MIGHT THAW A LITTLE

Soaring medical costs, the burdensome Medicare-Medicaid program, and the pressures of public opinion, have combined to make health one of the major domestic issues of 1971. The Administration has announced highest priority for reform of the nation's health-care system. Meanwhile, liberals in both houses of Congress have prepared their own far-reaching plans for compulsory national health insur-

Health Policy

The time has come indeed to reconsider the plethora of health programs that politicians have approved from time to time to stay in office. When we do, we can see that the national experience in providing health care for the aged and needy has not been happy because there has been no overall national policy.

The patchwork of tinkered programs has become so unmanageable that it is one of the chief causes of spiraling medical costs in the nation as a whole, costs which are rising twice as fast as the cost of living. The national medical bill, now \$60 billion a year, is more than double what it was before

1965 when Washington first began intervening directly between the patient and his physician. A number of solutions have been proposed to diminish the medical burdens and to bring us from the morass of publicly-subsidized medical care for the elderly and the poor.

Some approaches would seek to root out the faults of the Medicare and the Medicaid systems by eliminating abuses and generally tightening the programs. The spate of bills in Congress on the sub-

ject as well as the number of ideas waiting in the wings to solve the nation's health care problems portray the deep roots of the matter. The simple truth is that, brimming with good intentions, we have embarked on a major federal program of assuring some level of health care to a large segment of our society without really knowing what we are doing or


