Fred W. Adams, co-founder of the Adams Extract Co., died Sunday at the age of 88.

Adams and his father started the business in 1909 in Beeville and then moved it to Austin in 1920. While working as a salesman for the fledgling company, Adams enrolled at what is now Southwest Texas State University in San Marcos.

In 1912 he put up \$50 of his own money to start the

Normal Star, a publication that has grown into the University Star student newspaper.

Named a Distinguished Alumnus of SWT, Adams also held the distinction of being the first graduate of the University of Texas School of Business, earning his degree in 1917.

Adams lived in Austin for 66 years, was an active member of the University Presbyterian Church, a director of First Federal Savings in Austin and a member of the Rotary Club and the Austin YMCA. He was also a trustee of Austin College in Sherman where he built the campus hospital which was named in his honor.

Adams is survived by his wife, Mattie Gandy Adams; a daughter, Evelyn Mayes; three sons, John G. Adams, Fred Adams Jr. and Lawrence Adams; 11 grandchildren and one great-grand child, all of Austin.
