FLORIDA ATLANTIC UNIVERSITY

Florida Atlantic University, a member of the State University System of Florida, was established in 1961 and opened its doors to students in 1964. In addition to its 850-acre campus in Boca Raton, FAU has campuses in Fort Lauderdale, Davie, Palm Beach Gardens, and Port St. Lucie.

The University's nine colleges - the Schmidt College of Arts and Humanities, and the Colleges of Business, Education, Engineering, Liberal Arts, Nursing, Science, Social Science, and Urban and Public Affairs - offer 52 bachelor's, 41 master's, 3 specialist's, 1 associate's, and 14 doctoral degrees. As of December 1994, the University had awarded 59,084 degrees, serving more than 135,000 individuals through its instructional programs.

In December 1967, Florida Atlantic University was elected to regular membership in the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools, at which time the Commission on Higher Education of that Association granted full accreditation to all of the University's programs. In accordance with Association regulations, this accreditation was reaffirmed in 1973, 1983, and again in 1993.

In the fall of 1994, the University had 17,400 students and 1,000 faculty members.

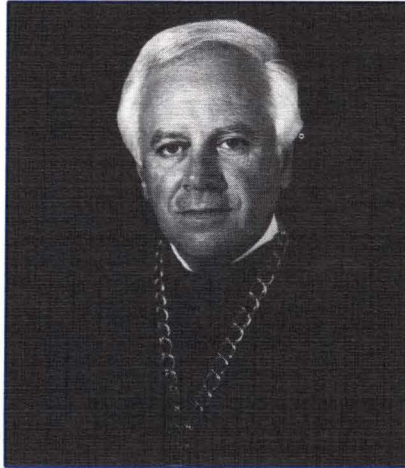

FLORIDA ATLANTIC UNIVERSITY PRESIDENT

Dr. Anthony James Catanese



Dr. Anthony James Catanese joined Florida Atlantic University as its fourth President in January, 1990. Dr. Catanese was previously Provost of Pratt Institute in New York City; Dean of the College of Architecture at the University of Florida; Dean of the School of Architecture and Urban Planning at the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee; Professor and Director of the Center for Planning and Development at the Georgia Institute of Technology; and Associate Dean of the School of Engineering and Environmental Design and James A. Ryder Professor at the University of Miami. Dr. Catanese also was a Senior Fulbright Professor at the Pontificia Universidad Javeriana in Bogota, Colombia.

Dr. Catanese previously maintained a private practice in design, planning, and development. His consulting contracts numbered over fifty clients, including coastal zone planning and development in Hawaii and native land claims in Alaska. As a developer, he built several projects for the single family and multi-family market in the Atlanta region.

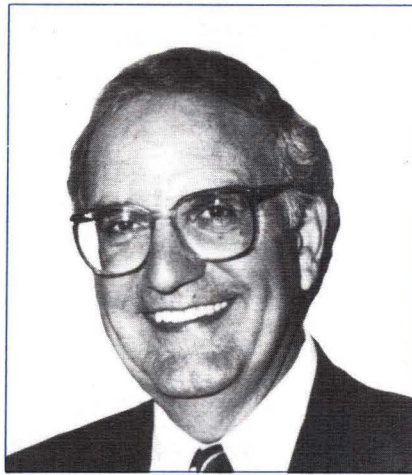
Dr. Catanese has been a public servant as well. He was appointed by President Jimmy Carter to the National Urban Policy Task Force. He served as chairman of the Milwaukee City Plan Board and the Gainesville City Plan Board. Dr. Catanese was president of the Park West Development Corporation, a not-for-profit organization that planned and developed a major area in Milwaukee. He is currently a member of the Board of Directors of the Environmental Education Foundation of Florida; the Orange Bowl Committee; and Barnett Bank of Palm Beach. He has served on the Presidents' Commission of the National Collegiate Athletic Association.

Dr. Catanese received the Ph.D. degree from the University of Wisconsin-Madison in Planning and Land Economics; the Master's Degree in Planning and Public Administration from New York University; and the Bachelor's Degree in Planning and Civil Engineering from Rutgers University. He has done advanced studies in real estate finance, computers, and transportation.

A prolific writer, Dr. Catanese has authored eleven books, eighteen chapters in books, over sixty-five articles in journals, and thirty-five research monographs. Two of his books, *Planners and Politics: Impossible Dreams* and *Urban Planning*, have been best sellers in their fields.

THE PRESIDENTIAL MEDALLION

George J. Mitchell



George J. Mitchell was born in Waterville, Maine, on August 20, 1933, the fourth of Mary and George Mitchell's five children. His father, the son of Irish immigrants, was a laborer, and his mother, who had come to the United States from Lebanon, worked in the textile mills. Although they had little formal education themselves, the parents instilled in all of their children a deep respect for learning. Young George's first career goal was to become a teacher.

After graduating from Bowdoin College in 1954 and serving for two years in Berlin as a U.S. Army counter-intelligence officer, he enrolled at Georgetown University Law Center as a night school student; during the day, he was an insurance claims adjuster. Upon receiving his law degree in 1960, he went to work as a trial lawyer for the Antitrust Division of the U.S. Justice Department. Two years later, he got his first taste of national politics when he became Executive Assistant to U.S. Senator Edmund S. Muskie of Maine.

Returning to his home state in 1965, Senator Mitchell entered private law practice and became active in the Maine Democratic Party, serving as both State Chairman and Democratic National Committeeman. In 1977, he became U.S. Attorney for Maine, and, in 1979, he was appointed a U.S. District Court Judge. He left the federal bench a year later to accept an appointment to the U.S. Senate seat left vacant by Edmund Muskie, who was named U.S. Secretary of State.

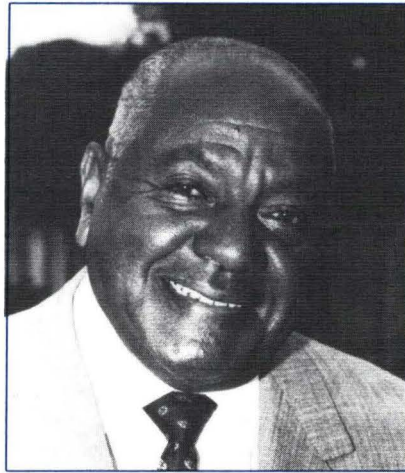
Senator Mitchell's ensuing 14-year career in the Senate was marked by numerous distinctions, including election by his colleagues to the post of Majority Leader in 1989, 1991 and 1993. Issues on which he focused special attention included health care reform, nursing home standards, veterans' health care, welfare reform, and preservation of the environment. He led successful efforts to re-enact the Clean Air and Clean Water Acts and to write into law the groundbreaking Indoor Air Pollution Act.

Senator Mitchell declined to seek reelection in 1994, acting upon his personal conviction that elective office should not be a lifetime career. His first post-Senate commitment was to serve higher education in South Florida as the Tripp, Scott, Conklin & Smith Distinguished Visiting Professor during the Spring Semester, 1995. In this capacity, he afforded students at Florida Atlantic University, Florida International University, Nova Southeastern University and Broward Community College a long-time insider's look at American political processes.

For his long and meritorious service to the nation, Florida Atlantic University is pleased to award George J. Mitchell the Presidential Medallion.

HONORARY DOCTORAL DEGREE

Carl T. Rowan



Carl T. Rowan, one of the most honored Americans in the fields of journalism, publishing, civic leadership and public service, has served his country as a naval officer, ambassador to Finland, and director of the U.S. Information Agency at the height of the Cold War. He is the only journalist in American history to be awarded, by his peers, the coveted Sigma Delta Chi medallion in three successive years. He has been enrolled in both the Sigma Delta Chi Hall of Fame and the Black Journalists Hall of Fame. He holds the Allen H. Neuhart Award for Excellence in Journalism and the Missouri Medal, the highest honor bestowed by the University of Missouri School of Journalism. For his work in television, Rowan has received the Peabody Award and the E.I. DuPont-Columbia University Silver Baton for his specials on Africa and his report on "Thurgood Marshall: The Man." He is completing his 26th year as the senior panelist on "Inside Washington," the highest rated talk show in the nation's capital. He is also known nationally for his syndicated newspaper column, which offers informed commentary on a host of contemporary issues.

The author of seven books, Rowan most recently published his autobiography, *Breaking Barriers*, and a biography of the late U.S. Supreme Court Justice Thurgood Marshall, *Dream Makers, Dream Breakers*. Rowan has received numerous honors for his civic work, especially for founding "Project Excellence," a scholarship program that has provided almost \$9 million in scholarship aid to some 700 college-bound black youngsters. His civic work began more than 40 years ago, when as a reporter at the *Minneapolis Tribune* his articles awakened Americans to the issues of state-sponsored racism and segregation.

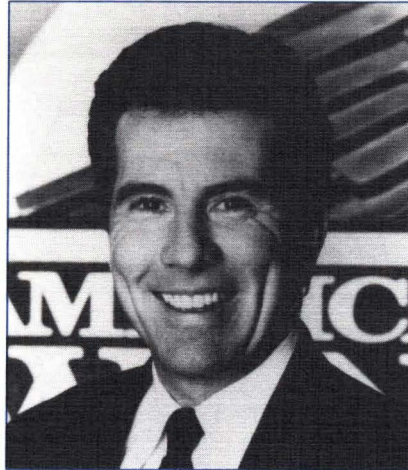
In 1961, President John F. Kennedy appointed Rowan Deputy Secretary of State and later a delegate to the United Nations and ambassador to Finland. After the assassination of President Kennedy, President Lyndon B. Johnson recalled Rowan from Helsinki and named him to succeed Edward R. Murrow as director of the U.S. Information Agency.

During his boyhood in McMinnville, Tennessee, Rowan hoed bulb grass for 10 cents an hour and mowed lawns for 25 cents an hour. Because of his race, he was forbidden to enter the town's only library, yet he still graduated as valedictorian of his high school class. He went on to attend Tennessee State College in Nashville where he passed a nationally competitive exam to become one of the first 15 black Americans to become commissioned officers in the U.S. Navy. After World War II, Rowan used the GI Bill to get a bachelor's degree in mathematics from Oberlin College and a master's degree in journalism from the University of Minnesota.

For his many contributions to American society and the democratic dialogue, Florida Atlantic University is pleased to award Carl T. Rowan the honorary doctoral degree in humane letters.

HONORARY DOCTORAL DEGREE

John Walsh



To America at large, John Walsh is the intense, single-minded host of *America's Most Wanted*, the most effective anti-crime program in the history of television. To South Florida, he is that and something more. South Floridians will forever remember John and his wife, Reve, as the distraught parents of six-year-old Adam, who disappeared during a shopping trip to the Hollywood Mall on a summer day in 1981. Despite massive media coverage and widespread search efforts, Adam remained missing for 10 agonizing days. During this period, the Walshes discovered that U.S. law enforcement agencies had no system in place to coordinate searches for missing children and did not seem inclined to create one. After fishermen discovered Adam dead in a turnpike canal 100 miles north of Hollywood, John and Reve channeled their grief into a campaign to right this wrong. Ultimately, they revolutionized the way American society views and responds to the plight of missing, abused and neglected children.

Working first from their home and then from a small center named after their son, the Walshes waged a determined battle on many fronts. John's efforts in Washington were directly responsible for passage of the Missing Children Act of 1982, which requires the FBI to keep separate files on missing children and unidentified bodies in the National Crime Information Center computer, and to investigate child abduction cases even in the absence of a ransom note or evidence of interstate flight. Two years later, continued lobbying by John led to passage of the Missing Children's Assistance Act, which established the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children. With this achievement, the Walshes created the central coordinating agency that had not been available to help them when they lost Adam.

John has continued his fight for children's rights at the state level, traveling repeatedly to virtually every state to promote tougher legislation and to educate Americans about how they can better protect their own children against abduction and molestation. His goal is to see all states adopt laws similar to the child protection legislation adopted in Florida, which has put more than 35 laws into effect to protect the rights of children.

Much of the Walshes' ongoing work on behalf of children has been accomplished through the Adam Walsh Child Resource Center, a non-profit organization responsible for nationwide public education on child safety and dedicated to legislative reform. There are currently four centers operational around the country, in Lake Park, Florida; Orange, California; Rochester, New York; and Columbia, South Carolina.

Since 1988, John has hosted the Fox Broadcasting Company's phenomenally successful *America's Most Wanted*, which has brought more than 350 fugitives into police custody.

For his untiring efforts on behalf of children and crime victims, Florida Atlantic University is pleased to award John Walsh the honorary doctoral degree in humane letters.

ACADEMIC REGALIA

Lending color to the pageantry of the Academic Commencement are the academic robes and hoods worn by the faculty and delegates. This regalia reaches back into the medieval ages when it served a functional as well as an ornamental role, separating the learned men from other groups and offering warmth and protection.

In late nineteenth century America, a conference was held by representatives of colleges and universities to bring more order and system to the custom of academic dress. Since then, there have been periodic conferences to revise or reconfirm existing practices.

Essentially, holders of the bachelor's degree wear black robes unadorned. Holders of the master's degree wear hoods that are lined with the colors of the college conferring the degree and trimmed with the color representing the subject in which the degree was earned. The doctoral robe is adorned with velvet and also is worn with the hood suitably ornamented.

Holders of degrees from foreign universities or religious orders wear the entire academic costumes as decreed by the conferring institutions.

The History of the Mace

The mace, generally made of wood and clad in metal, was used as a weapon during the Middle Ages. Later, as more powerful military arms were developed, the mace became a symbol of authority.

During the 12th century, guards of the English and French kings were the first to bear ceremonial maces. The tradition grew, and by the end of the 16th century the mace was used by officials in cities and towns throughout England. Today, the ceremonial mace is carried in the British Houses of Parliament, before ecclesiastical dignitaries, and in university convocations.

The Florida Atlantic University mace carried in today's commencement procession was designed and handcrafted by FAU art professor William Lattimer and is made of mahogany and silver. The carved staff, encircled with silver rings, is topped by a silver owl with outspread wings. The design signifies the dignity, determination and wisdom of FAU's mascot, the burrowing owl.

The flags on display above the platform represent many of the nations from which FAU students come. The original collection was presented to the University by Mrs. Leslie A. Wagner and her late husband. Additional flags have been donated by a number of individuals and organizations.

President Catanese cordially invites all the graduates and their guests to a reception immediately following the Commencement Exercises in the Breezeway of the Field House, just south of the gymnasium.

NOTE ON PHOTOGRAPHY

In order to maintain an orderly and dignified ceremony, one which our graduates can remember with pride and enjoyment, guests are requested to remain seated during the entire ceremony and recessional and to refrain from taking pictures of the candidates until after the exercises are completed.

FAU LIBRARIES

"The true University. . . is a collection of books." Thomas Carlyle

Libraries are edifices Americans take for granted. We rarely contemplate life without them, for the idea is unthinkable. Wherever we are, we expect to find a library - for work as well as pleasure. Even in our highly sophisticated, technologically savvy world, we love our books as people have for some 500 years. At Florida Atlantic University we support the acquisition of new books, while providing a safe haven for volumes individuals have treasured over the years. The FAU Libraries, like libraries everywhere, preserve the important artifacts of our culture, while reaching to the future with the tools for increased productivity in research and scholarly analysis.

Today's FAU Libraries, under the direction of Dr. William Miller, form an impressive resource for the enrichment of the University. The first FAU library, a five-story, 80,000-square-foot structure built to house both the book collection and University administrative offices, was completed in June 1964, well before the charter class began study that fall. A three-story addition, completed in 1985, more than doubled the space of the original building. The Boca Raton campus library bears the name of Dr. Stanley E. Wimberly, FAU's first vice president for academic affairs, who died in 1971.

As FAU became a multi-campus university, the library kept pace, spreading its activities to multiple locations. In addition to an extensive inter-library loan network, permanent collections also are housed on FAU campuses in Palm Beach Gardens, Port St. Lucie, Fort Lauderdale and Davie. In Fort Lauderdale, a cooperative arrangement with the downtown branch of the Broward County Public Library, adjacent to the FAU Tower, gives students access to all county and FAU holdings. In Davie, students will soon be served by an expanded library designed to meet the needs of the 21st century user. A state-of-the-art, 112,000-square-foot, joint-use facility is expected to go into operation in early 1996. The new library will rank among the most technologically sophisticated libraries in South Florida.

A wide range of automated services is available through the libraries' on-line commercial database search capability and compact disk databases, which give students access to nearly any library collection in the United States. The holdings of other State University System libraries are available through inter-library loan and through the on-line catalog system NOTIS/LUIS, which many students and faculty access from their home computers. The collections of area libraries and of the Center for Research Libraries (CRL) are available through FAU's memberships in the Southeast Florida Library Information Network and CRL.

FAU has been fortunate to obtain a number of distinguished and rare collections. Foremost among them are the 85,000 books, documents, paintings, and artifacts in the Molly S. Fraiberg Judaica Collection. A good 80 percent of the collection is in Yiddish, making this one of the five or six largest in the country. Most of the Judaica Collection—some of which is distributed among the libraries' holdings by subject matter—is located on the fifth floor of the Wimberly Library building. Included on the "Fifth" are the Alice Harkavy Karp Holocaust Research Collection; the Abraham J. Rose Collection, 6,000 volumes from a rabbi's own scholarly books; the Joseph and Mary Savetsky Collection of Yiddish Resources; the Zvee Aroni Music Library; and—received most recently—the Isaac Bashevis Singer Collection. Donated by his widow, the Singer collection includes the library and furnishings from the late Nobel Prize-winning author's New York apartment.

Other important holdings include rare original music scores that represent an invaluable resource to music scholars as well as to historians of Russian and European publishing of the 19th and early 20th centuries, and the Arlyn Austen Katims Civil War collection of some 600 volumes and artifacts. A collection from *Barefoot Mailman* author Theodore Pratt includes copies of his many books of fiction as well as furnishings and posters from his study. The poet Gregory Corso's European manuscripts, including the original of his 1958 Bomb holograph manuscript, an 1852 first edition of Harriet Beecher Stowe's *Uncle Tom's Cabin*, a 1620 copy of *Dissertation on the Sacraments of Marriage*, an early rag paper edition of the *Decrees of St. Gregory*, and a 1594 Latin edition of *History of the Peloponnesian War* are among FAU's prized rare books.

In addition to large collections of U.S. and Florida government documents, maps, annual reports and other more specialized materials, the libraries now contain more than 800,000 books and 2.5 million microforms. More than 3,500 periodical subscriptions are ongoing. The libraries are particularly strong in such subject areas as Floridiana, taxation accounting, small business administration, international business, economics, business computer systems, women's studies, and ocean engineering, and in preserving books, which, as Thomas Carlyle said, are "the purest essence of a human soul."
