Year-Round

Lane County History Museum will be featuring the first 50 years of the Fair in a year-long exhibit. The exhibit will be up through June 6, 2020—go check out a slice of Oregon history. OCF Archives will also have a display in the Collins Gallery of the Portland Central Library running through the months of July and August, 2019. A special treat for our Portland friends!

On November 1, 2019 we will celebrate the actual day of the first Fair exactly 50 years later! KOCF is throwing a giant costume party at the WOW Hall at 8th and Lincoln in Eugene. Follow KOCF on social media for updates. Everyone is encouraged to don your best costume and party like it's 1969!

All Weekend

The Jill Heiman Vision Fund, one of the Fair's key philanthropic programs, is endeavoring to reach the goal of donating \$50,000 to area non-profit groups helping people meet their basic needs in honor of the Fair's 50th anniversary. Look for collection boxes where you can donate at all the Info Booths throughout the Fair.

Craft Demonstrations

Every day from 11:00 to 7:00 at Black Oak Pocket Park (across from the Ritz Sauna) craft-making will be demonstrated. Creating space for artisans and chefs to sell their creations has always been a foundational tenet of the Fair. This year, we are highlighting the processes by which some of these arts and crafts are created. Have you ever wondered how they made that wonderful thing? Don't miss this opportunity to be inspired and educate yourself about what it takes to create some of the art you so admire.

Fair Roots

Leading the Way, a new display, gives a brief overview of the social and political issues of the 60s that the Fair grew out of and highlights areas of the Fair still reflects these ideals. Also, the first 50 years of the Fair's history is illustrated in timeline form for a better understanding of where we came from. These will be on display all weekend at the Elders' Still Living Room.

Peach on Parade

Look for the whimsical humongous Peach Tree Birthday Cake as it joins in the daily parades and pops up on stages. Fifty years ago, a peach pit was planted and has been lovingly tended throughout the years. It has blossomed into our Peach Tree Birthday Cake and is ready for us to celebrate it. It will be wandering through the Fair every day of the three-day extravaganza!

Honoring Fair History

Colorful plaques around the Fair will honor our fabulous crafters and food purveyors who have been participating in our event for 40 years or more by telling their stories in words and pictures.

Keeping it Green

To demonstrate our commitment to making the Fair an event built on sustainability and care for our planet, for our 50th the Fair has identified reducing our carbon footprint as an important area where we can have an impact. Fair staff and volunteers are engaging in understanding our current carbon impacts to identify areas where we can make significant improvements. This year, Xavanadu hosts a demonstration of composting toilets so we can see if this is a technology that will help meet the Fair's needs and goals. Reducing individual automobile trips to the Fair is one of the most obvious and clear ways to reducing carbon emissions. Thank you to everyone who bicycled, carpoled or took the bus to the Fair!

Ticket Info

Tickets are available at ticketswest.com, or call 1-800-992-8499. Cost is \$29/advance and \$32/day-of for Friday, \$32/advance and \$36/day-of for Saturday, and \$25/advance and \$28/day-of for Sunday. You can also purchase a three-day ticket for \$70. NO tickets are available on the Fair site. Admission for children under 10 is free, tickets for seniors (65 and over) and alter-abled are \$5 off.

Shuttle Bus Service

Ride the bus! You don't need a bus ticket; your Fair pass gets you on any LTD bus for free. That includes fast and frequent shuttle service from Valley River Center and the downtown LTD station. The LAST BUS LEAVES THE FAIR SITE AT 7:30! LTD schedules are available at ltd.org or by calling (541) 687-5555.

Child Care

Child Care is a friendly, secure and enriching Fair experience made just for kids! We welcome potty-trained children between the hours of 11:00 and 6:00 for \$2.00 per hour, per child, with a maximum of two hours per visit. We're also on call 24/7 for lost kids. Child Care has two locations: on Sesame Street at the top of the Figure Eight, past Main Stage near the Ritz Sauna, and New Kids on Wally's Way at the front of the Fair near the Bus Admissions entrance and Caravan Stage. Both locations offer fun and stimulating activities for younger Fair-goers, including live entertainment, crafts, imagination and sensory play, and many other fun things. We cannot accept hungry children, bare butts or training pants, but we do offer family-friendly rest areas adjacent to each location.

Diaper Service

Located on Wally's Way, BRING Recycling will provide cloth diaper service for our newest generation. Complimentary plastic storage bags and diaper pins are provided as needed. Using this service is a great way to help move the Fair towards zero waste while protecting the health and safety of the Sanitation and Recycling Crews.

Chela Mela Meadow: The Fair's Inner Child [K7]

Chela Mela invites you to come play, chill, dance and celebrate the Oregon Country Fair's 50th anniversary. Enjoy some lounge time in the Cuckoo's Nest. Learn to juggle at the Yes You Canopy; we supply the toys. For young ones with a creative streak—stop by Five Fingers of Fun for an original craft project. Want a parade? Check out Dragon's Lair before 1:15 on Friday and Saturday or 2:30 on Sunday. Here you can get painted and ready to parade through the path with Peachi the Dragon and her drummers. Looking for something quieter? The Dharma Garden offers a peaceful retreat under a giant tree by the side of

the river with yoga classes at 12:00, 2:00 and 4:00. The Mighty Tiny Puppet Theater presents traditional and original stories with a range of styles. Kids and adults gather under the red, yellow and black tent to experience live puppetry on the Fair's tiniest stage.

On your way to the Hoarse Chorale Stage, check out the Game Room—we've gone all in for bean bag games.

Premiering for the 50th celebration is Stand-Up Comedy Showcase featuring a selection of emerging artists and a daily dose of David Clay. Drop by for a laugh each day starting at 5:00 at the Morningwood Odditorium.

Also at the Morningwood Odditorium is JACK AND THE BEANSTALK by the Fremont Players and Fremont Philharmonic Orchestra. Family-friendly, this classic Panto-style fairy tale is about Jack, his mom, a farming community, an evil ogress and a destructive giant. Will Jack have to sell Daisy the cow? Can the neighbor's goose lay a golden egg? Will there be a beanstalk that grows into the clouds? Come cheer the heroes and boo the villains!

Still Living Room: Pull Up a (Rocking) Chair [H5]

The Still Living Room is located on Strawberry Lane by Jill's Crossing. Take a break and stroll through the five historical timelines depicting the issues and growth that the OCF community has faced. Be sure to see the new interactive 50th year celebration timeline.

Recycling

The Recycling Crew, working with the Fair food vendors, is doing everything it can to eliminate plastic from the Fair. All of the food service ware throughout the Fair, including beverage cups, is compostable! Please dispose of all compostable service ware in the green compost receptacles, not the red landfill receptacles. You will find collection kiosks throughout the Fair, often run by costumed Recyclers who will happily answer your questions. If you're not sure what goes where, ask a Recycler!

The Recycling Crew members are dedicated to minimizing the impact that our event has on our land and the planet. To learn more about what we do, please visit the educational recycling kiosk in Energy Park. You might also enjoy our presence at the StewardShip Booth in Xavanadu. Our success depends on you—thank you for recycling responsibly.

Medical & Crisis Assistance

Once again White Bird's Rock Medicine crew provides its unique brand of medical and crisis intervention services at OCF! White Bird is the emergency response at the Fair and dispatches trained medical & mental health professionals to incidents anywhere on site as needed. Services are free & confidential. Don't call 911 (seriously), call White Bird! We can be contacted by any staff person carrying a radio or via OCF's internal telephone system (Tinker Bell) located at most major Fair installations like stages, gates and Info Booths.

AND THAT'S NOT ALL! - It is with great pleasure that we would like to announce the opening of a full-service second service center, Little Wing, located in Xavanadu, near Wind Gate. For the past few years Little Wing has been open for limited hours and with limited services but this year we have expanded to a full service model with all the same resources Big Bird offers, just at the other end of Fair! Little Wing will be open beginning 8:00am Thursday, July 11 and will run 24/7 all weekend until 4:00pm Monday afternoon, July 15.

Community Village: A Fair Within A Fair [E5]

Community Village is at the center of the Oregon Country Fair, located between Energy Park and Main Stage. Community Village is dedicated to education, information access and networking for progressive social change. We work to create a Village Vision of love, peace, trust, justice, cooperation, equality and social service, by believing in dreams, thinking of others, valuing differences and experimenting with new ideas. We hope to expand consciousness, growing beyond the Fair... into the world at large. Come gaze into the future, see the peaches of our past, and stand up for community, as we celebrate the 50th with family.

Archaeology Park: Super Old School-ing [B8]

Visit "Ark" Park and step back in time along the banks of the Long Tom River. Regional archaeological studies during the 1980's found more than 10,500 years of cultural history on the grounds of the Oregon Country Fair site. At Ark Park's museum display you can talk to our archaeologist and learn more about the Fair's educational, research and preservation efforts. Learn about the Kalapuya people and their history and

culture through time up to today. The archaeological sites we care for are part of a larger system of sites along the river. Find out how the Kalapuya managed the landscape and harvested its bounty. Check out the Ark Park buildings of hand-split cedar, built with traditional construction methods. Visit with true artisans as they show you flint-knapping, fire making, hide tanning and basketry.

At the trade booth, you can learn about ancient skill gatherings or purchase replicated artifacts and instructional books produced by our demonstrators. See the workshop schedule or just stop by and learn something new about some very old skills.

OCF Fire Theatre: There's No Place Like Home!

Featuring live music from The Garcia Birthday Band, Tyler Spencer, Marv Ellis and Shook Twins. Oz is on fire and so is the cast of this version of The Wizard of Oz as you've never seen it before. Enjoy OCF's finest fire dancers and acrobats as they share a special twist on this beloved story on Friday at 9:00pm at the Fire Theatre stage in Miss Piggy parking lot.

Xavanadu Art Program

All the years combined, they melt into a dream called Xavanadu. Walk into the splintered sunlight, where Toni Tone Mikulka's Giant Puppets Save the World and animate classic personalities on an unearthly scale. Create Sympathetic Resonance with Tyson Ayers and the 5 Elements Sound Cave, where the strings play all alone. Bask next to Cory Glory's Mandala. Come looking for familiar faces where Dena Schofield returns with previous offerings of Photo Ops, re-combined into a dizzying arrangement. Michael Taluc has created Where There is Light, There is Shadow, a dazzlingly larger-than-life kinetic sculpture where strange shadows from the flames will grow. Just gotta poke around a bit to experience faraway culture with the miniature marionettes of Gustavo Fuenzalida Ugalde, who presents Trauko: The Fear of My Life, interpreting the roots of Chilean Culture. Future Memory Art presents The Juggler, a 2Dimensional expression of how it feels to be in a flow state.

Jean Margaret eases us lightly into the transient nightfall of diamonds. Did that tree just change color? Brad Batson's A Star is Born hangs by the shady oaks. This must be heaven, cuz here's where the Rainbow Ends, presented by Lucky Linda Sheeley. Tyler FuQua sets the stage with a shape-shifting, color-changing, oversized Cyclameleon, Clyde. There's mosquitoes on the river, but not by Clyde! Portal Arts Collective and Richard Cawley outdo themselves once again with the Peach de Resistance. How many nooks are in a peach pit and what curious stories from the last half century lie within? What more tales can be spun?

Crown yourself the queen of clowns and experience Xavanadu with eyes alight and glowing hair, all that fancy paints as Fair. For this is only a dream we dreamed one afternoon long ago.

Tara Kemp: Tara is a long-time artist and graphic designer in Eugene. The inspiration for her poster was to celebrate the history of the Fair. “My poster

honors 50 years of Fair posters by incorporating a Mandala of Peaches from past years’ art. The ‘Phases of the Peach’ motif around the perimeter suggests the passage of time and a connection to the natural world.” Tara’s artwork can be viewed at tarakemp.com. Cory & Catska Ench: Cory & Catska Ench have been a collaborating artist team since 1999. Although they prefer working on their independent artwork most of the time, over the last 20 years they have collaborated on an extensive number of projects. They created OCF posters in 2008, 2009, 2010, and now again with a 50th anniversary poster. Their 2019 poster draws on the spontaneous creative energy that happens at the Oregon Country Fair. The 50th anniversary and the 50 years of time that has passed are represented by the cuckoo clock-shaped booth. The great variety of designs of all the booths at the Fair is an artistic inspiration. The best inspiration of all is the amazing people and all the incredible things they create and experience at the Fair. It is a wonderful thing to be a part of this special year. PHILANTHROPIC PHAIRIES

The Fair has been rooted in philanthropy since it began as a fundraiser for a children’s program. Our philanthropy is focused on building community and helping people thrive. We have three grantmaking programs that together have donated more than \$1.5 million: The Bill Wooten Endowment Fund, the Jill Heiman Vision Fund and Board of Directors donations. To learn more, wander over to Wally’s Way to visit the Galleria Philanthropia booth or visit oregoncountryfair.org.

Five nonprofit organizations that help meet people’s basic needs have been selected to receive the donations to the Jill Heiman Vision Fund from this year’s Oregon Country Fair:

- **Assistance League:** To buy fresh produce and other nourishing food for the Weekend Food Pantry and Backpack Programs for school children.
- **Carry It Forward:** To construct a laundry and cleaning station facility that will serve homeless campers.
- **Catholic Community Services:** To provide basic needs support for Lane County participants in the Refugee and Asylum-Seeker Assistance program.
- **Planned Parenthood:** To purchase an autoclave, used to sterilize medical instruments.
- **St. Vincent de Paul:** To help purchase a 15-passenger van that will provide transportation for families in the First Place Night Shelter program and for homeless teens to attend school.

Look for donation boxes at Info Booths around the Fair. Food vouchers, cash or checks may be donated. Checks and cash donations are tax-deductible; please include address for mailed receipt. The OCF Board will triple the power of your gift by matching every \$1 donated with \$2, up to a total of \$25,000.

This year, Oregon Country Fair’s Bill Wooten Endowment Fund awarded a total of \$16,000 to support nonprofit organizations serving youth in the Fair’s neighboring communities in the Fern Ridge area. The grants tangibly represent the Fair’s deep appreciation of our home community. The 2019 grantees are:

- **Elmira Elementary School:** An artist-in-residence will combine performance arts with the school’s renewed focus on wellness and physical activity. Students will learn to juggle after making their own scarves and balls.
- **Fern Ridge Middle School:** The school will add ukuleles to enrich their General Music class, which is often taken by students who are the most reluctant music students.
- **Lane Arts Council:** Fern Ridge area children will be able to participate in a local “All About Art” immersive summer camp, which blends an exploration of ecology with exciting, diverse experiences in the visual and performance arts.
- **Rural Art Center:** The Crow-Applegate-Lorane School District depends on the Center to provide after-school multi-cultural art instruction on shortened school days—which is especially valuable for elementary students who have no art teacher at their school. Older students will develop playing skills and socialize at the Center’s Ukulele Club.
- **Veneta Elementary School:** An artist-in-residence will work with students to create detailed drawings from studying scientific specimens, using a variety of media: pencil, pen and ink, watercolor, acrylics and charcoal.
- **Wordcrafters:** This collaborative project with Elmira High School will provide an arts residency

focusing on spoken word writing and performance, engaging students and enlarging their writing experience and skills.

- **Culture Jam:** Fern Ridge area youth will attend this eight-day arts-based empowerment camp for teenagers held each summer at the Fair site.

The annual Leslie Scott Imagine Grant Award is given to the funded project that best represents former Fair General Manager Leslie Scott’s contributions to the Fair, which include providing opportunities for youth, reaching out to our neighbors, and nurturing creativity of all sorts. This year’s awardee is Elmira Elementary School.
