Campaign flier is disavowed

A committee leader has disavowed a controversial campaign flier, mailed to voters on the eve of Tuesday's city council election which insinuates that an incumbent seeking re-election

is "meeting behind closed doors privately" with developers.

The flier carries the name of the Wayne Westland Citizens Information Committee with the home address of chairwoman Elizabeth Potter and the group's bulk mailing permit.

But Potter told the Observer in a telephone interview Sunday afternoon that she was "livid" after learning of the flier. She stressed that the committee had nothing to do with it and that it was written by a man who joined the group about four months ago.

He is no longer a member, Potter said in declining to identify him.

The flier was originally planned to be an endorsement publication.

Potter said she initially received several angry phone calls from people who hung up on her. That was before she had seen the flier.

Targets of the flier are Councilman Glenn Anderson, seeking a second term, and Richard LeBlanc, a Wayne-Westland school board trustee in his first council campaign.

The two are campaigning together and sharing some campaign expenses, they said in an earlier interview.

Anderson thought it was ironic that he was being singled out for being too friendly with developers since he said that he continuously argued for improved and more expensive plans submitted by developers.

Student, UAW trainer honored

A William Ford Vocational/Technical Center student and advisory committee member were honored at the Michigan Council on Vocational Education Association conference held in Kalamazoo.

One honoree is Andrew Siwarski, a desktop publishing student who mastered the necessary keyboarding skills despite a Duchennes Muscular Dystrophy disability which limits his hand movement to a maximum of six inches. The 18-year-old Westland resident, who gets around the center in a wheelchair, graduated high school in June and is now pursuing desktop publishing studies at Schoolcraft College.

Also honored at the annual conference was Ray Crane, who is an active member of the Ford Center's numerous business/industry and school-to-work committees. He is a maintenance training coordinator at the Ford Motor Co.'s Wayne Assembly Plant.

Rich Hamrick, a Ford Center assistant principal, said the awards program honors outstanding career/tech students and adults who "have generally assisted in the delivery of vocational education as volunteers."

Despite his physical disability, Siwarski not only mastered the computer skills needed for desktop publishing, but maintained a consistent "A" grade point average and scored the only "A" on the final exam given by the career/tech center.

Hamrick quoted a program an-

nouncement from the awards conference to say that Siwarski's "enthusiasm for his technical training inspired other students to complete tasks beyond the requirement for the course. His peers seek him out for interaction and advice on a regular basis. He is admired by the center's staff and students for his sense of humor and vibrant, infectious personality."

In class, Siwarski was able to organize and maintain computer job files for future use and reference, including hard drive, file server and disc management.

Hamrick said the student has the technical skills to produce publications through the use of a computer and modem. At Schoolcraft College, Siwarski is studying graphic communication and design in hopes of

starting his own home-based desktop publishing business.

Nominated for the award by teacher Sue Anderson and Diane McLean, teacher consultant, Siwarski is active with a local sports team made up of disabled athletes.

He helps the recreation department staffers by running errands for various special events.

Crane "has been in a perfect position to influence both union and management attitudes toward the schools and serve as a catalyst for numerous cooperative ventures between the two institutions," the center said.

"Crane has personally conducted over 100 hours of plant tours for school staff and student groups. He

Victim skips court hearing

A Westland man has been ordered to stand trial on charges of raping a Detroit woman, even though the alleged victim didn't show up Thursday for a court proceeding.

Randall Schroeder, 31, is accused of raping the 31-year-old woman after forcing her to go behind Kelly's Emergency Room Lounge on Palmer Road east of Merriman. The incident allegedly occurred at 1 a.m. Oct. 21.

Schroeder was ordered to stand trial for third-degree criminal sexual conduct after he waived a preliminary hearing Thursday in front of Westland 18th District Court Judge C. Charles Bokos.

Investigating police Sgt. Terry Donohue had been concerned that the charge against Schroeder might be dismissed because the woman hasn't cooperated with police.

Even though the woman didn't

Parents to lawmakers: slow down

Thirteen Livonia school district parents trekked to Lansing Wednesday to stop what one lawmaker called the "100-yard dash" to launch schools of choice in Michigan and to completely revamp the state school code.

Every year, Livonia Parent Teacher Association, which includes chapters from the Westland portion of the district, as well as PTAs throughout the state send a group to Lansing on Legislation Day to question lawmakers on issues close to the heart of the Michigan PTA.

This year, because of the speed both issues had moved through the Senate, there was a special urgency to the parents' mission.

"We're hoping to slow this down," said Judy Sinning, a member of the Frost and Churchill PTAs and Livonia PTA Council. "We're afraid they're trying to put this through too fast. Normally, on Legislation Day, we cover a great deal of topics. But this is our major concern this year."

Mayor, Mehl argue over TV commercial

Westland Mayor Robert Thomas is claiming that statements he made about former Councilman Kenneth Mehl have been distorted in a television commercial being aired in Mehl's comeback bid.

But Mehl denies the claim and is accusing the mayor of trying to thwart his campaign for a council seat, which Mehl said he would use to challenge the city's spending practices.

The dispute shows that even in a new election year, old enemies can shake off the dust and resume their

battle stations.

The controversy comes on the eve of Tuesday's election in which eight candidates are competing for four seats. Incumbents Glenn Anderson, Thomas Brown, David Cox and Charles Pickering are in competition with challengers Mehl, retired state Rep. Justine Barns, Wayne-Westland school board member Richard LeBlanc, and seven-time candidate Dorothy Smith.

Polls will be open from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. City Clerk Diane Fritz has predicted an 18-percent turnout among the city's 52,500 registered voters.

Mehl, a former three-term council member, routinely clashed with Thomas before leaving the council two years ago. Mehl left the council after launching a failed mayoral bid against Thomas.

Thomas, in a letter to the Observer, criticized Mehl for using an old film clip from a council meeting in which Thomas commended Mehl for his intelligence on municipal government matters.

"The problem is that he failed to air the remainder of the comments that I made," Thomas said.

The complimentary remark to

Mehl was followed by the mayor's statements that Mehl should put his knowledge to positive use rather than using it vindictively, Thomas said.

Mehl's 30-second commercial is airing 162 times prior to Tuesday's election on such stations as CNN and ESPN, Mehl said, and he defended himself against Thomas' criticism.

"We didn't alter anything, nothing whatsoever," he said. "We didn't say anything that he didn't say."

Mehl said he and his supporters used the mayor's comments in his commercial because "we wanted him to help us."

Thomas said he raised the issue because he wanted voters to know that he doesn't support Mehl for a council seat in Tuesday's election. The mayor noted that he has officially endorsed only Anderson and LeBlanc, though he has made complimentary comments about other candidates.

Thomas said that Mehl's departure fostered a better relationship between his administration and the seven-member council.

Mehl offered a different opinion about the improved relationship.

"I think probably more or less it's because nobody on the council challenges anything, and it's like they have a country club going," he said.

Mehl said he believes that Thomas wants to keep him off of the council to avoid having Mehl closely scrutinize spending measures and other administrative recommendations.

Mayor Robert Thomas has accused council candidate Kenneth Mehl of taking a two-year-old quote of his out of context to use in a TV commercial to make it appear that the mayor is supporting Mehl.

Mehl said he was "surprised" that the mayor took issue with his commercial.

"I think it's kind of funny, myself," he said.

The mayor wasn't laughing.

"I do not believe that Ken Mehl is the right choice for our Westland residents as a member of our City Council," he said. "There are too many good candidates to choose from who will try to work with one another to make sure that our residents get the best for their community."

The 13 PTA parents — Sinning, Joyce Galindo, Tom Bailey, Patti O'Neil, Cathy Krucki, Connie Triplett, Dianne Naderi, Jo Morgan, Mary Bartkowiak, Betty Davis, Karen Holmes, Emmet Holmes and Kathy Lefler — broke into groups and talked with Sen. Robert Geake, R-Northville, Rep. Gerry Law, R-Plymouth, and Rep. Lynn Bankes, R-Redford.

Geake already had voted for both issues; the Republican-sponsored bills recently passed the Senate on a 21-16 party-line vote. However, substitute bills may emerge in the House that require another vote in the Senate.

Now, the drama unfolds in the House, where Republicans have a slim 56-54 majority. The votes of Bankes and Law could be crucial.

"It's not popular to be a Republican and go against this, but Law said he felt obligated because it is what his constituents want," said

Morgan, a member of the Randolph PTA.

In an otherwise disappointing trip, Law's support came as a ray of sunshine to the parents. They said they left Bankes' office with no reassurance that the bills would either be slowed down or that she would oppose them.

"She said it was politically correct to get the code passed now; I don't understand what that means," Sinning said. "The Michigan PTA is concerned about the code, but I don't think it will make a difference. I don't think anything was accomplished in terms of slowing this down."

Mary Bartkowiak, a member of the Taylor PTA, called the parents' visit with Geake a "miserable experience."

"He's taken such a strong stand in favor of schools of choice," Bartkowiak said. "He's not only uninterested in our views, but

amused we didn't agree with him."

All three lawmakers, plus Rep. Eileen DeHart, D-Westland, recently appeared before district administrators and the school board to explain legislation all concede is on a "fast track." A portion of DeHart's district is within the boundaries of Livonia Public Schools.

District officials view both bills with alarm, saying they are being pushed forward with little attention to details.

The trustees recently voted to oppose adoption of both proposals until these details are spelled out.

School code reforms would repeal 2,841 sections of the old code, add 15 new sections and modify 37 others. If approved, major changes would take place in core curriculum, teacher certification, parental rights in the classroom and charter schools.

Educators agree some of the reforms may be a good thing; they

just want legislators to be sure they know what they're doing — and the legal ramifications — in changing the rules that govern public education in Michigan.

While a Republican, Law sees little merit in the two bills being pushed by his party. "It's just a rush, a 100-yard dash, to do this. Debate so far has not been strong, even on the Senate side."

Law said he sympathizes with parents who believe the state doesn't care about their views.

"Most parents are not looking for gimmicks, just good local public schools," and Lansing tells them, nobody thinks that's important," Law said. "I sympathize with parents who ask: what is going on? The state pushed hard for testing, core curriculum, accountability. Now, there's a complete turnaround."

"Two years from now, will we turn around again and go in some other direction? They can't jack schools around all the time."

In a joint statement Sunday, Anderson and LeBlanc said that it is unfortunate that "all too often in our community these type of faceless committees spring up for the sole purpose of spreading suspicion, innuendo, and many times flat-out lies about candidates."

"We believe there are no more than a handful of politicians, one school board member and a couple other and former office holders, who are involved," they said in declining to identify the persons.

"It is sad that they lack the courage to step into view, but chose instead to hide behind this so-called 'citizens committee' to make these baseless charges. While we have received only positive calls of support since residents began receiving this, it is interesting that neither of the four

candidates who are supported by this group have called to distance themselves or their campaigns from this flier."

"Sadly, hiding behind an 'unknown citizens committee' to trash another candidate is a tactic some chose," they concluded.

The flier reiterated previous committee criticisms about LeBlanc's votes as a school board member on cutting secondary school busing during a budget crisis two years ago and school attendance boundary changes.

The flier included two photos of a combined Anderson/LeBlanc campaign sign and asked "who's hiding behind this sign?"

came to court Thursday, the charge stood as Schroeder voluntarily waived a preliminary hearing and was bound over for trial in Detroit Recorder's Court.

The woman has stopped staying with her Detroit parents, and Donohue said he has tried unsuccessfully to learn of her whereabouts. Her apparent unwillingness to assist police has raised questions about whether there will be a victim to testify against Schroeder in Recorder's Court.

Schroeder could face a maximum sentence of 15 years in prison if convicted of third-degree criminal sexual conduct. Initial police statements mistakenly indicated that Schroeder had been charged with first-degree CSC.

Schroeder was arraigned on the charge on Oct. 22 in the out-county district court. He was released a short time later after \$760 was posted toward a \$7,500/10 percent bond, set by Livonia District Judge Robert Brzezinski during the weekend arraignment.

The alleged rape victim told police that she had phoned for a taxi cab and was waiting outside of Kelly's Lounge when someone ap-

proached her and forced her to go behind the bar, Donohue said.

The woman tried unsuccessfully to fight off her assailant during the incident in which Donohue said the victim was "brutally raped."

After the rape allegedly occurred, the woman phoned Westland police from the intersection of Merriman and Parkwood.

Police came to Kelly's Lounge and arrested Schroeder, whom Donohue said was inside the bar.

Infant care program was 'canceled' in 1988

A funny thing happened on the way to hiking the price parents pay for infant care at Jackson Center, run by Livonia Public Schools.

Trustee Pat Tancill remembered the Livonia Board of Education voted to phase out the program in 1988.

The phase-out and closing of the program apparently never took place because the program now has 60 infants and toddlers in it.

Jay Young, who heads the program, was about to make a pitch for increasing the program's fee when Tancill recalled the controversial debate that took place seven years ago during the administration of James P. Carli.

At that time, many emotional pleas were made to keep the program open.

Of today's trustees, only Tancill and Joe Laura sat on Livonia's board back then. Tancill backed phasing out the program; Laura wanted to keep it open. The vote was 5-2 in favor of the phase-out.

The board in 1988 voted to first close the program to new enrollments and then close it down completely after all the infants in it had reached age 2 1/2. Based on that, the program should have shut down by June 1991.

Now, before they can approve a fee increase for the program, the trustees must first decide what to do about the 1988 board decision to disband.

"The board needs to decide, either to vote to reverse that decision, or to do nothing," Tancill said. "We must resolve this, one way or the other."

The trustees will discuss the dilemma in a Nov. 27 committee meeting.

The dilemma surfaced after Young, in a July letter, told parents in the infant care program that they face a fee increase in January 1996.

When Young told the trustees of the proposed increase, Tancill recalled that the program for infants had been killed.

Young investigated, and the following facts surfaced: Following the board's decision, the phase-out began. No new infants were admitted.

Then, in 1990, the district decided to move Bentley Center's child care program to Jackson. This program included infants, and that upped the number of infants in Jackson Center's program.

Subsequently, for licensing purposes, one room at Jackson was designated for infants only. However, that room did not bring in enough money because the infants of Bentley students got child care at either a free or reduced rate.

To bring in more money, the program was once again opened to the community.

In 1993, the children of Bentley students were moved back to Bentley. But the program at Jackson Center continued. As of August, 10 children of district employees were enrolled.

At its Nov. 27 meeting, Young will ask trustees to consider the following in its decision whether to keep the program open:

- Livonia needs quality care for infants up to age 30 months.
- No tax dollars are used to run the Jackson Center program.
- With the proposed fee increase, the program will be self-sufficient.
- Residents and employees should have preference in enrolling their children.

Young will ask the trustees to

"affirm the value and need for an infant child care program in the district and authorize the Community Services Department to continue operating the program."

"We will work towards revenue enhancements to make the program finally self-sufficient," he said.

The program's estimated 1995-96 cost is \$389,000. Under the proposed fee increase, families would pay \$488 a month, beginning in January.

To meet program expenses, the 60 families who use the program should pay \$541 a month, said Carol Smiley of Jackson Center.

"The rate change in January will not correct the overage; however, it will initiate the differential rate based on the child's age, which we have failed to do in the past," Smiley said. "We could conceivably be self-supporting in July 1996."

In 1988, the board cited numerous reasons for phasing out the program:

- Increased legal liability to the district for a program dealing with the youngest of children.
- More stringent regulations for infants, including staffing ratios, feeding, diapering and the handling of them.
- Infants have not received all their immunizations.
- Livonia schools is in the education business; the program is primarily custodial.

In 1988 many Livonia educators, including Elaine Koons and Pamela Lemerand, went to bat for the program.

"Certainly we recognize that the primary function of the board of education is to set the policies for the K-12 program," proponents wrote in one memo. "However, the causal relationship between quality infant-toddler care and early elementary success is so apparent to us because we see the disastrous effects of poor early care on a daily basis with the K-12 population."

Cameras in the classroom?

If changes to the state school code are enacted into law, Michigan parents may get one right parents now don't possess — the right to record on film what goes on in the classroom.

Parents have been given this right in Senate Bill 679, which recently passed the state Senate. The House Education Committee has begun debate on the bill.

The revamped school code passed by the Senate would bring monumental change to Michigan school districts. Changes are so massive that local superintendents are meeting today in Wayne-Westland Community Schools to sort through the details.

Sen. Robert Geake, R-Northville, recently walked Livonia school administrators and the School Board through some of the more controversial changes contained in the bill, for which he voted.

The revamped code has major implications for teacher certification, public school academies or charter schools, school curriculum, and parental rights in the classroom.

The Senate bill gives parents the right to:

- Review at any time the district's curriculum, textbooks and teaching material.
- Be present in the classroom to observe any instructional activity.
- Remove their child from any optional course or instruction.
- Record, either using audio or video recording, any instructional activity.

Livonia schools now encourage parents to visit a classroom as long as they aren't disruptive, said Superintendent Ken Watson.

But videotaping a classroom is something entirely new.

"It would be quite disruptive to the class," said Nancy Shaw, president of the Livonia Education Association, the teachers'

union. "It would be hard for students to ignore."

The Senate bill says that any guidelines or policies adopted by a district could not be unreasonably restrictive in these areas.

The bill, if approved by the House, could have consequences never envisioned by those who wrote it, Watson said.

"They may not intend to have seven parents sitting there with video recorders, but there is nothing there to prohibit it," Watson said. "We don't think they have thought through the consequences."

Shaw said parents videotaping their own child could invade the privacy and right to confidentiality of the other students because most likely they would show up in the videotape.

"One parent may come in with the best of intentions, but all the kids wind up in the video. I think parents may not want their neighbor to see things going on and critique them."

The boy suffered only minor injuries when he was thrown onto Warren Road, but the driver of the truck drove around him and fled westbound on Warren, police reports said.

The truck is believed to have been a red- or rust-colored Dodge Ram pickup, either a 1995 or 1996 model, with an extended cab.

If located, the driver could face charges of leaving the scene of a personal injury accident.

School district keeps negligence clause

Despite a parent's urging to do so, the Livonia Public Schools will not delete the negligence clause from a waiver required for preschool students to attend outings away from Jackson Center.

John Rennels, assistant superintendent for business for the district which serves the northern section of Westland, gave the school board Monday 10 reasons for the clause should continue to appear on the waiver.

"If we do away with this, we do away with trips," Rennels said.

After brief debate, the trustees asked Rennels to draft a letter to Greg Edgecomb, outlining reasons why the district won't change its waiver policy.

Edgecomb last week refused to

sign the waiver so that his daughter could go to the Detroit Zoo with her classmates.

Edgecomb said he couldn't sign a waiver that absolved the district from all liability if, through negligence by an employee, some harm befell her on the outing.

Over the years, Rennels said, the word "negligence" has jumped out at a number of parents, who also have refused to sign the form.

Rennels, an attorney, cited the following 10 reasons why the negligence clause should continue to appear on the waiver:

- Field trips at Jackson Center are voluntary.
- Immunity protection the state

gives for K-12 programs is weaker for school programs that are run for profit.

■ The district can't afford to shift money from its K-12 budget to pay off claims that could have been avoided with a release of liability waiver.

■ If negligence occurred that was willful, wanton and reckless, the district still would be liable.

■ Negligence is in the eye of the jury. "We do not want to pay thousands of dollars in legal fees plus large judgments because something we thought was an accident is ruled to be an injury that could have been prevented in the eyes of a jury," Rennels said.

■ Because of the large award given by Wayne County Juries, the district's lawyers recommend the language on the waiver.

■ Parents who opt not to sign are given options for their child. The child can stay home, attend another preschool class, or go on the outing with a parent.

■ If the district did not have the protection given by the release, there would be no field trips.

■ The district is self-insured, so payouts from its liability insurance could affect future rates paid by the district.

■ The city requires a comprehensive waiver from the district any time it uses a city facility, such as a park or ice rink.

County lightfest to return Nov. 13

It's beginning to look a lot like Christmas in Hines Park.

On Monday, Nov. 13, the switch will be flipped to light up 35 holiday light displays on Hines Drive between the Merriam Road entrance and the Warrendale park shelter, at Telegraph, a distance of four miles.

The display features 500,000 lights and uses 350,000 watts of electricity.

Open from 7-10 p.m. nightly through Jan. 1, 1996 (closed Dec. 25), the donation to see the display is \$5 per car (including vans and recreational vehicles), \$20 for limousines, \$20 for small buses and \$50 for full-size buses.

The LightFest project, entering its third year, cost \$250,000 in 1993, when the county loaned the parks department the money to buy 30 displays. The parks department is paying the money back in payments of \$50,000 a year for the five-year term of the loan. Payments were made in 1993 and 1994, and Wayne County division of parks director Hurlay Coleman said he fully expects a payment to be made in 1995.

In 1993, 63,000 cars traveled through the display, and in 1994, 61,600 cars visited it. At least 60,000 cars are expected this year. At \$5 a car, LightFest has brought in at least \$300,000 per year, and after the \$50,000 loan payment is made and the costs of running the show are deducted, \$50,000-\$60,000 is invested in park activities, Coleman said.

Three new displays have been added this year — a nativity scene, menorah scene and Kwanzaa scene.

In 1994 the parks department began seeking corporate sponsorship for displays, and two displays were added.

Coleman sees the light display as an opportunity to expose people to the county parks system. "People had no idea we were year-round," Coleman said.

Coleman calls LightFest a chance to "create positive memories."

"Where else is the general public going to go and just feel

good about being in Wayne County?" he said.

Coleman said he expects to add more displays in the next few years. "In two or three years there will be a complete ribbon that shows the panorama of the American holiday experience," he said.

Current displays include Santa, a rocking horse, the American flag, a train, a gingerbread village, an antique car parade and a poinsettia wreath.

Sponsors for displays include: poinsettia wreath, Blue Cars Network of Southeast Michigan; American flag, Ameritech; Santa's antique car parade, AAA Michigan; nativity scene, Melody Foods, Ring Screw Works, International Union — UAW; Parkway Express Train, Torre & Bruglio; menorah scene, Arbor Drugs, The Farman Group; gingerbread village, Detroit Edison; Santa's golf cart, Friends of Wayne County Parks; Kwanzaa scene, Lewis, White & Clay, Avis Ford, Lewis & Thompson Agency, First Independence Bank, Coopers & Lybrand; and putting golfers, Warren Valley Banquet Center.

Work started a month ago to put the displays up to be ready for the Nov. 13 opening. The opening will include the lighting at 7 p.m. with the help of Wayne County Executive Edward McNamara. After the lighting, visitors can drive through the four-mile display. From 7:15-9 p.m. food, sweets and visits with Santa will be available at Warren Valley Banquet Center, 26116 West Warren Road in Dearborn Heights.

Santa Claus will be at the Warrendale shelter starting Nov. 13 until Christmas Eve. Ornaments will also be for sale at Warrendale.

The first year of the display, traffic backed up for about two miles on Merriam Road, but after some improvements to the road and in managing traffic, that problem has been alleviated, Coleman said. For those who don't want to wait long to see the lights, parks officials suggest Tuesdays, Wednesdays or Thursdays as lower-traffic days.

Weekends, especially Thanksgiving weekend, are very popular, Coleman said.

More jail time for crimes against seniors

The bill was popular — tougher punishments for crimes against senior citizens — but one state senator had doubts about its constitutionality.

"I'm concerned with special penalties for (crimes against) a certain class of people," said Sen. Alma Wheeler Smith, D-Salem, who voted against the measure.

"What about special penalties for crimes against pregnant women and children? And there's a question of double jeopardy — adding one penalty on top of another," said the freshman senator from Washtenaw County.

It was the first time sponsor Henry Stallings II, D-Detroit, had run into opposition on his Senate Bill 343. It was named for Rosa Parks, the famed civil rights activist who was beaten in her own home a year ago.

SB 343 defines a senior citizen as one 60 or older. It allows a judge to tack five years onto a felon's prison sentence for crimes committed in the senior's home and three years if committed outside the home.

The Senate on Nov. 1 passed

the measure 32-3 and sent it to the House. All area senators voted yes except Smith and David Honigman, R-West Bloomfield.

Missing the session while working on the telecommunications bill was Mat Dunaskiss, R-Lake Orion.

Sen. William VanRegenmorter, R-Jenison, chair of the Senate Judiciary Committee, said double jeopardy wasn't a problem because "this isn't part of a layer of crimes but a separate crime." He added that a judge, in consulting sentencing guidelines, may take

into consideration "the vulnerability of the victim."

Said Stallings: "This bill provides greater protection for our senior citizens, one of society's more vulnerable groups. I am pleased by the bipartisan support for this bill."

The Senate Fiscal Agency estimated the bill, if enacted, would cost the state prison system \$3.8 million more a year by the third year. It estimated 2.1 percent, or 86 of the 4,100 prison admissions in 1994, were for crimes against seniors.

Local commissioners split on county bond proposal

A multi-million dollar bond issue, which includes a new Wayne County Juvenile Detention Facility, was approved Nov. 2 by the Wayne County Commission.

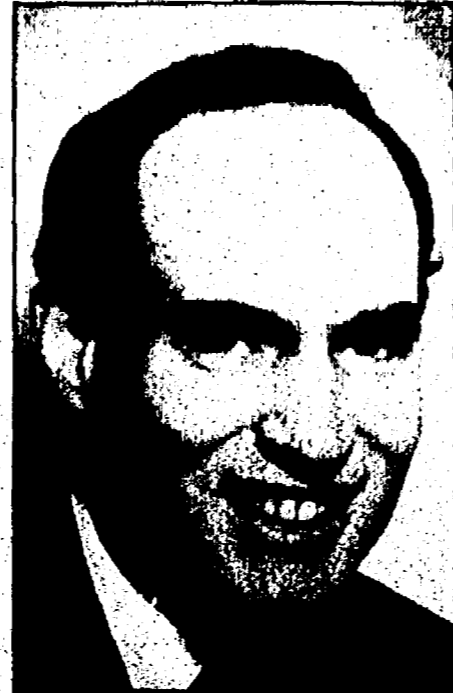
The facility, with a cost estimated at \$27 million, is part of a bond package for projects projected to cost \$44.1 million, but not to exceed a cost of \$46 million.

Four commissioners voted against the plan, including two from the Observer coverage area — Thaddeus McCotter, R-Livonia; and Bruce Patterson, R-Canton Township. Other local commissioners Michelle Plawecki and Vice Chair Kay Beard voted in favor. The proposal passed 8-4 with an abstention by commissioner Jewel Ware.

The projects are:
 ■ \$27 million to build a new juvenile facility in Detroit to house about 200 juveniles;
 ■ \$4.4 million for demolishing three old buildings and building a new one at the Wayne North Yard in the city of Wayne to house the engineering division's permit office, field engineering office and testing laboratory;
 ■ \$4 million for a Wayne County parks capital improvement program;

■ \$1.1 million to build a new public health clinic in the proposed Taylor Human Services Complex in the city of Taylor;
 ■ \$1.6 million for elevator replacement at the Frank Murphy Hall of Justice (Recorder's Court) building;
 ■ \$1 million for a kitchen on the county's Eloise Campus in Westland; and \$5 million for a 10 percent contingency fund.
 McCotter, whose district also

includes Plymouth and Plymouth Township, said he is disappointed the proposal is not being put up for a public vote. He said his "no" vote should not be taken as opposition to the youth home project, but said the taxes approved by voters in 1988 should have been used to build a new juvenile facility.
 In 1988 voters approved a tax hike for youth programs, but county executive Edward H.

McNamara's administration didn't use the money to build a new youth home. A U.S. Department of Justice investigation of the youth home, located in Detroit, was conducted in 1994. Federal

authorities released a report in December with accounts of physical abuse, overcrowding and food containing worms, roaches and rocks.
 A new youth home will be built

because the Justice Department has threatened to sue Wayne County if the problems it discovered are not addressed.

Patterson, who said he embraced all of McCotter's statements, pointed out the maturity of the bond issue would be "no later than 40 years." "There are at least four commissioners serving today that aren't even 40 years of age," he said.

"What we're doing here is financing this on the backs of youth," Patterson said. "This is a tax increase just waiting to happen. I'm very troubled by it."

After the meeting, Plawecki said that while she doesn't like everything in the bond package, she sees positive projects like the senior program. "I also don't think you can keep pointing fingers at the McNamara administration" over the use of youth home money, she said.

"We have to look to the future," she said. "We know the voters

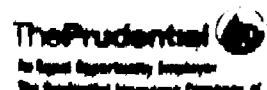

voted for the youth home," she said.

"It's kind of unfortunate that some of my colleagues have turned this into a partisan issue," she said.

Commissioner Andrew Richner also voted against the proposal. "It strikes me there aren't too many specifics here before us," he said, adding that he had heard of recent proposed changes to the youth home project that would add to the cost. He questioned the cost of the youth home project, saying a similar Indiana project had a much lower per bed cost.

Vice chair Beard, D-Westland, disagreed that much of the project hadn't been studied. "We've debated and discussed this and massaged this . . ." she said. "Long-term financing is something all of us are involved in when we buy a house or a condo," she said. "Government has to make some kind of projections

based along similar lines," she said.

"We have needs and it's important for us to respond," she said, adding that she is also disappointed that the voter-approved tax money was not used to build a new youth home.

Commissioner chairman Ricardo Solomon agreed that it had been a "long, arduous process."

"I'm proud of the process the commission used to evaluate the bonding proposal. The process was fair and allowed every commissioner an opportunity to raise their concerns and fully discuss the matter with their colleagues," Solomon said.

He pointed out the original proposal in July was to borrow \$80 million, which had included a plan to purchase the Wayne County Building for \$20 million among other projects. That plan was dropped.

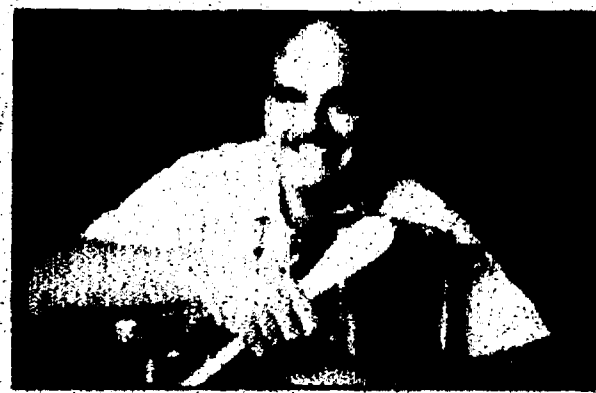

Cooking experts write books to share, enjoy

Having been involved in one way or another with the food scene here in metropolitan Detroit just about all of my life, you probably know how much I love to cook. I'm often asked, "do you ever run out of story ideas?"

No, I never run out of story ideas. My cooking skills continue to improve, and I get great story ideas by interviewing some of the top chefs, and cookbook authors who frequently descend into town to push, plug, schmooze and generally talk about food and their latest work.

"Hot Wok"

Take for instance the fact that I was able to sit in on an enlightening cooking class recently when Hugh Carpenter, author of hit cookbooks "Hot Wok" and "Hot Chicken" (copyright 1995, Ten Speed Press, \$17.95) stopped by Kitchen Glamor in West Bloomfield.

"Hot Wok" and "Hot Chicken" are number one and two, respectively of a five-part cookbook series that will soon include "Hot Pasta," "Hot Barbecue" and "Hot Vegetables."

Series cookbooks must be the "in thing" right now because everyone from Williams-Sonoma to La Varone doyenne Anne Willan is doing them.

I found it interesting when Carpenter, slipping about a \$125 Calphalon wok and eschewing its virtues years before touted the fact that "you can use your wok as a planter and substitute any good 12-inch skillet."

When queried, Carpenter claims that "times change and you can still use a skillet, but a good heavy, 14 or 16-inch flat bottom wok can do more than any skillet."

Judging from Carpenter's class, intense, high heat (the hottest possible) is best for optimum "sealing in" of flavors and tastes. That, friends, is why you need a wok as a 12-inch skillet subjected to intense heat would be a sacrifice.

In my business, as a rule, cookbooks with big beautiful pictures are usually avoided by food writers mainly because the more pictures, the costlier the book, and the less the recipes. The pictures were done by Carpenter's wife Teri Sandison, and if the recipes taste half as good as the photography makes them look, it will be a hit. Judging from the ooh's and ah's from the students in Carpenter's class, the recipes were a hit.

Mary Ellen Morgan of Birmingham, who registered for all three of Carpenter's classes, claims Carpenter's class was full of great tips and he "showed how to elevate chicken from the common everyday ingredient to gourmet status using flavor ideas from around the world."

For today's cook

While Carpenter's books undoubtedly pose interest to cooks with Pacific Rim tastes, a new book by the editors of "Woman's Day" magazine — "The Woman's Day Cookbook," (copyright 1995, Viking Press, \$24.95) has hit the shelves. I spent a hurried lunch last week with Jane Chesnutt, one of the six food editors who compiled this cookbook. It's full of great recipes, bright ideas and healthy choices for today's cook. I couldn't help but notice that the book contains more than 700 recipes, but just as impressive are the roasting charts, measuring units, spice suggestions, low-fat versions, and shortcuts. If you are a new bride, starting out in your new home, or just beginning to cook and need basic information this book is for you. It makes a great gift, and is sure to be used, copied, spilled on, dribbled over and stuck all over with Post-It notes marking favorite recipes.

Do I sound enthused? I queried Chesnutt on the fact that the "book contains everything except information on changing the oil in your car" and she replied that "after three years in the making, the folks at 'Woman's Day,' who are known for their check-full bargain \$1.29 monthly magazine, wanted to offer the same with regards to food and cooking for today's busy cook."

At only \$24.95, this book will hold court on my kitchen shelf, and not be relegated to the downstairs library next to "The Joy of Cooking" and other perennial favorites that I always use for reference material.

"If all that isn't enough, the chapter on 'invest ment cooking' is worth its weight in gold for working cooks who need to 'make' time in the kitchen," said Chesnutt, who with two kids and a full-time job relies heavily on recipes that save money and time. Yes, there's nutritional analysis, something I wish all cookbooks would include, double indexing for easy recipe retrieval, kid's choice recipes, microwaveable, one pot meals, low fat recipes, make ahead ideas, vegetarian dishes and even classics.

Singles share cooking, shopping tips

Here are flowers on the table. The food is presented on "pretty little serving dishes."

Water is served in stemware. Is this the setting for a dinner party, or is Vicki Vensel dining alone?

"Treat yourself as though you're special," said Vensel, 38, of Southfield, "because you are."

A furniture salesperson, and now divorced three years following a four-year marriage, Vensel prefers her home cooking to going to a restaurant, "just because you have to eat."

Mostly, her dinners are in the dining room. Once in a great while, she confesses, she'll eat at the living room coffee table, "if there's a really good movie on TV."

In early post-divorce days, she says, some people don't care about things, and even get a bit sloppy. She's heard stories of people abandoning utensils and manners.

Preparing and serving dinner to herself, she says, is a matter of self-respect.

As for shopping single, she says, "it's not much different than when I was married."

"I do spend less. I buy less meat and more dairy. Low-fat cheese, for example."

"Sometimes on a Sunday I'll cook for the

week." Some of the meals yield lunches she can take to work "to save money, fat and calories."

Vensel grew up in Berkley, one of seven children. "Dinnertime was family time. A chance to visit with each other. Mom made good meals. Nothing fancy."

But Edna McLaughlin, 76, of Canton, says, "It's difficult to cook for one."

A widow for 30 years, McLaughlin took care of her mother for a long time. Alone since her mother died in 1988, she's learned to shop in small quantities.

"I buy just two onions, because more will spoil. I buy just one tomato. I use frozen vegetables, because fresh spoil."

"I buy the smallest of anything so I'm not eating it for a week or throwing it away." A higher unit price on a smaller package is offset by the reduced waste, she says.

McLaughlin's favorites include meatballs, meatloaf, and various chicken dishes. Often, tonight's dinner will also be tomorrow's lunch.

At the Canton Senior Center, where she volunteers 20 hours a week as an office aide, she's known for the quiches she often brings to serve to the busy staff.

Her tollhouse cookies also get high ratings. "It's in the baking time," she says. "People over-bake. The package tells you to bake nine to 11 minutes. I use the nine."

For recent Madonna University graduate Kathryn Mulka, shopping for one is a continuing education.

As a child growing up in Alpena, she used to go to the market with her mother, who was shopping for the family of seven.

Mulka, 24, of Plymouth, who works in commercial and graphic arts, has been living on her own for the past three years. She shops for her version of best value, which is based on quantity, price and intent.

Something might be very appealing, but if she admits to herself that she's not going to use it, she doesn't buy it.

"I keep learning. What I eat. What I don't eat. When. What goes bad. Like lettuce. I don't buy it unless I know that I'm going to make a salad. Or it just gets moldy and gross."

She likes to make casseroles that can be a dinner and a lunch, and coleslaw, potato salad, and other cold salads.

The newest brand to throw its hat into the ring from southern France is Jenard. To attract your attention, Jenard created the classic bottles and labels of any of the wines from the Pays d'Oc. Using art from the Belle Epoque (beautiful era) of the 1890s in Paris, Jenard has captured art and French wine in a manner uncommon to popularly priced, everyday, enjoyable wine.

Henri de Toulouse Lautrec is the artist of the Belle Epoque era. To those who know art, his vividly colored poster lithography represents the period's history and have

and art are the result of cooperative work between France's Maison Jean-Jean and its U.S. importer Cannon Wines Limited of San Francisco. The wines have become an instant success, just as Toulouse-Lautrec became an instant hit when his Moulin Rouge poster went up in the Paris streets in the mid 1890s. An original 1995 projection of 10,000 cases of these wines for the U.S. market grew to 30,000 cases and it's anticipated that 75,000 cases will be sold in 1996. In the future, look for more Rhone varietals to be added to the brand.

There's no mistaking here, these are French wines and you'll taste this in the chardonnay especially, because it has better acid-fruit balance than many California wines at the same price. These wines are good everyday drinking French wines designed with food in mind.

TEQUILA ROAST CHICKEN

2 frying chickens, cut into pieces
 3 cloves garlic, finely minced
 3 serrano chiles, finely minced
 1/2 cup tequila
 1/2 cup Dijon mustard
 1/2 cup thin soy sauce
 2 tablespoons honey
 1/4 cup cilantro, chopped
Sauce:
 2 cloves garlic, minced
 1 serrano chile, minced
 2 tablespoons olive oil
 1 cup chicken broth or stock

2 tablespoons oyster sauce
 1 tablespoon cornstarch
 1/4 cup tequila
 3 ounces crumbled goat cheese
 1/4 cup salted, toasted pumpkin seeds
 1/4 cup cilantro sprigs

Rinse the chicken with cold water, then pat dry. In a bowl large enough to hold the chicken, combine the garlic, serrano chiles, tequila, mustard, soy sauce, honey and cilantro. Mix well and add to the chicken, toss to coat.

Refrigerate at least 15 minutes but not longer than 8 hours. To make the sauce, combine garlic, serrano chile and olive oil and set aside. Keep tequila, goat cheese, pumpkin seeds and cilantro in the refrigerator. Preheat the oven to 425 degrees F.

Line a shallow baking dish with foil and place a wire rack on top. Place the chicken skin side up on the wire rack. Roast the chicken for 30-40 minutes or until the juices run clear when pierced with a fork. Transfer the chicken to a serving platter. Place a skillet or saute pan over high heat. Add the garlic, chile and olive oil mixture. When garlic begins to sizzle, add the stock mixture and bring to a boil. Stir in

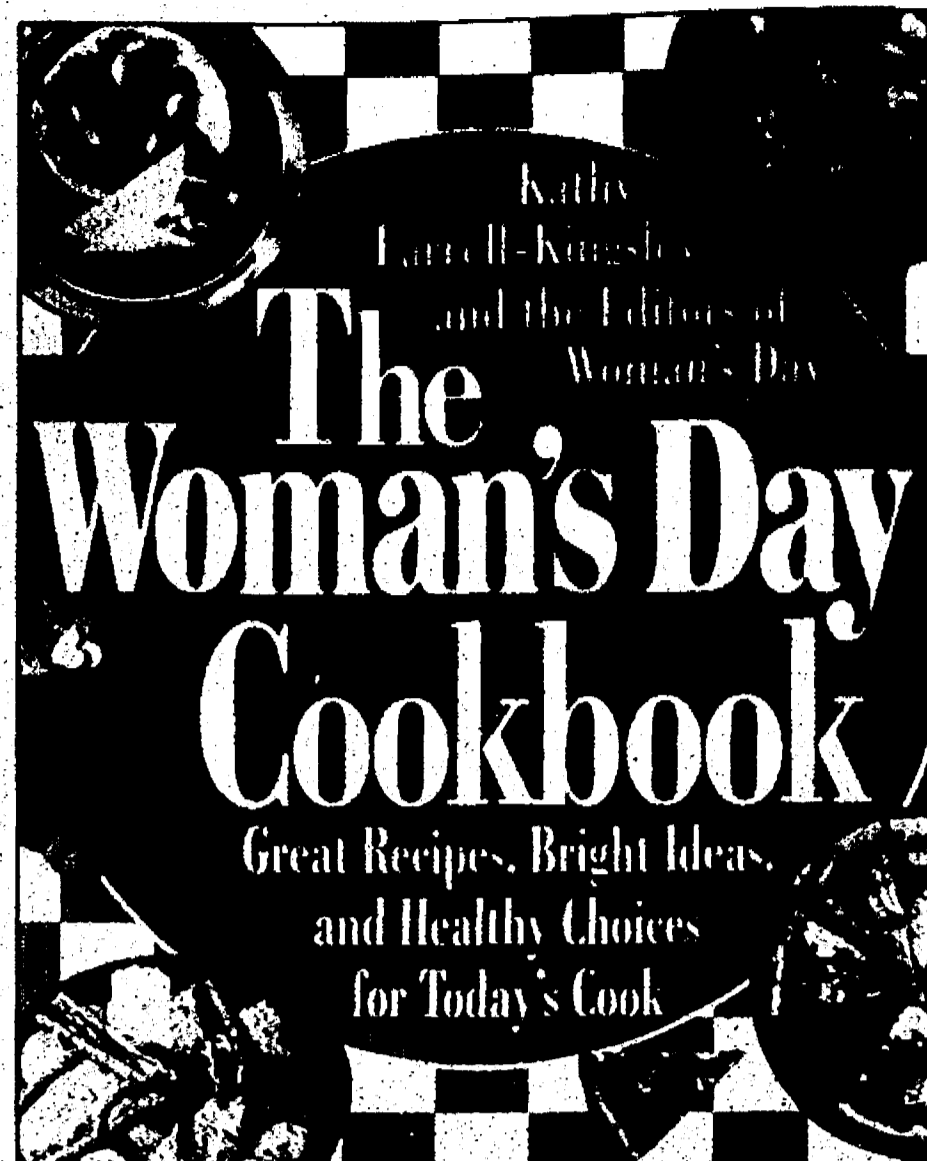

Stuff winter squash with fall's fruitiest flavors

Winter squash, the season's nutritional gold mine, is also the source of a wide variety of delicious recipes. You can bake it, puree it, grate it, saute it and simmer it in soups and stews. Beyond all these uses, you can stuff squash with delightful fillings that can make it a wholesome side dish or a hearty entree.

Different varieties of winter squash have their own distinctive flavors and uses. Acorn squash, with its moist, firm flesh, holds its shape well. This, along with its moderate size, make it great for stuffing. Hubbard squash, particularly smaller varieties, also stuff well.

In general, when preparing stuffed squash, preheat the oven to 375 degrees F., cut the squash in half and scoop out the seeds. Place the squash flesh side down in a baking dish and pour in 1/4 cup water to cover the bottom of the pan. Bake the squash for 30 minutes while you prepare the filling.

For microwave preparation, pierce each squash in three to four places with a sharp knife, place them on a double layer of paper towels in the microwave, and cook on high for eight minutes or until just soft to the touch, rotating once during cooking. Let them

stared for five minutes before cutting in half.

For filling, try a Mexican-style mixture of cooked and drained lean ground beef, diced onion, celery and zucchini, quartered cherry tomatoes and cooked kidney beans, seasoned with chili powder, cumin, and thyme. Or, make a seasonal stuffing of leftover turkey, chopped raw cranberries, diced onion and celery, and bread crumbs, flavored with marjoram and maple syrup.

For a meatless meal, stuff acorn squash with a multi-grain pilaf and diced papaya, seasoned with tarragon.

Once the filling is prepared, stuff into each squash half and return them to the baking dish (make sure there is still some water in the baking dish). Cover the dish with foil and return to the oven. Continue baking for one hour or until just tender.

For microwave preparation, place the filled halves on a microwavable plate and cover loosely with wax paper or vented plas-

tic wrap. Microwave on high for four to six minutes, or until heated through. Let them stand, covered, for two minutes.

Stuffed Winter Squash produces a delicious stuffing, full of the season's fruitiest flavors — apple, cranberry and orange.

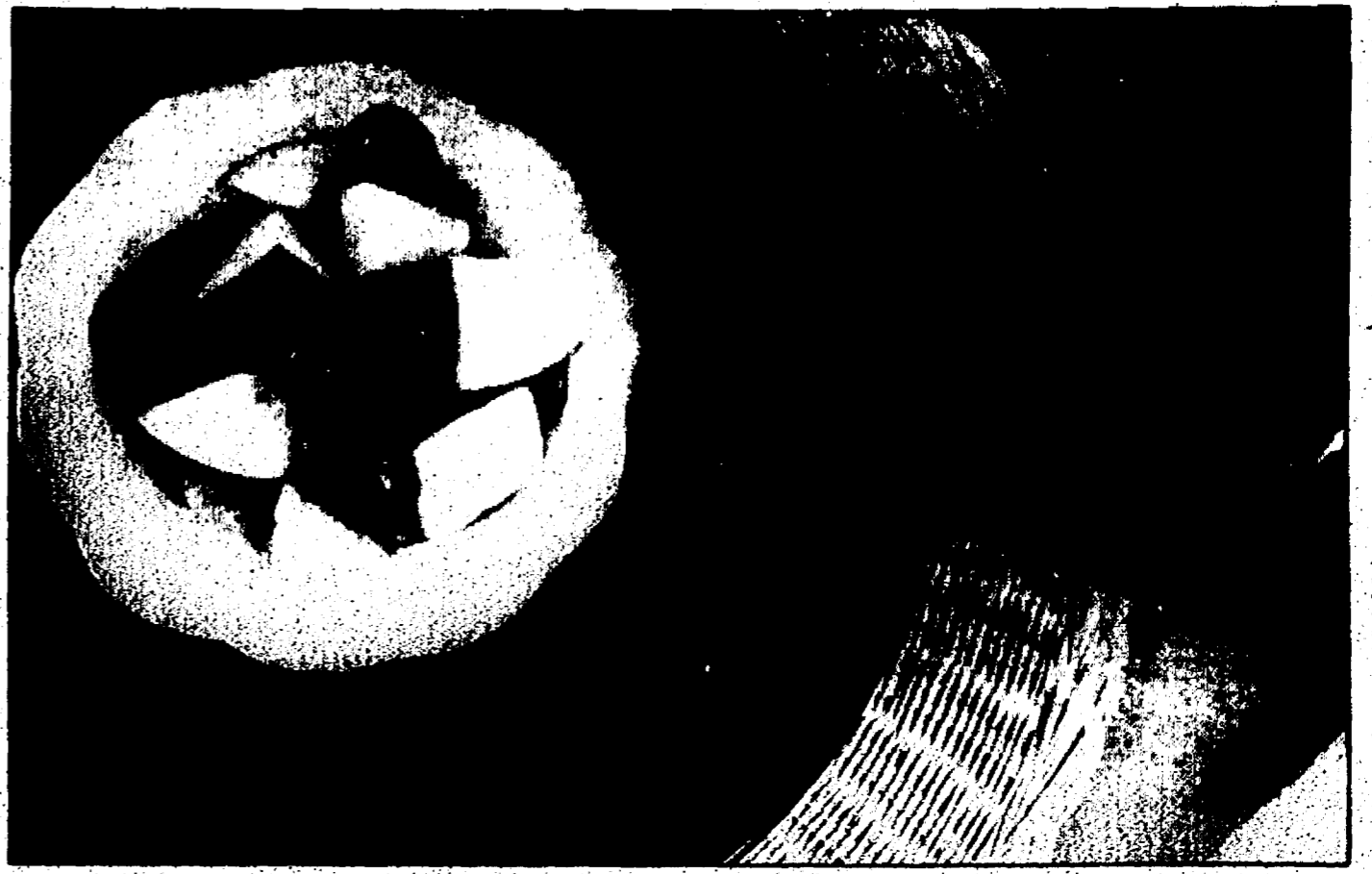
STUFFED WINTER SQUASH

- 1 winter squash
- 2 cups of apple (chopped or canned)
- 1 cup of ground cranberries
- 1 sectioned orange
- 1/2 cup of raisins
- 1/4 cup of brown sugar
- 2 teaspoons margarine

Halve the winter squash lengthwise and scrape out the seeds and stringy portion. Place both halves with the cut side down in a baking dish with 1/4 cup of water covering the bottom of the pan. Bake in the oven at 350 degree F. for one hour.

While the squash is baking, mix the other ingredients in a bowl. Stuff the baked squash with the fruit mixture and bake at 350 degrees F. for an additional 20-30 minutes or until the squash is tender.

Eat lots of fall's crisp apples, they're so good for you

Apples are a favorite fruit because of their delicious flavor, year-round availability, variety and versatility in preparation. An apple contains almost no fat or sodium, they are high in complex carbohydrates, contain fiber, potassium, trace minerals, Vitamins A and C, and many other vital nutrients. What's not to like about an apple, they are good for you.

Dietary research shows that apples may have many health benefits. Apples may actually help reduce serum cholesterol, high blood pressure, and the risk of colon cancer, and strokes. Apples can also play an important role in weight control because the fiber gives you a full satisfied feeling after eating. Of course, these items are true when eating raw

apples, not necessarily when eating apple pie. Apples are also called nature's toothbrush as they refresh the breath and teeth and massage the gums.

Apples can be eaten fresh, baked, stir-fried, canned, frozen or used as a garnish. There are many varieties so before buying apples decide how you are going to use them.

The best fresh eating apples are Macintosh, Cortland, Jonathan, Red and Golden Delicious, Winesap, and Ida Reds.

Apple pie is best made from Jonathan, Macintosh, Rome Beauty, Nonhemp Spy, Ida Red, Empire and Winesap. When baking all will work fine. For cooking choose a firm, tart apple and for baking a very firm apple. Bruised apples can be used for jelly, apple butter, applesauce or cider.

When cooking apples use very little water so that more vitamins are retained within the fruit. To enhance the natural aroma, add a

little spice or lemon to the apples, cover the pan but do not overcook. Adding sugar also serves to enhance the apples flavor but too much masks the characteristic scent and causes them to be mushy. If you're making a salad, dip the apple slices or rings in lemon, orange or pineapple juice to prevent browning.

Store apples at 32 degrees F. or in the refrigerator to retain freshness and crispness. They ripen 10 times faster at room temperature than when kept chilled. Put them in tightly closed bags to prevent absorption of food odors and to maintain humidity. Apples also give off ethylene gas so do not store near lettuce, celery or bro-

coli, the gas will cause vegetables to rust. If you're storing apples in your garage, protect them with a blanket if it gets too cold. Apples like it cool but not below freezing. Meanness in stored apples may denote too long or improper storage.

Since apples can be stored for a long period of time, buy a quantity. Three medium apples (one pound) make one-and-one-half cups of applesauce. Six to eight medium apples makes a nine-inch pie, 46 medium-sized apples is one peck and one bushel will make 16-20 quarts of applesauce.

Everyone has their own favorite apple pie recipe so here are some other ways to add apples to your

meals. Add one half cup grated apples to each two cups of mashed squash, sweet potatoes or parsnips to give them more flavor and flair. This is great served with roast veal, lamb or pork.

A quick low-calorie dessert can be a cored apple microwaved in a little apple cider. Add apple slices to the hot breakfast cereal when microwaving in the morning.

Freezing apples or applesauce is very easy. Select a firm, crisp apple, avoid any with a mealy texture. After washing, peeling and coring, drop into ascorbic acid such as lemon juice to help keep

their color. If you want chunky applesauce, peel and cut up the sizes you want to cook, while for smooth sauce, run the cooked apple, skin and core through a sieve (cooking the red skin will make a beautiful pink applesauce). Use sugar sparingly or you'll ruin a good thing. Pie filling ingredients can be mixed with the apples and frozen in amounts used for individual pies.

Michigan produces some of the best apples of course, eat them everyday.

'Home for Holidays': poignant, funny

Claudia Larson just lost her job. She has a cold. Her 15-year-old daughter...

tel her that he was recently married — to another man. Claudia appreciates Tommy, but both siblings can't stand sister Joanne...

As dinner progresses, the action grows wackier, with so many layers that it starts to look like a Marx Brothers movie.

Director Foster proves she has an amazing eye for blending comedy and drama. Her previous film, "Little Man Tate," was poignant, heartfelt but not especially entertaining.

At the same time, "Home for the Holidays" is a little rough around the edges. The dialogue seems jumbled, especially near the beginning, so much so that you feel like pushing rewind to catch all the nuances.

Though set over just a couple of

days, things just sort of happen in the movie, and many of them succeed. When Claudia is complimented by the furnace repairman who has had a crush on her since high school, she beams back at him, half moved, half glad that she didn't wind up his wife.

Even those moments out of a thousand other situation comedies (Geraldine Chaplin's incontinent aunt, for instance) come off funny. After singing a prolonged grace at the dinner table, she proceeds to recall in graphic detail a little fling she and Claudia's father had some 40 years ago.

Foster is uncomfortable getting laughs out of Joanne's irritating children, who might as well be seated at a separate kids' table for the amount of time they have on screen.

She brings the best out of her performers, including Bancroft, who has experienced a revival of sorts with this and "How to Make an American Quilt." She is both maddening and endearing, finally

finding a use for that extra overstuffed winter coat she always carries around when Claudia arrives without one.

Downey, often irritatingly over the top, is quite funny here. He gets most of the movie's best lines, snapping Polaroid photos that we never actually see. His obsession with capturing these family moments — painful as well as happy — has a special meaning at the end of the film.

"Home for the Holidays" is an intelligent, winning movie that should appeal to a wide audience. It's intended for anyone who has ever found comfort in a holiday gathering or ever wanted to force a turkey leg down a family member's throat.

Donna Karan's baffled down vests are the catalyst for down's return to the marketplace. Streetwear often inspires ski wear and vice versa.

Searle Tech, for instance, debuted its pearlized rubber, lacquered nylon and microfil jackets this fall, combining the practicality of ski wear with urban chic (\$350) at Saks Fifth Avenue, the Somerset Collection, Troy.

The body-hugging silhouette is seen in Nils' long, lean suit with stretchy bottom and belted red top (\$475). Patagonia is the fleece expert. Look for a myriad of styles and colors to layer as you like.

"Hats this season are fun and funky," says Sigmann. "Our newest glove is an extremely lightweight microfiber by Grandoe with high loft insulation." It's too new to guarantee its warmth, but worth a try (\$50).

Jim Desautels, manager of Bavarian Village in Birmingham echoes these trends and adds his own thoughts.

Desautels sees lots of dark earth tones with bright accents and multicolored jackets, especially red, black and yellow. Layering is more important than ever, he says. Fleece and medium-weight outer coats are the rage. Fashionable component gloves with zip-in and zip-out linings are more convenient than buying separate gloves and liners.

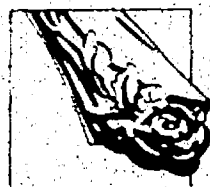

Pick up some Michigan apples and start cooking

Here are some "appl-icious" recipes from the Michigan Apple Commission.

APPLE CRUMB COFFEECAKE

1 1/4 cups sugar, divided
1 tablespoon cornstarch
1/2 teaspoon cinnamon
1/4 teaspoon nutmeg
1 tablespoon light corn syrup
2 cups chopped, peeled Michigan apples
1/4 cup dried currants
2 1/2 cups all-purpose flour
1/4 cup margarine
1/4 teaspoon salt
1/2 teaspoon baking powder
1/2 teaspoon baking soda
1 egg
1/4 cup buttermilk
Vegetable cooking spray

In 2-quart saucepan, combine 1/4 cup of the sugar, cornstarch, cinnamon and nutmeg. Add corn syrup, apples and currants. Cook over medium heat, stirring frequently, until mixture thickens and begins to boil. Remove from heat and cool slightly.

In large mixing bowl, combine flour and remaining 1/4 cup sugar. Using pastry blender, cut in margarine until mixture resembles coarse crumbs. Remove 1/2 cup and set aside for topping. To remaining mixture, stir in salt, baking powder and soda.

Mix together egg and buttermilk. Add to dry ingredients, stirring only until combined. Spread 1/2 batter

over bottom of round 9-inch cake pan coated with cooking spray. Spread 1/2 of apple mixture over batter. Dot remaining batter and apple mixture over top, spreading evenly. Sprinkle with reserved crumb topping mixture.

Bake in 350 degree F oven about 45 minutes or until golden and wooden pick inserted in center comes out clean. Cool slightly before cutting into wedges. Yield 8 servings.

Variation: Use 21-ounce can apple pie filling in place of fresh apple, the 1/4 cup sugar, cornstarch and corn syrup. Stir cinnamon, nutmeg and currants into Apple Pie filling before spreading over batter. Place cake pan on baking sheet before putting in oven. Increase baking time to 60 minutes.

APPLE-BERRY SALAD

1/2 cup sugar
1 envelope unflavored gelatin
1 1/2 cups Michigan apple cider or Michigan apple juice, divided
1 tablespoon Cinnamon Imperial candies
1/4 cup unsweetened Michigan applesauce
1 1/2 cups diced, unpeeled red Michigan apples
1 cup halved green seedless grapes

In large mixing bowl, combine sugar and gelatin. Set aside.

Heat 1 cup of the apple cider and cinnamon candies, stirring frequently, until mixture boils. Remove from heat and continue stirring. If necessary to dissolve candies. Add hot mixture to gelatin. Stir until gelatin is dissolved. Add remaining 1/2 cup apple cider and applesauce. Chill until mixture starts to set and is syrupy. Stir in apples and blueberries. Pour into serving dish or mold. Chill until firm, about 3 hours. Yield 8 servings.

APPLE-CHEESE BISCUITS

1 package active dry yeast
1/4 cup warm water
3 1/2 cups all-purpose flour
2 tablespoons sugar
1/2 teaspoon salt
4 teaspoons baking powder
1/4 teaspoon baking soda
1 cup shredded Cheddar cheese
1/4 cup buttermilk
1/4 cup vegetable oil
1 1/2 cups shredded, unpeeled Michigan apples
1 teaspoon milk
2 teaspoons sesame seeds
Vegetable cooking spray

Combine yeast and water. Let stand 5 minutes.

In large mixing bowl, combine flour, sugar, salt, baking powder and soda. Stir in cheese. Set aside.

Thoroughly combine buttermilk, oil, apples and yeast mixture. Add

to flour mixture, mixing only until combined. Turn out on lightly floured surface and knead about 10 times. Pat dough to 1/4-inch thickness.

Using 2 1/4-inch round cutter, cut into biscuits. Place on baking sheet coated with cooking spray, about 1/2-inch apart. Brush lightly with milk and sprinkle with sesame seeds. Let

rise in warm place about 1 hour or until double.

Bake in 425 degree F oven about 12 minutes or until golden. Serve hot. Yield 18 biscuits.

Try torta filled with vegetables, cheeses

AP — Zucchini, mushrooms, onion and fresh spinach leaves are among the vegetables that fill classic California torta.

The vegetables are layered with Monterey Jack and mozzarella cheeses and cooked crab meat. Cut into wedges and serve warm, or let cool to room temperature.

CLASSIC CALIFORNIA TORTA

Preparation time: 35 minutes
Cooking time: 50 minutes
2 loaves frozen bread dough,

thawed
1 tablespoon chopped fresh thyme (1 teaspoon if dried)
1 medium red onion, chopped
1 clove garlic, peeled and minced
3 cups sliced mushrooms
Salt and pepper to taste
3 tablespoons olive oil
2 tablespoons chopped fresh dillweed
4 zucchini, sliced
1/2 bunch fresh spinach leaves,

washed and dried
1/2 cup shredded Monterey Jack cheese
1/2 cup shredded mozzarella cheese
8 ounces crab meat, cooked and flaked

Heat oven to 375 degrees F. Combine bread dough and let rise until doubled.

On a floured surface, sprinkle with thyme and roll out to a 20-inch circle. Transfer to a greased, 10-

inch springform pan, letting the edges drape over the sides.

Saute onion, garlic, mushrooms and seasonings in 2 tablespoons of the olive oil until tender, about 5 minutes. Stir in dillweed and set aside.

Saute zucchini in remaining oil until tender.

Layer half mushroom mixture, half zucchini, half spinach leaves, half cheese and half crab meat into the dough-lined pan; repeat. Bring

dough together over top, leaving a small vent for steam to escape; brush lightly with oil or beaten egg.

Bake in a 375-degree F oven for 60 minutes, until golden brown and crusty. Cut into wedges and serve while still warm, or let cool to room temperature. Makes 10 servings.

PROBING FOR DEEP POCKETS
The American Academy of Periodontists began promoting the periodontal screening and recording (PSR) test in 1992 as a means of detecting periodontal (gum) disease. The painless procedure only takes a few minutes and can be incorporated into a routine oral examination. It involves the use of a calibrated instrument to measure the predetermined depth, along with bleeding and other factors, is indicative of gum disease. If detected early, periodontal disease can nearly always be cured with fluoride and antibiotic therapy. If an advanced form of disease (periodontitis) is uncovered, oral surgery may be required to reattach the gums to the teeth. By utilizing the PSR test, dentists hope to catch gum disease in its earlier, more easily treatable stages.

Windy conditions could not slow down Schoolcraft College at the NJCAA Region 12 Cross Country Championships Oct. 27 at Waverly Golf Course in Lansing. The Lady Ocelots raced to a second-place finish, edging out Lansing CC. SC now advances to the NJCAA Finals Saturday in Alfred, N.Y. Macomb finished first at the regional with 48 points, held in high winds and 65-degree temperatures. SC totaled 67, just ahead of Lansing (72). Cuyahoga was fourth (80), followed by Vincennes (101), Delta (125), Columbus State (165), Southwestern Michigan (170) and Oakland CC (no team score). SC put three runners among the top 10 finishers, making them All-American. Dana Goba was fifth on the five-kilometer course in 20:19. Stacy Moore was sixth (20:27) and Tara Teran was 10th (20:40). Nicole Falk finished 24th (22:11) and Christine Spica placed 33rd (23:27). "The girls ran an excellent race and I couldn't be more proud of them," said SC coach Laura Loggins. It was a strong performance for the first-year program and got the team well-prepared for the upcoming NJCAA Finals. Lansing is the defending NJCAA champion; Macomb placed third. Loggins feels confident her team can also place in the top five. A week prior to the regional meet, the Lady Ocelots ran at the Eastern Michigan University Classic in Ypsilanti. There were no team scores kept, but several SC runners showed marked improvement. Spica led in that regard. Her previous best over that distance had been 24:18; at EMU, she ran a 23:08, in spite of the wet and windy weather. Moore placed highest for SC, finishing 30th (20:45). Goba was 33rd (20:53), with Teran 37th (21:09), Falk 58th (23:04) and Spica 59th.

Whew! CC nips Spartans, 14-6

Redford Catholic Central escaped with a 14-6 Class AA-Region III football victory over Livonia Stevenson. The Shamrocks face defending state champ Troy next.

Redford Catholic Central is still alive in the state football playoffs, but not without some irregular heartbeats Saturday, courtesy of a gallant Livonia Stevenson team.

The Shamrocks, rated the No. 1 team in Michigan and No. 22 nationally in USA Today, advanced in the Class AA tournament with a pulsating 14-6 win over the underdog Spartans at Livonia Clarenceville.

CC, now 10-0 overall, will square off against defending state champ Troy (9-1) for the Region II championship. The game is tentatively set for 1:30 p.m. this Saturday at Pontiac's Wisner Stadium.

The Shamrocks averted one of the greatest upsets in Observerland history after stopping Stevenson at the Spartans' 1-yard line early in the fourth quarter.

Leading 7-6, CC then marched 92 yards in 21 plays to seal the win, capped by Greg Call's 5-yard touchdown run on fourth down with only 35 seconds to play.

Stevenson, forced to burn all three timeouts during the 8:27 drive, was not through despite being down eight points.

Quarterback Dean Bacheller hit Gade Clark out of the backfield for 57-yard gain down to the CC 23.

Bacheller followed by hurling a pass to the end zone for wide receiver Jeff Backus, who had the ball momentarily, but couldn't hang on.

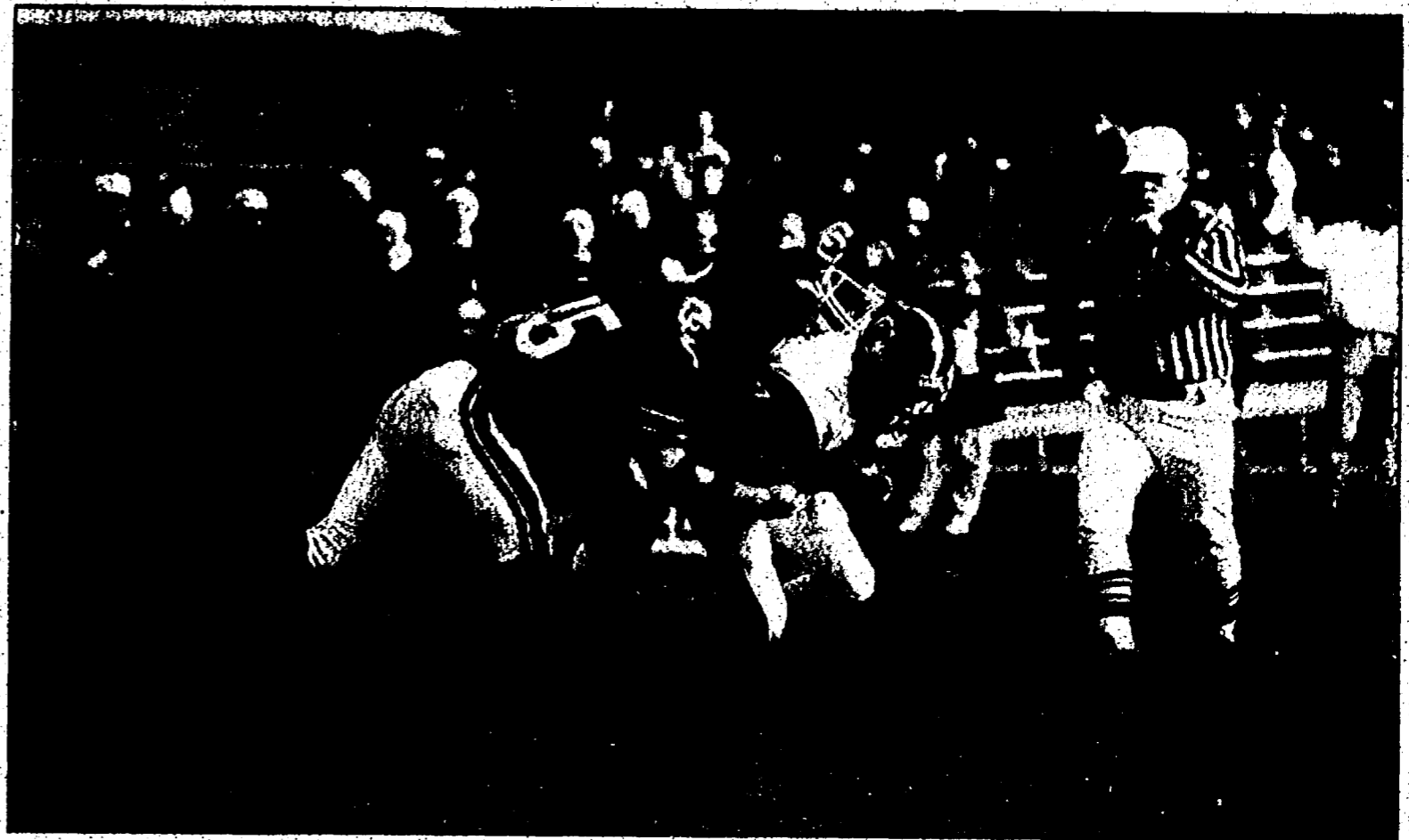
The clock then ran out with Bacheller scrambling to get out of bounds near the CC 22.

"This was a great state playoff game," CC coach Tom Mach said. "It was a terrific, hard-hitting game by both teams. It could have gone either way."

"We did a terrific job stopping Stevenson inside the 10 and I was proud of the way our kids drove the ball on the final drive."

A pair of end zone drops, which could have given Stevenson the lead, proved pivotal as far as the final outcome.

But the key play of the game occurred with the Spartans facing a second-and-goal at the CC 1 with just

over nine minutes remaining. Bacheller dropped back to pass, but was sacked for a 7-yard loss by CC tackles Dan Dominguez and Rick Deptula.

"CC's defensive line did an excellent job," said Stevenson first-year coach Tim Gabel, whose team was held to a net-10 yards rushing in 24 attempts. "Their front three are all stronger and quicker than anybody we have. We couldn't even run quick traps. We were just going to ride with what was going well for us at the time. We had a little magic in the throwing game. The way the game was going we were not doing much on offense."

Backus, who scored on a nifty 79-yard catch and run with 11:12 left in the third quarter to put the Spartans back in it, appeared to have the go-ahead TD grab on third down, but officials ruled he did not have possession long enough.

The Spartans, who missed the extra point to tie it earlier after Backus' TD catch, shunned a field goal attempt. They elected to try for the score on fourth down, but Bacheller's pass, intended for Backus once again, was broken up.

"We got hot with the passing game and we were going to ride that," Gabel said. "We had three shots from the 10 and in, I felt like we could catch one

of those passes. We wanted to throw a little dink pass in there, but they (CC) had great coverage."

"Then, CC got the ball and jammed it down our throats. They showed what kind of team they are."

Call, CC's junior quarterback, hit a big fourth down pass to 6-foot-7, 250-pound tight end Eric Gilbo for 8 yards to set up the insurance TD.

"Greg has done a great job of keeping us out of trouble all year long," Mach said. "We want the ball in his hands because he makes such smart decisions."

CC's 6-foot, 230-pound senior fullback John Spolsky, was also instrumental in the TD-clinching drive. He rushed nine times for 51 yards and wound up with a hard-earned 109 in 24 carries.

"At the end they made the plays," Gabel said. "Call hits Gilbo on fourth down in traffic."

"But we weren't going for a moral victory. We were going in to win the game. We had our chances and I was proud of the way we came to play."

The Spartans had only one major breakdown defensively, but it cost them dearly.

Call, a 6-1, 185-pound junior, rolled out to his right and found Steve Monday wide open in the flat. The TD play covered 61 yards, giving CC a 7-0 lead with 4:44 to go in the open-

ing quarter (following Eron Kosmowski's extra point).

"We were confused on the (Monday) touchdown," Gabel said. "It was a busted coverage, but we learned a lot from that play."

Stevenson's defense, which limited CC to less than three yards per carry (49 for 177), got a break just before the first half ended when Kosmowski's 31-yard field goal attempt sailed wide after the Shamrocks drove to the Stevenson 13.

CC outgained the Spartans 283 to 207 in total yardage. The Shamrocks also had 12 first downs to Stevenson's five. Bacheller was eight of 19 for 197, while Call was five of 13 for 106.

"Up to this point we've been averaging 300 yards a game," Mach said. "All the teams we've played this year, we've moved the ball on."

But the Shamrocks found the going plenty tough at times against the Spartans.

"Our defensive coordinator Conrad Newman made all the calls and he guessed right an awful lot," said Gabel, whose team finished 7-3 overall. "We were gambling and sending people to one place or another. Plus, we went with man coverage in the secondary. You can't sit in a straight 5-2 (alignment) and stop them. You've got to take risks."

Stevenson ousted in regional bid, 5-0

One break. That's all it took on a day when frigid temperatures, blustery winds and occasional snow took their toll on two talented teams forced to compete in shorts.

That break went to Plymouth Salem. The Rocks countered quickly on a mishit ball by a Livonia Stevenson defender to score early in Saturday's Class A regional soccer final, hosted by Salem.

Which is all they needed, thanks to a strong defensive effort that shut down the Spartans in lifting Salem to a 1-0 triumph.

The win puts the Rocks in the state quarterfinals opposite Ann Arbor Pioneer Tuesday. The game is scheduled for Northville HS.

Stevenson, ranked second in the state, finishes its season at 18-1-2. Salem improves to 20-3 — the win giving outgoing coach Ken Johnson (he's retiring at the end of the season) his 200th career victory.

It certainly couldn't have come at a better time, nor against a more formidable opponent. The low temperature and high crosswind was certain to sap both teams and gradually wear them down, making an early goal imperative.

"It was unbelievably important," said Stevenson coach Walt Barrett. "It set the tone."

Scoring first, however, was more of a necessity for Salem. The Rocks had lost three straight to Stevenson (twice in '94), the last a 3-0 setback earlier this season.

"We planned it that way," said Sa-

lem's Johnson, his team normally slow in starting. "It's the only way to beat Stevenson — move the ball side to side, swinging it and swinging it back, instead of taking it at them and attacking quickly down the wings."

Johnson and his staff, son Randy and Dave Mashni, had hoped to catch Stevenson off-guard. The tactic appeared to work; Salem got several good scoring chances early.

But the game's only goal was nothing more than a misplaced clearing attempt by a Spartan defender. Instead of knocking the ball forward into Salem's end of the field, he pulled it sideways.

Drew Drummond broke in on it and played the mistake, knocking it into Stevenson's end for a one-on-one with keeper Jim Grewe. Drummond won the showdown, rolling the ball in just 12:19 into the match.

Stevenson didn't get the number of scoring chances in the first half that Salem did — the three beat all ended on the foot of Jeff Urbata; twice he shot wide, a third time high — but the Spartans got plenty in the second.

Over the last 30 minutes of the match, they pressured constantly as Salem tried to adjust, dropping midfielder Ronny Mashni back to defense. The ball got inside the Salem box several times, but keeper Brian Bacyinski had few real challenges, and he was equal to them.

The Rocks' defense did the rest: Matt Hucal, Chris Curry, Chris Jaskolski, Josh Fair and Scott Loeve were able to clear dangerous balls be-

"But Glover is a good player, that's for sure."

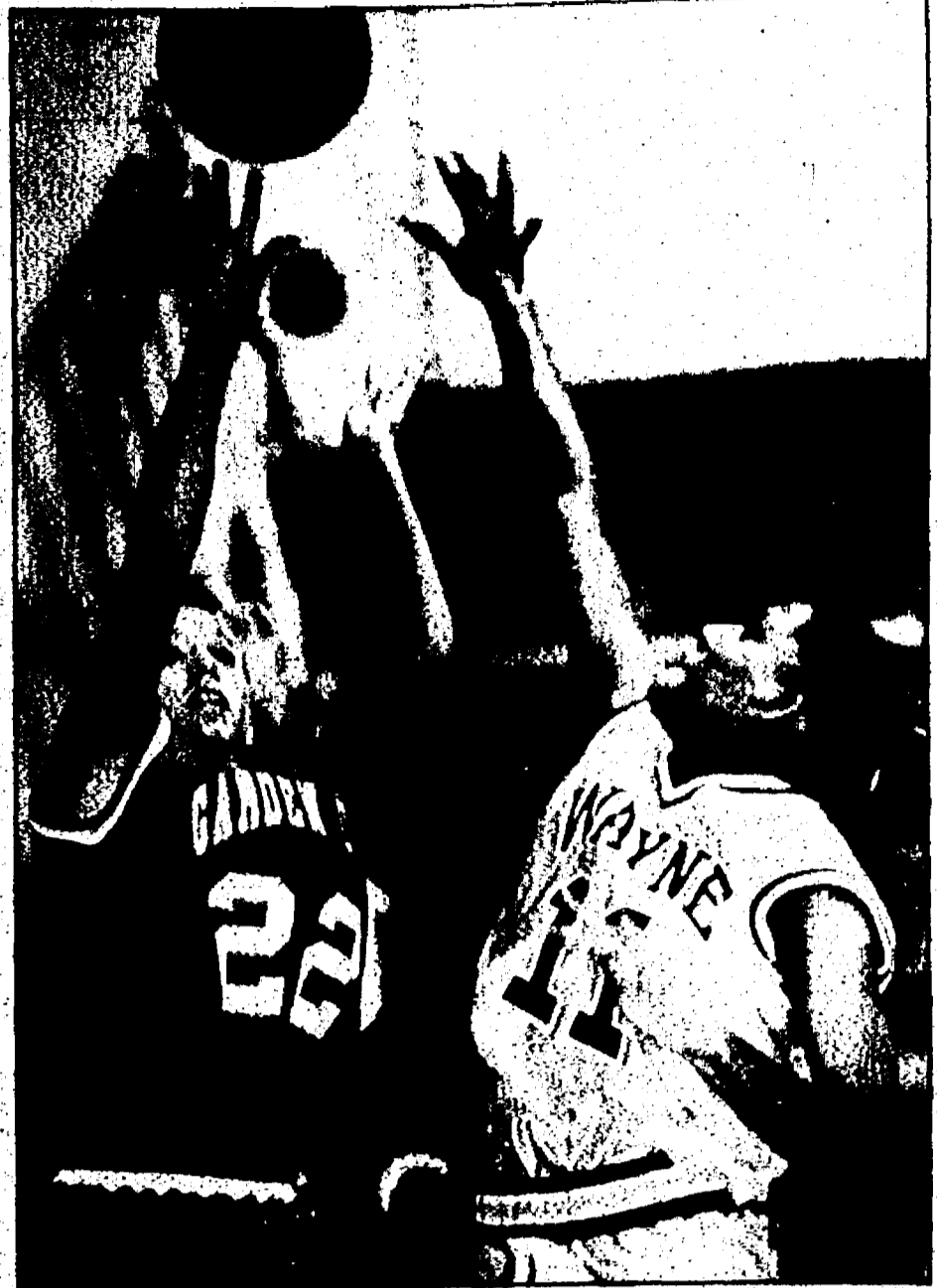
The Cougars' comeback started with defense, according to Marshall Henry.

Redesigned Honda Civic goes where it hasn't gone before

EAST LIBERTY, Ohio — Slipping behind the wheel of the redesigned Honda Civic, you almost have to get out and make sure you're in the right car.

Yep, it's a 1996 Honda Civic. But like no Civic has been before. It's roomy. It's got a functional back seat. The doors sound solid when you close them. And, hey, it's even kinda cute.

Not small cute. The Civic has always been known as a "teeny weeny" car. Make that really teeny. Remember the Civic CRX? Man, that was small.

This new Civic is now in its sixth generation — Honda started selling the Civic here in 1972. And now, all these years later, the company's East Liberty plant is the largest single producer of Civic worldwide.

A little more about East Liberty — Honda's the only

automaker (and East Liberty is the only auto plant in the world) to accomplish completion of a running model change in the midst of a plant production increase of more than 30 percent.

To effectively ramp up production of the 1996 models, while completing orders for the 1995 Civics, East Liberty was producing both 1995 and 1996 model Civics on the same line, at the same time.

By late September, Honda had finished its 1995 run and

began exclusively building 1996 Civics.

By the end of this month, the plant is expected to be building around 800 Civics a day for us here in the U.S. market and for export to Japan and other countries.

That translates in 265,000 domestically earmarked Civics for the 1996 model year, with 40,000 more being exported.

Back to the car.

Enjoying its first major makeover since the 1991 model year, the Civic is still classified as a small car, but it's really bigger, quieter, faster and more fuel efficient than it has ever been. It's also more distinctive in styling.

Three models are available this year: A sedan, coupe and hatchback. All three have smart styling, stiff bodies, better engines than their predecessors and new transmissions.

Now this is cool: The Civic HX coupe is available with a

new, innovative automatic transmission Honda calls CVT — Continuously Variable Transmission.

What Honda has done here is melded the fuel efficiency of a manual transmission and the performance of an automatic.

What this means is that it's totally shiftless. You stomp on the gas and the rpms rev up without ever having a shift-back on the car. There's never an interruption of power, either.

This feature is a little unnerving because you expect to feel the car shift up a gear. But it never does.

The Civic is also available with an improved 5-speed manual and a new 4-speed electronically controlled automatic on most models.

The automatic features Honda's grade logic control for smoother shifting when climbing or descending hills. Anti-lock brakes are standard on the EX sedan and are optional

on the other models.

The Civic EX is also powered by a high performance 127-horsepower VTEC engine. The Civic HX coupe has an improved VTEC-E engine with 115 horses that promise a whopping 39 mph in the city, 45 on the highway.

Altogether there are three 1.6-liter 16-valve engines available. The new 106-horsepower engine is the first production gasoline engine to meet California's low-emission standards.

Air conditioning and remote entry system are also standard on the EX models. Standard on all models is an AM/FM stereo and clock. The stereo is pre-wired for a security system.

Instrumentation is laid out well. The speedometer has a 247-degree sweep that's neat. All other instrumentation — including a tach, coolant temp and fuel-level gauge — is backed by a soothing blue background.

Seating is comfy in front — with enough leg room for anyone under 6-foot-2. The back seats, again, are functional for normal-sized people. Just don't push the seats all the way back. You'll fit, but the knees will touch the back of the front seat.

All in all, the new Civic is a "small" car that's fun to drive, easy on the pocket and easy on the trips to the gas station. Thumbs up.

Preventive Car Care Can Save Lives

(CCC)—Accidents directly attributable to neglected vehicle maintenance (worn brakes and tires, poor vision, loose steering, etc.) could be costing the American public billions of dollars annually. This statement, from the Car Care Council, is based on a National Highway Traffic Safety Administration estimate of \$137.5 billion annual cost of vehicle accidents. Subtracting a third which are D.U.I.-related driver impairment, this still leaves an accident tab totaling more than \$90 billion.

Five to fifteen percent of this cost might be averted through periodic inspection and maintenance of vehicles, according to industry estimates. Even the more conservative figure, which would place a \$4.5 billion price tag on mechanically related accidents, stresses the need for greater concern for safety maintenance.

Beyond the economics, concludes the Council's statement, is the impact of personal injury, loss of life and property. Consider that for every American lost during the 42 days of Operation Desert Storm, several more died on our nation's highways because of accidents due to a vehicle failure. Both types of losses are tragic and unacceptable, and certainly the latter is preventable.
