The question of moving the present school to more central locality has been proposed, but it has been shown that there is not site on the Reserve where a school could be placed to accommodate all the children. The north eastern settlers could more easily attend reach the Gatinean Road, then any other locality.

The undersigned is of opinion that if an additional amount of say \$150 per annum could be provided, it would be possible to carry on two schools. The Band now contributes \$300
