The team will be attached to the Ministry of Local Government, Rural Development and Co-operatives, and will work in close co-operation with the Bangladesh Academy for Rural Development (BARD) and other affiliated regional institutes, who, under the Five-Year Development Plan have a programme for training, research and evaluation.
