## SUMMARY OF MONTHLY OPERATIONS

The month of January was spent for the most part in preparations for redeploying the Wing in Korea to give further support to ground operations. By the end of the month a number of significant changes had taken place. VMF-214 and VMF-323 had left the carrier and after a brief period at Itami moved to Bofu in the closing days of the month. Meanwhile construction of a new base at Pusan Field West (K-1) Korea, was proceeding, and the command post of MAG-12 was moved to this place from Itami. VMF-212 continued to operate from the USS BATAAN, while VMF(N)-542 and VMF(N)-513 operated planes from Itazuke Air Force Base, Japan under the control of the

the 5th Air Force. In the latter part of the month, VMF-311 which had been operating from Pusan Field East, K-9) returned to Itami, and VMF(N)-513 began to operate planes from that field, discontinuing its flights from Itazuke.

The Headquarters Squadron of the Wing remained at Itami, but the establishment of Marine Wing Service Squadron-1 at Itami during the month was intended to relieve it of many of its house-keeping functions so that it might be moved to the forward area with the Wing headquarters. For the first two weeks of the month, Major General HARRIS was at Headquarters, U. S. Marine Corps, Washington, D. C. Brigadier General CUSHMAN was acting commander of the 1st Marine Air Wing. General HARRIS reassumed command 13 January 1951 upon his return.

Continued planning for the movement of the entire wing to Pusan Field West (K-1) was carried on. However, the movement date depended upon the completion of the field. It was estimated that the additional runway and tent areas would be completed early in February.

CONFIDENTIALCHRONOLOGY

- 1Jan51 - On this date the Wing suggested to Commanding General Fleet Marine Force, Pacific that a proposal by the Commander Fleet Air, Japan to replace personnel of VMF-214 and VMF-323 by that of VMF-232 and VMF-235 be referred to the Commandant. Subsequent exchanges indicated the Wing's desire that the personnel exchange be effected on a squadron for squadron basis. Fleet Marine Force, Pacific favored a permanent system of individual replacements, but recommended that a final decision be deferred until the plans of the Commandant were known. (See CG IMAW dispatch 010650Z, CG FMFPAC dispatch 030105Z, CG IMAW dispatch 040610Z, and CG FMFPAC dispatch 062145Z, Appendix I). Wing operation order No. 1-51 was issued this date setting forth the missions of Wing units in Korea (See Appendix I).
- 2Jan51 ✓ Routine administration. 1stLt. Marshall E. SIMONSON, 044359, USMCR, of VMF-311 was killed on a strafing run near Kaesong, Korea (See CO, VMF-311 dispatch 021410Z, Appendix I).
- 3Jan51 ✓ Routine administration. BrigGen T.J. CUSHMAN departed Itami Air Base, Japan for Korea. He visited Pusan Air Field East (K-9) and MajGen O.P. SMITH at Masan. The designation of Marine Wing Service Squadron-1 was transferred from AIRFMFPAC to the Wing on this date. General CUSHMAN returned Itami 1630. (See CG AIRFMFPAC dispatch 050210Z, Appendix I). Colonel BAILLY, Chief of Staff, 1st Marine Air Wing held conference with Wing staff sections and group commanders regarding billeting arrangement of Pusan Air Field West (K-1) the proposed station of the 1st Marine Air Wing in Korea.
- 4Jan51 ✓ The Commander, Naval Forces, Far East directed that air interception of unidentified aircraft be continued but forbade use of pursuit curve tactics with guns bearing on unidentified plane. (See COMNAVFE dispatch 040730Z, Appendix I).
- 5Jan51 Colonel's C.T. BAILLY and T.J. NOON visited Pusan Field West (K-1) and reported that the second runway was progressing as planned and that the building of the tent area was underway.

6Jan51 - MTACS-2 and MCCIS-1 were transferred from MAG-12 to the Wing. Marine Wing Service Squadron-1 was formally designated a part of the Wing. (See CG 1MAW speedletter serial 150 of 6Jan51, Appendix I). This squadron was established to take care of the replacement personnel and housekeeping functions formerly handled by G-1 and Hedron-1. Details of the forthcoming movement to Pusan Air Field West (K-1) were considered further in a staff conference held by General CUSHMAN with the Commanding Officer, MAG-12, Colonel BATTERTON, attending. A dispatch from Commander, Naval Forces, Far East directed that all units institute a vigorous aircraft recognition program in view of similarity of certain types of U.S. and Soviet aircraft and the increasing air strength displayed by the enemy in Korea. (See COMNAVFE dispatch 060750Z, Appendix I).

7Jan51. Routine administration. General CUSHMAN, Colonel DYER, G-3, 1st MAW departed Itami 0730 to confer with Admiral MOOPHOUSE at COMNAVFE headquarters in Tokyo. Returned at 1615. Colonel BAILEY, CofS, 1stMAW departed Itami to confer with 5th Air Force representative at Pusan Air Field West (K-1). Returned Itami at 1730.

8Jan51  
\* Captain Richard A. ELANAGAN, 023795, USMC of VMF-311 was killed at Pusan Air Field East (K-9) on take off. (See CO, VMF-311 dispatch 081220Z, Appendix I). Plans were initiated for the airlift of more than a thousand replacements for the 1st Marine Division from the United States through Itami to Korea. This operation was completed successfully 29 January. (See CINCPACFLT dispatch 082006Z, CG, FEAF dispatch 140220Z, CO VMR-152 dispatch 152151Z and CO 1MAW(RE) dispatch 290300Z, Appendix I).

9Jan51 Routine administration.

10Jan51 Routine administration. Commander, Fleet Air Japan informed the Wing that it might use Bofu Air Base immediately under field conditions, but advised that the Navy had no funds available to provide for repairs and upkeep on a permanent basis. (COMFAIRJAP dispatch 100518Z, Appendix I).

11Jan51 Colonel BAILEY, Cofs, 1stMAW, Colonel NOON, G-4, 1stMAW Colonel BATTERTON, Commanding Officer, MAG-12, Captain REINERTSEN, USN, Medical Officer, 1stMAW, and Lt. Colonel WEST, Commanding Officer, MAG-33 inspected Bofu Air Base and returned to Itami at 1600. General CUSHMAN departed Itami at 0930 for Taegu to confer with General PATTRIDGE, USAF on matters pertaining to close support by units of 1stMAW. General CUSHMAN returned to Itami at 1800.

12Jan51 Routine administration.

13Jan51 Major General Field HARRIS returned to Itami at 1515 from the United States. In accordance with the request of the Commander, Naval Forces, Far East directed that VMF-214 and VMF-323 be disembarked from the carriers. (See COMNAVFE dispatch 130404Z, Appendix I).

14Jan51 VMO-6 moved from Masan to Pohang. (See CG 1MAKDIV dispatch 140545Z, Appendix I). The Commander Carrier Division 15 reported that planes of VMF-214 and VMF-323 would leave the ships on 16 January with carriers docking at Kobe on 17 January to offload remainder of personnel. (See COMCARDIV 15 dispatch 141248Z, Appendix I).

15Jan51 Major General HARRIS, BrigGen CUSHMAN, and Colonel DYER departed at 0945 for a conference with Admiral MOORHOUSE at COMNAVFE, returned at 1700. Movement plan No. 1-51 was issued this date for moving VMF(N)-513 to Pusan Field East (K-9) and for returning VMF-311 from there to Itami. Administrative Plan No. 2-51 and Movement Plan No. 2-51 were also issued providing for the movement of MAG-12 to Pusan Field West (K-1) and of VMF-312 and units of MAG-33 to Bofu. (See Appendix I).

16Jan51 Aircraft of VMF-214 and VMF-323 arrived at Itami from carriers. They received high praise from the Commander Seventh Fleet (see CO MAG-33 dispatch 161335Z, COM7THFLT dispatches 151414Z and 160840Z, Appendix I). Major General HARRIS, BrigGen CUSHMAN, Col. DYER, and Col. NOON departed at 0730 for an inspection of facilities at Pusan Field West (K-1), returning at 1745. The Commander Naval Forces, Far East reported that the occupancy of Bofu Air Base by wing units had been cleared. (See COMNAVFE dispatch 160602Z, Appendix I).

- 17Jan51 The Commander, Naval Forces, Far East in response to a request by the Wing directed that an escort carrier be placed at disposal of the Wing to permit carrier qualification of the pilots of VMF-312. The USS SICILY (CVE-118) was designated for this duty, and the squadron completed its qualifications on 20 January. (See COMNAVFE dispatch 170812Z, and USS SICILY dispatch 200501Z, Appendix I).
- 18Jan51 In response to a request from the 1stMARDIV, the Wing established an R4D courier plane to operate on a schedule between Itami, Pusan Field West (K-1), Pohang and Chinhae. (See CG 1stMARDIV dispatch 180030I and CG 1MAW dispatch 180600Z, Appendix I). The Division also requested that a close air support squadron be stationed at Pusan Field West (K-1) or Pohang by 19 January. (See CG 1stMARDIV dispatch 180940I, Appendix I). Arrangements were accordingly made for VMF-311 to leave Pusan Field West (K-9) and to station twelve (12) planes of VMF(N) 512 at that base to support the Division. (See CG 1MAW dispatch 180627Z and 181203Z, Appendix I). The Wing also made three (3) TBM aircraft available to VMO-6 to furnish an airborne radio relay for motorized patrols of the Division. (See CG 1MAW dispatch 181201Z, Appendix I). The Wing Commander also made a number of recommendations to the Commander, Naval Forces, Far East respecting the deployment of Marine squadrons in this area. In view of the possibility of Communist air opposition he proposed the assignment of another jet squadron to the area. (See CG 1MAW dispatch 180402Z, Appendix I). He likewise requested the assignment of an additional GCI squadron since one furnished inadequate warning and control coverage. (See CG 1MAW dispatch 180404Z, Appendix I). Finally, he proposed the return of VMF(N)-542 to the United States for re-equipping with new type all-weather aircraft with their present planes being reassigned to VMF(N)-513. This last recommendation was specifically approved by the Commander, Naval Forces, Far East. (See CG 1MAW dispatch 180406Z and COMNAVFE dispatch 200646Z, Appendix I). MAG-23 began moving personnel and equipment to Bofu Air Base, Honshu, Japan.

- 19Jan51 Due to communications difficulties with Pusan Field East (K-9) the close air support section of MTACS-2 request that eight (8) planes from VMF(N)-513 stage daily at Pohang. (See OIC CAS SEC dispatch 191930I, Appendix I). 1stLt. Alfred J. WARD, 037772, USMC, of VMF-212 was shot down by enemy fire near Kumchon and killed. (USS BATAAN dispatch 190800Z, Appendix I).
- 20Jan51 Routine administration. Capt. Alfred H. AGAN, 013674, USMCR, of VMF-212, died of exposure after a crash landing in the water. (See USS BATAAN 20121Z, Appendix I).
- 21Jan51 Routine administration. Aircraft of VMR-152 were employed for moving Wing elements to Bofu Air Base.
- 22Jan51 Major General HARRIS and Colonel DYER left Itami at 0650 and flew to Taegu for a conference with Major General PARTRIDGE, Commanding General of the 5th Air Force in Korea. They returned at 1800. BrigGen CUSHMAN flew to Pusan Field West (K-1) on an inspection trip. MAG-33 established its headquarters at Bofu Air Base. (See CO MAG-33 dispatch 241245Z, Appendix I).
- 23Jan51 Portions of the G-2, G-3, and G-4 sections of the Wing moved to Bofu Air Base on this date.
- 24Jan51 This 1st Marine Division sought permission from the Eighth Army to make requests for close air support directly from the Wing. (See CG 1stMARDIV dispatch 240914Z, Appendix I). On this date elements of the Wing were operating from Itami, Itazuke, Bofu, Pusan Field East (K-9), Pusan Field West (K-1), Pohang, and the USS BATAAN (CVL-29). (See CG 1MAW dispatch 241500Z, Appendix I).
- 25Jan51 The Wing Command Post was transferred to Bofu Air Base as of 1800 this date. The Headquarters Squadron remained at Itami. (See Itami AFB dispatch 250505Z, Appendix I).
- 26Jan51 Routine administration.
- 27Jan51 MajGen HARRIS and Col. DYER departed from Bofu at 0800 to attend a conference at Pohang with MajGen O. D. SMITH of the 1stMARDIV regarding close air support. They returned at 1225. The Command Post and administration of MAG-12 was established at Pusan Field West (K-1) on this date. (See MAG-12 dispatch 260755Z, Appendix I). The fifth replacement draft departed from San Diego (See CG WMPACTHPS dispatch 280230Z, Appendix I).

- 28Jan51 BrigGen CUSHMAN arrived at Bofu from Pusan Field West (K-1) at 1445 for a conference with Major General HARRIS regarding the movement of Wing elements to Pusan Field West (K-1).
- 29Jan51 Routine administration. BrigGen CUSHMAN departed from Bofu for Pusan Field West (K-1) at 1015.
- 30Jan51 MajGen HARRIS departed from Bofu at 0745 to attend a conference with Major General PARTRIDGE at Taegu, returning to Bofu at 1600. Movement Order No. 3-51 and Administrative Order 3-51 for the movement of Wing elements to Pusan Field West and Bofu were issued this date (See Appendix I). A plan of logistics support for Wing units was also promulgated. (See Appendix I).
- 31Jan51 Routine administration. As of this date the Wing and its units were located as follows:



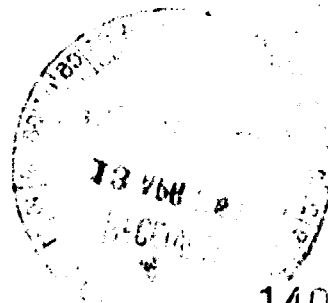

SUMMARY

During this period the Photographic Unit of the 1st Marine Air Wing was based at Itami Air Force Base, Honshu, Japan with the exception of a forward element of one (1) officer and two (2) enlisted men. This element was returned to Itami on 13 January 1951 from K-1 Pusan, Korea. The unit is commanded by Major Donald S. BUSH USMC as officer-in-charge. On 31 January 1951 the unit had a total of thirty-six (36) enlisted men, one of whom is a naval aviation pilot, and twelve (12) officers, all naval aviators, one of whom is on emergency leave in the United States.

Extensive training was conducted throughout January for five (5) newly assigned pilots and some refresher training for the experienced pilots as well. Training sorties were conducted within a radius of two hundred (200) miles of Itami and included all phases of photography that might be encountered plus instrument training.

Twenty (20) combat sorties were flown, processed, printed and delivered during January. From the time the sortie requests were made, delivery of the completed mission was in the hands of the requesting agency within a twenty-four (24) to thirty-six (36) hour period.

It was necessary during this period to paint, restencil and remark all boxes of material due to the transfer of the unit to Headquarters Squadron 1st Marine Air Wing from Headquarters Squadron Marine Air Group Twelve late in December.

Two (2) officers and three (3) enlisted men joined the unit during this period and one (1) enlisted man was discharged while one (1) was granted leave to the United States.

No movement orders, embarkation orders, operations orders or administrative orders were issued during this period.

**CONFIDENTIAL** CHRONOLOGY

1 January 1951 Normal work routine was the order of the day. Routine work consisted of mixing chemicals, processing film, negative marking for identification, pilots plots of previously flown sorties, construction of work benches, and storage areas, and training of personnel including newly joined pilots in all phases of aerial photography. Aerial photo sorties were and are being flown from this base to all sectors of Korea within range limitations of the aircraft in use, which are F7F-3P and F4U-5P type aircraft.

2 January 1951 Normal work routine. Two (2) sorties to Korea were flown this date in the vicinity of Pohang and Pusan. Four (4) training sorties were flown.

3 January 1951 Two (2) training sorties were flown. Processing was completed the same date. Captain R. J. LYNCH, Officer-in-Charge of the forward element at K-1 returned to Itami.

4 January 1951 No sorties were flown. Daily working routine prevailed.

5 January 1951 A mission was assigned by ComNavFE. The sortie required six (6) aircraft for the photographic work and escort. The mission was completed the same date and the film was processed, five prints of each roll made, and marked by 0400 6 January 1951. One (1) test flight and one (1) familiarization flight was made.

6 January 1951 Photographs taken the 5th of January were plotted by Pilots and delivered to ComNavFE and FEAF in Tokyo. The entire mission was flown, processed and delivered in a total time of approximately thirty (30) hours.

7 January 1951 Normal work routine.

8 January 1951 Normal working routine was conducted, including training sorties.

9 January 1951 Routine. Poor weather for photography. All flights held up. Word was sent to Technical Sergeant CAMPBELL at K-1 Korea to begin packing all photographic equipment for shipment to the laboratory at Itami upon request.

10 January 1951 Normal working routine. All hands reported for five (5) semi-annual inoculations. Due to inclement weather a mission to Korea was held up.

11 January 1951 Routine. Instructions were sent to K-1 to begin airlifting the first of three (3) plane loads of equipment. First lift arrived at Itami this date. Bad weather caused all flights to be held up.

12 January 1951 Two (2) sorties were flown over Korea this date. All film processing was completed and made ready for morning delivery. One (1) test flight and two (2) training sorties were flown. Joined Captain William L. ATWATER, USMC.

13 January 1951 Sorties flown and processed the previous day were delivered to ComNavFE and FEAF this morning. Work routine including familiarization and photo training flights were carried on. Captain Warren C. WATSON USMC joined the unit. Technical Sergeant CAMPBELL and Staff Sergeant KRUTT returned from Korea with the final load of equipment.

14 January 1951 Normal work routine.

15 January 1951 Routine. Prints of airfield in Korea delivered to the 822nd Engineer Aviation Battalion at K-1 via courier plane. Five (5) training sorties were flown.

16 January 1951 Routine. Joined two (2) radiomen for the engineering section. Three (3) training sorties were flown this morning. The afternoon was devoted to line maintenance of aircraft.

17 January 1951 Routine.

18 January 1951 Material personnel and all other personnel available began "Operation Paint Box". All material boxes were being painted, restenciled, remarked and repacked for a future move. This was made necessary because of the hasty move for Yonpo and transfer of the unit to Headquarters Squadron 1st Marine Air Wing from Headquarters Squadron, Marine Air Group 12. Training sorties were flown and one (1) official sorties, a mosaic map of Bofu Airfield was completed.

19 January 1951 Routine.

20 January 1951 Routine.

21 January 1951 Routine.

22 January 1951 Routine. One man, Sergeant TROBOY, was transferred to MCAS El Toro (Santa Ana) California for dependency discharge.

23 January 1951 Routine. One (1) man to emergency leave to U.S.

24 January 1951 Construction of storage areas completed by Air Installations, Itami AFB.

25 January 1951 Routine. Two (2) officers flying courier plane to Korea.

26 January 1951 Two (2) sorties were flown over Korea. By 0230 27 January 1951 all film processing was completed for morning delivery.

27 January 1951 Sorties flown the preceeding day were delivered to the 1st Marine Division, and two (2) more sorties were flown. The film was processed, developed and prepared for delivery by 0400 28 January 1951.

28 January 1951 Two (2) sorties were flown, film processed, developed and made ready for delivery. Yesterdays sorties delivered to 1st Marine Division at Pohang.

29 January 1951 Normal work routine. No photo flights were flown. Lieutenant O'NEILL and Lieutenant OPEKA went to Far East Air Material Command at Tachikawa on Material Matters.

30 January 1951 Normal work routine. First air lift of photographic material and equipment made ready.

31 January 1951 Normal routine. Two (2) sorties flown to Korea. Laboratory work completed by 2330.

SUMMARY

During this period the Flight Section of the 1st Marine Air Wing was based at Itami Air Force Base, Honshu, Japan. On 31 January 1951 the unit had a total of fifty-six (56) enlisted men, two (2) of whom are naval aviation pilots and five (5) officers, all naval aviators. The unit has five (5) R4D type and two (2) SNB type aircraft regularly assigned.

Routine transport and administrative flights were conducted during this period. Two (2) courier flights, utilizing R4D type aircraft were established. One (1) for the 1st Marine Division in Korea and one for the 1st Marine Air Wing at Itami AFB and forward elements in Korea.

Aircraft checks and routine maintenance were conducted at Itami AFB on a 24 hour day basis for the entire period.

One officer and four (4) enlisted men joined the unit during this period and one man was transferred.

No movement orders, embarkation orders, operations orders or administrative orders were issued during this period.

CHRONOLOGY

1 January 1951 Normal work routine was the order of the day. Routine work consists of maintenance checks, engine changes, minor repairs, administrative reports and administrative and transport flights. SNB type aircraft are normally used for administrative flights and the R4D type aircraft are utilized for transporting personnel and cargo. Three (3) transport flights were flown to Korea and two (2) administrative flights were flown in Japan.

2 January 1951 Two (2) transport flights were flown to Korea and one (1) to Tokyo. One (1) administrative flight was flown to Itazuke.

3 January 1951 One (1) transport flight was flown to Korea and one (1) to Heneda and Itazuke. One (1) local flight was flown in the SNB.

- 9 January 1951 Two (2) transport flights were flown to Korea and two (2) were flown in Japan. Two (2) administrative flights were flown in Japan, one (1) to Tokyo and one (1) to Tachikawa.
- 10 January 1951 Three (3) transport flights were flown to Korea and one (1) was flown to Tokyo. One (1) administrative flight was flown to Komaki.
- 11 January 1951 Two (2) transport flights were flown to Korea and one (1) to Itazuke. One (1) administrative flight was flown to Bofu and one (1) to Komaki.
- 12 January 1951 Three (3) transport flights were flown to Korea and one (1) to Itazuke. One (1) administrative flight was flown to Komaki.
- 13 January 1951 Four (4) transport flights were flown to Korea and one (1) to Tokyo. One (1) administrative flight was flown to Komaki.
- 14 January 1951 Three (3) transport flights were flown to Korea, one (1) to Bofu and one (1) to Itazuke. One (1) administrative flight was flown to Komaki and one (1) was flown locally.

23 January 1951 Three (3) transport flights were flown to Korea. One (1) administrative flight with General CUSHMAN in Korea and one (1) to Tokyo.

24 January 1951 Two (2) transport flights were flown to Korea. One (1) administrative flight was flown in Korea and one (1) to Itazuke.

25 January 1951 Two (2) transport flights were flown to Korea and one (1) to Bofu. One (1) administrative flight was flown in Korea and one (1) was flown to Itazuke.

26 January 1951 Two (2) transport flights were flown to Korea, one (1) to Tokyo and two (2) to Bofu. One (1) administrative flight was flown from K-1 Korea to Bofu and returned to Itami.

27 January 1951 Four (4) transport flights were flown to Korea. Two (2) administrative flights were flown, one to Komaki and one (1) to Bofu.

28 January 1951 Two (2) transport flights were flown to Korea, two (2) to Bofu and one (1) to Tokyo. One (1) SNB was flown to Bofu and remained over night.

29 January 1951 Two (2) transport flights were flown to Korea. Two (2) administrative flights were flown to Bofu and the SNB at Bofu proceeded to K-1 Korea with General CUSHMAN

1. GENERAL SITUATION

This is Commander Marine Forces, Far East and CG, 1st Marine Air Wing order for operations in Korea and Japan. It is derived from ComNavFE Operation Order 20-50 and, as appropriate, current operation orders of CG, 5th Air Force;

a. Enemy forces - See Annex ABLE.

b. Friendly forces -

- (1) The 8th Army, including the 1st Marine Division, FMF, continues operations against enemy forces in Korea.
- (2) The 5th Air Force is conducting air operations in support of UN ground forces; providing air defense and maintaining air supremacy.
- (3) TF 77 (Fast Carrier Task Force) and CTG 96.8 (Escort Carrier Group) are conducting air operations in Korea in coordination with 5th Air Force.

2. This force will:

a. Provide Marine air units to operate from designated aircraft carriers, or from designated shore bases, for close support of ground forces.

3. a. Photo Detachment

- (1) Provide aircraft for photo missions as directed.
- (2) Maintain facilities for the processing and reproduction of photographs exposed by the detachment.

b. Marine Wing Service Squadron-1

- (1) Provide rear area logistic and administrative support at Itami AFB as directed.
- (2) Operate facilities and functions at Itami AFB for which 1st Marine Air Wing is responsible.
- (3) Operate and maintain 1st Marine Air Wing aircraft at Itami as directed.

- (2) When based ashore revert to command MAG-33.

h. Marine Fighter Squadron-214

- (1) While embarked in USS SICILY (CVE-118) or other designated aircraft carrier, operate as directed by commander afloat.
- (2) When based ashore revert to command MAG-33.

i. Marine Fighter Squadron-323

- (1) While embarked in USS BADJENG STRAIT (CVE-116) or other designated aircraft carrier, operate as directed by commander afloat.
- (2) When based ashore revert to command MAG-33.

(2) Submarine sanctuaries have been established as follows:

- (b) The sea area of Tosa Wan north and west of a line between Murotsu (Latitude 33°15'N, Longitude 134°01'E) to the coast of Shikoku has been established as a submarine sanctuary (paragraphs 712, 713 PacFlt conf ltr LCL-49).

(3) JOINT ZONES (paragraph 715, PacFlt conf ltr LCL-49) have been established as follows:

- (a) Area 5 and 6 - North of Hokkaido bounded on the north by latitude 45°45'N and on the south by Hokkaido. The west boundary of area 5 is longitude 140°E divided from area 6 by longitude 142°E. Eastern boundary of area 6 is longitude 145°E.
- (b) Area 7 - Sea area between latitudes 40° and 41°N and west of longitude 131°E to the coast of Korea.

(4) Unidentified submarines may be attacked and driven off by any means available in self defense or when offensive action against our forces is indicated. In interpretation of the foregoing, continued submergence of an unidentified submarine in position to attack our forces operating against North Korea or in support of the assigned mission with regard to Formosa is considered to indicate offensive action against our forces. Reference to, or reports of, attacks made by our forces on submarine contacts will be classified TOP SECRET, except in the event attack is made by aircraft, a brief message shall be sent to

the effect "this TOP SECRET. Submarines sighted (Location) positive action taken.", to commander normally guarding aircraft circuit and to him only, using CSP 1270. Amplifying report shall be made by normal TOP SECRET means after plane returns to base.

- (5) Guard against subversive activity and sabotage.
- (6) Submit reports as required by Annex BLE.
- (7) Exercise positive control of all outgoing messages to insure that only those who need to know are included in the address.
- (8) Air defense operations in Korea and Japan according to 5th Air Force instructions to be issued.
- (9) SAR in accordance current 5th Air Force doctrine.
- (10) Target restrictions as per current 5th Air Force instructions as furnished by this headquarters.
- (11) Observe forward bomblines as established by 8th Army.
- (12) This order effective on receipt and remains in effect until cancelled, at which time it may be destroyed by burning. No report of destruction is required.

## INTELLIGENCE

## 1. SUMMARY OF ENEMY SITUATION

- a. General: During October, 1950, it was determined that elements of the Chinese Communist Army were in northern KOREA. By late November, 1950, it was evident that CCF had entered KOREA in great strength. This enemy force launched an all out offensive on 28 November, 1950, causing UN Forces to withdraw. Enemy air activity has been slowly building up and engagements with ever increasing numbers of Type 15 and MIG-15 fighters are not infrequent.
- b. Composition: The CCF are deployed in KOREA in Division, Corps, and Army strength. Under the supervision of the CCF and protection of the Manchurian Border the Peoples Army of North Korea has been reconstituted, and is now opposing UN Forces in Division, Brigade and Corps strength. This combined enemy force is deployed across the entire peninsula of KOREA on the general line SUWON - YOJU - WONJU - SONGDONG.
- c. Estimated Strength: Estimates of enemy strength as of 1 January, 1951, consisting of units actually in KOREA and reserves capable of early intervention are as follows:

## 4. MEASURES FOR HANDLING PRISONERS, CAPTURED DOCUMENTS, AND CAPTURED MATERIEL.

a. As directed by higher authority.

## 5. MAPS AND CHARTS.

a. Map procurement is a function of the G-2. Group and/or Squadron intelligence officers shall requisition maps as required. Such requisitions should be submitted well in advance.

## 6. COUNTERINTELLIGENCE.

a. Censorship: Current directives will be carried out. In the event general censorship is invoked at a future date the requirements of the Naval Censorship Manual, ONI D22-T will be complied with.

b. All personnel shall be given frequent instructions in security measures.

c. All personnel will be informed that in the event of capture they are required to give only their name, rank and serial number. Diaries will not be kept.

d. Psychological warfare may be utilized as required. Groups and/or Squadrons will be prepared to make leaflet drops and the Wing should be prepared to accomplish Air-to-Ground broadcast.

## 7. REPORTS AND RECORDS.

a. Interrogation Reports: To be submitted at the operational level (Group or Squadron in accordance with which unit is accomplishing the interrogation). Interrogation reports will be submitted as soon as possible. These reports form a foundation for the G-2 Summary as well as the bulk of intelligence information which must be evaluated and disseminated and prompt reporting is of utmost importance. This report shall consist of a short, concise resume of the interrogation for each mission. Each such report shall be numbered consecutively and contain the following information: number of aircraft, time on target, nature of target, results of attack and observations of the pilot enroute to target, at the target area and on return to base. Interrogation reports will be sent to G-2 via telephone, teletype or dispatch, whichever is more rapid and/or satisfactory.

b. Flash Reports: To be submitted by any agency working with the Wing. Flash Reports will be submitted on any intelligence information which is of immediate value or which require immediate action. Such reports will be transmitted to the G-2 by the most rapid means available.

c. G-2 Summary of Operations: This report will be compiled daily by the G-2. The period covered will be from 1800 to 1800 daily. Distribution shall include the immediate superior in command, AirFMFPac, FMFPac, the Commanding General, each staff section, each Group, and such others as may be directed.

It is believed that the NKAF is at present engaged in training and expansion in Manchuria, and has a strength of approximately 40 to 50 YAK type aircraft. The Sino-Soviet pact of February, 1950, assured Communist China enough aircraft to make up an 800 plane air force. The necessary aircraft to accomplish this agreement are believed being supplied by the USSR as they become available.

## 2. ESSENTIAL ELEMENTS OF INFORMATION.

- a. What is the strength, composition, identification, morale, combat efficiency and nationality of enemy air forces in the operating area?
- b. Will the enemy make an all out air effort against the UN Forces?
- c. Does the enemy have the capability to reinforce his present strength, and if so, from what source?
- d. Are there any unlocated guerrilla forces from the NKPA capable of supporting the enemy. If so, where are they located?
- e. What are the characteristics of any enemy aircraft that may be encountered?
- f. What tactical maneuvers are employed by enemy airmen?
- g. Will the NKAF be re-constituted to such a degree as to become operationally effective?
- h. What is the nature, disposition and status of enemy air defense?
- i. What is the direction, type and volume of enemy troop and vehicular movement, and where observed?
- j. What air fields are being utilized by the enemy for operations against UN Forces?
- k. To what extent can the CCF interfere with friendly air support? What steps can be taken to remedy any such interference? (False aircraft direction and jamming of nets.)

## 3. RECONNAISSANCE AND OBSERVATION

- x. (1) Intelligence officers on the Group and Squadron level shall insure that all pilots are thoroughly familiar with the ESSENTIAL ELEMENTS OF INFORMATION. Pilots must be thoroughly indoctrinated and fully appreciative of the great importance attached to intelligence information obtained through visual and photographic air reconnaissance.
- (2) Photographic Reconnaissance: All photographic reconnaissance shall be coordinated by the G-2.
- (3) Visual Air Reconnaissance: All visual air reconnaissance shall be coordinated by the G-2.
- (4) All reconnaissance missions shall be briefed in detail by the intelligence officer on the operating level (Group or Squadron) to the end that every pilot flying a reconnaissance mission is thoroughly familiar with the objectives of the mission.
- (5) All visual air reconnaissance missions shall be given a priority of interrogation over other missions. The results of all visual reconnaissance missions shall be FLASHED to the G-2.

Information to be submitted shall include results of each mission, targets attacked, location of each target attacked to be shown by UTM Grid Coordinates, and any other information of interest. Period covered is from 2000 to 2000 daily. 1st Marine Air Wing, Headquarters, will submit this report.

### AUTHENTICATION SYSTEM

1. These authentication tables are prescribed for use between CPO, FPO and major subordinate commands and for air to air, air to ground and air to ship authentication throughout the Far East Command.

2. The Pacific Command Authentication System, PAO 7 Series, will be used for inter-theater authentication.

#### 3. Description of the Table

a. The authentication table consists of 26 random alphabet sequences with row designators, a key-letter column, and an authenticator column.

b. There is no time designator column in this table since the system does not employ a time factor for authenticating.

#### 4. Method of Operation (See example)

a. Two test elements are used to derive the authenticator, a test element being a character used in determining the authenticator. A time element is not used in this system. If either of the test elements is a number, use the letter opposite the number in the row designators. The test elements for message authentication will be the first and last characters of the text, exclusive of system or message indicators. The test elements for station authentication will be two random characters transmitted in the challenge.

b. Locate the first test element in the column of row designators.

c. Proceed across the row designated by the first test element until the second test element is reached.

d. The letter immediately to the right of the second test element is the key letter. In case the second test element is the last letter in the row, the first letter in the row is the key letter.

e. Locate the key letter in the key letter column on the right-hand side of the alphabet table. The letter in the authenticator column directly to the right of the key letter is the authenticator.

## Appendix III to Annex "B" of Operation Order I-51

SHACKLE CIPHER

(1) This cipher is prescribed for use on CW and VOIC<sup>W</sup> circuits to provide a rapid means of enciphering numerals in plain language dispatches.

(2) Several letter equivalents are provided for each numeral, and when enciphering numerals, letters should be chosen from columns at random, avoiding repetition where possible.

(3) The indicator for this cipher is "shackle" which shall be placed at the beginning of any numeral expression enciphered in this system. The term "Unshackle" should be placed at the end of the enciphered numerals whenever confusion with the following groups of the text is possible. On visual nets the words "Shackle and Unshackle" will be replaced by 'KK'.

(4) Only the basic grid with the effective alphabet inscribed shall be carried in the field or in aircraft. If compromise of any grid or list is suspected, or determined, a report will be sent immediately to the 1st Marine Air Wing Communication Officer.

Aeronautical Material will be requisitioned from the Supply Officer, Aviation Supply Branch, U. S. Fleet Activities, Yokosuka. Spare Parts for Mobile Ordnance Vehicles will be requisitioned from the Yards and Docks Supply Office, Port Hueneme, California.
- (6) Class V(A) - Will be furnished by Commander, Service Squadron 3.
- (7) Post, Camp and Station property will be furnished by Japan Logistical Command or the U. S. Air Force for units based in Japan and issued on memorandum receipt. Post, Camp and Station property will not be removed from the jurisdiction of the account on which issued.

(Such as F9F, F7F, HO3S-1, SCR-720, AFS-18 and 50 caliber spares). These pack ups will accompany squadrons when operating away from the parent Marine Air Group.

(b) Marine Aircraft Group 12 and Marine Aircraft Group 33, when initially deployed away from Itami will take with them a 30 day streamlined allowance of TBA consumables. When the tactical situation indicates that one of the two Marine aircraft Groups will support the majority of the 1st Marine Air Wing aircraft at a base other than Itami for an indefinite period, the remainder of that Group's TBA consumables will be shipped to that base.

(c) Marine Wing Service Squadron 1 will issue to Marine Aircraft Group 12 and Marine Aircraft Group 33, when these units are initially deployed away from Itami, a high usage 30 day streamlined allowance of Section "M" spares for assigned vehicles.

(d) Marine Aircraft Group 12 and Marine Aircraft Group 33 will maintain Rear Echelon Supply Sections at Itami to maintain a complete 90 day allowance of Section "B", "R", "O" and NavOrd List 20870 material.

Appendix III to Annex DQG to Operations Order 1-51

Housekeeping and Service Squadron Functions at Itami; responsibility for

1. Class C Facilities and Services

(a) Effective 30 January 1951, Service Squadron 12 will assume operational control of all shops now located at Itami. Marine Aircraft Group 33 will furnish sufficient personnel and equipment to insure a continuous flow of work in these shops. Marine Aircraft Group 12 will set up complete shop equipment as rapidly as possible and place this equipment into operation. Marine Aircraft Group 33 will preserve a pack shop equipment now in use as soon as similar items have been placed in operation by Marine Aircraft Group 12. Marine Aircraft Group 33 will in some instances find it necessary to immediately withdraw all personnel from some shops. It will be the responsibility of Marine Aircraft Group 12 to assign personnel to these shops to insure a continuity of shop functions.

(b) Service Squadron 12 will issue to all units of the 1st Marine Air Wing, Quick Engine Change Units, parachutes and full oxygen and CO<sub>2</sub> bottles on an exchange basis.

(c) Priority of work in Service Squadron shops will be assigned by Rear Echelon of the 1st Marine Air Wing G-4 Section.

2. Pool Aircraft

(a) Service Squadron 12 will assume physical custody of COMFAIRJAP Itami Aircraft Pool. Services to be performed by Service Squadron 12 are as follows:

Upon receipt, pool aircraft will be checked and placed in readiness for ferry flight. Aircraft will be turned up every third day for preservation of engines. Prior to transfer of pool aircraft to tactical squadrons, radio and ordnance equipment will be serviced to insure proper operation. Pool aircraft will not be operated more than one test flight per week.

(b) Rear Echelon, 1st Marine Air Wing will submit weekly aircraft status reports.

3. Housekeeping Functions

Marine Wing Service Squadron 1 will assume responsibility for the following housekeeping functions:

(a) Motor Transportation Section

Maintenance, check and custody of vehicles located at Itami. Operate refueler pool.

(b) Base Maintenance

Provide personnel to assist Air Installation Officer for maintenance of base facilities at Itami.

(c) Billeting

The billeting officer will assign billeting space at Itami and maintain custody of all Camp, Post and Station equipment and supplies required for use in BOQ's and barracks at Itami.

(d) Messing Facilities

Food Director will operate all messes at Itami.

(e) Air Freight and Passenger Section

Prepare Bills of Lading, manifests, load and unload aircraft.

## Appendix IV to Annex DOG to Operations Order No. 1-51

## Daily Aircraft Availability Report

1. To assist in planning the replacement aircraft requirement, the following report will be submitted by all squadrons having assigned aircraft in their custody.
2. This report will be made by routine confidential dispatch (unless a higher classification is considered desirable by the originator) to Commanding General, 1st Marine Air Wing, and for information to their parent organization and to COMFALMARPAC. (Carrier based squadrons will also include Carrier Division Commander in addition to their parent Marine organization.)
3. The following code will be used in the dispatch report.

## (a) Instructions for use of code:

- ABLE** - Number of aircraft assigned, in accordance with Appendix I, and their physical location.
- BAKER** - Number of aircraft on hand. This indicates the number of aircraft which the squadron has in their physical possession.
- CHARLIE** - Number of aircraft in commission.
- DOG** - Aircraft out of commission for 24 hours. This is intended to indicate those aircraft out for minor check or minor repairs which will be accomplished through squadron line maintenance.
- EASY** - Number of aircraft out of commission for 72 hours. This is intended to indicate service checks and extensive repairs being effected by squadrons.
- FOX** - Number of aircraft out indefinitely, repairs being effected by Service Squadron. Number of aircraft falling within this category and requiring parts or extensive repairs should be included under HOW as a replacement required. A brief and explanatory note should be made under ITEM.
- If in the opinion of the Squadron Commander an aircraft is considered a strike he can assume, for purposes of this report, that the strike has the approval of higher authorities. It is desirable to indicate the Bureau Number of the aircraft so stricken.
- GLORGE** - Number of aircraft stricken since last report.
- HOW** - Number of replacements required. Ordinarily this will indicate the number of aircraft required to bring the squadron up to allowance, however, circumstances such as described in FOX above will also affect this category.
- ITEM** - Miscellaneous. Include any brief or explanatory notes which are not covered elsewhere in the report but which the originator considers appropriate.

## (b) General Instructions.

- (1) Under conditions where a squadron is divided into echelons and each echelon is operating aircraft, the echelon encompassing the squadron CP will submit the ABLE portion of the daily availability report for the total aircraft assigned to the squadron. The balance of their report will be submitted on the basis of the aircraft assigned to that echelon. The rear (forward) echelon will also submit an availability report based upon the number of aircraft assigned to their echelon by the squadron commander. Subordinate echelons requiring replacement aircraft from the senior echelon will request same by separate dispatch. Such inter-squadron requirements will not be incorporated in the report, unless so indicated by the Squadron Commander under category ITEM.

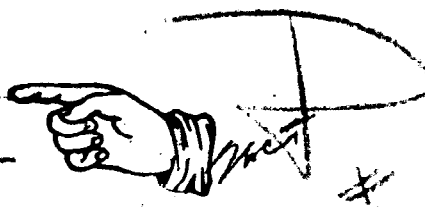

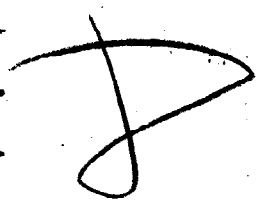
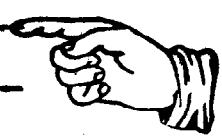

This order to cover operations of the following organizations for an indeterminate period.

(2) Headquarters Squadron, 1st Marine Air Wing

(a) The Supply Officer of Headquarters Squadron, 1st Marine Air Wing, will maintain all Hedron, 1st Marine Air Wing organizational property at Itami and ship items to Korea or Bofu upon request of authorized personnel.

(3) Marine Aircraft Group-12

(a) Furnish logistic support of Classes II, IIa, IV, IVa, and Y material for attached squadrons.

(b) Receive, store and issue POL products and aviation ammunition required for the operation of K-1.

(c) Requisition, store and issue all rations and housekeeping items required for use at K-1.

(4) Marine Aircraft Group-33

(a) Furnish logistic support of Classes II, IIa, IV, IVa and Y material for attached squadrons.

(b) Furnish logistic support of Section "B", Section "R" and Section "O" material for Headquarters Squadron, 1st Marine Air Wing aircraft.

(c) Receive, store and issue all POL products and aviation ammunition required for operation of Bofu.

(d) Requisition, receive, store and issue all housekeeping supplies required for use at Bofu.

Rear Echelon will furnish TBA

(5) Marine Observat.

(a) Requisition, store and issue Class II, IIA, III, IIIA and IV, IVa and V material required for their own use.

(6) Marine Tactical Air Control Squadron 2

(a) ~~When~~ accountable officer is assigned, which should be prior to 31 January 1951, will furnish logistic support of Classes II, IV and V for Marine Ground Control Intercept Squadron 1. The Supply Officer, 1st Marine Air Wing is currently requisitioning and furnishing resupply material for Marine Tactical Air Control Squadron 2 and Marine Ground Control Intercept Squadron 1.

(7) General

(a) Marine Aircraft Group 12 and Marine Aircraft Group 33, when initially deployed away from Itami, will take with them a streamlined 30 day allowance of Section "B", "R", "O" and NavOrd List 20870 material which is commo to all 1st Marine Air Wing aircraft.

(b) Marine Aircraft Group 12 and Marine Aircraft Group 33 will prepare 30 day pack ups of high usage Sections "B", "R", "O" and NavOrd List 20870 material required to support squadrons operating aircraft requiring peculiar spares. (Such as F9F, F7F, HO3S-1, SCR-720, APS-19 and 50 caliber spares). These pack ups will accompany squadrons when operating away from the parent Marine Air Group.

(c) Marine Aircraft Group 12 and Marine Aircraft Group 33, when initially deployed away from Itami will take with them a 30 day streamlined allowance of TBA consumables. When the tactical situation indicates that one of the two Marine Aircraft Groups will support the majority of the 1st Marine Air Wing aircraft at a base other than Itami for an indefinite period, the remainder of the Marine Aircraft Group's TBA consumables will be shipped to that base.

(d) Marine Wing Service Squadron 1 will issue to Marine Aircraft Group 12 and Marine Aircraft Group 33, when these units are initially deployed away from Itami, a high usage 30 day streamlined allowance of Section "M" spares for assigned vehicles.

(e) Marine Aircraft Group 12 and Marine Aircraft Group 33 will maintain Rear Echelon supply sections at Itami to maintain a complete 90 day allowance of Sections "B", "R", "O" and NavOrd List 20870 material.

1. Attached hereto is a summary of missions flown by the 1st Marine Air Wing while operating in Korea. The period covered is from 3 August 1950, through 14 December, 1950.

2. The summary is by phases. Though not indicated in the summary there was some overlap of the phases. Figures show total sorties flown and are further broken down to show Close Air Support and for whom the support was given, also miscellaneous sorties (CAP, Recon, Photo, etc.).

3. This summary was compiled from Aircraft Attack Reports. In many cases the aircraft attack reports were not submitted where no ordnance was involved. Squadrons actually flew more sorties than are indicated in the summary. This is particularly true of the All Weather Squadrons, VMF(N)-513 and VMF(N)-542 who flew a considerable number of night reconnaissance and night CAP missions.

## 2. Narrative

During this period the section accomplished routine and special objectives. The activities of the section took place as follows:

- (a) The first half of this period was used in preparation for the return to Korea. The accumulation of necessary maps and information for the coming operation was achieved as well as establishing liaison with the proper U. S. Navy and U. S. Army and Air Force representatives so as to set up the acquisition of new equipment and information as it developed in the early future. The physical necessities of the section were anticipated and fulfilled as the unit's equipment had been seriously depleted during the previous operations in Korea.
- (b) The entire section's effort was also concentrated on the compilation of individual squadron records and statistics for the Korean action from 1 August, 1950 through December (31), 1950, so as to prepare a report which would indicate the total sorties flown by squadrons during each of the three major phases of the action and which report also set forth a breakdown of the sorties as to type and in the case of Close Air Support sorties the military unit supported was indicated.

- (c) Conferences and classes were held with and for the Marine Air Group and Squadron Intelligence Officers with advantageous effort, clarifying and solving many problems and establishing the necessary procedures for the future.
- (d) A recognition program was put into effect and proceeded successfully until the Marine Air Groups and Squadrons began departing Itami to Bofu and K-1. Arrangements were made so as to continue this training on Group and Squadron levels.
- (e) An echelon of the section was sent to K-1 for the purpose of establishing a working section and quarters for the arrival of the entire section.
- (f) The section was airlifted to Bofu Air Force Base, Japan, on 25 January, 1951, at which base it set up and functioned fully, undertaking new responsibilities of daily staff briefings and weekly briefings covering the entire Orient. Colonel R. T. CARLESON, USMC, was relieved, at this time, as Assistant Chief of Staff, G-2, and was replaced by LtCol W. V. CROCKETT, Jr., USMC.

1. CHRONOLOGY

COMMUNICATION OFFICER: Major Carl O. WYMAN, (05247), (2502), U.S. Marine Corps Reserve

ECHELON OF COMMAND: Chief of Staff, 1st Marine Air Wing

GEOGRAPHICAL LOCATION: Itami Air Force Base, APO 15, Japan, K-1 Korea and Bofu Air Force Base, Japan

2. NARRATIVE

Work accomplished during this period was of both a special and routine nature seeing a division of the entire Wing Communication Section. The resultant services are listed as follows:

- (a) Served as Communication and Crypto Guard for Wing Headquarters and all Marine Aviation units based at Itami APB, including the Air Force base units. The communications files kept by the CG 1st MAW during the Wonsan, Ham Hung and Hung Nam operation were refilled and the necessary reports submitted. The personnel that returned were integrated with the Wing Administration section plus building up MAG-12 and 33 for future commitments.
- (b) With Air Support , MOCIS-1, MTACS-2 and MAG-12 still in Korea, it became necessary to establish some line of direct communication to expedite intra-Wing traffic. This was done through the use of Wing facilities at K-1, Air Support facilities at K-10 and Wing facilities at Itami, utilizing frequencies previously assigned by GHQ. The problem of crypto security immediately arose and was met by the same urgency by the implementation of MAG-12 crypto center at K-1 who guarded for MOCIS-1 and MTACS-2 and using CCBP-8 and PAC-6 for Air Support at K-10. This circuit proved invaluable and that the days of CW operators were not over.
- (c) The probability of a complete split of Wing Communications was being anticipated, in that two sections were being drawn up, complete in all respects. It was anticipated that MAG-12 would be located at K-1 and MAG-33 at Bofu. The Wing would be superimposed upon MAG-12 at K-1 utilizing MAG-12 personnel augmented by Wing personnel and equipment. MAG-33 was filled up by other Wing personnel and readied for independent operations. The operation order was being compiled along with the Communication Annex 1-51 and 2-51. They were based on several situations, and upon the final writing were still made more or less a generality.

- (d) The gathering up of all group electronics equipment was a major problem, it being scattered hither and yon, no one knowing where. After many conferences and letters, most of the major components were located and brought to bear on the forth coming operation.
- (e) Conferences were held with 5 AF to firm up the proposed installation at K-1 whereby they would furnish trunks from JOC K-2 and their rear echelon in Pusan. The carrier bays and frequencies were to be furnished by them and all other terminal equipment furnished by 1st MAW. This same situation was taken up with the 314th Air Division in Nagoya for the Bofu installation and like results obtained.
- (f) On 22 Jan 51 the 1st MAW communication section moved to K-1 in preparation of the shift of the 1st MAW CP to that location, at the same time MAG-33 communication section moved to Bofu. At K-1 installations were rapidly being accomplished, the FM circuits were placed in operation plus a landline carrier back up. The crypto center was assigned and work commenced. On 24 Jan 51 the situation changed, the 1st MAW communication section was ordered to Bofu and on 25 Jan 51 were air lifted there. The 1st MAW CP was to be located at Bofu for an indefinite period of time. The same situation was to exist at Bofu as at K-1, with the one exception, MAG-33 was to maintain the communication center. It was found that little progress had been made in respect to the installation of teletype circuits to the various relay centers for traffic outlet. A few phone calls and certain influencing factors by the Wing Communication Officer resulted in considerable speed up of all concerned. The formally over loaded CW intra-Wing circuit to Itami, K-1 and K-3 was relieved by the implementation of the half duplex circuit to Itami and a direct half duplex circuit to JOC at K-2. The inefficient communication center operation was gradually being worked out to a much more satisfactory routing. This again is proof of the so called pudding. If you are not able to allow units to operate communications centers as such, at every opportunity, there is little or no need for them having an allowance of equipment and personnel.
- (g) The 1st MAW at Itami handled a total of 4517 dispatches, of this amount 3390 were incoming and 1127 outgoing. Coded outgoing 407 with a group count of 56,263. The incoming group count was approximately 800,000.
- (h) Maintained custody of Registered and non-registered publications for this headquarters. Also during this period the Wing RPO assisted the Wing units in bringing their respective publications up to date and making several trips to the district RPIO with the various unit RPO. The present RPO took over as such on 1 Jan 51.
