positive image of the Regt, the Artillery Corps, LFAA, and the Army within the local communities of Moncton and Fredericton, NB. Included in the Op CONNECTION tasks was the "Support the Tps Night" hosted by the Moncton Wildcats LMJHQ hockey team on 23 February. 4 AD Regt also participated in the Nova Scotia International Tattoo from 28 June – 18 July, the 50th Anniversary of Gagetown incl the Freedom of the City Parade in Fredericton on 6 Sept, the Dieppe Ceremony on 19 Aug, Battle of Britain Ceremony on 14 Sep, and Remembrance Day. Finally, members of 4 AD Regt completed a 50 km relay run around the city of Moncton on 7 Dec in support of the Christmas Daddies Telethon, which raises money for underprivileged children in the Maritimes. Upon the presentation of the final cheque, the team had raised a total of \$11,823.66.

Marshall, CD, visited the Regt and participated in the Regt's training activities, ASCC/SUAV/TUAV departure ceremony, and the Regt'l Family Day from August 13-15, 2008. The Family Day was a full-scale event that had the Base Gym transformed into a play area for children with Bouncy Castles, Clowns, Magician, Petting Zoo and a Kiddie Commando obstacle course. A number of photos were taken and 3 of these were submitted to the RCA Quadrant photo contest by Sgt Johnson who won the fall Quadrant photo contest.

4 AD Regt Hosts the 44th Joint Tactical Data Link Advisory Panel (JTDLAP) 29 Sep - 03 Oct

Along with providing ASCCs for LFWA and SQFT, deploying ASCCs to Afghanistan, training ASCCs and SUAV soldiers for deployment, the Bty was given the task of hosting the 44th JTDLAP. A total of 75 participants from the Army, Air Force, Navy and Joint Commands attended the 44th JTDLAP and represented every unit that is involved in using Tactical Data Links in the CF.

The highlight of this year's JTDLAP was a live demonstration for all participants integrating the Tactical Data Link between 22 Wing North Bay, an ASCC BISON, an Air Defence Command Post, an ADATS and two CF-18s. The ability for all participants to be briefed on the capabilities of the new AD equipment and to see it in operation was a crowd pleaser and was a clear demonstration that the soldiers of 4th Air Defence Regt will have the equipment in the future to fully integrate into NATO Tactical Data Link architecture.

For the members of 119 AD Bty, hosting the JTDLAP provided an excellent opportunity to showcase what they do on a daily basis and proved to the attendees that Tactical Data Link is more than a Command and Control system (it is an inherent part of NATO weapon systems). It allows for the rapid exchange of friendly and enemy positions, air surveillance, unit status and command messages in near real time.

Ex POTENT KNIGHT

From 9-20 Nov Ex POTENT KNIGHT was held at CFB Suffield Ab. The ex focused on the readiness of the operators, maintainers and Det Commanders of the ADATS 400 series. Soldiers of 128 AD Bty deployed over 3400kms from CFB Gagetown, NB to CFB Suffield, AB. After long hours in the air and on the road, over 130 persons and more than 30 vehicles arrived at CFB Suffield. The live fire portion of the ex was from 15-20 Nov. The gunnery was impressive with a total of 100 missiles fired with unparalleled success. The superb efficiency of the gunners was rated by the Instructor Gunnery team from the RCAS as outstanding.

Conclusion

As the only Ground Based Air Defence unit in Canada, 4th AD Regt, RCA has continued to provide a high level of readiness whether it is with the ASCC, ADATS, TUAV or SUAV. In 2008, 4 AD Regt fielded the 400 series ADATS, Bison ASCC and associated communications equipment, while supporting ASCC, TUAV and SUAV force generation for TF Afghanistan. 4th Air Defence has increasingly provided necessary support in theatre and in training and has proven time after time that its contributions are vital to protecting Canada's sovereign interests both home and abroad.

The Royal Regiment of Canadian Artillery School's Year in Review

2008 has been a very busy, but extremely rewarding year within the RCAS. With Pers deployed from coast to coast within Canada, on ranges in the United States, and on TAVs in support of operations in Afghanistan, LCol Marc LaFortune assumed command of the RCAS from LCol Brian McPherson during the peak of summer training. There were several other key staff

posted out during APS and Maj Dave Buchanan replaced Maj Ray Dufour as the Deputy Commandant. With Btys operating independently to achieve their missions, and collectively to achieve the RCAS and Royal Regiment's Mission in support of CF operations, the RCAS continued its seamless and unflinching support to the Royal Regiment.

Major Hazen Harty assumed command of **Maintenance Training Battery** as the Chief Instructor Maintenance in Jun 08 from Maj Paul Cogswell, who was posted to Ottawa. With approximately half of its pers posted in APS 2008, Maint Trg Bty had a very busy but successful year, conducting 18 courses and producing 169 trained technicians, focusing on Low Level Air Defence Equipment, Advance Optics, Artillery Meteorological Systems and the Remote Weapons System currently employed on the M113A3 TLAV and RG31. Over 90 Personnel were trained specifically for deployment to Afghanistan as the Battery continued its support to the introduction of the M777. Although a successful year from a training perspective, an unfortunate vehicle accident resulted in the death of MCpl Michelle Lundrigan, Wpns Tech instructor. She was a very professional soldier and competent instructor who is greatly missed by her colleagues and supervisors.

On 27 June 08, **45 Depot Battery** changed command from Maj Paul Payne CD, who was appointed 2I/C of 2 RCHA in Petawawa, to Maj Ralph E. Holah, Royal Artillery UK Exchange Officer. MWO Ron Benoit handed the BSM's pace stick over to MWO Chadley Wagar, posted in from D Bty 2RCHA. An extremely busy year saw 45 Bty export a Forward Observation Officer (FOO) course to 5 RALC, which proved to be very successful in producing FOOs for operations. The FSCC cell

revamped the Artillery Operations Course into a new course with greater emphasis on Battle Group (BG) level operations, the integration of assets, and more focus on current operations. The new course will be known as The Fire Effects Coordination Centre Officers' (FECCO) course. It will qualify students to conduct generic artillery staff duties, and to supervise/manage any coordination centre whether a Fire Support Coordination Centre (FSCC), an Air Space Coordination Centre (ASCC), or a Surveillance and Target Acquisition Coordination Centre (STACC) at BG level. The Forward Air Controller (FAC) Cell has had another busy year completing three FAC courses and the Surveillance and Target Acquisition (STA) Cell has been very busy with HALO, LCMR, and UAV training while running several STA TC and TSM courses. WO Williams received a CEFCOM Commander Commendation for his exemplary work with the mini unmanned aerial vehicles in Afghanistan and BSM Wagar received a Chief of Defence Staff Commendation for his exemplary work as part of 2 RCR BG in 2007. The Battery

trained approximately 214 Artillery Officers and soldiers for future operations.

The tempo within **67 Depot Battery** was at an all time high this year. The Battery conducted 14 Courses and graduated a total of 234 Field and Air Defence soldiers and officers. The Field IG Course 0901 graduated seven Canadian and two Royal Artillery officers in May 2008 and four of those graduates were immediately engaged in conducting DP 1 Officer training. Two serials of DP 1.1 (Officer) were exported, one each to Shilo and Petawawa respectively, and we very successful due largely to the great cooperation throughout the Royal Regimental, specifically the outstanding support from both 1 RCHA and 2 RCHA. The IGs and AIGs have been very busy with IG Assistance and Center of Excellence tasks as well. These include assistance to 2 RCHA in CMTC, to 1 and 3 Field Regiments in Gagetown, and an IG Team to Mississippi to assist with Exercise NOBLE GUERRIER from 4 - 11 January 2009. The Battery said farewell to several loyal and dedicated pers this year to incl MWO Ken Walker – Retired 4 September 2008 after 20 years service to pursue a second career as a Reservist on contract with the CIMIC Cell in Ontario; WO John Ryan - Retired 11 September 2008 after 21 years service to pursue a Second Career as a contractor with VALCOM; WO Murry Gerein – Retired 17 September 2008 after 25 years service to pursue a Second Career as a contractor with VALCOM; WO

Headquarters Battery – Battery Commander and Chief Standards Officer, (CSO) Maj Mike Draho handed over the Bty to Maj Jeff Pederson and continued to support to the Royal Regiment of Canadian Artillery, fulfilling its mission as the Center of Excellence for all Artillery courses by providing Standards Oversight, Administration, IT, Simulation, and Supply services to the RCAS and outside agencies. Although not terribly glorious our exciting work, our Standards Pers continue to review and update Training Plans and courseware to ensure the RCAS is delivering relevant training and capabilities to the Royal Regiment and the Canadian Forces. The IT and Simulation section grew within the Bty with the addition of 11 civilian positions, with a view to exploiting digitization to facilitate realistic and stimulating training. Escaping the bounds of the office, the battery had one of its members, WO Snodgrass, deployed to Afghanistan in support of Op ATHENA, who returned safe and successful in Nov 08.

With the command of the Bty passed from Maj Rob Dunn to Maj Rob Hart in July 2008, the workhorse of the RCAS, **W Battery**, continued its support of an incredible number of courses, taskings and training events this past year. In addition to support to nationally mandated courses and support to Operations, W Battery successfully conducted internal training and Regimental School to ensure our soldiers are qualified to support the Royal Regiment. With the soldiers of the Bty

meeting themselves coming in and going out to the field between taskings, there was little time to rest save block leave. Challenged by a shortage of equipment, Guns and soldiers, W Bty rose to the challenge, amended plans and soldiered on. Supporting everything from Battery Commander Crses to DP1 NCM and everything in between, both on the ground and in the air, W Bty was there. There were a few highlights between the days and nights in the field for some of our soldiers, which were highlighted by the Halifax Air Show and the United Nations Honour Guard in Korea.

With a very busy year behind us and an equally busy and challenging year

ahead, the Royal Regiment of Canadian Artillery School looks to the great things on the horizon for the Royal Regiment as our inspiration.

The Royal Canadian Artillery Band

In March, 2008, for the first time in its 128 year history, a Regular Force piper was posted to The Royal Canadian Artillery Band. His name is Bdr Jim Douglas, a native of Milton, Ontario.

Bdr Douglas came to the RCA Band as a component transfer from the Argyll & Sutherland Highlanders of Canada, a Primary Reserve regiment in Hamilton, Ontario, where he was employed as a piper and infantry soldier.

Bdr Douglas joined the Canadian Forces in 1996. He completed QL3 Infantry at the RCR Battle School at Area Training Centre Meaford in Meaford, Ontario in August 1997. He completed his QL4 Communicator and QL2 Common Courses in Georgetown, Ontario in June 1997. Bdr Douglas attended the CFSAL Music Training Company at CFB Borden in May and June 2002 where he completed his QL4, 6A and 6B Piper qualifications. For part of 2005, Bdr Douglas was attach-posted to the Pipes & Drums of the 2nd Battalion Royal Canadian Regiment at Camp Gagetown NB, where he assisted in training new members of the Pipes & Drums and participated in a large number of events around Atlantic Canada and the United States including the Royal Nova Scotia Tattoo and the Virginia International Tattoo.

Like many members of the RCA Band, Bdr Douglas came to the Regular Force with extensive performance experience. In the summers of 1999, 2000 and 2001, Bdr Douglas performed as a member of the Band of the Ceremonial Guard in Ottawa, where he participated in a large number of public duties and events in the National Capital Region including a solo performance at a State Dinner at Rideau Hall on Canada Day 2001.

Bdr Douglas has performed and competed with the Toronto Police Pipe Band at Highland Games throughout North America and at the World Pipe Championships in Glasgow, Scotland in 1996 and 2004. This band won the North American Championships in Maxville, Ontario in August 1996, in Bdr Douglas' first season competing with the band.

As a bagpipe soloist, Bdr Douglas has performed at major international tattoos including the Canadian International Tattoo in Hamilton, the Rochester Marine International Tattoo in Rochester, New York and the Manitoba International Tattoo in Winnipeg. He was also featured as a soloist with Hamilton Philharmonic Orchestra in October of 2006. He has performed for Royalty, and Hollywood personalities including Jim Carrey and Paul Gross. Bdr Douglas has also performed with the Rankin Family, the Barra MacNeils, and Natalie McMaster.

Reflecting back on his first 11 months with the RCA band, Bdr Douglas says that "it has been a very busy and successful year. Coming from the Infantry to the Music Branch has been a difficult transition, but there has been some give and take from both

sides." One of the challenges coming to the RCA Band has been settling on a suitable design for Bdr Douglas' uniform. "There is currently no authorized regiment-wide RCA piper's uniform, so the design process has been challenging." Bdr Douglas expects that he will have a fully authorized ceremonial, concert dress, and DEU uniform in the near future.

Bdr Douglas' regular routine includes many mess dinners, concerts, parades, and some funerals and memorial services. His first year included a tour to France and Belgium as part of a Directorate of History and Heritage (DHH) and Veterans Affairs Canada (VAC) Pilgrimage to commemorate the 90th anniversary of the Armistice at the end of the World War I. There Bdr Douglas participated in numerous ceremonies of remembrance including ceremonies at the Vimy Ridge and Beaumont Hamel Memorials.

Bdr Douglas performed at The Royal Canadian Artillery Band's Annual Christmas Concert at Edmonton's Winspear Centre on November 30. This concert, in support of Make-a-Wish Northern Alberta, featured a very moving pipe duet performance of *Amazing Grace* with Bdr Jim Douglas and MWO Colin Norris who recently returned from Afghanistan. A Year at 1 Fd Regt in Halifax

This year was a busy year of training for the Regiment. We participated in exercises to hone our gunnery skills, maintain our soldier skills, and become proficient in contemporary Army doctrine. We undertook the usual yearly regimen of training, without the much-missed ARCON, which was cancelled this year in order to shift efforts to operational commitments.

The unit swore in new members throughout the year, thanks in part to an open house hosted at the Halifax Armoury. The open house was a massive recruitment drive for the Army Reserves primarily, but the Royal Canadian Mounted Police also brought a kiosk. The Regiment gave exciting demonstrations to hundreds of high school students, who were bussed in from surrounding schools. The event also attracted local media, and featured demonstrations of equipment and techniques employed by the Army Reserves.

The Regiment also participated in a domestic operations exercise February, in Shannon Park, Halifax, a derelict and abandoned neighbourhood. The area proved to be a realistic training environment ideally suited for practicing MOUT skills. Troops also learned helicopter techniques including casualty evacuation with the help of CH 146 Griffin helicopters.

At the request of Parks Canada, the Regiment also provided two C3 howitzers to the 53rd Louisburg Battery, 5th Regiment of the Royal Artillery in June. Representatives from the Battery were in Nova Scotia to participate in ceremonies at Fortress Louisbourg on Cape Breton Island. The ceremonies commemorated the 250th anniversary of the second siege of Louisbourg. The ceremonies were a part of the larger D250 campaign, celebrating 250 years of democracy in Canada. The guns were used to signal the opening of the celebrations. The event was attended by about 30 000 spectators and involved about 1300 re-enactors. Warrant Officer Hartery of 1st Field Regiment and Sergeant Fitzgerald of 84th Independent Field Battery supervised the deployment.

The Regiment also provided an enemy force, a fire support

co-ordination centre, and a forward observation party to participate in Southbound Trooper VIII in Fort Pickett, Virginia this past February. The forward observation party got the chance to practice their air observation post skills from a Canadian CH-194 Sea King helicopter. The fire support co-ordination centre played a role in the final scenario of the exercise which gave depth to the scenario and maximized training value for the Regiment in the absence of guns.



The Regiment also experienced a change in Command this year. Lieutenant-Colonel Nickerson handed command of the Regiment over to Lieutenant-Colonel MacDonald on field exercise Blazing Gunner in May. The ceremony was carried out in a proper field artillery setting.

The Regiment continues to support operations in Afghanistan by augmenting the Regular Force with

personnel. Captain James Huddleston returned this fall from Afghanistan where he worked for the All Source Intelligence Centre for Task Force 1-08 in Kandahar Airfield. Bombardier Ryan Pepler, Bombardier Edward Power, Bombardier, Adam Greeley, and Gunner Edward Armshaw are all currently deployed.

The unit has supplied Task Force 3-08 with two gunners. Warrant Officer Lannigan, Bombardier Pepler and Bombardier Power are deployed with F Bty, 2 RCHA and 128th Battery, 4th Air Defence Regiment respectfully. WO Lannigan is currently the BQMS for F Bty and the Bdr's are both on the launch and recovery team. They prepare, maintain, and operate the CU-161 Sperwer Tactical Unmanned Aerial Vehicle Flight launching system. The system is a battle group asset capable of providing overwatch of the airfield. The aircraft is useful to ground force commanders, who can use them for convoy overwatch and target acquisition for artillery.

Over the next year, 1st Field Regiment and 84th Field Independent Battery continue to work together in order to maintain and enhance our capability to meet our domestic mandate as well as provide support to the Canadian Artillery, in general. Ubique!

The 08-09 year began with the change of command between LCol M. Bourque (outgoing CO) and LCol D. Parent (incoming CO) which took place during a Regimental parade at the Côte-des-Neiges Armoury on the 27 of September 08 in the presence of the 34 Bde CCmdt, Col Lapointe. This parade was preceded by a Regimental dinner held in the officer's mess at the armoury with the CCmdt, Bgen E. Beno as the guest of honour. The year was also marked by the change of honoraries between LCol (H) Fecteau (outgoing) and LCol (H) DeKovachich (incoming).

Another activity of note is the Saint-Barbara's mess dinner which was organized and hosted by the 2nd Field Regiment on the 6th of December 08. The regimental dinner *2RCA in Mississippi on EX NOBLE GUERRIER 09* took place at the Atwater club and included 150 members from 5 RALC, 2 RCA, 6 RCA, and 62 RCA. The 2nd Field Regiment also took part in the LFQA militia concentration exercise, EX NOBLE GUERRIER which took place at Camp Shelby in Mississippi from the 3 to the 11 of January 09. During this exercise, the regiment fielded a Bty of 4 guns which was incorporated into a combined Regiment composed of 2 RCA, 6 RCA and 62 RCA. This Regiment was commanded by the 2nd Field Regiment's ex-CO, LCol Bourque. During this exercise, a total of 2200 rounds were fired using regular firing procedure and specialized equipment not

usually employed by the reserves such as MSTAR radar and NODLR thermal cameras. Other highlights included taking part in regimental fire plans, conducting direct fire under the command of gun detachment commanders and detaching FOO to infantry Coy to act as advisors on firepower.



The 2nd Field Regiment was also implicated in several civic parades, most notably by conducting gun salutes in support of the Canada Day celebrations which took place in Montreal's old port and in support of the Remembrance Day parade in downtown Montreal.

The 2nd Field Regiment is also contributing to operational force generation by providing 9 members to Task Force 1-09. These members will be employed in

3rd Field Regiment, RCA (The Loyal Company)

Like every other year since the Regiment's beginning in 1793, the year 2008 has been extremely busy.

The army's continued emphasis on operations, particularly in Afghanistan, has reinforced the need to provide realistic and relevant training. Drawing on lessons learned and new doctrine and tactics, 3rd Field Regiment continues to focus its training in the Contemporary Operating Environment (COE). The unit's training exercises were designed to develop and maintain core gunnery skills. However, field exercises also incorporated new SOPs in force protection and reconnaissance.

With the operational tempo continuously increasing, the Regiment has seen an increased demand for full time soldiers. Whether with the actual Task Forces in theatre, supporting W Battery, or filling other necessary Class B positions at CFB Gagetown, this has had an impact on Class A training and administration. Unit recruiting staff have been working diligently to ensure a steady stream of gunners into the unit, and the unit has still been able to conduct valuable, challenging training with over 50% of the unit on CI B.

2008 Highlights

Exercise Maritime Raider took place in Fort Pickett, Virginia, during the 2008 March Break. 3rd Field Regiment sent 9 personnel, consisting of a clerk, two general duty soldiers, and a FOO party to train with the members of 37 CBG in an Afghanistan-type setting. This training was infantry-driven, with the FOO party providing simulated indirect fire support through WES and arty simulators. It provided the other arms with a good appreciation of the importance and necessity of the guns on operations.

2008 saw 2 soldiers from the unit deploy to Afghanistan with the SUAV troop. Even as they were deploying 3 more gunners were starting their training to deploy in early 2009. Many of the soldiers who participated in TF 1-07 are already looking to return on the 2009-10 Task Forces.

On 7 September, 2008 3rd Field Regiment conducted a Change of Command parade for LCol D. Kirk McGeachy at CFB Gagetown, NB. The position of Commanding Officer was passed to LCol Shawn I. McPherson, previously the Battery Commander for 115 Bty. LCol McGeachy had commanded the unit since September of 2005, and had previously been the CO from 2000 to 2002.

Maj J.C. Besner returned to take command of 115 Bty for his second tour as BC. Originally from 6 RAC in Lévis, Qc, Capt Chantal Bérubé has taken the mantle of BK. MWO Rene Parker, once a member of the unit many years ago before his component transfer to the Regular Force, has taken over as BSM of 115 Bty. 89 Bty also saw a change of their command, with Capt Wayne LeBlanc assuming command as BC alongside the BSM, WO J.H. MacKay.

November 3rd, 2008 marked the untimely death of the late LCol Duncan (Kirk) McGeachy. Amidst shock and grief, 3rd Field Regiment showed their respects for the former Commanding Officer and long standing member of the Regiment (36 years) by holding a full military funeral in Saint John, NB. Alongside friends and family members were co-workers, former serving members of the Regiment and officers and men who had worked with him. Kirk is survived by his wife, Lisa, and three children. He will be greatly missed. Stand Easy Kirk!

Training in 2009

The new year will have a focus on preparing the unit for the next Maritime Raider. The second iteration will be taking place in Fort Pickett, VA, from 27 February to 8 March, 2009. 3rd Field Regiment will be sending 45 soldiers along with an attachment of 9 soldiers from 1st Field Regiment to man three guns. This troop will be supporting light infantry companies with live artillery fire during some of their complicated ranges. FOO will be attached and will provide live and simulated artillery support to their respective combat team commanders.

This is an excellent opportunity for soldiers of all ranks to participate in a live combat team exercise in the COE. During the week there will also be live fire convoys operations training, a competition for Top Detachment, and gunner specific scenarios based on deploying in Afghanistan using the TPPs from 1 RCHA, such as actions on IEDs, and ambush drills. The final 36 hours of the week will consist of supporting a company defensive position.

After Ex Maritime Raider, the unit will be conducting at least one live fire exercise in the Spring, in order to apply the learnings from Maritime Raider. After that, it will be preparation time for summer individual training before our busy Fall training schedule.

Currently the Regiment also has one Capt and one Sgt in Petawawa conducting work up training for TFA 1-10 as well as a Lt on HUMINT training.

This past year saw the unit conduct a basic winter indoctrination weekend exercise in January quickly followed by Ex Cold Steel (105/81mm live fire) in February and then Ex Coop Gunner, the annual Regimental level live fire exercise in March with 11 Fd and 56 Fd. April and May saw the 7th Toronto participate in two more live fire exercises as part of 32 Brigade's Iron Talon series of manoeuvres. On those exercises, FOO parties led by Capts Scott Graham and Navraj Grewal marched in support of A Coy and B Coy respectively and provided valuable fire planning advice to assist those units seize their bridgeheads. The summer and fall saw the unit focus its efforts on IBTS training with one range practice in June as well as two IBTS weekends in September. October saw the unit deploy again to conduct a weekend live fire shoot. The focus of November training was Domestic Operations. Two FOO parties led by Capts Graham and Finelli deployed to Thunder Bay along with the Bde Dom Response Coy (DRC) to participate in an LFCA area wide Dom Ops exercise which included the IRU from Petawawa and the DRCs from 31 and 33 Bdes. The remainder of the Regiment remained in Toronto that weekend to conduct local Dom Ops and IBTS training.

As well as providing instructors to the 32 Bde Battle School for the BMQ, SQ and PLQ courses, the unit ran a mortar conversion course, two serials of Basic Comms, one serial of Arty Comms, an OP Members course and a Recce Tech Course. The unit provided instructors to Sault Ste Marie for the local area summer Arty school as well as six soldiers to support the Arty School in Gagetown. In early July of 2008 the Regt had over 80 of its soldiers either tasked away or on course somewhere in Canada; almost half of its effective strength of 170. By the end of the summer the unit had received 13 new DP1 gunners, 13 new PLQ qual Bdrs, seven new Det 2iC qualified MBdrs as well as many more successful course completions.

The Regiment fired three salutes during the past year for Victoria Day, Canada Day and Remembrance Day. The crowd at the Remembrance Day salute numbered over 300 and we were especially honoured again this year by a visit from His Honour David C. Onley O. The Regiment's Band also participated in many high profile events this past year most notable being the playing of the 1812 overture at BMO Field during the CNE accompanied by the sound of the guns and gunners from the Regt and from throughout LFCA.

The Regiment held two special guest nights in 2008 with the Col Cmt, BGen (ret'd) E.B. Beno, OMM, CD being the special guest for our Artillery Day Dinner and the Director of Artillery, Col D.D. Marshall, CD, being the special guest for our St Barbara's Day Dinner. At the St Barbara's Day dinner we also commemorated the service of Major Stephen Zurbrigg, CD who just retired after almost 43 years of service. Best of luck Steve.

With the irreplaceable role of Artillery overseas, 38 CBG ATG has never been more determined to achieve a state of operational readiness such that our Group (ATG) is capable of deployment. In the past year, we have overcome a demanding training schedule and enforced a common ethos among members of a great respect for fellow gunners. The Group (ATG) is a means of combining the efforts of the three artillery units of 38 CBG, namely 10 Field Regiment RCA (18 Battery, Regina, 64 Battery, Yorkton), 26 Field Regiment RCA (Regimental Head Quarters, 26th Field Regiment Pipes and Drums, 13 Battery, Portage, 71 Battery and HQ & Svcs Battery, Brandon), and 116 Independent Field Battery, Kenora. 26th Fd Regiment is unique in having a complete CSS Bty with Medical. The 26th Fd Regt Pipes and Drums is the longest serving Artillery Bagpipe Band in the Commonwealth. The three units retain their entire identities, honouraries, unit funds, unit traditions, and so forth. The three share the same Commanding Officer and RSM – in 2009 Lieutenant-Colonel Donald Thompson and Chief Warrant Officer Mike MacRae. The unified command allows for the most efficient distribution of leadership, for the units have varying strengths in terms of officers, senior NCOs and warrant officers, and soldiers. The ATG has maintained centralized training and operations while decentralizing administration to the maximum extent possible. Unit identities remain unchanged, as does the footprint of five batteries in five communities. Overall strength of the ATG has grown to 257 members, proving to be the largest Reserve ATG in Canada!

January kicked off with a series of unit training weekends running concurrent with the Driver Wheel and Comms courses in Brandon, MB. 38 CBG ATG is proud to announce all fourteen candidates from our Group were graduates from the Comms course and sixteen candidates were graduates from the Driver Wheel course. Also in January '08, LCol Thompson authorized the units to train every Tuesday evening which worked well taking care of administration requirements such that time on unit training weekends could be more efficiently directed toward Artillery training. IFT training was arranged for 26th Fd Regt serving as workup training for Exercise Urban Thrust 23-24 February 2008. In preparation for Brigade level Exercise Prowling Gunner IV (PG IV) 29-30 Mar 08, a CAX PD session was held in Edmonton, AB from 8-10 Feb 08 in addition to navigation and local defence training on 9-10 Feb 08.

Prowling Gunner IV was an evolutionary training exercise with the aim of preparing soldiers within 38 ATG to become proficient in the application of Gunnery, Battle Craft, Defensive Operations and Command and Control. The Brigade conducted defensive operations within a level 3 Field Artillery Battery context in preparation for deployment for the Brigade Exercise Prairie Defender. Artillery skills were challenged by leadership at all levels as this exercise included the GPO's open action, anti tank drills and procedures, AN missions executed from gun position, gun programs, FPF and HF tasks; self-illumination; emergency smoke withdrawal and engaging dismounted troops direct with HE. It was an action packed weekend including three moves within three moves first thing Saturday morning, with the first round down range by 1100 hours despite difficult weather conditions (blizzard conditions generated a white-out Saturday afternoon, resulting in a retreat to the HQ & Svcs Bty station out of the field). The exercise welcomed several guests



including the Brandon Sun for media coverage and the Army Cadets from the Yorkton area. Also in with PG IV was an attached Medical Officer from 17th Amb in Winnipeg, MB which assisted HQ & Svcs Bty in exercising several casualty evac scenarios; and a cook from Thunder Bay was attached to the Brigade for this exercise. Overall, the weekend was a success with several boundaries pushed and leadership at all levels attaining valuable lessons.

The 26th Fd Regt/ XII MB Dragoons museum held its annual Vimy Night auction on 5 April 08. In efforts to raise money in support of the museum and generate a greater interest in the museum within the unit and the community, this annual event includes casino games and appetizers followed by an auction of items donated by local businesses. This year's Vimy Night brought in several serving members and community members and was decidedly a success after generating significant funds for the next operating year.

26th Fd Regiment had a monumental year in 2008, celebrating its 100th Anniversary throughout the year. Exercising a historical right to parade through the city with arms (as granted by the mayor of Brandon), 26th Fd Regt held a Freedom of the City in Brandon on 19 Apr 08. Also in celebration of the 100th Anniversary, there was significant focus on the 60th annual Royal Military Ball in Brandon, MB. The Honourable John Harvard, Lieutenant Governor of Manitoba recognized this



ball as “an excellent way to celebrate (26th Field Regiment)’s strong presence and long history here in Brandon”. Le 62^e RAC a vu de l'action

The only person to remain at RHQ RCA through out 2008 was the Asst Adjt RCA, Capt Geoff Popovits. Maj Gerry Lessard

took up full time duties as the Base G1 in January and Cpl Crystal Yaroslowsky returned to Base as Cashier in July. Maj Chuck LaRocque, formally the Base COS took over as Regt Maj in November, but the RHQ Clerk was not replaced. However, on the plus side, a new Regt Adjt was filled in November with the posting in of Capt Victor de

Waal, fresh from a tour in Afghanistan. Butler, Bdr Zinck, Capt Popovits Sgt Dave Redford

returned to 1 RCHA in August, and was replaced by Sgt Angus Henry (4 AD Regt) as RHQ Sgt. RCA Museum - Musée de l'ARC

In the spring of 2008, The RCA Museum was awarded Manitoba Star Attraction status. In June we won the Tourism Westman "Best Product Development" award and in November we received the Deloitte Innovator of the Year National Tourism Award from the Tourism Industry Association of Canada. The RCA Museum is the first military museum in Canada to ever win a national tourism award.

In 2008 we opened a new permanent gallery entitled "The Manitoba Hall of Honour" and held two temporary exhibitions: "The War in Afghanistan" and "Aircraft, Arms and Art". In December we brought the "Canada's Gunners" exhibit home from its final show in Petawawa and incorporated many of the components into our National Artillery Gallery. Over 290,000 people experienced "Canada's Gunners" 2005-2008. This year we also participated in a new series entitled "Finding the Fallen" which aired on History TV in November.

We wish Gunners everywhere good luck and good shooting. We are proud to tell your stories.
