June 21. Friday. Snow. S.W. wind. Arriving at Director's finger had. Ice ran out in aft. to see snow. Arrived the other side on 23rd all 100. I. has 10. Is 8. Mygale's by Captain. Sunny hard in the evening. Wind shifted to N.W. down aft.

June 22. Saturday. Quiet night. Snow from N.W. Coast (Hots Island) with in the last days at Director's finger had. Capt. DeLong's team will go via S.W. channel - other party to Mygale's in evening from Stearn's backing chart. Capt. Ken saw seal moral course. Found

A study had been a slight thaw than all frozen again. No sun all day. A lot of birds of sea. Several fish all black & frozen when low water marks. Light snow & mist & rain.

June 27. Thursday. Did not start for Great Island. Snow but Cristopherson and Anson had taken 5 good "working" flights out of boat and left their tale over. Ken seeing of some small rain. Probably he thought it will be a way of weather permitting to look like. Tomorrow. Francis reported but not yet come. Light rain but fish snow had covered over all the tracks. Domingo still in bed in the sled - the old woman looking very bad - something over by with head in hand - one eye shut only one forearm - apparently internally being it is a to show her by hand which usually are full despite unlike the present looking legs of an old American Cuban. Not D. the young quite comfortable.

The little fish were quite content playing about in the sea with their feet & legs. Along the river. The Kingfisher looking more ancient than ever. Singing curiously black white more distinct purple black hills. River at low tide and whole line of sandbars - sea coast at substrate lined with dead black sand sandy mounds. All the margin frozen and the mounds also but their stems not seem to kill them. Crown effect with snow rising almost from the usual kds. In the morning Domingo had his face painted (by old Mr. D.) with red lines to simulate a monkey. Did not note anything like what as the old woman. Singing.

D.K. was curiously silent except when the evening the sun could be heard any more than away in the distance. Crown chief contrast in colors - black & deep blue snow capped mountains - all grey sky behind the North Island mountains and a sharply snowed line of light on the horizon where the water of the Gulf met the mountains. That some marked difference in composition of Narvaia & Hoki Island. Primer very mantanous especially with the whole surface punctated by long tubular channels & sinuses. The latter sets practically absent in Narvaia which has small but in marked contrast to you flat or undulating country in its eastern parts. In this respect it resembles Pinea del Diego which again, save on its western side, is similar to Narvaia to the south & Palagonia (also partly) to the north. You say not "mineral" or Narvaia but especially on Hoki Island - the fumaroles on Hoki. West coast of Narvaia (along Suwayo basin & further south) seem identical in structure with opposite coast of Hoki Idl.

Well, the latter says that part was actually dry at some a the old Narvaia station on Jekouka Bay. Many parts had so ~~more~~ flat as majority of the Diego, looks like part in the foreground - but perhaps climatic conditions subsequent favorable per say coral on Hoki Island.

Tues. 2 July.

Some rain during night, then snowy. Ice gone from core. Glemens wife (Alacaluf), 4 children, in from Ponsonby at 3.30. No furs. Made up old Toldo.

Wed. 3 Snow at intervals.

Glemens agreed to come to Rio Douglas. S.W. wind, sun at intervals. Grandi in 6 pm. Cutter engine & natives coming in broken down. Pedro consented Bessie coming Rio Douglas. Rough outside core.

Thurs. 4. Wind during night. Wind S.S.W. Dull morning, mostly snowing. Bad weather in Narrows & Sound. Unable to leave. Glemens still in camp.

Friday 5. Very bad during night. Attack as before' at Rio Douglas. Helpless.

Sat 6. In bed. Bad & helpless.

Ken left for Ushurraia to see if Doctor would come.

Sun. 7 Clemens & family left for Ushurraia. Unfortunately, cutter in with drink, & wild nights.

Monday 8. Ken back from Ushurraia with things sent by Dr. Martin Lawrence & Capt. Alvarez.
