Hartford, Dec. 31.—Will to right closing hours of 1949 bring high traffic accident experience with many personal injuries and some deaths, or will highway users coast through until midnight, at least, and ensure Connecticut's establishing its lowest traffic mortality experience for all time?

"Call it 'holiday haze' or 'holiday daze' or any other term desired, there still remained the fact that highway use on such occasions as New Year's Eve and New Year's Day involves unusually high accident experience," says the Commission's bulletin, offering comment based on statistics furnished by the Department of Motor Vehicles.

But, where Saturday is the last day of the year with preparations for New Year's Eve parties or premature celebration, accident experience mounts rapidly.

"Ordinarily the average Saturday traffic accident experience will mean about 90 to 100 traffic accidents," states the bulletin.
