The Lists are sent by first-class mail to subscribers in the U.S. and Canada, and by airmail to all other areas; they should be received shortly after the publication dates listed below. IN THIS ISSUE

The October List again contains notice of the largest number of available positions ever reported in a single issue of the JIL. Information was provided by 736 departments of English, Comparative Literature and Linguistics in U.S. and Canadian colleges and universities, as well as some number of overseas institutions and non-academic enterprises. The listings describe 1,009 definite or possible positions; 982 were reported at this time last year.

GUIDE FOR USING THE JOB INFORMATION LIST

U.S. and Canadian Departments (pp. 1-36)

The main body of the List, arranged in alphabetical order by state (and for Canada, by province), contains information on definite or possible vacancies, comments on notices published in past issues (e.g., that a previously announced position has been filled), and notices from departments that expect no vacancies but would nevertheless like to keep resumes on file.

Read through this section item by item to see which departments would welcome your letter of application or inquiry at this time. Send letters only to departments expressing an interest in a person with your qualifications. If a notice states that no vacancies are expected but that the department would like to maintain a file of prospective candidates, you must decide in each case whether it is worthwhile to write.

Comparative Literature, Linguistics, and ESL Sections (pp. 37-39)

Notices in these fields have been separated out from the main body of the issue and placed under the appropriate heading, with occasional cross-referencing to items in the main body of the List that might also be of interest. Candidates should read through through the main body carefully, however, since the cross-referencing is not exhaustive.

Additional Entries (pp. 39-44)

The "Additional Entries" section consists primarily of notices that arrived after the main body of the List went to press, but in time to be included in an appendix. The section also contains notices of nonacademic positions, overseas opportunities, fellowships and grants, as well as openings in private secondary schools, when such information is supplied.

Departments Reporting No Vacancies (pp. 45-46)

This section lists departments reporting that they have no openings for the remainder of 1988-89 or for 1989-90. Do not waste your time and the department's time by writing; if an opening should occur unexpectedly, the department will report this in the next List. The only "no-vacancy" departments to which you should write are those in the main body of this issue where the notice has stated that letters or credentials will be kept on file.

GENERAL ADVICE FOR CANDIDATES

Be sure that your dossier (transcript, letters of recommendations, and other material) is ready to be sent out by your placement bureau to any department that requests it. Prepare and duplicate a one-page vita sheet to enclose with any letters of application or inquiry. In your letter of application, it is probably wise to express a willingness to be interviewed at the department's convenience. Professional meetings provide a convenient opportunity for such interviews (see list of upcoming meetings on page ii).

While it is important to begin to search for a position immediately, you should be aware that hiring goes on all year. Surveys indicate that only about half of all English and foreign language departments have begun recruiting by the end of December, and that the majority of departments do not complete the recruiting process until spring, in some cases until summer.

Bear in mind that the candidate who has not limited his or her search for a new position to a particular geographical area or kind of institution is most likely to find a position. Do not discount the small colleges where one often has the opportunity to teach a wide selection of courses to students of varied backgrounds.

NOTICE ON TENURE POLICIES

The Modern Language Association recommends that department administrators and their representatives inform candidates before or during the interview about prospects for tenure in the specific position under consideration and about the tenure policies and practices in their departments and institutions. If the information is not offered, candidates are urged to inquire about these policies.

ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF APPLICATIONS

Acting on a recommendation from the MLA Delegate Assembly, the MLA Executive Council has adopted a policy calling for departments to acknowledge all applications for announced positions either by letter or by self-addressed postcards provided by applicants.

Statement on the Use of Part-Time Faculty

The following statement on the use of part-time faculty was developed by an ad hoc committee of the Association of Departments of English and adopted by the MLA Executive Council in May 1982:

The recent dramatic increase in the use of part-time teachers in many departments of English and foreign languages is already threatening departmental integrity, professional standards, and academic excellence. Although some part-time appointments add significant dimensions to curricula and some professionals prefer to accept only part-time academic appointments because of other commitments, most part-time appointments are not made for educationally sound reasons. Indeed, the primary motivation for many of these appointments has been to reduce the cost of instruction.

From the point of view of the departmental administrator, part-time teachers fall into two general groups. Most are clearly temporary members of a department. Others teach from year to year and become virtually permanent. Graduate students who serve as apprentice teachers enjoy a special status in their departments and are therefore distinct from these groups.

The very conditions under which most temporary and permanent part-time teachers are employed define them as nonprofessionals. Often they are hired quickly, as last-minute replacements, with only hasty review of their credentials. They receive little recognition or respect for their contributions to their departments; in many instances they are paid inequitably.

The potential damage to academic programs caused by the excessive use of part-time teachers cannot be calculated exactly, but some negative effects are unavoidable. Because part-time teachers are not treated as members of the departmental community, they often have a limited commitment to the institution and its students. Because part-time teachers rarely participate, as professionals should, in the development of courses, the continuity of sequential courses and the consistency of multisectioned courses suffer. Because part-time teachers are rarely available to advise students or, if available, may not be fully informed about institutional programs, inordinately heavy responsibility for advising falls to the full-time faculty. In addition, because of the low professional standing of part-time teachers, their frequent assignment to composition and introductory language courses diminishes the importance of basic courses at a time when society recognizes a need for special attention to this part of the curriculum.

In the face of present conditions and concern about the decline in quality of humanities programs, the MLA urges college and university administrations to make new and concerted efforts to eliminate the excessive use of part-time teachers, to improve the conditions under which part-time teachers are employed, and to recognize the professional status and important contributions of such teachers. Continuation of excessive, unplanned use of part-time teachers can only exacerbate administrative difficulties, invite student dissatisfaction, and threaten the quality of education.

The MLA offers the following guidelines for the employment of part-time teachers.

Guidelines

1. *Each department should develop a long-range plan that clarifies the use of both temporary and permanent part-time teachers in terms of departmental needs and goals.* This plan should establish an appropriate limit on how many part-time teachers may be hired in relation to the number of full-time faculty and graduate students who serve as apprentice teachers.

2. *All part-time teachers should be treated as professionals.* They should be hired and reviewed according to processes broadly comparable to those established for full-time faculty. They should be given mailboxes, office space, and clerical support. They should receive adequate introduction to their teaching assignments, departments, and institutions. They should either be paid a pro rata salary or receive a just salary that accurately reflects their teaching duties and an additional stipend for any duties outside the classroom they are asked to assume. When appropriate and in accordance with well-thought-out policies, part-time teachers should participate in determining departmental policies and in planning the courses they teach.

3. *If there is a recurrent need for the services of part-time teachers, departments should consider establishing a cadre of permanent part-time teachers.* In addition to the privileges outlined in item 2, above, these teachers should receive appropriate fringe benefits and incentives that foster professional development, for example, merit raises and access to research and travel funds.

Job Workshop at New Orleans Convention

Another in the successful series of job workshops for MLA members interested in exploring employment outside the academy will be held at the 1988 convention in New Orleans. This year's clinic will be conducted by Howard Figler, director of the University of Texas Career Center and author of *The Complete Job-Search Handbook*. The MLA's current series of job workshops began at the 1984 convention. The job workshops in 1986 and 1987 were sold out, and the response of participants was enthusiastic. "I see this seminar as the first necessary step to undertaking the difficult task of starting a nonacademic career," wrote one participant at the 1987 workshop. "I'm excited about making a career change; I was fearful before," wrote another. A third observed that the workshop "gave me confidence, a new network of friends and colleagues to draw upon, a sense of

precision about the kinds of jobs and salaries I can command. I was frightened and experienced a sort of 'career vertigo' whenever I thought about a nonacademic position. I've managed to overcome most of those anxieties."

The job workshop will help participants learn to identify career options and marketable skills, prepare effective letters of application and résumés, locate jobs, and improve their interviewing and negotiation skills. It is especially recommended for those deciding whether to seek nonacademic professional careers.
