The minutes of the Town Board Meeting of April 18, 1973 were approved as submitted.

Supervisor Powers stated would like to start meeting with a statement from the Supervisor. I was appalled by County Manager Morin's proposal to establish a landfill in Black Creek Park. This represents an irreversible and irrecoverable commitment of natural resources. Mr. Morin's proposal made known to me only on this Monday afternoon exemplifies the secrecy surrounding this entire package that in no way depicts statesmanship. His proposal is a complete change from Erdman and Anthony's report on the Black Creek Site which even our legislators are not familiar with. That report was based upon the promise the County would use a quadrant system for solid waste disposal. That report indicated 50-55 acres to be used for landfill, it is now 75 acres, that report indicated vehicular traffic at about 40 trucks per day, it is now 110. That report indicated no cost figures, it is incomplete. No new data was or has been made available to this Supervisor on Mr. Morin's latest proposal other than the limited information we were able to secure during a hurriedly called meeting today, Monday, but the County Manager. Many technical questions remain unanswered. Mr. Grant, Director of County Parks, condones this proposal on one hand while roaching out with the other for monies from the recently passed Environmental Bond Issue for Open Space of Conservation lands. The County forbids use of County Parks for snowmobiling, but yet has under consideration the use of park land for a landfill. The ultimate use benefit derived from this site, namely recreation, does not justify the creation of a landfill. I think it becomes imperative and increasingly so, that we preserve for public use open spaces such as this park. Thus, I'm asking your support of the following resolution:

#202 RESOLUTION OFFERED BY SUPERVISOR POWERS

BE IT RESOLVED that the Town Board of the Town of Chili is unalterably opposed to the proposed County Landfill site in Black Creek Park AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chili Environmental and Conservation Commission prepare a brief giving detailed reasons why this site is unacceptable AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chili Environmental and Conservation Commission be instructed to work on a continuum basis with your Supervisor and Town Board and the State Department of Environmental Conservation AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a letter be sent to each County Legislator asking they not support this proposal when presented to that body for approval AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Town Attorney be requested to initiate any legal action necessary to block this proposal AND FURTHER RESOLVED that area State Legislators be asked to assist us in our stand against this proposal. Supervisor Powers read the following reports from Paul Duff and Dave Pupo of the Conservation Commission:

PROPOSED BLACK CREEK PARK LANDFILL ANALYSIS

The inception of a sanitary landfill represents an irreversible and irrecoverable commitment of natural resources. It is incumbent on the Chill Conservation Commission to examine any commitment of this nature and to specifically evaluate the environmental impact incurred by the initiation of a landfill operation in Black Creek Park.

On the basis of a purely philosophical reaction, it is the consensus of the commission that the use of a county park for landfill operations appears to be a questionable course of action. The following is a brief summary of the history and rationale used by Monroe County Officials to justify the use of Black Creek Park.

The County of Monroe is faced with a July 15th closing date of the Rush landfill site. To provide an interim or short range solution to this deadline, a short range plan was developed. The creation of several new landfill sites would allegedly provide an interim (2 - 5 years) solution to the problem of solid waste disposal for residue generated on a county-wide basis. During this interim period, a long range program would be developed for tile solid waste problem. The most recent long range proposal is the purchase and installation of the American Can Company's resource recovery system. While the long range plan will reduce the amount of non-recoverable wastes, there will still be a necessity for landfill sites (this point is often played down by proponents of the "Americology" system).

Black Creek Park has been nominated as one of the short term landfill sites, buying the County time so they can implement the long range solution. Partial justification for using park lands includes an alleged "ultimate use" benefit that would be derived from the sites' operation. A recreational hill will be created by mounding the garbage on an already elevated drumlin, and an artificial lake will be created by removal of soil from an adjacent marshy area of the park. The use of this earth will serve as daily cover material for the landfill operation. It should be noted here that the creation of an artificial land and tile generation of a recreational hill could both be accomplished WITHOUT THE OPERATION OF A LANDFILL IN THE PARK.

An important point to be noted at this point is that the value of this area as a park CEASES during the operational period (2 - 5 years) of the landfill. NO one would want, nor would they be allowed to enter the premises for recreational purposes because of the movement of heavy machinery and other activity at and around the landfill operation.

The Conservation Commission realizes that it is an accepted practice to upgrade low quality land areas by conducting sanitary landfill operations with the ultimate intention of deriving an "ultimate use" benefit greater than would be possible without the fill operation. It is our opinion that Black Creek Park is not such a case. Even though money has not been allocated to develop the park land, leaving the area in its natural state has provided many people with the opportunity of enjoying scenic nature in an undisturbed state. If action is not taken now to preserve for public use open spaces such as this park, land would diminish at an alarming rate. We in America have an overwhelming desire to "Do Something" with an area, feeling that if we don't it won't serve any real value. A short walk through the so-called "undeveloped" Black Creek Park should permanently dispel this notion. Again, based on our philosophical reaction to the proposal for a landfill operation in the park, we feel it would establish a precedent of questionable judgement.

Addressing the technical problems associated with a landfill site in Black Creek Park, several serious questions are raised:

1. Will the water quality of the adjacent streams (Mill and Black Creek) and the ground water itself be polluted by leachate from the fill? An Erdman and Anthony report specifically stated that the ground water level at the perimeter of the fill area is high (1 to 5 feet from the surface). The report further states that any raw leachate will migrate directly into Mill Creek and have a deleterious effect on its water quality. The concern of local residents on the quality of leachate attenuating from the fill area is valid, as almost all these people depend on well 16 for their water supply.

2. The very selection of a site in such close proximity to Black Creek and Mill Creek seems to increase the probability for these waterways to become contaminated by an accidental leakage of raw leachate.

3. Is the amount of earth contained in the lowland area sufficient to provide the necessary 6" of daily cover material for the total period of site operation?

4. Can the County drive trucks on a road designated for an eight ton gross limit when the transfer vehicles themselves weigh almost nine tons empty?

5. Is the County willing to specify a specific period of time after which the site operation will be terminated?

6. Is the site geologically sound enough for the County to secure the necessary approval by the State Department of Environmental Conservation before the area can be used for a landfill operation?

7. Is the site capable of handling the increased load based on the most recent proposal by the County Manager? The first Erdman and Anthony report evaluated the capacity of the area based on the implementation of the original quadrant plan. The new report issued by Erdman and Anthony significantly increases both vehicular traffic to the fill [obviously increases the tonnage that must be handled].

As stated in the beginning of this report, landfill represents an irreversible and irrevocable commitment of our natural resources. The above questions raise valid points that demand serious and factual answers.

POINTS CONCERNING THE LOCATION  
OF A  
SANITARY LANDFILL IN BLACK CREEK PARK

1. Environmental Assessment of a Sanitary landfill in Black Creek Park, Town of Chill dated 19 October, 1972, prepared by Erdman and Anthony states its evaluation was based on a site utilizing 55 acres of land and a 200 acre lake will be created by dredging wetlands to provide cover material for the landfill. As of 1 May 73 the acreage has been increased to 75 acres at the fill site and the lake size to 350 acres as stated by the Monroe County Manager. Studies concerning Environmental Impact were only prepared on the smaller site. Just how large a landfill will this be in 5 years time?

2. Complete testing of all sites still have not been accomplished as stated on page 20 of Engineers Report by Erdman and Anthony. Parts of the test sites are still too wet to obtain complete results. Will all test results ever be obtained?

3. Tests were run in the fall and winter seasons only. Why were they not run in the spring season when ground water is highest and possible leachate contamination will occur?
4. The ground water surface of the site is quite high. It varies from 1 to 8 feet. All homeowners in the area south of Black Creek rely on ground well for their water supply. Some wells in the immediate area are even now of QUESTIONABLE QUALITY. Most wells are in the depth range of 24 to 30 feet with the water rising to a height of 12 to 17 feet below ground in the well casing. The possibility of ANY LEACHATE leaking from the landfill may seriously effect the quality of well water in the area. Can we be guaranteed this will NEVER happen?
5. WILL HAZARDOUS WASTE materials determined to be toxic by the Secretary of Health, Education and Welfare pursuant to Section 20 (6) of the Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1970 be included in this landfill? What guarantee will be have to prevent usage of this hazardous waste either intentional or accidental?
6. WILL INFECTIOUS WASTE materials such as those disposed of by dentists hospitals, animal hospitals and laboratories that may be committed harbor or transmit pathogenic organisms to this landfill where Mill Creek runs very close to its site? Engineers Report Indicates ANY LEAKAGE OF LEACHATE will contaminate Mill Creek which flows in an area where there are many children.
7. Will the site and operation meet the Federal Guidelines as provided by the Solid Waste Disposal Act (Section 211) and the Office of Solid Waste Management Programs of the Federal EPA?
8. The Engineering Report Indicates many preparations that SHOULD be done properly, if possible, in this site. Will they?
9. The Environmental Assessment of Proposed Sanitary Landfill in Black Creek Park stated under the ANIMAL AND PLANT LIFE section that it discovered that the Great Blue Heron makes its habitat in the Park. They indicate no operations will be allowed near these rare and endangered species to insure that they are not disturbed.  
 Dr. Neal Moon of the Genesee Ornithological Society precautions indicated by the findings of the Environmental Assessment will be sufficient. The blue heron is a migratory bird that is very sensitive and wary of people. The noise and vibration created by the many large trucks (over 100 per day) and the dozers and other equipment required to operate a landfill will undoubtedly disturb these birds to the extent that they will permanently leave the area.

Mr. Pietropaoli stated would like for the record to state that the notice of this hearing was duly published in a legal newspaper designated by this Town Board in the Town of Chili and affidavits of such publication are on file with Mrs. Robbins, the Town Clerk. Correct Mrs. Robbins? Mrs. Robbins stated yes.

Mr. Robert Schoenberger of Sear Brown appeared. Stated with him tonight, Otto Layer, the dovoiper. Proposal seek tonight for formation of drainage district which will serve Section 6 of Lexington Subdivision. Outlines on final map in color. Shown on overall scheme of things as darkened area. Connects onto Section 5 presently under construction, namely Battle Green Drive and sub-streets. Other sections over here. Developed 3 and 4 and 1 and 2 to the north. Proposal as far as drainage concerned quite simple. Bordered on west side by existing drainage channel which proceeds to the south. Improved some years ago as part of conditions of final approval which required to be concrete liner in bottom of channel where subdivision does abut. Met with Mr. Chudyk and Mr. Mannara in field to discuss implications of that concrete liner in reference to previous section and sees no problem with that. Drainage will be gathered within subdivision and be dispersed at point at south-west corner. Final plans indicate 24" pipe to the east which will provide ample capacity to handle drainage to the east. Not water-locking or land-locking property to the east because natural low area and does come into this section. Thinks pretty well explains technical points.

Supervisor Powers stated at end of Gaunton Drive, extension of Battle Green, couple of pretty good sized pipes come in. Asked going to remain as they are? Headwall or anything? Mr. Schoenberger stated two end sections but filling needs to be done. Banks will be cut to one on tiree slope. Will be ripped immediately in front of end sections in where liner starts. Discussed in field today. Mr. Layer stated primarily because of gutters not all in on Battle Green and existing sewer not picking up.

Supervisor Powers asked three on one slope satisfactory? Mr. Schoenberger stated on side of channel, yes. Multiple slope. Supervisor Powers asked both sides! Mr. Schoenberger stated right. Supervisor Powers asked sleeper than usually go? Mr. Mannara stated three on one is right

Supervisor Powers asked how far concrete gutter runs, as far as Section 3? Mr. Schoenberger stated last lot in section 6. Still some remaining to be built in front of culverts speaking of and continue down to this point. Supervisor Powers asked beyond where 3 comes in? Mr. Layer stated plan to do when do Section 5 final, bring that down beyond Section 5 to the intersection of ditch coming in from 3. Actually 5 stops here but at time doing, might as well bring down and hook in and when do 6 will be from this point to this point so everything there now will be hooked in before do this section at all.

Supervisor Powers asked going to do any cleaning of ditch beyond 6? Mr. Layer stated if necessary. Cleaned out through here last fall so could get good drainage in this area. In this area, probably know putting in new relief sewer through there and one of the agreements has with them is that they rake sure any place disturb existing drainage channel they will open and clear. Couple areas will probably be straightened because easement for that sewer pretty closely follows drainage area and will have to move channel a little. Good fall from here down so no reason why problem from end of this section on down through. been working fine.

Supervisor Powers stated still have sections 3 and 4 to get off the books. Still having a problem there. Doesn't want to get horse too far ahead of the cart. Mr. Layer stated met with Mr. Chudyk and Mr. Mannara this afternoon and discussed west end of that Section 3 ditch. Agreed how going to be done and Simmons going to be in next week to start on 5 and do that end of 3. When had final inspection on 4 this afternoon and did road inspection on 3 so believes knows items necessary to be corrected in order to dedicate roads in 3 and final inspection for 4. Supervisor Powers asked how soon? Mr. Layer stated a few aprons around storm inlets have cracked and replacement of those. Basically things in 3 and 4 in addition to end of ditch.

Councilman Callahan stated if recalls conversation talking 5 and 6. When do 5 which is here tonight go for the current drainage to lot 265 and when do Sec. 6 continue to lot 2687 Mr. Schoenberger stated shouldn't confuse Sec. 5, up here and 6 is what currently processing. However drainage district for Sec. 6 is extension 5. Small amount of concrete liner to be constructed with 5 and some for 3. Will be extended at that time down to this point. To where Sec. 3 drainage ditch which runs along south property line discharges. When subdivision Sec. 6 served by Extension 5 is actually physically constructed balance of concrete liner will be extended from where Smith/Lexington ditch intersects to the last lot.

Councilman Callahan asked around the inside of your lots like 276, 77, going outward and south 282, 83, 84. what is backyard drainage? Sees drainage easement but... Mr. Schoenberger stated sorry doesn't have grading plan with him tonight. Councilman Callahan asked pipe system? Mr. Schoenberger stated swale in back toward front, has been reviewed by Mr. Mannara. doesn't have plan tonight. Supervisor Powers asked swale to the south to that pipe that comes back to sewers? Mr. Schoenberger stated swale side of lines to the front. If inlet required would have put in. 24" storm sewer between 285 and 286 will be continued over to serve land over here which would not have stream or other means of drainage in future. Providing capacity to accommodate that.

Supervisor Powers asked have easement along east side of 282-2871 Mr. Schoenberger stated 10 ft drainage easement along rear lines on all lots. Councilman Callahan stated thinks question leading up to between 275 and 769 in that section has easement 20 ft. wide plus if read correctly has some kind of sewer down through there. Mr. Schoenberger stated that is Town requirement to have easement whether swale or not. That is just absolute requirement whether used or not. Town wants easement along rear property line. Councilman Gray asked if Engineer satisfied with all conditions? Mr. Mannara stated settled last few problems today.

Section 2. The plan for the financing of such maximum estimated cost is as follows:

- (a) By the expenditure of \$42,000 to be provided from available current funds; and
- (b) By the issuance of 173,000 serial bonds of said Town, hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local finance law.

Section 3. It is hereby determined that the period of probable usefulness of the aforesaid specific object or purpose is thirty years, pursuant to subdivision 21 (a) of paragraph a of Section

11.00 of the Local Finance Law. It is hereby further determined that the maximum maturity of the serial bonds herein authorized will not exceed five years.

Section 4. The faith and credit of said Town of Chill, Monroe County, New York, are hereby irrevocably pledged to the payment of the principal of and interest on such obligations as the same respectively become due and payable. An annual appropriation shall be made in each year sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such obligations becoming due and payable in such year. There shall annually be levied on all the taxable real property in said Town a tax sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such obligations as the same become due and payable.

Section 5. Subject to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, the power to authorize the issuance of and to sell bond anticipation notes in anticipation of the issuance and sale of the serial bonds herein authorized, including renewals of such notes, is hereby delegated to the Supervisor, the chief fiscal officer. Such notes shall be of such terms, form and contents, and shall be sold in such manner, as may be prescribed by said Supervisor, consistent with the provisions of the Local Finance Law.

Section 6. The validity of such bonds and bond anticipation notes may be contested only if:

- (1) Such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which said Town is not authorized to expend money, or
- (2) The provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of publication of this resolution are not substantially complied with,

and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within twenty days after the date of publication, or

- (3) Such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the Constitution.

Section 7. The resolution heretofore adopted by the Town Board of said Town on June 20, 1973 authorizing the acquisition and financing of the aforesaid land, is hereby repealed and superceded.

Section 8. This resolution, which takes effect immediately, shall be published in full in the Suburban News, the official newspaper, together with a notice of the Town Clerk in substantially the form provided in Section 81.00 of the Local Finance Law.

A Public Hearing was held by the Town Board of the Town of Chili in the Chili Administration Offices, 3235 Chili Avenue, on July 11, 1973 at 8:15 P.M. for the purpose of amending the Swimming Pool ordinance of the Town of Chili, Chapter 14, Code of the Town of Chili (see legal notice attached).

Roll Call: Supervisor Powers, Councilman Callahan, Councilman Criddle, Councilman O'Connor, Councilman Gray.

Also Present: Deputy Town Clerk Mrs. Burke, Mr. Chudyk, Mr. Pietropaoli, Mr. Heilman, Mr. Mannara, Mr. Vall

Mr. Pietropaoli stated have affidavits of publication on file and would like to make statement for the record that proposed amendment to the ordinance has duly advertised in the Suburban News, one of the official newspapers of the Town of Chili and meets all requirements pursuant to State Law for the purpose of amending the Code of the Town of Chili.

Supervisor Powers stated section referring to in particular Section 14-4 location. Section A, #2 and #3, to read at least 10 feet from any side yard line and rear yard line and at least 10 feet from the house basement for an above-ground pool and Inground pool to remain 15 feet from the house basement. Any questions on these? Might say that the 10 feet will be applicable and better fit all of our residential districts. During months of April, May and June the Zoning Board is inclined to get inundated with requests for variances and these variances not specifically for any one particular district. Have come in regardless of E, E or D and Ihs would take considerable load off Zoning Board. Believes one night agenda read about 23 and 80% requests for variances with regards to pool setback and with this in mind, thinks we should make the change. Doesn't think going to hurt esthetics of any particular district.

Councilman Criddle asked reducing the distances from 15 feet, believes? Mr. Pietropaoli stated reducing distances for above-ground pool to 10 feet from 15 feet from basement of house. Inground will remain same but had to revise because of wording of ordinance, inground still has to remain 15 feet away. Mr. Mannara and Mr. Chudyk studied and better practice to put that amount of waiver if inground at least 15 feet away from house. Councilman Callahan asked have any recommendations or anybody have recommendations in writing from Planning Board or Zoning Board on this? Normally get recommendations to make change from somebody. Mr. Heilman stated thinks Mr. Davis was gentleman at meetings who felt this was quite appropriate. Part of the problem, people don't realize ordinance and get into contractual deal and have to have pool put in by such and such day and problems and have to first come before Board that meets once a month and time-limit to get application in to be published. Suffering hardship. Mr. Davis felt would be no problem in giving that close. At least that is what he has said at meetings.

Mr. Pietropaoli stated Mr. Davis indicated ordinance should be changed and communicated that to Supervisor Powers and that is why changing. Mr. Heilman stated Zoning Board approved every application, no reservations. Councilman Callahan stated not saying against but when change ordinance should have something to substantiate change other than own thinking. Councilman O'Connor stated advertised public hearing and set at prior meeting as far as advance notice concerned. Councilman Callahan stated can have public hearing on anything. Should have something in writing to substantiate reason for change. Right now nothing in writing except our own thinking. Mr. Pietropaoli stated this Board doesn't require anything in writing to change ordinance. No Town Board requires. Asking something not required by law. There has been oral communication not only from Zoning Board members, Deputy Town Attorney, but also your Superintendent of Building and Engineer has checked out. Ought to stop at Zoning Board meeting and would understand problems. Councilman Callahan stated has been there to Zoning Board, not in here to Judge whether have been here or not. Supervisor Powers stated not seen there in 3 years.

Councilman Callahan stated thinks should have some proof other than verbal. Councilman Grey stated thinks may be right and what could do at this point is enter Mr. Mannara's statement into official record that Town Engineer has made recommendation and that would take care of this. Councilman Callahan stated perfectly fine. One point, matter of order, wondering, doesn't know what has happened, but two or three people have talked to me about their own pools, several above-ground pools broken and water has gone all over. Do you feel, Mr. Mannara, that 10 feet from any basement for above-ground pool satisfactory? Mr. Mannara stated could mound dirt up close to structure. Only reason ask for 15 feet on below ground, too close to the footings. No reason why same pool could not be put within 5 feet of structure if made of reinforced concrete fine, never know. That is why set 15 feet.

Councilman Criddle asked if someone came in for variance on In-ground pool of poured concrete, could build closer to the foundation? Mr. Mannara stated right, poured, reinforced concrete. Mr. Pietropaoli stated would have to satisfy Zoning Board that had hardship. Councilman Criddle asked specific requirement or something? Mr. Pietropaoli stated gigantic tree or financial problem. Mr. Heilman stated usually problem, tree in yard that cannot be moved. If put pool, has to be 10 feet instead of 15 feet. Mr. Mannara stated safety factor too, youngster might fall in. If want to fence might want further from itie house.

Mr. Measday, 16 Benedict Drive, stated came down about pool tonight, lot is 50 feet wide, 160 feet deep. Has ample amount of room from house to end of lot but wants to keep toward back and put 27 foot round above-ground pool in. In order to do this and stay away from electric power lines and everything 15 feet, cannot do it. Was going to apply for variance myself when ready to put in. Not planning to do until next February, buy pool when new ones come out. In order to keep away from house and cellar and power lines, if it is dropped to 10 feet from lot lines will have plenty of room and enough yard besides. Wants to get away from house so can enjoy yard besides. If 15 feet would have to get smaller pool, that variance anyway. 20 applied for last month and approved. If approved anyway, might as well have down to 10 feet. Inconvenience of getting okay and being in paper. Lots of paperwork in office. Believes Town of Chili or Greece is 10 feet. Several other towns around dropped from 15 to 10 feet. Older homes, smaller lots. Want to put good-sized pool in so if have people in have the room. If little one, hardly worthwhile to spend \$800 for a pool and not be able to enjoy it.

Mrs. Lozada, 71 Chester Avenue, stated had mer from Kayak measure yard and told would fit in, told didn't have to get permit. Husband came three times. When came, pool didn't fit. Fellow over phone said put it in. I stopped them. If doesn't go, didn't want. Tried to call Mr. Hall and never there. Called Ariestory and said additional bill and part, around house. Cannot put pool in. Calling me a liar, if town says cannot put in, if put in said knows men over at Town Hall won't let you move it. Talked to Mr. Rowers and told would have to move it. Trying to come and put pool in. Won't let in yard. Needs 10 feet because 2 feet short on each side. 5 college boys sent over, told to put it in. Asked to speak to man from Kayak and said if husband not here won't talk to me. Will have to leave because not 15 feet. Spoke to him about ground fault. Asked where did I hear that, never heard of it. Mr. Powers told me about it. Something now, said doesn't do it. Paying over \$3,000 for this pool, means to tell me puts it in and doesn't know anything about it. Cannot law make him do it. Said law cannot make do anything. Husband had to leave work early tonight to try to get it. Giving hard time over the phone. Won't let back in yard. Thinks said measured pool from the inside 11p line and supposed to measure from outside. Mr. Hall told to go ahead and put pool in. Asked them to leave. Mr. Pietropaoli asked above-ground-pool? Mrs. Lozada stated Yes. 12 x 20 swim area, 16 x 30 with dock. Had to cut down two trees to make room. Cut down trees and picked up roots, did work now cannot put up pool. Got very sarcastic to me. Supervisor Powers asked told didn't have to install Interceptor? Mrs. Lozada stated told if went and bought it, called R G & E, told should have to get. Said would cost \$50 extra. Said would go, went this far, if supposed to do it, will have to do it.

Councilman Callahan asked required in our pools? Supervisor Powers stated required by State. Councilman Criddle asked something new? Councilman Gray stated required by Underwriters Laboratory. If have pool without, house isn't insured. Supervisor Powers stated safety factor keeps electricity flow out of there. Mr. Mannara stated keeps from getting electrocuted. Councilman Callahan asked item we should add? Councilman O'Connor stated State law. Supervisor Powers stated State law and Underwriters supposed to follow through on that aspect of it and Bill says people are aware of it. Councilman Criddle stated ordinance mentioned pool must conform to Underwriters standards, would include this, of course.

Mrs. Weist, Bright Oaks Drive, stated want to put above-ground pool on backyard. Have hill right down. Replacing pool has had for 6-7 years. That was before code and had about 10 feet from house. At 15 we have pool in garage and cannot put up. All this beautiful weather and no use of 11. 10 foot would be fine for us. Councilman O'Connor asked all lighting and electrical work would comply with electrical code of the State of New York? Mrs. Weist stated also might mention at last variance meeting Or. Hoffschneider got variance to put pool closer than 15 feet to the house and just a few houses down. Mr. Pietropaoli stated would have had in drainage easement. Mrs. Weist stated so would ours. Councilman O'Connor stated ordinances allow wood frame structure, house or garage, 10 feet from lot line and talking above-ground pool which is usually aluminum and rubber lining.

Supervisor Powers asked if anyone else wished to speak from audience? Questions from the Board.

Mr. Clarence Young appeared representing Mr. Intress. Stated has filed resolution and petitions and thought those Here all papers necessary. Mr. Pietropaoli asked is attorney going to be here tonight? Know he contacted me about request. Mr. Young stated to his knowledge, did not expect. Anything I can gain in Interim will make effort to do it. Mr. Mannara asked don't have maps? Mr. Young stated should have been submitted. have copies given to me by attorney which I feel sure he has filed with resolution and petition, etc. Mr. Pietropaoli stated aware of the fact that trap required by law has been filled with the petition and order for request for public hearing. Standard procedure and sure your attorneys know that when request public hearing, you and representatives from law firm and engineering firm present detailed maps before the Town Board indicating drainage pattern and how developed plans to drain particular parcel of land. Mr. Teamerson is quite a knowledgeable attorney and appeared before this board three or four times since I have been town Attorney. Built considerable number of homes in town and in each instance when there has been subdivision, there has been public hearing before the Town Board on drainage district. In attendance at these meetings has been attorney, engineer and many times Joe himself. Guess we are just as surprised as you are that you came by yourself. Knows hasn't been involved in this for too very long but sure that Rod Leland and Joe's attorney perfectly familiar with routine and procedure. No question in my mind that knows exactly what has to be done to conform. Doesn't want to put in spot but cannot act without having information. Mr. Young stated let me add that information has been filed with the Planning Board, certainly.... Councilman Criddle stated admittedly filed but must be presented to the Town Board at the Public Hearing forming drainage district.

Councilman Callahan asked is this something that could he adjourned or start over again? Mr. Pietropaoli stated would suggest that be petitioned for new date. Doesn't think should adjourn it. Councilman Criddle asked in the interest of expediency, could you get Rod Leland available tonight? Joe available? Knows not feeling well, willing to wait long enough after agenda to go through this. Mr. Young asked could I ask your bearing with me and get on telephone and see what can do. Councilman Callahan stated engineer key man in the drainage really. Mr. Young stated will get on phone right away and report back to you. Mr. Hellman stated need map 5

for board to see. Mr. Pietropaoli stated suggests not close but recess until close of this meeting and re-open under public hearing again.

The Public Hearing was adjourned at 8:48 P.M. and reconvened at 10:00 P.M. Roll call was as follows: Supervisor Powers, Councilman Callahan, Councilman Criddle, Councilman O'Connor, Councilman Gray.

Supervisor Powers stated Mr. Entress now here with Mr. Young. Mr. Mannara asked would you explain your drawings? Mr. Entress stated understands hearing now open for this. Sorry about misunderstanding. This is exactly same map as you see in entirety that we now have preliminary approval from the Chilli Planning Board to proceed with along the lines to comply with recommendations they have set up. Number one of which is formation of drainage district and other items. Drainage District before you tonight. Realize that before and have with me letter from Pure Waters indicating that could make no connections for this subdivision. The above project will be served directly or indirectly by the Central West Sanitary Trunk Sewer on Westside Drive. The present trunk sewer does not have enough capacity to allow connections from the above project. Plans and specifications for a parallel Central West Trunk Sewer have been received from the engineers. The County Division of Pure Waters shortly will advertise for bids on this project and completion of the project is expected to be by the Fall of 1974. The Monroe County Division of Pure Waters cannot allow any connections to existing sanitary sewers from the above project until the parallel Central West Trunk is in place, tested and approved for use. If you have any questions, please feel free to contact this office. /s/ Donald W. Russell, Special Assistant Planning and Coordinating, Division of Pure Waters. Sanitary Sewer now in the project. Part of the main in this project. Doesn't have to take out of the property to get to main but they do require that the project will not be allowed connections until parallel trunk in place, tested and approved for use. Believes what they mean is that another trunk is being installed that would allow this to begin installation assuming that the timing would correspond and come together at some later date. In the meantime, requesting that the Town Board approve this same area that approved by Planning Board as drainage district so can continue with the planning of it and actual development of it. Any questions, detailed questions would be happy to answer.

Mr. Mannara stated will not begin until Pure Waters gives go ahead. Mr. Entress stated has letter in quite detail spreading out hole matter in terms of dollars and cents, connections and everything else. This letter from June which was prior to this letter indicated could not allow connection to the sewer until....putting me on notice that sewer to come and this subdivision would be hooked up to that sewer. Supervisor Powers stated that Central West Trunk supposed to go out for bids very soon, going to run from Trabold to Golden and understands going to come out for bid in next week or two. Mr. Pietropaoli stated that is something Mr. Entress is going to have to comply with before can file map anyway. Could Mr. Entress explain how the water is going to be drained off of that piece of property that you are seeking formation of drainage district for. Which way is flow and what kind of piping? That is what Board would like to know about subdivision.

Mr. Entress stated will read from letter from New York State Department of Transportation written June 6th to me and quite sure Planning Board has copy. "This is to inform you that the State of New York does not require a closed storm drainage system on State Right-of-Way. We will not object to a storm drainage pipe being discharged onto expressway Right-of-Way in the vicinity of the proposed subdivision provided the necessary permits are obtained. Any water discharged into the drainage system of Westside Drive could also be discharged into the open drainage system there. We must point out that this drainage basin on Westside Drive is critically overloaded now and any added discharge in this area will necessitate some work downstream to alleviate this added burden. A copy of our letter to Lozler Engineers, dated June 5, 1968 is attached and the comments made at that time are still valid.

"The proposed enlrances shown on your drawing #67-27-15 should present no problems when an application for a Highway Work Permit is filed. We will require that the existing four foot high fence along the Expressway Right-of-Way be replaced with a six foot high chain link fence along the entire length of the subdivision." Prior letter sent to Loziers by Burkitt, Resident engineer, "Enclosed is your print with our recommendations on the above subject. As noted on your print we feel that the critical point in the drainage problem in the installation of a new culvert by your contractor across Coldwater Road just south of the Penn Central Railroad...." This has been...is not possible at this time and this letter here of June 6, 1973, this is one in 1968, iakea preference of state's attitude regarding flow of water there.

Mr. Mannara asked didn't you offer to do some work there? Mr. Entress stated there is another letter here. The state is allowing and this is something that since all of this has been written and I read it here someplace that they will allow water to be drained out of here onto their right-of-way.

Councilman Criddle asked where is outfall from system? Mr. Entress stated to one out here and one in this corner of the traffic over here. Mr. Hellman stated none of members here were present at the Planning Board so they don't know talking about expressway and permission received as indicated by letter that half of the property could be drained that way. Mr. Entress stated whatever is drainable onto state right-of-way.

Supervisor Powers stated problem other side of Westside Drive. Mr. Mannara asked made agreement didn't you? Mr. Entress stated Town of Gates required nothing. No agreement with Town of Gates on that at all. Hasn't required one. Mr. Young stated across Westside Drive State of New York acquired easement when went in and did other work to open ditch going down into railroad ditch. They said would allow and accept out drainage from this area here to go down under now enlarged culvert and following caomont down through there. Supervisor Powers asked have they requested that ditch be cleaned from that point? Mr. Entress stated no, they haven't. Supervisor Powers asked is culvert at Coldwater large enough? Mr. Entress stated hasn't requested that. State gets water here and their concern is apparently satisfied that existing conditions, our subdivision will not add any more water than has added there. No water flows into subdivision to be taken away from it. From no area. No water flowing into this subdivision that has to be taken care of in addition to water that is there. Filled extensively and will be filled in disallowing standing water in area.

Supervisor Powers asked no correspondence indicating that contractor or you required to put new culvert under the road at Coldwater? Mr. Young stated no, state indicated that was taken care of and adequate to food into easements they have. Mr. Entress stated Westside Drive culvert here, does require I clean ditch along Westside Drive. Supervisor Powers asked anything in writing, because sure can get down Westside but know what happens across Westside. Anything in writing that State says this is OK or requiring that you clean to Little Black Creek? Mr. Entress stated OK'd according to letters I have filed the water outfall in total provided I clean ditch on Westside. Supervisor Powers stated going to be pulling water into Gates and wondering if neighbors requested you to clean ditch to creek, Mr. Entress stated continuation of what is going on now. Nothing new. Has been going there right along. Supervisor Powers stated really sits up in there. Water in there and low down Westside Drive. Any correspondence? Mr. Young stated nothing other than what indicated and State allowed use. Doesn't know if fully aware that ditch paralleling 490 expressway has plenty of capacity to handle anything subdivision could throw at it. State allowed to go in. Mr. Entress stated State gave approval as now laid out and under letters that exist on this. As matter of fact at one of live hearing, State man attended himself, Timmones, from State Department of Transportation, discussed what State wanted in entirety.

Councilman Criddle asked could you point out how drainage handled internally? Assume have State approval to go along Westside and along railroad ditch. Drains out onto expressway right-of-way. Where is breaking point for water drainage? Mr. Entress stated this area here they will allow any drainage that we can bring out to here on this side of tract. Councilman O'Connor asked just about half of the tract? Mr. Mannara stated about one-third. Bottom piece plus right hand side. Mr. Entress stated will not object to storm drainage being discharged onto expressway right-of-way.

Councilman Criddle stated interested in inside subdivision itself. Mr. Entress stated major streets onto Westside Drive. Councilman Criddle asked about two-thirds? Mr. Entress stated yes. Hut State satisfied if clean Westside Drive ditch out to point where crosses road and satisfied to remove if I can, so to do, whether try to improve drainage or not, question of getting whatever you need to get onto somebody else's property to do that. As private citizen doesn't have right to improve drainage. Cannot speak out on own rights, What State will allow to do on this right-of-way and easements, what we can do to improve, knows State can give what needs to get on railroad property but cannot do from railroad side, on private property.

Councilman Callahan asked internal segment of subdivision, is that swale or open pipe in internal part of subdivision? Mr. Entress stated storm sewers to carry water. Councilman Callahan asked about back lots in center section? Mr. Entress stated this will drain to the street. Councilman Callahan asked piped between lot lines? Mr. Entress stated easement here, 20 foot easement in there. Councilman Callahan asked swale or pipe? Mr. Entress state no pipe on road, pipe here. Councilman Callahan asked along Westside Drive, what is depth of ditch and the slope of it? Mr. Entress stated cannot tell you that, Mr. Young stated let me answer this way, They have asked us to go in and clear out and in the easement that they have running across on far side of Westside Drive going over to the railroad ditch is adequate and indicated that at preliminary meetings. Councilman Callahan asked if homeowner and bought lot on Westside, what would I expect at road? Mr. Entress stated like all other lots on Westside and Coldwater, ditches in front of them.

Mr. Mannara asked Mr. Entress to explain private road on Westside Drive. Won't face right on Westside Drive. Mr. Entress stated there is private road here and ditch would remain on Westside Drive. Duffer street in here inside Westside Drive that ties lots together and outfall goes here and here. That ditch not in front of houses, on north side of street in front of houses which is south, two parallel streets, Westside and inner street of subdivision. Councilman Callahan asked private drive? Mr. Mannara stated doesn't know if will be dedicated yet, Mr. Entress stated town road like rest of streets. Planning Board asked for that. For safety purposes, driveways, etc.

Councilman Callahan asked is there another section later on? Or this is development picture for all property in this area you own? No Sections 2 and 3? Mr. Entress stated all the property own in that lot. Councilman Criddle asked how many lots? Mr. Entress stated 65. Councilman Callahan asked do we have easements? Mr. Entress stated thinks very probably could do with some inside streets. Mr. Mannara asked explain easements around perimeter? Mr. Entress stated easement surrounding whole thing but some so high doesn't know what would have easement for but designing it, Mr. Mannara stated in case of emergency, if want to clean, can clean. Mr. Entress stated realize part of tract is 12 feet higher than road on Southwest corner.

Councilman Gray stated on western side of property, quite a swamp area in that area. Are those lots above that? Mr. Entress stated surrounded by swamp area. Councilman Gray asked where are lots in relation to that? Mr. Entress stated lowest area west of where street will come out, being filled. This area all filled well above road. No water laying in here. There is some along here which is drainage area but will be filled in. Councilman Gray asked if someone walks out of lots 51-52, how far before you drop out of sight in swamp? Mr. Young stated wooded area on this edge of property. Councilman Gray stated big back in there. Not against

property? Mr. Young stated naturally with wooded area don't have swamp. Woods do buffer property. Mr. Entress stated Planning Board asked us to preserve as many trees as can but some will be going because filling some more in that area but west portion keep as natural as possible. Natural outfall for property over here on this west side going to ditch as well and leads from this point out. Future development of area could be laid into same easement. Easement would accommodate adjoining property and will anyway whether attempt to do so or not, will be on terrain now.

Councilman Callahan asked, property to the east of your area, any arrangement to pick up future drainage if they develop? Mr. Entress stated this is high point where falls off to the east here. Outfall here and drains ease in the present highway ditch now. Another drain which goes under Westside east of Coldwater that drains all this area and drainage flows into that ditch that goes, second culvert under Westside that drains this area now. Mr. Young stated fairly highly built in here. Mr. Entress stated no water could come into this lot from there. If you drove in, could easily see set up that high. Mr. Young stated Jewell's, adjoining property owner, gratified to see that type development going next to them. Quality development. Glad to see what building. Mr. Entress stated lots 24 and 75 go to Westside Drive here but no possibility of water spilling in here. Mr. Young stated Riedman family here on high. More concerned about cost and quality of homes. Drainage not problem to them.

Supervisor Powers asked what do lot sizes average? Mr. Entress stated above minimum size partly because doesn't want to hold to minimum. 92, 81, 85, 85 standard lot, 82-85, 89 and these 95, 83, no minimum of 80 feet attempted to be here. Lost about four lots to increase lots to get higher than minimum size. Mr. Mannara stated felt those turn arounds had to be little larger, that is why lost lots. Mr. Entress stated went beyond that, didn't want 80 feet. Mr. Young stated suggestion complied with.

Councilman Criddle asked drainage at the outfall at the southeast corner, piped or course? Mr. Entress stated this is not drainage pipe on east lot line. Councilman Criddle stated concerned that side lot drainage is piped. Mr. Entress stated doesn't drain side lot lines. Never heard of subdivision will separate sewer on each side of lot. Councilman Criddle stated major drainage between lots like outfall between 31 and 32 onto expressway. Mr. Entress stated that would be underground. Councilman Criddle asked also outfall to northwest? Only two major portions of district that run through side lot lines? Two outfalls? Mr. Young stated yes. Mr. Mannara stated also two top lots. In the north, those are connected together. Mr. Entress stated plan calls for pipe there. Mr. Mannara stated those lots facing Westside Drive are picked up and brought into drainage system. Between those lots below with pipe. Mr. Entress stated back of these here. They will drain to the back and front. No pipe, picked up in ditch that comes out here. Mr. Young stated easement on the west side of lot 24. Mr. Entress stated easement without pipe in there. Mr. Mannara stated pipe between 23 and 26. Mr. Entress stated yes, drains into street and out. Mr. Mannara stated originally wanted to run drainage into westside into ditch and didn't allow that.

Councilman Callahan asked in that center section where have two backlots coming together, had problems in town, what is opinion on that? Mr. Mannara stated most of the run-off on lots going toward front. That is secondary safeguard, easement, swale in there. If somebody tries to terrace lot, will drain. Each house picks up own storm water either by sump pump or gutters or what, into main drainage system. Councilman Callahan asked would water from two houses come back to the center line? Mr. Mannara stated minor run-off to center of lots. Councilman Callahan asked how carry it to road? Mr. Mannara stated will take front down 1-7% to street. The back swale will go from house to the easement, slope down and same on the sides. Councilman Callahan asked back to the property line? How get out of there? Mr. Mannara stated drawing shows grade and it goes out. Councilman Callahan stated must have to go between lot lines someplace. Mr. Mannara stated goes to back, doesn't need anything on sides. Swales in back and front where road-side drainage is, picks up there.

Mr. Young stated some of this going to drain... Councilman Callahan asked water back here, how get out of here. Off six and three. Mr. Mannara stated either west or east. Councilman Callahan asked how out to the street? Mr. Mannara stated roadside ditches or gutters. Councilman Callahan asked what is slope on here, four on one? Mr. Mannara stated has another map which shows way being drained. Councilman Callahan asked do we consider side lot lines which according to ordinances must be piped? Mr. Mannara asked piping from house into the street? Councilman Callahan stated also have ordinances that say all drainage on side lot lines must be piped. Mr. Mannara stated doesn't understand. Councilman Callahan stated doesn't have book here. Mr. Entress stated have to drain every yard. Councilman Callahan asked have drainage swale going by side lines, says has to be piped. Councilman Criddle stated only major. Lot and block grading takes care of that. Mr. Mannara stated just showed you two lots and how took care of drainage. Same principal, bring out to sewer in front. Mr. Entress stated pipes would be so close to surface, would be sorry put in. Surface won't drain, freeze and heave up because too close to surface. Simplest way to handle water on top unless lot of depth to get below freezing. In many areas will be pipe filled with ice. Drain on surface anyway. Mr. Mannara stated that is why grade land to suit surface. Mr. Entress stated fine if goes three feet under but side lots not that way in subdivision. Mr. Mannara stated either reading wrong or interpreting ordinance wrong. Nowcr interpreted that way and doesn't think builder in town would. Councilman Callahan stated not talking about house drainage. Mr. Mannara stated talking about drainage between two lots. Mr. Entress stated Planning Board undertook quite thoroughly.

Supervisor Powers asked if anyone in the audience wished to speak and no one appeared.

The Public Hearing was closed at 10:37 P.M.

A Public Hearing was held by the Town Board of the Town of Chili in the Chili Administration Building, 3235 Chili Avenue, Rochester, New York 14624 on September 5, 1973 to hear discussion on the proposed New Subdivision Ordinance for the Town of Chili (see legal notice attached). The Hearing was called to order by Supervisor Powers at 8:30 P.M.

Roll Call was as follows: Supervisor Powers, Councilman Callahan, Councilman Criddle, Councilman O'Connor, Councilman Gray

Also Present: Mrs. Robbins, Mr. Pietropaoli, Yr. tielman, Mr. Chudyk, Mr. Mannara, Mr. Vall

Supervisor Powers stated document presented tonight accumulation and compilation of lot of effort not only on behalf of Town Board and Mr. Uff and Mr. Frazer, who worked with us on the development of the Master Plan for Town of Chili since inception. Pretty well details just what processes are that developer must follow in building subdivision within the municipal boundaries of this particular town. Gets into application procedure and approval procedures and design standards and required improvements. Upgraded requirements regarding drainage and roads. Moves on to specifications for preparing sketches and preliminary lay-outs and subdivision plats. Planning Board's role and miscellaneous provisions and penalties when not carried out. Probably one of the new things included is sidewalks. Upgrades street requirements and standards. Requests topos, which was done in the past, many pieces of paper finally combined into one solid document, Subdivision Ordinances, which will become addition to our Master Plan we have not completed but another step toward completion of such and has one question that wants to ask and then very happy to turn over to other Councilmen if they wish to ask questions or make statements, welcome to do so. Doesn't only reflect thinking of these gentlemen here but predecessors and spent many a night hashing this out and pretty general consensus of thinking on behalf of each of us. Would like to move to the drainage section, believe page 17. Unless just did not read within here, had some problem and concern except now and then by members of this board about carrying water from the home to the storm drainage system and wondering, doesn't recall having read anything in here, about laterals from homes being connected to the storm drainage system. Mr. Mannara?

Mr. Mannara stated sure in here somewhere. Let me glance through. Mr. Pietropaoli stated Section 4050 says "all drainage systems of Town of Chili shall conform to street ordinance" separate ordinance presently on the books and believe in that ordinance where have requirement that laterals or downspouts be connected to the laterals, correct? Supervisor Powers asked what section is that? Mr. Pietropaoli stated page 17, section 4040, drainage system. Councilman Criddle asked we have yet to adopt one? Mr. Pietropaoli stated have one on the books now which does incorporate. Councilman Criddle stated stipulations and regulations but nothing in ordinances to my knowledge. When builder comes in and wants information handed sheet of papers and included therein are number of items pertaining to drainage. One point was going to bring up that didn't find and noticed refer to Chili storm drainage ordinance. Didn't think we have one yet, probably will. Question about open storm drainage on side lot lines. Thinks pointed out one time is in stipulations to builders pertaining to drainage, item presently attached to building permits in regards to laterals, storm sewer requirements "Under no circumstances will open storm drains be allowed on side lot lines." All lots, houses and buildings will be serviced. Ultimately when take this and put in form of ordinance then we will have that.

Mr. Pietropaoli asked may I see that Councilman? Supervisor Powers stated that is attached to building permits. Councilman Criddle stated thinks those are handed out like this. Councilman Callahan stated passed something like that in September 1971. What could we have put it in? Just Town Board resolution? Mr. Pietropaoli stated doesn't think needs ordinance. Building construction ordinance, Chaplar 4, storm sewer requirements. Thinks part of the ordinance. Additional building construction requirements Section 4, 5. Requirements you just indicated. Councilman Criddle asked those things are in ordinance that this alludes to here? Mr. Mannara stated sure covered somewhere because thrashed out and found to be covered.

Mr. Pietropaoli stated notice for this particular public hearing duly published in a legal paper of the Town of Chili within required period of time and posted on the Town Clerk's bulletin board and affidavits of publication and posting are on file with the Town Clerk. Should have statement on the record that have compiled with legal requirements. There were detailed copies on file with Mrs. Kobkins, the Town Clerk, pursuant to the legal notice and do have extra copies for people who have not received them. Set on table and if you would like to review in course of hearing.

Councilman Callahan stated would like to discuss one or two points. One page which is not really pertaining to this particular document in here but in original proposed subdivision ordinance and would like to mention items. Looked at first proposed subdivision ordinance and though Monroe County Planning Council, thinks should give credit to them. Subject, subdivision ordinance April 1971. Local planning agent, town of Chili Planning Board. Source of copies, Clearing House for federal Scientific Information, Washington D. C. Chili Planning Board, 3235 Chili Avenue, Rochester, New York Monroe County Planning Council, Rochester, New York under HUD project NYPI95, report 71-04. Many people to thank for information. Councilman Gray stated would like to see included in here to authorize Supervisor with Mr. Frazer to come up with insert page, credit page and Supervisor affidavit. Frazer be allowed to work that out. Mr. Pietropaoli stated legally speaking don't have front page and all of this when adopting ordinance. Credit page to me, if adopted by Town Board, will put on names of members of the Town Board, affixed as passing on such and such a date, Town Clerk files and published in newspaper and that is credit you get. Not publishing literary work here that going to have lot of people take credit for. Legally speaking, no place in the official recording of this particular ordinance and afraid if did something like that probably would have some type of criticism. Adopt ordinance if want to adopt and pay tribute to people who worked perhaps by resolution after adopt, then can pass resolution thanking people who participated and Supervisor can send letter of commendation to people who worked on preparation of the document. As long as doing that, No. 1 Mr. Frazer from Monroe County Planning Council who certainly spent many hours putting together and getting and keeping us on the proper course for even getting to this point. Hard work and perhaps would like to make comments.

Councilman Callahan stated point well taken, point to acknowledge beginning of project and mention those who had been with it for period of time. Includes Frazer. On the ordinance itself, would like to discuss particular 4.047, concrete sidewalks five (5) feet wide. Finds difficult to separate arterial and collector streets from regular small roads in Town and thinks going to run into problem when have sidewalks along arterial or collector street and stop because goes around corner into side road, or subdivision street. Thinks we should look into this section and probably include either sidewalks for all streets or make some better distinctions. Councilman Gray stated went through that, spent almost two meetings on that in the Master Plan thing. Apparently you were not at those. Councilman Callahan stated there and made same objection. Councilman Gray stated thinks one when you were in retirement? discussed for two hours and went through this. My feeling to put sidewalks in all streets in them, going to impose burden on taxpayer. New set of equipment to plow. Many people do want and equal number don't. Thinks arterials and main roads, not difficult to locate, there is dangerous

situation occurring today and fools remiss if didn't correct it. If forced the other way, certainly doesn't feel Town of Chilli can afford to maintain complete sidewalk system in the entire town. Personally favors arterial highways, business streets where have most danger. Doesn't think can afford to go into subdivisions also.

Councilman Callahan stated agrees on arterial and collector street. Problem in mind at the last meeting given petitions by the people in the Lexington Subdivision that they wanted sidewalks. Put sidewalks in each and every subdivision, no condition that Town would be responsible for each and every sidewalk. Sidewalks as known in other towns responsibility of homeowner in that area and does maintain them. Same argument used for expensive amount of equipment for maintaining sidewalks for lawns. However, if allow some on arterial and collector level streets, who would maintain them? Homeowners on that arterial and collector street. Problem. Lake Lexington Subdivision. If planned today decided to call Lexington Parkway collector road and have sidewalks down that street. How about Knights Trail, Rever. Would not have sidewalks, sure would be in asking for sidewalks. This is problem I have.

Councilman Gray stated thinks one of the problems, not all the people in town particularly want sidewalks, personally, on street where I live do not feel sidewalks justified. Most neighbors feel same way. Main streets into Lexington probably should have. Councilman Callahan asked only talking about new subdivisions? Supervisor Powers stated if this is adopted, Councilman Gray stated thinking in terms of cost, even if people maintain snow removal, if look into city that has sidewalks and budget after 4 - 5 years, cost of replacement of broken walks and problems associated with repair, costs almost as high as highway repair expenses. Doesn't think town can afford to do that. Does have to protect people to extent that all major roads have to have something. Doesn't think in subdivision can afford to. Might be able to do if unlimited amount of money. Councilman Callahan stated agrees with thinking but many roads main roads and would require sidewalks.

Councilman O'Connor stated there is leeway here, does say may also be required within pedestrian easements through blocks to provide a system of pedestrian walkways to schools, parks and other community facilities. This is in addition to collector roads. Depends on layout of subdivision and decided at time subdivision going in.

Mr. Pietropaoli stated probably compromise between those who wanted in all and those who didn't want at all to attempt in places, like if develop Chestnut Ridge and areas of that nature, certainly provide for that along street like that. Hopefully in future will be able to provide for that if adopted. That was basic thought and idea to compromise because cost staggering to provide in all subdivisions and maintain. Perhaps other towns do leave to homeowners to take care of the sidewalks in front of their homes but if you travel in subdivision in Gales that has sidewalks in winter most kids walking in street because homeowners too lazy to plow. Town doesn't have equipment to plow. Point we discussed when discussing this particular area.

Councilman O'Connor stated also when talking, this very section on sidewalks, compromise was agreeable at the time and affects entire subdivision ordinance, that in future, if situation warrants, any change can be made and increase, delete or alter, in future years another board says have to have sidewalks on every street, change one section and get it. Isn't something so cut and dried never going to be able to put sidewalks in streets.

Councilman Criddle stated one point on minor street, not necessarily precluding them if adopt ordinance because legal mechanics still exist. Petition Town Board to have sidewalks on benefits derived basis. Not saying cannot have on any other streets but Mr. Callahan and I probably disagree on this. Does look on this as compromise. Did have many sessions on this and personally have always felt that sidewalks on minor streets, mine for example, would be waste. Doesn't think youngsters would ever use them. At same time can appreciate fact that some people in subdivisions like sidewalks. Fine if want them.

Can have sidewalks and would do everything I can to assist but to include in ordinance, remain at this point.

Councilman Callahan asked would anyone agree to change in there, "concrete sidewalks at least five (5) feet wide shall be required on both sides of all arterial and collector level streets or they may also be required at the request of the Planning Board and on pedestrian easements through blocks to provide...." Councilman Gray stated would seem that pull builder under undue stress. No yiddish as to whether or not going to have to put through whole subdivision or part. This way clearly define what major streets are that would require and those that don't. Councilman Callahan stated only thought would give Planning Board, when looked at particular thing, could say yes or no. Councilman Gray stated seems they do now. If arterial or feeder street and if feeder street and Planning Board demands there is, then by the ordinance they must do it.

Supervisor Powers asked anyone in audience wishes to speak for this proposal? Mr. Otto Layer, Laycull Construction, asked on that section discussing? Supervisor Powers stated on the ordinance.

Mr. Layer stated owns property on Paul Road. As far as sidewalks concerned, would like to make couple of comments. Happens to live in neighborhood where just installed sidewalks on one side of an arterial street. This is installed by the Town. Interesting, goes from one side to the other. One side for way and crosses over and on other side. Reason pressure put on to put sidewalks on the street was three years ago a young girl killed on bike at night and now have street lights and sidewalks on that particular street. Point would like to suggest at this stage, Councilman Callahan mentioned Lexington Parkway, though in future if one like this came in sidewalks would be required. Under ordinance, thinks as now reads it would be. Two questions, one, to inquire sidewalks on both sides of the street excessive. Other thing more matter of philosophy. If young fellow and lived on Lexington Parkway and child had my permission to ride bike on Parkway, sure that at some point would want to ride bike to Westgate or Parkminster Church or something. Ride to end of Lexington where hits Chill and then what happens. Got real problem. Kid told could ride bike and has to ride on Chill Avenue, tough place to ride bike. My thinking this, that with ordinance like this requiring sidewalks that in most cases won't go anyplace. Thinks only reasonable for the Town Board to consider the fact that if going to start program of installing sidewalks on some streets, also thinks for the same type of streets Town has responsibility to continue sidewalks in developed areas. Have waste sidewalk plan for section of the town and say Lexington area one, require sidewalks, why require. Where would somebody want to go. School, church, Westgate or something like that and honestly feel it means commitment on the part of the Town which is what has happened in many others. happen to live in Brighton, now have sidewalk program where putting in so many miles every year. Cutting down on bussing of kids in meantime. Something that should be considered because to require sidewalks which all realize particularly on minor streets nobody uses anyway. Go into subdivision where sidewalks are and walk on one side of the street and in winter time problem with snow removal and summertime the road much better place to ride bike and play anyway so that is where they do it. Just kids and have to recognize it.

Mr. Layer continued, another thing which thinks has concerned me some is that oftentimes run into double standard on sidewalks. One town requires concrete sidewalks from subdivision and yet when loan puts in, asphalt sidewalks. That is tough one to think about. Mr. Mannara would know, at least 100% sure for concrete. Thinks that there are places where sidewalks called for but many more places where absolutely essential for safety that have already been developed and really main highways and without some protection on those, seems foolish to require on other streets.

Councilman Criddle stated as you know, town of Chili as well as many of course, many of our collector streets run to our main arteries, speaking primarily of Chili Avenue, Chestnut Ridge, over which we have little control. Mr. Layer asked what do you mean? Councilman Criddle stated State highways and County highways. Mr. Layer asked trouble getting easements? Councilman Criddle stated yes, Ridge back down Lexington to Chili, up against State easements. Insufficient space, acquire right of way for easements. Mr. Layer stated practical problem but unfortunately oftentimes solved by having unfortunate accident. Tough to have happen and realize almost impossible situation to put sidewalks into developed areas but it is being done and effort should be made. Honestly thinks responsibility of the town authority to try to do it. Certainly makes sense. Nobody can argue against it. Did make a few notes and bring up quickly. Under first article, section 1.010, authority mentioned through Section 281. Does that mean by adoption of this ordinance, also adopting Section 281? Mr. Pietropaoli stated no. This refers to those sections of Town Law which give the town the right to regulate and control subdivisions within the territorial jurisdiction of the town. Not our intention to adopt 281 by this particular subdivision ordinance. Correct Mr. Frazer? Mr. Frazer stated yes. That would be handled separately, if necessary.

Councilman Callahan asked in your subdivision known as Lexington, have several streets. Lexington Parkway, Revere, Newport, Canon Hill, Meeting House, wouldn't more than one of those roads be classified as collector street, Meetinghouse as collector road? Mr. Layer stated everybody has different definition. It is defined in ordinance. Any street that serves 150 units. Here again, going to be tough to nail that down but doesn't think can at this point, try to nail down what is and isn't. Councilman Callahan stated thinks that is point of my argument, which is which. Can picture subdivision half with sidewalks and half without. Those without will want. Mr. Layer stated person living within subdivision without will be paying for them just like fellow that does because have to spread cost. Councilman Callahan stated builder will put in and charge everyone. Mr. Layer stated each one proportionately. Cannot sell for more money if sidewalks in front. Wanted to clarify my thinking that your first public hearing will be on preliminary plan, is that right? Then the public hearing or the actual subdivision plan is optional with the Planning Board? Mr. Hellman stated believes that follows change under New York State Law in section 776.

Mr. Layer asked under page 8, Letter of credit. Applicant and each owner of records of subdivision shall jointly make and execute letter of credit. Didn't mention being letter of credit from bank, however in middle of it talking about releases, does refer to the bank. Assumes letters of credit must be issued by bank or can it be individual letter of credit? Can have private letter of credit? Mr. Pietropaoli stated thinks means letter of credit other than applicant- or owner of records of the property. If develop land wouldn't think looking for your letter of credit. Mr. Layer stated didn't think particularly clear. Mr. Pietropaoli stated other than owner. Mr. Layer stated says applicant and each owner shall make and execute letter of credit. Mr. Bob Burnett, Bright Oaks Circle, stated means instrument to affect letter of credit from the bank that is on behalf of an owner but document addressed to the municipality. Thinks knows what is going to be required but didn't think the wording... Mr. Pietropaoli stated standard letter of credit which we have always required before. No intention to change that.

Mr. Layer stated Page 14, section on trees, mention that an overall tree planting plan shall be developed and approved by the Planning Board. Talking specifically about street trees, is there an inference that there will be necessity to have additional plantings other than street trees or is that up to Planning Board? Never seen expressed that way. Mr. Pietropaoli stated up to number of boards. Thinks full authority will rest with Planning Board and sure would like to see landscape plan on what exists on particular areas before subdivide and

on plans after subdivide and thinks will be referred to Conservation Commission and they will make recommendations to Planning Board and subdivider will know where he stands. Basic intent for additional plantings along streets, also conservation of trees in subdivided areas by subdividers. Too many cases subdividers allowed to go in and, so to speak, rape the landscape of good trees presently on the land, just built doze and put up houses and walk out. That is not intention of this ordinance. Mr. Duff had lot of input and is that your understanding? Mr. Duff stated essentially correct. Presenting to board essentially extreme lack of woods in town and as it is should be made to preserve areas where possible so that commission can make recommendations to Planning Board that would allow for builder to make compromise in development and allow for preservation of wooded areas. In addition to tree plantings mentioned there, Mr. Layer stated hopes actually turns out that way so can work with town and preserve rather than cut and chop up into grid lots which leave no choice. Always turns out house is where best trees are. Mr. Pletropaci stated thinks familiar because last section in Lexington had nice plan and did seek variances on some lots to conserve trees already there and Planning Board and Conservation Commission extremely gratified that developer was concerned to that extent and should be commended when not requested for coming in and asking to do that.

Mr. Layer stated under Street Improvements, page 16, K "the Town of Chili shall not be held responsible for underground drains." Not sure what talking, underground drains talking about. Mr. Mannara stated road base drains, not road itself. Mr. Layer stated under drains shown on typical road section. Is that going to be on basis of as required? Mr. Mannara stated 6 inch perforated as required. Mr. Layer stated lot of areas where won't need and matter of pulling in if called for as far as ground conditions. Mr. Mannara stated will require on all roads, on both sides. Mr. Layer stated simply something requiring that know not needed in most instances. Mr. Mannara stated keeps road from heaving so doesn't get frost under road and crack up as have been right along. Mr. Layer stated does recognize fact that in 90% of cases would not probably help to have under drain. Mr. Mannara stated maybe, maybe in not that year but in second year might need it. Mr. Layer stated same amount of gravel outside of pavement so natural drain anyway. Mr. Mannara stated found not efficient in most instances, expect to eliminate if with underdrain. Mr. Layer stated not familiar with roads that have cracked because of lack of under drain. Usually not under drain. Mr. Mannara stated could take on four. Mr. Layer stated cannot prove caused because no underdrain.

Mr. Burnett stated in order to develop Bright Oaks and go directly in, Caldwell & Cook petitioned to move drainage to west and in so doing, nobody gave thought to fact that water surface draining into 11. Mr. Mannara stated another subject, entirely different.

Mr. Layer stated in item (1), you will be providing inspector for the job, that was thing glad to see and figured that would be the way could determine underdrain and that sort of thing if wanted to. Under drainage on Page 18, "adequate and comprehensive drainage systems shall be provided to convey the storm water runoff originating within outside the subdivision in accordance with the natural direction of runoff for the total upland watershed area affecting the subdivision." As you know I have been very concerned about this item for many years because of the fact that there is tremendous expense when have situation where downstream developer that is doing just this. Simply would like to again be on record that thinks responsibility of overall drainage district or separate one with the part in that town now as formed so can participate with builder or developer or whoever putting in system, can actually participate in some of the cost of that which would be charged against other areas than what subdivider developing at that time. Also applies to sanitary sewer and others but not involved with that in Chill. Thinks now that you have made giant leap of using town funds for drainage programs as down in Hillary, thinks next obvious thing to do is to form loan-wide district or two and put in position to not only participate in situation like this, but in position to take care of any problems that may now have or may come up in future.

Page 19 under Erosion Control, Section g, where say "top soils shall not be stored on rear lot lines or drainage easements", problem is where to store it because all leaving open for there is store off subdivision so that provides problems and additional cost. Thinks not unreasonable to allow Planning Board and Engineers to determine where on subdivision top soil can be stored and add suggestion that rather than having statement like that in there that cannot be stored on rear lot line or drainage easement, that it be worked out in some way so that determination could be done at time subdivision approved. Mr. Mannara asked what if add as Town may direct? Mr. Layer stated our engineers may agree upon. Could be part of regular subdivision requirements because top soil problem. Councilman Criddle stated understands and appreciates intention of that but situations in town where topsoil left on easements and drainage doesn't function. Trying to eliminate. Mr. Layer stated provides problem while cannot build if in wrong place. That is why thinks it should be function of the engineering review but the way is, would leave owners no choice but to put off subdivision.

Mr. Pietropaoli stated doesn't think that is accurate. Undeveloped sections that are there, most subdividers come in and do section by section and put topsoil from 1 on 2 and things of that nature without great hardship on subdivider and that is why in there. Too many take topsoil off lots in section one, strip back to back of area. Drainage doesn't work and people in adjoining developed areas complaining about problems. Rather than leaving wide open, talked about this at length one night and felt would rather put in. Subdivider comes in, cannot store on rear lot line or easement, doesn't have to worry about talking to anybody about where to store it. Would like to see stay as it is. Mr. Layer stated no matter where store it, in wrong place. If on lot, it is first one somebody wants to buy. Mr. Pietropaoli stated where stored in pail has been wrong place and generally on easement that water has to pass through and wouldn't go uphill too well.

Mr. Layer stated wants to commend Town Board for coming up with ordinance. Thinks good to have something that everyone can work with and certainly looking eagerly forward to time when we will have other ordinances and documents that will make this part of complete package for development of town of Chili.

Mr. Burnett, Bright Oaks Circle, stated as former chairman of Drainage District Commission might say prepared and presented to one or two former boards detailed analysis of not only current problems projected into future, working with many authorities, etc. Believes was accepted would be to create drainage districts, north and south districts. At time had problems of own, problem of raising water to meet Paul Road area and problem wanted interjected into overall survey and to best of my knowledge, doesn't know what happened in the report. Present board should be charged with looking into presentation of this program and make due recognition of time and effort on people's parts. Wasn't paid, didn't even get \$1.00. Not done for money. Other thought and intents of this subdivision ordinance as understood, purpose and intent to direct those people in preparation of plat and if read opening paragraph, purpose of establishing ordinances, specifically speaking of establishment of subdivision. Not to enhance presently established subdivisions. If going in with sidewalks and trees and not going to definitely discern which talking about. New subdivision to be built to enhance present subdivision? One of the other things in report we submitted, necessity of creating basins for drainage. One of the better developed areas came about by suggestions brought to us in present Entrance tract. Reasonable program, self-cleaning, little or no maintenance on part of town, concrete and fast enough flow cleans bottom. Looked at possibility if creating closed drainage ditches where seed over top and decided to leave open because found with open, had certain amount of natural evaporation which took water away from subdivision. Believe it or not all water in town goes to the south, lowland part of the town and area trying to help by not creating more water problems for them by closed type operation. Thinks intent was trying to take

away barren look of development by removing trees, comes about naturally. Displace earth, takes time for grass to grow and some homeowners more diligent than others. If the Town plants trees homeowners think they put in, they can maintain. Don't have forestry department. Intend to create? Developing all sorts of little **problems** not in original intention of the particular ordinance. Only to be used as guideline for new subdivision, not anything else other than that.

Mr. Pietropaoli stated only thing Town Board can do by adopting ordinance to govern subdivisions is to govern new subdivisions. Cannot retroactively go back and govern subdivision approved and built in the town. Ordinance for a public hearing on this matter governs only new developments, subdivisions, single residence subdivisions within the town of Chili and all the related problems such as drainage, sidewalks, roads, trees, topsoil removal, anything concerned. Development of new subdivision within confines of this town. All we have legal right to do. Mr. Burnett stated not arguing that point. Mr. Pietropaoli stated thinks asked question. Mr. Burnett stated though? speaking of others who did request sidewalks. Others did lead me to believe that these are presently established subdivisions. Wanted to clear up, not going into program of establishing **sidewalks** and **trees** for already established subdivision. Mr. Pietropaoli stated by this ordinance we are not doing that, you are correct.

Supervisor Powers asked if **anyone else** wishes to **speak**. No one appeared. The Public hearing was closed at 9:35 P.M.

Anyone in audience wish to make comment on the ambulance contract?

Mr. Gracey appeared, stated as president of Fire Department, which also provides ambulance service for the Town and as a citizen would like to go on record in favor of the proposed budget as submitted to the Town Board for their consideration. Supervisor Powers asked may I ask approximately how many more calls made, increase? Mr. Gracey stated go to refer to ambulance officer. They have figures from 1972 to current runs this year. 658 total for 1977, little over 500 to date for 1973. Will run over last year's total. Looks probably projecting into 7004 mark at this point. Supervisor Powers stated growing a little bit. Mr. Gracey stated yes we are.

Councilman Callahan asked wondering, predict that this ambulance service is adequate for number of years. Mr. Gracey stated depends on what growth rate of town is. Guessing now but would have total population about 19 - 21,000, much depends on growth, population and apartments and homes. Hard question to answer. Would predict will grow. Would

say current services adequate for foreseeable future, say five years. Beyond that doesn't know. Supervisor Powers stated thinks 1970 census was 19,608. Growing between 5-7% a year. Close to 22,000 now. We are growing and in definite westerly direction as Ogden and Gales. Pretty definite pattern following.

Mr. Gracey stated do have two ambulances in town, one north Chili and one Chili Center. Growth of the town in westerly section and some southerly. Just plain civilian type housing situation. Sure will increase. Do know have additional apartment complexes on the drawing board that Town Board has approved and sure there will be additional calls into those areas. Have tremendous amount of calls down in the Scottsville Road area along Barney's, Olympic, Varsity Inn area. Thinks will back me up, that of total calls approximately 1/3 motor vehicle accidents of all types. Another third transfers of residents to and from hospitals. Once in a great while have transfers to New York or Chicago which ambulance service has provided at no cost other than tax to the town. Not included in runs into Ogden which is separate situation.

Councilman Callahan stated was on Scottsville Road in front of Barney's when two cars collided and could end up three or four cars quickly. Mutual aid among volunteer ambulances, might use two ambulances on that. Mr. Gracey stated yes there are. Mutual aid needed when ambulances tied up. Have services of Gates, Churchville, Scottsville, Spencerport. There is mutual aid system and times when had both ambulances in use and had to call on other services to come into the town. There is mutual aid factor which comes into this.

Supervisor Powers stated program had last week at airport, were our ambulances involved? Mr. Gracey stated one was. Happy to say that affair ambulances gathered, TV camera panned across the field and Chili Ambulance was on TV. Supervisor Powers asked any fire equipment called in? Mr. Gracey stated in airport situation, city claims all rights on that even though physically in town. Last to hear about it. National has contract for ambulance. In disaster call Gates because have fire contract and if remember us, call us. The way our fellows work, if something is going on, sitting and waiting. Supervisor Powers stated if no one further wishes to speak on this matter, close public hearing at 9:14 P.M.

A Public Hearing was held by the Town Board of the Town of Chili in the Chili Administration Offices, 3235 Chili Avenue, Rochester, New York 14624 on October 3, 1973 at 8:30 P.M. for the purpose of the presentation of an Open Space Index of the Town of Chili by the Chili Conservation Commission (see legal notice attached).

Supervisor Powers asked everything in order? Mr. Pietropoli stated correct, Mr. Supervisor.

Mr. Paul Duff, Chairman of the Commission, appeared. Stated Chili Conservation Commission appreciates opportunity to present Open Space Index to the Town Board and citizens collected here this evening. As mentioned in the transmittal letter in the Index, discharging responsibility under State Law which charges commissions such as ours with the responsibility of preparing and presenting Index on all undeveloped land in the Town. Commission in report lists 14,600 acres comprising 60% of total area of Chili as areas feel environmentally sensitive. Of that, approximately 5800 acres designated as highest priority areas. Directly adjacent to the Black Creek and located in 10 year flood plain. As explained in report, land can be utilized and will contribute in protection fashion to growth and esthetics. One way of accomplishing is to initiate linear park along the creek. In May of this year, submitted application to Ford under Foundation Grant program asking for monies to help develop and design concept and as yet have not received monies. Conversely if areas in flood plain not controlled in their development, future residents may well assume liability rather than asset. Commission feels document presented this evening in conjunction with comprehensive plan, subdivision ordinance and proposed zoning ordinances will give future community plans perspective as to how Town should grow and develop. Feels planned and programmed growth should lead to healthy economic climate and esthetically pleasing place in which to live. Joe Abernethy, member of the commission and key person in development of index and will provide narration although I reserve the right to butt in and make comments. Other members present and would like to introduce, Sieve Hassall, Roger Stoessel, Carol Turcott, Hill Wilcox, Oave Pupo. After the slide show will have question and answer period and will moderate and call for assistance from members of the commission. Might have a few closing remarks.

(slide presentation was made at this time)

Supervisor Powers asked any Councilmen have any questions? Councilman Callahan asked would like to ask upon review of the report, saw very little though on conservation regarding industrial sites or conservation in areas you talked about. Knows exist down there. Left for later report? Mr. Abernethy stated something considered at beginning primarily as continuation of open space. Do have industrial areas within them and in some cases reference made to them. Certainly need industrial development and another committee working in that area. Doesn't think contrasting function, complimentary. Areas identified as suitable for industrial development and help to taxpayers as source for tax base. Fact that didn't include doesn't show prejudice. Primarily looked at open spaces. Councilman Callahan stated just wondered what was your thought industry wouldn't locate in some of those areas and some have railroads adjacent and Scottsville Road has certain areas. Another

item wondering did your committee ever consider planned unit development for any areas you looked at which takes in open spaces? So that development in the future would allow for open spaces? More clustered housing? Mr. Abernethy stated that is excellent way of preserving open spaces within areas that develop for subdivision if town willing to go along. That would be trying to maintain open spaces within developed areas. Wouldn't feel our right to tell or say that to the town Board that this should be policy. Councilman Callahan stated wondered if thought occurred that maybe someday in future would consider PUD developments that would preserve natural items communally has seen. Mr. Abernethy stated on Page 23 Section on Lexington Subdivision, further makes mention of cluster type subdivision and I think... Mr. Duff stated either make reference under recommendations that appropriate to have multi-family or single family housing, cluster type subdivision which does in fact reduce linear footage of roads and sewers and costs that that area plus provides for substantially more open space.

Councilman Callahan stated looking at Item 14. One request for development in that corner of that section. Had thought in that area, had your committee had any thought on expanding industrial area that way or keep in Chill-Scottsville, Archer. Beaver area open space? Mr. Duff stated thinks should realize this is beginning of where we are working and this is for future expansion and growth, what should be done is work hand in hand with Conservation Commission Inventories and Planning and Zoning Boards of the Town. Then come up with logical determination of future use. In our case would recommend possibilities. At this point aren't ready for that, in future would work hand in hand. Councilman Callahan stated in majority of recommendations would make recommendation for preserving wooded areas and certain open land use. Feel in future if something like this comes about would have citizens committees from these areas provide input, might be landowners directly involved. Mr. Duff stated right, Joe was going to mention. Mr. Abernethy stated obviously landowner has major roll in determining what use put to. All citizens of town and stake in it, certainly. Councilman Callahan stated knows there are some large landowners in area and got over 2-400 acres, R G B F has large parcel in the east, thought might be good to have input from these people in future when develop land.

Councilman Gray stated quite commendable task, great deal of work and time. Should keep in mind nothing but an inventory of where land is today and recommendations of open spaces and should expect recommend where industrial or commercial or PUD going. For many other boards and town boards to decide. Commendable job. Few areas that feel should be covered in addition and hope other councilmen will suggest, few other wooded areas not included first time around would like to see included and sure this will happen.

Mr. Duff stated make good point and as town grows relative environmental importance of these areas will change. State provided in General Municipal Law must be up-dated on yearly basis. Have mechanics for adding and deleting. One of the charges of future commission to up-date and include areas as you suggest and point well taken, might be citizen input from other areas which Commission could take under advisement and consider when made changes on annual basis.

Councilman O'Connor stated would like to add been coming to Committee as liaison and realize how much work actually doing and for how long a time. Thinks one of the finest presentations ever seen since on board. Knows future development of the town will depend a lot on work you have laid down. Would like to see your Committee strengthened a lot to have impact on future development perhaps when get into PUD development of this type. Read good job.

Councilman Criddle stated feels this is excellent beginning, as pointed out it is a beginning. From this point can move on and also mentioned mechanics-provided for updating much the same as provided in master plan. That is extremely important because interests do change. One

question, on page 2 mention points that had emerged as priority. One refers to town drainage system being protected for the safety and benefit of residents. Has committee given any thought to handling drainage on broad basis? Perhaps northern part of town north of the creek? Any thought or something hadn't gotten to? Mr. Duff stated doesn't think specifically dealt with but felt had obligation to evaluate in future.

Councilman Criddle stated parcel 8 on the map which is up just east of Willeen and Berna Lane. Recommendation for that is that it be preserved for future environmental land use. You are aware a subdivision is going into that area. Actually being bulldozed at this moment out of that area? Mr. Duff asked total or portion? Councilman Criddle stated not total, talking toward intersection of Westside and Pixley. Mr. Duff stated had to initially use major topographical characteristics for boundaries.

Supervisor Powers stated myself very pleased with what commission has done and they have had pretty free rein. Thinks personnel on this committee outstanding. In viewing some of the film and having canoeed this, seemed did more portaging than rowing and next time I go won't be with two others. Especially two I went with. Was enjoyable time, last ones homo, beat us by 10 minutes, one paddle or not. Might mention couple scenes in there ere just under Stottle Road, Mr. Wehle's, along properly where bank drops off and cleaned out a good portion, quite attractive. Commend you on that. Right there creek takes bend and a little blockage. Mr. Wehle stated isn't as bad as it was. Supervisor Powers stated maybe can help get the rest out with funding got coming. This is just one case of what can be done along the creek. Beautifully done. Knows commission itself has ideas for the future along the creek. Both in immediate future and long range. Want to thank you all.

Mr. Duff stated thank you for the kind words. Has 6 or 8 copies with me this evening, would be glad to hand out and in addition to that hope to have several more so others who didn't get, leave name with me or in Town Hall and will try to make sure copies made available.

Supervisor Powers asked any other questions? Councilman Criddle stated would be remiss if didn't mention, being in graphic arts field want commission to know that quality-wise this is a most attractive report and I know having done similar things amount of work that went into this and fine looking piece and will agree it is intelligently put together and designed and really good job. Supervisor Powers stated thinks conservation bug might have bit Planning Board. Gentleman in before the board on Caldwell Cook property who park area is and one point of discussion was woodland stay as much in tact as possible. Even if meant losing lots or making smaller but basically stay as it is as much as possible.

Mr. Wehle, Stottle Road, stated has something that goes back a little while, talked yesterday, today and tomorrow. Has something that doesn't think anyone here has ever seen. Inventory for planning 35 years ago. Done under WPA. At that time population 2493. Really jumped since then. Tax base District #1 school \$5,30/1000. Town \$12.67. Equipment of 60 houses 35 years ago, picked at random in 1937. Started in 1930. In 37, 53 wood construction, 7 tile or brick, 27 equipped with bath. Quite complete reports, everything in there. Took 7 years to install 51 had electricity, 28 telephones, 42 radios 15 iceboxes, 16 electric refrigerators. Traffic count, key station Union & Chill, weekday in January, 217 a day, Saturday 149, Sunday 247. Motor vehicle registration in 1936 in town, 215 passenger, 50 commercial. 1 suburban, some 7, covered wagons 1, etc., for a 303 total. Jump about 15 years to another master plan done by Tom Steckel in 1956. Population 9274. Recreation recommendation 1 acre for 1000 people. Today should have 200. Get 31,000 in 1990 - 310, 5 shopping centers proposed, North Chill, across the street, third whose time ran out on Union and Chill and two others that never did materialize. One

thing bothered on Master Plan, underlined in red all the way. As means of describing residential development, board proposed that residential be established as follows. EE for all that area on the south side of Black Creek. Then pick up this comprehensive plan, to retain rural and agricultural areas in areas designated as rural or agricultural, will not be served by sanitary sewers during planning period. Developed highways in this area described. In addition to points made above, over 24,000 acres and by 1990 11 or 17,000 acres committed to urban development. This represents 1/2 area in Chili. On Page 21 says conspicuously missing in the commercial recommendation are indications of possible regional level commercial shopping centers. Recommendation of this plan that areas of this scale offer some advantages and present problems of scale, site size requirements and traffic generation that give the present character and desired future of the town of Chili. would not fit to the town. Already have quick access to centers in Gates, Henrietta, etc. Page 32, Policies, only those areas designated for urban use in the plan shall be considered for extended sanitary sewer service. Main trunk line scheduled for construction south of Black Creek shall be recommended for 1985 and beyond. Then look at the map that shows runs almost parallel with line proposed for water. One going to Wheatland-Chili Town Line Road. Page 40 says it is the position of this plan that the extension of interceptors south of Black Creek during 1970 to 1990 should be rescheduled for 1985 and beyond. Presence of lines would serve to weaken the stated findings and goals and hamper proper and full development of lands north of the creek by areas south of the creek opening up to development pressures. As this interceptor is to serve the Town of Wheatland and Village of Scottsville after 1900, the master plan for the Town of Wheatland and Village of Scottsville was consulted and proposed development pattern in accord with this recommendation. That is what amazes me. Done back in 1964 by County of Monroe. Took this plan followed by County of Monroe, or Lowers did it, and under direction of county. This plan took industrial areas off of Union. Look at this land use and doesn't mean to say anything derogatory toward you or board but only interested in Chili, and particularly south Chili. This is where wife's people were born. This is home to me more than on the north side where I live. Take these sections and of the 24 sections, 23 talk of park. None of industrial or drainage. Did do considerable amount of work and thank Paul for letting me have this, wouldn't do to find wrong with it. No one knew what I would say tonight. They worked. Went around, but look at section after section, find that #1 biggest thing that bothers us today is landfill in Town of Chili and of this report only 4 members on as visiting it. Pupo Duff, Wilcox, and Abbrnathy. Look at area 1, 2 and 4. Area that lies north of the railroad. North of the thruway. Railroad almost splits in half. Whole area dependent on one thing. Mitchell Acres, and this Town Road opening up that ditch along the railroad track and somebody's got to get on hands and knees and get together with Gates and Ogden to open up. Two major divisions, Black Creek and that side to Little Black Creek. Whole area opening up now, Golden Road, Mitchell Acres all subject to that one drainage opening. Looked at this and find 1, 2 and 3, someone made mistake and said that comprehensive plan recommended multi-family. Know is single family. All 2 same and 3 same. Goes all the way down through and forgot about the north side. Well populated. Got 19,000 and enough area for parks and industrial. Won't build much more. South side has no water and sewer. Worry about county picking up sewer and running across river. Ride down East River Road, beautiful apartments, Kidak, Riverton and job to get across to go to work. Section 18, runs along the upper part of Morgan Road. Find elevation 540. Elevation on top of Morgan 613, 13 ft. higher. Land, if taken time to look at, top from Morgan all the way down through and areas where near creek goes over top of bank and sets some and knows what happens to be about 30-35 ft. above top of Black Creek. Some developer who comes along not very far away and if decided to buy property and develop, wouldn't be tough job to drain. Section on Clifton area, Harry Newman, that says preserve these by cutting top of drumlin off and make higher. Don't you think lower areas would make subdivision if filled with top of drumlin and build. Took picture of piece of property on Stottle Road and Chili-Scottsville. Is owner interested in farming any more? Owner stated quit 20 years ago. Mr. Wehle stated would like to sell property some day. Not really concerned but know would bother if would like to buy. Get to

south side of Black Creek and cannot help but wonder that twice in 1973 two proposals to run water on the south side of Black Creek and people were going to pay \$14,000 water tax a year. Knows heard Town Board members say this will open your property. This says to discourage building and know many areas south of Chili got some water over there. Maybe 70% but remember highest property in Town of Chili up to 670 ft. and could all be drained and be beautiful property. Should start to begin to look at the other towns. Bad mistake to initiate sewer plant. Initial cost \$75 a year. Last year-1972, went up \$27 a unit. Had two units, twice as much. But this cost went up, for what? So that we could furnish sewer through the county of Monroe to Henrietta, River-ton, Rrighion. I am one of the ones that held up for 6 months until brought water line in Gates. South side water is there. Talks about recreation, want to thank the Judge for article in paper today. For this reason when spend \$600,000 for a building and look at Bob Hunter with boarded up windows and we paid for it. Maybe could get some of those pieces of property and use. Three other school districts in town. Why do we have to continually bond ourselves to death. Let people in south Chili, thinks only 1600 children in school. This is probably the way it has been for how long. On austerity budget after 4 votes with tax rate of \$134. Thinks important that you people begin to look out at north side growing by itself but look over there and put water and sewer in there. Instead of Henrietta, spend money in Chili. Open talks for county programs in Chili. Begin to. If you would ever like to talk about it again, I would.

Mr. Uff asked may I have a copy of your testimony? Points are valid. Couldn't possibly answer all questions or what I thought were questions, but for the record sure more than people listed who went out to the Black Creek park and investigates potential dump site. Problem on going basis. People listed went out specifically for the task. Mr. Wehle stated didn't mean to take crack at you because still thinks same of this report when handed to me. Thinks direction to your committee was wrong that we have many oilier things much more important and if look at 1990 when talking about 40,000 people according to Lozler figure 100 people per acre would only need 400 acres at that time. Almost have without buying. Does think creek needs cleaning, does think direction for south Chili should not be, doesn't have to go to South chili caroa, Golden Road where in report, possibly wouldn't be bay for them to continue if agricultural. What else can they do, cannot grow cukes. That area does have sewer in a tremendous cost and some day will be developed.

Mr. William Kelly, County Legislator, stated would like to compliment commission on fine product. Mr. Abernethy, well-chosen words. Pictures done excellently. Do portray accurately scenes of the Town of Chili. Should feel proud we have such dedicated people to work on the program. Doesn't have copy of proposal. Will try to get hold of one. Question occurred to me, total number of acres proposed to be dedicated to open space areas and total amount of assessment that would be involved in that acreage? Perhaps in report? Mr. Duff stated this isn't. Thinks misunderstanding amount of acreage nominally included was just a listing of the open spaces in Chili. That was approximately 14,650 acres or 60.8%. Merely serves as function of being listing of undeveloped land in the Town and recommendations listed at end of each section are recommendations of members subject to change and citizens input and each merely constitutes listing and collection of those. Mr. Kelly asked strictly inventory of the town. Mr. Duff stated that is exactly what it is and that is charge under state law. Mr. Pupo stated basically what we have done as entire groups is survey land in the town and what you have seen is exactly what you are looking for. Citizen input to change it on annual basis and how we can get people involved in proper development of the town and that is what we hope whole inventory starts opening. Where everybody can do something in the Town and prevent what has happened in other towns in the county.

Supervisor Powers asked any other questions? Mr. Koily stated if possible could research question if 60% of the land open space, what assessment is of that 60% compared to total assessment?

Mr. Kozlowski (Frank) stated administrator of estate on Stottle Road. Regarding future use of land there substantially open space for 15 years. Presently farmed by farmer in North Chill and looking at how to sustain expense of property for 15 years. Cannot go back to farming. Mentioned other farmer cannot benefit if go back. You sustain tax hills for next 10 years at this pace? Land will go up some but won't if coded as open land. Looking at ~~rate~~ of tax increase over 5 years rate will go up proportionately to increase of value of land. Income not sustaining expenses for the year. Deficit every year. Have to come up with means of making deficit plus figure. Only option to sell to speculator. Look at properties in south Chill and people that don't farm, unless have other source of income than property, going to be in situation where best speculative offer comes, will sell. Cannot sustain. Thinks help people to find way of preserving but rate going, not giving us any financial benefit. Have families and homes to sustain. Just doesn't seem to make out right now. Those are my feelings looking at objectives with this property.

Mr. Wehle stated owned property for 24 years. One of the first things did was clean swamp and bog. Scouts have used, churches, baseball team, hockey, etc. Loves to see local people. Always used property for recreation and never asked anybody unless way out of order to leave property. Local people. Asked one taking pictures to take picture of bottles, tin cans, that some of the sportsmen isft in creek. One thing that will never happen, open up for linear park under much protest for the simple reason no one will ever tell me who is going along my property and who isn't. Fear element seen out there and know of case a few years ago, two girls on the creek down on Archer Road area. For that reason, when opened up 24 hours a day, not my piece. Local people and children always welcome. Always have been but not outsiders.

A Public Hearing was held by the Town Board of the Town of Chill in the Chill Administration Offices, 3235 Chill Avenue, Rochester, N. Y. 14624 on November 7, 1973 at 8:30 P.M. to consider the estimated budget for the Town of Chill for the year 1974. (See legal notice attached.)

Roll Call: Supervisor James J. Powors, Councilman William Callahan, Councilman Robert Criddle, Councilman Donald O'Connor, Councilman William Tiray

Also Present: Town Clerk Mrs. Robbins, Town Attorney Patrick Pietropaoli, Deputy Town Attorney Alfred Heilman, Supl. of Highways and Comm. of Public Works Stephen Chudyk, Lozlers Consulting Engineer James Mannara, Insurance Counsellor J. Norman Vall

Supervisor Powers asked is everything in order? Mr. Pietropaoli stated yes, notice of the public hearing on the preliminary budget was duly published pursuant to sections of the Town Law in an official newspaper designated by this Town as an official newspaper for the Town of Chill and Mrs. Robbins has in her possession affidavits of that publication which were hand delivered.

Supervisor Powers stated get right into it. Sure you may have some questions. Ask Mrs. Horstman to come up and join us. Any questions? Councilman Callahan stated when examined budget on General fund things came up with revenue of \$288,000 but when added revenue individually in the detailed report only came up with \$735,000. Mrs. Horstman asked did Mrs. Robbins tell you, inadvertently mortgage tax was omitted? Included, but when typed up... Supervisor Powers stated believes \$55,000. Mrs. Horstman stated told Mrs. Robbins to tell you, \$55,000. Councilman Callahan stated that is the missing amount. Could you tell what actual amount of mortgage tax for 1973 is estimated to be? Mrs. Horstman stated in the budget estimated at \$45,000. Councilman Callahan asked think more money that will increase it? Mrs. Horstman stated won't get second payment until December. Expect more because of Grants and apartments.

Councilman Callahan asked any reason why Revenue Sharing funds, \$97,000 don't appear as appropriation of revenue? Mentioned in budget but not mentioned in recap as appropriation in budget. Mrs. Horstman stated on Page 36. Councilman Callahan asked where did you add that in? Mrs. Horstman stated shown on front as separate item on recap. Councilman Criddle stated didn't see that. Mrs. Horstman stated wasn't in there, hadn't been done since I was out. When came back, did it. Councilman Callahan asked corresponding... Mrs. Horstman stated Page 36 I believe. Councilman Callahan asked may I see one of those copies? This is a copy? Do we have in here what spending \$98,000 on? Mrs. Horstman stated Page 36. Councilman Callahan asked Page 36? Supervisor Powers stated road repairs, highway garage, recreation building, parks, highway department equipment.

Councilman Callahan asked why show in the Preliminary Budget. Donovan Plan revenues for \$2103,35? Seems sat at Board meeting some months ago and led to believe would get much more than that? Some change from what led to believe? Mr. Chudyk, didn't you request approximately \$100,000? Mr. Chudyk stated was for three years, 74 to 76. Councilman Callahan asked only \$2,000 for next year? Mr. Chudyk stated that is all. Councilman Callahan asked how much do we have to spend on our own? 1/3? Mr. Chudyk stated 75%, they furnish 25%. Councilman Callahan asked plan to do a majority of that work in another year? Mr. Chudyk stated spread over three years. Certain roads indicated for certain years. 1974 light, 75 heavier and 76 still heavier. Not under program for last 10 or 12 years and didn't want to jump into it without knowing what complications would be involved. Supervisor Powers stated thinks we have letter indicating what roads are involved. Councilman Callahan stated actually only 1/3 of the plan. Mr. Chudyk stated one year of the three years, lightest year actually.

Councilman Callahan stated sees in other years approximately \$200,000 surplus. Any reason \$160,000 at this time? Mrs. Horstman stated felt could use and Audit and Control doesn't want too high. Councilman Callahan asked could maintain balance at \$160,000? Mrs. Horstman stated that is right. Councilman Callahan stated thought Town Clerk's office quite low. Any reason for lower rate than what submitted? Mrs. Horstman stated it is for the total salary, thought this was Justified. Councilman Callahan stated that is all I have at this moment.

Councilman Criddle stated apparently in Town Clerk's office indicated by amount that jotted down in budget that town clerk not going to be receiving any help in 1974. Mrs. Horstman stated from office pool. Supervisor Powers stated help available within secretarial staff on duty in Town Hall. Ample personnel to serve with the clerk. Councilman Criddle stated providing nothing for deputy town clerk. You feel that is justified? Supervisor Powers stated feel we have personnel here that could assist in the town clerk's office. Councilman Criddle stated would seem to me that inasmuch as elected official, what pointing out as elected official would seem in fairness that the Town Clerk should be allowed and realize gone over and over this thing for the last two years and probably through it again, but thinks in all justification town clerk should be allowed to make own selection of clerk and town board should set salary. Should not have deputy pressed upon her who is not of her own choice. Thinks prerogative of town clerk's office and important enough for a smooth running organization and thinks you are as interested in this as I am that should provide along that line. Supervisor Powers stated thinks with personnel we have available we could get nothing but a smooth running town clerk's office with existing personnel. No question in my mind.

Councilman Criddle stated notice 14 of the 19 towns in the county have given taxpayers some relief in tax rate. Here in Chili see our assessed valuation over past years has increased pretty close to \$7.5 million. Received revenue sharing or will receive by July next year, 6200,000. There was substantial unexpended balance a couple of years ago when Republicans last in office. Would seem taxpayer deserving of a reduction in his tax rate. If 14 out of 19 can do this for their residents would seem Chili could certainly follow suit and do the same thing. Observation. Realize won't get anywhere with it because apparently have in your judgement decided taxpayers don't deserve a decrease or cannot maintain services and extend decrease in rate but feels certainly would be justified. Supervisor Powers asked where would you cut? Councilman Criddle stated certainly would think that in your good judgement could find an area in your budget for this kind of relief to be extended. Supervisor Powers asked Mrs. Horstman would you call this fairly tight budget? Mrs. Horstman stated to operate on this next year, yes. So tight, didn't know if want to mention, retirement bill came in after did this and short already. Supervisor Powers stated secondly believes surplus we have, very little beyond unexpended balance which was recommended by the state two or three years ago because there was quite a surplus beyond unexpended balance and wanted more realistic type budget and very tight budget.

Councilman Callahan stated since using federal revenue sharing funds to balance budget and doesn't have copy of what got on for any equipment purchases in there, out of federal revenue sharing? Mr. Chudyk stated \$30,000. Supervisor Powers stated got it in there. Not saying going to get it. In there. We are not bound absolutely. You have sat with us in executive session and until resolution is put before the board making expenditure, remains flexible with the money. These are flexible too. Councilman Callahan stated wondering and thinks should buy good and proper equipment. See in 1974 budget \$146,000 for Item 3 machinery. Add another \$30,000 from revenue sharing, 8176,000 which is more than had for any particular year can recall. Mrs. Horstman stated only \$36,750 on page 76. Councilman Callahan stated thinks on the summary, machinery, Highway Item P3. Mrs. Horstman stated equipment \$36,750. Councilman Callahan asked how does that compare with previous years? Mrs. Horstman stated \$35,000 for 1973. Councilman Callahan stated with revenue sharing doubling that amount. Any area there that could be

redistributed in the budget to give tax decrease? Mr. Chudyk stated not if we are to buy equipment when we need it. Equipment slays outside and deteriorates much faster than if in garage. Don't have garage to put equipment in, \$30,000 under federal revenue sharing doesn't mean will get it. Just estimate. Doesn't know if will get it. Councilman Callahan stated guess figures show if I am correct, revenue sharing from last year, this year and through July will give \$200,000. Would seem from that money, since windfall money, wasn't originally anticipated, some could provide tax relief for the homeowners and property owners in Chill.

Councilman Gray stated five of us and we sat down and discussed where money goes and at that time you requested \$10,000 be given back to the taxpayer. Subsequently agreed with every item on that survey as to where money would go because arrived at by consensus. Now say let's give money back. Budget due and campaign ended last night. Councilman Callahan stated only at one meeting. Doesn't know how many meetings had. Funds received in 1972 which had no knowledge of. Supervisor Powers stated you were here.

Councilman Callahan stated right that was spent by the administration. Still think not all that \$200,000. Only one I sat in on was 697,000. Supervisor Powers stated missed one, came in late. Councilman Gray stated other one asked to bring in written statement and didn't bring one. Councilman Callahan stated brought written one asking for \$10,000 tax relief. Still think something should be done for taxpayers. Supervisor Powers stated this is Chill, doesn't know what other towns have done with moneys. Of course it is election year also. You cannot use federal revenue sharing moneys to cut taxes. Not saving cannot be done but not recommended because changes tax effort which is part of the formula on which moneys computed and in the long range it could cut or drop what your share might be in the future. Councilman Callahan stated understands, if town vital and growing would have increased assessment which would increase money each year.

Councilman Gray stated would like to comment on the budget. In looking over it is tight budget. Unexpended balance down to reasonable amount. No money hidden anywhere. Please again that only raises involved anywhere are cost of living raises and uniformly applied to elected and appointed officials. Not large for elected aid workers yet token increase. Talk about taxpayers. Perhaps didn't cut but hold and few towns can say same as 1967 or 68. Many towns did cut taxes this year and had raises since the 1967-68 period of time. Willing to match services given by this town to any other town. Feels tight budget and thinks will have hard time living within it during the year. With inflation, to hold tax rate constant takes a great deal of growth, and belt tightening on part of officials and employees and frankly happy able to hold, let alone cut.

Councilman Callahan stated thinks fortunate have excessive surplus left by Republican administration. Councilman Gray stated don't usually thank you but guess I will bow to that. Councilman O'Connor stated seems two years ago told would be bankrupt by now anyway.

Councilman Criddle stated still great deal of significance that 14 of the 19 towns, and doesn't think a tight budget is unique to Chill, no extra money floating around. 14 towns able to lower rate in some cases quite substantially. Doesn't feel Chill exception to this. This can be done. Wouldn't have to be a huge decrease but could have been decrease in this budget. Talk about revenue sharing not being used to lower taxes. I agree but for dollar of revenue have dollar purchase of equipment. Ways of juggling funds so wouldn't specifically use revenue sharing. Use to lower taxes instead of buying equipment. Ways to do it without using to lower tax rate. All that talk about holding the line may be well and good but does think could have done something for the taxpayer this year.

Councilman O'Connor stated thinks all aiming for the same thing and realize we have some fiscal plans that have kept this town solvent for number of years. Thinks Mrs. Horstman deserves a lot of credit, set the budget for a number of years. When talk about the revenue sharing funds, actually all realize these are estimated expenses and only just that. Once you receive the funds then this board acts as to how it is going to be spent. Actually have opportunity to see if services along the line, doing the job and road repair going and highway equipment, what are we going to do with it, have to give back to the people with taxes. Thinks growing but services will have to grow too and smart to go along with it when time comes. Have to put in estimate as to how going to spend money. Purely that as far as government concerned, Once we receive, as long as spend within legal limits, do it then.

Councilman Callahan asked what is procedure on adopting budget? Do you make suggested changes in the budget at this time? Close hearing and take vote and make recommended changes? Supervisor Powers stated close hearing and adopt the budget and if adopted won't be any changes. Councilman Callahan stated would like to make change at present time. Mrs. Horstman stated cannot during public hearing. Councilman Callahan asked how could I do this then? Mrs. Horstman stated at Town Board meeting. Councilman Callahan stated would like to make transfer of fund in appropriations and revenue, come out of different areas. I will put in the minutes of this meeting and then bring it up again in case I did at wrong time, will come up twice. January 1, 1972 cash on hand in general fund \$269,000. Balance on December 31st 1262,000. Amount of money to have as balance in 1973 estimated at \$120,000. Increasing out of last unexpended is \$160,000 but maintaining \$120,000 balance with difference of \$40,000. If had balance last December of \$262,000 and extra \$40,000 off of that come down to \$222,000 actual surplus. Mrs. Horstman stated \$120,000 off of that. Councilman Callahan stated if have \$170,000 at the end one washes out the other. Would like to transfer in the budget someplace an extra \$10,000 on unexpended balance, raise from \$160,000 to \$170,000 and have extra \$10,000 appropriated over to the town clerk's office for personal services or some appropriate item that she feels is needed in her office to raise from \$14,000 to \$24,000 and take out of unexpended balance. Councilman O'Connor stated just talking about giving revenue sharing to the people. Councilman Callahan stated take it out of unexpended balance. Supervisor Powers stated understand cannot do it at this time. Make recommendation at Town Board. Mrs. Horstman stated that is right.

Supervisor Powers asked anyone in the audience wish to be heard? Any other questions? Public Hearing will be closed at 9:00 P.M.

Supervisor Powers stated at last meeting, thinks 18¢ per front foot and \$1.62 per \$1000. Anyone in the audience that wishes to speak on this budget? If not, will... Councilman Callahan stated would like to say something. Does anybody recall, went through back a couple of the books and see had two accounts for Chili Water. Only one now. Anybody recall how merged the two accounts? One was just on bond indebtedness and other on general account (or the Chili Water District. Only one account now. Councilman Criddle stated appears bond account closed right out, wound up with zero balance at the end of 1971. Supervisor Powers stated should have the budget officer here, cannot answer that.

Councilman Callahan stated second of them was noticed years ago had \$80,000 bond indebtedness each year. Up to \$100,000. Built into original plan or resolution by the board to change it? Supervisor Powers stated not bonding export and not sure if it was built in. Mr. Pietropaoli stated Mrs. Horsman would have to answer. Councilman Criddle stated does have from the assessor that built in when bond issue first set up. However, doesn't know why. Or question that bothers me and also bothers assessor, no answer for it, why interest rate has jumped some \$4,000. Think we paid about \$80,000 for the years 1969, 70 and 71, on the principal. In 1969 paid \$88,400 on the interest. Paid 555,200 in 1970 and paid 582,000 in 1971. Doesn't have figure for 1972 but in 1973 thinks indicated interest paid would amount of 884,000. Councilman Callahan stated \$78,000 in 1972. Councilman Criddle stated \$78,000. What confuses me anytime you amortize bond issue or mortgage or what have you, as you lower principal your interest payment comes down ordinarily. Paying more on your principal and less interest. However, this interest seems to be going up. From \$78,000 in 1972 to \$84,000 in 1973. Principal went up from \$80,000.

Councilman Callahan stated understand State Legislature allowed raises in rates on loans and time deposits this year. Once given out bonds, can rates be changed at all? Mr. Pietropaoli stated pursuant to what State Legislature did this year. Doesn't think so. Councilman Criddle stated would like to see us hold or approving this. Mr. Pietropaoli stated thinks what happened in this instance, schedule set up when bond issued raised and in later years less would be paid and as town grew, pay more and more on the indebtedness. Probably how schedule set up. When bond issues raised and in the earlier years less would be paid. Councilman Criddle stated apparently it was. Mr. Pietropaoli stated according to information had, apparently looks that way. Type of schedule set up in such a way that in earlier years, because capital expense so great and population of the town not large enough to afford greater payments, in earlier years, because capital expense so great, and as the town, apparently Mr. Mannara knows something about that. In the later years because of growth of the town, bigger payments in bond interest and principal are due and payable. That is what looks like to me. Familiar with the fact that certain towns and villages and municipalities do operate in that way and can have bond issues set up that way. Doesn't have to be equal payments each year.

Councilman Criddle stated why interest payment has gone up so bothers me. Can understand how principal would vary. Mr. Mannara stated first 5 years small lump sum and next five years double that so interest rate greater. Councilman Criddle stated original bond issue amount that was floated doesn't change. Still paying on approximately \$2 million. Mr. Mannara stated doesn't understand, town has grown and since grown, more houses in helweon and properties, why shouldn't this come down? Should be cheaper. Mr. Pietropaoli stated reason is that we have set up the way I explained before, if the growth doesn't parallel payments, have to be made in the later years of the bond issue. Obviously principal and interest payments won't come down. Mr. Mannara stated grown larger. Councilman Gray stated maybe town grew but not district. Mr. Pietropaoli stated in the improvement district talking about growth may not have equalled the anticipated growth in the district when bond issue floated. Consequently reduction in what it should have been. Councilman O'Connor stated something could go over with Mrs. Horstman but in some cases where bonds taken out, thinks matter of a few years and renew at the going interest rate and this is probably the case here.

Councilman Callahan asked could you give me proposed front footage and assessment amounts? Supervisor Powers stated thinks \$1.62 per \$1000 and 18¢ per front foot, total to be raised \$138,997.27 for 1974. Councilman Callahan asked would we get in trouble by holding vote to the first meeting in December? Supervisor Powers stated thinks County would like to have this figure as soon as possible. Mr. Pietropaoli stated bills cannot be printed until got tax rate. Councilman Criddle stated doesn't necessarily question. Guess would like to have more information but doesn't think necessary to hold it up. Supervisor Powers stated one thing Mrs. Horstman indicated at last meeting, she did mention failed to pick up what was needed. Councilman Criddle stated bookkeeping error, right. Supervisor Powers stated sure you can call her and get the answers. Councilman O'Connor stated could call on her tonight.

Mr. William Wilcox, Stuart road, asked is this talking about Water District of the Town of Chili? Supervisor Powers stated Chili Water District. Mr. Wilcox asked has Chili Water District expanded since it started? When expand it builders boundaries laid out on the map and builders. When build new subdivision, they paid for that water themselves, the pie that went through the water district, and the district stayed inside of its boundaries, hasn't it? Then why should it be going up in your interest rates, higher because all laid out 20 or 30 year bond on that when put in. Supervisor Powers stated cannot remember how long, 1980 or 90. Councilman Gray stated thinks right in terms of outside boundaries. Believes Chili Water District has been developed inside the district where builder did not pay and when permitted to connect in without paying as of a couple of years ago. Mr. Wilcox asked was that when water authority gave us a good shafting on it? Running for those years and then got stuck with Monroe County Water Authority. This has been hot subject with me since started. Councilman Gray stated didn't think that was the time of the big shafting. Mr. Wilcox stated sewers got that shafting on.

Supervisor Powers asked anyone else from the audience? if not, close the Public Hearing at 8:30 P.M.
