Season Ends with “The Tussle”

Dartmouth and Brown square off for the 100th time on the gridiron in this contest, named “The Tussle” by veteran Big Green scribe Bruce Wood in honor of the Hall of Fame coach, Tuss McLaughry, that coached at both schools. But Dartmouth has bigger concerns — doing all it can to earn a share of the Ivy League title. A Dartmouth victory, coupled with a Yale win over Harvard, would land the Green in a three-way tie atop the standings with those two, just the third time the Ivy champion would have two losses.

Last week, Dartmouth kept its championship hopes alive by taking care of Cornell in the final home game of the season, 30-14. Quarterback **Nick Howard** topped 100 yards on the ground for the first time this season and sixth time in his career while carrying the ball over the goal line three times, breaking the 96-year-old program record for rushing touchdowns in a career (34).

The Big Green jumped out to a 14-0 lead on two of those Howard TD runs. After Cornell cut its deficit in half, **Jackson Proctor** connected on a 37-yard touchdown toss to tight end **Jace Henry** with less than a minute before the intermission. Again the Big Red closed to within seven, but a 42-yard field goal by **Owen Zalc** and Howard’s final scoring scamper put the game out of reach.

Proctor, whose only other career start came last year at Cornell, finished the game 13-of-19 for 149 yards and one touchdown. **Paxton Scott**, fourth in the Ivy League in receptions and yardage, hauled in five tosses for 78 yards while Henry had a career-high 64 yards on a mere two grabs.

The running game isn’t reliant on Howard whether he is or is not behind center. **Q Jones** averages close to 50 yards per game with a pair of touchdowns to his credit, and **Tevita Moimoi** picks up close to five yards per carry.

The Big Green had a balanced attack with 196 yards on the ground and 176 more through the air while holding Cornell to 266 total yards. **Leonard St. Gourdin** led Dartmouth with a team-high six stops, plus forced and recovered a key fumble at the Dartmouth 5 in the first half. DE **Charles Looes** provided the Green’s lone sack, boosting his league-leading total to 6.5 on the season.

The defense as a whole has been quite good, ranking in the top 25 nationally in total defense (13th), rush defense (14th) and scoring (21st) to name a few statistical categories. That will come in handy against a Bears offense that averages over 400 yards a game, 29th in the FCS.

Special teams continued to play a big role for Dartmouth with Zalc leading the country in field goals per game (1.78) while breaking the program record with his 16th field goal of the season in

the win over Cornell. Punter **Davis Golick** also had a big game with a career high in punting average (46.3 yards) and the longest punt of his career (53). And **Sean Williams** remains one of the top return men across the FCS, averaging 25 yards per kickoff return (17th) and over 11 yards per punt return (18th).

Scouting the Bears

Picked to finish last in the preseason polls, Brown has proven itself as an up-and-coming team for the future and could finish as high as second with a win over the Big Green. The Bears' three wins in Ivy play have come at the expense of Princeton, Penn and Columbia.

As noted previously, the Brown offense is quite stout, and Jake Willcox is second among FCS quarterbacks with 302.9 passing yards per game while completing 63.2 percent of his passes and throwing 17 touchdowns against eight interceptions. He can maneuver in the backfield as well with 129 rushing yards to his credit.

Willcox has three receivers with more than 400 yards to their name, led by Wes Rockett who has a league-best 62 catches for 725 yards and three scores, putting him in the top 20 nationally on a per-game basis. The Dartmouth defense will also have to contend with Graham Walker (40 catches, 448 yards, 5 TDs) and Mark Mahoney (37-408, 3 TDs), not to mention deep threat Solomon Miller (15.9 yards on his 19 receptions).

The ground game has been a bit sluggish with under 100 yards per game and just 3.1 yards per carry. Stockton Owen has been the primary back with 102 carries for 326 yards and seven TDs. Ian Franzoni spells Owen and has gained 193 yards and scored once.

The Brown defense has improved from a year ago, surrendering 28 points a game (seven fewer than in 2022) and just under 400 yards per game (37 fewer). LB Ethan Royer is the leading tackler with 54, 3.5 going for a loss with a sack and an interception. The top pass rusher is Terrence Lane II with 3.5 sacks and 6.5 TFL, and CB Isaiah Reed leads the Ivy League with four pickoffs.

Christopher Maron handles the place-kicking duties and is 8-of-10 on field goals with a long of 47. Austin Alley averages 38.8 yards per punt with a 56-yard boot on his resume. Rockett is the top punt returner in the league as well (12.5-yard avg.)

Head coach James Perry (Brown '00) is 12-27 in his fourth season at the helm of the Bears. He began his coaching career at Dartmouth before stops at Williams, Maryland, Brown and Princeton led to his first head coaching gig at Bryant (2017-18). As a player, Perry earned the Bushnell Cup by quarterbacking the Bears to an Ivy title in 1999 and posted a 23-7 record as a starter.

Last Year Against the Bears ...

Dartmouth took control in the first half, building up a 20-0 lead, then did not allow any points until the final two minutes of the game in a 30-7 victory. The Big Green piled up nearly 300 yards on the ground and had the ball for almost 40 minutes in the dominating performance. Noah Roper led everyone with 91 rushing yards and a TD while QB **Jackson Proctor** had 70 on a mere four carries and fellow QB **Nick Howard** had 56 more and scored twice. And the defense completely shut down a Bears offense that had put up 38 points a game entering the finale as **Braden Mullen** had two of the team's three sacks, and **Sean Williams** and Robert Crockett III each picked off a pass.

So You're Sayin' There's a Chance

And a decent one at that. Thanks to its 30-14 win last week over Cornell, Dartmouth is still in the hunt to earn a share of the Ivy League title. A Big Green win over Brown and a Yale triumph over Harvard in New Haven would leave Dartmouth, the Crimson and the Bulldogs tied atop the standings at 5-2. There have only been two instances of an Ancient Eight champion having two losses, and wouldn't you know the Big Green was in on the action both times (1963 and 1982).

Howard Breaks 96-Year-Old Record

Nick Howard demonstrated just how difficult a runner he can be to bring down against Cornell, posting his first 100-yard game of the season (108) and sixth of his career while scoring three touchdowns in the 30-14 victory. Those three scores boosted his career total of rushing TDs to 34, breaking the all-time Dartmouth record that had been set by Myles Lane '28. Yes, Class of 1928, and he finished playing 96 years ago. It was his 14th multi-touchdown game as well, tying the program record held by Lane. Howard also climbed four spots on the Big Green all-time rushing leaders from eighth to fourth with 1,835 yards to his name, and he is tied for third in scoring with 204 points.

The Wizard of O.Z.

First-year place kicker **Owen Zalc** continues to be a weapon for Dartmouth. The four-time Ivy League weekly award winner (rookie three times, special teams once) connected on a 42-yard field goal in the 30-14 win over Cornell. It was his 16th three-pointer of the season, breaking a 33-year-old record held by Dennis Durkin '93, and his 13th in Ivy League games only, tying the conference record. He is just the third Big Green player to earn four weekly honors in one season from the league office, joining Craig Morton '89 (four-time Rookie of the Week) in 1986 and Jay Fielder '94 (four-time Offensive Player in 1992). Three times this season he has provided three field goals in a game, and in two of those contests he provided the winning kick either in overtime (Penn) or the final two minutes of regulation (Princeton). In addition, Durkin is the only other Big Green kicker with at least three field goals in three games in one season. On top of all that, Zalc leads the FCS in field goals made per game (1.78).

BROADCASTS

Dartmouth fans who are unable to come to Hanover or the various venues on the road can catch every Big Green football game either on television or streamed over the internet on various services, including eight contests on ESPN+ (four of which will also air on NESN), one on ESPNU and one on FloSports. For the 12th straight season, Dartmouth is teaming up with Northeast Sports Network (NSN) to produce the ESPN+ games and provide an enhanced viewing experience in HD.



For those who are unable to watch the ESPN+ stream of the game live, an archived broadcast will be available for 30 days on ESPN+.

Matt Corsetti, who first called a Big Green football game in 2018, will serve as the play-by-play broadcaster for the four home ESPN+ broadcasts. He will be joined by Steve Goldberg in his second season with the team.

Audio broadcasts of every game will be available through the DartmouthSports.com website. Calling the action is Brett Franklin, now in his third season calling the games on the Dartmouth Sports Network. A local broadcaster, Franklin also serves as the voice of Dartmouth softball and also lends his vocal cords to basketball and hockey contests. Providing analysis for a 23rd consecutive year is Wayne Young '72, who will team up with Franklin at Memorial Field. A two-sport athlete at Dartmouth, Young was a linebacker on three Ivy League championship Big Green squads from 1969-71 that went 25-2, earning first-team All-Ivy honors as a senior captain. He is also a member of Wearers of the Green. For the games outside of Hanover, Corsetti will join Franklin in the booth.

Cornell Brings It Out in Dartmouth

s some of his best work against Cornell. The senior hauled in a 37-yard touchdown pass in the 30-14 victory over the Big Red, his second career receiving TD. His other one also just happened to come against Cornell last year in Ithaca.

On the flip side, Dartmouth missed a PAT for the first time this year versus the Big Red. This was the third consecutive year the Big Green failed to convert a PAT against Cornell, and over their last 27 games, their only other failed PAT was blocked by Harvard last season.

One last note for you: Of Nick Howard's 34 career touchdowns, seven have come against the team that recruited him to play linebacker. That's right, Cornell. Two of his three games with three or more trips into the end zone have come against the Big Red, the other a career-high four TD game back in 2021.

Great Scott!

Senior WR **Paxton Scott** has been the Big Green's most effective offensive weapon this year, twice catching 10 passes and topping 150 yards in a game and leading the team in receptions in six of the nine games thus far. He enters the final game of the season fourth in the league in receiving yards (609) and fifth in receptions (47), not to mention 11th all-time at Dartmouth in both catches (127) and yardage (1,505). To move up into the top 10, he would need four more hauls and 127 more yards against the Bears.

Proctor Passes Another Exam

One week after coming off the bench to guide a second-half comeback against Princeton, QB **Jackson Proctor** got his first starting nod of the season and second of his career — both against Cornell. The junior completed 13-of-19 passes for 149 yards and a TD in leading the Big Green to a 30-14 victory. For the season, Proctor has completed 67-of-88 throws (76.1 percent) for 676 yards and three scores. No Dartmouth QB has completed more than six passes at a rate higher than 75 percent in any season, and the program record is 70.7 percent (169-of-239) set by Derek Kyler '21 in 2021 (Proctor would need to complete 33 passes against Brown to qualify for that mark).

Golick Goes Long

Junior punter **Davis Golick** posted career-high numbers in the 30-14 win over Cornell, blasting four punts for a career-high average of 46.5 yards. Among those four boots was a 53-yard bomb without a return, the longest of his career. Twice he pinned the Big Red inside their own 20 as well.

Top-20 Defense

The Dartmouth defense has been terrific this season, ranking 13th among FCS schools in yards allowed per game (301.4) and 14th in rushing yards allowed (106.3). The Big Green are also tough on third and fourth down, allowing opponents to convert just 33.3 percent of their third downs (tied for 19th in the nation) and 31.6 percent of their fourth-down situations (sixth).

Looes Cuts Loose

Fifth-year DL **Charles Looes** had a game he will never forget in helping Dartmouth defeat Princeton on Nov. 3. Not only did he tie a Big Green record with four sacks, he also forced two fumbles and recovered one of them. In addition, he had a key block of a field goal attempt in the fourth quarter to keep the Dartmouth deficit at one point and set up the game-winning field goal with 1:29 to play. Looes was named the Gold Helmet Award winner as the top Division I player in New England that week as well as the Ivy League Defensive Player of the Week, not to mention receiving honorable mention for the Stats Perform FCS National Defensive Player of the Week. Add in his sack the following week against Cornell and he leads the Ivy League with 6.5 sacks this season.

Williams' Will

If you felt like safety **Sean Williams** was everywhere on the field in the 23-21 win over Princeton on Nov. 3, there's a good reason for that. The

sophomore opened the game by returning the kickoff a season-long 38 yards, and on the Tigers' first play from scrimmage, he intercepted a pass and returned it 26 yards for a touchdown, the first pick-six for a Big Green player since Isaiah Johnson '22 had a 73-yard score against Princeton two years ago. Williams also had three punt returns that gained 30 total yards, plus a 69-yard blocked field goal return for a touchdown that was called back due to a penalty.

Win on the Rare Side

The 23-21 victory over Princeton wasn't half-baked, but it was pretty rare in that Dartmouth only accumulated 197 yards of offense. This was just the ninth win (and first in 18 years) for the Big Green when being held to fewer than 200 yards since the 1969 season. They lost the other 42 such games, giving them a winning percentage of .176. That last win? It came on Sept. 17, 2005 against Colgate, 26-21.

ROBERT L. BLACKMAN HEAD COACH



Sammy McCorkle, who was on Buddy Teevens' staff since the head coach's return to Hanover in 2005, was promoted from interim head coach to the Robert L. Blackman Head Coach on Oct. 19. He was originally named acting coach on

April 4 following Teevens' bicycle accident in March and subsequent passing on Sept. 19.

The 1996 graduate and three-time letter winner at the University of Florida is in his 19th year on the staff and helped guide the Big Green to the program's 20th Ivy League championship in 2021. From 2013-19, the Big Green were first or second in passes defended in the league, and his secondary was instrumental to the team's top-12 ranking in passing efficiency defense.

His special teams have excelled as well, ranking among the top 25 nationally in each of the four seasons in punt returns between 2017-21, including a pair of top-10 rankings.

McCorkle has coached eight players who have earned All-Ivy League First Team honors a total of 12 times, including two-time All-American CB Isiah Swann. No fewer than 25 of his defensive backs have received All-Ivy honors a combined 40 times, most recently safety Quentin Arello '22 (second team) in 2022.

The Dartmouth defense was 13th nationally in scoring defense in 2022 after placing among the top three in the previous three seasons, and the 2021 squad ranked fourth in fewest passing yards. And in the previous campaign of 2019, McCorkle's players were quite opportunistic during the season with four pick-sixes among the five defensive scores, fourth among FCS programs.

In 2018, the defense ranked second nationally in fewest points allowed and red zone defense, and fourth in total defense as Dartmouth

finished the season ranked 15th in the coaches' poll. Three years prior, the squad led the nation in those first two categories and was also fourth in total defense as the Big Green won a share of its first conference crown in 19 years. Cornerback Vernon Harris '16 earned a spot on the All-Ivy First Team in 2014 and '15, and two-time co-captain Garrett Waggoner garnered first-team honors as a safety in both 2012 and '13. McCorkle also mentored one of the finest cornerbacks and return men in Dartmouth history in Shawn Abuhoff '12, who earned first-team All-Ivy honors at both positions in 2010 and 2011.

McCorkle previously coached at UT Martin, working with the secondary in 2000 before serving as the defensive coordinator (2001-02). From 1997-99, McCorkle was a graduate assistant at his alma mater, assisting the secondary and special teams coaches while also scouting opponents.

During the 1996-97 academic year, McCorkle taught PE while coaching the defensive backs and linebackers, and coordinating special teams at Spanish River High School in Boca Raton, Fla.

McCorkle was a standout defensive back on four SEC championship teams at Florida, competing in four bowl games (Gator, Sugar twice and Fiesta) and a national title game. McCorkle graduated with Florida's single-season and career records for blocked punts. He twice was named Florida's special teams player of the year.

He and his wife, Vicki, have three daughters, Madison, Allie and Campbell.

Sack Masters

One thing Dartmouth understands is getting to the quarterback and protecting its own. Only two teams in the FCS (Drake, 3, and The Citadel, 4) have surrendered fewer sacks than the Big Green (5), and they also are second in the Ivy League in defensive sacks (21). **Charles Looes** leads the way with 6.5, one ahead of teammate **Braden Mullen**.

You Shall Not Pass

Gandalf would be proud of the Dartmouth defense on Oct. 28, when it limited Harvard to a paltry 36 passing yards in the 17-9 Big Green defeat. Those were the fewest yards through the air for an opponent in 36 years (Penn failed to complete a single pass in the matchup in 1987), and over the last 54 years, Dartmouth has held the opposition to 35 or fewer just 10 other times. On top of that, the Crimson did not record a single first down on a pass play, marking just the second time that has happened since 1969 (again, Penn in 1987). But those games did not guarantee a victory as the Big Green are now 4-7 when limiting an opponent to fewer than 40 passing yards.

Whiteout

Actually, Whiteback. Linebacker **Marques White** had missed every game this season and all but two since the start of the 2022 campaign after earning second-team All-Ivy honors in 2021. He returned to the field with a vengeance at Harvard, recording three sacks among his five tackles, even in a limited role. And by limited, I mean he was on the field for just 12 snaps.

Safety Dance

Sophomore safety **Sean Williams** made his presence known in the secondary in the 17-9 loss at Harvard, picking off two passes in the first half of play. He is the first Big Green player in four years with two interceptions in a game, last achieved by Jack Traynor '19 against Columbia in 2019.

Homecoming Heaven

Not much tops a win on homecoming, and Dartmouth achieved that with a 20-9 victory over Columbia on Oct. 21. The Big Green have won five of their last six homecoming contests and 10 of the last 14; all four losses have come against Harvard. Dartmouth could not return the favor in Cambridge this year, however, playing in front of 22,515 fans, the largest crowd for a Big Green game anywhere in 16 years.

Blocked Punt Touchdown Déjà Vu

One play turned the tide against Columbia in the 20-9 victory on Oct. 21, and that was a blocked punt and recover in the end zone by **Patrick Campbell**. It was the team's third blocked punt this season; only four FCS teams have more. It was also the second straight season in which Dartmouth blocked a punt against the Lions and recovered it for a touchdown. Last year, Robert Crockett III rejected the kick and **Tevita Moimoi** scooped it up in the end zone for the score.

Who Needs Passes?

Dartmouth demonstrated that a team doesn't need to rely on passing the ball much to win a game. The Big Green threw for only 61 yards on 7-of-15 completions in the contest in its 20-9 defeat of Columbia on Oct. 21. Over the past 25 years, Dartmouth has had just six games in which it threw for fewer than 65 yards and has gone 4-2 in those contests. And since 1969, the Green are 25-8-1 when passing for no more than 65 yards.

McCorkle Promoted

On Oct. 19, Dartmouth Director of Athletics and Recreation Mike Harrity announced that **Sammy McCorkle** has been promoted from his position as interim head coach to the Robert L. Blackman Head Football Coach. McCorkle is in his 19th year on the staff and was the associate head coach for the past nine years under Buddy Teevens '79, who passed away last month following injuries suffered in a bicycle accident in March.

Mid-Season All-American

The Phil Steele football organization announced its FCS Mid-Season All-Americans on Oct. 20, and long snapper **Josh Greene** was listed on the third team. The fifth-year senior was one of nine Ivy Leaguers to make one of the four teams. Greene has been the team's long snapper for the last three seasons and has been incredibly consistent in his accuracy while also demonstrating good speed in being one of the first to get downfield on the punt coverage team on a regular basis.

Overtime Giveth and Taketh Away

On Sept. 30, Dartmouth earned a hard-fought road win at Penn in overtime when **Owen Zalc** booted a 37-yard field goal to end the 23-20 game. Fast forward two weeks later, and after rallying from a 14-point, fourth-quarter deficit, the Big Green saw Colgate strike first in the overtime period with a field goal. That opened the door for a victory, but when Dartmouth stalled out at the 13, it was merely trying to tie the score. Zalc's 29-yard attempt, however, was blocked, abruptly ending the game, leaving the Green 7-9 all-time in overtime contests.

Colgate is Kryptonite

Yes, in this analogy, Dartmouth football is Superman, just go with it. There isn't another team in college football that has had as much success against the Big Green than the Raiders. With the 27-24 overtime decision going Colgate's way on Oct. 14, it is now 19-7-1 (.722) all-time against Dartmouth. That is by far the best winning percentage of any opponent that has faced the Big Green at least 10 times. Next on that list? Harvard, which is 73-48-5 (.599).

Unusual Loss

Dartmouth piled up more than 500 yards of offense at Colgate on Oct. 14, just the 34th time it has done so since the start of the 1969 campaign (54 seasons). But with the 27-24 defeat, the Big Green dropped to 28-6 (.824) in those

games, though three of the six losses (including this one) did come in overtime contests.

Speaking of Yards ...

Due to a 14-point halftime deficit, the Big Green took to the air quite often at Colgate and finished with 372 passing yards, their most since the final game of the 2019 campaign. **Jackson Proctor** posted a career-high 278 of those yards, completing 21-of-25 throws, the sixth-best percentage (84.0, minimum 15 completions) in Dartmouth history (though only the second best of the season as **Dylan Cadwallader** completed 84.2 percent — 16-of-19 — against Lehigh). Oddly enough, the Green did not have a touchdown through the air, just the third time in 48 300-yard passing games that has happened. And all those passing yards are not necessarily a good barometer for winning — Dartmouth is 23-24-1 when topping 300 yards.

Up in the Ayers

At Colgate, linebacker **Macklin Ayers** did his usual thing, piling up tackles with a season-high 11 on his ledger. But the senior also did something he had not done in college before — intercept a pass. He has teammate **Jordan Washington** to thank for it as the cornerback dove to deflect a pass straight up in the air, and Ayers was there to collect the prize.

Pounding the Ground

Running for at least 200 yards in a game is usually a big part of the recipe for success. Since the start of the 1969 season, Dartmouth

has amassed 200 rushing yards 156 times, going 139-16-1 in those contests. Unfortunately, one of those 16 losses came on Oct. 7 against Yale, against whom the Big Green piled up 221 yards on the ground, including 87 by co-captain **Nick Howard** and a career-high 82 by another co-captain, **Tevita Moimoi**.

Pounding Into the Ground

On the flip side, the Dartmouth defense has severely limited the running game of its opponents, holding Lehigh, Penn and Yale to a combined total of 99 yards. The last time the Big Green kept an opponent from running for even 100 yards in three consecutive games was a five-game stretch spanning the 2017-18 seasons. But the last time opponents failed to combine for 100 yards over three straight games was ... well, certainly not since 1969 when my data starts. None of the three recent opponents amassed more than 52 yards, and after allowing only 45 rushing yards in a 20-9 win over Columbia, Dartmouth is 55-2 when limiting an opponent to no more than 55.

Coach BT

Dartmouth lost its winningest coach in program history with the passing of **Buddy Teevens** '79 on Sept. 19 from injuries he suffered in a bicycle accident in March. The Robert L. Blackman Head Football Coach guided the team for 22 seasons over two stints, including the last 17 campaigns, winning five Ivy League titles along the way. He was named the New England Coach of the Year three times (1990, 2015, 2019) and the Ivy League Coach of the Year twice (2015, '19) while racking up 117 victories, 83 in conference play.

Also on the Big Green's collective minds is **Joshua Balara** '24, an offensive lineman who passed away last spring following a battle with a lengthy illness. While he never got a chance to play in a game for Dartmouth before his death, his commitment and unselfish dedication to helping the team improve made him a model teammate, and his affable nature and sense of humor made him a friend to all. Both will be honored by the team throughout the season with stickers featuring their initials on the Dartmouth helmets.

Fumblerama

Dartmouth recovered three fumbles in the 23-20 overtime win at Penn on Sept. 30, its first game with at least three recoveries in five years. DL **Derrell Porter** forced the first one with S **Sean Williams** corralling it, LB **Braden Mullen** (who also had two sacks) pounced on an unforced fumble that set up a Big Green TD, and DL **Joe Onuwabagbe** forced and recovered the third one on his first career sack. Coming up with that many fumble recoveries is also a pretty good barometer of success. The Big Green are 31-12-1 (.716) when scooping up at least three fumbles in a game going back to 1972.

McCorkle's First Win

Interim head coach **Sammy McCorkle** earned his first victory guiding the Big Green with the 34-17 triumph over Lehigh on Sept. 23. It was also the ninth consecutive win in a Big Green home

opener, a streak that began with a 35-25 win over Central Connecticut State in 2014.

First Win Over Lehigh in 27 Years

True, the two teams hadn't played since 1999, but Dartmouth's win over the visiting Mountain Hawks was the first in the series for the Big Green since they topped Lehigh, 21-14, during the 10-0 perfect season of 1996. Dartmouth is now 3-5 in the series that began in 1950.

Opening Day Win Streak Snapped

Dartmouth entered the 2023 season with the longest active win streak on opening day, emerging victorious in each of the season openers of the previous 12 campaigns. Of those 12 victories, only two were decided by single digits — 30-23 over Butler in 2013 and 22-21 over this year's opening opponent, New Hampshire. But 13 was not lucky for the Big Green as the 11th-ranked Wildcats handed Dartmouth a 24-7 defeat.

Co-Captains

Dartmouth is employing four captains for just the fifth time in program history. Two of those captains — S **Quinten Arello** and QB **Nick Howard**, both fifth-year players — are the first teammates to serve together in that capacity a second time. Joining those veterans on the leadership team are senior LB **Macklin Ayers** and senior RB **Tevita Moimoi**.

732 Wins All-Time

Back in 2018, Dartmouth won its 700th game, becoming just the sixth FCS teams to reach the milestone. That win came two games after playing its 1,200th contest as well. Now after 140-plus seasons and 1,248 games, the Big Green have a record of 732-470-46, a winning percentage of .605. Only 19 FCS teams can boast a win percentage of .600 or better (minimum 10 seasons). And only five teams have more victories.

Greene on Good Works Team

Allstate and the America Football Coaches Association (AFCA) announced their annual Good Works Team to recognize 22 football student-

athletes for their community service on Sept. 12, and fifth-year long snapper **Josh Greene** was among those selected for the prestigious team. Among his charitable works is founding Off the Bench Foundation, an organization that has collected and donated nearly \$10,000 worth of sporting goods to the Boys & Girls Club in West Palm Beach since 2012.

A Decade-Plus of Success

Dartmouth football returned to prominence throughout the 2010s decade, recording a record of 70-30 (.700) over the 10 years. Only eight teams enjoyed a higher winning percentage in that span. And with a third consecutive 9-1 season in 2021, the Big Green enjoyed more victories over a span of three seasons (27), four (35), five (39), six (48) and seven (56) than at any point in their history. Dartmouth has also added three Ivy League titles since 2015 to boost its conference-record total to 20 crowns since the league first officially formed for the 1956 season.

Still All-Time Ivy Champs

Since the Ivy League began play in 1956, no other school in the conference has won more football titles than Dartmouth with 20. The last time an Ancient Eight squad had more crowns than the Big Green was in 1961 when Yale had a grand total of two. The next season, Dartmouth equaled that amount and has never looked up at another team

GRANITE BOWL GOES TO NO. 11 NEW HAMPSHIRE IN 24-7 OPENING DAY DEFEAT

DURHAM, N.H. — With winds gusting up over 30 miles an hour, the 11th-ranked New Hampshire Wildcats pulled away late from visiting Dartmouth on Saturday evening, taking a 24-7 decision over the Big Green at Wildcat Stadium to retain the Granite Bowl trophy. Dylan Laube had 180 rushing yards and scored a pair of touchdowns — one on the ground and one through the air — to lead UNH (2-1) to a victory in its home opener, while Paxton Scott had a career-high 153 receiving yards on nine grabs to lead Dartmouth (0-1) in its season opener.

“We played hard and fast, but we had some penalties and mistakes that put us in tough situations at times,” said interim head coach Sammy McCorkle after his first game at the helm of the Big Green. “We had our chances; we have the skills and the toughness to compete with any team, but we have to correct those mistakes, particularly against a team as good as New Hampshire. But one game does not make a season.”

The Big Green offense struggled through most of the first three quarters and trailed by a 10-0 count before Scott gave the team the jolt it was looking for. Quarterback Dylan Cadwallader found him between a seam 15 yards down the left sideline, and Scott sprinted all the way to the 10 before being corralled for a 69-yard gain. Two plays later, Q Jones burrowed his way up the middle for a 4-yard touchdown run on the first play of the fourth quarter, suddenly bringing Dartmouth within three points.

A personal foul call after the touchdown, however, meant the Big Green had to kick off into the wind from their own 20. The squib kick was downed near midfield, and six plays later facing 3rd-and-4, Wildcat quarterback Max Brosmer — who was limited to a mere 67 passing yards while completing 11-of-23 throws — used Laube as a decoy on a keeper. He then was able to sprint 31 yards to the end zone, boosting the UNH lead back to 10 at 17-7 with 12:16 to play.

On Dartmouth’s ensuing possession, the Green also faced a crucial third-down situation at midfield. The snap one-hopped Cadwallader, and he was hit as he released his pass, allowing Max Oxendine to pluck the ball from the air and return the interception 43 yards down to the Dartmouth 27. Laube needed five rushes to cover those 27 yards, the last on a 4th-and-1 at the 2 for his second score of the night and a 24-7 advantage with 10:43 remaining.

Twice the Big Green drove into Wildcat territory in the final minutes, but turned the ball over on downs both times before UNH ran out the final 1:17 off the clock to close out its victory.

Both teams had scoring opportunities in the opening quarter but came away empty. On their

initial drive, the Big Green got as far as the UNH 22 before lining up for a 44-yard field goal. The Wildcats blasted through the line, however, allowing Randall Harris to block the kick, and Oxendine scooped the ball up. Only a tackle by Cadwallader (the holder on the attempt) at the Wildcat 47 kept Oxendine from taking the loose ball all the way to the end zone.

New Hampshire responded by marching down to the 2-yard line, but a dropped pass in the end zone on third down followed by a terrific pass breakup by cornerback Leonard St. Gourdin kept the game scoreless.

Once the field flipped to start the second quarter and the Wildcats had the wind at their back, they were able to put the first points of the game on the scoreboard on a 4-yard pass to Laube, his first of six catches for 31 yards on the evening. New Hampshire added a 33-yard field goal in the final minute before halftime to take a 10-point lead into the locker room.

Cadwallader finished the night 16-of-30 through the air for 195 yards, 153 of those going to Scott on a career-best 10 receptions. Scott’s total also pushed him past 1,000 yards for his career, becoming the 24th player in Dartmouth history to reach the milestone. The other half of the Big Green quarterback tandem, Nick Howard, ran for 62 yards on 10 carries while Jones amassed 55 yards on 14 rushes.

Linebackers Braden Mullen and Macklin Ayers led the Dartmouth defense with 10 and nine tackles, respectively, and each recorded a sack while the latter broke up a pair of passes as well. Joe Eichman led the Wildcats with eight tackles, 1.5 going for a loss while helping out on the lone sack.

When asked about how the team will consider this game going forward, safety and co-captain Quinten Arello said, “Wipe it. Move on from it. We’ll study the film, note our mistakes and how to correct them, then wipe it. We have nine more games this season, and we expect to surprise some people. We know what we are capable of, we just need to execute better.”

Notes: The loss snapped Dartmouth’s 12-game winning streak in season openers, which was the longest among FCS schools entering the season ... DARTMOUTH WINS HOME OPENER OVER LEHIGH WITH HEAVY HEARTS, 34-17

HANOVER, N.H. — With the passing of Buddy Teevens, the Robert L. Blackman Head Football Coach at Dartmouth, just four days past, the Big Green were able to control the game against Lehigh, running 30 more plays than the visitor as the Big Green (1-1) finished off their home opener with a 34-17 victory over the Mountain Hawks (1-3). The win was the first for interim head coach Sammy McCorkle, who took over leading the team after Teevens' bicycle accident back in March.

"I'm just so proud of the players," McCorkle said during a postgame press conference. "They did a phenomenal job. Everything we've asked them to do, they've done it. They are a fun group to coach, and I enjoy celebrating a win with our players and our coaches. Everyone has put in a lot of time and effort, and we know we have to continue to do that going forward."

Dylan Cadwallader completed 16-of-19 passes, one of which was a 7-yard fade into the end zone to give Dartmouth the lead just before halftime as Dartmouth racked up more than twice as many yards (346-169).

The ground game was running full force for the Big Green as Q Jones just missed out on his second career 100-yard game, taking the ball 17 times for 99 yards including a 10-yard touchdown late in the third quarter that boosted the lead to 21 points. Nick Howard ran for 70 yards on 16 carries, two of which ended in the end zone for his 11-career game with at least two touchdown runs as Dartmouth finished the day with 219 rushing yards.

Cadwallader added 110 more yards and his scoring strike to the Big Green ledger through the air, and Howard added another 20 on 5-of-7 throws. Jones was the most frequent target with five grabs for a modest 21 yards, and Isaac Boston hauled in four more for a team-high 45 yards as nine different players caught at least one pass.

With the game tied at 10, Sean Williams returned a punt 17 yards (a warmup for a 35-yard return in the second half) to the Dartmouth 33 with 3:07 remaining until halftime. Cadwallader proceeded to guide the team methodically down the field in 11 plays, completing all six of his tosses along the way while Jones and Howard added runs of 11 and 12 yards, respectively. On first-and-goal from the 7, Cadwallader dropped a beautiful pass to Paxton Scott in stride in the back corner of the end zone with 35 seconds to spare for a 17-10 lead at the intermission.

Two plays proved to be difference makers in the third quarter, giving the ball to the Green deep in Lehigh territory. The second half began with five consecutive punts, but shortly after Williams' 35-yard return to midfield, Lehigh cornerback Donovan Lassiter intercepted a deep pass at its own five. That momentum shift lasted about as long as this sentence as cornerback Leonard St. Gourdin punched the ball free from quarterback Brayten Silbor at the Mountain Hawk 16, where Big Green defensive end Ejike Adele covered it up. Five rushes later, Howard had his second 1-yard touchdown run of the game for a 24-10 advantage.

When Lehigh failed to record a first down on its next possession, fifth-year senior Sam Koscho

was there to block the punt. Though the Mountain Hawks recovered it and tried to advance the ball — even trying a lateral to get into open ground — Williams made the tackle a yard shy of the marker, allowing Dartmouth to take over at the Lehigh 32.

"We knew they were blocking down, and it was just a matter of hitting the line correctly to not waste an extra step to get to the punter," Koscho said. "Hats off to (special teams coach Joe) Castellitto for telling me where to be to get that punt block."

Jones quickly converted the field position into points for Dartmouth in the final minute of the third quarter, gobbling up 22 yards on the first play and the final 10 on the next for his first touchdown run of the season.

On the first play of the fourth quarter, nickel-back Tyson McCloud broke up a third-down pass, and linebacker Danny Cronin plucked the ball out of the air for his first career interception at the Mountain Hawk 36. Dartmouth expertly worked the clock, taking up nearly eight minutes to drive a mere 27 yards in 13 plays before settling for a 26-yard Owen Zalc field goal, essentially sealing the game with a 34-10 lead and just 6:55 to play.

Lehigh tacked on a late touchdown by recovering a muffed punt at the Big Green five and took advantage of a pass interference call in the end zone on third down before finally punching the ball in on a 2-yard run by Jack DiPietro.

There was also a Dartmouth miscue on the game's first drive that gave the Mountain Hawks a sudden 7-0 lead. The Big Green drove down inside the 10-yard line, but Howard got stood up at the line of scrimmage on a run and Dean Colton stripped the ball free. Logan Jones spotted the ball on the turf at the 8, scooped it up and ran untouched the length of the field for the touchdown.

That sudden setback didn't faze the Big Green offense, however, as the unit marched 75 yards in 12 plays on the very next drive to tie the score. A 29-yard strike from Cadwallader to Isaac Boston was the big play, and Howard bulled his way in from a yard out.

In the second quarter, the two teams traded field goals — a 35-yarder by Zalc, a 26-yard by Nick Garrido — before Cadwallader found Scott for the go-ahead score.

The Dartmouth defense was stifling, yielding just eight first downs, a paltry 52 rushing yards and just one third-down conversion in 10 opportunities. Williams and Leonard St. Gourdin supplied six tackles apiece to lead the team effort.

The two Lehigh quarterbacks, Silbor and Dante Perri, combined to complete 19-of-30 passes for 115 yards with one interception.

Notes: Dartmouth has won eight consecutive home openers ... the Big Green improved to 3-5 all-time against Lehigh, beating the Mountain Hawks for the first time in 27 years when Dartmouth was a perfect 10-0 ... this was the first meeting between the two teams since 1999 ... following the game, there was a gathering of remembrance for Teevens with the football team, Teevens family and numerous community members in attendance.

BIG GREEN OUTLAST PENN IN OVERTIME TO START IVY PLAY WITH A WIN

PHILADELPHIA, Pa. — A year ago, Penn came to Hanover, kicked a field goal as time expired in regulation and defeated Dartmouth in double overtime. The Big Green did not let history repeat itself after the Quakers booted a game-tying, 51-yard field goal in the final minute at Franklin Field this afternoon, thanks to first-year Owen Zalc and his 37-yard field goal in overtime that lifted Dartmouth (2-1, 1-0 Ivy) to a 23-20 victory to start Ivy League play.

Penn (2-1, 0-1 Ivy) got the ball to start overtime, and was forced to settle for a 42-yard field goal attempt after throwing three incomplete passes. But Graham Gottlieb's kick failed to find its target, giving the Green a chance to win the game with just a field goal. Dartmouth took no chances in making a mistake in a game that featured four fumbles and two blocked kicks with quarterback Nick Howard running the ball three straight times to move the ball to the Quaker 20. Zalc trotted on the field, waited out an icing timeout by Penn and calmly kicked the ball through the goalposts for the Big Green's first overtime victory over the Quakers in four tries.

"I knew our offense was going to give me the best situation possible there," Zalc said during a postgame press conference. "I just do the same thing I do every time, the situation might be different but it's the same kick every time, same snap, same hold. They just put me in a position to do it and I do it."

Penn entered the fourth quarter trailing, 20-10, and it looked like the Big Green had put the game out of reach with a 74-yard touchdown run by quarterback Jackson Proctor, filling in for the other half of the quarterback tandem, Dylan Cadwallader. A holding penalty downfield cut the run short at 29 yards, however, and Dartmouth eventually had to punt, pinning the Quakers inside their own 1-yard line with a little more than 10 minutes to play.

The precarious position did not faze Penn quarterback Aidan Sayin, who finished the day 36-of-55 throwing the ball for 357 passing yards. A play-action pass across the middle turned into a 52-yard gain, and following a fourth-down and a third-down conversion, Sayin connected with Malone Howley on a 16-yard touchdown toss, closing the gap to three with nearly six minutes remaining.

Dartmouth was able to run two-and-a-half minutes off the clock, but that left enough time for Penn to push the ball down to the Big Green 29. But on 3rd-and-1, Sayin pitched the ball to his running back with linebacker Macklin Ayers waiting for him for a 4-yard loss. The Quakers turned to a bigger leg in punter Albert Jang, who supplied plenty of distance to spare on the 51-yard, game-tying field goal, which turned out for naught after Zalc's game-winner.

"We had it pretty locked down all day, but we knew it was going to go all the way to the end and then some," linebacker Braden Mullen said. "We had a couple mental errors in the last couple drives, so still a lot of room for improvement at the end of games. Our goal is to keep them scoreless in the fourth quarter, so we have things we still need to work on."

The first half was a wild affair as big plays on special teams provided scoring opportunities for

both teams early. After Penn failed to get a first down on the game's opening drive, Niko Schwikal broke through the line, blocked the punt and recovered it at the 1. Howard took the honors in carrying the ball over the threshold for a 7-0 lead barely one minute into the contest.

When Derrell Porter forced a fumble and Sean Williams recovered it at the Penn 20, Dartmouth had a golden opportunity to extend its lead. But Quaker Joey Slackman blocked Zalc's 32-yard field goal attempt and his teammate, Jonathan Melvin, scooped up the loose ball, returning it to midfield. Penn was able to advance inside the Big Green 5 before settling for a 21-yard Gottlieb field goal.

The Big Green got those three points back early in the second quarter when Zalc drilled a 28-yarder. But the Quakers pulled even when Saurin faked a keeper to suck in the defense and connected on a short pass with Malachi Hosely, who sprinted the rest of the 52 yards to the end zone.

Two more Penn miscues would play a big role late in the half. Sayin fumbled the snap on a third-down play and linebacker Braden Mullen — who also had a pair of sacks on the day — came up with the ball at the Quaker 36. Seven plays later, Howard dropped a perfect pass in the corner of the end zone to tight end Chris Corbo from 14 yards out, giving the Green the 17-10 lead with 44 seconds still showing.

Defensive end Joe Onuwabagbe forced another Penn turnover with 31 seconds before the intermission, stripping Sayin in the backfield for his first career sack and recovering the fumble at the Quaker 20. Zalc booted a 26-yard field goal as time expired for the 20-10 lead at the break.

Although Penn outgained the Big Green by 143 yards (394-251), the Dartmouth defense completely shut down the running game, yielding a mere 11 yards on 21 carries with the help of three sacks. Cornerback Leonard St. Gourdin had a game-high nine tackles for the Green, which as a team recorded 10 tackles for a loss totaling 38 yards.

"We knew it was going to be a battle, knew that there would be some bad plays on our side, but we just had to forget about it, correct it and move on," said interim head coach Sammy McCorkle. "I thought our guys did a very good job of doing just that. This was a typical Dartmouth-Penn game, always down to the wire, overtime classics. I thought all three phases of our game — offense, defense and special teams — came up with big plays when we needed them, and that was the difference for us.

Howard provided 132 yards of total offense, grinding out 58 yards on 19 carries and completing 9-of-18 passes for 74 more.

Bryce Myers was Penn's leading receiver with 103 yards on eight catches.

Notes: This is just the third game in the last 19 years in which Dartmouth converted three field goals ... the Big Green recovered three fumbles in a game for the first time in five years ... Dartmouth has defeated Penn in five of the last six meetings and is now 39-49-2 all-time against the Quakers.

TURNOVERS PROVE TOO MUCH TO OVERCOME IN 31-24 LOSS TO YALE

HANOVER, N.H. — Although Dartmouth amassed nearly 100 more yards and held the ball for close to 11 more minutes than visiting Yale, the Bulldogs were able to overcome the disadvantage with several big plays, earning a 31-24 victory on an overcast and humid Saturday afternoon at Memorial Field. The winning score came with 5:52 remaining in the game when Nolan Grooms connected with Ryan Lindley for a 69-yard touchdown, breaking a 24-24 deadlock and lifting Yale (2-2, 1-1 Ivy) to its first conference win of the season.

Nick Howard ran for 87 of the Big Green's 221 yards on the ground, including a pair of touchdowns for Dartmouth (2-2, 1-1 Ivy) and Paxton Scott had a touchdown grab among his five receptions — giving him 100 for his career — but three interceptions and a tough-luck turnover on a punt proved to be the difference in the game.

The two teams entered the fourth quarter knotted at 17 with Yale knocking on the door inside the Big Green 10. Grooms, who completed 15-of-22 passes for 239 yards, teamed up with Mason Tipton for his first scoring strike of the day from four yards out and a 24-17 lead.

The Dartmouth offense responded with a methodical, 14-play, 75-yard drive that took up nearly half the quarter to get back to even. Quarterback Jackson Proctor completed 4-of-5 throws to start the drive to move the Green into Bulldog territory before they pounded the ball on the ground with eight consecutive runs (the longest a Howard 11-yard jaunt) down to the Yale 6. Facing 3rd-and-goal, Proctor zipped a throw to the back of the end zone to Scott for his first touchdown toss of the year.

It took Yale three plays to regain the lead as Grooms found Ryan Lindley down the middle just past midfield. The Big Green safety slipped on the turf as the catch was made, leaving Lindley (who led all players with seven catches and 128 yards) free to sprint to the end zone for the 69-yard, go-ahead score.

On Dartmouth's next possession, Scott snared his 100th career catch, which was followed by a pass interference call that pushed the Big Green across midfield. But a 9-yard sack by Dylan Yang — just the second allowed by Dartmouth this season — left the Green up against 2nd-and-19. On third down, Proctor's pass was intercepted by Hamilton Moore.

But that pick did not seal the deal for Yale. The Bulldogs could not pick up a first down (they had just 11 on the afternoon) as Dartmouth burned its timeouts to preserve the clock, and the Big Green took over at their own 11 after a 35-yard punt. Proctor threw for a 17-yard gain to start the drive, but two plays later, cornerback Sean Guyton — who put Yale on the board in the opening quarter with a 70-yard pick-six — dove for another pickoff, and the Bulldogs were able to

run out the clock from there.

"It's very frustrating and disappointing that we couldn't come away from this game with a win," said interim head coach Sammy McCorkle. "Our guys battled the entire game, and we were better than they were in a lot of the stats, but those turnovers really hurt us, put us in tough situations. We had our own chances to get some interceptions but just couldn't quite finish off those plays. Our guys will bounce back, however; they are a tough and resilient group."

The day began well for the Big Green, shutting Yale down on the game's opening drive before taking a 7-0 lead. Tevita Moimoi, who ran for a career-high 82 yards on just nine carries, burst through the middle of the line for a 41-yard pickup to the Yale 5. That set up Howard's first touchdown run from 5 yards out. But Guyton tied the game with his pick six late in the first quarter.

The Bulldogs took the lead on a 43-yard Jack Bosman field goal in the second quarter, and the two sides traded touchdown runs (Howard from 2 yards out and Joshua Pitsenberger from 4), leaving the Bulldogs with a 17-14 lead at the intermission.

Dartmouth opened the second half with a 7-minute drive, but a fumbled snap on 3rd-and-goal from the 1-yard line forced the team to settle for a 32-yard field goal by first-year Owen Zalc, tying the game at 17. And when the Big Green forced Yale to punt from its own 14, momentum seemed to be on their side until the punt backed up and clipped a Dartmouth blocker in the shoulder. The Bulldogs recovered the ball at their own 41, spoiling a golden scoring opportunity for Dartmouth. The score remained 17-all until the fateful fourth quarter.

Proctor finished the game 17-of-23 throwing the ball for 120 yards and the touchdown to Scott, but also suffered the two late interceptions. Scott led the Big Green receivers with 60 yards on his five catches.

Three players had six tackles to lead the Dartmouth defense that allowed Yale to run just 49 plays for 275 yards (the Big Green had 72 for 368), including a mere 36 rushing yards. Linebacker Braden Mullen contributed two of the team's three sacks with nose guard Josiah Green recording the other for a 15-yard loss.

Joseph Vaughn led all players with 15 stops for the Bulldogs.

Notes: Scott is the 15th player in Big Green history with 100 receptions ... Howard has 12 multi-touchdown games in his career, two shy of the Dartmouth record held by legendary Myles Lane from the Class of 1928 ... Dartmouth had not turned the ball over four times in a game since coughing it up five times in a 24-21 loss against Brown in 2016 ... Yale has won the last two games in the series after dropping eight of nine.

FOURTH QUARTER COMEBACK ENDS IN OVERTIME HEARTBREAK AT COLGATE

HAMILTON, N.Y. — After rallying from a 14-point fourth-quarter deficit, Dartmouth could not match a Colgate field goal in overtime when a 29-yard attempt was blocked, allowing the Raiders (2-4) to send their homecoming crowd of 2,732 home happy with a 27-24 triumph. Colgate won its second straight game following four losses to start the season, while the Big Green fell to 2-3 despite a career-high 185 receiving yards for Paxton Scott.

Dartmouth won the coin toss in overtime and elected to play defense first, only to have Raider running back Chris Gee rip off a 17-yard run to the 8-yard line. But the Big Green stiffened up, keeping Colgate out of the end zone and forcing it to settle for a 20-yard field goal for the lead.

A false start did not help Dartmouth's prospects on its possession, but on 3rd-and-16 at the 31, Scott caught a short pass for his 10th grab of the day (matching a season and career high), then twisted and fought his way to the marker for a first down. When the Green could only muster two more yards on three plays, first-year Owen Zalc — who had ended an overtime victory at Penn just two weeks ago with a 37-yard field goal — was summoned to attempt to tie the game with a 29-yarder and send it into a second overtime. Those plans went out the window, however, when his kick was batted away by Zack Pelland, ending the wild affair.

The Big Green had the ball in Colgate territory when the fourth quarter began, trailing 24-10, and finished off a 12-play, 71-yard drive barely three minutes in on a 9-yard run across the goal line by Tevita Moimoi, his first touchdown of the season. The defense did its job and forced a punt, giving the ball back to Dartmouth on its own 28.

Quarterback Jackson Proctor guided the Green through the Raider defense, expertly mixing five completions with a trio of runs before Nick Howard took over behind center at the 4-yard line. The fifth-year senior powered his way into the end zone for his second score of the day, and Zalc provided the extra point to tie the game with 4:32 still to play, plenty of time for the big emotional swings to come.

Again Dartmouth stymied Colgate on a three-and-out, leaving the Big Green 2:24 to navigate into field goal range from their own 19. It didn't take long to do so as Proctor hit Scott about 15 yards downfield over the middle on the very first play, and the receiver sprinted another 50 down to the Raider 16. But it was not to be when Proctor had the ball jarred loose while scrambling to avoid the oncoming rush, and Michael Slivka covered it up for Colgate.

A 32-yard pass on the Raiders' first play suddenly advanced them to midfield, but a big second-down sack by Charles Looes was the key to forcing another punt. Dartmouth had 51 seconds to move the ball from its own 11, but after one first down, it had to punt, and Colgate took a knee to send the game into the fateful overtime.

Those penalties played a big role in helping the Raiders build a 17-3 lead by the intermission. Colgate opened the game by marching right down the field, helped in part when Dartmouth was whistled for roughing the passer near midfield. Two plays later, Osborne (27-of-38 for 264 yards) connected with Brady Hutchison on a 23-

yard throw for his first of two touchdown tosses on the day and a 7-0 lead.

The Big Green responded by moving the ball effectively until a holding penalty negated a first-down run in Raider territory. On the next Dartmouth possession (courtesy of an interception by linebacker Macklin Ayers), another holding penalty — this time in the red zone — denied the Green a first down at the 6-yard line, and the team ended up settling for a Zalc 32-yard field goal on the first play of the second quarter.

Colgate answered with a 29-yard field goal with a little help from a facemask penalty that put the ball on the Big Green 16. And after the next Dartmouth drive stalled out just shy of midfield, the Raiders covered 83 yards spanning more than seven minutes, capped by an Osborne 7-yard keeper into the end zone for the 17-3 advantage.

Even without any timeouts and only 1:07 left in the half, Dartmouth was able to maneuver downfield as Proctor (21-of-25 for 278 yards) completed six passes, the last to Scott at the Colgate 3, where Proctor spiked the ball to stop the clock with six seconds showing. After one pass into the end zone was broken up, Proctor went back to Scott, but his effort left him a foot shy of the goal line as time expired.

The momentum from that final drive of the half carried over into the second half, starting with the kickoff return by Sean Williams to the Big Green 45. Dartmouth then kept the ball on the ground, starting with a 32-yard run by Howard and a 19-yard pickup by Q Jones down to the Raider 2 before Howard was powered across the goal line on a "tush push" from the 1.

The defense stepped up in turn as nickelback Tyson McCloud broke up a 4th-and-3 pass at the Big Green 35. Dartmouth looked as if it would continue that momentum on a 31-yard toss from Proctor to Scott, but Colgate returned the favor by stopping Howard short of the marker on a 4th-and-2 run. Osborne then led the Raiders 78 yards over nine plays, ending with a 19-yard strike to Max Hurlleman, boosting their lead back to 14.

Dartmouth finished the game with a season-high 509 yards of offense, 372 provided by Proctor and Howard through the air. Howard led the team on the ground with 62 yards on 16 carries while linebackers Danny Cronin and Ayers had 12 and 11 tackles, respectively, to lead the defense.

Colgate amassed 418 yards (the most against the Big Green defense this year), 154 on the ground though no one player had more than Gee with 40 on six carries. Receiver Treyvhon Saunders posted eight catches for 118 yards, and Owen Goss led the Raider defense with 11 stops.

Notes: With his two touchdowns today, Howard now has 31 rushing scores in his career, into second place all-time at Dartmouth ahead of Dominick Pierre '14 and just two behind the all-time leader Myles Lane '28 who had 33 nearly 100 years ago ... the Big Green have topped 500 yards of offense 34 times over the last 54 seasons, winning 28 and losing only six, though this is their second straight defeat in such games (the last was another overtime loss at Sacred Heart last year) ... Scott's 185 receiving yards are the 11th-most in a game in Dartmouth history ... the Big Green fell to 7-19-1 in the all-time series against Colgate.

CAMPBELL SPARKS DARTMOUTH TO 20-9 HOMECOMING VICTORY OVER COLUMBIA

HANOVER, N.H. — The Dartmouth football team made sure the spirits of the 4,188 brave souls to face a steady rain on a very wet homecoming did not go home disappointed, knocking off visiting Columbia at Memorial Field on Saturday afternoon by a final of 20-9. Cornerback Patrick Campbell played the hero for the Big Green (3-3, 2-1 Ivy) with several big plays that turned the tide after the Lions (2-4, 0-3 Ivy) jumped out to an early 9-0 lead.

The slick conditions made advancing the ball a challenge for both teams with Dartmouth accumulating just 222 total yards and only 62 through the air on 7-of-15 completions against a Columbia defense that entered the game ninth in the country in total defense. The Big Green, meanwhile, kept the visitors in check by yielding 299 yards, only 45 of which came on the ground.

"Sometimes things aren't going to go your way, and we didn't panic when things didn't early," said Sammy McCorkle, the Robert L. Blackman Head Football Coach. "This is a long game, and it didn't start the way we wanted, but we couldn't worry about that and just had to adjust going forward. We were simply concerned with putting our offense and our defense in a position for them to be successful, and we were able to do just that."

Columbia, playing its fifth straight game in the rain, received the ball first and proceeded to march down the field in 10 plays, finishing off the drive on a 5-yard keeper by quarterback Joe Green. And when a Dartmouth snap went over the head of quarterback Dylan Cadwallader a few minutes later with Cadwallader simply kicking it out of the back of the end zone for a safety, the Big Green found themselves in a quick 9-0 hole.

Instead of hanging their heads, Dartmouth got to work, and Campbell was there to provide the momentum-changing play. Following the safety, the Lions were unable to pick up 10 yards and were forced to punt from their own 27. The snap was high, but punter William Hughes was able to make a leaping grab to attempt the kick only to have Campbell reject it. The ball bounded into the end zone, and Campbell fell on it for a Dartmouth touchdown, closing the gap to two points.

The next time the Big Green got the ball back, they covered 70 yards in 15 plays — 12 on the ground — with Tevita Moimoi powering across the goal line from 2 yards out to give Dartmouth a 14-9 lead early in the second quarter.

Columbia had four more chances to score in the second quarter, only to miss a 45-yard field goal attempt and have another drive ended by safety Cam Maddox, who intercepted a pass after defensive lineman Charles Looes got a hand on the throw at the line. Dartmouth was able to advance the ball just 17 yards following that pickoff, but it was enough for rookie place kicker Owen Zalc to split the uprights from 47 yards out for a 17-9 lead before the half.

Neither team could dent the scoreboard in

the third quarter, though Columbia threatened to before Campbell made an astounding, leaping interception on a halfback pass at the Big Green 28.

"I saw that they were running a reverse, and when the running back came over, he didn't look like he was trying to run the ball," Campbell said after the game. "So I was just disciplined. Some people would just try to run up there and leave the man behind wide open. When he threw the ball, I didn't know high I was, I just went up to get the ball."

Dartmouth was able to turn that turnover into three more points early in the fourth quarter when Zalc repeated his earlier performance with another 47-yard field goal.

"That's the farthest field goal I've ever hit in a game, and to do it twice is even cooler," Zalc said. "I can't do it alone; it's the line, it's the snap and the hold every time, so shoutout to [holder] Dylan [Cadwallader], [long snapper] Josh [Greene], and the whole line — and the offense — for giving me the opportunity."

A 40-yard completion from Green to J.J. Jenkins down to the Dartmouth 1 had the Lions in position to close the gap, but with a little help from a low snap on second down, the defense stiffened, and Columbia gambled on 4th-and-goal from the 4. Green threw to Marcus Libman in the end zone, but there was Campbell, doing just enough to keep the pass from being completed.

The Lions had one last gasp, but another 45-yard field goal attempt sailed wide right with just under a minute to play, and the Big Green were able to take the victory formation twice to close out the victory.

Q Jones was Dartmouth's leading rusher with 73 yards on 16 carries while Moimoi added 48 more on 11 carries including the go-ahead touchdown. Cadwallader, who had missed the previous two games with an injury, completed 6-of-12 passes for 57 yards, and linebacker Macklin Ayers led the defense with 11 tackles.

Green threw for 239 yards on 25-of-41 passes while Jenkins had 94 yards on five catches and Malcolm Terry II ran for 62 yards on 17 attempts. Anthony Roussos led all players with 12 tackles, one going for a loss.

Notes: Dartmouth has won just three games in the last 25 years when passing for no more than 61 yards ... the Big Green are now 72-20-1 all-time against Columbia ... Dartmouth had a blocked punt recovered in the end zone for a touchdown last year in New York against the Lions as well ... the most recent inductees into Dartmouth's Wearers of the Green were honored with an on-field celebration at halftime, recognizing men's and women's fencers who earned five national club sport championships in the mid-2010s, figure skaters, water polo players, an Olympian, a women's rugby player (prior to the team achieving varsity status) and a masters champion in women's squash.

NO SPOILER FOR DARTMOUTH AS HARVARD HOLDS OFF BIG GREEN IN HOMECOMING SHOWDOWN, 17-9

CAMBRIDGE, Mass. — With first place in the Ivy League on the line, Dartmouth could not spoil Harvard's homecoming with 22,515 fans in the seats as the 23rd-ranked Crimson (6-1, 3-1 Ivy) held off the Big Green (3-4, 2-2 Ivy) in a defensive struggle, 17-9. Shane McLaughlin provided more than half of Harvard's total offense with 156 rushing yards to help Crimson head coach Tim Murphy win his 136th Ivy victory, breaking the conference record.

The Big Green defense completely stymied the Harvard air attack, limiting the host to a mere 36 passing yards, the fewest for a Dartmouth opponent in 36 years. But the Crimson found their groove on the ground in the second half, racking up 196 rushing yards after halftime. Harvard finished the day with 228 yards on the ground against a Big Green team that was fourth in the FCS against the run (84.2 yards per game) entering the contest.

Dartmouth ended up with more total yards, 325-264, 242 of which came via the pass. Dylan Cadwallader completed 24-of-37 throws for 186 yards, but also suffered a costly interception in the fourth quarter. Harvard was able to convert that turnover into a drive that ate up over six minutes of clock and ended with a 22-yard field goal to give the Crimson a two-score advantage at 17-6 with 3:26 remaining.

Even with no timeouts, the Big Green would not yield. Cadwallader drove the offense down to the Harvard 2-yard line and tossed a touchdown pass to Jackson Gerard only to have the play negated by an offensive pass interference call. With just 21 seconds on the clock, Dartmouth's Robert L. Blackman Head Football Coach Sammy McCorkle decided to take the three points, which rookie Owen Zalc provided with a low, line-drive kick that found its way through the uprights from 35 yards out.

The Big Green still needed to recover the on-side kick to even get a shot at a likely Hail Mary pass — evoking memories of Dartmouth's victory here just four years ago — not to mention a two-point conversion. Those plans never came to fruition, even with a little slight of foot with Zalc serving as a decoy and Ivan Hoyt dribbling the kick as desired, yet Harvard was able to cover up the ball and secure the win.

"We fought all the way to the end, but we have to put some points on the board and can't simply settle for field goals," said McCorkle. Defensively I thought we did a great job except for a couple drives in the second half when they were able to run the ball against us. It kind of deflated us a bit. But we still had a heck of a stand to limit them to a field goal, and the offense gave us a chance at the end with that drive. We simply ended up on the short of it today."

In the first half, Dartmouth mostly dominated play with its offense holding the ball for nearly 18 minutes and outgaining the Crimson, 171-57. Yet it was Harvard who held a 7-3 lead at the intermission thanks to a fumble recovery on a sack of Cadwallader at the Big Green 14, just three plays after safety Sean Williams recorded his first of two interceptions on the afternoon. Three plays later, backup quarterback Jaden Craig carried the ball over the threshold from 4 yards out for a

7-0 lead midway through the first quarter.

Zalc put Dartmouth on the board just before the end of the opening quarter, drilling a 37-yard field goal. Neither team could advance past its opponent's 40-yard line in the second quarter until the Big Green ran their two-minute drill, weaving their way from their own 24 to the Crimson 30. But a second sack of Cadwallader — equaling the number of sacks allowed by Dartmouth all season — pushed the ball back to the 35. With mere seconds remaining in the half, Zalc was summoned to attempt a 52-yard field goal, and though his kick may have had the distance, it veered wide left, leaving the Green trailing by four points at the intermission.

In the third quarter, Zalc trimmed the deficit to one with a 47-yard field goal, matching a personal best he recorded twice last week. But Harvard responded with an 11-play, 75-yard drive that featured two completions by Craig for 13 yards with the rest coming on the ground. The last play was a 3-yard touchdown by Craig, opening up an eight-point lead for the Crimson at 14-6.

After both teams had a stalled drive, Cadwallader completed three consecutive passes to push into Harvard territory, only for his next throw to sail high and into the outstretched hands of safety Phillip Smitherman. That set up a six-plus-minute drive and the short field goal by Cali Canaval.

Paxton Scott led the Big Green receivers with seven catches for 72 yards while Daniel Haughton added six more grabs for 50 yards. Q Jones led the ground game with 50 of the team's 83 yards, while quarterback Nick Howard (Dartmouth's ninth-leading all-time rusher) was limited to 24 yards on nine carries.

Nose tackle Josiah Green supplied a career-high 10 tackles to lead the defense, and fifth-year linebacker Marques White — making his first appearance after suffering an injury during pre-season — had three of the Big Green's four sacks, all coming on third-down plays.

Ty Bartrum led all players with 13 tackles for Harvard, and Gavin Shipman added 10 more stops.

Notes: Zalc's three field goals tied a personal best he set four weeks ago in an overtime win at Penn ... it was the third time in the last eight games dating back to last year that Dartmouth had three field goals in a game, with the last time before this stretch coming in 2011 ... Harvard had 18 first downs in the game, all coming via the rush, marking just the second time since 1969 that a Big Green opponent did not have at least one first down come through the air (Penn did not complete a pass in the 1987 contest) ... Davis Golick tied a career high with a 50-yard punt at the start of the fourth quarter to push the Crimson back to their 18 ... Williams is the first Big Green defender with two picks in a game in four years (Jack Traynor at Marist in 2019) ... White's three sacks were one shy of the program record ... the crowd of 22,515 was the largest that Dartmouth had played in front of in 16 years (24,237 at Yale in 2007).

DARTMOUTH CAPITALIZES ON PRINCETON TURNOVERS IN 23-21 VICTORY

HANOVER, N.H. — Dartmouth rookie place kicker Owen Zalc split the uprights from 47 yards out with 1:29 left in the game — his third field goal of the night — lifting the Big Green to a 23-21 triumph over visiting Princeton on the 100th anniversary of Memorial Field. Dartmouth (4-4, 3-2 Ivy) picked up just 197 yards of offense but forced four turnovers to knock off the Tigers (4-4, 3-2 Ivy), which entered the weekend as the co-leader in the Ivy League standings.

A Zalc field goal from 38 yards late in the third quarter whittled the Big Green deficit down to one, 21-20. Dartmouth got the ball back on the first play of the fourth quarter when defensive end Charles Looes recorded his fourth sack of the night — tying a program record — jarring the ball loose in the process and recovering it near midfield. But the Big Green could not capitalize on that Tiger miscue, failing to convert a 4th-and-1 “tush push,” giving the ball back to Princeton at its own 44.

The two teams traded punts before the Tigers attempted a 47-yard field goal with 5:11 to play. Looes continued his big night as he got a hand on the kick, and the ball landed directly in the hands of Sean Williams, who scampered 69 yards to the end zone, seemingly giving the Green the lead. But a block-in-the-back penalty negated the score, leaving Dartmouth on the Princeton 48.

Six plays later, the Big Green faced 4th-and-1 from just inside the Tiger 30, so Zalc trotted onto the field following a Princeton timeout to attempt the 47-yard field goal. From the moment the ball left his foot, there was no doubt about where it would end up, giving him his fourth conversion from 47 yards in the last three weeks.

“There are some nerves that come about naturally from pressure situations, but I just try to stay calm and collected,” Zalc said. “When I get nervous, I talk a lot. [Long snapper] Josh Greene can tell you I’m always chirping in his ear. I’m always a little more energetic when I get stressed, but I just channel that in a good way to do what I need to do.”

There was still nearly a minute-and-a-half to play, however, and Princeton quickly picked up a first down with a 16-yard pass. That would be all the Tigers could muster as a short pass on 4th-and-2 was broken up by cornerback Jordan Washington, allowing Dartmouth to take the victory formation and run the clock out to secure the victory.

“We definitely didn’t make it pretty, but we knew it was going to be a battle and that it was going to come down to the end, and we made the plays we needed to make,” said Sammy McCorkle, Dartmouth’s Robert L. Blackman Head Football Coach. “Our team did a great job with the effort throughout, and after a rough first half, we held each other accountable. We kept chipping away and knew it wouldn’t happen on one play, but we stayed consistent with our energy and played to the very end.”

The game opened with a pair of Princeton turnovers that allowed the Big Green to jump out to an early 10-0 lead. On the Tigers’ first play from scrimmage, a Blake Stenstrom pass went right through the hands of receiver A.J. Barber, and Williams was there to pluck the ball out of the air and scamper 26 yards to the end zone barely two minutes into the contest.

On the very next Princeton possession, Looes

registered consecutive sacks, the second of which caused Stenstrom to lose hold of the ball, which nose tackle Josiah Green covered up at the Big Green 44. Although Dartmouth ran three plays and set up to punt from midfield, McCorkle called for some trickery in the form of a fake punt as tight end Chris Corbo took the snap and ran 26 yards before he could be taken to the turf. Now in field goal range, Zalc eventually provided the points in the form of a 39-yard field goal.

The tide turned on the first play of the second quarter when the Tigers punted to Williams, who already had a 38-yard kickoff return and a 22-yard punt return, not to mention his pick-six. But this time, the ball slid through his arms, allowing Princeton to recover the muff at the Dartmouth 45. Nine plays later, running back John Volker scored the first Tiger points on a 1-yard run over the goal line.

Princeton added another touchdown before the intermission on another Volker carry, this time from 9 yards out right after the Big Green were whistled for pass interference on a 3rd-and-7 pass to the end zone, giving the Tigers a 14-10 lead.

Jackson Proctor took over behind center for Dartmouth to start the second half, and the change paid off immediately as he led the offense on an eight-play, 57-yard touchdown drive, culminating with a 9-yard toss to Jackson Gerard for his first career touchdown and a 17-14 lead.

That lead was short-lived thanks to a 62-yard bomb over the Big Green defense from Stenstrom to Luke Colella. Proctor helped Dartmouth respond with completions of 10, 23 and 5 yards on the next drive, allowing Zalc to provide his shortest field goal of the day from 38 and set the stage for his heroics in the fourth quarter.

Proctor, the third-string quarterback, finished the game 9-of-12 passing the ball for 86 yards with the one touchdown. Williams tied for the Dartmouth lead with nine tackles to go with his pick-six, a forced fumble and a pass breakup, while Looes terrorized the Tigers with his four sacks and blocked field goal.

Stenstrom completed 19-of-31 throws for 245 yards and a score, but he also was intercepted once and fumbled the ball away twice. Colella led all players with 107 receiving yards on five catches, and Liam Johnson recorded 11 tackles.

Notes: Dartmouth is 276-145-8 in the 100 years of playing at Memorial Field ... the Big Green have beaten Princeton each of the last six games in Hanover ... Dartmouth is 44-3 against the Tigers when scoring at least 18 points against them ... the Big Green had not rallied for a victory when trailing entering the fourth quarter since a 29-23 win at Brown on Nov. 23, 2019 ... Zalc has 15 field goals on the season, which is tied for the Dartmouth single season record set 33 years ago by Dennis Durkin ’93 ... with 12 of his 15 field goals coming against Ivy opponents, Zalc is also one field goal shy of matching the Ivy League single-season record in conference contests ... Looes is just the third Big Green defender with four sacks in a game, tying the mark set by George Neos ’93 in 1992 against Harvard and matched by Anthony Gargiulo ’06 in 2004 against Cornell ... Williams’ pick-six was the first for a Dartmouth player since Isaiah Johnson ’22 returned an interception 73 yards for a score two years ago against Princeton at Memorial Field as well.

HOWARD RUNS FOR THREE TOUCHDOWNS TO LEAD DARTMOUTH TO 30-14 VICTORY

HANOVER, N.H. — Senior Day could not have gone any better for quarterback Nick Howard. The fifth-year led Dartmouth to a 30-14 victory over visiting Cornell at Memorial Field by rushing for 108 yards and three scores, breaking the Big Green record for career rushing touchdowns that had stood for 96 years.

With the victory, Dartmouth (5-4, 4-2 Ivy) kept its title hopes alive, though Harvard (8-1, 5-1 Ivy) held on to sole possession of first place with a triple-overtime victory over Penn this afternoon. The Big Red dropped to 3-6 on the season and 2-4 in the Ivy League.

Howard now has 34 rushing touchdowns at Dartmouth, breaking the record of 33 set by legendary Myles Lane '28. With his first 100-yard game of the season and sixth of his career, he also boosted his career rushing total to 1,835 yards, leapfrogging four others in the Big Green annals into fourth place.

"This was a great win, and we have a lot of pride playing here in front of friends and family," Howard said after the game. "I felt good coming into the game, and I haven't felt fresh the past couple of weeks, but I've been fortunate in not taking a lot of big hits lately. We had a little different buzz today, and it really felt like our confidence and belief in each other all kind of came together at the right time."

First-year Owen Zalc joined Howard as a Dartmouth record-breaker today, converting his 16th field goal of the season from 42 yards into the wind, breaking the program's single-season mark that had stood for 33 years.

Dartmouth got out to a quick start, marching 75 yards in plays to the end zone to start the game. The key play in the drive was a 38-yard bomb from Jackson Proctor to Paxton Scott inside the Big Red 10 on 3rd-and-10. Two plays later, Howard was bulling his way across the goal line from three yards out for his first touchdown of the day and a 7-0 lead.

Before the first quarter could expire, the Big Green offense was back at it, starting past mid-field after forcing Cornell to punt from its own 9. Howard took control of the drive, completing his only pass of the day (a 27-yard connection on 3rd-and-1 to tight end Jace Henry) and running the other five plays, the last a 1-yard burrowing to the end zone for a 14-0 lead.

The Big Red fought back, though it coughed up a golden scoring opportunity first. After traversing 70 yards to the Dartmouth 13, Drew Powell had an eight-yard rush that ended in catastrophe as cornerback Leonard St. Gourdin poked the ball free and recovered it at the Big Green 5. But when Dartmouth could not advance the ball and punted away, Cornell started its next drive with a 41-yard pass from Jameson Wang to Davon Kiser and ended it with a reverse to Wang who shoveled a pass to Ean Pope for a 2-yard touchdown toss with 4:43 left in the half.

Both teams traded punts, leaving Dartmouth 1:47 to try and cover 65 yards before the intermission. It took only 1:12 as it turned out as

Proctor carved up the Cornell defense. The junior completed 5-of-7 passes during the drive, the last a 37-yard strike to the 270-pound Henry, who broke a pair of tackles to thunder his way into the end zone for a 21-7 lead at the break.

Cornell would not relent however, blocking a punt early in the third quarter to take over at the Big Green 23. On 3rd-and-5, Wang called his own number and sprinted for the 6-yard score, closing the gap to seven points once again.

Dartmouth responded in kind thanks to a 20-yard toss to Scott and runs of 11 and 14 yards by Howard. Although the drive stalled at the Big Red 24, Zalc came on and booted the 42-yarder into a stiff wind, clanging the ball off the left upright and just over the crossbar for his record-breaking field goal and a 10-point advantage.

In the fourth quarter, Cornell gambled on 4th-and-3 from its own 36 with 9:22 to play and rolled snake eyes as Wang's pass fell incomplete. The deflated Big Red then allowed a 31-yard run by Tevita Moimoi followed by Howard's final touchdown of the day, this time from 5 yards out, though the extra-point attempt banged off the right upright, leaving Dartmouth with a 30-14 lead.

But when the next Big Red drive died at the Big Green 31 when cornerback Patrick Campbell broke up a fourth-down pass, Dartmouth was able to run out the final 5:34, kneeling down inside the Cornell 10 twice to finish off the victory.

"We prepared ourselves all week, and I'm very happy with how quickly the offense came out of the gate," said Sammy McCorkle, the Robert L. Blackman Head Football Coach. "And the defense did a heck of a job stepping up when we needed them to. The energy level was the best we've had in a long time. The guys were really into it across the board."

The Big Green ended the day with a well-balanced offensive attack — 196 yards on the ground and 176 through the air. Proctor completed 13-of-19 throws for 149 yards and the one touchdown via the pass, his favorite target being Scott who had five grabs for 78 yards, boosting his career total over 1,500 yards. St. Gourdin led the defense with six stops and his big forced fumble and recovery.

Cornell mustered only 266 yards with Wang throwing for 153 on 19-of-31 passes and leading the rushing attack with 31 yards on eight carries. Luke Banbury led all players with 11 tackles and Noah Taylor added 10 more including a sack for the Big Red.

Notes: Dartmouth improved to 63-42-1 all-time against Cornell and has won 12 of the last 14 meetings ... Zalc also tied the Ivy League record for field goals in a seven-game Ivy season (13) ... Charles Looes registered a sack one week after collecting four, boosting his league-leading total to 6.5 on the year ... of Howard's 34 career touchdowns, seven have come against the Big Red.

Dartmouth football teams have played before live television cameras 114 times since 1953 when the Big Green met Holy Cross at Manning Bowl in Lynn, Massachusetts, in the first New England college game televised nationally.

The 1953 game, won by the Crusaders, 28-6, was carried on NBC's 82-station network as part of the NCAA's restricted television agreement but wasn't seen on the Dartmouth campus since

there were no television stations serving northern New England at that time. The Dartmouth touchdown was scored by end Dave McLaughlin who later would serve as president of the college.

Frequently, during the early years of formal Ivy League football, Dartmouth played before major network regional audiences. Perhaps the most memorable game televised from Memorial Field in Hanover was the 1971 game with Cornell

that was ABC-TV's prime regional game with the broadcast team of Chris Schenkel, Bill Fleming and Bud Wilkinson. Cornell was undefeated and led by Heisman Trophy candidate Ed Marinaro. Dartmouth won, 24-14.

Dartmouth's record in televised games is 52 wins, 66 losses and one tie. The Big Green has a 27-37-0 record in games televised at Memorial Field.
