Washington, July 12.—(AP)—The Senate passed 62 to 15 today an OPA Revival bill that had been denuded of almost as many major price controls as it promised to restore.

Final passage came at 1:55 P. M. (S.A.T.) on the thirtieth day of OPA's lapse into legal coma. Approval was the original intent of the President when he signed the act on July 1, 1945.
