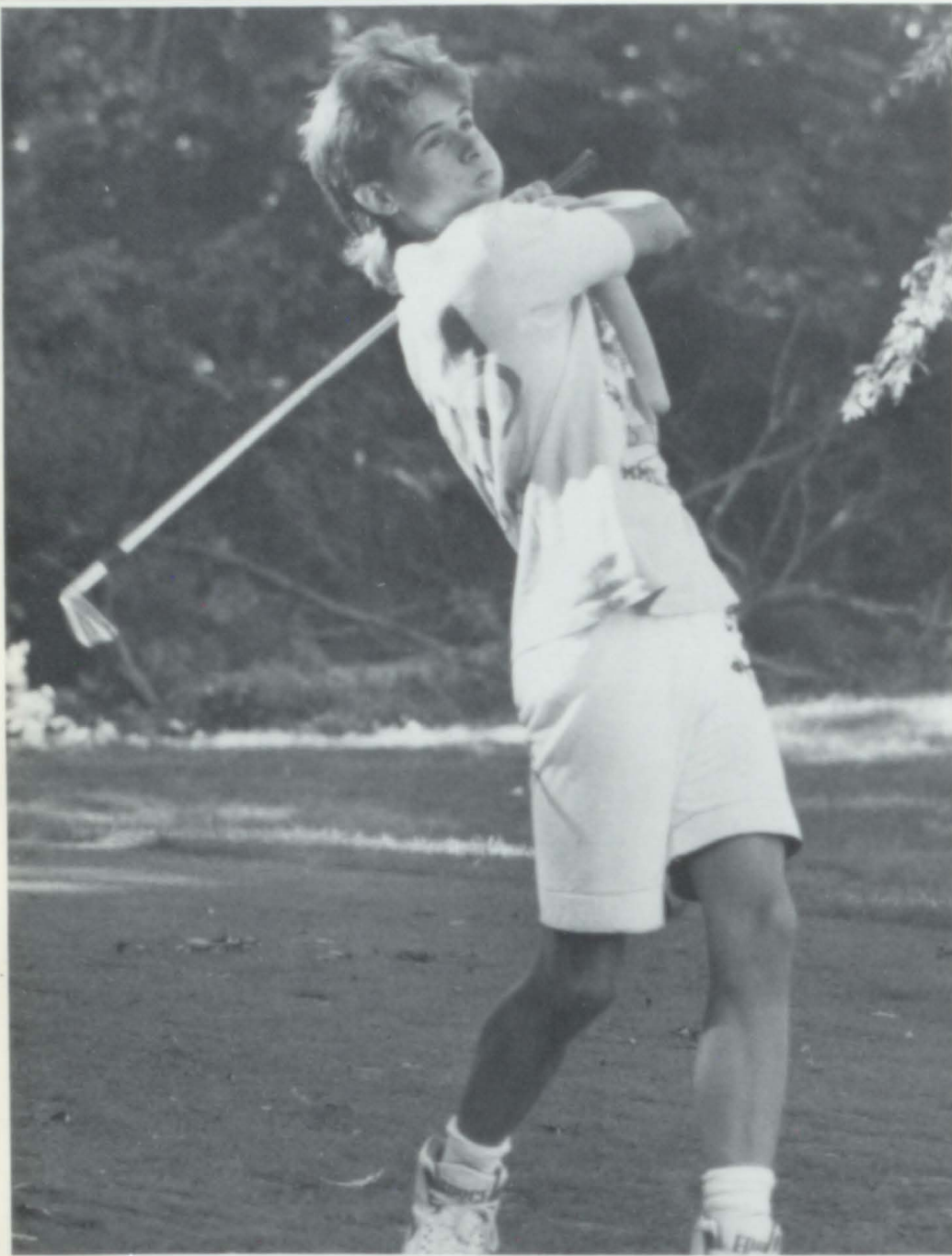
Everything in life takes time. There are some things that we don't like to do, but there are also things we love doing. Making and maintaining friendships is one of those things.

Time out for extracurricular activities!

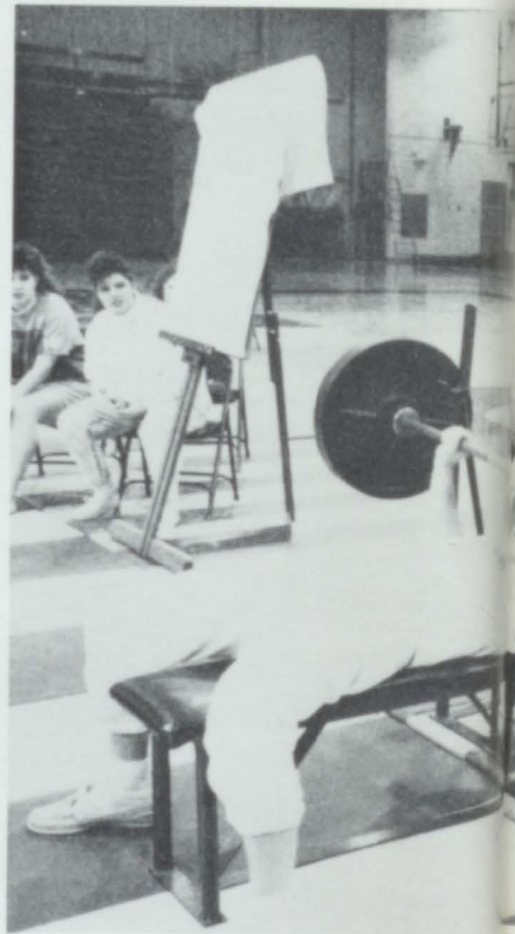
Extracurricular activities are things that don't involve the basic curriculum. Extracurricular activities include clubs, sports, and band. They may also be get-togethers with friends.

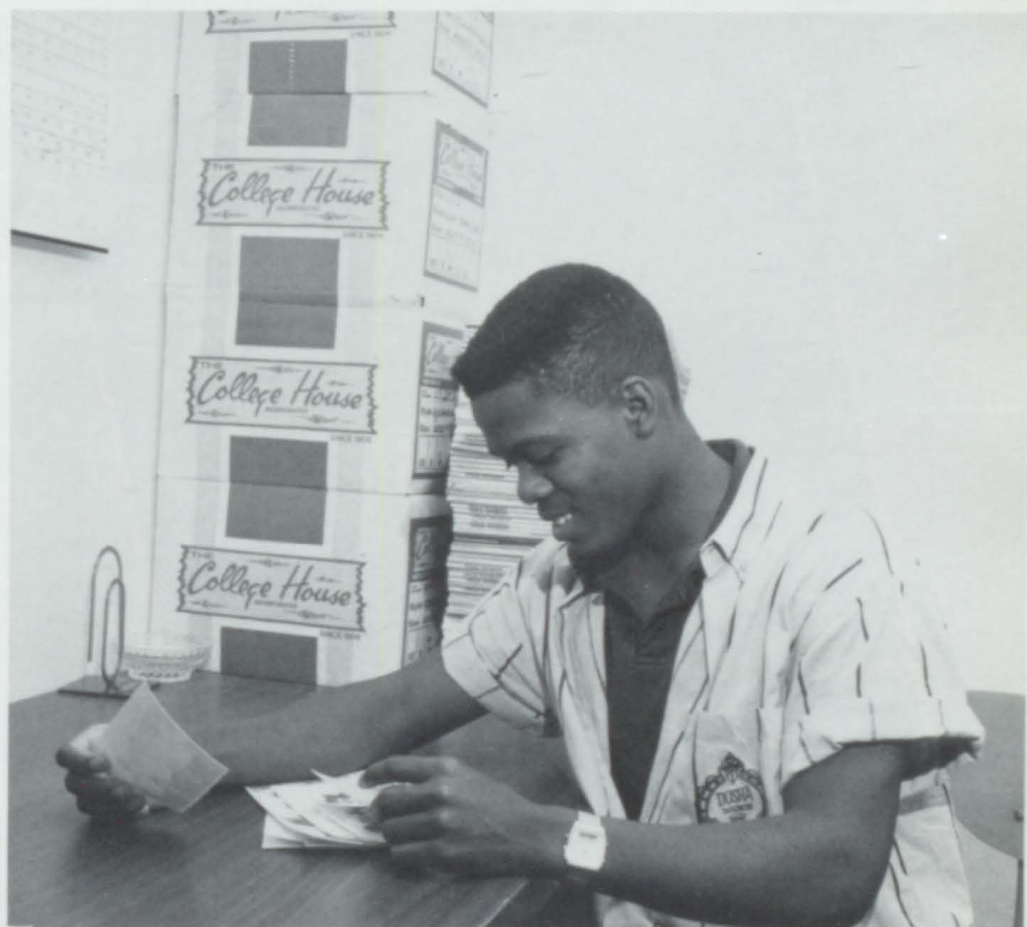
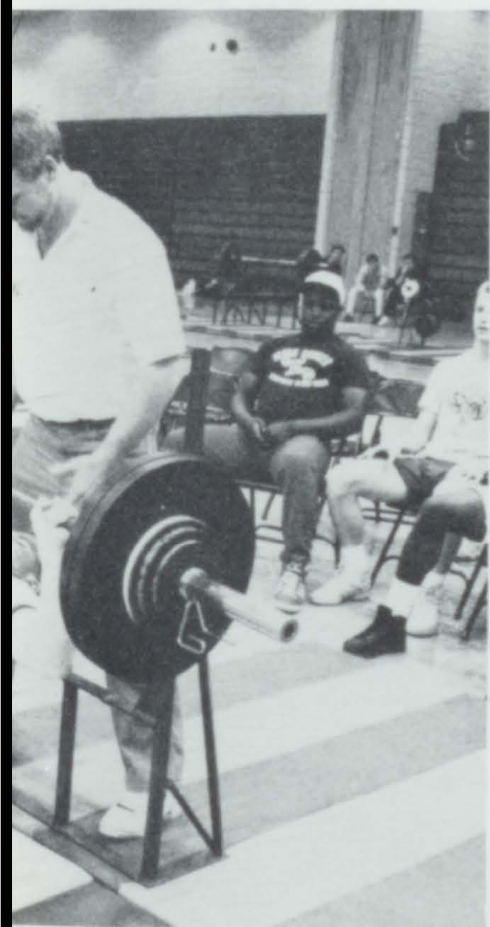
The time needed for these activities is usually time well spent. Some

need practice, and some need meetings to plan for the activities.

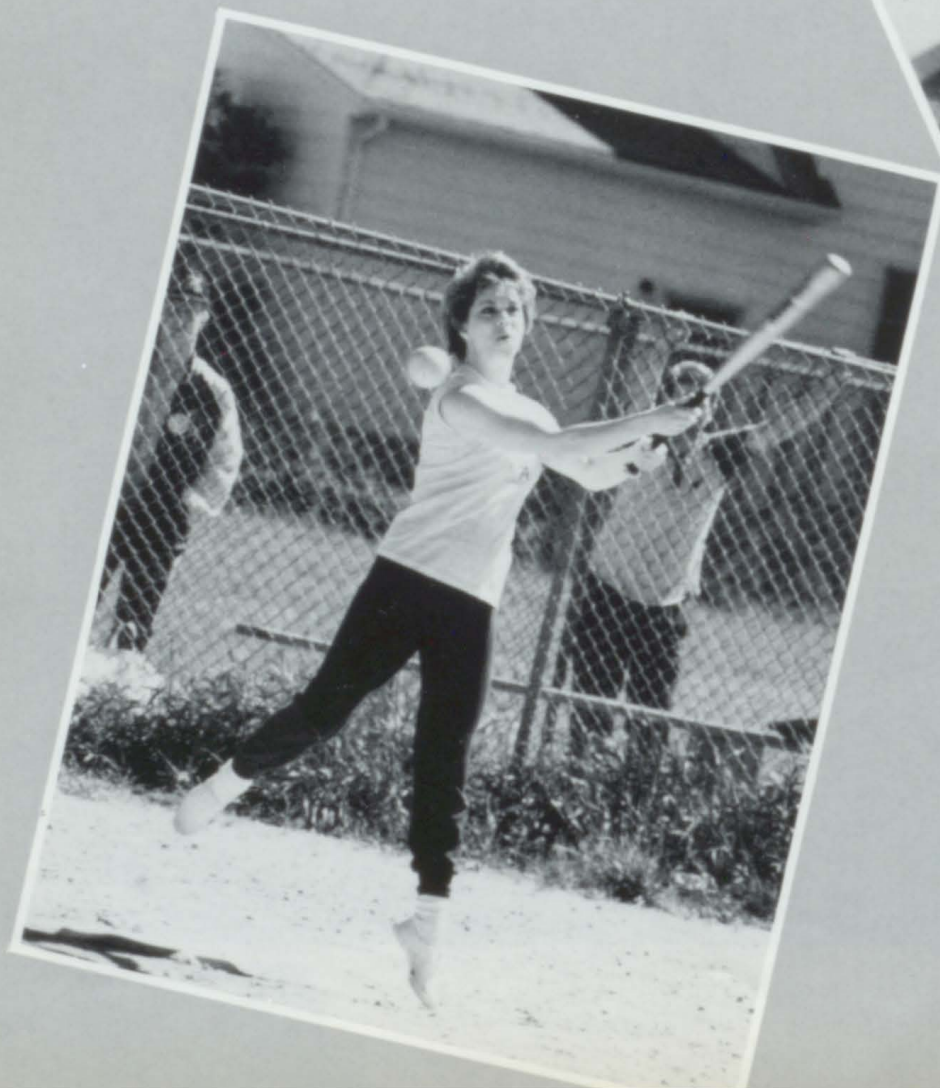
Some of the extracurricular activities award service credit. The service credit will come in handy when National Honor Society comes around.

Before they leave, there is business to take care of, and that's why the seniors elect the Senior Committee, to handle all of those big decisions like the prom, announcements, and caps and gowns.

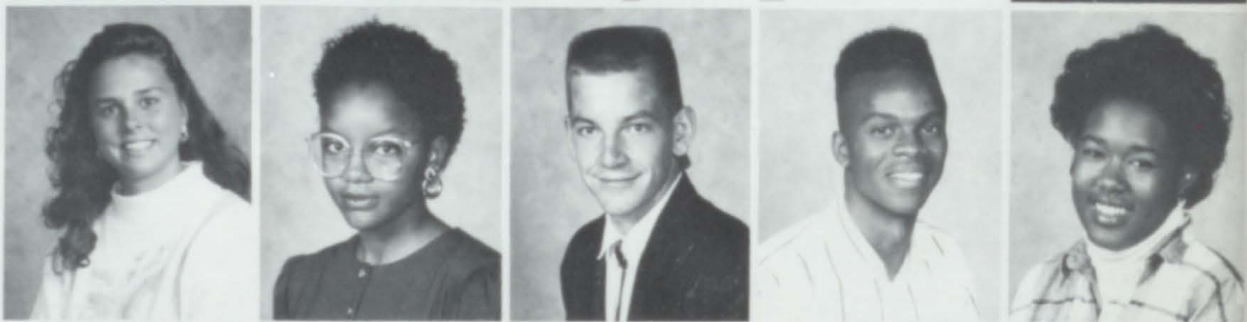

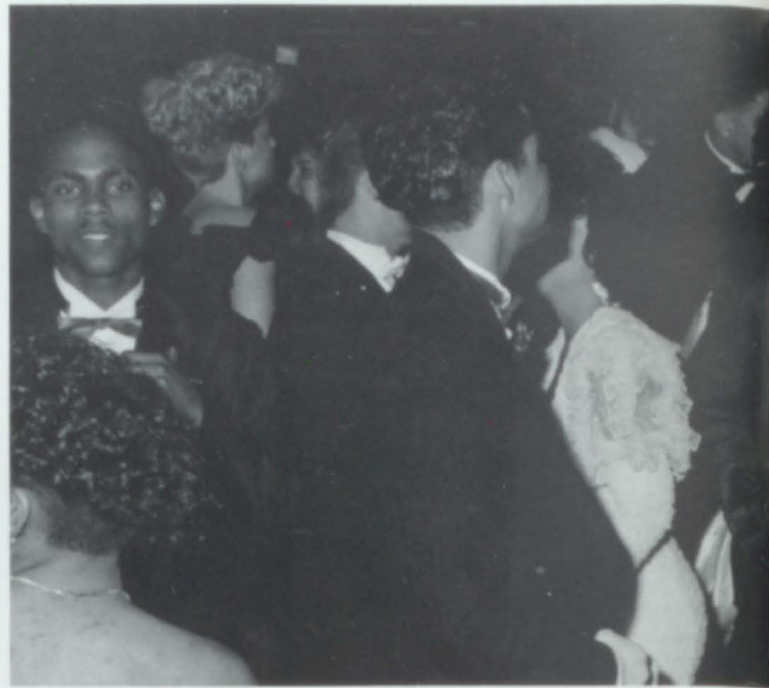

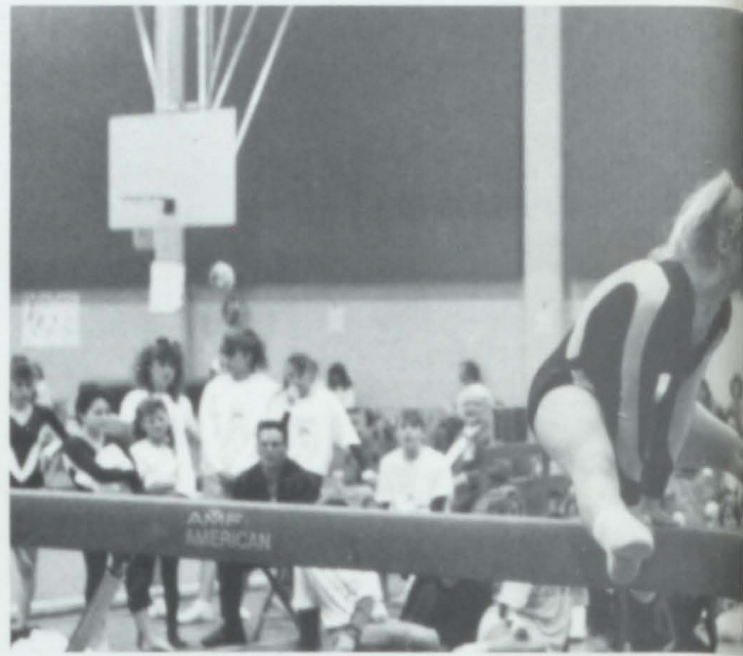

All of the students expressed appreciation for their time in America, and most say that they would like to visit again to get together with the friends they have made here.

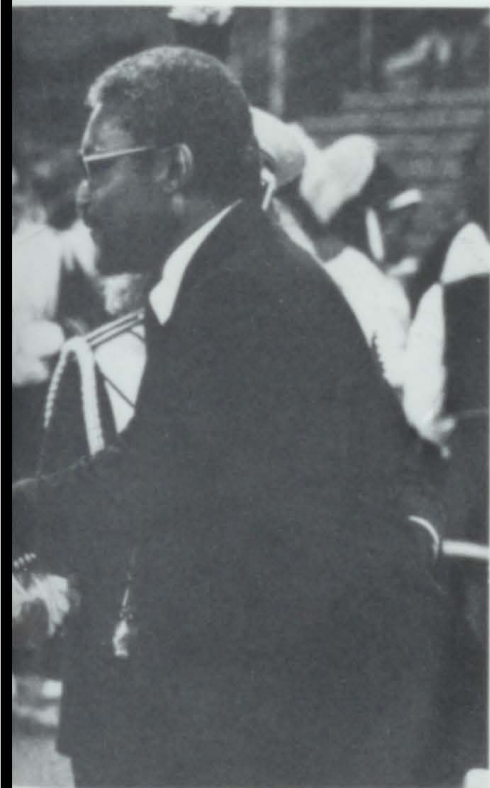

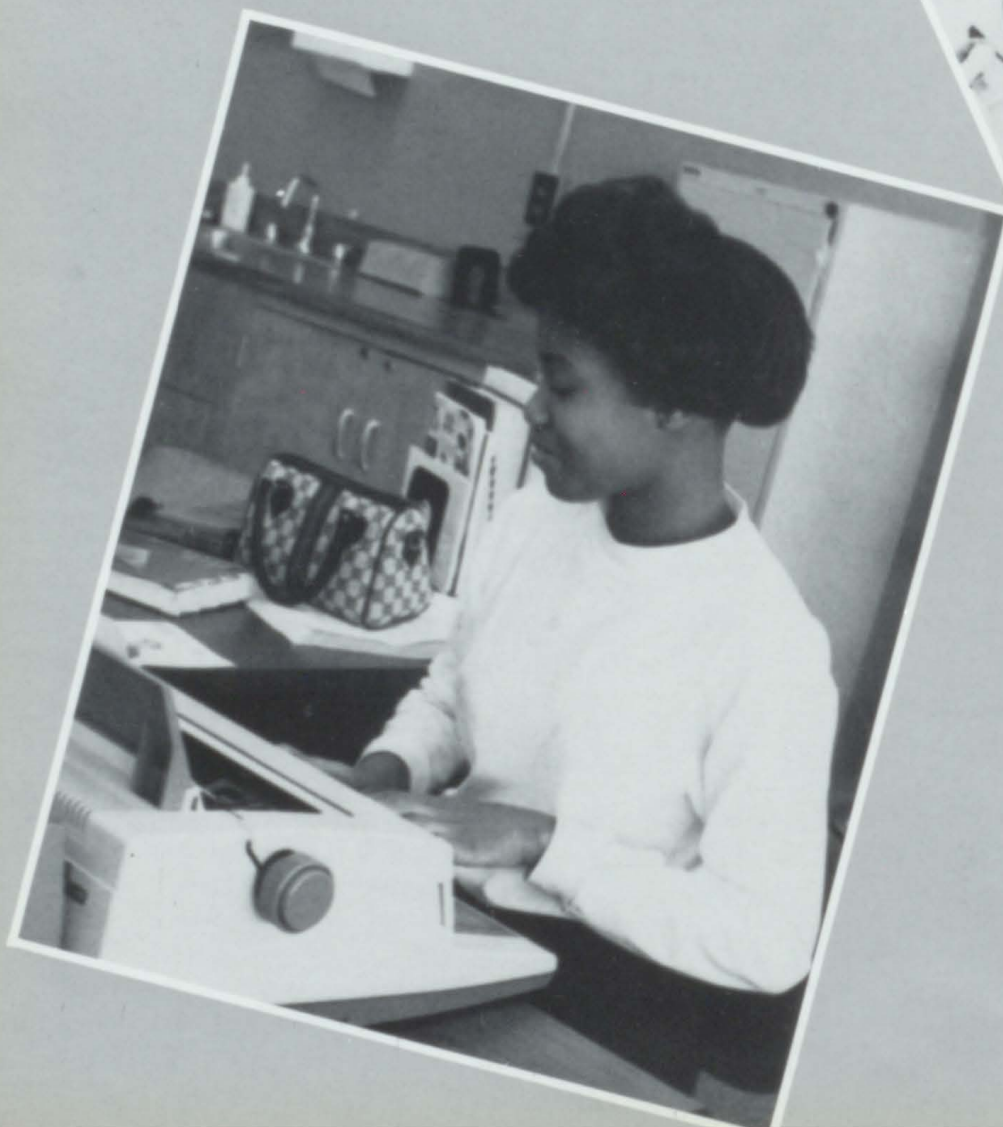

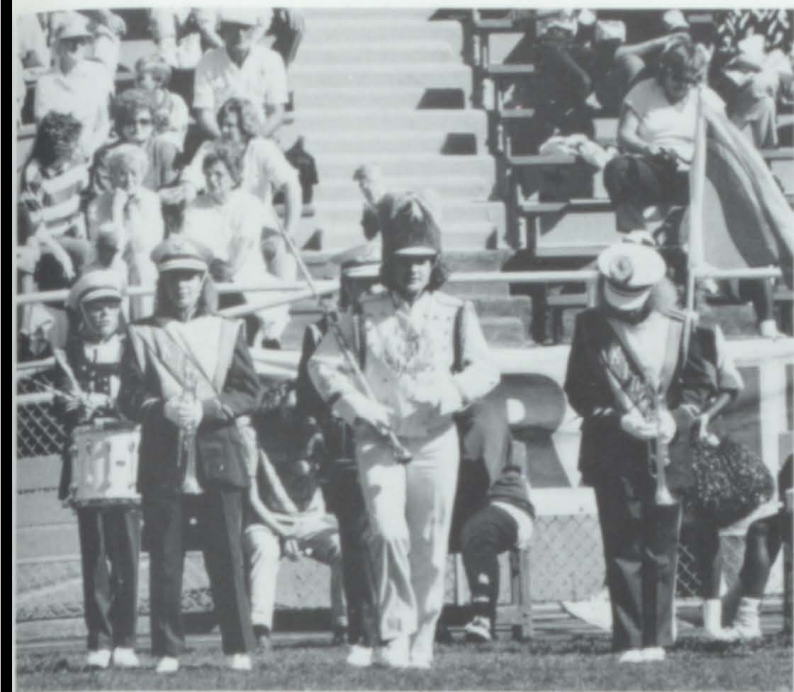

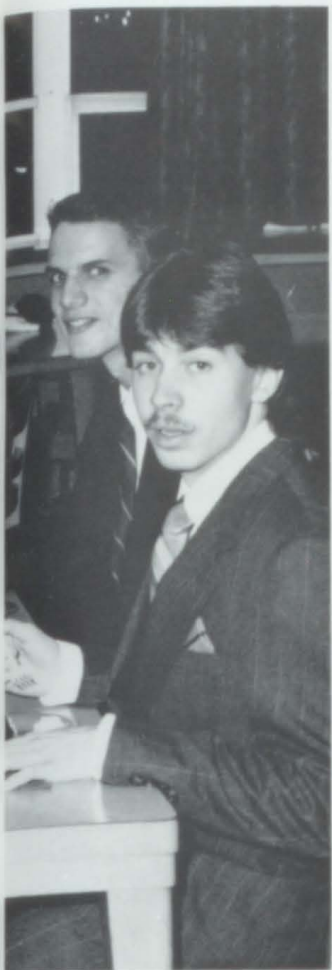

# ***Spare Time Is Dedicated To Service***

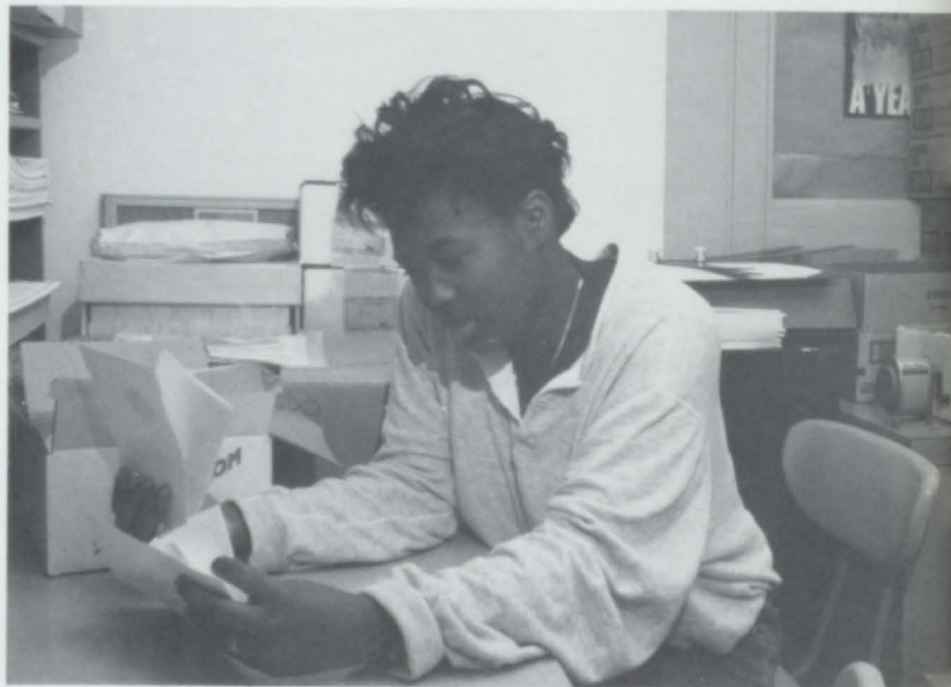
Trident, Key Club, Student Council, and Telecommunications take time out of their daily activities to perform those necessary duties for the school.

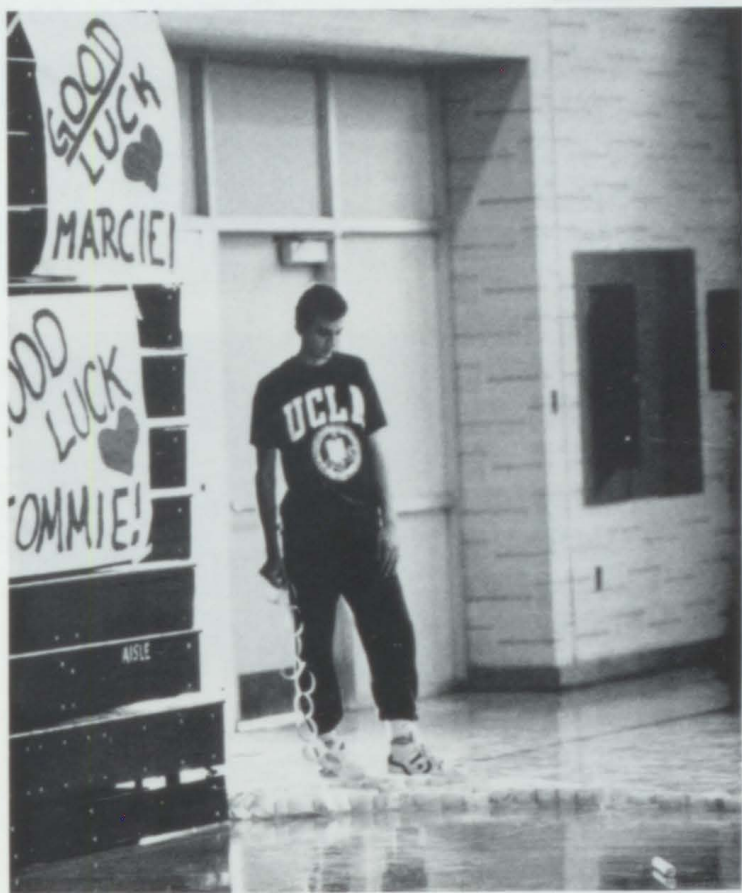

Students interested in a field concerning television become part of the Telecommunications class. The Telecommunications class is often asked to videotape school activities, individual class events, and footage for the Year Video.





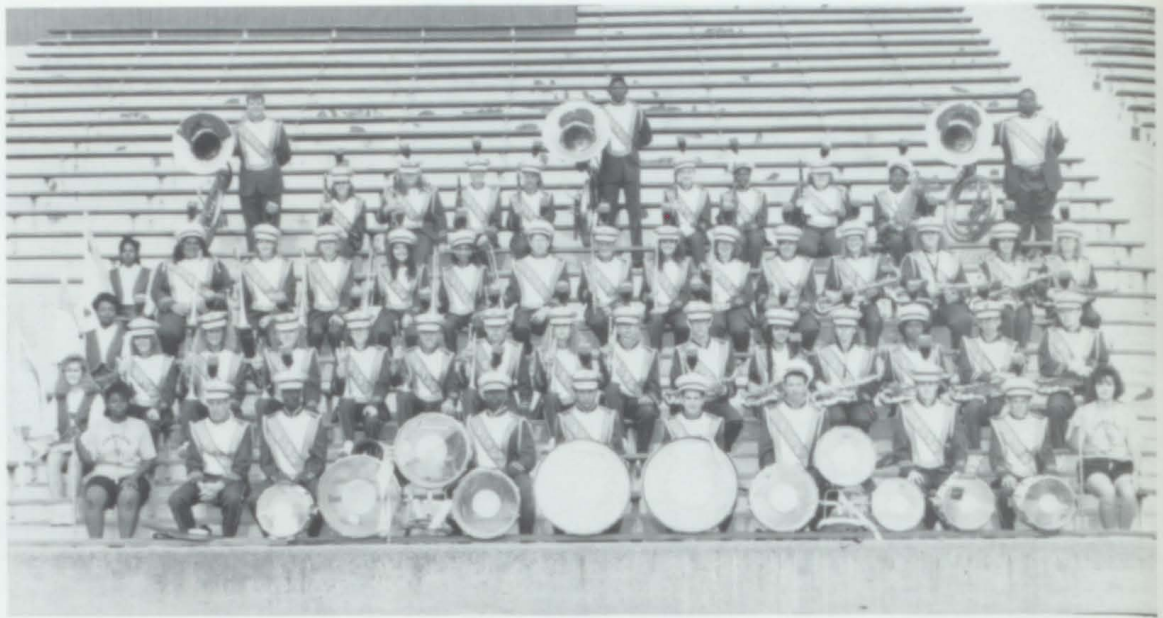

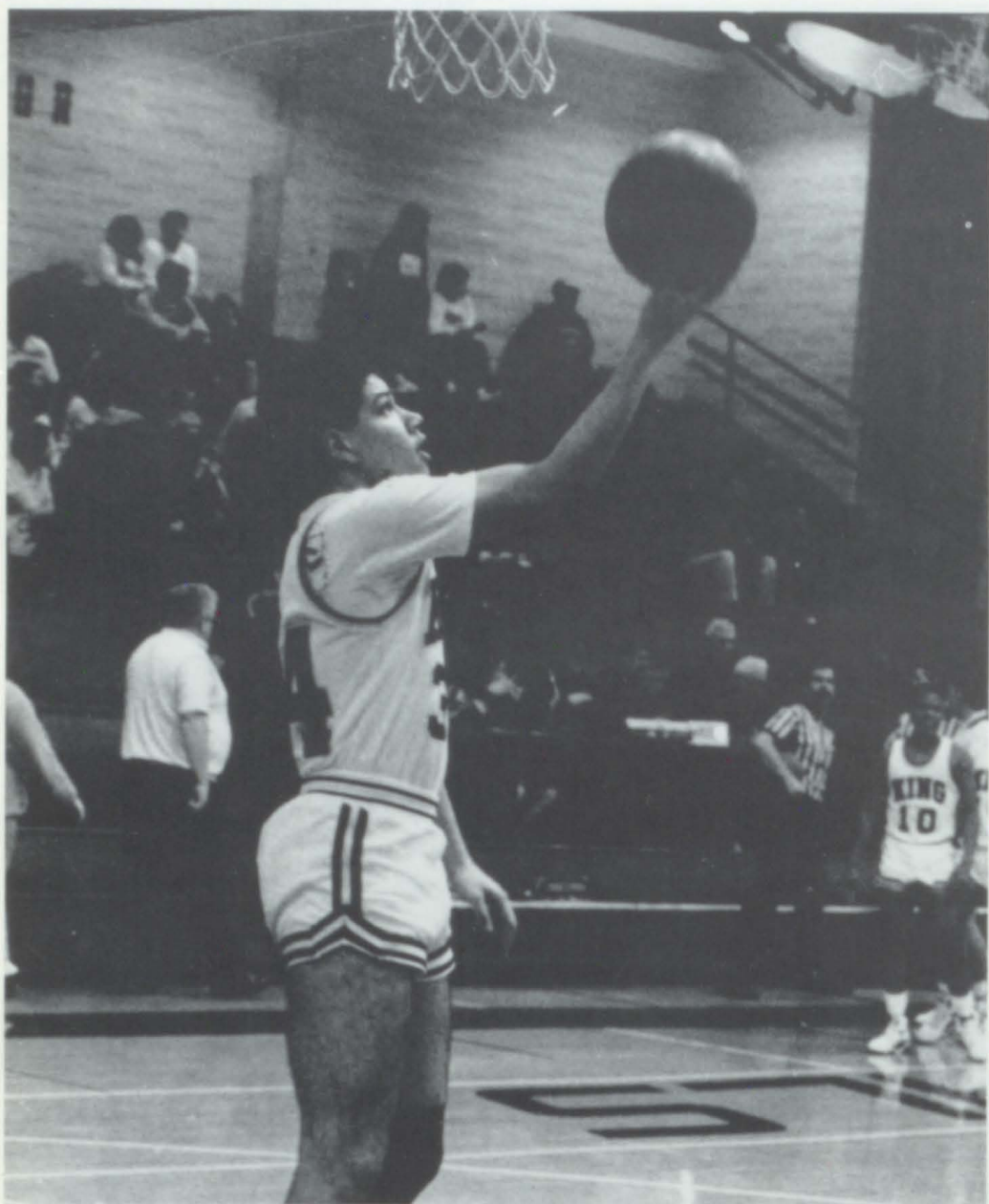

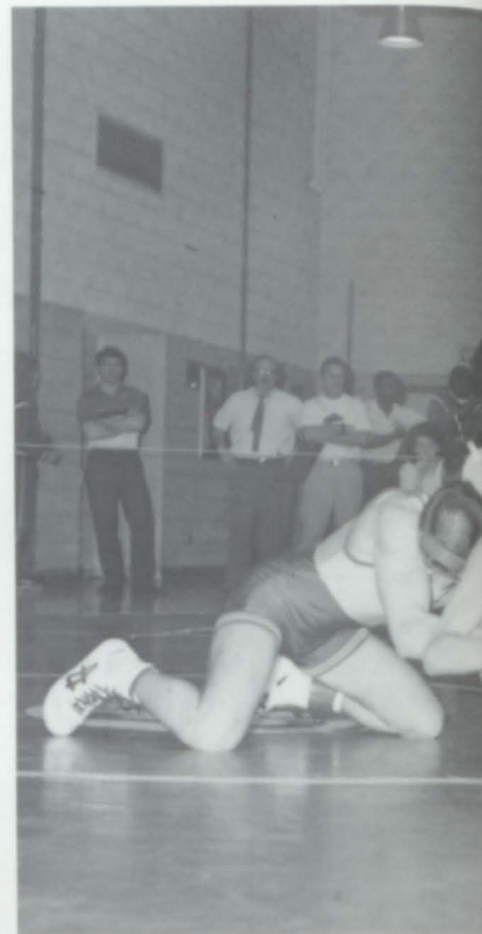
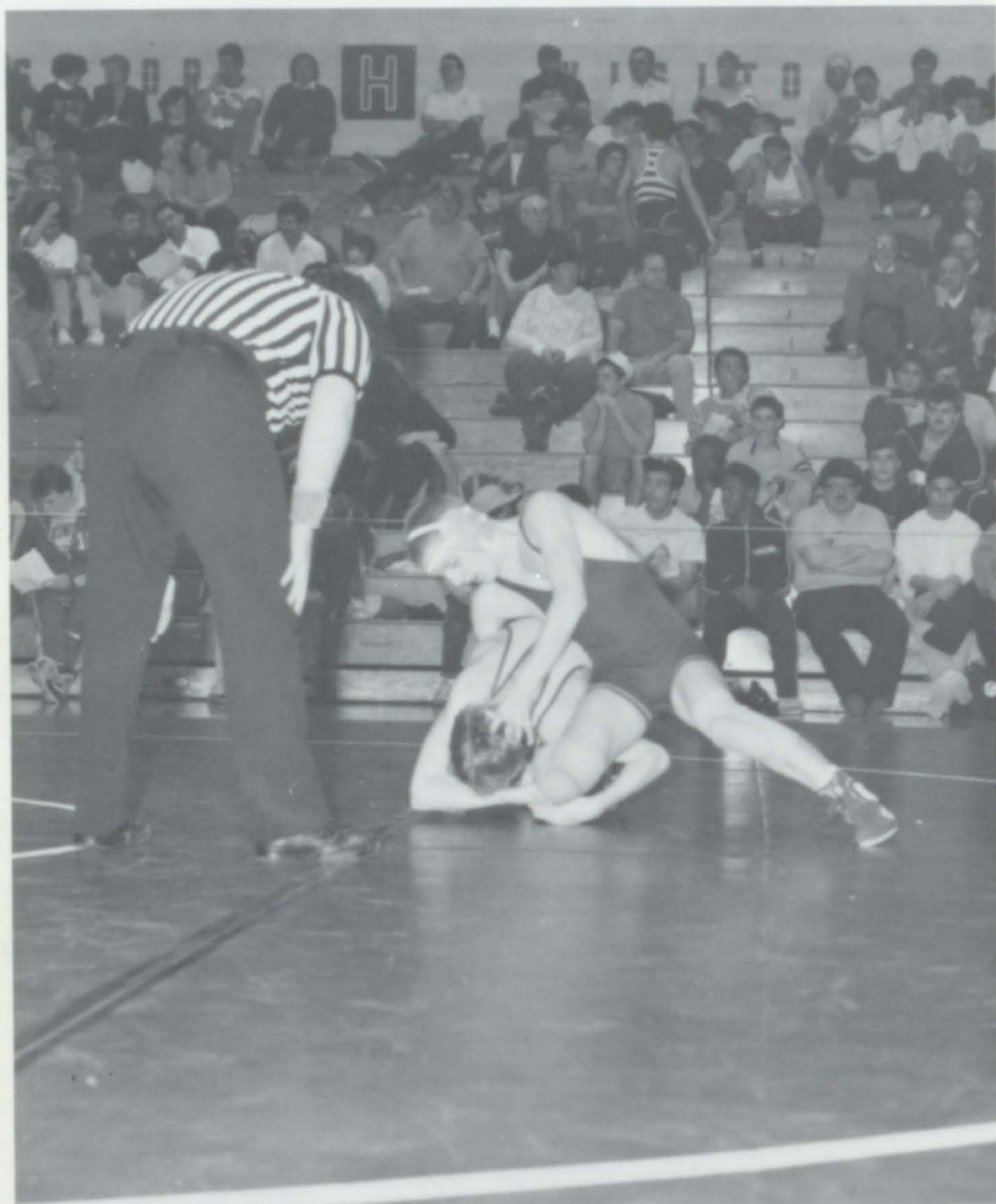
## Pugh a two-time qualifier

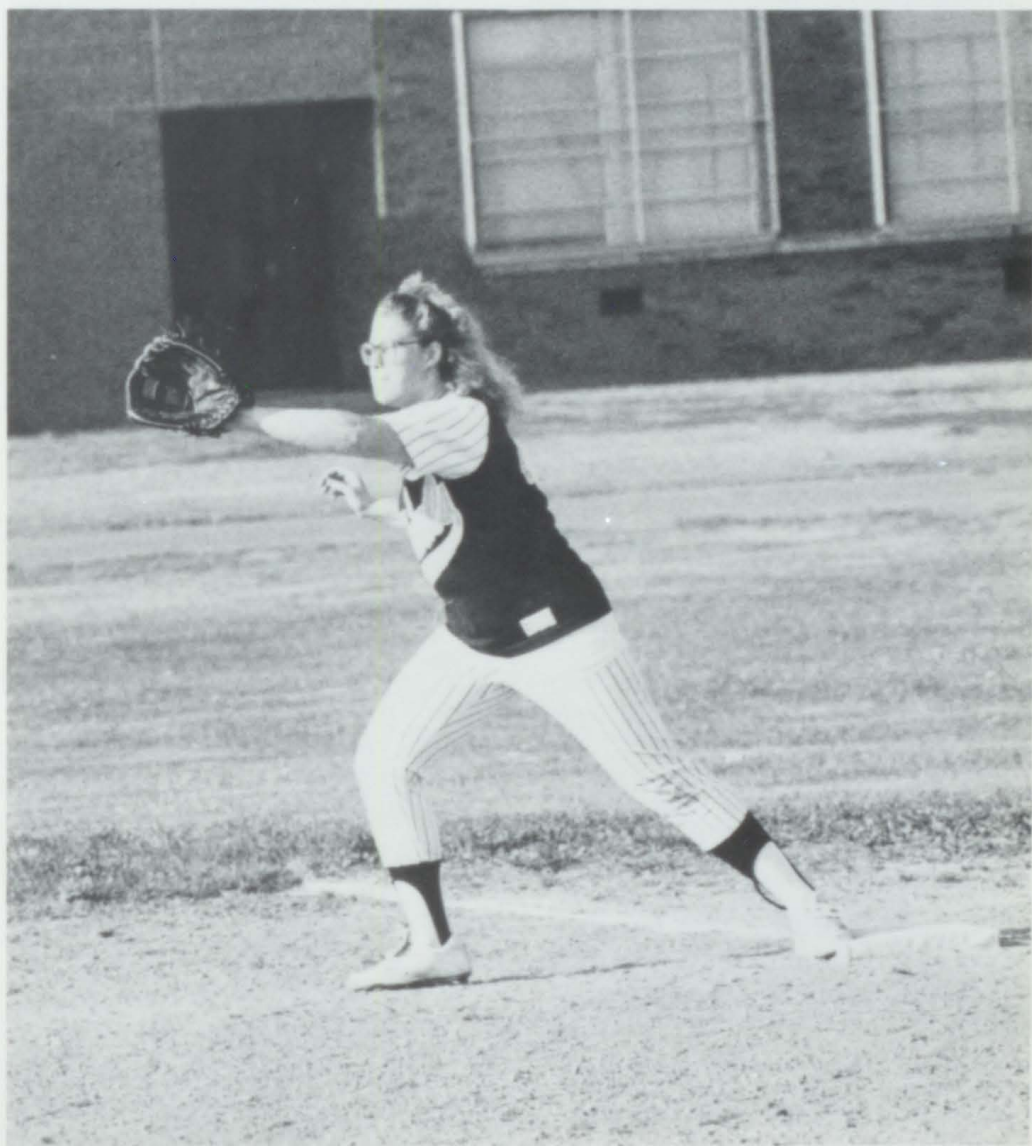

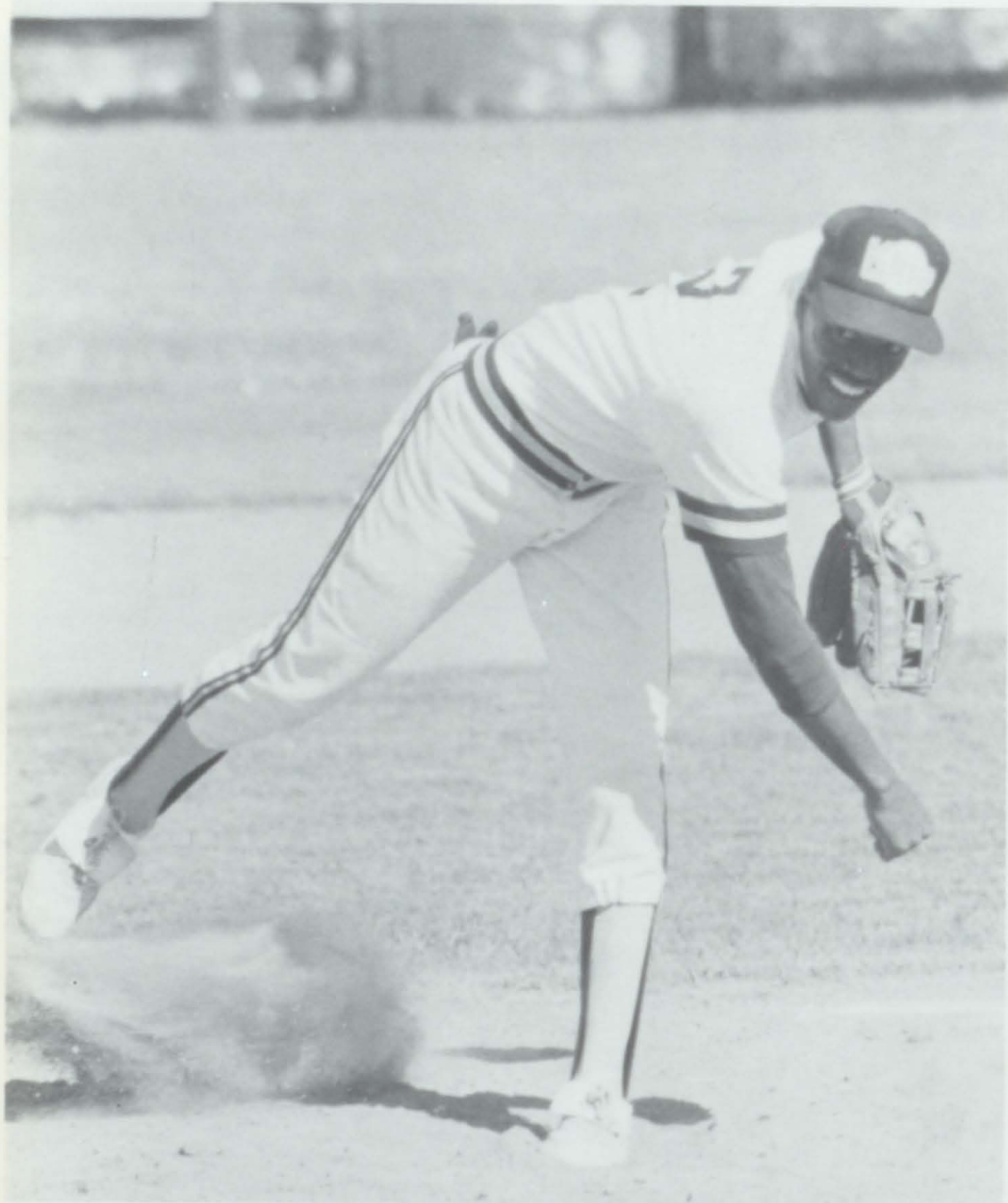
