Success in such attacks would probably lead to delaying the armistice talks and increasing offensive operations.

Acceptance of a demarcation line removes any likelihood of withdrawal at this time.

a. Composition - A realistic estimate of the air strength in Communist China cannot be confined to the Chinese Communist Air Forces alone. Aircraft of the Soviet Union present in China and aircraft of the North Korean Air Force must also be included. A specific breakdown of aircraft into CCAF, USSR AF in China, and NKAFF Units is not considered possible at this time.

b. Strength - The enemy air strength in China is now estimated to be 1455 aircraft. The total of 1455 by type is as follows:

(1) Not included are 100 Transports. These transports are organized under the 13th Air Division with various squadrons distributed throughout China, particularly at Mukden, Peiping, Harbin and Chengtu.

(2) Photo interpretation reports through August and September indicated 50 aircraft at Sinuiju. Identification of these aircraft as to type cannot be made, however it is possible that they were of the YAK-9, LA-9 and IL-10 models. As Photo interpretation could support no estimation as to the serviceability of the aircraft or as to how many were probably dummy, the estimate of CCAF does not carry any aircraft as based at Sinuiju.

(3) There are considerable indications which point to continued enemy efforts to render serviceable at least three airfields in North Korea - Namsi, Taechon, and Saanoham. If these airfields are made serviceable it would logically follow that both piston and jet aircraft would be moved into them from Manchuria.

(4) A reconnaissance report on 9 November disclosed 26 MIG-15's on the newly rehabilitated Uiju airfield. For the present no aircraft are carried as based there.

d. Personnel. It is believed that the CCAF has 2000-2500 fully qualified pilots with at least 4000-5000 pilots in training. At least 500 of the combat ready pilots are believed qualified to fly jet aircraft and an additional 350 jet pilots are estimated to be in advanced training stages. No accurate estimate of ground personnel can be made; however, with reports of continued expansion of ground training facilities, it is believed the enemy has a sufficient number of ground personnel to adequately maintain the aircraft available.

e. Organization into units.

(1) Reports indicate the possible existence of 16 Air Divisions.

(2) It is assumed that each Division consists of 3 Air Regiments, and each Regiment consists of 3 Squadrons.

(3) The authorized number of aircraft per Air Regiment is believed to be as follows:

(a) Jet Fighter Regiment	36 Aircraft.
(b) Conventional Fighter Regiment	50 Aircraft.
(c) Attack and Light Bomber Regiment	42 Aircraft.
(d) Transport Regiment	32 Aircraft.

(4) Enclosure ABLE lists the identified Air Divisions.

f. Combat Efficiency. During the middle of 1950 the combat efficiency of the CCAF was believed to have been at least fair, and since the latter part of that year intensive efforts have been made to raise the combat effectiveness of the Air Force. Reports

received from United Nations fighter and bomber units which have engaged in aerial combat with enemy aircraft indicate a steady overall improvement in operational tactics, although the degree of individual pilot aggressiveness has fluctuated periodically. Generally enemy aerial gunnery has been poor. Reports have indicated that enemy pilots have profitably emulated F-86 tactics as a result of their combat experience gained over Korea. This experience together with the alleged intensive training activity should result in continuing improvement on tactics, aggressiveness and gunnery. It must be borne in mind, also, that in practically all instances of aerial combat in which Chinese pilots could have participated, the psychological factor of the Manchurian sanctuary undoubtedly was a potent contributor to combat morale. Should the enemy be forced to relinquish the advantage of heretofore inviolate bases - through commitment of a major portion of his fighter strength to offensive Korean operations - it is possible that considerable deleterious effect on combat morale, and therefore on combat effectiveness would result. Maintenance and serviceability within the CCAF is an unknown factor of the overall combat effectiveness. Since the CCAF is almost wholly dependent upon Soviet sources of supply for aircraft, spare parts, and technical guidance, it must be assumed that maintenance - at least for the present - is no better than that of Soviet Air Forces in the Far East, which is considered adequate.

g. Time and Space.

- (1) Jet Fighters with external fuel load.
 - (a) From Antung-Sinuiju area - could reach all of Korea.
 - (b) From Tsingtao area - could reach all of Korea with exception of Pusan - Pohang-dong area.
 - (c) From Shanghai area - could reach only the extreme southwest portion of Korea.
- (2) Conventional Fighters.
 - (a) From Antung-Sinuiju or Tsingtao area - could reach all of Korea.
 - (b) From Shanghai area - could reach all of Korea west of a line running through Seoul and Pohang-dong.
- (3) TU-2 Aircraft.
 - (a) From Antung-Sinuiju or Tsingtao area - could reach all of Korea.
 - (b) From Shanghai area - could strike west of a line drawn through Chinnampo and Pohang-dong.
- (4) Ground Attack Aircraft. - Do not have the range capability of striking UN areas from bases outside Korea.

h. Reinforcement.

- (1) The possibility of Soviet intervention in the Korean Air War, with aircraft of its Siberian Air Force must be regarded as an important factor.
- (2) There have been no indications that such direct Soviet action is in preparation.
- (3) For the present, it is assumed that the Soviets will limit their activities to advising and training the Chinese Communists and North Korean Air Forces and to providing them with aircraft, supplies, materiel and POL.

i. Anti-aircraft Defenses.

- (1) The total amount of anti-aircraft in North Korea as indicated by photo interpretation reports now stands at 336 heavy guns and 1600 automatic weapons.
- (2) The past three months have seen a steady augmentation of automatic weapons strength, particularly along the MSR's and in the immediate front line areas. Heavy guns are deployed primarily in the defense of communications centers and airfields.

- b. Discussion of Enemy Air Capabilities.

 - (a) During the week 22-28 October, the enemy mounted 914 MIG-15 sorties. A concentrated effort was made to stave off UN B-29 attacks on the airfields at Namsi, Taechon and Saamcham with the enemy attacking both the bombers and their escorts. On one occasion the bombers and their escort were engaged by MIG-15's 20 miles northwest of Wonsan. The record number of sorties flown leaves little doubt as to the capability of the CCAF to continue their aggressive defense of North Korea. The engagement in the vicinity of Wonsan is one indication that the enemy has the capability to extend his air defense operations to cover most of Communist-held North Korea.
 - (b) The total number of weekly MIG-15 sorties have declined during November, but the expansion of the area of operations has continued. On 9 November, a flight of MIG-15's pressed the attack

against an RB-45 from 35 miles southwest of Pyongyang to the island of Yonpyon, 60 miles northwest of Seoul, before disengaging. Just prior to the first pass by the flight of 3 aircraft, a group of 40-50 jets were observed by the crew of the RB-45. It must be assumed that the smaller attacking elements were supported by the balance of the formation. If this is true, the incident represents not only the most southerly penetration by attacking enemy jets, but the largest number of MIG-15's observed below Chinnampo. This incident is a definite indication of a southward expansion of enemy counter air operations.

(c) Sorties by enemy aircraft unidentified by type have been observed by UN night intruders over North Korea since 1 December 1950. There have been several incidents in which the enemy aircraft has been a jet. However, it is believed that the enemy has primarily been employing piston type fighters of the YAK or LA types in night activity over North Korea. Until 16 November, there was no evidence that a UN aircraft has been damaged in any way by fire from any of the night operational enemy aircraft. On the night of 16 November, in the vicinity of Sonchon, a B-26 was caught in the cone made by 15 searchlights and was immediately afterward attacked by two enemy piston type fighters. The B-26 received major damage from the enemy aircraft fire which appeared to come from automatic weapons in the nose. In addition, the B-26 received one hit from ground automatic weapons fire, but managed to return to its base. No positive increase in the amount of enemy night activity has been noted; however, it is evident that there has been a definite improvement in enemy night counter-air effectiveness.

(d) It is believed that enemy night activity in the future may be expected to exercise a definite threat to friendly aircraft operating in the disputed area between the Yalu and the Chongchon rivers. Radar directed searchlights have been reported in the general area of the airfields at Namsi, Taechon and Saamcham. It is known that the GCI capability of the installations at Antung extends to cover the vicinity of these fields, and they are within the combat radius of enemy aircraft of the YAK and LA type operating from Anshan.

(2) Initiate offensive operations against UN Air, Ground, and Naval components on or near the Korean Peninsula.

(a) There are no indications which would support a conclusion that the enemy in the immediate future will initiate a general air offensive.

(b) During the week ending 10 November, a formation of eleven TU-2 type enemy light bombers attacked a friendly held island off western Korea approximately 35 miles southeast of the mouth of the Yalu River. This is the first confirmed report of an enemy light bomber formation on combat missions in the Korean Air War.

(c) The attack by the light bomber formation is believed to be of particular significance in that it gives the first firm indication of the apparent advanced state of combat readiness of some units based

in Manchuria and available for offensive action in Korea. Should the enemy be prepared to accept the same losses which have accrued to UN combined piston-type bomber and jet escorted missions within the sphere of limited air control, he has at present a considerable capability for mounting such strikes. It may be expected that as more light bomber units reach an advanced state of combat readiness, this capability will improve.

g. Conclusions.

- (1) The enemy has definitely committed himself to continue maintenance of limited control of the air over the area north of the Chongchon River. It appears that he continues to utilize this limited control, and the resulting restriction of UN medium bomber attacks within this area, to bring the air fields of this area into serviceable condition. At the same time the enemy is increasing the anti-aircraft heavy artillery protecting these airfields. It is evident that the enemy will attempt to expand the area of air defense operations southward. Should the enemy be successful in a positive expansion of his current area of limited air control to include the Pyongyang area it may logically follow that he will attempt to move jet and piston fighters, ground-attack, and light bombers into the new airfields. Should the enemy be successful in operating aircraft from the airfields of Namsi, Taechon, Saamcham and Uiju, his capability to challenge UN air superiority over the immediate battle area and to initiate air strikes against UN ground forces and air installations would be greatly increased.
- (2) It is believed there are definite indications that the enemy capability to restrict UN night operations has considerably improved and may be expected to be a limiting factor on future friendly activity over North Korea, at least in the area north of the Chongchon River.

SIGNAL COMMUNICATION

1. GENERAL:

a. Message Drafting

- (1) Communications procedures will be in accordance with USF 70(B), effective JANAP's and current theatre directives. USF 70(B) is the primary communications authority since it amplifies certain provisions of the JANAP's for the guidance of Naval activities.
- (2) Drafters of dispatches are directed to familiarize themselves with the contents of JANAP 121(A) in regards to proper drafting, precedence, classification, and the general responsibilities of originators. 1stMAW Bulletin 12-51 gives examples of proper drafting and contains a list of commonly-used abbreviations.
- (3) Releasing Officers shall carefully review originated messages for proper format. They will also determine the provisions for assigning lower precedence for information addressees than for action addressees, and for mailing copies to information addressees. Information addressees are to be kept to a minimum - only those who "need to know".
- (4) All date-time groups will be assigned by the appropriate Communication Center.
- (5) Two (2) copies of classified and one (1) copy of unclassified outgoing dispatches will be delivered to Communication Centers for transmittal. The Communication Center will prepare confirmation copies for internal distribution.
- (6) All dispatches emanating from 1stMAW will indicate the originator as Commanding General. All messages released by Groups will indicate the Commanding Officer as originator. The use of personal names will be kept to a minimum as prescribed in 1stMAW Bulletin 11-51.
- (7) Releasing authority is outlined in Wing Standard Operating Procedure.
- (8) Call signs, delivery groups, and routing indicators will be derived from JANAP's 115, 116, 117, and 119, except where higher authorities assign call signs on a rotating basis for security reasons. Current call signs are contained in Appendix I.

b. Movement Reports

- (1) Movement Reports are required upon a shift of command post, change of base status of ship or shore based aircraft involving squadrons or organized detachments, and movement of Marine units of battalion strength or larger.
- (2) They will be filed twenty-four (24) hours in advance of movement if possible.
- (3) They will be classified in accordance with the classification of the movement order. They will be assigned ROUTINE precedence, unless exceptional circumstances prevail.
- (4) They shall be addressed to MRO TOKYO only. There shall be no information addressees.
- (5) The officer ordering the movement shall originate the Movement Report unless he specifically orders the moving unit to file its own Movement Report.
- (6) The movements of General Officers shall be handled in the same manner as for a moving unit, except that MROC Washington will be made an information addressee.
- (7) When the report is classified, Communication Centers shall bury the originator in the last portion of the encrypted text, and use the indefinite call "NQC" as the originator's call sign. The originator of the dispatch will be placed in the last portion of the text.
- (8) The precedence of "Arrival" messages will normally be as follows:
 - (a) ROUTINE - when actual arrival coincides with, or is prior to, the latest EIA furnished MRO Tokyo.
 - (b) PRIORITY - when actual arrival occurs after, but prior to two hours later than, the latest EIA furnished by MRO Tokyo.
 - (c) OP-IMMEDIATE - when actual arrival time occurs during the period from two to four hours later than latest EIA furnished MRO Tokyo.
- (9) Further amplification and examples are provided in 1st MAF Bulletin 20-51 and 23-51.

(c) Authentication and Identification

- (1) FEC Authentication Table #1 is effective for Air-to-Air and Air-to-Ground Voice Circuits. FEC Authentication Table #3 is effective for Point-to-Point, and Air-to-Ground C. Circuits.

- (2) The FEC 6 Series is effective for shackling numerals. It will be utilized whenever it is desired to transmit numerals in the clear.
- (3) The utilization of Mark III IFF equipment installed in aircraft under operational control of Fifth Air Force will be in accordance with current 5AF SOP's and specifically with 5AF COI Item 97-1, dtd 7Nov51, and as modified by 5AF SECRET dispatch 130225Z. Code settings for this equipment will be assigned from Appendicies in this COI. The IFF Destruct Switch in 1stMAW aircraft are inoperative and will be safety-wired in the OFF position. When directed, the Mark X Systems will be operated in accordance with JANAP 160.
- (4) Effective joint identification recognition doctrine will be in accordance with the JANAP 150, 151, and 152 series. Extracts from the JANAP 158 series (Air-Ground Identification Signals) will be for one-week periods only. Troop and vehicular identification panels are contained in EUSAK SOI 43-11. Positive measures will be taken to ensure that all pilots are briefed on the effective identifying signals for each day. The Wing Communication Center will disseminate countersigns by courier to subordinate units.

d. Navigational Aids

- (1) Complete information on navigational aids in Korea is contained in 5AF "Radio Facilities and Aids to Navigation", published weekly. A complete listing of YE/YG and VHF Radio Homing Beacons aboard Naval vessels and shore stations is contained in Section 660, USF 70(B).
- (2) The radar beacon, MPN-2(CPN-6), at AFB, Itami, is assigned 2-3-1. The beacon at K-3 is assigned code 1-3. The beacon at K-18 is assigned code 2-2. Detailed information on "X" and "S" band shipboard radar beacons is contained in Article 672 of USF 70(B).
- (3) VHF/DF procedures are outlined in ACP 130(A), 5AF SOP 55-17, and 55-3 provide amplifying details.
- (4) Lost Plane Procedure will be in accordance with Chapter 17 USF 70(B).
- (5) JANAP 300 contains basic Search and Rescue doctrine. Chapter 18 of USF 70(B) and 5AF SOP 100-10 provide amplifying details.
- (6) JANAP 107 sets forth procedures to be used for aircraft distress communications. 5AF SOP 100-95 gives applicable details.

- (1) Message Centers, as defined in paragraph 14(b) of JANAP 117(A), will be maintained by the 1stMAW, MAG-33, MAG-12, MACG-2, MWSS-1 and the 1st 90mm AAA Gun Bn. Message files will be maintained and destroyed in accordance with Articles 278.3(a), and 279.1(a) of USF 70(B).
- (2) Communication Centers, as defined in paragraph 14(c) of JANAP 117(A), will be maintained only when a unit is operating separately. Whenever possible, senior units will provide communications and cryptographic guard for subordinate units. The subordinate unit will continue to operate its own Message Center, but will make available personnel and equipment to the senior unit commensurate with the additional traffic load being borne by the senior units. Arrangements to implement the above doctrine will ensure the most economical and efficient utilization of personnel and equipment. It is the responsibility of the senior unit assuming communication guard to provide the subordinate unit with satisfactory service. Units will make arrangements with commands of the other services for the communications guard of subordinate units located adjacent to such commands, whenever such subordinates cannot perform their own communications guard. MAG-12, MWSS-1, and 1st 90mm AAA Gun Bn will maintain their own communication centers. 1stMAW will perform communications and cryptographic guard for Wing Headquarters and directly attached units. MAG-33 and MACG-2.
- (3) Publications and Cryptosecurity: RPS-holders will maintain a complete publication allowance, as authorized by RPS 6(D) and JANAP 199(C), and as modified by CNO directives, at all times. Local holders will draw only those publications necessary for operations from their senior command when on independent duty. All commands will closely adhere to the regulations contained in RPS 4(C). Each command operating a crypto center will appoint a Cryptosecurity Officer who will be governed by paragraph 2002 of AFSAG 1210 in the performance of his duties. Crypto Centers will conform to the standards set forth in Section 2210 of JANAP 122(A). Crypto Center operations will be governed by AFSAG 1210.
- (4) Radio
 - (a) An intra-wing, Point-to-Point, Simplex Manual, HF, circuit will be maintained at all times. The primary purpose shall be for administrative traffic. Overload tactical traffic will be handled when necessary. 1stMAW is Net Control Station at all times. Subordinate units shall enter the net when directed. Groups may activate their own Command Nets when justification exists.
 - (b) Additional radio nets will be entered when necessary or directed.
 - (c) Responsibilities for radio relay by Wing units will be assigned by this Headquarters.

(d) Strict circuit discipline shall be maintained at all times, not only as a means of expediting traffic, but also as a means of defeating enemy jamming and imitative deception. All radio operators shall be thoroughly familiar with the provisions of Chapter 13 of USF 70(B), which details these attempts to interfere with our radio communications.

(e) Anti-jamming procedures are contained in 5AF SOP 100-51. Each radio station shall maintain a current plan for alternate routing of traffic should jamming disrupt communications. Reports of interference shall be made according to 5AF SOP 100-50, as modified by CG, 5AF message CME 1830, whenever an Air Force frequency is involved. Interference on Navy-assigned frequencies shall be reported according to paragraph 1315.1 of USF 70(B).

(f) Countermeasures will be taken only upon direction by higher headquarters.

(g) Radio telegraph operating procedures will be governed by ACP 124(A).

(5) wire

(a). Each unit so equipped shall operate a separate switchboard unless facilities are available for serving all commands at one location from a central switchboard, in which case the senior command shall assume the code name for the field. If such is the case, personnel shall be pooled for switchboard operation and trouble-shooting under the supervision of the senior command. When separate switchboards are necessary, the responsibility for laying and maintaining lines from the senior to the subordinate commands rests with the senior. At K-3 the 1stMAW shall assume the code name for the airfield, provide local circuits for Wing Headquarters, and provide sufficient trunk circuits to MAG-33 and MACG-2 switchboards.

(b) Wire tagging will be in accordance with APPENDIX III. Telephone directory numbers shall be assigned in accordance with 5AF SOP 100-26, an example of which is contained in APPENDIX III. Commands operating separate switchboards may assign random numbers. Each command operating a separate switchboard shall provide all other units of the wing with sufficient copies of its telephone directory to provide adequate distribution. Units located at the same airfield shall incorporate their telephone numbers in a common directory.

(c) Telephone switchboard operating instructions will be in accordance with JANAP 134.

(d) Each unit performing its own communications guard will normally be served by teletype circuits which will provide communications with other commands as well as with wing units through relay centers of other services. Teletypes will be installed and operated in accordance with JANAP 127(A), and as modified by AFR 100-13. Responsibilities for tape relay by wing units will be assigned by this Headquarters.

b. Tactical(1) Tactical Circuits.

(2) Radio

(a) Tactical voice circuits needed for operations will be established as set forth in para 3(b)(1)(a).

(b) See paragraph 3(a)(4)(e) and (f).

(3) Wire

(b) Carrier-loaded VHF/FM and Landlines furnished by wing Communications will provide direct circuits (hot lines) between TACC and TADC's of wing and between those Air Control Units of other Services with which the wing is operating.

13. a. All aircraft equipped with Bird-Dog enroute to DEVASTATE BAKER will employ homing technique as follows:
- (1) Check in with DEVASTATE ABLE or BAKER as soon as possible. Advise that flight desires Bird-Dog homing. Give ETA as DEVASTATE BAKER.
 - (2) DEV STATE BAKER will advise aircraft when homer will be on the air.
 - (3) Homer frequency is 1730 kcs.
 - (4) Homer identification will be the voice call of the TACP to which the flight will be assigned by DEVASTATE BAKER.
 - (5) Advise TACP when over homer. TACP will secure homer when visual contact has been established between aircraft and controller.
- b. The Homer is a low-powered MHF non-directional homer operated by the TACP to guide aircraft into his area under emergency conditions such as a scramble flight, reduced visibility due to smoke or haze or overcast conditions when ceiling is high enough for attacks but too extensive an overcast for VFR navigation.
- c. TACP's are advised that Homer could be used for let-downs in which case caution must be exercised as to ceilings, terrain, direction of let-down, and visibility. These factors must be considered prior to attempting a homer let-down using the above procedures.

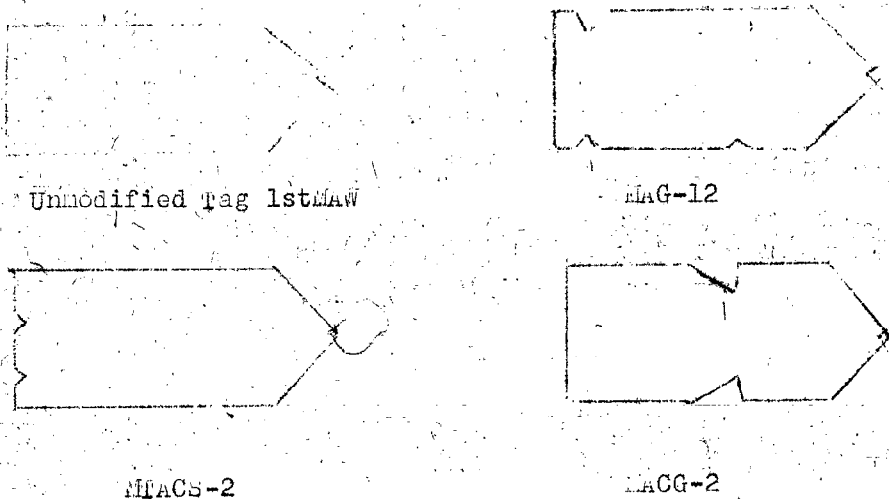

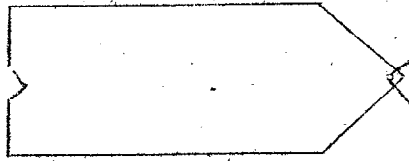

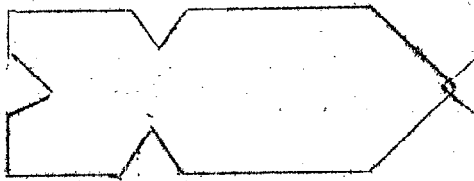

AIR DEFENSE PLAN

1. GENERAL

a. Enemy: Annex CHARLIE

b. Friendly:

(1) Commanding General, Fifth Air Force is responsible for the air defense of Korea, including harbor areas, and has established standing operating procedures to be followed by all units under 5th AF operational control.

(2) For air defense purposes, Korea has been divided into two sectors: a Northern Air Defense Sector, and a Southern Air Defense Sector. These Sectors each comprise two Sub-sectors. (See Appendix I - Air Defense Sectors). The CG, 1stMAW has been designated by 5th AF as the Air Defense Commander (ADC), Southern Air Defense Sector, with appropriate responsibilities. Air defense activities in the Northern Air Defense Sector will be controlled by the 5th AF TACC and assigned TADC's. Air defense activities in the Southern Sector will be conducted as outlined herein.

(3) EUSAK will participate in active air defense with organic weapons, and prescribe and implement passive air defense measures for army units and civilian personnel under its jurisdiction.

(4) Naval forces in Korean Harbors will participate in active air defense within the limits of their capabilities. Naval forces elsewhere in Korean waters may participate under 5th AF coordination-control as occasion demands.

2. This force will:

a. Conduct active air defense in the Southern Air Defense Sector.

b. Implement passive air defense of Marine installations under jurisdiction of CG, 1stMAW.

c. Provide air warning services in the Southern Air Defense Sector.

d. Provide plot-telling services and fire control status to adjacent Naval AA batteries.

e. Be prepared to direct all air defense operations in Korea in order to provide an alternate command post for CG 5th AF if needed.

3. a. 1stMAW Flight Section

(1) In the event of air attack be prepared to disperse or evacuate aircraft as directed.

b. AAA Command, Pusan Harbor Area

(1) Provide shore-based AA coverage of the Pusan Harbor Area. (See Appendix VIII).

(2) Maintain and operate an anti-aircraft artillery operations room (AAOR) to relay Air Warning and gun control information to specified units. (See Appendix III).

(3) Coordinate shore and sea-based AAA defense of Pusan Harbor area.

(4) Recommend to the ADC, Southern Air Defense Sector, the tactical employment of smoke unit facilities in the Pusan Harbor area.

c. HMR-161

(1) In the event of air attack, and when released from operational control of 1st MarDiv, be prepared to disperse or evacuate aircraft as directed.

d. VMO-6

(1) In the event of air attack, and when released from operational control of 1st MarDiv, be prepared to disperse or evacuate aircraft as directed.

e. MACG-2

(1) Install, operate and maintain a TACC at Pohang (K-3) to provide the centralized means for the ADC to control and direct air defense, and air warning services, in the Southern Air Defense Sector. (See Appendices V and VI).

(2) Install, operate and maintain in the vicinity of Kunsan (K-8) a TADC to direct aircraft in air defense and to provide, to the extent of its capabilities, radar coverage of the Southwestern Air Defense Sub-sector, (See Appendices V and VI).

(3) Install, operate and maintain in the vicinity of Pohang (K-3) a TADC to direct aircraft in air defense and to provide, to the extent of its capabilities, radar coverage of the Southeastern Air Defense Sub-sector. (See Appendices V and VI).

(4) Install, operate and maintain, in the vicinity of Pusan (K-1) and Cheju-do (K-40), GCI detachments to provide early warning services and limited navigational facilities.

(5) Be prepared to direct all air defense operations in Korea in order to provide an alternate CP for the CG 5th AF if needed. (See 5th AF SOP 355-25).

(6) Identify all aircraft airborne in the Southern Air Defense Sector.

(7) Maintain constant liaison with 5th AF TACC to effect mutual exchange of pertinent air information. Insure that necessary identification information on northbound air traffic is relayed to appropriate Northern Air Defense Sector agencies. Pass all plots in Southern Air Defense Sector to 5th AF TACC. Receive all plots passed from Northern Air Defense Sector.

(8) Initiate or relay Warning messages to adjacent United Nations installations.

(9) Employ available CAP and alert aircraft for identification/interception as required.

(10) Initiate, for the ADC, Southern Air Defense Sector, requests to the 5th AF TACC for additional aircraft, if available aircraft are inadequate to meet an immediate situation.

(11) Maintain a current record of air activity in the Southern Air Defense Sector.

(12) Coordinate air-raid plotting, telling service, and fire control status information with adjacent AAA gun battalion, Fleet Activities, and ship's AA batteries within gunfire range of shore.

(13) Coordinate and direct as appropriate the fire control status of AAA units to insure proper AAA consideration of friendly and hostile aircraft. Pass status changes direct from 1stMAW TACC to appropriate AACOR and AAA automatic weapons command posts. Immediately relay all AA status changes direct to 5th AF TACC.

(14) Provide radio and radar navigational assistance to the maximum extent of equipment capabilities.

(15) Recommend to the ADC the employment of early warning and GCI facilities to attain maximum efficiency.

(16) Carry all radar plots until identified, or until pass into Northern Air Defense Sector, or fade from the scope.

(17) Submit daily status report in accordance 5th AF Regulation 55-9.

f. MAG-12

(1) Conduct air identification and air intercept operations as directed.

(2) In the event of air attack be prepared to disperse or evacuate aircraft as directed.

(3) Conduct passive air defense in accordance with Appendix IV.

g. MAG-33

(1) Conduct air identification and air intercept operations as directed.

(2) In the event of air attack be prepared to disperse or evacuate aircraft as directed.

(3) Conduct passive air defense in accordance with Appendix IV.

x. (1) In the event of Alert Warning:

(a) If during daylight hours 1stMAW TACC may direct aircraft groups to dispatch to orbit points or air space assignments, those aircraft not immediately required for intercept. (Appendices V and VI).

(b) If during the hours of darkness or inclement weather, 1stMAW TACC may direct day-fighter aircraft to remain on the ground. Unit commanders will disperse aircraft to the maximum possible extent. Taxi-ways and service runways will be kept clear to permit available all weather fighters to be employed by 1stMAW TACC.

(2) Broadcast control and trailer operations (Appendix X).

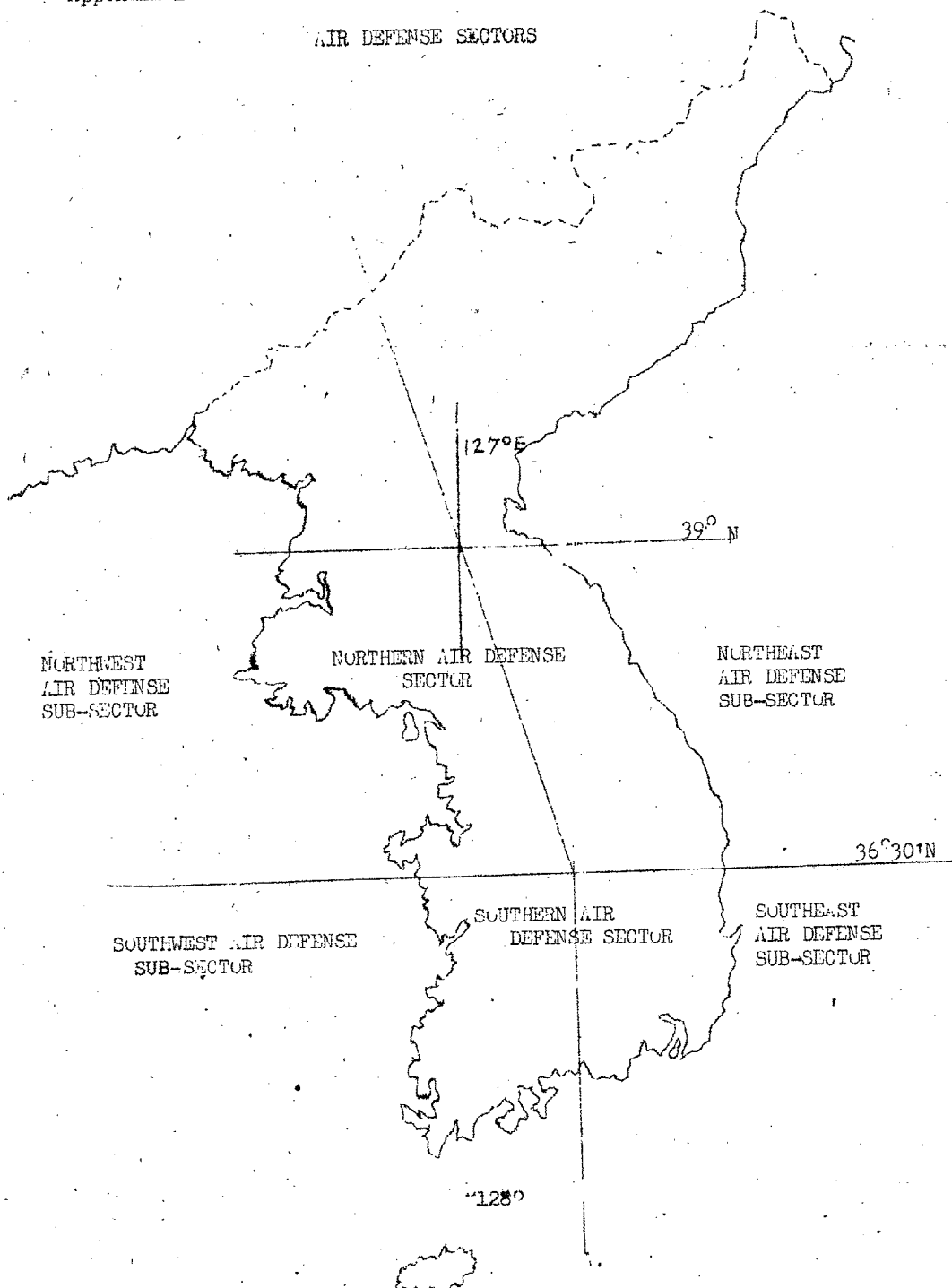

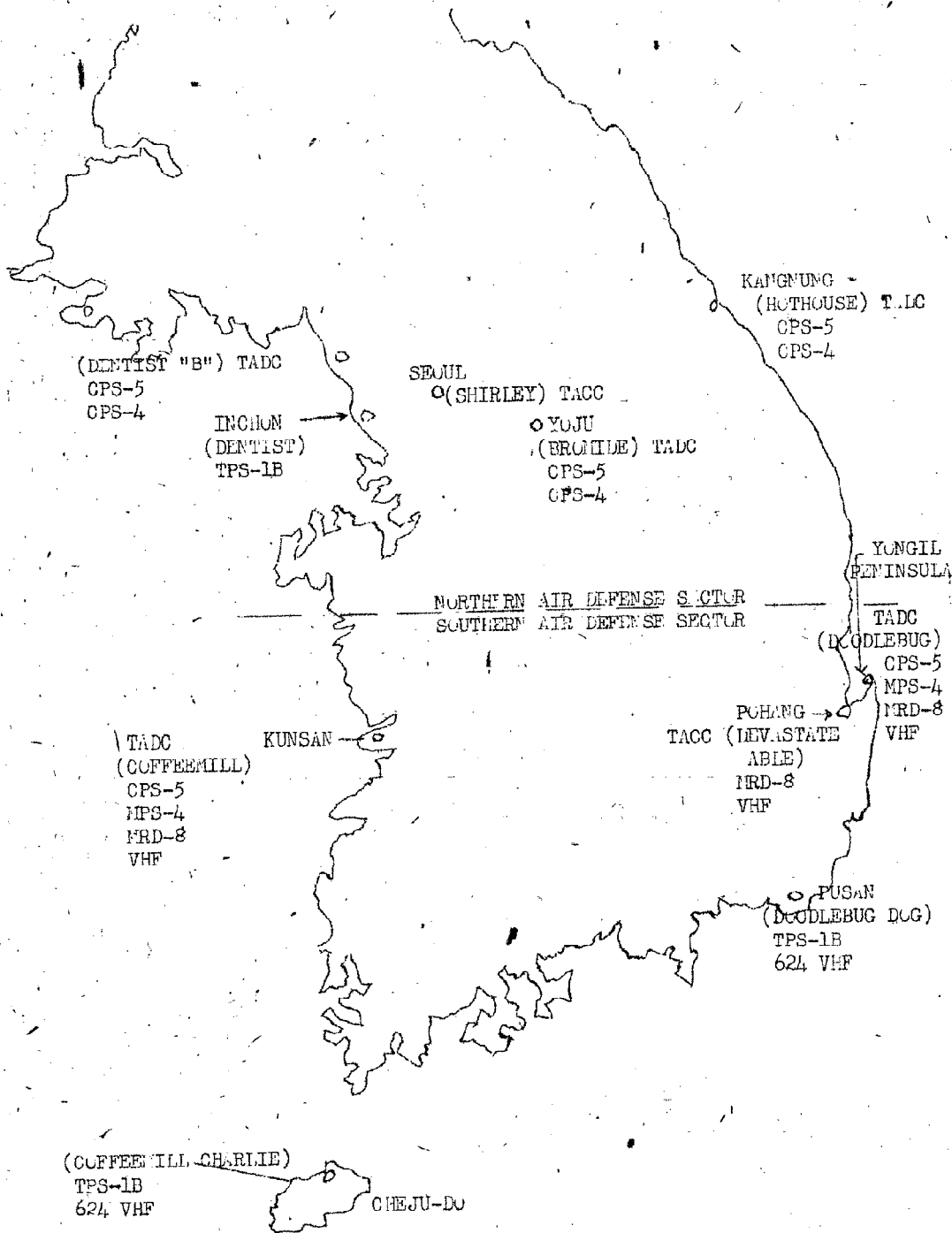

ATTACK WARNING CONDITIONS
(Reference: 5th AF SOP 355-3, 355-25)

1. Air Raid and Ground Attack Warnings are disseminated by means of Alert Warning Messages. In the case of air raid warnings these messages include color code to indicate probability of air attack, local time group, effected area (as defined in Appendix I), and the terms "many" or "few" to indicate more than fifteen (15) or less than fifteen (15) aircraft. Color code, sequence, and definitions are as follows:

- a. Warning Yellow - (denote local time, sector, and many or few).
 - (1) Indicates air attack probable; unidentified aircraft in vicinity.
 - (2) Army, Navy and Air Force agencies who must take action are notified but no general alarm is sounded.
 - (3) Warning Yellow will be given for one or more Air Defense Sub-sectors.
EXAMPLE: "Warning Yellow - 1130I - Southeast Sub-Sector - Few".
- b. Warning Red - (denote local time, sector and many or few).
 - (1) Indicates an attack imminent; enemy aircraft in vicinity.
 - (2) All agencies will be notified and suitable alarms sounded.
 - (3) Warning Red may be ordered for an Air Defense Sub-sector or an affected immediate area while other sectors remain in warning Yellow status.
- c. Warning Black
 - (1) Indicates ground attack imminent or in progress.
- d. Warning White - (denote local time and sector).
 - (1) Indicates all clear from either ground or air attack.

2. 1stMAW TACC, net control station for the Southern Air Defense Sector, will initiate or receive Air Alert Warning Messages for the Southern Air Defense Sector and pass them to:

- a. 5th AF TACC
- b. Air bases in the Southern Air Defense Sector.
- c. Subordinate TADC's and outlying units.
- d. AAA Command, Pusan Harbor Area (AAOR).

3. AAA Command, Pusan Harbor Area (AAOR) will relay air raid warning messages to:

- a. CG, 2d Logistical Command.
- b. CO, 3d Logistical Command.
- c. SOPA (via Flt Activities).
- d. Fleet Activities.
- e. Air Base Commander K-1.
- f. Air Base Commander K-9.
- g. Air Base Commander K-10.
- h. Smoke Generating Companies (Pusan Harbor Area).
- i. 1st 90mm AAA Gun Bn, FMF.
- j. 213th AAA Gun Bn USA (less 2 btrys).
- k. Such other activities as may later be established in the Pusan Harbor Area.

4. Air Base Commanders will pass Warning Black and Warning White (concerning ground attack) messages.
5. The Senior Controller, 5th AF TACC, will pass Warning message to:
 - a. 1stMAW Tactical Air Control Center.
 - b. Itazuke ADCG through 1stMAW TACC.
 - c. Aircraft on tactical missions (for diversionary purpose).
6. Japan Air Defense System is responsible for passing Warning messages from other Air Defense areas to Korea. Secondary means of passing these messages is; Itazuke ADCG-1stMAW TACC-5th AF TACC.
7. Technical Control Officer, 5th AF Communications Center will pass Warning Messages by CW Radio to all Fifth Air Force Units in Korea and to such Naval Units as are in the available nets.
8. Air Base Commanders will:
 - a. Pass Warning Messages to all units on or adjacent to their bases.
 - b. Be prepared to silence radio navigation aids when directed.
9. Administrative and Tactical Radio-Telephone and CW operators will notify all stations within their respective nets of the warning conditions as required by this order and maintain their receivers on standby with transmitter plate power off, unless operational traffic of an emergency nature is received for transmission. GCI operational traffic will be transmitted over VHF/FM if available. In cases where VHF/FM is not available, radio transmissions will be held to a minimum consistent with proper operation.
10. Units responsible for passing alert warning information will prepare detailed orders covering the action required including the circuit to be used and the alternate routing. These orders will be plainly posted in front of the individual who will take action. Alert warning communications facilities will be tested at least twice each 24 hours, and a log kept indicating the results of the tests. When the caller or recipient of the message has reason to doubt the authenticity of the message, he may challenge using the Far East Command Authentication System. The 1stMAW TACC is "net control" in the Southern Air Defense Sector and will initiate the test calls.
11. Anti-Aircraft Gunfire Control - Fire control of AAA guns within the Southern Air Defense Sector is vested in the 1stMAW TACC. The normal control condition is "Limit Fire" "Release Fire" may be given by the TACC when an air attack appears likely or at any other time deemed advisable. "Hold Fire" may be given at any time by the TACC to protect friendly aircraft. The Senior Air Force Duty officer, 5th AF TACC, has final control authority and may at any time direct changes in the control conditions established by the 1stMAW TACC.
12. AAA Control Conditions are as follows:
 - a. Release Fire - Anti-aircraft Artillery Fire Control status under which AAA may engage the following:
 - (1) Aircraft not recognized as friendly or,
 - (2) Aircraft designated by the TACC Controller.
 - b. Limit Fire - Anti-aircraft artillery fire control status under which AA may engage only aircraft recognized as hostile or those seen attacking friendly vessels, troops or installations with ordnance.


- c. Hold Fire - Anti-aircraft Artillery Fire Control status under which AAA will not fire under any circumstances. "Hold Fire" will normally be ordered only when friendly aircraft are in the area and/or in close pursuit of the target.

 - (3) Extent of damage sustained.
 - (4) Number of casualties.
 - (5) Assistance required.
 - i. Initiation of an Atomic, Biological and Chemical Defense program.
2. CO, MAG-12 and CO, MAG-33 will be prepared to smoke their respective fields. Use or non-use of smoke will be determined by this headquarters. Instructions will be passed by 1stMAW TACC for K-3; by 5th AF TACC for K-18.

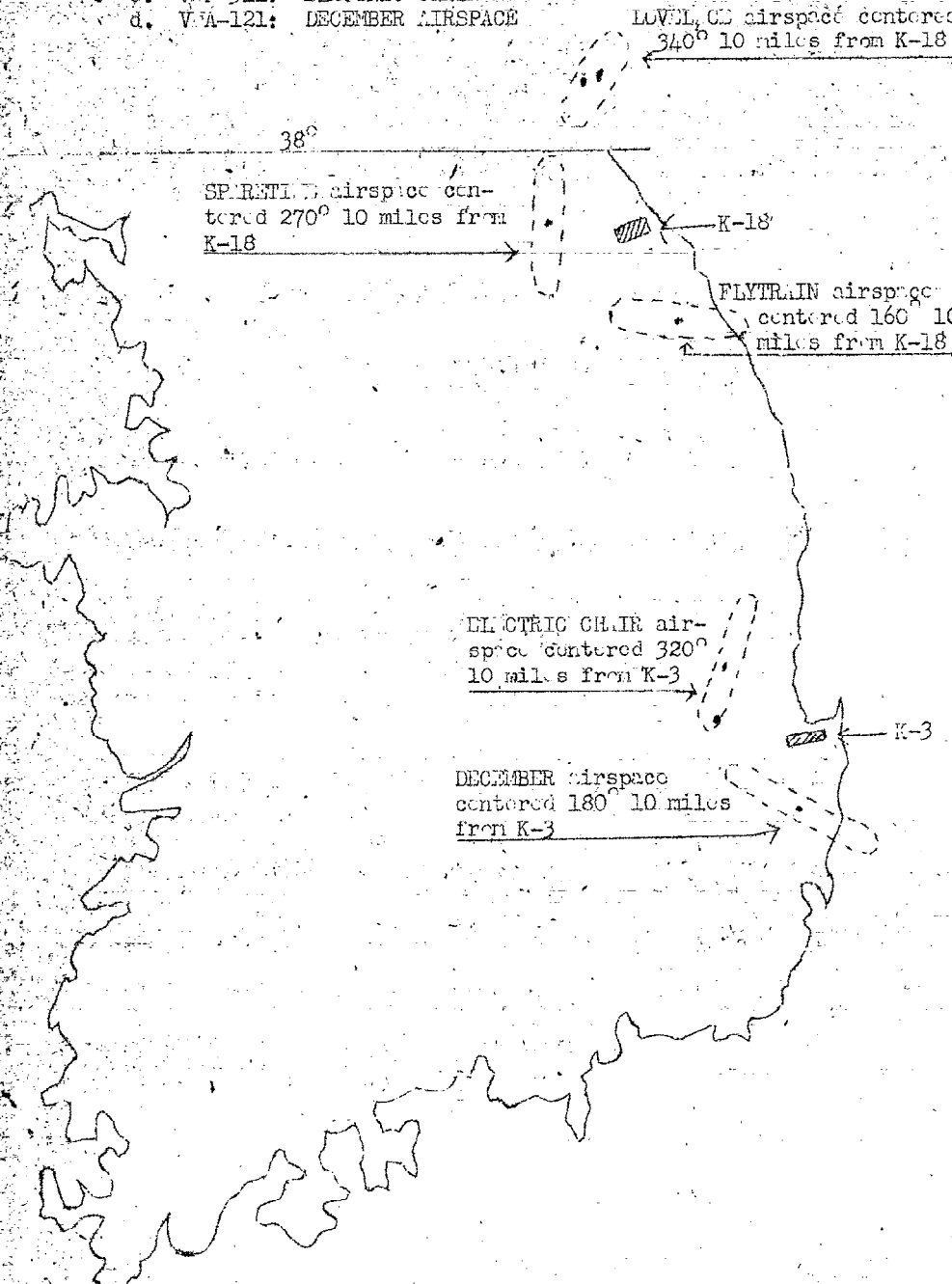

2. Anti-aircraft Readiness Conditions:

a. READY ONE:

- (1) A/W Section of Gun Batteries: During "periods of target visibility" Quad 50 cal. weapons will be prepared to open fire within ten (10) seconds. Ground mounts within one (1) minute.
- (2) 90mm Gun Units: Ready to fire within six (6) minutes.

b. READY TWO:

- (1) A/W Section of Gun Batteries: During "periods of target visibility" two (2) Quad 50 cal. weapons will be prepared to open fire within ten (10) seconds. Ground mounts within two (2) minutes.
- (2) 90mm Gun Units: Ready to fire within ten (10) minutes.

c. READY THREE:

- (1) A/W Section of Gun Batteries: During "periods of target visibility" one (1) Quad 50 cal. weapon ready to fire within ten (10) seconds. Ground mounts within two (2) minutes.
- (2) 90mm Gun Units: Ready to fire within ten (10) minutes.

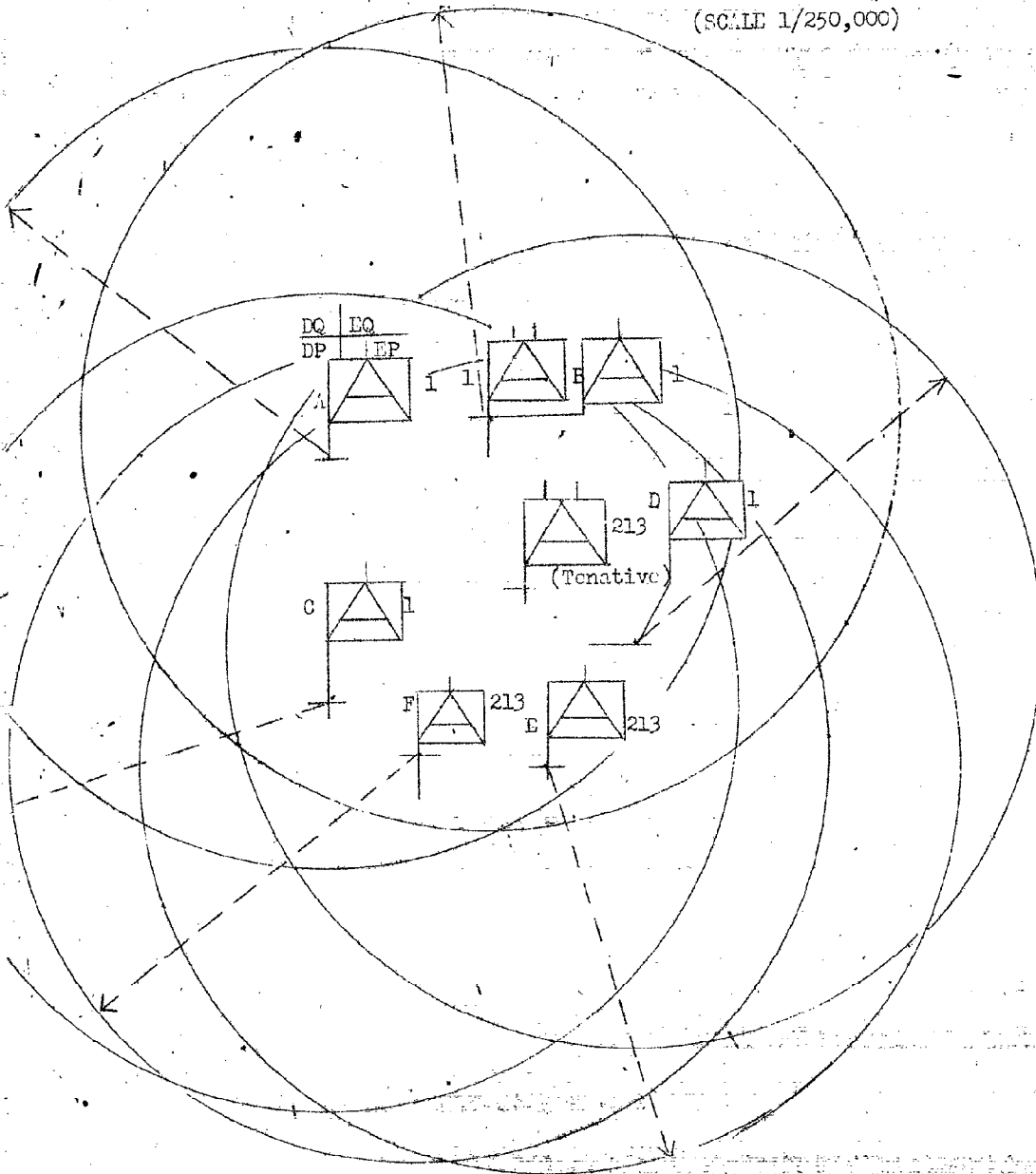

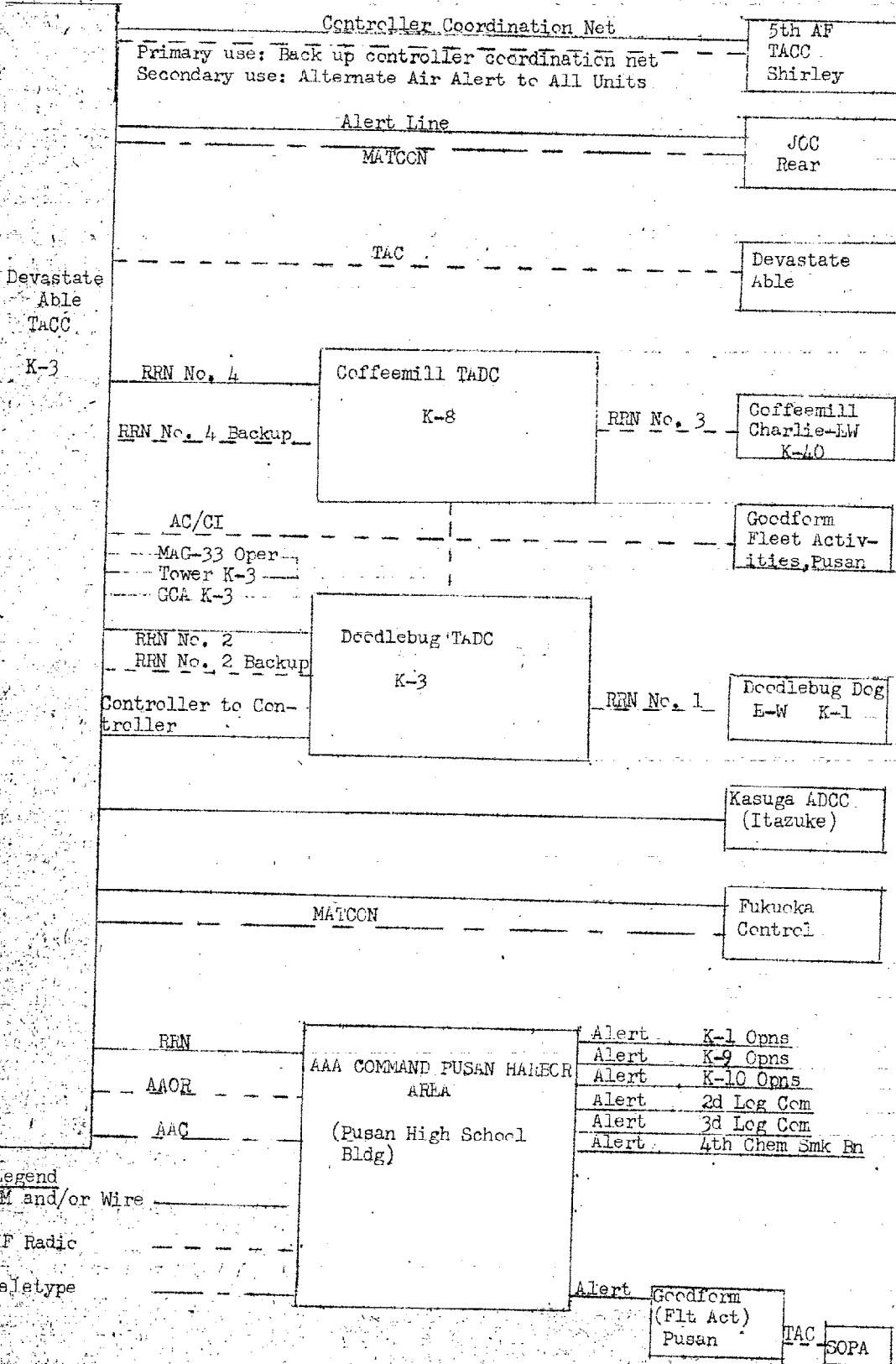

BROADCAST CONTROL AND TRAILER OPERATIONS
(Reference 5th AF SOP 55-14)

1. Purpose - To establish procedures, by use of Broadcast Control and Trailer Operations, to:

- a. Control large numbers of interceptors against mass air attacks.
- b. Provide information relative to the movement of enemy aircraft for interception and/or diversionary purposes.
- c. Provide supplementary methods of monitoring enemy aircraft movement and direct interceptions.

2. Application - Broadcast Control and/or Trailer Operations will be placed in effect by the TACC, when required. All pilots will be familiar with these procedures.

3. Definitions -

a. Broadcast Control: A system of control whereby a controller in the Tactical Control System provides progressive information over a common frequency concerning movement, disposition and activity of enemy aircraft. Aircraft scrambled for, or diverted to, "Broadcast Control" will monitor the control frequency for necessary information and control instructions. Friendly aircraft, other than fighters, may monitor Broadcast Control for diversionary information. Broadcast Control is effected only where the size of the enemy attack and/or the number of intercepting flights under tactical control warrants.

b. Trailer Operations: Assigning a friendly aircraft or flight to trail an enemy formation for one or more of the following reasons:

- (1) To insure continual information on the position of an enemy formation being relayed to the tactical control system when the target passes through areas of poor coverage after initial detection and interception.
- (2) To act as an airborne controller in directing and controlling attacks against enemy formations.
- (3) To provide current information on diversionary strikes, low level attacks or other activities of an enemy force.

4. Procedures -

a. The Senior Controller, TACC, upon initiating Broadcast Control, will:

- (1) Advise appropriate TADC to initiate Broadcast Control procedures.
- (2) Scramble and/or divert additional interceptor aircraft as necessary, assigning them to appropriate TADC, and specifying monitoring frequency for Broadcast Control instructions.
- (3) Provide instructions as necessary to returning aircraft for diversionary purposes.
- (4) Provide information to Senior Air Force Duty Officer, JOC.

b. The TADC operating under Broadcast Control will:

- (1) Advise aircraft under its control that Broadcast Control is in effect.

- (2) Provide continual commentary over designated frequency on position, heading and altitude of enemy raid or raids, designating raids by number when more than one is involved.
- (3) Assign interceptors to specific raids by number as they "check in" when more than one raid is involved.
- (4) Monitor group common frequencies within capabilities to obtain additional information from interceptors that have made contact.

c. Interceptor aircraft scrambled for, or diverted to, Broadcast Control will:

- (1) Monitor designated Broadcast Control frequency, maintaining radio silence except to check in, tally-ho or acknowledge instructions when requested by the TADC.
- (2) Proceed on intercepting course and follow instructions from the TADC.
- (3) Return to group common for the attack after making visual contact with the enemy.

d. The "Joint Scene of Action" frequency will be used for Broadcast Control unless another frequency is specified by TACC or TADC.

e. Aircraft directed to perform "Trailer Operations" after intercept will:

- (1) Maintain visual contact with the enemy formation after intercept, remaining out of gunfire range.
- (2) Be prepared to provide information to the TADC upon request, advise of diversionary strikes or other activity that might be missed by TADC.
- (3) Direct interceptors approaching the scene but not making visual contact with the raid.
- (4) Assume Broadcast Control functions if directed to do so by the TACC.

f. Relay aircraft crystallization will include all group common frequencies to provide means of relaying instructions to all tactical aircraft.

AIRCRAFT MOVEMENT AND APPROACH PROCEDURES

(Reference: 5th AF Regs. 66-17 and 60-15)

1. Purpose: To insure positive control over the identification of friendly aircraft flying within Korea and adjacent waters.

2. Procedures:a. Non-tactical Flights

- (1) All non-tactical flights, other than liaison and helicopter, will be on established airways, unless destination cannot be reached on such airways.
- (2) Non-tactical flights to destinations not on established airways will proceed along airways to the point nearest destination. Upon leaving airways, pilots will contact the nearest Tactical Air Direction Center, giving position, route, and destination. Return flights will be made direct to the nearest established airway and then along the airway to destination.
- (3) Pilots of non-tactical flights will file flight plans with base operations at points of departure. If no facilities are available to transmit flight plans to Military Air Traffic Control Center (MATCON), the pilot will:
 - (a) Contact the nearest TADC, giving the point of departure, route, and destination.
 - (b) Contact MATCON giving the aircraft number, type, point of departure, route, destination, air speed, and time enroute by one of the following methods:
 - (1) Through MATCON Airways for aircraft with airborne radio operators when out of VHF range of MATCON.
 - (2) To MATCON when within VHF range.
 - (3) Through airdrome control towers, with request for relay to MATCON.
- (4) IFF instructions will be issued separately.
- (5) Non-tactical aircraft will make position reports to TADC and TACC upon request.
- (6) Altitudes of 12,000 feet and above are restricted to the movement of tactical aircraft.
- (7) Non-tactical aircraft departing Korea for Japan via Ashiya will make position reports to Fukuoka Control when over K-9.
- (8) Non-tactical aircraft may clear VFR between Japan and Korea provided a minimum altitude of 5,000 feet is maintained along airways.
- (9) IFR non-tactical flights are restricted to a maximum altitude of 11,500 feet on airways and will comply with present regulations regarding ATC clearance.

- (10) Local non-tactical flights will be permitted in local flying areas in accordance with individual base regulations. Aircraft will monitor tower frequency at all times.
- (11) Position reports will be brief and to the point. Only information listed below will be transmitted. Pilot will monitor frequency before transmitting so as not to block out other transmissions. Position reports will not be duplicated; eg, by pilots to MATCON and by radio operator to MATCON Airways.
- (a) VFR non-tactical flights will make position reports to control towers enroute over compulsory reporting points listed in the Korean Letdown Guide. In addition, aircraft departing Japan will make position reports to K-9 or K-3 tower when 30 miles out. VFR position reports will include identification, point of departure, type of flight plan (VFR), destination, and time over the fix. Example: AF1263 departed Ashiya VFR for K-2, 30 miles south of K-9 at three six.
- (b) IFR non-tactical flights will make position reports over compulsory reporting points listed in the Korean Letdown Guide, when 30 miles out of K-3, K-9, or K-2, and as instructed by MATCON or control towers. IFR position reports will include identification, position, time, altitude, departure point, destination, and estimated time over next reporting point. Example: AF9618 over K-3 at one six, 6000 feet, departed Komaki for K-46, ETA K-2 0345.
- (c) IFR position reports will be made as follows:
- (1) To MATCON on VHF, or
 - (2) To Airdrome Control Towers, with request for relay to MATCON, or
 - (3) To MATCON Airways on H/F.
- (12) Jet aircraft on non-tactical clearances may fly direct within Korea and between Korea and Japan with prior approval from TAGC.
- (13) All aircraft will be prepared to authenticate, using "Far East Command Authentication System."

b. Tactical Flights

- (1) Group Commanders will:
- (a) Insure that the Tactical Air Control Center or Tactical Air Direction Center is notified of any aircraft departing on a tactical clearance.
 - (b) Insure that clearance is obtained from the nearest Military Air Traffic Control Center for clearances on or across established airways under IFR conditions when flying at an altitude of 11,500 feet or below, except when under direct control of a Tactical Air Direction Center which will be responsible to keep tactical traffic clear of traffic under Military Air Traffic Control.

- (c) Provide lateral separation of all aircraft under his command while under controlled instrument flights along established airways.
 - (d) Continue or abort a tactical mission as directed by proper authority.
 - (e) Insure that pilots of jet aircraft desiring to make actual instrument letdowns advise Military Air Traffic Control Center or airdrome control tower sufficiently in advance so that the letdown path can be cleared of controlled traffic.
- (2) 1stMAW TACC and/or TADC will:
- (a) Monitor flights of aircraft on tactical clearances.
 - (b) Relay pertinent information to the adjacent Tactical Air Control Center or Tactical Air Direction Center when aircraft on tactical clearances are cleared into the adjacent air defense areas.
 - (c) Provide the nearest Military Air Traffic Control Center with all pertinent information relative to the flights of aircraft on tactical clearances which may encounter actual instrument conditions on or across established airways below 12,000 feet which cannot be vectored clear of controlled traffic.
 - (d) Vector tactical aircraft without, or with inoperative radio compasses or in an emergency, to a specific point where GCA can pick up the aircraft.
 - (e) Immediately advise the nearest Military Air Traffic Control Center of all tactical scrambles when participating aircraft are expected to encounter actual instrument conditions.
 - (f) Keep all airborne alert and tactical aircraft under radar surveillance clear of aircraft under Military Air Traffic Control.
 - (g) Maintain constant and continuous liaison with the nearest Military Air Traffic Control Center.
- (3) Military Air Traffic Control Center will:
- (a) Specify an altitude and provide traffic separation between tactical aircraft and other traffic when it becomes necessary for a tactical flight to proceed on or across established airways below 12,000 feet and cannot be vectored clear of aircraft under Military Air Traffic Control.
 - (b) Coordinate flights of aircraft on tactical clearances as received from Tactical Air Control Center or Tactical Air Direction Center with flights of other aircraft under Military Air Traffic Control.
 - (c) Maintain constant coordination with Tactical Air Control Center or Tactical Air Direction Center.

c. Reporting In and Out:

- (1) Aircraft from K-2 and K-3 will RIO with DEVASTATE ABLE on published frequency.

- (2) Aircraft from K-8 will RIO with COFFEEMILL on published frequency.

- (4) Other Aircraft:
 - (a) Aircraft approaching Southern Air Defense Sector from the NORTH: Call DEVASTATE ABLE (K-3) on published RIO frequency when entering sector. If no contact, call COFFEEMILL (K-8) if on the west coast or DOODLEBUG (Yongil Peninsula) if on the east coast.
 - (b) Aircraft entering the Southern Air Defense Sector from any other direction will contact the nearest air defense facility when 100 miles out, and will contact successive air defense facilities as they are approached.
- (5) Reporting in and out on RIO net does not preclude the use of IFF nor the established airways per existing directives.

2. The text of reference (a) as published in reference (b) is quoted below for information and future guidance.

FREE MAIL PRIVILEGE FOR MEMBERS OF THE ARMED
FORCES OF THE UNITED STATES IN KOREA

"Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, that any first-class letter mail matter admissible to the mails as ordinary mail matter which is sent by a member of the Armed Forces of the United States in Korea and such other areas as the President of the United States may hereafter designate as the combat zones or theaters of military operations, to any person in the United States, including the Territories and possessions thereof, shall be transmitted in the mail free of postage, subject to such rules and regulations as the Postmaster General may prescribe: Provided, that when specified by the sender letters weighing not to exceed one ounce shall be transmitted to destination by air mail, dependent upon air space availability therefor."

"Sec.2. The free mailing privileges above granted shall become effective upon the date of enactment of this act and shall continue until June 30, 1951, unless terminated at an earlier date by concurrent resolution of the Congress or by direction of the President."

Letters sent by members of the Armed Forces of the United States in Korea, to be mailed free of postage, shall bear in the upper right corner of the address side in the handwriting of the sender the word "Free" and in the upper left corner the written name of the sender, together with his serial number, his rank or rating, and the designation of the service to which he belongs.

The free mail privilege is applicable only to personal letter mail in its usual and generally accepted form, including messages on post cards, sent by members in the active service of the Armed Forces in Korea. This provision is primarily for the purpose of making it easier for our men in the service in combat zones to keep in touch with their families and friends.

Such letters, including messages on post cards, weighing not to exceed 1 ounce and endorsed by the sender for air service, shall be given air mail transportation, whenever practicable. Letters intended for air service should be marked or endorsed "Air Mail" or "Via Air Mail" in a prominent manner above the address and below the word "Free".

3. Reference (c), which is an administrative extension of privileges granted by Public Law 609, is quoted for information and compliance:

"FREE MAILING PRIVILEGES AUTHORIZED BY PL 609 AS AMENDED HEREBY ADMINISTRATIVELY EXTENDED TO THOSE MILITARY PERSONNEL HOSPITALIZED OUTSIDE CONUS AS A RESULT OF SERVICE IN KOREA X NAVY AND MARINE CORPS PERSONNEL ELIGIBLE FOR THIS PRIVILEGE WHO AT TIME OF INCIDENCE OF DISEASE OR INJURY FOR WHICH HOSPITALIZED ARE ELIGIBLE UNDER OPNAV INSTRUCTION 2700.4 OF 10 AUG 51 FOR FREE MAILING PRIVILEGES X PERSONNEL OF ARMY AND AIR FORCE HOSPITALIZED IN NAVAL HOSPITALS ELIGIBLE IN ACCORDANCE, INSTRUCTIONS ISSUED BY RESPECTIVE DEPTS WHICH CONFORM IN

1. Reference (a) issues instructions for the use of the Air Freight and Passenger Section services. References (b) and (c) are hereby cancelled.

2. In order to clarify the Standard Operating Procedure for the Air Freight and Passenger Section the procedures explained herein will be covered under separate general headings:

a. Reports and Forms

(1) DISPATCHES: A daily coded dispatch will be sent from each Air Freight and Passenger Unit showing the number of personnel, pounds of cargo and destination at each station to be moved during the following day's operation. This dispatch will be as of 1100 daily and will be submitted as soon thereafter as communication facilities permit, it will be given Operational Priority precedence. The dispatch will be sent to the Commanding General, 1st Marine Air Wing, and info to all Air Freight and Passenger Units.

(a) The Marine Command, which is responsible for the communication facilities at his location will handle the dispatch traffic of the Air Freight and Passenger Unit located at his field.

(b) Dispatch reports will be written using the following code system:

ABLE - Destination - number of passengers - priority.
BAKER - Destination - pounds of cargo - priority.
CHARLIE - Destination - number of evacuees, priority one.
DOG - This item for cargo that must be carried by C-119- destination - number of pieces - total weight and cube - priority - outside dimensions of any piece exceeding sixty inches in any dimension - description if practicable.

(2) Navy Bill Of Lading, S and A Form 700 (Encl 1).

(a) Navy Bill of Lading, S and A Form 700 is available through regular Navy Supply channels. This form will be used in requesting all cargo shipments and will be signed and delivered in accordance with paragraphs 10 and 11 of reference (a).

(3) Form No. AFP-5, enclosure (2) will be compiled by the Air Freight and Passenger Unit with copies as follows:

(a) One copy to the Assistant Chief of Staff, G-4.
 (b) One copy to the receiving Air Freight and Passenger Unit.
 (c) One copy retained in the originating Air Freight and Passenger Unit.
 (d) One copy, with necessary copies of all applicable S and A delivery, the receiving activity will complete the Consignee's Certificate of Delivery on the bottom of the form. This receipt copy will be retained by the pilot and returned as follows:

1. RSD deliveries will be returned for filing to the Air Freight and Passenger Unit, Itani.
2. RAD deliveries will be returned to the Air Freight and Passenger Unit, K-1.

(e) The remaining copies to be used by the Air Freight Officer at the delivery point to obtain receipts from the consignee.

(4) AFP-4, enclosure (3), will be signed and submitted in accordance with paragraph 11 of reference (a).

(5) AFP-7, enclosure (4), will be compiled by the Air Freight and Passenger Unit Officer from the approved AFP-4 forms with original and three copies to be distributed as follows:

(a) One copy to the Assistant Chief of Staff, G-4.
 (b) One copy to Air Freight and Passenger Unit file.
 (c) Original to crew chief of the aircraft assigned the lift.

(6) AFP-12 will be completed by each Air Freight and Passenger Unit Office and forwarded to the Assistant Chief of Staff, G-4, prior to the tenth day of the following month. This report must include all aircraft loaded.

b. SCHEDULING: The above requests for air movement which are reflected in the daily dispatch, also covered above, are used for the basis of scheduling all aircraft assigned to Air Freight service. Upon receipt of these dispatches the schedule for the following day will be released in dispatch form to all concerned with the receipt or delivery of cargo or personnel. Prior to release, this schedule will be approved by both the Assistant Chief of Staff, G-3, and the Assistant Chief of Staff, G-4. Flight personnel will be assigned by the officers in charge of the aircraft furnished for Air Freight duty.

c. LOADING: One crew member will be present during all loading and unloading operations. It is the responsibility of the Air Freight Unit to load and secure all cargo and to provide for seating of all passengers. Final approval of all loading and security measures are the responsibility of the plane commander and if so requested by him, the load will be modified accordingly.

1STMAW MEMORANDUM 187-51 (Cont'd)

d. Officer Messenger Mail and Courier Mail.

- (1) The senior command on each airfield utilizing Air Freight services will provide one (1) man for duty with the Air Freight and Passenger Unit to handle all Courier and Officer Messenger Mail..
- (2) The subject man must be cleared to handle Secret and Confidential mail but will not be authorized to sign for Registered U. S. Postal Mail.
- (3) This man will be responsible for the security of classified mail while being held at the Air Freight and Passenger Unit.
- (4) He will keep on file, signed receipts of incoming and outgoing Courier and Officer Messenger Mail.
- (5) This duty may be performed by Officer Messenger Mail Centers on airfields where such centers exist.
- (6) On stations where Air Freight and Passenger Units do not exist the senior command will arrange to have a qualified courier and Officer Messenger Mail representative meet each incoming aircraft and receive from or deliver to the pilot any applicable mail.
- (7) All courier and Officer Messenger Mail will be included on the cargo manifest by pouch number, weight, and destination.

e. POSTAL MAIL

- (1) The post office will be notified immediately upon arrival of all incoming mail and will be responsible for pickup. The Postal Officer will keep the Air Freight Unit informed on the quantity, type and destination of mail to be airlifted.

f. General Information

- (1) A blackboard with an up-to-date schedule must be maintained at all times in each Air Freight Unit. It must be large enough for miscellaneous information concerning loading of aircraft and estimated arrivals and departures of all aircraft assigned for Air Freight duty.
- (2) All equipment assigned to the Air Freight and Passenger Unit will be kept in top operating condition at all times and any discrepancies in the condition of the equipment will be corrected immediately.
- (3) The Air Freight and Passenger Unit must arrange for or furnish transportation for pilots, crews, and passengers to Base Operations and mess.
- (4) Plane commanders will act as Air Freight and Passenger Unit Officers at terminals where no Air Freight and Passenger Unit exists and will comply with reference (a) and this memorandum in executing these duties.

1. Previously issued instructions regarding Historical Reports are cancelled and superseded by this General Order.
2. Standard Historical Reports shall be rendered by the 1st Marine Air Wing and its subordinate units in accordance with references (a) through (e) and this General Order.
3. Paragraph 2 (a) of reference (c) shall be complied with by all units. Officers assigned as Unit Historical Officers shall be reported by memorandum to the Historical Officer, 1st Marine Air Wing.
4. The Wing Historical Officer will be responsible for keeping the Wing Historical SOP current.
5. MONTHLY REPORTS. Units of this command shall submit Type B Reports (Historical Diaries) monthly in accordance with references (a) through (e) and the following instructions:
 - a. Monthly Type B Reports shall be completed by all units by the 15th of the following month and will be forwarded to the Commandant of the Marine Corps via channels. Units will submit their reports via the group to which attached at the end of the month, the Commanding General, 1st Marine Air Wing, and the Commanding General, Fleet Marine Force, Pacific.
 - b. Copies will be sent to the following: The Commander-in-Chief, Pacific Fleet; the Commander, Naval Forces, Far East; the Commanding General, Aircraft, Fleet Marine Force, Pacific; Pacific Fleet Evaluation Group, 5 ComNavFFE, Navy #1165 (2 copies); Pacific Fleet Evaluation Group, Cinc Pac Flt (3 copies); the unit exercising operational control; and the unit previously exercising administrative control if that has changed during the month.
 - c. The Type B Historical Report shall contain a detailed day-to-day record of the unit's operations as well as copies of important directives, maps, photographs, and other pertinent material which will be referenced in the diary and attached as appendices. In the case of tactical squadrons, the daily entries will show the total number of sorties broken down into types (close air support, search and attack, etc.), the total number of combat hours, flights other than combat, and the number of non-combat hours. A brief summary of each flight will be given showing number of planes, time and place, type of mission, how controlled, the particular ground unit supported, enemy opposition, and results observed. These squadrons shall also append a statistical summary of the month's operations showing personnel assigned, personnel lost (by name), number of aircraft assigned at the end of the month,

aircraft lost (by type and bureau number), average aircraft availability, average pilot availability, the total number of individual flights, total hours flown, total combat sorties, total combat hours, a summary of damage inflicted on the enemy, and the expenditure of ammunition.

d. All units shall attach a station list to the report.

e. Recapitulation forms, similar to those previously distributed by the Wing Historical Officer, shall be completed and appended to the monthly diaries by all units having tactical aircraft in this command.

f. Tactical units such as the Flight Section, Headquarters, 1st Marine Air Wing; VMF-6; and HMR-161, shall each submit a similar recapitulation that appropriately reflects the activities of the unit.

6. SEMI-ANNUAL REPORTS. Semi-Annual Historical Reports shall be rendered in accordance with reference (b), placing particular emphasis upon paragraph 7 of enclosure (1) to reference (b). Paragraph 7 is quoted below for compliance:

"7. SUBMISSION.

a. The historical report shall be prepared every six months and be submitted one month after the termination of the period covered. The historical period is considered to be from 1 January to 30 June and from 1 July to 31 December of each year.

b. Historical reports shall be submitted under covering letter directly to the Office of the Chief of Naval Operations (Aviation History and Research Section). Marine Corps aviation activities shall at the same time forward a copy through the chain of command to the Commandant of the Marine Corps.

c. Marine Corps aviation activities, at such time as they may be required to submit Historical Diaries (Type B Reports) in accordance with Marine Corps Manual, Paragraph 11401, shall at the end of the historical period submit copies of Type B Reports in lieu of OPMV Report 575.1 together with a covering letter directly to the Office of the Chief of Naval Operations (Aviation History and Research Section). For periods or portions of periods during which they are not required to submit Type B Reports, Marine Corps aviation activities shall comply with instructions in Paragraph 7 (b) above."

7. OCCLASIONAL REPORTS. Type C Reports (Special) shall be rendered in accordance with the provisions of references (a) through (c), placing particular emphasis upon references (d) and (e) and the following instructions:

a. Type C Reports shall be submitted to the Commandant of the Marine Corps via official channels.

b. Recommendations made in Type C Reports shall be made the subject of comments by each succeeding echelon of command.

c. To insure more efficient organization of the reports, units submitting Type C Reports shall make liberal use of headings and subheadings in compiling their reports.

d. Recommendations made in Type C Reports shall be listed under a separate heading titled "Recommendations."

8. Units submitting historical reports shall insure that all reports are compiled in accordance with the following additional instructions:

- a. The contents of mimeographed reports, including the appendices, shall be completely legible.
- b. Each historical report must include a table of contents.
- c. Each section, annex, and the appendix shall contain an individual title page which identifies the contents of that particular part of the historical report.
- d. If a section, annex, or appendix is attached to the original copy only of the historical report, that information must be included as a note in the table of contents, on the individual title page, or in some similar manner.
- e. The different sections, annexes, and appendices of each historical report shall be indicated by tabs attached thereto.
- f. The original and each copy of the historical report shall be bound separately so that they will not come apart enroute.

1. References (a) and (b) are hereby cancelled.
2. Emergency leave may be granted to personnel attached to this command when:
 - a. Serious illness of a member of the immediate family or dependent relative exists which requires the immediate presence of the person concerned.
 - b. Death of a member of the immediate family or dependent relative which requires the presence of the person concerned in connection with the settlement of the estate or other matters for which no other member of the family is in a position to act.
 - c. Martial difficulties or other matters of an extreme personal nature which, because of their seriousness, may affect the mental attitude of the individual in the performance of his duty, and whereby his presence is necessary in order to settle the matter on a permanent or legal basis, particularly where minor children are involved.
 - d. Private financial emergencies and/or civil court matters whereby the individual, unless present temporarily, may suffer a substantial financial loss or his interests would be jeopardized.
3. When personnel request emergency leave, Commanding Officers are directed to take the following action:
 - a. Assure that it is a true emergency, based on facts available and verification by the Red Cross, or other reliable sources.
 - b. When verified by the Red Cross, or other reliable sources, originate correspondence to the Commanding General, 1st Marine Air Wing, FMF (G-1) stating that emergency leave has been authorized.
 - c. If verification is lacking and, in the opinion of the Commanding Officer, a true emergency exists, the situation will be referred to the Commanding General, 1st Marine Air Wing, FMF (G-1) for final action.
4. The below listed information will be included in the Commanding Officer's letter or endorsement requesting the emergency leave:
 - a. Leave address of person concerned.
 - b. Leave balance as of the last fiscal accounting period and any leave taken since that date, as shown in the service record of person concerned.
 - c. Overseas control date.
 - d. Category and date assigned extended active duty in the case of all reserves.
5. The below action will be taken by the Commanding Officers of carrier based squadrons when they have determined that an emergency exists in accordance with the provisions outlined in paragraph 2 above.

a. Dispatch the Commanding General, with information copy to Commanding Officer, Marine Wing Service Squadron 1, stating the nature of the emergency and their recommendations.

b. Send the person involved on temporary additional duty to Marine Wing Service Squadron 1, Itami Air Force Base, Itami, Japan awaiting action on his request. Information listed in paragraph 4 above will be included in temporary additional duty orders.

6. Upon receipt of dispatch, the Commanding General will notify the Commanding Officer, Marine Wing Service Squadron 1 of either approval or disapproval, with information copy to Commanding Officer originating request. If approved, the message will authorize the Commanding Officer, Marine Wing Service Squadron 1 to write emergency leave orders.

7. Pay Cards of personnel granted emergency leave should be entrusted to their care when reporting to this Headquarters for orders. This action will permit personnel to continue to Japan upon receipt of orders, saving time and unnecessary travel.

- a. ROKA liaison officers will be assigned to organizations of this Wing by means of written orders issued by this headquarters. Each officer will be issued an identification card to be carried at all times.
- b. Commanding Officers will report breaches of military discipline on the part of ROKA officers via this headquarters.
- c. Recommendations for promotion of liaison officers will be submitted to headquarters Republic of Korea Army via this headquarters.
- d. Recommendations for awards for liaison officers will be submitted to this headquarters.
- e. Emergency leave orders will be issued only by this headquarters upon written request.
- f. In order to facilitate the identity of the rank of liaison officers, they are authorized to wear Marine Corps insignia of rank while assigned to this Wing.

2. Listed below are duties to be performed by the ROKA liaison officers while assigned to this command:

- a. Effect security among Korean employees and indigenous personnel on this base and in the immediate surrounding area, conducting such investigations as may be required.
- b. Assist labor officers of this command in supervising and controlling indigenous employees.
- c. Serve as interpreters in all matters between this command and the Government of Korea and the Republic of Korea Army, Navy or Air Force.
