

Reflection

Within any authentic relationship there is always freedom of choice. In today's readings both Joshua and Jesus call upon the people to exercise this freedom by once again declaring their fidelity to God. How have you been called to rededicate your life to Jesus through your journey of faith?

The Art of Surrender

"I do." I clearly remember pronouncing these captivating words at my wedding and hearing my beloved wife speak them as she looked into my eyes. My heart leaps.

At that time, "I do" meant promise and hope. We dreamed. We imagined. We planned. Life would have many surprises in store. Some good, especially our two beautiful children. Some not so good, starting with my own limitations.

Two decades have passed. Our "I do" is still promise and hope, yet we have learned that it also means "surrender." Surrender not as relinquishing wants or selves but as the art of allowing ourselves to be delightfully fashioned and refashioned by the other because of love.

St. Paul today proposes understanding spousal love in light of how he interprets the relationship between Christ and the Church. Many pastors and catechists argue likewise. I wonder, can Catholics differ with the apostle's use of metaphors? Allow me the irreverence: I think it is the other way around. Scriptures regularly use spousal relationships to speak about God. They embrace with humble wisdom the fact that spouses enjoy a unique authority to speak about marital love, and all that happens within it, because we have lived it. In light of what happens there, we can ascertain much about God and humanity. Our Church should listen more to married women and men, including those whose relationships have broken down.

When I reflect about unconditional allegiance to God and the idea of surrendering, I start with my own marriage. In that school, I have become a wiser man and a better Christian.
