Two Mighty Soviet Armies Complete Encirclement; Nazi Propagandists Continue to Promise Reinforcements to Nazi Forces.

Washington, April 25.—(AP)—The Russian troops battled against weakening Nazi resistance in the center of flanking Berlin today, as the German high command announced that a Soviet wing west of the capital had driven to Rathenow, 14 1/2 miles from American positions on the west bank of the Elbe. The advance to Rathenow, an optical instrument manufacturing center on the Havel river, represented a 23 1/2-mile gain westward for the Russians from Nauen, the front dispatches said. Soviet of the Red Army today are fighting in the heart of German capital, said a Fast report dated Berlin.
