The New College of Dentistry Building

FOR years the College of Dentistry of the University of Minnesota has been recognized as one of the leading dental schools of the United States. And the growth of the school has been such that for years there has been a need for a new building. Two years ago the state legislature made provision for the new structure. Since that time, detailed studies of the needs of the college by the Board of Regents brought about the decision to put more money into the erection of the building than was at first planned. This and the fact that building costs are now lower will make possible the erection of a much more complete and desirable building than was anticipated two years ago.

The College of Dentistry will now have a building in harmony with the prestige and leadership of the school.

The College of Dentistry was moved onto the University campus in 1892. At that time it was housed, together with Medicine, in what is now the Pharmacy building. In 1912 the Dental College was moved to its present building, which was formerly a medical science building, erected in 1896.

The detailed plans of the new building as prepared by C. H. Johnston, state architect, will be shown on the succeeding pages of this publication. The preliminary plans were prepared by the University advisor, Architect F. M.

Mann, in consultation with the faculty of the College of Dentistry.

The new building which is to be 243 feet long by 66 feet wide, will be divided into two parts. The dental building proper will be 198 feet long and will have a higher roof level to accommodate the high windowed infirmary on the third floor. The second part will be an annex to Millard Hall, and will be used jointly by the medical and dental units. The entire building will be built of brick with Bedford stone trim, in harmony with all the newer buildings on the campus.

The main entrance to the building will be on the south, facing the University Hospitals. The entrance on the north into the court side of the quadrangle facing Washington Avenue will be about 200 feet back from the street. This will be easily accessible from the car lines and the noise of traffic and the dust from the street will be reduced as a result of the distance.

The structure will be four stories high. The ceiling of the clinic on the third floor will be two stories in height and the high windows on the north side will insure plenty of light. The infirmary will be equipped with about 135 chairs and units of the most modern type, with every convenience to facilitate the teaching of dentistry. Provision has been made for demonstration rooms for in-

dividual and group teaching for both students and post-graduate classes.

The diagnosis, X-ray, and oral surgery work will be located on the second floor, with ample space for these departments. Lecture rooms and laboratories for classes and individual work have been provided for in the plans.

Contracts for the new building will be let this spring and construction will begin at once. The sum of \$457,000 has been set aside by the Board of Regents for its construction, exclusive of the service connections of water, gas, electricity, sewerage, and exclusive of equipment.

Before selecting the location of the building, the Regents had architectural studies made of all the available sites on the campus, followed by complete studies and preliminary plans for buildings on the three most desirable locations. These studies occupied several months time and the decision to erect the building as it is now planned was unanimously approved by the University administration and the faculty of the College of Dentistry.

The new building at Minnesota will be one of the finest ever built for the teaching of dentistry. Every appointment has been planned most carefully and the entire structure and its equipment will stand as a model for buildings of its type and purpose.

Children's Summer School

FOR some time parents have felt the need for a summer school to which their children might be sent to enrich their experiences. Such a school is to be conducted this summer by the University of Minnesota at the Motley School. This school will be staffed by excellent teachers selected from the Minneapolis force. The curriculum, which will supplement that of the Minneapolis schools, will be an enriched one, permitting the child to broaden his experiences, make new contacts, maintain his previous knowledge, and add to that knowledge further information and enrichment which will come from his extended period of learning. In this school provision will also be made to take care of the child who needs special help in any one of the subjects pursued in elementary schools.

For further information relative to enrollment, tuition, length of school day, etc., parents should confer with the principal of the school district in which they live, or with Mr. H. P. Cooper '25 G, Principal of the Tuttle Demonstration School, Minneapolis.

Alumnae

WOMEN will study a problem many centuries old, a problem which still confronts them in modern life, on the University of Minnesota campus this summer under the direction of a graduate of the institution, Miss Alice Schoelkopf, '23Ed, who is now head of the art department at the Lincoln School, in Columbia University, and who will come to the campus to participate in the Round Table in Dramatic Arts and Music from June 15 to July 25. The problem is that of clothes—the course, one in historic costume.

Archeologists excavating at prehistoric sites, discover among the many artifacts revealed to them, an amazing number of beads, and even ear-rings with which women who lived hundreds of thousands of years ago adorned themselves. And in the modern age, an industry which absorbs the thoughts of hundreds of trained workmen, caters to this same trait. The problem of how to dress, and what to wear is greater than it has ever been before.

But teaching women how to dress is not the object of the course which Miss Schoelkopf will conduct this summer. Her interests will be in the dramatic arts course, and she will attempt to show her students how to model costumes worn in all the important periods in history. She will give lectures on the subject, she will show specimens which she has herself made, and she will have the students themselves make gowns made in the styles of the many periods of costuming. She will show them how to combine colors, how to create pleasing effects out of cheap materials, and little work.

Costumes worn in the ancient courts of Europe, the dress of the peasantry during many ages, the period costumes in the United States—these are among some of the things which the dramatic arts round table students will study. Instead of a text-book, the students in the class will carry needles, threads, a scissors, and bits of cloth.

There will be some practical help for the modern woman, Miss Schoelkopf believes. If women are to dress intelligently, they must know the fashions of previous ages. The well dressed woman should be able to trace the influence of other ages and countries in her dress. That is what the summer session students will learn.

Miss Schoelkopf is a member of the Minnesota chapter of Delta Phi Delta, and of Pi Lambda Theta. Since her graduation, she has studied at the University of California, and at Columbia University, as well as conducting research work at the Metropolitan Museum in New York city. She has also traveled in Europe, and has done many outdoor paintings both in the United States and in Europe.

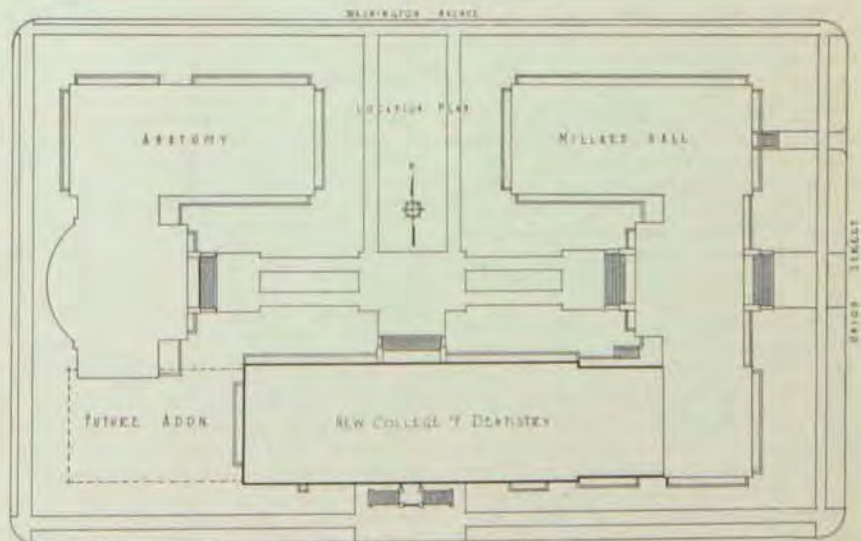
Dental Alumni

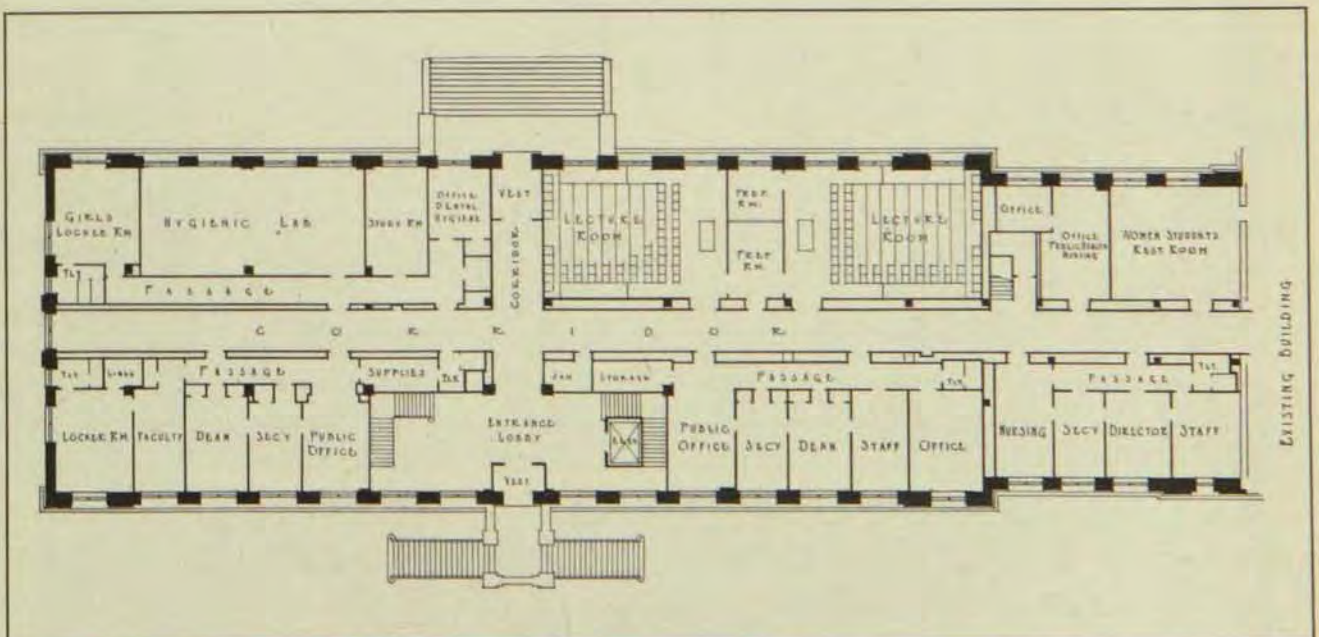

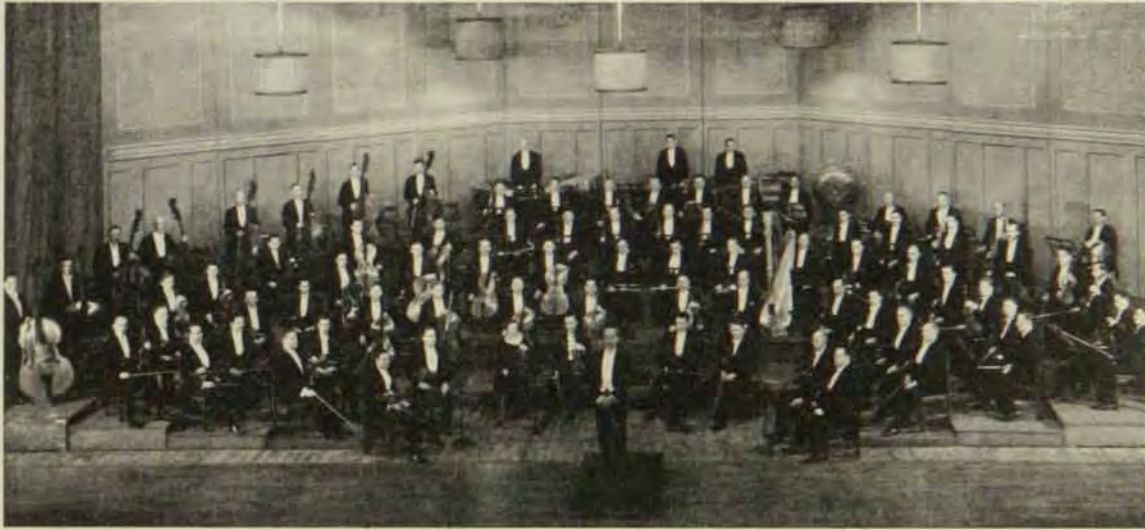

The University Symphony Series

THE first season of the University of Minnesota Symphony series was of world-wide importance. While the regular concerts by the Minneapolis Symphony orchestra, given in the Cyrus Northrop Memorial auditorium, interested and attracted thousands of students, the series had greater significance because it was the first time in history that a major orchestra had become affiliated with a university and presented its programs on a college campus.

The orchestra itself, under the direction of Henri Verbrugghen, developed remarkably through the season, as if inspired by its beautiful new "home," which Serge Koussevitzky described as America's finest concert auditorium. Situated midway between Minneapolis and St. Paul, the building was easily reached by students near the campus and music lovers in each city, so that an unprecedented interest in the Symphony and its work was aroused.

Such an important season offered in its sixteen concerts fittingly brilliant attractions. Already names like those of Paderewski, Jeritza, Spaulding and Onegin have become associated with the University and its Symphony course. Every concert was an outstanding event in the history of the University and the Northwest.

The season opened with a gala program which included the appearance of Maria Jeritza, Metropolitan Opera Company soprano, as guest artist. It was the first time in years the famed singer had sung with an orchestra in a concert program, and a capacity audience gave the series an encouraging start.

The regular programs which followed brought to the campus Alexander Brailowsky, pianist, Louis Graveure, the

former baritone who now has a lyric tenor voice, Ruggiero Ricci, sensational child violinist, Jascha Schwarzmann, new first violincellist of the Minneapolis Symphony, Josef Gingold, violinist, and Heinrich Schlusnus, leading German baritone.

Extra seats for a huge audience were placed in all the available unused space when Ignace Jan Paderewski, the world's most celebrated pianist, appeared December 12, 1930. Following a masterful

interpretation of his stirring B minor symphony by the orchestra, the renowned musician played his concerto for piano, accompanied by the players. The pomp and brilliance of the occasion will always be remembered by the 5,000 people who were present.

Guest soloists with the orchestra in the remaining programs were: Clare Clairbert, Belgian soprano, Jose Iturbi, Spanish pianist, Paul Kochanski, violinist, Sigrid Onegin, the popular contralto, Myra Hess, distinguished English pianist, and Albert Spaulding, native violinist. Two guest conductors, Chalmers Clifton and Eugene Goosens, also visited the campus.

A feature of the series came at the final concert on April 10 when Henri Verbrugghen, conductor of the orchestra, was honored with investiture with the cross of an Officer of the Order of the Royal Belgian Crown. Orren E. Safford, vice-president of the General Alumni Association and Belgian consul to Minneapolis, presented Mr. Verbrugghen with the cross, conferred directly by King Albert in recognition of the local conductor's distinguished work in music.

Looking to the future, it can be safely said that the increasing interest in the orchestra and its plans will assure a banner year for the musicians next season. The beloved Mary Garden will sing at the opening program, October 23, and on January 8 there will be a "Rachmaninoff night," with the appearance and a full program of the famous Russian composer's work. Seasons of such brilliance will be of increasing worth to students, faculty members and alumni of the University, and will go far to enhance Minnesota's already high cultural reputation.

Minnesotans

ANOTHER member of the class of 1906 of the University of Minnesota who has won international prominence in his chosen field is Dr. Elvin C. Stakman. Dr. Stakman is now professor of plant pathology and botany, and pathologist in the Agricultural Experiment Station at the University. He has just completed a semester of lectures in the German language at the University of Halle in Germany, as guest professor. At the present time he is returning to the United States by way of Malaya, Java, Sumatra, the Philippine Islands, China, and the Hawaiian Islands.

In 1928 Dr. Stakman was the recipient of the Emil Christian Hansen gold medal and prize of 2,000 crowns for his work. He was further honored by an international group a few months ago by appointment on a jury of award of the International Committee for Phytopathology and Economic Entomology. The other members of the jury are Dr. Jacob Eriksson of Sweden, one of the world's outstanding authorities on rust diseases of cereals, and Professor E. T. Foex, probably the best known plant pathologist of France.

Dr. Stakman was born in Algoma, Wisconsin, and received his early education in a St. Paul high school. In 1910 he completed the work for his M.A. degree at the University and received his doctor's degree in 1913. Before completing his University work he taught school at Red Wing and at Mankato. During the school term of 1908-09 he was superintendent of schools at Argyle, Minnesota. He became a member of the University staff in 1909 as an instructor in plant pathology. He attained his present rank on the staff in 1919.

Since 1914 he has also been connected with the United States Department of Agriculture in various capacities. In 1918-19 he was pathologist in charge of the barberry eradication campaign. Since 1917 he has been in charge of the rust epidemiology studies and stem rust studies for the United States Department of Agriculture in co-operation

with the University of Minnesota. He is a member of several college honor societies, including Phi Beta Kappa, Sigma Xi, Alpha Zeta, Gamma Sigma Delta, and Gamma Alpha. He is also a member of several national and international scientific societies.

During 1917-18 he was a member of the commission in charge of emergency research of the War Emergency Board of American Plant Pathologists. In 1922 he was president of the American Phytopathological Society, and from 1925 until 1929 he was editor-in-chief of *Phytopathology*. Last year he was accorded unusual international recognition when he was named the first and only American scientist to serve as an editor on the editorial board of the *Phytopathologische Zeitschrift*. In 1923 he was named delegate from this country to the Pan-Pacific Science Congress.

Dr. Stakman has traveled extensively during the past several years. His scientific journeys have taken him through all the states of the United States and into all the provinces of Canada. He has also made several trips to Mexico and has traveled extensively through Europe.

Law Alumni

MAYNARD E. PIRSIG, LL.B., 1925, associate professor of law, has been awarded a fellowship at Harvard Law School with a stipend of \$2,000. Since graduation, Mr. Pirsig has been chief counsel of the Legal Aid Society of Minneapolis. He will be on leave from the University for the next two years. Following his year at Harvard Law School, he will study one year abroad. His work will be in the field of administration of law. On his return to the university, Professor Pirsig will teach this subject as part of the four year law course.

Edward S. Bade, LL.B., 1922, has been nominated for a fellowship at Columbia University Law School at a stipend of \$2,400. Since graduation, Mr. Bade has been engaged in practice and has been associated with James E. O'Brien. He will pursue post-graduate studies at Columbia in the field of property and trust law.

Floyd E. Nelson, B.A., 1929, LL.B., 1931, has been awarded a Sterling Fellowship at Yale Law School with a stipend of \$1,500 for next year.

In recent examinations for admission to the Bar of the State of New York, **John B. King, B.A.**, 1928, LL.B., 1930, made the highest average of nearly two thousand candidates. 1931 Memorial

New Fee System

A new system of general and military deposit fees to take effect next fall will require a \$15 deposit of all men students,

whether or not they take military drill.

The \$15 deposit will be made upon registration in the University and will be kept until the student either graduates or withdraws from school. Under the former system the registrar's office has been closing deposit accounts at the end of each spring quarter.

The \$15 deposit will take the place of the \$10 fee in the Colleges of Dentistry, Medicine and Pharmacy and the \$10 military deposit.

Gopher Lettermen Hold Reunion

SOME 300 winners of the M were present at the first annual letterman reunion in the Minnesota Union Tuesday night. In the afternoon preceding the dinner, a baseball game between an alumni team and Coach McCormick's 1931 team was played on Northrop Field. The varsity won, 20 to 2, in spite of the umpiring of Dr. L. J. Cooke.

The occasion, planned by Athletic Director Fritz Crisler, was considered a definite step forward toward a revitalizing of Minnesota's athletic tradition, which the Gopher sports chief in his address of welcome declared was missing with the new men.

Tales of hard-boiled athletes of the 80s and 90s, who would play two football games in three days, when each half lasted 45 minutes, and the intermission was only 10 minutes, when the campus gridiron was a sandburr patch, and but one bath tub was available for both teams, were spun to the high amusement of the hearers.

Such inspiration was delivered to the Gopher athletes assembled who have played in this and recent years with the help of lavish facilities by old veterans, including George K. Belden, Jack Hayden, Dr. Leo M. Crafts, George Finlayson, Jack Harrison and Martin Davis, all former footballers. Davis came all the way from Joplin, Mo., for the dinner, while Finlayson came from Duluth.

After telling of progress made in the athletic department during his first year of administration, Crisler asked for a return to the athletic tradition constructed during the days of Dr. Henry L. Williams, football coach, and Dr. L. J. Cooke, veteran staff member,

whose greatest success lay in his basketball teams.

"In my opinion," Crisler said, "the groundwork will be laid soon for wholesome progress and we now can look forward to a good future. The old Cooke and Williams tradition has not been carried down to the new men. Your job and my job is to do this."

Progress over the year, Crisler said, is seen in the following steps taken in University athletics:

Revision of letter requirements which "recognize faithful service over a pe-

riod of three years even if the service did fall short of technical requirements"; revision of the manager systems to assure more efficient operation; standardization of eligibility rules; arranging for practice to start at 4 p. m. daily; eliminating the conflicts of military drill with spring practices; creation of a sports publicity office; impending completion of the golf course and clubhouse; a return to the captaincy system; adoption of a policy of encouraging athletes to participate in other sports wherever they can make a contribution and development of morale in the department.

Old timers who attended the dinner included Bernie Transk, member of the 1886 football team with Hayden; Byron Timberlake, 1889, with Martin Davis; Harry Loomis, 1895; Richard Woodworth, 1896; George Rogers and George Sudheimer, 1899.

Additional talks were given by R. B. "Bunny" Rathbun, E. B. Pierce, Dr. Cooke and Sig Harris.

Dramatic Stars Secured

EVEN among theatrical circles, where anything is expected to happen, and where most anything does occur, there is a first time for everything. Ernest Lawford, distinguished English actor, and Edward Fielding, prominent American actor with successes both in the United States and in Europe, will appear in star roles in a collegiate production for the first time since they themselves were in college, when they came before the public in the University Summer Dramatic Arts Course presentation of "Marco Millions," on July 2 and 3 in the Cyrus Northrop auditorium.

Mr. Fielding will come to the campus at the conclusion of a long tour with the New York Theatre Guild, where he has been one of the cast in the Lynne Fontaine and Alfred Lunt presentation of "Elizabeth the Queen." Mr. Lawford is now making his first talking picture in the interesting role of Barrows, the English butler, in the Nancy Carroll starring feature, "Personal Maid," now under production in the Paramount's New York Studio, and he will come to the campus as soon as the picture is completed. Mr. Lawford's last appearance on the screen was in the Paramount silent picture, "Irish Luck," with Thomas Meighan.

If fate had not played a queer trick on Mr. Fielding, he would probably have gone into the diplomatic service. In his family there has been a long succession of professional men, and family pressure was brought on Mr. Fielding to study political science, so that when he was finished with his college course, he might go to Venezuela as secretary to the minister. A trip to Europe was the final step in the long preparation for the diplomatic service, and it was while he was there, that Mr. Fielding changed his mind about his

choice of a profession. He and a group of young people interested in literature, suddenly decided that the theatre was the life for them, and to their surprise, they were actually given parts in professional productions at the Drury Lane Theatre. After one season at that theatre, and three at Her Majesty's Theatre, Mr. Fielding began to get significant parts in companies in which Granville Barker and Olga Nethersole were starred. Some of the plays from this early period include "The Second Mrs. Tanqueray," "Magda," "Midsummer Night's Dream," and "Julius Caesar." When he finally returned to the United States, Mr. Fielding was firmly convinced that he should continue in his theatrical career. And that is why the University will be able to present so distinguished an actor as Mr. Fielding in its summer production.

Mr. Fielding saw his first great success in "A Woman's Way," with Grace George, and his first Broadway hit was in "Your Humble Servant," while his theatrical successes range from Shakespearean revival, Ibsen seasons, and French and German classics, to modern plays written by contemporary dramatists.

"Statemen have careers, actors only lives—and possibly experiences," is the claim made by Mr. Lawford, who is reluctant to discuss his theatrical career. He too, like Mr. Fielding, was expected to have a professional career, which in spite of family opposition was abandoned in favor of theatrical life.

Mr. Lawford started as an amateur directing two performances a year in London, one performance at Windsor, and one at Richmond, for the favorite charities of Princess Mary of Teck, mother of the present queen of England. This taste of amateur productions edged his appetite for professional work, and undertaking the most arduous of all training, he went out with provincial companies playing in "one night stalls." The memories of those jobs still haunt his memory, and he recalls how at times, the company would be required to walk from one town to the next because there was not money for train-fare.

The University productions, and the excitement of college life have recalled to the minds of the two guest stars, vivid impressions of their youthful training, and they are anxious to being their association with the University group which is just now beginning its career.

This play, and two others, is being given as a part of the round table in dramatic arts and music which will be held from June 15 to July 25, and at which dramatic directors in the Northwest will be given an opportunity to study stage lighting, design, costume, and play production.

Mr. Lawford, who is looking forward to the opportunity to be of assistance to the people in the Northwest inter-

ested in drama, has been the leading character in the original production of "Candida," and "The Man of Destiny," by George Bernard Shaw.

Among other delightful experiences which Mr. Lawford has had, is that of playing leading man with Maude Adams. He was Captain Hook in her production of "Peter Pan," which was played in 811 performances, and he took the part of Lieutenant Brown in "Quality Street," and the part of Metternich in "L'Aiglon," two plays which Miss Adams made famous. In 1925 Mr. Lawford played Jesus Christ in "The Life of Christ," every word of which is from the New Testament, and the playing of this part he regards as one of the most wonderful experiences in his life.

Professor Lester Raines, of the Normal University, New Mexico, and formerly dramatic director at the University, will direct the performance. Tryouts for the student parts are now being conducted for undergraduates on the campus who will return for the summer session, while another tryout will be conducted after June 15 for the summer session students.

COMMENT

THE campus of the University has undergone great changes since the members of the Silver Anniversary class of 1906 received their diplomas from President Cyrus Northrop twenty-five years ago. Even the names of the old buildings that they knew have been changed and the center of campus activities has shifted from the Knoll facing University Avenue to the Mall facing Washington Avenue.

About the farthest thing from the minds of the members of the class of 1931 at the present time are any thoughts of class reunions. And they undoubtedly will leave the University with the general feeling that the campus will remain pretty much as it is today for some time to come. But it might be interesting to consider the possible developments that may come to the campus during the period between their graduation and the reunion marking the tenth anniversary of their class.

Even before they are away from the University they hear of definite changes that may take place within the next decade. During the past week the Minneapolis city planning commission presented to William T. Middlebrook, comptroller of the University, and chairman of the University traffic committee, plans which may

lead to the depression of Washington Avenue and the unbroken continuance of the grass plot of the Mall from the steps of Northrop Memorial auditorium south to the bluff overlooking the Mississippi River.

Washington Avenue would run underground from Walnut street to the river. The completion of such a project would eliminate traffic congestion on Washington Avenue, and it would enable the University, partially at least, to solve the parking problem on the campus through the construction of a large underground garage. At the present time there is a parking garage under the auditorium plaza. Another object of the plan on the part of the city would be to complete a connection of the River road with St. Anthony boulevard to further develop the Grand Rounds parkway system of Minneapolis.

The River road would be cut in the rock of the bluff twenty-five feet beneath Washington Avenue and would run across Washington on to Thirteenth Avenue. A side lane would connect it with Washington at the bridge. The driveway from the Fourteenth Avenue gate to the Mines Experimental building and the animal house behind the Psychology building would be eliminated.

By means of Thirteenth Avenue, the River road would connect with St. Anthony boulevard and the Grand Rounds, a system designed by the park board to circle the city. The break from the River road to St. Anthony boulevard has been the only open part of the loop for several years. Many efforts have been made to complete the circle.

The plans were designed by H. E. Olsen, engineer of the city planning commission, in accordance with the Cass Gilbert plan of the campus at the joint request of the park board and the University.

SPORTS OF THE WEEK

ONLY once before has a Minnesota track team scored more points in an annual Western Conference track and field meet than the total of 15 scored by the 1931 aggregation at Evanston last week. Clarence Munn tossed the shot more than 48 feet 8½ inches to take the championship in that event away from Behr of Wisconsin. For the entire two years of his track competition at the University Munn has been aiming for a triumph over the great Badger weight man. The Gopher athlete has been slowly creeping up inch by inch until the conference meet when he realized his objective. In the Pennsylvania Relays a few weeks ago, Munn broke a record which had stood for a quarter of a century.

Since last spring, Munn has added more than two feet to his own distance in the shot put. Under the direction of Coach Sherman Finger, he has consistently bettered his style and added not only inches but feet to his distance. Coach Finger feels that the development will continue and that Munn has not yet reached the maximum of his ability. Next spring at a time when the candidates for the 1932 American Olympic team are being selected, the Gopher star will rate as one of the ranking competitors in his event in the country.

Cam Hackle of Minnesota tied Shaw of Wisconsin for the conference championship in the high jump. Here is another Gopher who will be competing again next year who has shown marked development. Captain Johnny Hass pressed Eddie Tolan of Michigan in the 100 yard dash to place second, and he placed fifth in the 220 yard event. Scheifley, another Gopher sophomore, showed his mettle in fast company by placing fifth in the high hurdles. The event was won by Sentman of Illinois who set a new conference record and tied the world's record of 14.4.

Gophers Win No-Hit, No-Run Game

THE Minnesota baseball team came along strong in the final game of the season to win a no-hit, no-run game from the powerful Wisconsin nine on Northrop Field, Wednesday afternoon. Walford Mattson, star Gopher hurler, held the Badgers hitless while his mates were collecting six hits and three runs. During the last five innings of the contest, Mattson set the opponents down in order. A no-hit, no-run game has not been seen on Northrop Field since Al Redding blanked the Iowa team in 1926.

The Gopher pitcher received great fielding support from his mates. The Badgers drove the ball hard on numerous occasions only to be out at first on brilliant plays by the Minnesota infielders. Adams, Beauchaine, and Loose stopped hard hit grounders and pegged accurately to Gay at first.

Jake Sommerfield, the Wisconsin twirler, pitched in style that would have won nine out of 10 games, but he was up against an invincible Mattson. Sommerfield was relieved in the beginning of the seventh after the Gophers scored two tallies in the sixth.

Only four Cardinals were able to make their way to the bags. Mattson donated three gifts in the form of two walks and a hit batter, while Griswold, Wisconsin catcher, scooted all the way around to third when Don Cherp in left field missed on the backstop's liner in the second.

The Gophers put two hits and a sacrifice together in the fourth inning to score their initial run. "Lefty" Evans banged a hot single off Sommerfield's glove, and went to second on Gay's good sacrifice. Beauchaine then parked the ball far in center field for a triple to bring in Evans.

A walk, a beautiful hit and run play, a long fly and Loose's triple brought in two more runs and finished the scoring for the afternoon. "Sparky" Adams, first up in the sixth, worked Sommerfield for a walk, Evans popped out trying to sacrifice, but Gay singled on a hit and run play which sent the speedy Adams to third. He scored a moment later on Beauchaine's long fly to left. The Gopher first baseman then counted on Loose's second extra base hit.

Golfers Place Third

For the second time in succession Minnesota's varsity golf team captured a third place rating in the annual conference golf tournament at Ann Arbor last Friday and Saturday. Led by Edgar Bolstad, who was third low score man with a total of 316, the four Gophers used 1321 strokes to complete 72 holes of play.

The Illinois and Michigan team placed first and second, respectively.

Earl Larson of Minnesota shot the only hole-in-one of the affair. Larson placed fourteenth with a total of 332. Captain Bill Fowler found the wet weather conditions so harmful to his style of play that he was forced to acknowledge 338 strokes. After shooting by far

the best game of anyone on the squad throughout the season, the Gopher leader suffered reverses, which prevented him from competing for individual honors.

Cliff Bloom, the fourth man to make up the Minnesota team, was midway in the standings with a 335 total.

Lose to Badgers

The Minnesota track team won seven first places in their final dual meet of the season with Wisconsin, the 1931 conference champions. Johnny Currell of Minnesota staged a great finish in the two mile event to win from Wright of Wisconsin who won the race at the conference meet just a week earlier. Captain Johnny Hass scored firsts in the two dashes and a second place in the broad jump. Munn again defeated Behr in the shot put. Shaw of Wisconsin did not compete and the high jump was won handily by Hackle.

Reach Semi-finals

Minnesota racqueteers reached the semi-finals in both the singles and doubles Big Ten matches held last Thursday, Friday and Saturday, at Columbus, Ohio.

Henry Yutzy, Gopher ace, was forced out of the race in the singles, losing to Carl Dennison of Ohio State, after one of the closest matches of the tournament, 8-6, 9-7, 6-2, 6-2.

Dennison, in the finals, lost to the defending champion, Scott Rexinger of Chicago, who also tripped up Charles Britzius, Maroon and Gold sophomore star, in the quarter-finals, 6-3, 6-2.

In the doubles matches, Rexinger teamed up with Herbert Heyman to cop the Big Ten title, defeating Riel and Dodge of Northwestern. The Minnesota entry, Yutzy and Britzius also went to the semi finals, being downed by Riel and Dodge.

Coeds Receive Awards

Sixty-one coeds, the largest number ever to receive awards at the W. A. A. spring banquet this week were presented with chevrons, pins and M's for achievement in women's athletics.

One coed, Regina Joesting, was given the W. A. A. seal, the highest honor to be won in coeds' sports at the University. A second, Dorothy Gershel, was presented a medal by Major John H. Hester for winning the national rifle marksmanship championship for coeds from a prone position.

Ruth Kiekenapp was awarded a medal for the high score in rifle shooting between men and women.

Nine coeds received the M, the next to the highest sport award for feminine athletes. Nine seasons of athletic activity, covering at least four different sports, is necessary to win the M.
