

"I had to work....." -Senior Chris Amos


"I heard our float got busted......the fireworks were pretty cool. I worked on my truck most of the day." -Senior Ross Umphrey










STOPAL When's there time? ROSES!




Mike Matson, a junior who is on the wrestling team, had this to say about sports, "You feel you have accomplished something. It gives you a drive to be the best at what you do."


























