HAPPY BIRTHDAY, SEABEES

The third anniversary of the "workingest, fightingest bunch of men" in the nation's armed forces, the Navy Seabees, was observed on December 28 by 240,000 officers and men of the United States Naval Construction Battalions.

Born just three weeks after the Pearl Harbor disaster, with an authorized strength of 3,000, the Seabees won their spurs at Guadalcanal and have been with the assault troops in every major American amphibious operation. They can now boast that they built the network of air and naval bases in the Pacific that pushed the Japs back 3,000 miles; that they developed amphibious equipment and techniques that helped carry the day on the African, Sicilian, Italian and Normandy beachheads.

Every commissioned Construction Battalion is either currently overseas or has completed a tour of duty; many battalions are on their second tours. Seventy-six per cent of the Seabees are now outside the continental limits of the United States; only 9,000 essential men have never seen foreign service.

As Gen. Douglas MacArthur wrote in a letter to Seabee Chief Vice-Admiral Ben Morell, "The only trouble with your Seabees is that you don't have enough of them!"

Red Cross Supplies For American Pows Unloaded in Japan

Unloading of the first shipment of American Red Cross relief supplies received in Japan since 1943, and completion of plans for distribution to American and Allied prisoners of war, were announced today by Basil O'Connor, national chairman.

Plans for distribution included sending 15 per cent of the total cargo or approximately 45,000 parcels and proportionate amounts of other supplies to prisoners of war and civilian internees in the Philippine Islands. Supplies for captive Americans in Japan proper were to be distributed in November.

Announcement of these developments followed receipt at American Red Cross National Headquarters of the plan for distribution from the Japanese delegate of the International Committee of Red Cross.

Supplies unloaded at Kobe, Japan included 300,000 American and Canadian Red Cross standard food parcels as well as clothing, medicine, and other supplies. This was the first shipment sent from the United States to the Far East via a Russian port, and, like the two earlier shipments made by other routes, supplies from the British and American Red Cross societies will be pooled for Allied prisoners of all nationalities.

The food parcels in this shipment were specially prepared to include more protein and less starch than those sent to Germany, as escaped prisoners from the Far East have reported a disproportionate amount of starch in the Japanese rations.

The shipment via Russia came as a result of months of negotiation involving the governments of the United States, Britain, and Japan and the Red Cross, and the Japanese and other problems of shipment.

Widow Receives Unexpected Income From Social Security

You all know John Blackstone. That is not his real name, but it will do. When John Blackstone died last year, he left his wife and two children in the same situation thousands of other young families find themselves. John was barely 30. He was a power-brake operator at the Crown Aircraft Plant No. 3 and was making about \$45 a week.

That is where John Blackstone's social security account came in for his family. John's local had a social security committee that was always on its toes looking out for the union members, and it immediately notified the Social Security Board office of his death, told Mary, John's widow, how important it was to file her claim for survivor's insurance.

Mary Blackstone will get her \$27.56 a month until the youngest child is 18 years old. Each child will continue to get his \$18.37 a month until he is 16 years old, and until 18 if he is still in school. So the proceeds of John's social security account will at least take care of the children's education through the grades and high school.

COLOR PRINTS MADE POSSIBLE

Printing of color photographs in home darkrooms—long the dream of camera amateurs—has become a peace-time certainty through work of engineers of the Air Technical Service Command. ATSC engineers, needing a rapid, faithful means of reproducing color as a laboratory aid, have done much of the production pioneering on Gasparcolor, a process employing an entirely new photographic principle. "Gasparcolor seems to be a likely means of bringing color printing to the home darkroom after the war," said Maj. P. M. Thomas, chief of the photographic engineering branch of the technical data laboratory, "because the amateur may make either contact prints or enlargements from his transparencies with one exposure and obtain pleasing color brilliance."

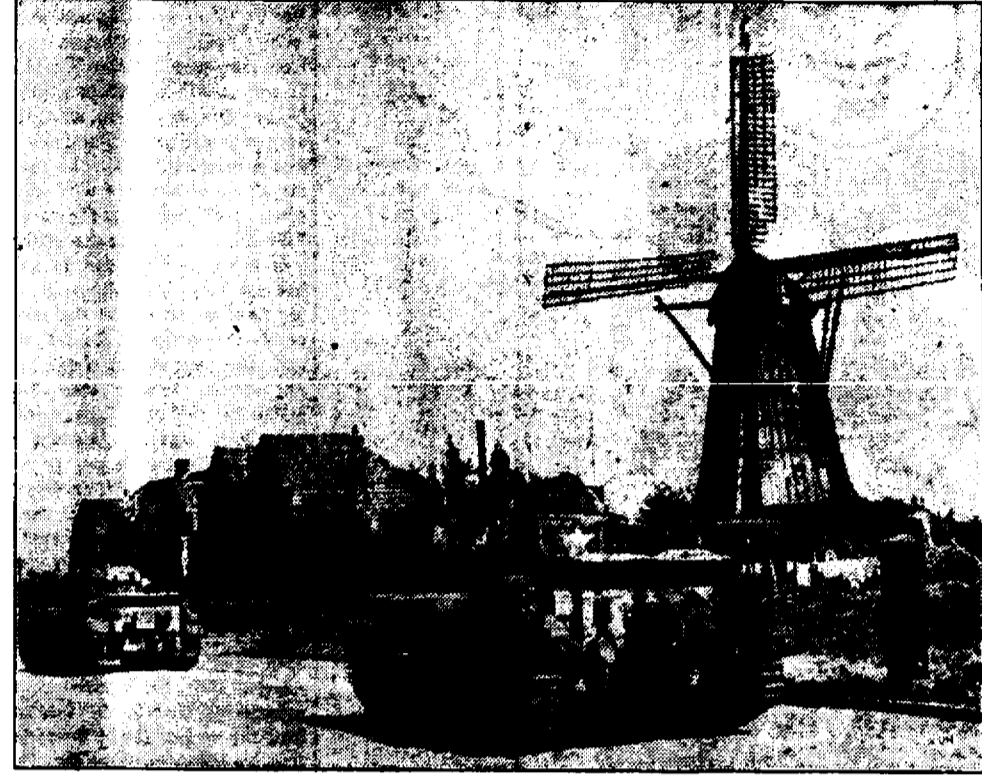

### I Am a Wac

By SERGT. RUTH C. WOLF

All over the world today, from cold windswept prairies to tropical jungle lands and the romantic islands of the Pacific, Wacs are living new and exciting lives. Experiences gained from their travels during World War II will remain with them a lifetime. No doubt many of them, who, at this very moment are dining from field kits or sleeping beneath the protecting weave of mosquito netting, have often asked themselves the question: "What if I had remained a civilian?"

It is an easy question to answer because most Wacs know that life for them would still be the same as before they answered the call to colors. But instead they chose to join the service because they "would rather be with them than waiting". As long ago as January, 1943, WAC contingents began to arrive overseas. In North Africa they have discovered living conditions are considerably better than expected and that life in general is not so unusual and different from the United States. Wacs visit the pyramids and the Nile and buy fruit from vendors in dusty open markets on crooked dusty streets. Italy, the Boot which holds volumes of history, is fascinating from the ancient city of Rome to the eruptive Vesuvius. Now that France is free again Wacs are seen on many Parisian streets chatting in patched French to civilians, and pressing their noses against the shop windows to admire styles that have at long last returned to the Fashion Capitol of the World.

On the tropical islands of New Guinea and New Caledonia Wacs are learning the names of strange flowers and birds, and to tolerate the insects and the taste of the water. Many parties and outdoor sports are planned for entertainment when they can relax with GI companions on off-duty hours.

All these experiences, and more, are happening to our women in uniform overseas. No doubt the question "What if I had remained a civilian" has become quite vague to most of them who would never have had the opportunity for such experiences if they had not chosen to "be with them, that winter."
