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# **Program Update**

When changing to a new software version, the machine requires updating.

# **Contents of Update Kit:**

Update hard disk in mobile rack Programmed dongle for the required country and version Software licence Win95 (only if you update 1 - 4 to version 6) Update instructions

#### SilverBall Upright:

In the case of an update from versions 1 - 4 to version 6, please attach the enclosed Microsoft software licence to the back right side of the inside of the machine.

#### SilverBall Beetle:

In the case of an update from versions 1 - 4 to version 6, please attach the enclosed Microsoft software licence to the bottom of the inside of the machine.

Please note: We expressly would like to draw your attention to the Microsoft Licence Agreement on page 37!





# **Updating the machine:**

The SilverBall Software is located on the permanently installed hard disk in the machine's PC. During an update the hard disk in the mobile rack is copied to the installed hard disk.

#### **Operating steps:**

- Turn off the device
- Insert the update hard disk- into the mobile rack (SilverBall Upright)
- Plug update hard disk into the mobile rack printed board (SilverBall Beetle)
- Turn on the device
- Copying process is started automatically (duration app. 15-20 min.)
- Hard disk is checked and if necessary new set up. This can result in a reboot of the device.
- Copying of general data (GENERAL)
- Copying of language dependent data (e.g.: GERMAN, ENGLISH, FRENCH)
- Copying of configuration-dependent data and data for the advertisement function.
- Waiting for message "Switch of SilverBall, Remove update disk, and switch on".
- Turn off the device.
- Remove update hard disk from the mobile rack (SilverBall Upright).
- Remove update hard disk from the mobile rack printed board (SilverBall Beetle).
- Turn on the device.
- Checking process is started automatically (duration app. 3-6 min, process similar to copying process).
- Waiting for message "Hard disk ok, switch SilverBall off and on".
- Turn off the device.
- Turn on the device.
- Activate test mode and calibrate touch-screen.
- Activate all desired settings in the test mode.
- Deactivate test mode.

After copying the data, the hard disk automatically checks the contents the next time the machine is turned on.

Later on, the checking procedure can also be started manually (see Functions description on page 9).

After the update, the touch-screen has to be realigned and recalibrated (SilverBall Upright; see Functions description page 9).

In the case of the SilverBall Beetle, the touch-screen needs calibrating only. Linearisation not possible!!





# **Brief operating instructions**

The test switch is located on the left front side underneath the cover (SilverBall Upright). The test switch is located on the right front side underneath the cover (SB Beetle). Test functions are described in detail in the help menu.

### **Key options:**

Turning on the test switch while at the same time pressing a specific key can call up the following programs:

Player 1A: Touch-screen calibration

• Player 1B: Touch-screen test

• Player 1C: Testpicture

Immediately after turning on the machine, during the boot-sequence, you can enter the following program:

• Player 2 all 3 buttons: Hard disk check

• Player 1A+2A: In the case of an update, data is not saved and new

reloaded

With switched test mode switch, during boot-sequence, you can enter the following program:

Player 2A: Touch-screen linearisation with subsequent calibration

SilverBall Beetle Linearisation not possible

# **InterLink:**

InterLink offers the possibility ok linking two SilverBall machines via a cable. This allows most games to be played directly against partner playing on the second machine.

# **Tournament mode:**

The tournament game in SilverBall is a competition that permits the players to play over a certain time period for a prize (in form of product prizes).

Two games are played per tournament, and it is possible to set the same game twice. The tournament starts as soon as you press the tournament start button in the main menu.





# **ChampionsNet:**

By installing our modem your SilverBall can be provided with the ChampionsNet mode. ChampionsNet is the world-wide SilverBall network.

For each game, there is a national and international high score list, whose entries are valid for 30 days.

Thus, you can measure yourself nationally and internationally in your favourite game.

The world's 10 best players of all time are listed in the "Hall of Fame"!

The high scores can also be consulted on the Internet under www.championsnet.net.

# **Email function:**

In all SilverBall machines equipped with ChampionsNet, there is an additional e-mail function available enabling you to send e-mail messages directly from the SilverBall.

# SilverBall-Internet Browser:

In all SilverBall machines equipped with ChampionsNet, you can additionally activate the SilverBall Internet Browser. This will allow you to surf the World Wide Web (WWW), chat and even send SMS's and web mails straight from the SilverBall.





# **Functions description**

In the following section, the individual settings and options that have partially already been mentioned in the Brief instructions are described once more in further detail.

# **Key options:**

By switching the test mode and simultaneous pressing a certain button you are able to enter the following programs:

#### • Player 1A: Touch-screen calibration

If you press the key Player 1A when turning on the test switch, your SilverBall will automatically change to the Calibration mode.

Make sure to stand upright in front of the SilverBall and proceed with calibration procedure.

After confirmation, the SilverBall will carry out a restart.

#### • Player 1B: Touch-screen test

If you press the key Player 1B when turning on the test switch, your SilverBall will automatically change to the touch screen test mode.

In this mode, you can check horizontal and vertical lines by tracing them with your finger on the screen. The drawn lines must be parallel to existing ones.

After switching back the test switch, the SilverBall will carry out a restart.

#### Player 1C: Testpicture

If you press key Player 1C when turning on the test switch, your SilverBall will automatically change to the test picture. By means of the control board installed on the right side inside the cabinet behind the coin acceptor, you can adjust the following image options:

Brightness Contrast Screen geometry

In the SilverBall Beetle you can only adjust brightness!

The setting option is located at the control board attached to the cover underneath the key 2B.

By switching back the test switch, the SilverBall will carry out a restart.

ATTENTION: Every time you adjust the image -geometry settings, the touch-screen needs to be recalibrated!





Immediately after turning on the machine, during the boot-sequence, you can enter the hard disk check:

• Player 2 all 3 buttons: Hard disk check

• Player 1A+2A: In the case of an update, data is not saved and new

reloaded

This can take several minutes. After the checking procedure is completed, the message "Hard disk OK, Switch SilverBall off and on" will appear. After this, the machine will start normally and access the playing mode.

By turning the test switch on and pressing key Player 2A while starting up the machine, you can start the touch-screen linearisation procedure manually.

Player 2A: Touch-screen linearisation

SilverBall Beetle: Linearisation not possible

By turning the test switch on and pressing key Player 2A while starting up the machine, your SilverBall will automatically change to the 25-point touch-screen linearisation. After the linearisation procedure is finished, the machine continues in calibration mode. After calibration is finished your SilverBall will carry out a restart. In the case of the SilverBall Beetle linearisation is not possible!

# Interlink:

InterLink offers the possibility ok linking two SilverBall machines via a cable. This allows most games to be played directly against partner playing on the second machine.

In order to play InterLink, you need a commercially available computer cable, which you can obtain from TAB-AUSTRIA under item number 360.134-261 of from any computer





store. The machines automatically recognise the InterLink cable and activate the InterLink mode for the games available.

#### The definition is:

25 pole SUB-D serial cable (zero modem cable), with a jack at both ends.

#### **Starting an InterLink game:**

When two machines are connected with a cable, an additional button (2-player InterLink) appears under the start buttons 1-4 in each game, which has the InterLink capability. If they wish to start an InterLink game, both players must be in the same game. The 1<sup>st</sup> player presses the InterLink starting button and receives a message "Please Wait", while at the same time the 2<sup>nd</sup> player is invented to an InterLink game. If the 2nd player agrees to play an InterLink game, he must press the InterLink staring button too. However, if the 2nd player does not wish to play InterLink, he may at any time choose to play a normal individual game or another game.

### **Tournament mode:**

The tournament game in SilverBall is a competition, which permits the players to play over a certain period for a prize (in the form of merchandise prizes).

It is possible to set tournaments in advance. For the first tournament, one can set the exact end (date and time), for all following tournaments the duration.

1. Tournament	Solitaire / Twelve	from 1.4.01 - 8.4.01
2. Tournament	Crazy Dice / Blocks	from 8.4.01 - 15.4.01 (1week)
3. Tournament	Twenty One / Twenty One	from 15.4.01-22.4.01 (1week)
4. Tournament	Solitaire / Twelve	from 22.4.01-29.4.01 (1week)

Two games are played per tournament, and it is possible to set the same game twice.

#### The tournament screen:







All the information, which is important for the player, will appear on the tournament screen. This will happen when you press the "tournament" button on the main menu. The tournament screen contains the following information:

Tournament games to be played

Tournament end date and time when the tournament will end

High score list current list of winners

Tournament start button this button starts a tournament game Tournament price how much a tournament game costs

#### Tournament start / tournament game

A tournament game starts as soon as you press the tournament start button. Animations appear before each of the two games announcing the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> rounds. The games in the tournament are identical to the individual games (same time, same number of rounds).

#### High score entry after a tournament game

If, after a tournament game, a player has attained the tournament high score (or if he is among the first three), he must, after entering his name, also input a four-figure personal identification number (PIN). This PIN number is necessary for the prize payoff and should not be forgotten.

#### The winners of the tournament

The first three players in the high score list are the winners of the tournament.

#### Presenting the winnings

The winnings can be presented after the completion of each tournament by the supervisor to the player. To do so, the player must select his name on the winners` list (for a tournament in progress, press the winners` list button on the tournament screen; if no tournament is running, the winners` list button is on the main menu). The supervisor must now press on the <u>SilverBall-Logo</u>. A new screen appears in which first the supervisor and then the player must enter their PIN numbers. After the player has correctly input his PIN number, the supervisor can give him the prize and delete the name of the player from the winners` list.

#### **Tournament settings**

If one wishes to play a tournament, it is necessary to enter a number of settings in test mode (tournament). You will find an explanation on page 14.

# **ChampionsNet:**

ChampionsNet is the world-wide SilverBall network.

For each game, there is a national and international high score list, whose entries are valid for 30 days.

Thus, you can measure yourself nationally and internationally in your favourite game.

The world's 10 best players of all time are listed in the "Hall of Fame"!

#### Participation:

With every game you automatically participate in the ChampionsNet! (no registration required)

If you have attained a high score in a game, you are asked to enter your name.





Then you are shown the place you have attained, and your name immediately appears on the national (and perhaps also the international) high score list.

The high scores can also be consulted on the Internet under www.championsnet.net.

# **Email function:**

In all SilverBall machines equipped with ChampionsNet, there is an additional e-mail function available enabling you to send e-mail messages directly from the SilverBall. For writing Emails use the keyboard, if you have finished press the **Send** button. You can see the remaining time on the upper right on the screen next to the **Send** button.

FROM: Enter your own Email address and it appears as the sender. If you do not have

your own Email address, simply enter your name.

TO: Enter the Email address of the addressee. \*)

CC: Enter the Email address of the addressee who should receive a copy of the

Email. \*)

BCC: Enter the Email address of the addressee who should receive a blind copy of the

Email. \*)

RE: Enter the subject. Text: Enter the text.

# <u>SilverBall Internet Browser:</u>

In all SilverBall machines equipped with ChampionsNet, you can additionally activate the SilverBall Internet Browser. This will allow you to surf the World Wide Web (WWW), chat and even send SMS's and web mails straight from the SilverBall.

Retrieve the information you are looking for with the SilverBall search engine.

#### Use these buttons:

BROWSE: to enter an address (e.g.: www.tab.at).

REFRESH: to re-display the latest version of the page.

HOME: to return to the homepage.

STOP: to discontinue further downloading from the webpage.

BACK: to return to view a previously visited page.

FORWARD: to move a page further.

EXIT: To close down the Silverball browser.

KEYBOARD: to input a text (e.g.: in the case of search engines).

# **Test mode**

You can access the SilverBall test mode by switching the test switch (on the left, inside the cabinet) at the same time as the main Menu 8games selection) is displayed on the screen. You can quit the test mode by switching back the test switch.

In the test mode, all settings can be adjusted that are necessary for the operation of the games.

On the test mode start page, you can look up your particular version and the exact name of your dongle.

The test mode offers the following options:

#### **General:**

**Test image:** In this mode a test picture is displayed according to which you

can check the image settings 8contrast, geometry, focus,...).

**Calibration:** This is were you can recalibrate the touch-screen after an

update or whenever necessary.

**Test:** Subsequent calibration procedure test.

**Adjust volume:** Intended for setting music volume during play and stand-by

time.

**Erase credits:** Existing credits are deleted.

**Erase high scores:** All high score entries are deleted.

**Master reset:** By pressing Master reset, all game data (credit, bookkeeping,

high scores, statistics) are reset to a default setting.

**Test credit:** A test credit is given.

# **Machine tests:**

**Coins:** Coin slot test for proper recognition and assignment of coins.

Bank notes: Banknote slot test for proper recognition and assignment of

bank notes.

Bonus card: Bonus card test.

**Last impulses:** This is where the appropriate recognition of coins and

banknotes is displayed.

**Button press:** Key check on function and proper assignment.





Meters: Test and check of counting impulse. After pressing the "Total

in" button, 10 impulses must have been counted on the meter.

# **Bookkeeping:**

Display of data concerning takings, bonus credits, test credits, running times and playing times. In Bookkeeping 2, the total brought-in sum, the operation times and the booked test credits are shown. Both bookkeeping systems can be deleted separately. Setting whether bookkeeping should be visible in the Supervisory Test Menu.

#### **Games:**

# **Advertising text - input:**

Enter advertisement pages that are shown during stand-by operation for the set period of time.

Background images, texts and ClipArt's can be used to design the advertisement page. Time setting for the length of display during stand-by operation.

# **ChampionsNet:**

Settings for operation in ChampionsNet.

**Machine/set-up site:** Enter the data of the site here.

The name of the site, the city and the country will be shown in

the high score list.

**Connection:** Here the data of the internet account and the daily transmission

are entered. For dialling-breaks you can enter commas (e.g.:

0,,07327765).

**Test connection:** By pressing this button the telephone line and the connection to

the internet is tested. By doing that you find out whether the modem is working, whether the number can be dialled, whether a connection can be established and whether the data of the

internet account were entered correctly.

**Test ChampionsNet:** The connection to the ChampionsNet server is being tested.

**Register:** Here the entered or changed data of the site are sent to the

ChampionsNet server or the already registrated data are picked up. The machine has to be registrated in order to

participate in the ChampionsNet.

**Receive high scores:** Here new data are sent to the ChampionsNet server and the

new high score lists are being received.

**Protocol:** Here the automatic connections to the ChampionsNet server

are registered.

**Email:** Activation or deactivation of the Email function, price settings

and statistics of the sent Emails.

Settings for the time available for writing an Email.

**WWW:** Activation or deactivation of the SilverBall Internet Browser for

the use of the internet, price settings for the online time and

statistics of the online time.

# **Basic settings:**

**Date and time:** Setting date and clock.

**Basic language:** Settings for basic language of game and test mode.





**Erotic:** Main activation or deactivation of erotic games.

Activation of erotica for a certain period (e.g.: 20:00 to 24:00

hrs).

Activation of erotic background images for games.

**Delete high scores:** Settings for deleting high score entries.

Never or in a certain set time interval.

# **Hardware settings:**

**Coins:** Setting for coin acceptance (channel, value).

**Bank notes:** Setting for banknote acceptance (channel, value).

**Meter impulse:** Setting for value of meter impulse.

**Currency:** Settings for the programmed currency for displaying during

playing mode.

**VDAI:** Settings for the VDAI read-out device.

# **Game price settings**

Setting for the price of game, credit value, bonus credit levels and freeplay mode.

# **Tournament settings**

The tournament mode is not available in some country versions.

**Current tournament:** This field must be activated in order, via the **Set games / price** 

button, to enter the tournament settings for current tournament.

**Next tournament:** This field must be activated in order, via the **Set games / price** 

button, to enter the tournament settings for the next

tournament.

Next but one This field must be activated in order, via the Set games / price

**tournament:** button, to enter the tournament settings for the next but one

tournament.

**Repeat:** If Repeat is marked, the sequence of the tournaments is

repeated, e.g. when the current tournament has ended, both the next and the next but on tournament move one place higher, while the former current one goes to the bottom of the

list. If only one tournament has been set, it is repeated.





**Set games/price:** If you choose a tournament (current, next but one) and then

press the **Set games / price** button, you can enter the settings

for this tournament (the two tournament games and the

tournament game price).

**Tournament end:** Shows the exact end of the current tournament.

**Tournament duration:** Shows the total duration of the further tournaments, which after

the first tournament are started automatically (if they are set or

Repeat is activated).

**Set:** If you press the **Set** button, a new screen page appears in

which you can enter tournament end, tournament duration and

price settings.

**Status:** This field gives you information about the current tournament

status ("tournament in progress" or "tournament ended").

**Start tournament:** If you have set a tournament and wish to start it, you must first

save the modified data by pressing the **Apply** button. Then the button **Start tournament** is activated (the tournament can be

started).

**Tournament end:** If you press this button the current tournament is ended and no

further tournament is started.

Winners list: If you press this button, a new screen page appears, in which

you can delete the winner from the winners list (after payoff of

the prizes).

**Apply:** Press this button in order to save and activate.

# PIN setting:

PIN for supervisor Here you can enter a PIN code (Personal Identification

Number) for 3 supervisors. The PIN is necessary for supervision so that tournament prizes can be awarded and the

winner can be deleted from the winner list afterwards.

PIN for test mode: Here you can enter a PIN code without which you cannot effect

any settings or modifications in test mode.

PIN for bookkeeping 2: Here you can enter a PIN code without which you cannot

access Bookkeeping 2.





# **Description of the games**

The following section describes SilverBall's current games:

# **Card Games:**

#### **Fire Towers:**



The object of this game is to clear the cards from the screen in the shortest time possible. To do this you must touch a card on the screen, which is the next value higher or lower than the card appearing on the top of the deck. Jokers are wild and can hold any value you wish. If you are unable to find a card which fits you must take another card from the deck.

ACE-2-3-4-5-6-7-8-9-10-J-Q-K-ACE-2-ACE-...

#### Solitaire:



The object of Solitaire is to use all the cards in the deck to build up the four suit stacks from Ace to King. Playing Solitaire involves the following procedures; to move a card from the deck or a stack, touch card on the deck and next touch the place where you want it. Or, to move more than one card from a stack, touch the uppermost card you want to move, and then touch the place where you want to place the cards. You can also move a card from a row stack to a suit stack by touching the card and then.

#### Eleven:



The object of the game is to clear the cards from the screen. To do so you must select cards which when added together equal 11 points. The quicker you do it the more points you receive. If you successfully use all the cards of the screen, you receive a point's bonus.

#### **Set Three:**



Try, faster than your opponent, to lay all the cards of the two piles in the lower fields. The cards can be laid on top of one another in increasing or decreasing order. The colour plays no role. After the king comes the ace and vice versa. One can place any number of cards in the interim storage area and then take them out in the reverse order. When the interim storage area and the two piles are empty, the game has been won and bother players come to the next level. Try to lay more cards than your opponent!

#### Cellitaire:



Try as quickly as possible with all cards to form 4 piles, which are ordered by colour and from ace to king. An ace can immediately be laid on one of the 4 target fields. Use the fields in the upper left as a place holder. In order to reveal the cards, at the end of the lower series you can move cards in declining order and alternating colour. The last card movement can be reversed. A partly covered card can be clearly revealed by touching it.





#### Get 21:



Try to form as many piles as possible with the card sum of 21. Cards you do not need can be moved into the interim storage area (on the right side next to the card pile). When you lay a card sum greater than 21, the respective pile field disappears and you thus have one less pile field. If you attain the required number of piles with the sum of 21, you ascend to the next level. The joker counts as 1 or 11.

Up & Down Around:



The object of this game is to clear the cards from the screen in the shortest time possible. To do this you must touch a card on the screen which is the next value higher or lower than the card appearing on the top of the deck. Jokers are wild and can hold any value you wish. If you are unable to find a card which fits you must take another card from the deck.

ACE-2-3-4-5-6-7-8-9-10-J-Q-K-ACE-2-ACE-...

Solitaire Pro:



The object of Solitaire is to use all the cards in the deck to build up the four suit stacks from Ace to King. Playing Solitaire involves the following procedures; to move a card from the deck or a stack, touch card on the deck and next touch the place where you want it. Or, to move more than one card from a stack, touch the uppermost card you want to move, and then touch the place where you want to place the cards. You can also move a card from a row stack to a suit stack by touching the card and then the stack where you wish to place it.

**Twenty One:** 



Try to form piles where the cards add up to 21. How many piles you need to advance to the next level can be seen in the window at the upper right. Cards which you don't need can be discarded to>the right of the pile. The joker counts as either 1 or 11.

Take 3:



Clear away the cards as quickly as possible. After you have marked 3 similar cards (i.e. 3 with the same suit or 3 with the same number) they will disappear.

One:



Try to clear all your own cards. For this, lay a card of the same colour, number or the same symbol on the card pile. Press "ONE" if only one more card is left, otherwise you receive more cards. With card +3 you can select the opponent who receives the 3 cards. You reach the next level when you get rid of all your cards faster than your opponent.





#### Match 11:



Get rid of the cards as fast as possible. They disappear after you have marked cards adding up to the sum of 11. When you make 3 cards disappear from the playing field, the first goes over to your opponent. With 4 cards, the first 2 go over to him; with 5 cards, the first 3. In this way, you can impede your opponent from clearing all his cards.

Stack Up Match:



Try, faster than your opponent, to lay all the cards of the two piles in the lower fields. The cards can be laid on top of one another in increasing or decreasing order. The colour plays no role. After the king comes the ace and vice versa. One can place any number of cards in the interim storage area and then take them out in the reverse order. When the interim storage area and the two piles are empty, the game has been won and bother players come to the next level. Try to lay more cards than your opponent!

Twelve:



The object of the game is to clear the cards from the screen. To do so you must select cards which when added together equal 12 points, (Aces have a value of either 1 or 11). The quicker you do it the more points you receive. If you successfully use all the cards of the screen, you receive a points bonus.

Up & Down:



The object of this game is to clear the cards from the screen in the shortest time possible. To do this you must touch a card on the screen which is the next value higher or lower than the card appearing on the top of the deck. Jokers are wild and can hold any value you wish. If you are unable to find a card which fits you must take another card from the deck.

ACE-2-3-4-5-6-7-8-9-10-J-Q-K

**Triple Up:** 



Put the cards at the bottom on to the top three piles as quickly as possible. You can either put cards of the same suit or the same value on top of each other. A card of the same suit gives you the points shown above the pile. A card of the same value changes the suit, and the points value above the pile increases before you receive it.

Swim:



The purpose is to obtain 3 cards of the same colour, making a total of 31. The ace scores 11, picture cards score 10 and the remaining cards correspond to their individually designated values. The same three cards score 30.5 points. Is it your move? You may exchange a card or all three cards from the middle of the pack. If you click on "Move", you may exchange again in the next round. If you click on "Match" you may exchange with the other players only one more time. The loser must abandon his dinghy If you have lost three times you have to swim If you lose one more time, you are eliminated.





#### **Monte Carlo:**

#### Words:



Try to guess the covered words. If you choose a letter, which is contained in the word, it is displayed. If the word does not contain that letter, time is deducted. When you believe you recognise the word being sought, press the "SOLVE" button and then all the still-missing letters. Furthermore, you have the possibility of receiving assistance 3 times.





# **Warranty and Liability**

- 1. Complaints concerning new machines delivered by us must be communicated to the seller in writing at the latest within eight days after receipt of the product.
- 2. With regard to concealed defects, complaints may only be raised immediately after their discovery, however no later than three months after receipt of the product.
- 3. The TFT LCD display is made up of over 1,000,000 thin-film transistors (TFT`s). A small number of missing black or luminous dots is characteristic of TFT LCD technology. However, the TFT LCD display should be changed if more than 15 black or luminous dots are missing.
- 4. If a third party repairs or tries to repair the delivered good, all complaints are excluded; the same applies if the customer has undertaken unqualified interventions on the delivered good. If the stickers or seals on machine parts are removed or damaged, the warranty expires for this part.
- 5. Complaints must be raised in writing or by fax. All warranty claims are excluded if TAB is not informed about any defects in the product in a timely manner in accordance with the provisions contained in the preceding points.
- 6. With regard to justified complaints, the customer is first entitled to repair of the defects. The customer must send the defective product back to TAB. Instead of performing the repair, TAB is entitled to deliver a replacement unit. If, in the event of a justified complaint, the product is not repaired within 4 weeks after receipt of the product at TAB and if the repair product or the replacement unit is not within the same time period transferred to the transporter for sending to the customer (at TAB's expense), the customer is entitled, at his option, to demand a reduction of the purchase price or to rescind the contract.
