# 3. Presentation/District 12, Chief Medical Examiner

Mr. Maxcy called on Shawn Edwards and Robert Hamrick to discuss mitered ends. Mr. Edwards stated the mitered ends takes longer to install. Further discussion followed. Robert Hamrick will contact Road & Bridge along with Engineering and bring results back to the Board at the June 25<sup>th</sup> Board Meeting. Mr. Maxcy stated the LDR will need to be amended asked that Robert Hamrick work with Engineering as well as Road & Bridge for solutions on this issue.

Mr. Maxcy called on Peggy Waters to give a report regarding the withdrawal of commodity distribution by County employees. Ms Waters stated DeSoto County is the only local government left that is doing this program. The State will find another person or entity to continue with the program. Ms. Waters commented there is a wealth of different ways to help feed residents of the County. There will be a 30 day notice given due to the contract.

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## EMPLOYMENT AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT made and entered into this <u>11</u> day of <u>June</u> 20<u>13</u>, by and between DESOTO COUNTY, a political subdivision of the State of Florida, acting by and through the DeSoto County Board of County Commissioners, 201 E. Oak Street, Arcadia, Florida 34266, hereinafter referred to as (Employer), and <u>Jorge L. Hernandez</u>, hereinafter referred to as (Employee).

#### 1. EMPLOYMENT

The Employer hereby employs, engages and hires the Employee as <u>Code Compliance Director</u> Employee is an "at will" employee and as such works at the pleasure of the County Administrator.

## 2. BEST EFFORTS OF EMPLOYEE

Employee agrees that he/she will at all times faithfully, industriously, and to the best of his or her ability, experience and talents, perform all of the duties that may be required of and from him/her pursuant to the express and implicit terms of the Agreement to the reasonable satisfaction of Employer.

#### 3. TERM OF EMPLOYMENT

a. The term of this Agreement commences on June 11, 2013 Employee agrees to remain in the exclusive employ of DeSoto County, and to neither accept nor to become employed by any other employer while serving DeSoto County, except as may otherwise be approved by the County Administrator.

b. Employee's service shall be reviewed by the County Administrator in accordance with the Personnel Policies of DeSoto County.

c. Nothing in this Agreement shall prevent or otherwise interfere with the right of the Employer to evaluate the performance of the Employee at any time, and to continue or terminate the service of the Employee at any time.

## 4. COMPENSATION AND BENEFITS

a. Employer agrees to pay Employee for his/her services rendered pursuant hereto an annual salary of \$53,156.48, payable weekly at the same time other employees of Employer are paid.

b. Employee is entitled to the following benefits as part of his/her employment with DeSoto County.

- 1. Health Care: "Employees only" coverage paid by the County, effective per current Health Plan wait period.
- 2. Vacation:
  - Seven (7) days the first year;
  - Ten (10) days beginning the second year through the fifth year;
  - Fifteen (15) days beginning the sixth year through the tenth year; and
  - Twenty (20) days the beginning of the eleventh year.
- 3. Sick Leave: Two (2) hours per week.
- 4. Retirement Membership in the Florida Retirement System in the Senior Management Service Class (SMSC) if position is designated; otherwise in the Regular Class.
- 5. Pay Increases:
  - Cost of living increases or any other pay increases that are approved by the Board and apply to all County employees;
  - Merit increases at the discretion of the Administrator within budgeted amounts, not to exceed 10% per year.

6. Workers Compensation, FICA (Employer Matching), Unemployment Compensation and Florida Retirement Plan (Employer Contribution) will all be paid by the County.

# 5. PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

a. The County may pay for Employee's annual membership cost for up to two (2) professional organizations.

b. The County will pay for the cost of out of County travel when traveling on County business which includes attendance at conferences, seminars, etc., which are for professional development.

# 6. SEVERANCE

a. In the event Employee voluntarily resigns his/her position, Employee shall not be entitled to severance pay. However, Employee shall receive accumulated annual leave and fifty percent (50%) of his/her accumulated sick leave up to a maximum of two hundred (200) hours.

b. If Employee is asked to resign or is terminated, he/she will receive thirty (30) working days of severance pay in addition to all accumulated annual leave and fifty percent (50%) of unused sick leave up to a maximum of two hundred (200) hours.

c. If Employee retires, he/she will receive all accumulated annual leave and fifty percent (50%) of accumulated sick leave up to a maximum of two hundred (200) hours.

d. If employee is convicted of a crime, he/she will be terminated, no severance benefits will be paid and all accumulated annual and sick leave will be forfeited.

## 7. NOTICE OF RESIGNATION

Employee is required to provide the County Administrator with sixty (60) days written notice of resignation. The County Administrator may accept less notice time if it is determined that less notice would not adversely affect the County. However, if Employee fails to provide the required sixty days notice and the Administrator does not accept less than the sixty days notice, the Employee will not be entitled to receive any severance or accumulated leave benefits, but shall receive a final pay check.

#### 8. BENEFITS IN CASE OF EXTENDED ILLNESS

In addition to being eligible for the County Sick Leave Sharing, the County Administrator may propose to the Board extension of benefits for Employee for a specified period of time. The recommendation will list the specific benefits requested and the time frame for the request.

#### 9. EMPLOYMENT STATUS

In addition to the fact that the Employee works at the pleasure of the County Administrator and is an "at will" employee, the Administrator may elect to place Employee on a leave with pay or without pay for a specified period of time. If Employee is placed on leave with pay status, he/she will continue to receive all benefits and pay as they were prior to being placed on the leave with pay status. If Employee is placed on a leave without pay status, he/she will continue to receive all benefits he/she received prior to his/her status change with the exception of being paid.

#### **10. MODIFICATION OF POLICY**

If the Board modifies the Employment Policy Affecting Director Positions, Employee agrees that this contract is subject to and shall be amended to conform to such modifications.

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## **11. INDEMNIFICATION**

The Employer shall defend, save harmless and indemnify the Employee against any actions, in tort or if he/she is named in his/her capacity as <u>Code Compliance Director</u> as a party defendant in any action for any injury or damage suffered as a result of any act, event or omission of action in the scope of his/her duties or function, unless he/she acted in bad faith or with malicious purpose or in a manner exhibiting wanton and willful disregard of human rights, safety, or property. The Employer shall not be liable in tort for the acts or omissions of the Employee committed while acting outside the course and scope of his/her agreed duties or committed in bad faith or with malicious purpose or in a manner exhibiting wanton and willful disregard and willful disregard of human rights, safety or property. Employer shall have the right to settle and compromise claims brought against Employee in his/her official capacity.

## **12. CONTROLLING LAW**

This Agreement is to be governed by the laws of the State of Florida. The venue for any litigation resulting out of this Agreement shall be in DeSoto County, Florida.

## **13. EXTENT OF AGREEMENT**

This Agreement represents the entire integrated agreement between the Employer and Employee and supersedes all prior negotiations, representations or agreements, either written or oral. This Agreement may only be amended, supplemented, modified, changed or cancelled by a duly executed written instrument.

#### 1. EMPLOYMENT

The Employer hereby employs, engages and hires the Employee as Environmental Services Director Employee is an "at will" employee and as such works at the pleasure of the County Administrator.

### 2. BEST EFFORTS OF EMPLOYEE

Employee agrees that he/she will at all times faithfully, industriously, and to the best of his or her ability, experience and talents, perform all of the duties that may be required of and from him/her pursuant to the express and implicit terms of the Agreement to the reasonable satisfaction of Employer.

## 3. TERM OF EMPLOYMENT

a. The term of this Agreement commences on March 26, 2013 Employee agrees to remain in the exclusive employ of DeSoto County, and to neither accept nor to become employed by any other employer while serving DeSoto County, except as may otherwise be approved by the County Administrator.

b. Employee's service shall be reviewed by the County Administrator in accordance with the Personnel Policies of DeSoto County.

c. Nothing in this Agreement shall prevent or otherwise interfere with the right of the Employer to evaluate the performance of the Employee at any time, and to continue or terminate the service of the Employee at any time.

# 4. COMPENSATION AND BENEFITS

a. Employer agrees to pay Employee for his/her services rendered pursuant hereto an annual salary of \$52,291.20, payable weekly at the same time other employees of Employer are paid.

b. Employee is entitled to the following benefits as part of his/her employment with

DeSoto County.

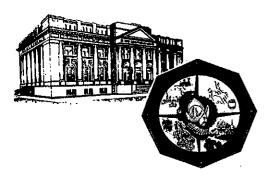

FDLE recommends that the Board of County Commissioners assume this responsibility. In the event the county declines to serve in this capacity, the Department will request the governing body of each municipality in the county, in descending order of population, to serve as the coordinating unit of government.

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#### Memorandum of Understanding Desoto County and Boca Grande Fire Control District

The Boca Grande Fire Control District hereafter referred to as "BGFCD" in this document, and Desoto County hereby enter into this agreement in order to coordinate the mechanical repair and maintenance of the vehicle fleet of the "BGFCD" by the Desoto County Road and Bridge Department.

This agreement encompasses all mechanical repair and preventative maintenance needs of the "BGFCD" within the scope, availability and capability of the Desoto County Road and Bridge Department. This agreement also recognizes from time to time that other needs may be requested such as welding and fabrication or other improvements needed to facilitate or upgrade the function of a specific vehicle. The "BGFCD" recognizes that Desoto County Fire Rescue vehicles will take priority of repair and the "BGFCD" will coordinate repairs so that all work will be scheduled and performed most efficiently for both parties. DeSoto County will make every effort to perform requested work in a timely manner but makes not representation or guarantee either that work will be accepted or that work will be completed within the time requested by BGFCD. Nothing in this Memorandum of Understanding prevents or limits BGFCD from using other facilities or vendors to perform repair, maintenance or other work.

## The following considerations are also understood:

- The hourly rate for labor will be \$65
- Parts will be supplied and paid for by the "BGFCD" unless other arrangements have been made. Accounts for parts suppliers (suggested by Desoto County) will be established and maintained by the "BGFCD"
- The "BGFCD" is responsible for delivery of vehicles for repair to Desoto County and return to Boca Grande. This includes towing if needed.
- If mobile repair is required the "BGFCD" will be responsible for tolls and will pay the hourly labor rate of \$65 for travel time.
- The "BGFCD" will provide any needed vehicle information or other historical information pertaining to repair needs of the fleet.
- Desoto County Road and Bridge agrees to assist the "BGFCD" in tracking its fleet for preventative maintenance or other needs.
- BGFCD agrees to indemnify and hold DeSoto County harmless for any damage, claims or injuries resulting from or incurred while BGFCD vehicles are in the care and custody or DeSoto County, or as a result of or caused by work performed by DeSoto County on BGFCD vehicles.
- Any deviation from this plan must be agreed upon in writing by both parties.

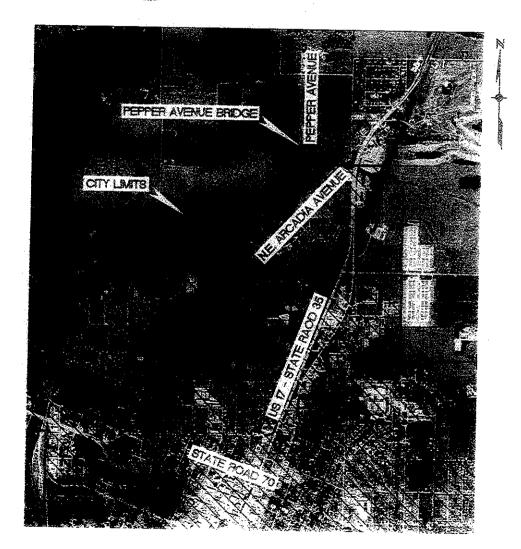

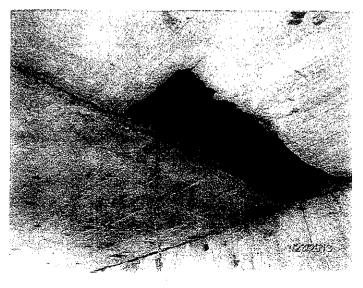

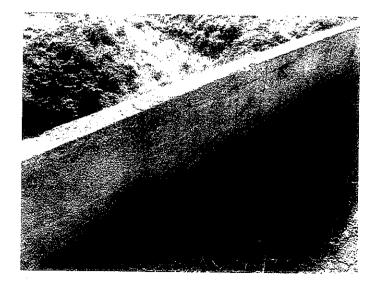

B. All representations, certifications, statements contained in CONTRACTOR'S bid submittal are true and accurate and are incorporated by reference herein.

#### SECTION 3. THE COUNTY'S RESPONSIBILITY.

Unless otherwise provided in the Scope of Work, the COUNTY'S responsibilities are as follows:

A. To provide, at the request of CONTRACTOR, existing data, plans, reports, and other information in the COUNTY'S possession or under the COUNTY'S control which are necessary for the execution of the duties of the CONTRACTOR in the Technical Specifications; and to provide full information regarding requirements of the Technical Specifications, including objectives, budget constraints, criteria and other requirements that exist at the time of signing of this Contract or which may develop during the execution of this Contract.

B. To give prompt written notice to CONTRACTOR if the COUNTY observes or otherwise becomes aware of any fault or defect in the Technical Specifications or non-conformance with the Contract requirements as stated herein.

C. To furnish required information, services, render approvals, and decisions as expeditiously as necessary for the orderly progress of CONTRACTOR'S services.

D. The COUNTY hereby designates the Utilities Director to act on the COUNTY'S behalf with respect to the Scope of Work. The Director shall have authority to transmit instructions, receive information, interpret and define COUNTY policies and decisions with respect to materials, elements and systems pertinent to CONTRACTOR'S services.

#### SECTION 4. TIME OF PERFORMANCE.

The CONTRACTOR agrees to commence work in accordance with the Notice to Proceed issued after Contract execution. If not canceled by the COUNTY, this Contract shall be for a period of one (1) year and may be renewed for a period of two (2) additional years, one year at a time, upon mutual consent and approval by the DeSoto County board of County Commissioners. The CONTRACTOR shall make no claims for

additional compensation or damages due to suspensions, delays or hindrances. CONTRACTOR may only be compensated for the extension of time as the COUNTY may decide. However, such extension shall not operate as a waiver of any other rights of the COUNTY.

#### SECTION 5. COMPENSATION.

Compensation for the Scope of Work performed by CONTRACTOR shall be payable as follows:

A. The COUNTY shall pay an annual amount not to exceed **TWENTY SIX THOUSAND ONE HUNDRED SIXTY DOLLARS (\$26,160.00)**. The CONTRACTOR may submit invoices on a monthly basis for work completed.

B. CONTRACTOR shall prepare and submit to the DeSoto County Finance Department, invoices for the services rendered under this Contract. Invoices for services shall be paid in accordance with the Florida Prompt Payment Act. All invoices shall be accompanied by a report identifying the nature and progress of the work performed. The statement shall show a summary of fees with an accrual of the total fees billed and credits for portions paid previously. The COUNTY reserves the right to withhold payment to CONTRACTOR for failure to perform the work in accordance with the provisions of this Contract and the COUNTY shall promptly notify CONTRACTOR if any invoice or report is found to be unacceptable and will specify the reasons therefore.

C. Compliance with requirements for the release of, or receipt of payment for, any lien or notice to owner relating to this project.

D. All representations, indemnifications, warranties and guarantees made in, required by or given in accordance with this Contract, as well as all continuing obligations indicated in this Contract, will survive final payment and termination or completion of this Contract.

#### SECTION 6. DOCUMENTS.

The documents which comprise this Contract between the COUNTY and CONTRACTOR are attached hereto and made a part and consist of the following:

- 1. This Contract;
- 2. The Technical Specifications attached as Exhibit "A" consisting of 5 pages.

 Contractor's Bid Form attached as Exhibit "B" consisting of 1 pages. Please note, total reflected is a monthly total not an annual total as listed on Contractor's Bid Form

B. This Contract represents the entire and integrated agreement between the COUNTY and CONTRACTOR and supersedes all prior negotiations, representations or contracts, either written or oral.

C. This Contract may only be amended, supplemented, modified, changed or canceled by a duly executed written instrument in accordance with County Policies.

In the event of a conflict between the terms of the Exhibits and this Contract, this Contract shall prevail.

#### SECTION 7. GENERAL CONSIDERATIONS.

A. <u>Subcontractors.</u> If CONTRACTOR subcontracts any of the work required under this Contract, CONTRACTOR agrees to include in the subcontract that the Subcontractor is bound by the terms and conditions of this Contract with the COUNTY. CONTRACTOR further agrees to include in the subcontracts, that the Subcontractor shall hold the COUNTY and CONTRACTOR harmless against all claims of whatever nature by Subcontractor's performance of Work under this Contract.

B. <u>Public Records.</u> CONTRACTOR shall allow public access to all documents, reports, papers, letters or other materials, subject to the provision of Chapter 119, Florida Statutes, prepared or received by CONTRACTOR in conjunction with this Contract. It is expressly understood that upon receipt of substantial evidence of CONTRACTOR'S refusal to comply with this provision, the COUNTY will have the right to terminate this Contract for breach.

C. <u>Contract Assurance</u>. The CONTRACTOR or Subcontractor shall not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national origin or sex in the performance of this Contract. Failure of the CONTRACTOR to carry out these requirements is a material breach of this Contract, which may result in the termination of this Contract or such other remedy as the COUNTY deems appropriate.

D. <u>Licenses and Certifications</u>: The CONTRACTOR shall be properly certified and licensed; financially solvent; experienced in and competent to perform the required work.

#### SECTION 8. PROHIBITION AGAINST CONTINGENCY FEES.

CONTRACTOR warrants that it has not employed or retained any company or person, other than a bona fide employee working solely for CONTRACTOR to solicit or secure this Contract and that CONTRACTOR has not paid or agreed to pay any person, company, corporation, individual or firm, other than a bona fide employee working solely for CONTRACTOR, any fee, commission, percentage, gift or any other consideration contingent upon or resulting from the award or making of this Contract. For the breach or violation of this provision, the COUNTY shall have the right to terminate this Contract without liability, and at its discretion, to deduct from the contract price, or otherwise recover, the full amount of such fee, commission, percentage, gift or consideration.

#### SECTION 9. TRUTH-IN-NEGOTIATIONS/PUBLIC ENTITY CRIMES AFFIDAVIT.

CONTRACTOR certifies that wage rates and other factual unit costs supporting the compensation are accurate, complete, and current at the time of contracting. The original Contract price and any additions thereto shall be adjusted to exclude any significant sums by which the COUNTY determines the Contract price was increased due to inaccurate, incomplete, or non-current wage rates and other factual unit costs. CONTRACTOR represents that it has furnished a Public Entity Crimes Affidavit pursuant to Section 287.113, Florida Statutes.

#### SECTION 10. INSURANCE.

A. The CONTRACTOR shall provide and maintain such Commercial (Occurrence Form) or Comprehensive General Liability, Professional Liability, Workers Compensation and other insurance as is appropriate for the services being performed hereunder by CONTRACTOR, its employees or agents. The amounts and types of insurance shall conform to the following minimum requirements:

#### WORKERS' COMPENSATION:

Coverage is to apply for all employees for statutory limits in compliance with the applicable state and federal laws. The policy must include Employers' Liability with a limit of \$500,000 each accident, \$500,000 each employee, \$500,000 policy limit for disease.

COMMERCIAL GENERAL LIABILITY – OCCURRENCE FORM REQUIRED: CONTRACTOR shall maintain Commercial General Liability (CGL) Insurance with a limit of not less than \$500,000 each occurrence. If such CGL insurance contains a general aggregate limit, it shall apply separately to this project in the amount of \$1,000,000. Products and completed operations aggregate shall be \$1,000,000. CGL insurance shall be written on an occurrence form and shall include bodily injury and property damage liability for premises, operations, independent contractors, products and completed operations, contractual liability, broad form property damage and property damage resulting from explosion, collapse or underground (x. c, u) exposures, personal injury and advertising injury. Damage to rented premises shall be included at \$100,000.

#### COMMERCIAL AUTOMOBILE LIABILITY INSURANCE:

CONTRACTOR shall maintain automobile liability insurance with a limit of not less than \$1,000,000 each accident for bodily injury and property damage liability. Such insurance shall cover liability arising out of any auto (including owned, hired and non-owned autos). The policy shall be endorsed to provide contractual liability coverage.  $i \hat{W}$ 

#### **EVIDENCE OF INSURANCE:**

CONTRACTOR shall, at its sole cost and expense, procure and maintain throughout the term of this Contract, Comprehensive General Liability and Worker's Compensation Insurance, including Employer Liability Insurance, with minimum policy limits of \$500,000 Combined Single Limits, or to the extent and in such amounts as required and authorized by Florida Law, and will provide endorsed Certification of Insurance generated and executed by a licensed insurance broker, brokerage or similar licensed insurance professional evidencing such coverage, and naming the COUNTY as a named, additional insured, as well as furnishing the COUNTY with a Certified Copy, or Copies, of said insurance policies. Certificates of Insurance and Certified Copies of these Insurance Policies must accompany this signed Contract. Said insurance coverage(s) procured by the CONTRACTOR as required herein shall be considered, and the CONTRACTOR agrees that said insurance coverage(s) it procures as required herein shall be considered, as primary insurance over and above any other insurance, or self-insurance, available to the COUNTY, and that

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any other insurance, or self-insurance available to the COUNTY shall be considered secondary to, or in excess of, the insurance coverage(s) procured by the Contractor as required herein.

Nothing herein shall be construed to extend the COUNTY'S liability beyond that provided in Section 768.28, Florida Statutes.

In the event the insurance coverage expires prior to the completion of the project, a renewal certificate shall be issued 30-days prior to said expiration date. The policy shall provide a 30-day notification clause in the event of cancellation or modification to the policy. All Certificates of Insurance must be on file with and approved by the COUNTY before the commencement of any work activities.

B. The required Certificates of Insurance not only shall name types of policies provided, but also shall refer specifically to this Contract. All the policies of insurance so required of CONTRACTOR, except workers compensation insurance, shall be endorsed to include as additional insured; the COUNTY, its officers, employees and agents

C. Insurance coverage shall be placed with insurers or self-insurance funds, satisfactory to the COUNTY, licensed to do business in the State of Florida and with a resident agent designated for the service of process. All insurers shall have an "A" policyholder's rating and a financial rating of at least Class IX in accordance with the most current Best's rating. CONTRACTOR shall provide the COUNTY with financial information concerning any self-insurance funds insuring CONTRACTOR. At the COUNTY'S option, a Best's rating or Self-Insurance Fund financial information may be waived.

#### SECTION 11. TERMINATION FOR DEFAULT.

The COUNTY shall be the sole judge of nonperformance, which shall include any failure on the part of the CONTRACTOR to accept the award, to furnish required documents, and/or to fulfill any portion of this Contract within the time stipulated. Upon default by the CONTRACTOR to meet any term of this Contract or related Exhibit, the COUNTY will notify the CONTRACTOR to advise the COUNTY of its plan for corrective action to remedy the default within three (3) days (weekends and holidays excluded). The corrective action plan must be accepted by the Utilities Director. Failure on the

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CONTRACTOR's part to correct the default within the approved time period shall result in the Contract being terminated and the COUNTY notifying in writing the CONTRACTOR of the effective date of the termination. The following shall constitute an act of default:

- Failure to perform the Work required under the Contract and/or within the time required or failing to use the sub-consultants, entities, and personnel as identified and set forth, and to the degree specified in the Contract.
- Failure to begin the Work under this Contract within the time specified.
- Failure to perform the Work with sufficient workers to ensure timely completion.
- Neglecting or refusing to correct Work where prior Work has been rejected as nonconforming with the terms of the Contract.
- Becoming insolvent or being declared bankrupt by a US Bankruptcy Court.
- Failure to comply with any of the terms of the Contract.
- Failure to pay sub-consultants or others pursuant to Work done under this Contract.

In the event of default, the CONTRACTOR shall pay any damages sustained by the COUNTY including attorney's fees and court costs incurred in collecting any damages. Title to all materials, work-in-progress, and completed but undelivered goods will pass to the COUNTY after costs are claimed and allowed. All documents prepared by the CONTRACTOR in connection with this Contract will be the property of the COUNTY.

The Utilities Director shall authorize payment to the CONTRACTOR, the costs and expenses for Work performed by the CONTRACTOR prior to receipt of the Notice of Termination; however, the COUNTY may withhold from amounts due the CONTRACTOR such sums as the Administrative Services Director deems to be necessary to protect the COUNTY against loss caused by the CONTRACTOR because of the default.

#### SECTION 12: TERMINATION FOR CONVENIENCE.

The COUNTY reserves the right to cancel this Contract by written notice to the CONTRACTOR effective the date specified in the Notice, for any of the following

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reasons:

- The COUNTY has determined that such cancellation will be in the best interest of the COUNTY.
- Funds are not available to cover the cost of the services. The COUNTY'S obligation is contingent upon the availability of appropriate funds.

The Purchasing Manager shall give written notice of the termination to the CONTRACTOR specifying the reason for the Contract termination and when termination becomes effective.

The CONTRACTOR shall incur no further obligations in connection with the terminated Work and on the date set in the Notice of Termination the CONTRACTOR will stop Work to the extent specified.

The COUNTY shall pay the CONTRACTOR under following conditions:

• All costs and expenses incurred by the CONTRACTOR for work accepted by the COUNTY prior to the CONTRACTOR 'S receipt of the Notice of Termination.

Anticipatory profit for work and services not performed by the CONTRACTOR shall not be allowed.

#### SECTION 13: DISPUTES.

All controversies between the COUNTY and the CONTRACTOR which arise under, or are by virtue of, this Contract and which are not resolved by mutual agreement, shall be decided by the County Administrator in writing, within 30 days after a written request by the CONTRACTOR for a final decision concerning the controversy.

The COUNTY shall immediately furnish a copy of the decision to the CONTRACTOR by certified mail, return receipt requested, or by any other method that provides evidence of receipt. Any such decision shall be final and conclusive, unless the CONTRACTOR brings an action seeking judicial review of the decision. The CONTRACTOR shall comply with any decision of the County Administrator and proceed diligently with performance of this Contract until final resolution by a Court of Law, if a judicial remedy is pursued.

#### SECTION 14. CONTROLLING LAW.

This Contract is to be governed by the laws of the State of Florida. The venue for any litigation resulting out of this Contract shall be in DeSoto County, Florida.

#### SECTION 15. SUCCESSORS AND ASSIGNS.

The COUNTY and CONTRACTOR respectively, bind themselves, their partners, successors, assigns and legal representatives to the other party to this Contract and to the partners, successors, assigns and legal representatives with respect to all covenants of this Contract. Neither the COUNTY nor CONTRACTOR shall assign or transfer any interest in this Contract without the written consent of the other.

### SECTION 16. INDEMNIFICATION OF THE COUNTY.

CONTRACTOR shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless DeSoto County, and its agents, employees, and public officials from and against all suits, losses, claims, demands, judgments, liabilities and actions, including attorney's fees and all costs of litigation and judgments of every name and description arising out of or incidental to the performance of this Contract or work performed thereunder, whether or not due to or caused by the negligence of DeSoto County, its agents, employees, and public officials excluding only the sole negligence of DeSoto County, its agents, employees, and public officials.

#### SECTION 17. INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR.

Neither the COUNTY nor any of its employees shall have any control over the conduct of CONTRACTOR or any of CONTRACTOR'S employees, except as herein set forth. CONTRACTOR expressly warrants not to represent at any time or in any manner that CONTRACTOR or any of its agents, servants or employees are agents, servants or employees of the COUNTY. It is understood and agreed that CONTRACTOR is, and shall at all times remain as to the COUNTY, a wholly independent Contractor and the CONTRACTOR'S obligations to the COUNTY are solely as prescribed by this Contract.

#### SECTION 18. NOTICES.

Any notices to be given under this Contract shall be given by the United States mail, addressed to CONTRACTOR at its address stated herein, and to the COUNTY at its address stated herein.

#### TECHNICAL SPECIFICATIONS Bide # 13-18-00ITB

PURPOSE:

DeSoto County is soliciting Bids for the purpose of selecting a Vendor to perform Sludge Management Services throughout the term of this Contract for the Utilities Department.

## BID AWARD:

Award will go to the Vendor which is more advantageous and in the best interest of the County.

## DEFINITIONS AS USED HEREIN:

- 1. CONTRACTOR shall mean the Vendor awarded the Sludge Management Contract.
- 2. COUNTY shall mean DeSoto County Government.
- 3. FACILITY(IES) shall pertain to the Wastewater Treatment Plants.
- 4. NON-CONFORMING SLUDGE shall mean any County Sludge which fails to conform to FDEP FAC.
- 5. OKEECHOBEE LANDFILL shall mean the landfill operated by Waste Management on Okeechobee County, 10800 N.E. 128th Ave, Okeechobee, Florida 34972.
- 6. SEWAGE shall mean any raw wastewater transported from the County operated collection system.
- 7. PROCESSING or PROCESS shall mean the appropriate dewatering, transportation, and final disposition of County Sludge.
- 8. SLUDGE shall mean sludge, which substantially conforms to general industry standards for wastewater sludge, non-hazardous.

## **RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE VENDOR:**

1. Contractor shall process County sludge generated at the County -owned facilities. The County will generate approximately two million (2,000,000) gallons per year and the percent of solids are estimated to be 2%. Facilities may be added or deleted during the term of this Contract. Any such additions or deletions shall not affect the per-gallon Contract Price or other services of this Contract. The DeSoto Correctional Facility will generate the majority of digester sludge.

NOTE: Contractor shall assume all responsibility for the proper disposition of all County sludge once accepted by the Contractor.

- 2. Contractor shall accept all of the County's sludge unless:
  - A. The sludge is not of a type with respect to which Contractor is legally authorized, by regulatory agencies, to process; or
  - B. The sludge in non-conforming sludge.
- 3. Contractor shall dewater the County sludge and guarantee that the sludge will pass a paint filter test and disposal in a Class I or II solid waste landfill before hauling.

- 4. Contractor shall haul liquid sludge from DeSoto County Regional Wastewater Treatment Facility to Desoto Correctional Institution Wastewater Treatment Facility if unable at any time to dewater sludge as well as from DeSoto Correctional Institution Wastewater Treatment Facility to DeSoto County Regional Wastewater Treatment Facility.
- 5. Contractor shall haul liquid sludge to and from either County Wastewater Treatment Facility (DeSoto Correctional Institution or DeSoto County Regional Wastewater Treatment Facilities) in lieu of dewatering, if deemed monetarily advantageous for the County to pursue this alternative.
- 6. Contractor pricing shall reflect the possibility that the percent of solids could be greater or less than the estimated percent of solids expected.
- 7. Contractor's dewatering equipment shall be self-contained and selfsupporting, including electricity, in operation.
- 8. Contractor's dewatering equipment shall not exceed 65 decibels at any point of the property line while operational.
- 9. Contractor shall provide adequate trained personnel to efficiently process the County sludge and perform other services as indicated herein.
- 10. Contractor shall provide, within 5 days, sufficient replacement dewatering equipment in the event of mechanical failure.
- 11. Contractor's dewatering equipment shall be portable and capable of dewatering all generated County sludge on a schedule mutually agreeable; however, the County shall have final approval of said schedule.
- 12. Contractor shall provide the necessary equipment to deliver dewatered sludge to the Okeechobee Landfill and/or the DeSoto County Landfill. Contractor shall coordinate deliveries with the Landfill Manager. All material is currently going to the Okeechobee Landfill, however we are requesting a price to haul to DeSoto County Landfill if the need should arise. Contractor may transport dewatered sludge to the DeSoto County Landfill only at the County's direction. Contractor shall coordinate deliveries with the DeSoto Landfill Manager whose phone number is (863) 993-4826.
- 13. Contractor shall be responsible for the cleanup of any and all spills, on or off County property and any required notification of and documentation to regulatory agencies. The County shall be immediately notified of any spill with a follow up in writing.
- 14. Contractor shall maintain all documentation required by regulatory agencies and make such documentation available to the County upon request.

- 15. Contractor's responsibility for the County's sludge shall cease upon delivery to the landfill(s) or other County authorized locations.
- 16. Contractor shall have the equipment available to jet out, vacuum clean, and haul sewer collection liquid and debris. The County anticipates this being done annually. This request may include both a "Vactor type snorkel truck" or a "vacuum pumper truck". This is mainly to clean lift station grit and debris.
- 17. Contractor shall respond to the County's requests for the transport of liquid wastewater or sewage within two (2) hours of an emergency situation and the emergency equipment must be within 60 minutes travel time, non-emergency situations within twenty-four (24) hours. All calls shall be 365 days a year with uninterrupted answering of phones.
- 18. Contractor shall be responsible for all overage costs in mileage, fuel rate increases and/or dewatering. The awarded Contractor will be responsible for tipping fees and all charges associated with this service. Awarded Contractor must provide copies of Landfill Scale Tickets to the County for payment. The County will only pay tipping fees and no other surcharges or mark-ups will be allowed.

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- 19. Contractor shall be responsible for all manifests.
- 20. Any modifications to the requirements of this Article must be expressly approved by the County.

### **RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE COUNTY**

- 1. The County shall provide the Contractor with a minimum of one hundred thousand (100,000) gallons of sludge to dewater per mobilization.
- 2. The County shall provide all County sludge to the Contractor.
- 3. The County shall provide adequate space for Contractor's dewatering equipment at the Facilities.
- 4. The County will provide fifty (50) psi water pressure at each of the Facilities.
- The County shall provide access to the Facilities eight (8) hours a day, five
   (5) days, a week to carry out the dewatering process. After hour arrangements may be approved with prior notifications.
- 6. The County is responsible for the testing of sludge analysis performed and analyzed by an accredited independent testing laboratory. Results shall be sent directly to landfill(s), the Contractor, appropriate regulatory agencies and the County.

7. The County will dewater the sludge at the Correctional Facility and load the sludge into a trailer. The DeSoto Correctional Wastewater Treatment Plant should generate approximately one trailer load of sludge every two to three weeks for hauling, depending on flow.

#### **REJECTION OF SLUDGE**

- 1. The Contractor shall have the right to reject any non-conforming sludge, provided that the Contractor notifies the County by telephone and/or in writing of such rejections for non-conformance promptly upon Contractor's discovery thereof, but in no event later than forty-eight (48) hours after the discovery of such non-conforming sludge.
- 2. Any such Notice of Rejection not given initially in writing shall be promptly confirmed in writing to the County.
- 3. The County shall within twenty-four (24) hours after receipt of the Notice of Rejection of non-conforming sludge arrange for and pay all costs associated with taking possession of and the transport of such non-conforming sludge for appropriate processing and/or other necessary treatment.

DeSoto County has just acquired a new Utility System located at 12169 SW Egret Circle, Lake Suzy, Florida 34269. Below is information for the new plant.

<u>Type of Plant</u> Capacity is .087 Extended Air Package Plant 2 – 10,000 gallons Digesters, total 20,000 gallons Digesters <u>must</u> be emptied one per month.

This plant is currently serviced once per month with four liquid loads of 5,000 gallons per load, taken back to the current Contractor's facility, pressed and taken to Okeechobee Landfill.

This site will be added on the Sludge Management Services as an alternate and may result in two separate Contracts. Please find attached a separate Bid Form for this new site. THIS CONTRACT is made this \_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_\_, 2013, between BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, DESOTO COUNTY, FLORIDA, a Political subdivision of the State of Florida hereinafter referred to as ("COUNTY"), whose address is 201 East Oak Street, Arcadia, Florida 34266, and SYNAGRO SOUTH, LLC, a Limited Liability Company, authorized to do business in the State of Florida, hereinafter referred to as ("CONTRACTOR"), whose address is 1800 Bering Drive, Suite 1000, Houston, Texas 77057.

WHEREAS, the COUNTY desires to retain a CONTRACTOR to perform services described as the DeSoto County Utilities Department Sludge Management Services as listed in the Technical Specifications. All specific duties are listed within the Technical Specifications, and;

WHEREAS, CONTRACTOR desires to render services described as DeSoto County Utilities Department Sludge Management Services for the DeSoto Correctional Institution and the DeSoto County Regional Wastewater Treatment Facility in accordance with in the Technical Specifications, and has the qualifications, experience, staff and resources to perform those services; and

WHEREAS, the COUNTY, through a competitive selection process conducted in accordance with the requirements of Florida Law and County Policy, has determined that it would be in the best interest of the COUNTY to award a Contract to the CONTRACTOR for the rendering of those services described in the Technical Specifications; and.

**NOW, THEREFORE**, in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements hereinafter contained, the parties hereto agree as follows:

## SECTION 1. INCOPORATION BY REFERENCE AND ENTIRE CONTRACT.

A. The foregoing "Whereas" clauses are hereby incorporated by reference and affirmed and ratified by the parties as true and correct.

#### SECTION 2. EMPLOYMENT OF CONTRACTOR,

A. The COUNTY hereby agrees to engage CONTRACTOR to perform the services as set forth in the Scope of Work for the DeSoto Correctional Institution and the DeSoto County Regional Wastewater Treatment Facility, and CONTRACTOR hereby agrees to perform the described services diligently and in a timely and professional manner.

B. All representations, certifications, statements contained in CONTRACTOR'S bid submittal are true and accurate and are incorporated by reference herein.

#### SECTION 3. THE COUNTY'S RESPONSIBILITY.

Unless otherwise provided in the Scope of Work, the COUNTY'S responsibilities are as follows:

A. To provide, at the request of CONTRACTOR, existing data, plans, reports, and other information in the COUNTY'S possession or under the COUNTY'S control which are necessary for the execution of the duties of the CONTRACTOR in the Technical Specifications; and to provide full information regarding requirements of the Technical Specifications, including objectives, budget constraints, criteria and other requirements that exist at the time of signing of this Contract or which may develop during the execution of this Contract.

B. To give prompt written notice to CONTRACTOR if the COUNTY observes or otherwise becomes aware of any fault or defect in the Technical Specifications or non-conformance with the Contract requirements as stated herein.

C. To furnish required information, services, render approvals, and decisions as expeditiously as necessary for the orderly progress of CONTRACTOR'S services.

D. The COUNTY hereby designates the Utilities Director to act on the COUNTY'S behalf with respect to the Scope of Work. The Director shall have authority to transmit instructions, receive information, interpret and define COUNTY policies and decisions with respect to materials, elements and systems pertinent to CONTRACTOR'S services.

#### SECTION 4. TIME OF PERFORMANCE.

The CONTRACTOR agrees to commence work in accordance with the Notice to Proceed issued after Contract execution. If not canceled by the COUNTY, this Contract

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shall be for a period of one (1) year and may be renewed for a period of two (2) additional years, one year at a time, upon mutual consent and approval by the DeSoto County board of County Commissioners. The CONTRACTOR shall make no claims for additional compensation or damages due to suspensions, delays or hindrances. CONTRACTOR may only be compensated for the extension of time as the COUNTY may decide. However, such extension shall not operate as a waiver of any other rights of the COUNTY.

#### SECTION 5. COMPENSATION.

Compensation for the Scope of Work performed by CONTRACTOR shall be payable as follows:

A. The COUNTY shall pay an annual amount not to exceed **THIRTY SEVEN THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED SEVENTY TWO DOLLARS AND FIFTY CENTS** (\$37,872.50). The CONTRACTOR may submit invoices on a monthly basis for work completed.

B. CONTRACTOR shall prepare and submit to the DeSoto County Finance Department, invoices for the services rendered under this Contract. Invoices for services shall be paid in accordance with the Florida Prompt Payment Act. All invoices shall be accompanied by a report identifying the nature and progress of the work performed. The statement shall show a summary of fees with an accrual of the total fees billed and credits for portions paid previously. The COUNTY reserves the right to withhold payment to CONTRACTOR for failure to perform the work in accordance with the provisions of this Contract and the COUNTY shall promptly notify CONTRACTOR if any invoice or report is found to be unacceptable and will specify the reasons therefore.

C. Compliance with requirements for the release of, or receipt of payment for, any lien or notice to owner relating to this project.

D. All representations, indemnifications, warranties and guarantees made in, required by or given in accordance with this Contract, as well as all continuing obligations indicated in this Contract, will survive final payment and termination or completion of this Contract.

#### SECTION 6. DOCUMENTS.

The documents which comprise this Contract between the COUNTY and

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CONTRACTOR are attached hereto and made a part and consist of the following:

1. This Contract;

2. The Technical Specifications attached as Exhibit "A" consisting of 4 pages.

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3. Contractor's Bid Form attached as Exhibit "B" consisting of 2 pages.

B. This Contract represents the entire and integrated agreement between the COUNTY and CONTRACTOR and supersedes all prior negotiations, representations or contracts, either written or oral.

C. This Contract may only be amended, supplemented, modified, changed or canceled by a duly executed written instrument in accordance with County Policies.

In the event of a conflict between the terms of the Exhibits and this Contract, this Contract shall prevail.

#### SECTION 7. GENERAL CONSIDERATIONS.

A. <u>Subcontractors.</u> If CONTRACTOR subcontracts any of the work required under this Contract, CONTRACTOR agrees to include in the subcontract that the Subcontractor is bound by the terms and conditions of this Contract with the COUNTY. CONTRACTOR further agrees to include in the subcontracts, that the Subcontractor shall hold the COUNTY and CONTRACTOR harmless against all claims of whatever nature by Subcontractor's performance of Work under this Contract.

B. <u>Public Records.</u> CONTRACTOR shall allow public access to all documents, reports, papers, letters or other materials, subject to the provision of Chapter 119, Florida Statutes, prepared or received by CONTRACTOR in conjunction with this Contract. It is expressly understood that upon receipt of substantial evidence of CONTRACTOR'S refusal to comply with this provision, the COUNTY will have the right to terminate this Contract for breach.

C. <u>Contract Assurance</u>. The CONTRACTOR or Subcontractor shall not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national origin or sex in the performance of this Contract. Failure of the CONTRACTOR to carry out these requirements is a material breach of this Contract, which may result in the termination of this Contract or such other remedy as the COUNTY deems appropriate.

D. Licenses and Certifications: The CONTRACTOR shall be properly certified

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and licensed; financially solvent; experienced in and competent to perform the required work.

#### SECTION 8. PROHIBITION AGAINST CONTINGENCY FEES.

CONTRACTOR warrants that it has not employed or retained any company or person, other than a bona fide employee working solely for CONTRACTOR to solicit or secure this Contract and that CONTRACTOR has not paid or agreed to pay any person, company, corporation, individual or firm, other than a bona fide employee working solely for CONTRACTOR, any fee, commission, percentage, gift or any other consideration contingent upon or resulting from the award or making of this Contract. For the breach or violation of this provision, the COUNTY shall have the right to terminate this Contract without liability, and at its discretion, to deduct from the contract price, or otherwise recover, the full amount of such fee, commission, percentage, gift or consideration.

## SECTION 9. TRUTH-IN-NEGOTIATIONS/PUBLIC ENTITY CRIMES AFFIDAVIT.

CONTRACTOR certifies that wage rates and other factual unit costs supporting the compensation are accurate, complete, and current at the time of contracting. The original Contract price and any additions thereto shall be adjusted to exclude any significant sums by which the COUNTY determines the Contract price was increased due to inaccurate, incomplete, or non-current wage rates and other factual unit costs. CONTRACTOR represents that it has furnished a Public Entity Crimes Affidavit pursuant to Section 287.113, Florida Statutes.

#### SECTION 10. INSURANCE.

A. The CONTRACTOR shall provide and maintain such Commercial (Occurrence Form) or Comprehensive General Liability, Professional Liability, Workers Compensation and other insurance as is appropriate for the services being performed hereunder by CONTRACTOR, its employees or agents. The amounts and types of insurance shall conform to the following minimum requirements:

#### WORKERS' COMPENSATION:

Coverage is to apply for all employees for statutory limits in compliance with the applicable state and federal laws. The policy must include Employers' Liability with a limit of \$500,000 each accident, \$500,000 each employee, \$500,000 policy limit for disease.

#### COMMERCIAL GENERAL LIABILITY - OCCURRENCE FORM REQUIRED:

CONTRACTOR shall maintain Commercial General Liability (CGL) Insurance with a limit of not less than \$500,000 each occurrence. If such CGL insurance contains a general aggregate limit, it shall apply separately to this project in the amount of \$1,000,000. Products and completed operations aggregate shall be \$1,000,000. CGL insurance shall be written on an occurrence form and shall include bodily injury and property damage liability for premises, operations, independent contractors, products and completed operations, contractual liability, broad form property damage and property damage resulting from explosion, collapse or underground (x. c, u) exposures, personal injury and advertising injury. Damage to rented premises shall be included at \$100,000.

#### COMMERCIAL AUTOMOBILE LIABILITY INSURANCE:

CONTRACTOR shall maintain automobile liability insurance with a limit of not less than \$1,000,000 each accident for bodily injury and property damage liability. Such insurance shall cover liability arising out of any auto (including owned, hired and non-owned autos). The policy shall be endorsed to provide contractual liability coverage.

#### **EVIDENCE OF INSURANCE:**

CONTRACTOR shall, at its sole cost and expense, procure and maintain throughout the term of this Contract, Comprehensive General Liability and Worker's Compensation Insurance, including Employer Liability Insurance, with minimum policy limits of \$500,000 Combined Single Limits, or to the extent and in such amounts as required and authorized by Florida Law, and will provide endorsed Certification of Insurance generated and executed by a licensed insurance broker, brokerage or similar licensed insurance professional evidencing such coverage, and naming the COUNTY as a named, additional insured, as well as furnishing the COUNTY with a Certified Copy, or Copies, of said insurance policies. Certificates of Insurance and Certified Copies of these Insurance Policies must accompany this signed Contract. Said insurance coverage(s) procured by the CONTRACTOR as required herein shall be

considered, and the CONTRACTOR agrees that said insurance coverage(s) it procures as required herein shall be considered, as primary insurance over and above any other insurance, or self-insurance, available to the COUNTY, and that any other insurance, or self-insurance available to the COUNTY shall be considered secondary to, or in excess of, the insurance coverage(s) procured by the Contractor as required herein.

Nothing herein shall be construed to extend the COUNTY'S liability beyond that provided in Section 768.28, Florida Statutes.

In the event the insurance coverage expires prior to the completion of the project, a renewal certificate shall be issued 30-days prior to said expiration date. The policy shall provide a 30-day notification clause in the event of cancellation or modification to the policy. All Certificates of Insurance must be on file with and approved by the COUNTY before the commencement of any work activities.

B. The required Certificates of Insurance not only shall name types of policies provided, but also shall refer specifically to this Contract. All the policies of insurance so required of CONTRACTOR, except workers compensation insurance, shall be endorsed to include as additional insured; the COUNTY, its officers, employees and agents

C. Insurance coverage shall be placed with insurers or self-insurance funds, satisfactory to the COUNTY, licensed to do business in the State of Florida and with a resident agent designated for the service of process. All insurers shall have an "A" policyholder's rating and a financial rating of at least Class IX in accordance with the most current Best's rating. CONTRACTOR shall provide the COUNTY with financial information concerning any self-insurance funds insuring CONTRACTOR. At the COUNTY'S option, a Best's rating or Self-Insurance Fund financial information may be waived.

#### SECTION 11. TERMINATION FOR DEFAULT.

The COUNTY shall be the sole judge of nonperformance, which shall include any failure on the part of the CONTRACTOR to accept the award, to furnish required documents, and/or to fulfill any portion of this Contract within the time stipulated. Upon default by the CONTRACTOR to meet any term of this Contract or related Exhibit, the

COUNTY will notify the CONTRACTOR to advise the COUNTY of its plan for corrective action to remedy the default within three (3) days (weekends and holidays excluded). The corrective action plan must be accepted by the Utilities Director. Failure on the CONTRACTOR's part to correct the default within the approved time period shall result in the Contract being terminated and the COUNTY notifying in writing the CONTRACTOR of the effective date of the termination. The following shall constitute an act of default:

- Failure to perform the Work required under the Contract and/or within the time required or failing to use the sub-consultants, entities, and personnel as identified and set forth, and to the degree specified in the Contract.
- Failure to begin the Work under this Contract within the time specified.
- Failure to perform the Work with sufficient workers to ensure timely completion.
- Neglecting or refusing to correct Work where prior Work has been rejected as nonconforming with the terms of the Contract.
- Becoming insolvent or being declared bankrupt by a US Bankruptcy Court.
- Failure to comply with any of the terms of the Contract.
- Failure to pay sub-consultants or others pursuant to Work done under this Contract.

In the event of default, the CONTRACTOR shall pay any damages sustained by the COUNTY including attorney's fees and court costs incurred in collecting any damages. Title to all materials, work-in-progress, and completed but undelivered goods will pass to the COUNTY after costs are claimed and allowed. All documents prepared by the CONTRACTOR in connection with this Contract will be the property of the COUNTY.

The Utilities Director shall authorize payment to the CONTRACTOR, the costs and expenses for Work performed by the CONTRACTOR prior to receipt of the Notice of Termination; however, the COUNTY may withhold from amounts due the CONTRACTOR such sums as the Administrative Services Director deems to be necessary to protect the COUNTY against loss caused by the CONTRACTOR because of the default.

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## SECTION 12: TERMINATION FOR CONVENIENCE.

The COUNTY reserves the right to cancel this Contract by written notice to the CONTRACTOR effective the date specified in the Notice, for any of the following reasons:

- The COUNTY has determined that such cancellation will be in the best interest of the COUNTY.
- Funds are not available to cover the cost of the services. The COUNTY'S obligation is contingent upon the availability of appropriate funds.

The Purchasing Manager shall give written notice of the termination to the CONTRACTOR specifying the reason for the Contract termination and when termination becomes effective.

The CONTRACTOR shall incur no further obligations in connection with the terminated Work and on the date set in the Notice of Termination the CONTRACTOR will stop Work to the extent specified.

The COUNTY shall pay the CONTRACTOR under following conditions:

• All costs and expenses incurred by the CONTRACTOR for work accepted by the COUNTY prior to the CONTRACTOR 'S receipt of the Notice of Termination.

Anticipatory profit for work and services not performed by the CONTRACTOR shall not be allowed.

#### SECTION 13: DISPUTES.

All controversies between the COUNTY and the CONTRACTOR which arise under, or are by virtue of, this Contract and which are not resolved by mutual agreement, shall be decided by the County Administrator in writing, within 30 days after a written request by the CONTRACTOR for a final decision concerning the controversy.

The COUNTY shall immediately furnish a copy of the decision to the CONTRACTOR by certified mail, return receipt requested, or by any other method that provides evidence of receipt. Any such decision shall be final and conclusive, unless the CONTRACTOR brings an action seeking judicial review of the decision. The CONTRACTOR shall comply with any decision of the County Administrator and proceed diligently with performance of this Contract until final resolution by a Court of Law, if a judicial remedy is pursued.

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#### SECTION 14. CONTROLLING LAW.

This Contract is to be governed by the laws of the State of Florida. The venue for any litigation resulting out of this Contract shall be in DeSoto County, Florida.

#### SECTION 15. SUCCESSORS AND ASSIGNS.

The COUNTY and CONTRACTOR respectively, bind themselves, their partners, successors, assigns and legal representatives to the other party to this Contract and to the partners, successors, assigns and legal representatives with respect to all covenants of this Contract. Neither the COUNTY nor CONTRACTOR shall assign or transfer any interest in this Contract without the written consent of the other.

#### SECTION 16. INDEMNIFICATION OF THE COUNTY.

CONTRACTOR shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless DeSoto County, and its agents, employees, and public officials from and against all suits, losses, claims, demands, judgments, liabilities and actions, including attorney's fees and all costs of litigation and judgments of every name and description arising out of or incidental to the performance of this Contract or work performed thereunder, whether or not due to or caused by the negligence of DeSoto County, its agents, employees, and public officials excluding only the sole negligence of DeSoto County, its agents, employees, and public officials.

#### SECTION 17. INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR.

Neither the COUNTY nor any of its employees shall have any control over the conduct of CONTRACTOR or any of CONTRACTOR'S employees, except as herein set forth. CONTRACTOR expressly warrants not to represent at any time or in any manner that CONTRACTOR or any of its agents, servants or employees are agents, servants or employees of the COUNTY. It is understood and agreed that CONTRACTOR is, and shall at all times remain as to the COUNTY, a wholly independent Contractor and the CONTRACTOR'S obligations to the COUNTY are solely as prescribed by this Contract.

#### SECTION 18. NOTICES.

Any notices to be given under this Contract shall be given by the United States mail, addressed to CONTRACTOR at its address stated herein, and to the COUNTY at its address stated herein.

#### PURPOSE:

DeSoto County is soliciting Bids for the purpose of selecting a Vendor to perform Sludge Management Services throughout the term of this Contract for the Utilities Department.

#### BID AWARD:

Award will go to the Vendor which is more advantageous and in the best interest of the County.

#### DEFINITIONS AS USED HEREIN:

- 1. CONTRACTOR shall mean the Vendor awarded the Sludge Management Contract.
- 2. COUNTY shall mean DeSoto County Government.
- 3. FACILITY(IES) shall pertain to the Wastewater Treatment Plants.
- 4. NON-CONFORMING SLUDGE shall mean any County Sludge which fails to conform to FDEP FAC.
- 5. OKEECHOBEE LANDFILL shall mean the landfill operated by Waste Management on Okeechobee County, 10800 N.E. 128th Ave, Okeechobee, Florida 34972.
- 6. SEWAGE shall mean any raw wastewater transported from the County operated collection system.
- 7. PROCESSING or PROCESS shall mean the appropriate dewatering, transportation, and final disposition of County Sludge.
- 8. SLUDGE shall mean sludge, which substantially conforms to general industry standards for wastewater sludge, non-hazardous.

#### **RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE VENDOR:**

1. Contractor shall process County sludge generated at the County -owned facilities. The County will generate approximately two million (2,000,000) gallons per year and the percent of solids are estimated to be 2%. Facilities may be added or deleted during the term of this Contract. Any such additions or deletions shall not affect the per-gallon Contract Price or other services of this Contract. The DeSoto Correctional Facility will generate the majority of digester sludge.

NOTE: Contractor shall assume all responsibility for the proper disposition of all County sludge once accepted by the Contractor.

- 2. Contractor shall accept all of the County's sludge unless:
  - A. The sludge is not of a type with respect to which Contractor is legally authorized, by regulatory agencies, to process; or
  - B. The sludge in non-conforming sludge.
- 3. Contractor shall dewater the County sludge and guarantee that the sludge will pass a paint filter test and disposal in a Class I or II solid waste landfill before hauling.

- 4. Contractor shall haul liquid sludge from DeSoto County Regional Wastewater Treatment Facility to Desoto Correctional Institution Wastewater Treatment Facility if unable at any time to dewater sludge as well as from DeSoto Correctional Institution Wastewater Treatment Facility to DeSoto County Regional Wastewater Treatment Facility.
- 5. Contractor shall haul liquid sludge to and from either County Wastewater Treatment Facility (DeSoto Correctional Institution or DeSoto County Regional Wastewater Treatment Facilities) in lieu of dewatering, if deemed monetarily advantageous for the County to pursue this alternative.
- 6. Contractor pricing shall reflect the possibility that the percent of solids could be greater or less than the estimated percent of solids expected.
- 7. Contractor's dewatering equipment shall be self-contained and selfsupporting, including electricity, in operation.
- 8. Contractor's dewatering equipment shall not exceed 65 decibels at any point of the property line while operational.
- 9. Contractor shall provide adequate trained personnel to efficiently process the County sludge and perform other services as indicated herein.
- 10. Contractor shall provide, within 5 days, sufficient replacement dewatering equipment in the event of mechanical failure.
- 11. Contractor's dewatering equipment shall be portable and capable of dewatering all generated County sludge on a schedule mutually agreeable; however, the County shall have final approval of said schedule.
- 12. Contractor shall provide the necessary equipment to deliver dewatered sludge to the Okeechobee Landfill and/or the DeSoto County Landfill. Contractor shall coordinate deliveries with the Landfill Manager. All material is currently going to the Okeechobee Landfill, however we are requesting a price to haul to DeSoto County Landfill if the need should arise. Contractor may transport dewatered sludge to the DeSoto County Landfill only at the County's direction. Contractor shall coordinate deliveries with the DeSoto Landfill Manager whose phone number is (863) 993-4826.
- 13. Contractor shall be responsible for the cleanup of any and all spills, on or off County property and any required notification of and documentation to regulatory agencies. The County shall be immediately notified of any spill with a follow up in writing.
- 14. Contractor shall maintain all documentation required by regulatory agencies and make such documentation available to the County upon request.

- 15. Contractor's responsibility for the County's sludge shall cease upon delivery to the landfill(s) or other County authorized locations.
- 16. Contractor shall have the equipment available to jet out, vacuum clean, and haul sewer collection liquid and debris. The County anticipates this being done annually. This request may include both a "Vactor type snorkel truck" or a "vacuum pumper truck". This is mainly to clean lift station grit and debris.
- 17. Contractor shall respond to the County's requests for the transport of liquid wastewater or sewage within two (2) hours of an emergency situation and the emergency equipment must be within 60 minutes travel time, non-emergency situations within twenty-four (24) hours. All calls shall be 365 days a year with uninterrupted answering of phones.
- 18. Contractor shall be responsible for all overage costs in mileage, fuel rate increases and/or dewatering. The awarded Contractor will be responsible for tipping fees and all charges associated with this service. Awarded Contractor must provide copies of Landfill Scale Tickets to the County for payment. The County will only pay tipping fees and no other surcharges or mark-ups will be allowed.

- 19. Contractor shall be responsible for all manifests.
- 20. Any modifications to the requirements of this Article must be expressly approved by the County.

#### **RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE COUNTY**

- 1. The County shall provide the Contractor with a minimum of one hundred thousand (100,000) gallons of sludge to dewater per mobilization.
- 2. The County shall provide all County sludge to the Contractor.
- 3. The County shall provide adequate space for Contractor's dewatering equipment at the Facilities.
- 4. The County will provide fifty (50) psi water pressure at each of the Facilities.
- 5. The County shall provide access to the Facilities eight (8) hours a day, five (5) days a week to carry out the dewatering process. After hour arrangements may be approved with prior notifications.
- 6. The County is responsible for the testing of sludge analysis performed and analyzed by an accredited independent testing laboratory. Results shall be sent directly to landfill(s), the Contractor, appropriate regulatory agencies and the County.

7. The County will dewater the sludge at the Correctional Facility and load the sludge into a trailer. The DeSoto Correctional Wastewater Treatment Plant should generate approximately one trailer load of sludge every two to three weeks for hauling, depending on flow.

## **REJECTION OF SLUDGE**

- 1. The Contractor shall have the right to reject any non-conforming sludge, provided that the Contractor notifies the County by telephone and/or in writing of such rejections for non-conformance promptly upon Contractor's discovery thereof, but in no event later than forty-eight (48) hours after the discovery of such non-conforming sludge.
- 2. Any such Notice of Rejection not given initially in writing shall be promptly confirmed in writing to the County.
- 3. The County shall within twenty-four (24) hours after receipt of the Notice of Rejection of non-conforming sludge arrange for and pay all costs associated with taking possession of and the transport of such non-conforming sludge for appropriate processing and/or other necessary treatment.

- Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (PPACA)
- State Legislature's decision not to accept \$52 Billion Dollars from the Federal Government to expand Medicaid

#### FACTS:

 A. THE COST INCURRED BY THE HOSPITAL TO PROVIDE CHARITY CARE AND OTHER UNPAID SERVICES TO THE CITIZENS OF ARCADIA AND DESOTO COUNTY EXCEEDS \$3.6 MILLION DOLLARS PER YEAR.

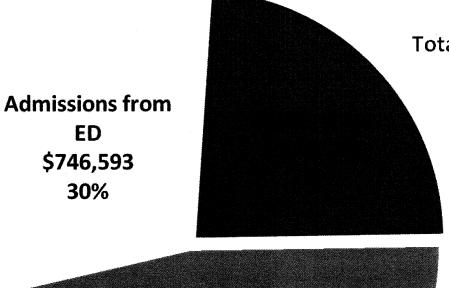

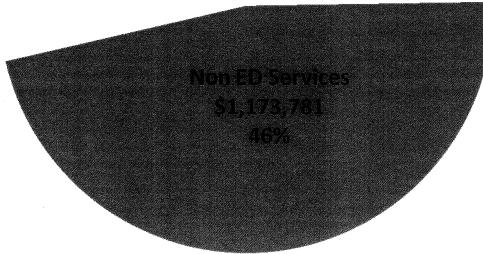

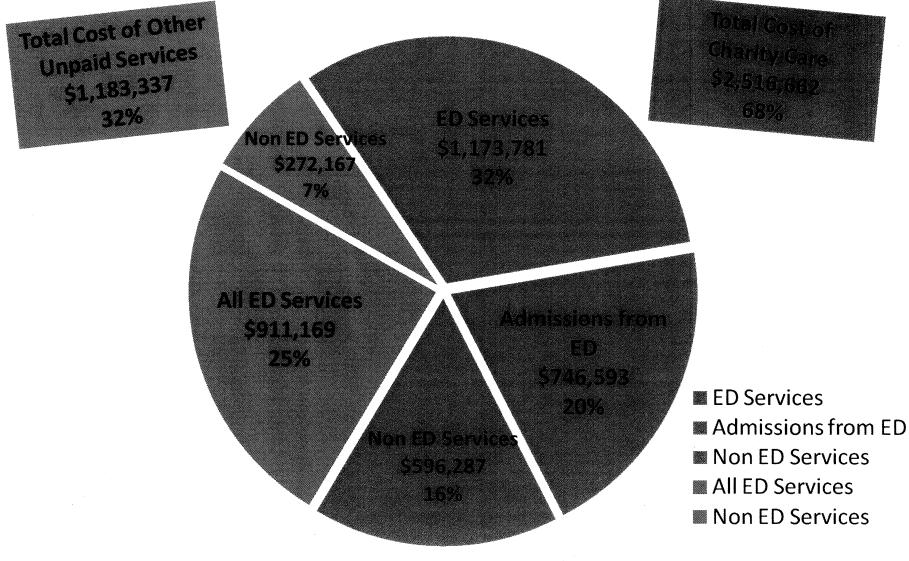

#### ORDINANCE NO. 2013-\_\_\_

AN ORDINANCE CREATING THE DESOTO COUNTY HEALTH CARE AND HOSPITAL MUNICIPAL SERVICE TAXINIG UNIT; DESCRIBING THE BOUNDARIES OF THE UNIT; AUTHORIZING SUCH TAXING UNIT TO ANNUALLY LEVY AD VALOREM TAXES WITHIN SUCH UNIT TO PROVIDE HOSPITAL AND HEALTH CARE SERVICES; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF DESOTO COUNTY, FLORIDA:

SECTION 1. FINDINGS. It is hereby ascertained, determined and declared that:

- (A) Pursuant to Article VIII, section 1 of the Florida Constitution, and sections 125.01 and 125.06, Florida Statutes, the Board of County Commissioners (the "Board") of DeSoto County, Florida has local home rule authority and all powers of local self-government authorized pursuant to the Florida Constitution and laws of Florida to perform county and municipal functions and to render municipal services in a manner not inconsistent with general law and such power may be exercised by the enactment of county ordinances and resolutions.
- (B) Pursuant to Article VII, section 9 of the Florida Constitution, the Board has been granted 10 mills of ad valorem taxing authority. Further, Article VII, section 9 grants to all counties the authority to furnish municipal services, and levy additional taxes within the limits fixed for municipal services.
- (C) Section 125.01(1)(q), Florida Statutes provides specific legislative authorization for counties to establish municipal service taxing units for any part or all of the unincorporated areas within its boundaries, or within the municipal boundaries of an incorporated area upon consent of the governing body of such municipality, within which may be provided essential municipal services and facilities.

(D) The purpose of this ordinance is to create the DeSoto County Health Care and Hospital Municipal Services Taxing Unit (the "Health Care and Hospital MSTU") to fund services and facilities described in Section 4 below.

Section 2. CREATION. The DeSoto County Health Care and Hospital MSTU is hereby created pursuant to section 125.01(1)(q), Florida Statutes. The boundaries of the Health Care and Hospital MSTU shall be coterminous with the unincorporated area of DeSoto County Florida, as described by Exhibit "A" which is attached and incorporated herein.

Section 3. AUTHORIZATION FOR AD VALOREM TAXES. The Board is hereby authorized to levy annual ad valorem taxes for municipal services and facilities upon taxable real and personal property within the Health Care and Hospital MSTU, beginning with the county budget for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2013. The budget and millage rate for the Health Care and Hospital MSTU shall be approved and levied in the manner provided by general law for the levy of County ad valorem taxes.

Section 5. AUTHORIZATION OF EXPENDITURES. Revenues derived from ad valorem taxes levied within the Health Care and Hospital MSTU shall be used exclusively for the maintenance and operational expenses of the DeSoto Memorial Hospital and for the provision of all health care and hospital services provided by the Hospital.

Section 5. EFFECTIVE DATE. The Clerk shall file a certified copy of the Ordinance with the Department of State within ten days of its adoption. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon it filing with the Department of State.
