THE EAST AFRICA TOWNSHIPS ORDINANCES.
1903—1918.

RULES.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon him by the East Africa Townships Ordinances, 1903—1918, and all other powers thereunto enabling him, His Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to make the following Rules:—

1. These Rules shall apply to the Townships of Naivasha and Gilgil, and may be cited as "Naivasha and Gilgil Township Rules, 1925."

2. No unemployed native shall remain within either of the Townships of Naivasha or Gilgil for a longer period than forty-eight hours, unless he is in possession of a permit from the District Commissioner allowing such person to remain in the said Township.

3. Any offence under or contravention of these Rules shall be cognisable to the Police.

4. Any person committing a breach or failing to comply with the provisions of these Rules shall on conviction be liable to a fine not exceeding Sh. 400, or in default of payment, to imprisonment of either description for a term not exceeding two months.

Sale of Grants in respect of Kibwezi Plots.

NOTICE is hereby given that grants in respect of the twenty-six plots at Kibwezi specified in the Schedule hereto will be sold by auction at Kibwezi Station Waiting Room on Friday, February 26th, 1926, commencing at 10 a.m.

9.
