


Left: A group of freshmen smile for a photo after completing their first class of the day. On August 15, only freshmen attended school so they could adjust to Central's schedule.











Limestone from the same Indiana quarry that made the current building is being used for the addition. Planners worked hard to keep Central's history intact.




The addition will house a new library along with music, art and drama rooms. The current library, vocal music and drama spaces have not been significantly updated since the 1930s.

























LETTER FROM THE EDITORS


