### QUICK HITS

#### LAST TIME OUT

◆ The Redbirds fought back from a 14-point deficit in the third quarter to tie the game twice in the final minute of Saturday's contest, but ultimately fell to Sacramento State (3-3), 65-63, at the Bren Events Center to close out the UCI Thanksgiving Invite on Saturday.

◆ Fifth year **Juliunn Redmond** led all scorers with a career-high 28 points, adding six rebounds, three assists and three steals. Junior **DeAnna Wilson** also set a new career best, putting up 21 points while grabbing six boards and three steals.

◆ The Hornets shot a blazing 50% from behind the arc, going 12-of-24 from distance. Summer Menke led Sac State with 20 points in the victory.

#### UCI THANKSGIVING ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM

◆ Junior **DeAnna Wilson** was named to the UCI Thanksgiving Invite All-Tournament Team after averaging 18.5 points and 7.5 rebounds on the weekend. Wilson just missed a double-double in Friday's contest at UC Irvine, finishing with 16 points and nine rebounds while shooting 6-of-9 (66.7%) from the floor. The junior then went off for a career-high 21 points in Saturday's game versus Sacramento State, scoring ISU's first 10 points while grabbing six boards and three steals on the day.

#### EDUCATION DAY

◆ Wednesday's game versus Missouri Baptist (NAIA) will serve as ISU's Education Day. Many local elementary schools will be in attendance to support the 'Birds, with over 1,400 students expected at the game.

## COACHING STAFF

**KRISTEN GILLESPIE / Head Coach / Fifth Season**

Kristen Gillespie is entering her fifth year at the helm of the Redbirds, guiding Illinois State to its first postseason berth in eight years during the most recent 2020-21 campaign, leading the Redbirds (16-9, 12-6 MVC) to an appearance in the WNIT. In the tournament, which was condensed from 64 to 32 teams and played at four regional sites due to COVID-19, the Redbirds also earned their first postseason win since the 2012-13 season with a 68-62 victory over Samford to make it to the Memphis Region Consolation Final.

**JESSICA KELLER / Associate Head Coach / Fifth Season**

Jessica Keller joined the women's basketball staff as an assistant coach April 24, 2017 and was promoted to the role of associate head coach prior to the 2020-21 season. Keller comes to Normal after a three-year head coaching stint at Columbia College in Columbia, Missouri. She compiled an overall record of 75-24 in three seasons at Columbia, including a 55-17 mark in the American Midwest Conference. She also coached the Cougars to a pair of NIAA National Tournament appearances in the last two years with the program. Columbia started the 2015-16 season with a school-record 19-straight wins and achieved the highest ranking in school history at No. 3 in the NIAA Division I Coaches' Poll, as the Cougars were ranked in 31 out of 34 polls during her tenure.

**SCOTT GILLESPIE / Assistant Coach / Fifth Season**

Scott Gillespie joined the women's basketball staff as an assistant coach May 12, 2017, and enters his fourth season at Illinois State after a three-year stint as an assistant men's basketball coach at IUPUI in Indianapolis, Indiana. Gillespie helped lead the Jaguars to a win increase each season under head coach Jason Gardner. Before heading to Indianapolis, Gillespie spent two seasons as a graduate manager at Memphis under head coach Josh Pastner, and Gardner, who was an assistant coach at Memphis and Pastner's teammate at Arizona. While pursuing his Master of Business Administration, the Tigers went 55-15 and made back-to-back NCAA Tournaments. **Scott is head coach Kristen Gillespie's cousin.**

**MARIYAH BRAWNER-HENLEY / Assistant Coach / Fourth Season**

Mariyah Brawner-Henley joined the women's basketball staff as an assistant coach May 17, 2018 after a one-year stint at Northern Illinois as a Graduate Assistant. She played her senior season under the direction of Coach Gillespie at Lewis University where she went on to earn GLVC Player of the Year and All-American honors. She helped guide the Flyers to four consecutive NCAA Division II Tournament berths and one GLVC championship. She finished her career as the greatest women's basketball player in Lewis history, tallying up a school record 1,981 points and 1,282 rebounds.

**GAME NOTES**

**CAREER HIGHS**

◆ Both **JuJu Redmond** and **DeAnna Wilson** improved on their career highs in scoring on Saturday, finishing with 28 and 21 points, respectively.  
 ◆ Redmond's 28 points were the most by an Illinois State player since Lexi Wallen had 35 in Feb. 14, 2020's double overtime win over Loyola Chicago, 86-85, at Redbird Arena.

**IT'S RAINING THREES**

◆ Redshirt junior **Mary Crompton** tied her career-best for three-pointers in a game on Friday, draining six triples versus UC Irvine to finish with a team-high 18 points on the day. It was tied for the second-most triples recorded by a MVC player this season and is a mark she has reached three times previously, the last being in ISU's match-up last year with Saint Xavier (12/6/20).  
 ◆ Crompton is currently 15 threes away from moving into ISU's top-five list in career three-point field goals, sitting at 155 and averaging 2.4 per game in her career.

**REPPIN' HER HOMETOWN**

◆ Redshirt sophomore and Normal native **Maya Wong** is growing into her spot as ISU's starting point guard, doubling her production from last year and leading the team averaging 8.5 points and 2.3 assists per game.  
 ◆ Despite her sophomore status, Wong has been with the program for three years already after deciding to forego her senior season at Normal Community HS to join the 'Birds early for the 2019-20 campaign, using a redshirt year to help her adjust to the challenges and demands of a collegiate student-athlete.

**GUESS WHO'S BACK?**

◆ Fifth year **JuJu Redmond** returns for her extra year of eligibility, after leading the Redbirds in scoring with 13.9 points per contest and also averaging 6.1 rebounds and 2.8 assists last year.  
 ◆ **All-around player:** Redmond was the only player in the MVC to be ranked top-10 in all three of those categories: 8th in points (13.9 ppg), 9th in rebounding (6.1 rpg) and 10th in assists (2.8 apg).  
 ◆ Redmond also shot an efficient 44.5% from the floor last season, a mark that ranked fourth in the Valley and among the top-150 players nationally.  
 ◆ The 2021 All-MVC First Team selection led ISU in scoring nine times last season while finishing in double-digits in 20 of 25 games.

**NON-CONFERENCE OPPONENTS**

◆ ISU's 2021-22 non-conference schedule features five home games at Redbird Arena, two Big Ten opponents, three mid-major opponents who finished with NET rankings in the top-100 last season and a Thanksgiving trip to California.

◆ The third-best sharpshooter in the nation in terms of percentage, **Mary Crompton** has proven herself as one of the league's premier shooters, averaging 11.1 points while going 64-of-137 (46.7%) from deep last season.

◆ **In good company:** The redshirt junior joins former Redbirds **Kristi Cirone** and **Katie Broadway** as the only players to ever record multiple seasons with 60+ three-pointers. Crompton currently owns both the program's freshman (68) and sophomore (64) three-point records.

◆ Head coach **Kristen Gillespie** has called junior forward **DeAnna Wilson** ISU's "go-to presence in the post" this season after leading the team with 6.3 rebounds per game and averaging 9.2 points during her debut 2020-21 campaign with the 'Birds.

◆ After dealing with adversity early last year, Wilson broke through into the starting lineup for the final 10 games of the year, earning a spot on the Valley's All-Newcomer Team and hitting her stride, averaging 11.1 points and 7.1 rebounds in that span.

◆ Wilson was the only player in the Valley to finish in the top-five in rebounding rate on both sides of the ball a season ago (per Calvin Wetzel, Her Hoop Stats).

**ADDING EXPERIENCE**

◆ The Redbirds welcomed grad transfer **Jada Stinson** to the program back in April, a 5'8 guard out of Arkansas State who began her career at Memphis.

◆ Stinson led the Red Wolves last year in scoring (12.6 ppg), assists (6.8, 3.2 apg) and free throw percentage (75.6 percent).

◆ The Fayetteville, N.C. native played two seasons at Memphis before transferring to Arkansas State and sitting out due to NCAA transfer requirements during the 2019-20 season. Stinson started in 16 of 21 games for the Red Wolves during the 2020-21 campaign before making the decision to grad transfer at the end of the season. After competing in three total seasons, the guard will have two years of eligibility as a Redbird due to the extra year of eligibility granted due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

**JADA IN JAPAN #TOKYO2020**

◆ Grad transfer **Jada Stinson**'s summer was far from "Normal" as the newcomer had the opportunity to compete for Puerto Rico at the 2020 Olympics in Tokyo, Japan.

◆ With the call-up, Stinson became the third Illinois State women's basketball player to compete at an Olympic Games. **Charlotte Lewis** was the Redbirds' first Olympian, earning a silver medal with Team USA in Montreal in 1976 while **Cathy Boswell** won a gold medal while donning the red, white and blue at the 1984 Los Angeles Summer Games. Both players' jerseys are retired and displayed in the rafters of Redbird Arena.



◆ At the Games, Stinson saw limited action in two of three group phase games, coming off the bench in the final minutes. Puerto Rico went 0-3 in Group C (China, Belgium, Australia) in their historic

first-ever appearance at the Olympics.

◆ Stinson had been in San Juan, Puerto Rico since the beginning of May to participate in training and try-outs before the official Olympic roster announcement on July 8th. The Fayetteville, N.C. native was first called up to the national team in March of 2021 to play in the Centrobasket Tournament in El Salvador.

◆ Due to Stinson's commitments with Puerto Rico, she was unable to even visit campus prior to her commitment to play at ISU in April and first stepped foot on campus for the fall semester in August.

**'BIRDS TABBED FOURTH IN VALLEY'S PRESEASON POLL**

◆ Illinois State was picked to finish fourth in this year's MVC Preseason Poll, announced in early October and voted on by the league's coaches, sports information directors and media. The fourth-place selection is the highest preseason prediction for ISU under head coach **Kristen Gillespie**.

◆ The Redbirds finished third overall in the conference standings during the 2020-21 campaign, their highest finish since the 2012-13 season.

**BULLMAN BREAKING THROUGH**

◆ Sophomore **Kate Bullman** will play a more significant role on this year's team, after spending her freshman season playing out of position mostly as a center instead of her natural four-spot.

◆ Bullman led the 'Birds with 18 blocks last year, which ranked top-15 in the league. She was also one of just four freshmen in the nation with a block rate of over 8% and a steal rate of over 2% (per Calvin Wetzel, Her Hoop Stats).

HEAD COACH KRISTEN GILLESPIE

Introduced in April 2017 as the eighth Illinois State women's head basketball coach, Kristen Gillespie is entering her fifth year at the helm of the program in 2021-22.

Gillespie guided Illinois State to its first postseason berth in eight years during the most recent

2020-21 campaign, leading the Redbirds (16-9, 12-6 MVC) to an appearance in the WNIT. In the tournament, which was condensed from 64 to 32 teams and played at four regional sites due to COVID-19, the Redbirds also earned their first postseason win since the 2012-13 season with a 68-62 victory over Samford to make it to the Memphis Region Consolation Final.

After being picked fifth in the MVC Preseason Poll, the 2020-21 Redbirds finished third overall in the conference standings, ISU's highest finish in Coach Gillespie's tenure and for the program since 2013. The 'Birds have shown gradual improvement in the standings each year under Gillespie, also finishing better than predicted at the beginning of the season in all four years. The 2020-21 squad ended the year with a NET ranking (replaced RPI) of 60 (ISU's highest ranking since 2010), with four players earning All-MVC honors: Mary Crompton (MVC's Most Improved Player, All-MVC Honorable Mention), Julu Redmond (All-MVC First Team), Terriion Moore (All-MVC Defensive Team, All-MVC Newcomer Team) and DeAnna Wilson (All-MVC Newcomer Team).

The Redbirds put together one of their best seasons in recent years during the 2019-20 campaign, going 19-10 (11-7 MVC) and finishing with a RPI of 74. Illinois State earned its first Power Five win since 2013 in their 74-58 victory over Illinois at the State Farm Center on Nov. 16, as well as its first win over a ranked opponent in 28 years on Feb. 27 in the 78-66 defeat of No. 17/21 Missouri State at Redbird Arena. Gillespie coached four All-MVC honorees, including two All-MVC First Team members, an All-Defensive Team player and her third-straight MVC Newcomer of the Year in Julu Redmond. Redmond also picked up All-MVC Honorable Mention and MVC Sixth Player of the Year recognitions. The 'Birds finished fourth in the conference standings, the third-straight year that Gillespie's team has finished better than their MVC Preseason Poll prediction, and were on a four-game winning streak entering the MVC Tournament. Unfortunately, the conference tournament and all other postseason tournaments were canceled due to concerns over the coronavirus (COVID-19), ending the 2019-20 season prematurely.

Illinois State continued to improve in Gillespie's second season, finishing with a 19-12 (11-7 MVC) record, with one of those conference wins coming at Missouri State, who went on to appear in the NCAA Tournament's Sweet 16 in the postseason. The Redbirds made it to the semifinals of the MVC Tournament for the first time in five years, garnered MVC Newcomer of the Year honors for the second consecutive season and had two 'Birds make the MVC First Team All-Conference list.

In her first year at the helm of the program Gillespie guided the Redbirds to the most successful season the program has seen in five years. The Redbirds finished with a 14-16 overall record and secured a No. 6 seed for the Hoops in the Heartland tournament as they finished with an 8-10 conference record. Gillespie coached three MVC All-Conference honorees and her 2018-19 recruiting class was named the strongest in the Valley and top 75 in the nation by PASS.

Gillespie came to Illinois State after leading Lewis University to a 51-12 record over two seasons, including a pair of trips to the NCAA Division II Women's Basketball Tournament and one appearance in the GLVC Championship game. In her first season in Romeoville, Illinois, the Flyers won the GLVC East Division with a record of 18-0, which led Gillespie to be selected as the 2016 GLVC Coach of the Year, the WBCA Midwest Region Coach of the Year and the IBCA Division II Coach of the Year.

Prior to her time at Lewis, Gillespie coached four seasons at Benedictine University in Lisle, Illinois. In her final year in 2015, she guided the Eagles to an 18-10 record.

Before Benedictine, Gillespie spent two seasons as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at UIC from 2009-11, but her formative basketball acumen was developed at NC State under legendary head coach Kay Yow.

Gillespie was a four-year letterwinner and three-year captain for the Wolfpack from 1996-99. As a junior, she was NC State's starting point guard on the 1998 NCAA Final Four squad, and she was also selected as an Honorable Mention Academic All-American the following year as a senior.

Upon her graduation, Gillespie had brief stops as an assistant coach at both UCF (1999-2000) and UC Santa Barbara (2000-02), before returning to Raleigh, North Carolina, to pursue her master's degree at NC State as a graduate assistant under Yow. During her tenure, the Wolfpack not only advanced to the NCAA Tournament, but Gillespie played a key role in recruiting a Top-20 recruiting class in 2004.

Once she received her master's degree, Gillespie spent two years as a high school head coach at Maclay School (2005-07) in Tallahassee, Florida, before returning to Raleigh for a third time to join Yow's staff as an assistant coach and co-recruiting coordinator. In 2008, NC State went 21-13 and advanced to the WNIT Final Four. In that short span, Gillespie coached five players who played professionally, including a WNBA First Round draft pick, and she recruited the 2010 Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC) Rookie of the Year.

Four MVC teams are in the top-25 - Missouri State (3), Northern Iowa (14), Drake (22) and Bradley (23) - with ISU non-con competition UT Martin, Northern Illinois and UC Irvine all receiving votes.

## ARRIVING IN STYLE

◆ The Redbirds have had a stronghold on the MVC Newcomer of the Year title, having earned the honor in three of the last four years, including the first three years of Coach Gillespie's tenure.

◆ Fifth year **Julu Redmond** was the last 'Bird to be dubbed Newcomer of the Year during the 2019-20 campaign. Redmond is also the only Valley women's basketball player to ever earn both Newcomer and Sixth Player of the Year in the same season.

◆ Although ISU did not take home the honor last year, current Redbird **DeAnna Wilson** was one of two ISU players to be named to the league's All-Newcomer Team.

◆ **Tradition of Excellence:** Additionally, five of the last ten MVC Newcomers of the Year have hailed from ISU.

## FRESH FACES

◆ Illinois State welcomes five newcomers to the 2021-22 squad in grad transfer **Jada Stinson** (Arkansas State) and the freshmen class of **Lexi Boles** (Dowling Catholic HS), **Kenzie Bowers** (Kent City HS), **Lauren Cohen** (Glenbard South HS) and **Chloe Van Zeeland** (Kaukauna HS).

◆ **Boles**, a 6-3 forward from Des Moines, Iowa, holds the single-season blocks record at her high school, blocking 66 shots as a freshman while averaging 9.2 pts and 5.8 rebs. She was named to the 2020-21 Iowa Print Sports Writers Association

5A All-State Second Team last year.

◆ **Bowers**, a 5-9 guard from Kent City, Mich. left her high school as the first to sign with a DI basketball program and as the all-time leading scorer, girl or boy, with 1,822 career points. She led the Eagles to an 84-12 overall record with four conference titles, four district championships, two regional titles and a state finals appearance in her four years.

◆ **Cohen**, a 5-8 guard from Wheaton, Ill. was named to the 2021 Class 3A All-State Team and the Daily Herald DuPage County All-Area First Team after averaging 17 pts, 5.1 rebs and 3.8 assists her senior year at Glenbard South HS. During her time with the Raiders, Cohen made two state appearances in '18 and '19, both of which were played at Redbird Arena.

◆ **Van Zeeland**, a 6-1 forward from Kaukauna, Wis. finished her prep career as the all-time scoring leader with over 1,300 points, 600+ rebounds and 200 steals. In her senior year, Van Zeeland led the Galloping Ghosts to a 17-8 overall record and to the regional semifinals while averaging 15.2 pts, 7.8 rebs, 3.2 asts and 2.7 steals per game.

## ISU NAMED PLAY4KAY DIVISIONAL WINNER SIXTH-STRAIGHT SEASON

◆ The Redbirds were named a Play4Kay divisional winner for the sixth year in a row, as Illinois State raised more money than any other non-BCS DI school during the 2020-21 season.

◆ ISU has raised over \$200,000 for the Kay Yow Cancer Fund in their its 11 years hosting a Play4Kay game.

◆ Head coach **Kristen Gillespie** played and coached under Coach Yow at NC State, helping them to a 1998 Final Four appearance as the starting point guard during her junior year.

## BELMONT TO JOIN MVC IN 2022-23

◆ Belmont has accepted an invitation to join the Missouri Valley Conference as its 11th member institution, announced on Sept. 28, 2021. The Bruins will begin competition in the Valley in the fall of 2022.

◆ The Belmont women's basketball team is coming off a historic season which included its fifth conference tournament championship in six years and an NCAA Tournament win over Gonzaga.

GAME NOTES

**SCOTT GILLESPIE INDUCTED INTO RIPON COLLEGE ATHLETICS HALL OF FAME**

◆ Assistant coach **Scott Gillespie** was officially inducted into the Ripon College Athletics Hall of Fame at a ceremony on the campus in July.

◆ Gillespie (2007-11) was a standout for Ripon's (DIII) men's basketball team, garnering several honors in his collegiate career including: a 4x All-Conference selection, 2011 MWC Player of the Year, 2011 Second Team All-American honors and remains the school record holder for career assists (602). His scoring record (1,871 pts) was recently surpassed as he ranks second all-time in the category now, averaging 19.8 ppg during his four-year career.

◆ Gillespie joins his father, Bob Gillespie, and grandfather, Gordie Gillespie, both long-time baseball and basketball coaches, in the Ripon College Hall of Fame. Bob coached Scott all four years on the men's basketball team and his one season with the baseball team. His grandfather Gordie retired from coaching in 2010 as college baseball's all-time winningest coach, compiling 1,892 victories in his 59 years as a coach. Gordie was also the grandfather of head coach **Kristen Gillespie**, Scott's cousin.

**WBB ADDS TWO ON NATIONAL SIGNING DAY**

◆ Illinois State WBB received National Letters of Intent (NLIs) from two high school seniors for the 2022-23 season: **Abbie Aalsma** (a 5-9 guard from Waupun, Wis.) and **Taylor Veach** (a 5-11 guard from Dewitt, Iowa).

◆ Aalsma averaged 19.9 pts, 5.0 rebs, 3.3 asts and 2.9 stls to lead Waupun HS to an 18-4 overall record and East Central Conference title during the 2020-21 campaign. She is a 3x WBCA All-State honoree and was also the unanimous ECC Player of the Year in all three seasons of her prep career so far.

◆ Veach led her HS team to the Iowa Class 4A state tournament for the first time in over a decade last year, leading the Sabers in scoring (19.1 ppg), rebounding (6.1 rpg) and FG% (44.0%). She is a 3x Class 4A All-State selection who has also earned the titles of MAC Player of the Year, Clinton Herald Player of the Year, Iowa Prep Sophomore Player of the Year and Quad City Times Metro Player of the Year.

**THE VALLEY ANNOUNCES 2020-21 ACADEMIC AWARDS**

◆ 10 women's basketball student-athletes made the MVC Honor Roll, with outgoing senior **Paige Saylor** and rising redshirt-junior **Mary Crompton** earning the President's Council Academic Excellence Award, the league's highest academic honor, as announced by the league in July.

**KYLE BRENNAN ANNOUNCED AS NEW ATHLETIC DIRECTOR**

◆ **Kyle Brennan**, who previously served as Utah's chief operating officer and deputy athletics director for internal operations, officially started his position at ISU on January 15. He is entering his first full year at the helm of the department for the 2021-22 season.

◆ Brennan is ISU's 12th Director of Athletics in the NCAA DI era. He has more than 16 years of combined university and athletic department experience at Northern Illinois, TCU, Ball State and Utah.

◆ The Conference will see 37 of 50 starters return (74%) for the 2021-22 season, including seven of the 10 programs returning 4 or more starters. The Valley will see 9 of our top 10 scorers return as well as all 10 of our top 10 rebounders. 10 of our 11 first-team All-MVC selections also return in 2021-22.

## RISE OF THE VALLEY

◆ The 2020-21 season set a new league record for the highest RPI/NET conference ranking. The league also saw five teams in the NET Top 100 for the second-straight season. Just three seasons ago, the league posted its worst conference RPI, sitting 24th nationally.

◆ Valley women's basketball sent a total of six teams to the postseason in 2020-21 as Missouri State and Bradley appeared in the NCAA field, Drake, Illinois State and UNI in the WNIT and Loyola in the WBI. The six teams tied for the second most in league history (1999 and 2010). The MVC has seen an average of four league teams participate in postseason play in the last 22 seasons. The Valley has sent multiple teams into the NCAA field three of the last four tournaments, including back-to-back Sweet 16 appearances.

## FEMALE LED PROGRAMS

◆ Missouri Valley Conference women's basketball programs feature female head coaches at nine of the 10 schools. The 90% leads all of NCAA Division I. The Valley was also the top ranked mid-major league during the 2020-21 season.

## 2022 MID-MAJOR PLAYER OF THE YEAR WATCH LIST

◆ Four of 25 players named to the 2022 Becky Hammon Mid-Major Player of the Year Watch List announced on Oct. 20, hail from the Missouri Valley Conference. They include senior **Gabi Haack** (Bradley), redshirt junior **Grace Berg** (Drake), senior **Brice Calip** (Missouri State) and senior **Jasmine Franklin** (Missouri State).

## PLAYER OF THE WEEK

## JASMINE FRANKLIN, SR., F, MISSOURI STATE

◆ Franklin recorded two more double-double performances last week against Power Five foes No. 24 Virginia Tech and LSU at the San Juan Shootout in Puerto Rico. Against the 24th-ranked Hokies on Friday, Franklin dropped 21 points and 12 rebounds on 60 percent shooting from the field, while also going 9-for-10 from the free throw line. On Saturday against the Tigers, Franklin recorded her fifth double-double in six games, which ranks third in the nation, with a 13-point, 13-rebound performance. She also blocked four shots and gathered four steals against LSU. The senior ranks first nationally with 9.8 defensive rebounds per game and second in the nation with 13.8 rebounds per game. She is also the only player in NCAA Division I averaging over 15.5 ppg, 13.5 rpg, 2 spg and 2 bpg.

## NEWCOMER OF THE WEEK

## JE'NAIYA DAVIS, JR., G, EVANSVILLE

◆ In just her second game as an Ace, junior guard Je'Naiya Davis put on one of the most impressive scoring performances in UE history. Coming off the bench in an 84-71 win over Purdue Fort Wayne on Wednesday, Davis scored 35 points in just 22 minutes of action, knocking-down 4-of-7 attempts from beyond the arc and shooting 13-17 from the field. The 35 points are tied for second-most in a game in program history and sit as the program record for points in a regulation game. Davis' scoring outburst is just the third of its kind in NCAA DI since 2008-09, matching a 40-point performance from UC Davis' Morgan Bertsch in 22 minutes in 2018 and a 35-point performance in 22 minutes from Baylor's three-time all-American Brittany Griner in 2012.
