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THE MERU COUNTY FINANCE BILL, 2019

A Bill for

AN ACT of the County Assembly of Meru to provide for the imposition and variation of certain taxes, fees, charges, licences, rents or rates for services and for connected purposes

ENACTED by the County Assembly of Meru, as follows—

Short title and commencement

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the Meru County Finance Act, 2019, and shall come into operation, or be deemed to have come into operation on 1st July 2020, or upon publication in the *Gazette*.

(2) All charges levied by the county in the financial year 2019 before coming into force of this Act, shall be deemed to have been properly levied under the provisions of this Act.

Interpretation

2. In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires—

“authorized” means the method, mode, process of collection of County Revenue or making payment to the county as approved by the County Government.

“cess” means fees charged for goods specified in the Second schedule.

“county” means the Meru County

“executive committee member” means the County Executive Committee member in charge of Finance.

PART II— TAXES, FEES, LICENCES, RATES APPLICABLE AND CHARGES PAYABLE

General Fees and Charges

3. (1) A person who wishes to carry out the activities specified in the First Schedule shall pay the fees specified in the last column of the Schedule.

(2) A person who wishes to carry out any of the activities listed under the First Schedule shall apply for a permit from the County.

(3) A person who contravenes the provisions of this Section commits an offence.

Barter Market Fees

4. (1) There is established the barter market fees charge which shall be in respect of designated county markets. Traders operating within the markets are liable to fees and charges for assessment year 2019- 2020 and the rates of fees and charges are as specified in the Second Schedule of the Act.

(2) A person who contravenes the provisions of this Section commits an offence.

Agricultural Produce Cess

5. There is established the agricultural produce cess which shall be a charge in respect of specified agricultural produce for the assessment year 2019 and the rates of cess charges have been specified in the Second Schedule Part III of the Act. These are the same as laid down in the Agricultural Produce Act of 1998, for the purpose of computation of cess charges due on cessable produce.

Slaughter Fees

6. There is established the slaughter fees charge which shall be a charge in respect of specified stock produce, for the assessment year 2019 and the rates of fees have been specified in the Second Schedule Part IV of the Act.

Application form Fees

7. (1) There is established the application form fees charge that will be used in relation to any application form for services from the county government.

(2) A person who wishes to carry out any of the activities under the Act shall apply for a permit from the County government.

(3) The County shall grant the relevant permit to the applicant upon payment of fees prescribed in the Acts Schedules.

(4) A person who contravenes the provisions of this Section commits an offence.

Parking Fees

8. (1) There is established the parking fees charge applicable to vehicles parked in designated parking areas within the Central business district, streets, bus parks and the owners of vehicle parked in designated areas which are liable to pay fees specified in Part I – VIII of the Third Schedule.

(2) There shall be penalties for late and non-payment of parking fees, impounding of vehicles, towing or withdrawal of court bonds specified in the Third Schedule.

Impounding fee

9. There is established the impounding fees charge relating to impounded items like motor vehicles, motor cycles, wares displayed in undesignated areas, court exhibits and animals.

Business premises refuse conservancy fees

10. (1) There is established the business premises refuse conservancy charges in relation to all refuse conservancy services offered by the County Government under the Fourth Schedule or supply of the same service by private persons in the County.

(2) A person who contravenes the provisions of this Section commits an offence.

Rental premises refuse conservancy fees

11. (1) There is established the rental premises refuse conservancy fee in respect to charges for conservancy services offered by the County Government under the Fourth Schedule for urban areas, towns and markets within rental dwelling premises

(2) A person who contravenes the provisions of this Section commits an offence.

Outdoor Advertising

12. (1) There is established the outdoor advertising charge as defined in the interpretation section of the Physical Planning Act of 1996 for the assessment year 2019 and the rate of advertisement charges has been specified in the Part I of the Fifth schedule.

(2) A person who contravenes the provisions of this Section commits an offence.

Fire Section Fees

13. (1) There is established the fire section fee charges to relate to Firefighting services rebate fees under Part V of the Fifth Schedule.

(2) A person who contravenes the provisions of this Section commits an offence.

Hire of Plant Equipment

14. (1) There is established the hire of plant equipment charge to comprise of hiring of County plant equipment.

(2) A person shall not use government machines specified in Part I of the Sixth Schedule without permission from the relevant authority.

(3) A person who wishes to hire plant equipment shall apply to the relevant authority within the Sub-county.

(4) A person who contravenes the provisions of this Section commits an offence.

Way leave charges

15. There is established the Way Leave charge under Part II of the Sixth Schedule relating to way leave charges on infrastructure installed by Kenya Power and Lighting Company, Rural Electrification Authority and Water companies within the County.

Building plan approval charges

16. There is established the building plan approval charge which relates to approval of building plans as defined in the Physical Planning Act of 1996 and the approval charges for the assessment year 2019 have been specified in Part III – VII of the Sixth Schedule.

Contractors Fee

17. There is established the Contractors Fee charge under Part II of the Sixth Schedule relating to various classifications of contractors and base transmitter stations contractors on public and private land within the county

House Rent

18. (1) There is established the house rent which a charge for housing units is owned by the County Government of Meru. The rate of rental charges has been specified in the Seventh Schedule to the Act.

(2) A surcharge shall be levied for rental default at a cumulative rate of 5 % per month.

Hire of County Properties

19. (1) There is established the hire of County properties charge to comprise of hire of County Vehicles and grounds, board rooms and chamber, equipment's and plants to the general public.

(2) A person shall not use hired county properties specified in Part II of the Ninth Schedule without permission from the relevant authority and upon payment of prescribed fees.

(3) A person who wishes to hire county properties shall apply for a permit to the relevant authority.

(4) A person who contravenes the provisions of this Section commits an offence.

Registration of Private Learning Institutions

20. There is established the registration of private learning institutions in the Tenth Schedule which provides a charge relating to any registration of private schools, colleges and universities within the County.

Foods, Drugs and Health Services Permits

21. (1) A person shall not sell the products, operate a business or receive the County services specified in the Eleventh Schedule without a permit from the relevant authority.

(2) A person who wishes to sell the foods or drugs or receives the County services specified in the Eleventh Schedule shall apply for a permit from the Department responsible for public health.

(3) The Department responsible for public health may grant the permit or provide the services specified in the Eleventh Schedule upon payment of the fee in the Schedule.

(4) A person who contravenes the provisions of this Section commits an offence.

Co-operative and Enterprise Development Fees and Charges

22. (1) A person shall not carry out any business or provide the services specified in the Twelveth Schedule unless permitted to do so by the relevant County department.

(2) A person who wishes to carry out any of the business or provide the services specified in the Twelveth Schedule shall apply for a permit to the relevant County department.

(3) A person who contravenes the provisions of this Section commits an offence.

PART III—RATES OF PROPERTY TAX

Rates of Property Tax

23. There is hereby charged rates of property tax in respect of properties of all categories by owners liable to pay taxes for the assessment year 2019-2020 specified in the Eighth Schedule and the rates of property tax shall be the same as those laid down in the valuation roll in force at the date of assent to this Act for the purposes of computation of property taxes due.

Penalties on outstanding rates

24. (1) Penalties shall be levied in respect of property liable to be taxed for the assessment year 2019-2020, in the following cases—

- (a) In the case of a property having total outstanding rates at the turn of the calendar year the amount of property tax computed shall be increased by a penalty calculated at 3% cumulatively per month.
- (b) In the case of properties owned by the national government the property-tax computed, in this case the contribution in lieu of rates outstanding shall be increased by a penalty of 3% for the purpose of such property tax.

(2) Provided that marginal relief shall be allowed in cases where the amount is cleared by the turn of the year to ensure that annual amount of the property tax payable does not accrue penalties until after the 31st of March of each calendar year.

PART IV—SINGLE BUSINESS LICENSE**Single Business Permit**

25. (1) There is established Single Business Permit in respect of businesses of all categories by owners liable to pay tax for assessment in the year 2019-2020 and the rates of single business permits shall be as specified in the Thirteenth schedule of the Act.

(2) A person shall not carry out any business or provide the services specified in the Thirteenth Schedule without a valid licence issued by the government.

Penalties on outstanding licenses

26. Penalties shall be levied in respect of business liable to tax for the assessment year 2015/16, in the following cases—

- (a) in the event of a business having total outstanding licenses at the turn of the calendar year the amount of license computed shall be increased by a penalty calculated at 5% of the license fee per month after 31st March.
- (b) a person who operates a business without a license or a permit commits an offence and shall be liable to a fine of—
 - (i) A fine of Kenya shillings ten thousand in the case of an individual;
 - (ii) A fine of Kenya shillings Fifty thousand in the case of a registered business; or
 - (iii) In default of (i) or (ii) above to imprisonment for a term not exceeding three months.

PART V—WIDENING OF TAX BASE

Royalties

27. For any minerals mined in the County there will be a proposed tax at the rate of 2% of net sales.

PART VI—MEASURES TO PREVENT NON REMITTANCE OF COLLECTED REVENUE

Use of technology for collection and monitoring of receipts

28. (1) All payments to the government shall be made through an authorized channel.

(2) In order to augment the existing measures and to ensure all revenue is remitted Executive Committee member shall:

- (a) make use of technological platforms for revenue collection and monitoring by automating and linking all revenue centres to County Integrated Revenue Management system and county revenue Collection System for real time reporting, monitoring and verification of cash flow in addition to the automation of cash receipts, internet banking, mobile payment systems, and other electronic cash transfers.
- (b) put measures in place to prevent loss of revenue including recording of all accountable documents within the information system;
- (c) ensure timely approval of building plans and enforcement, automation of plans approval process;
- (d) digitalize all county mutations to allow prompt management of property liable to property tax;
- (e) automate revenue centres for collection to enhance revenue collection and administration efficiency;
- (f) regularly monitor system generated bills to eliminate personal discretion in billing; and
- (g) serialize advertisement objects through system generated numerals.
- (h) (3) An official receipt shall be issued for all payments made to the County.

(4) Any payments made to the County shall be evidenced by an official receipt.

(5) A person who contravenes the provisions of this Section commits an offence.

PART VII—TAX INCENTIVES AND RELIEFS**Tax Incentives and Reliefs**

29. The Executive committee member may exempt, waive or vary fees or charges payable under this Act and the following shall constitute tax incentives and reliefs—

- (a) waiver of land rates penalties including reduction of property tax struck rate as contemplated by article 210 of the Constitution;
- (b) easing of the business license acquisition through mobile phone money payment system.

PART VIII—RATIONALIZATION OF INTER-COUNTY TAXATION PROVISIONS**Inter County Taxation**

30. In respect to the power of the county to impose taxes and other revenue raising measures the mobility of goods from other counties shall be accompanied by movement permits to augment Article 209(5) of the Constitution.

Amendments to the Schedules

31. (1) The Executive committee member may by order published in the *Kenya Gazette* amend any of the Schedules to this Act.

(2) Any order made under sub-section (1) shall be laid before the County Assembly without unreasonable delay, and unless a resolution approving the order is passed by the County Assembly within the next twenty one days on which it next sits after the order is so laid, the order shall lapse but without prejudice to anything previously done thereunder.

PART IX—OFFENCES AND PENALTIES**General Penalty**

32. A person who commits an offence under this Act for which no penalty is provided shall be liable on conviction, to a fine not exceeding two hundred thousand shillings or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding one year, or both.

PART X—GENERAL PROVISIONS**Anti-Evasion Rules**

33. The following shall constitute anti-tax evasion guidelines under this Act—

- (a) movement of goods across counties will be subject to movement permits agreed among counties;

- (b) automation of collection points and processes for real time monitoring;
- (c) imposition of fines and penalties for mitigating tax evasion as set out in the various schedules of the Act; and
- (d) physical mapping of business premises within the counties major centres and markets.

Regulations

34. The Executive committee member may make regulations for the better carrying out of the purposes and provisions to this Act.

The Bill has been submitted by the Executive Committee Member of Finance in line with budget proposals for 2019 Financial Year.

The object of the Bill is to impose and vary certain taxes, fees, charges, licences, rents or rates for services provided by the County Government.

Part I provides for preliminary provisions.

Part II provides for power to charge taxes, fees, licences, rates and charges

Part III provides for power to charge property rates tax.

Part IV provides charges for single business licences and penalties for outstanding licences.

Part V provides for the power to widen tax base by charging royalties.

Part VI provides measures to prevent non remittance of collected revenue.

Part VII provides for tax incentives and reliefs.

Part VIII provides for rationalization of inter- county taxation.

Part IX provides for general anti-evasion rule.

The enactment of this Bill shall occasion additional expenditure of public funds that will be provided for in the budget estimate.
