THE CORPORATION.

The Mayor (Mr J. M. Casey) presided at a meeting of the City Council on Thursday night.

The Manager (Mr T. C. O'Mahony) said that the Corporation had authorised the raising of a loan of £2,000 for the carrying out of improvements. Having regard to an amended estimate it would be necessary to increase that amount to £2,350.

On the proposition of Mr Donnellan, it was decided to raise a loan for that amount.

Mr Hartney referred to the condition of the footpaths in the Edward street district, and said that they were a positive disgrace. He had repeatedly urged to have the footpaths repaired, but his appeals had been in vain.

Alderman Reidy, T.D., said that the night scavenging system in the lower part of the city had proved to be an absolute failure. The cars went around at the dead of night, creating such noise that the working class people could not sleep.

Alderman D. Bourke, T.D., said that he agreed with Mr Hartney's complaint, but it should be remembered that the City Surveyor could not deal with all the footpaths at once.

The Mayor, referring to Ald. Reidy's complaint, said that the matter would receive the attention of the City Surveyor.

The Manager read a letter (already published) from Mr Dermot O'Brien, President Hibernian Academy, thanking the Council for the honour they had done him in making him a Freeman of Limerick. He would attend the meeting of the Council for the purpose of signing the roll.

The Mayor said it would be advisable to summon a special meeting for the purpose of signing the roll.

Ald. Reidy—That would be the proper course to adopt, but I would suggest that the Bard of Thomond Memorial Committee be consulted before definite arrangements are made.

Mayor—Very well, I will do that.

THE FINANCIAL POSITION.

Arising out of the consideration of the monthly financial statement, Ald. Reidy said that the late Acting Manager had given up undertaking to supply more details, and that had not been done.

Manager—I will submit a report on the question at next meeting.

Ald. Reidy—I notice from the return that a sum of £9,415 has been discharged as irrevocable. Who did that?

Assistant Town Clerk (Mr Conlan)—The late Acting Manager.

Ald. Reidy—Are not finances a reserved service?

Law Agent (Mr Dundon)—In my opinion the Manager has the right to deal with irrevocable rates.

Mr Bourke said that it would be an extraordinary thing if the Manager could discharge irrevocable rates, while at the same time the Council were responsible for striking the rate.

Mr Keyes, T.D., said that the Law Agent should give his considered opinion on that section of the Act dealing with finances.

Law Agent—I will submit a report to the next meeting.

Ald. Reidy asked why the revenue account showed a debit balance of £4,965.

Assistant Town Clerk—It is at this period of the year loan charges are paid.
