THIS GAME

- >> GCU officially opens its 75th season of men's basketball and 11th at the Division I level against fellow NCAA Tournament participant Southeast Missouri State on Monday night.
- >> This is one of three Opening Day matchups that features two participants from the 2023 NCAA Tournament (Iona vs. Charleston, USC vs. Kansas State.)
- >> Lopes forward **Gabe McGlothlin** played his first collegiate season at Southeast Missouri State in 2018-19.
- >> GCU has won 9 of its 10 home openers as a D-I program and holds an all-time program record of 59-15 in home openers.

STORYLINES

- >> **Ray Harrison** was named the Preseason WAC Player of the Year. The first-team ALL-WAC pick from a year ago set GCU's D-I era record for points in a season (640) and was the Most Outstanding Player of the 2023 WAC Tournament. He tested the NBA Draft waters in the summer before opting to return to school.
- >> **Gabe McGlothlin** was also named to the Preseason ALL-WAC team. He was a second-team ALL-WAC pick last year, ranking second in scoring (12.8 ppg) and first in rebounding (7.6 rpg).
- >> The Lopes are picked to win the WAC by the conference's head coaches, receiving 9 of 10 possible first-place votes.
- >> GCU was named one of five mid-majors to watch by ESPN.com.
- >> GCU begins the season ranked No. 83 in KenPom's preseason rankings, the highest start to a year for a Lopes team.
- >> In addition to returning its two leading scorers, the Lopes welcome nine newcomers including seven transfers and two freshmen. Of the seven transfers, five were most recently on a Power 6 roster (**Duke Brennan**, **Malcolm Flagg**, **Sydney Curry**, **Tyon Grant-Foster** and **Lök Wur.**)
- >> GCU is set to appear on national television five times during the regular season, a program high. Two games will take place at GCU Arena (Dec. 5 vs. San Diego State, March 2 vs. SFA.)
- >> Per Andy Katz of NCAA.com, GCU has the nation's No. 9-ranked student section, No. 10-ranked uniforms and is the No. 7 most underrated team.
- >> GCU will play its toughest schedule yet when measured by last year's NET rankings of this year's opponents.

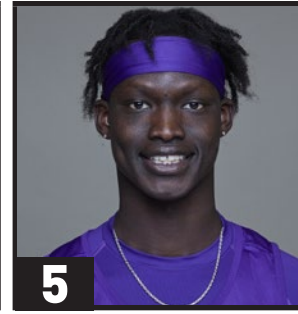

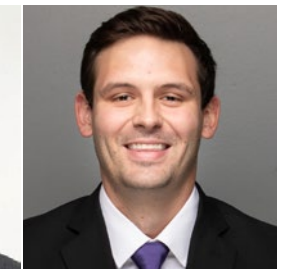

HEAD COACH BRYCE DREW

"We do have length and so, when guys can get their hands on balls, it allows us to get in transition. We do have some speed that can get up and down the court and finish at the rim. That was really prevalent for us during that stretch when we were able to build the lead. But it's got to be a constant. It needs to be part of how we are, our DNA."

"We have a lot of really talented scorers out there. Sometimes, they are taking a back seat or making the extra pass for someone else to get that shot up. We talked early on that chemistry was going to be a huge thing. Right now, they're doing really well."

AT-A-GLANCE

- » SEMO made its way to the NCAA Tournament by winning the Ohio Valley Conference Tournament as the No. 5 seed.
- » The Redhawks had to win four games in four days, defeating No. 8 Lindenwood, No. 4 Tennessee State, No. 1 Morehead State and No. 2 Tennessee Tech.
- » As a No. 16 seed in the South region, SEMO lost to Texas A&M-Corpus Christi in the First Four. It was the program's first NCAA Tournament appearance since 2000.
- » The Lopes are the sixth WAC team SEMO faces in its program history. SEMO is 7-5 all-time against WAC schools with games played vs. UT Rio Grande Valley (3-1), Abilene Christian (2-2), UT Arlington (1-0), Southern Utah (1-1) and California Baptist (0-1).
- » It is the longest trip the Redhawks make for a season-opener since they began the 2014-15 campaign at Loyola Marymount in Los Angeles, California.
- » Forward Josh Earley and guards Rob Martin, Braxton Stackler and TJ Biel will make their first career starts at Southeast Missouri Monday.

LAST TIME OUT

- » Aquan Smart scored 16 points, grabbed six rebounds and had six assists to lead Southeast Missouri to a 76-61 exhibition win over Henderson State in exhibition action on Oct. 23.
- » Smart scored 10 of his points in the first half and did not miss a free throw going 8-of-8 at the charity stripe.
- » SEMO trailed, 22-16, with 10:53 remaining in the first half when it used an 11-0 run to take a five-point advantage.

Harrison, last season's WAC Tournament Most Outstanding Player, made a case to be last season's WAC Player of the Year when he averaged career highs for points (17.8 per game) and assists (3.6 per game). That included a WAC Tournament title run in which the Greenville, South Carolina, native shot 52% from the field and averaged 20.0 points, 5.5 rebounds and 5.3 rebounds over four wins.

Gabe McGlothlan - Preseason All-WAC team

McGlothlan joined Harrison on the coaches' five-member Preseason All-WAC Team. The Chandler Basha High School graduate averaged career highs for points (12.8 per game) and rebounds (7.6 per game) on last season's NCAA tournament qualifier.

Ray Harrison became GCU's fifth selection in the last eight years for WAC Preseason Player of the Year honors.

"Ray had a great conference season all the way through," GCU fourth-year head coach Bryce Drew said. "They both improved this summer, so we expect them to take another step up in their games."

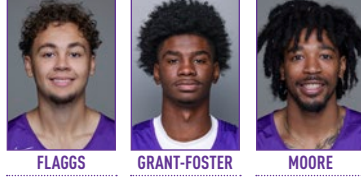

» **NEW NUMBERS!**

New in 2023-24... the NCAA expanded its rules to allow more flexibility in jersey numbers. Previously, only the digits 0 through 5 could be used, limiting selections to 0, 1, 2, 3, 4, 5; 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15; etc.

This restriction was lifted effective this season, meaning players can now choose from the full gamut of two-digit numbers.

Three Lopes jumped on the new trend immediately, and they will be the first three to wear their respective numbers in GCU's history.

» **NEW LOGO!**

GCU launched a campus-wide rebrand of its logo system that took effect in June.

The new "Speed GCU" logo was unveiled last February at a Lopes basketball game and an entire logo system was built out and refined for a June 30 launch. The logo system was developed with an aim to give the university a modern and cohesive brand that is unique to GCU.

GCU's "Running Lope" logo — unveiled nearly a decade ago in lockstep with the university's transition to Division I athletics — continues to be a foundational element of GCU's brand.

The Running Lope now has a cohesive GCU logo with familiar speed lines and agile movement that matches the university's innovative, modern and fast-moving identity.

A custom "Thunder" font was also developed that ties the brand together with "Lopes" and "Grand Canyon" wordmarks, which will start appearing in branded items such as GCU's athletic uniforms.

The "Arched GCU" logo that was unveiled prior to the 2015-16 academic year will be retired, serving the university well through many firsts, including D-I NCAA tournament debuts by most GCU athletic programs.

Bryce Drew is in his fourth season as Grand Canyon's men's basketball head coach in 2023-24 after being named the 14th head coach in program history prior to the 2020-21 campaign.

Drew has taken all three programs he's been the head coach of to the NCAA Tournament, including two visits with his Lopes teams in three seasons leading the program.

Drew wasted no time getting acclimated to GCU, leading the Lopes to their first appearance in the D-I NCAA tournament in his inaugural season. GCU won its first WAC regular-season title and its first WAC tournament title, advancing to March Madness for a date with No. 2 seeded Iowa. The Lopes went 17-7 overall and 9-3 in conference play amid a season plagued by the coronavirus pandemic. In a span of 12 months, Drew recruited new players (including WAC Newcomer of the Year Asbjørn Midtgaard), established a new culture and program identity and won a pair of WAC titles, all while facing various levels of practice restrictions and testing requirements due to COVID-19. On the regular season's final day, GCU defeated Utah Valley to win its first regular-season title and claim the top seed in the conference's tournament. GCU had a dominant run in the 2021 WAC tournament, defeating Seattle U and New Mexico State by a combined 52 points.

The Lopes were dancing again two years later. As the conference's No. 5 seed in the 2023 WAC Tournament, GCU made a tear through the bracket by winning four games in four days to return to March Madness. After tight wins over UT Arlington, Seattle U and Sam Houston, the Lopes defeated Southern Utah by 18 in the championship game to become the conference's lowest-seeded team to win the tournament since 2001. As a No. 14 seed, GCU was paired up against Gonzaga in Denver. The Lopes held leads as large as seven points and continued to lead under the two minute mark of the first half but fell by 12 to the Bulldogs.

GCU's best season in the NET rankings came in Drew's second season and, quizzically, his only year not to reach the NCAA Tournament. Drew and his staff were charged with replacing GCU's two leading scorers heading into 2022-23. Behind the development of Jovan Blacksher Jr. and the addition of Holland Woods II, the Lopes posted a 92 NET with a 23-8 mark. GCU's best win by metrics in its D-I program history came on Dec. 18 in the Colangelo Classic as GCU topped previously undefeated San Francisco.

Prior to GCU, Drew has had successful head coaching stops at his alma mater, Valparaiso, and at Vanderbilt, where he qualified for his third NCAA tournament visit as a head coach in 2017. Drew came to GCU with a career coaching record of 164-108 (.603), including a program-record season of 30 wins in his final year at Valparaiso.

Drew averaged 25 wins per season at Valparaiso and won the Horizon League regular-season championship four times during his five-year tenure. He led the Crusaders to their first NCAA tournament berth in nine years.

Drew moved to Vanderbilt to take on the SEC challenge in 2016 and coached his first Commodores team to five wins against top-25 teams and an NCAA Tournament berth. He came to the Phoenix area to land his first Vanderbilt recruit, Saben Lee, who starred in the 2019-20 season with 18.6 points and 4.2 assists per game.

In 2017, Drew assembled the greatest recruiting class in Vanderbilt history when he signed two five-star prospects. One of those players, Darius Garland, played only five games that season but was still drafted fifth overall by the Cleveland Cavaliers in the 2019 NBA Draft.

In 2019-20, Drew worked as an ESPN studio and game analyst, visited college and pro coaches and spent time with his wife, Tara, and son, Bryson.

Drew played six NBA seasons after being drafted 16th overall by the Houston Rockets in 1998, where he started 41 games in 2000-01. In 1999, the NBA awarded him with the Henry P. Iba Citizen Athlete Award for sportsmanship.

The 6-foot-3 point guard, who also played for the Chicago Bulls and New Orleans Hornets, was known for his perimeter shot (37% 3-point shooting) but he is most famous for "The Shot" he made in the 1998 NCAA tournament to lead the No. 13 seeded Valparaiso Crusaders over No. 4 seeded Ole Miss.

Drew comes from a basketball family and played for his dad Homer at Valparaiso. His brother Scott began his coaching career at Valparaiso in 2002 and has since turned the Baylor basketball program around with a 379-222 record in 18 seasons and a 2021 national championship. Drew's sister Dana was a Mid-American Conference Player of the Year at Toledo.

Drew and his wife, Tara, have one child: Bryson.

Grand Canyon University Arena is Phoenix's premier mid-sized indoor venue and serves as the primary home of Lopes men's and women's basketball and men's and women's volleyball teams as well as a wide assortment of university-sponsored and outside events.

The arena has provided the Lopes a definitive home-court advantage since opening its doors before the 2011-12 basketball season. With a seating capacity of 7,000 and a prime location on campus, the venue is regularly packed to the rafters with students and fans, providing an electric atmosphere ripe for success. Since its opening, the men's basketball team has been dominant in the arena, posting an overall record of 158-40 (.798), including six seasons of at least 15 wins.

GCU Arena hit new levels in 2018-19. With an average crowd of

7,170 fans, GCU Arena was the fullest venue in college basketball with a percent capacity of 102.42%.

Home attendance has tripled since the arrival of the arena, with a per-game average of over 7,100 fans coming through the doors in 2018-19. While crowds of over 7,000 used to represent milestones, it has become a common occurrence at GCU Arena. All but two nonconference games were filled above the arena's 7,000-seat capacity in the 2018-19 season.

The facility originally broke ground in the summer of 2010 and was completed before the start of the following basketball season. It is owned and operated by the university.



The Havocs are some of the most dedicated and rowdy fans in all of collegiate sports. Often 3,500 students strong, they turn GCU athletic venues into some of the rowdiest environments in all of college sports.

Known for their constant energy, support and pride, the Havocs support and encourage GCU athletic teams, promote school spirit and build Lope pride.

Tabbed as the "Biggest Party in College Basketball," the Havocs bring the noise and excitement every game with different cheers and chants to give every team a competitive advantage when playing at home. In 2018, GCU Arena was ranked 22nd in the country for best college basketball atmospheres, and was quoted as "easily one of the rowdiest fan bases in the entire country."



The Havocs mission is to be the most spirited, energetic and disruptive student section in the country. Havocs strive to create the most unique game day experience in college basketball and a sense of camaraderie for all students.

The Havocs cheer at more than just home events, sending droves of students to rival New Mexico State and to the WAC Tournament in Las Vegas. The support has garnered national attention over the past five years including being featured on ESPN's Scott Van Pelt's SportsCenter show.

Homer was a head coach for 34 seasons including 22 at Valparaiso. He won 640 games and is a member of the College Basketball Hall of Fame.

Scott was an assistant under Homer at Valpo before taking the reins at Baylor in 2003. He is one of the top-20 longest tenured head coaches in D-I men's basketball, leading the Bears to the 2021 National Championship in what some characterized as one of the greatest rebuilds in sports history. Scott has 440 wins.

Bryce played under both Homer (head coach) and Scott (assistant coach) at Valpo before taking over the program in 2011 and accumulating 124 wins in five seasons. Add 40 more at Vanderbilt plus his time at GCU and Bryce has 228 as a head coach.
