# Somerton Seeks Hwy to Link City to Port of Entry

Somerton officials are lobbying for construction of a new highway that would link their city with the Area Service Highway and the **San Luis II** commercial port of entry.

Under the proposal backed by Somerton officials, the route of the highway would extend from the commercial port of entry north on what is now Avenue E, jog to the right onto what is Avenue D and continue to County 18th Street in Somerton.

Somerton Mayor Gerardo Anaya said the proposed highway would be compatible with a separate proposal to modify San Luis II to be a border gate for private vehicles as well as commercial vehicles traveling between the United States and Mexico.


San Luis officials have asked the federal government to allow San Luis II to serve as a crossing for

private cars as a way to help shorten wait times to cross the border at the port of entry in that city's downtown.

Samuel Palacios, Somerton's public works director, said the conceptual design for the project has yet to be completed. The next phase would be to complete the final design and determine what improvements would have to be made on Avenue D between County 18 and Highway 95 to handle an increased volume of traffic.

Yuma County Supervisor Martin Porchas, whose district includes Somerton, says he will help the city try to convince the board of supervisors to proceed with work on the highway.

# For ADOT Freeway Aesthetics Are No Afterthought

Designing a freeway includes quite a bit of thought about how it will look beyond the travel lanes. That's why we make sure Valley freeways have designs that reflect the history and natural beauty of the areas they pass through.

The Loop 202 South Mountain Freeway is the latest reflection of that commitment. When designing the 22-mile freeway, ADOT took care in picking how sound walls, bridges and more would look, down to the lines, paint colors, landscaping and ground cover, including landform graphics.

As we shared last week, ADOT's designers drew inspiration from the work of modern architect Frank Lloyd Wright, architect, urban designer and artist Paolo Soleri, cholla cactuses, agriculture, the Salt River, South Mountain and more. You'll also see similar themes reflected in the choice of vegetation using, in some cases, native plants that were removed from the freeway's path, kept in temporary nurseries and replanted.

ADOT developed these concepts, which were presented for public input, in collaboration with the Frank Lloyd Wright Foundation and Cosanti Foundation.



"Design choices are an important part of providing quality freeways for today and for future generations," said LeRoy Brady, ADOT's chief landscape architect. "They enhance the experience of those who use

# 'Disruptive' Major I-10 Project Planned in Metro Phoenix

Planners are spreading the word that the start of a multiyear project to rebuild a critical freeway corridor in the heart of the metro area is only about a year off.

The project includes adding traffic lanes and building new bridges on parts of an 11-mile stretch of Interstate 10.

Work is expected to begin in spring 2021 and take about four years to complete, according to the **Arizona Department of Transportation**.

Primary funding for the \$700M project comes from a half-cent sales tax approved by Maricopa

County voters in 2004, ADOT spokesman Tom Herrmann said.

Herrmann said officials anticipate completing the final environmental assessment and receiving a favorable finding of "no significant impact" within the next 60 days.

The project could save up to 2 million hours of travel time a year.

Much of the reconstruction will center around a segment where five bridges will be built in the vicinity of **State Route 143**.

In the northern part of the project area, a collector-distribution



road system will be built to reduce the number of lane changes on the main portion of I-10 and improve traffic flow.

Other work includes expanding interchanges with SR 143 and U.S. 60.

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# Yavapai County Eyes Bridge Project over Verde River

One of the most heavily discussed Verde Valley road projects of the past few years has cleared a few more hurdles, and one county supervisor is hoping work on the road will begin later this year.

**Verde Connect** is a 9.4-mile road that will extend Beaverhead Flat Road from Cornville Road to Coury Drive, providing a continuous paved crossroad that will connect State Route 179, south of the Village of Oak Creek, with a portion of State Route 260, between Camp Verde and Cottonwood.

The route will connect to Middle Verde Road, ending the dead-end nature of that road, and will involve a new, expensive bridge over the Verde River.

District 3 Yavapai County Supervisor Randy Garrison is hopeful work on the project will start in the fall of 2020. He said most of the studies have been completed.


Garrison expects the supervisors will be able to vote on awarding a contract and beginning the project by August.

A \$25M federal grant was sought in 2018 and received as part of the Fiscal 2019 federal grant cycle.

The project has received some public opposition, especially those concerned about environmental impact, increased rural traffic, whether it is really needed or if costs will soar well beyond the \$25M in the grant and be passed along to taxpayers.

The **Camp Verde Town Council** unanimously approved a resolution on June 19th to oppose the project.
