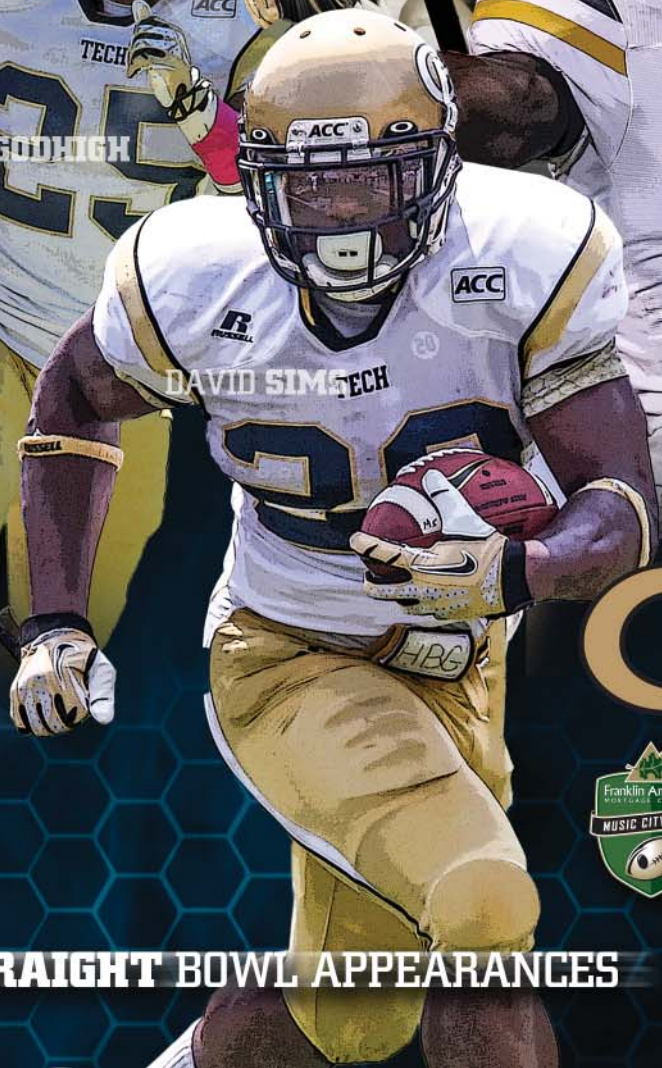

### Yellow Jackets, Rebels Music City Bound

• Extending what is now the nation's second-longest active bowl streak, Georgia Tech heads to Nashville for the Franklin American Mortgage Music City Bowl and will face the University of Mississippi on Monday, Dec. 30.  
• The game can be seen nationally on ESPN with Mark Jones, Brock Huard and Jessica Mendoza.  
• On the radio, "Voice of the Yellow Jackets" Brandon Gaudin has the call on the Georgia Tech IMG Sports Network along with analyst Rick Strom and sideline reporter Sean Bedford. The game can be heard on WYAY 106.7 FM in Atlanta and on the web at RamblinWreck.com.

### Quick Hitters

• The Yellow Jackets have rushed for more yards than any FBS team since 2008 and own the nation's sixth-leading rushing attack this season at 311.7 yards/game.  
• Georgia Tech is appearing in a bowl game for the 42nd time -- 17th consecutive -- and its .550 bowl winning percentage is ninth-best among teams with at least 25 appearances. The Jackets beat USC, 21-7, in last year's Hyundai Sun Bowl.  
• Tech finished at .500 or better for 19th consecutive season in conference play, to extend the nation's longest such streak.  
• In the five previous seasons under Paul Johnson, the Jackets' average preseason predicted finish in the Coastal Division was third place (3.0), with Tech's average actual finish checking in at 1.6 (an ACC-best difference of +1.4). This season, Tech was picked fourth, and at 5-3, finished second.  
• Tech is third in the ACC (22nd nationally) in scoring offense at 36.6 points per game, which is the second-best in the program's modern era.  
• Georgia Tech, Ohio State and Wisconsin are the only teams in the nation to rank in the top 10 nationally in both rushing offense and rushing defense. The Jackets rank sixth in rush offense, ninth in rush defense.  
• Georgia Tech is fifth nationally in third-down percentage (.525) -- the third time in Paul Johnson's six seasons that the Yellow Jackets have ranked in the top-five nationally in that category.  
• Senior DE Jeremiah Attaochu, who amassed a career-high four sacks versus Georgia, enters the Music City Bowl a half sack shy of breaking the school's career record. Attaochu is tied with Greg Gathers (31.0).  
• Attaochu's 31.0 career sacks are the most among all active FBS players, and ranked tied for fifth on the ACC's all-time list.  
• Senior A-back Robert Godhigh is one of the nation's most explosive all-around players. The 5-foot-7 former walk-on was named the 2013 recipient of the ACC's Brian Piccolo Award, which is presented annually to the league's most courageous player. Godhigh overcame three surgeries during the 2013 calendar year.  
• Godhigh has logged 1,114 yards from scrimmage (694 rush, 420 catch) and his average of 12.4 yards per play leads all running backs in the FBS. Of his 90 touches, 54 percent resulted in first downs or touchdowns.  
• Godhigh has 14 plays from scrimmage of 30+ yards, which is the fourth-most among all FBS players.  
• Five Tech players earned All-ACC honors from the media, including OG Shaq Mason (first-team) and DE Jeremiah Attaochu (second team). Running backs David Sims and Robert Godhigh, and OG Will Jackson earned honorable mention honors.  
• Senior DB Jemea Thomas will tie the school record in career games played (54) should he play in the Franklin American Mortgage Music City Bowl.

**MUSIC CITY BOWL HISTORY**

- The first Music City Bowl was played at Vanderbilt Stadium in 1998 before moving to the home of the Tennessee Titans, now known as LP Field, in 1999.
- Current ACC teams are 6-5 all-time in the Music City Bowl, but that includes wins by Virginia Tech, Syracuse and Boston College before those teams were actual ACC members.
- In actual ACC vs. SEC match-ups, the ACC is 3-5 in Music City Bowls.
- Nashville is in the Central Time Zone. Population is 1.27 million.
- LP Field seats 69,143 and has a natural grass surface.
- ESPN televises the Music City Bowl.

## The Ole Miss Series

- Georgia Tech leads the series, 2-1, splitting a pair of bowl games.
- Tech and Ole Miss will meet for the first time in 42 years, since Dec. 30, 1971 when the Rebels beat the Jackets 41-18 in the Peach Bowl.
- The last two meetings have come in bowl games. On Jan. 1, 1953, Tech beat Ole Miss 24-7 in the Sugar Bowl, capping a perfect 12-0 season en route to being crowned co-national champions that season.
- The two teams first met on the gridiron on Oct. 12, 1946 in Atlanta, a 24-7 Georgia Tech victory in the only regular season meeting.
- Tech's Paul Johnson has never coached against Ole Miss.

## Tech-Ole Miss Player Connections

- Georgia Tech has no scholarship players from Mississippi.
- Ole Miss has 12 players on its roster from Georgia – Evan Ingram (Powder Springs), Will Few (Augusta), Kyle Fowler (Johns Creek), Josh Gregory (Alpharetta), Bobby Hill (Moultrie), Mike Hilton (Fayetteville), Lavon Hooks (Atlanta), David Kamara (Loganville), Denzel Nkemdiche (Loganville), Robert Nkemdiche (Loganville), Evan Swindall (LaFayette) and Cameron Whigham (Snellville).
- Yellow Jackets Synjyn Days and Jabari Hunt-Days, and Ole Miss's Evan Ingram all played at Hillgrove High School.
- Tech's Adam Gotsis (Abbotsford) and Ole Miss' Will Gleeson (Melbourne) both hail from Australia.
- Tech quarterback Justin Thomas and Rebel OL Austin Golson both graduated from Prattville (Ala.) HS.
- Yellow Jacket quarterback Tim Byerly and Ole Miss LB Josh Gregory attended Chattahoochee HS.
- Tech's Corey Griffin and Isaiah Johnson, and Ole Miss's Mike Hilton all played at Sandy Creek HS.
- Yellow Jacket Shawn Green and Rebels David Kamara, Denzel Nkemdiche and Robert Nkemdiche all played at Grayson HS.
- In the last 20 years, Georgia Tech has signed only two players from Mississippi to letters of intent – Damarius Bilbo (Moss Point) and Kingi McNair (Pelahatchie).

## Tech-Ole Miss Staff Connections

- Ole Miss defensive coordinator Dave Wommack served in the same capacity at Georgia Tech in 2008 and 2009. Wommack's son, Kane, is a graduate assistant for the Rebels.
- Ole Miss co-offensive coordinator Matt Luke is familiar with Georgia Tech after serving as the offensive coordinator at Duke from 2008-11.
- Rebel running backs coach Derrick Nix spent the 2007 season in Atlanta as a quality control coach for the Falcons.
- Georgia Tech assistant director of player personnel Mike Cassano crossed career paths with Ole Miss co-offensive coordinator Dan Werner in 2004 and 2005 at Miami, where Cassano was an offensive assistant and Werner was a Hurricane assistant coach.
- Ole Miss athletic trainer Pat Jernigan is an Atlanta native and graduated from Valdosta State. Jernigan worked briefly at Middle Tennessee State, in 2000, when Georgia Tech assistant coach Andy McCollum was then head coach of the Blue Raiders.

## Tech's Nashville Connections

- Tech last played in Nashville on Halloween in 2009, a 56-31 win over host Vanderbilt in the Jackets' lone trip to Music City under Paul Johnson.
- Technically, the Jackets have not lost a game in Nashville in 72 years, since falling to Vanderbilt on Oct. 18, 1941. Since that loss to the Commodores, Tech has played in Nashville just seven times, going 6-0-1.
- Tech is 7-5-3 all-time in Nashville with all 15 trips coming against Vanderbilt. The Jackets were members of the SEC from 1933 to 1963.

## Tech's Tennessee Connections

- The Yellow Jackets are 14-18-4 all-time when playing in the Volunteer State, including a 7-5-3 mark at Vanderbilt, 4-13-1 at Tennessee, 1-0 at Memphis, 1-0 at Middle Tennessee State and a win over Iowa State in the 1972 Liberty Bowl in Memphis.
- One of Tech's most famous victories came against Cumberland (located in Lebanon, Tenn.). The Jackets beat Cumberland 222-0 – the largest margin of victory in college football history – in Atlanta on Oct. 7, 1916.
- Tech has two players from Tennessee and they're both starters on the offensive line – Will Jackson (Knoxville) and Shaquille Mason (Columbia).
- Former Yellow Jacket Derrick Morgan plays for the Tennessee Titans. The Titans host Houston, with former Jacket Andrew Gardener, at LP Field a day before the Franklin American Mortgage Music City Bowl.
- Tech assistant coach Andy McCollum began his coaching career at Middle Tennessee State (1981-88) and returned as the Blue Raiders' head coach from 1999 to 2005.
- Tech assistant coach Dave Walkosky coached at Memphis from 1992 to 1994 as a graduate assistant (1992-93) and assistant coach (1994). Walkosky was an assistant coach at UT-Martin from 1997 to 1998.
- Georgia Tech director of player personnel Matt Griffin was the head coach at Tennessee-Martin from 2003-06, and he was an assistant coach for the Pacers in 1997 and 1998.
- Yellow Jacket defensive line coach Mike Pelton served as an assistant coach at Vanderbilt in 2010.
- Tech director of strength & conditioning John Sisk served as strength coach at Vanderbilt from 2001-2010.
- Legendary Tech football coach Bobby Dodd played QB for the University of Tennessee from 1928 to 1930.

### Tech Notebook

Tech's five losses this season were to teams that are all bowl eligible with a combined record of 43-17. Four of the teams are ranked or receiving votes in at least one of the top 25 polls.

- The Jackets played nine teams this season that are in bowl games.
- Tech's scoring average of 36.6 points per game is the second-highest in the modern era (since 1950). The school's modern record is 40.7 ppg in 1999.

- Tech began the season 3-0, marking the second 3-0 start in the last three years, but just the third in the last 12 years. Tech started 2-0 in the ACC for the second time under Paul Johnson (2011).

- The Jackets defeated Elon 70-0, Syracuse 56-0 and Alabama A&M 66-7 this season to move Paul Johnson to 20-0 at Tech when surpassing 40 points.

- The shutouts to Elon and Syracuse mark Tech's first since 2008 -- and mark the first time since 1985 that Tech recorded two shutouts in the same season.

- Tech's 38-14 win at Duke was the Jackets' 10th consecutive win in the series.
- Overcoming two different 13-point deficits, Tech defeated UNC, 28-20 -- its fifth straight win over the Heels.

- Tech scored 136 points through its first three games in 2013 -- the second-most through three games over the program's last 50 seasons.

- After averaging 6.0 penalties over the first six games of the season, Georgia Tech was flagged just 3.7 times per games over the final six games (the second-fewest penalties in the ACC over that span).

- Tech led Miami 17-0 in the first quarter, and was within one (24-23) in the fourth quarter before three straight Hurricane touchdowns.

- Tech's margin of victory in the Syracuse win (56-0) was its largest ever in an ACC game and ranks as the eighth-largest all-time in ACC conference games.

- Tech has amassed more than 400 yards of total offense in 10 of the 12 games this season -- Virginia Tech (273) and Pitt (360) held Tech below 400.

- Zach Laskey (133), Robert Godhigh (111) and David Sims (107) all rushed for 100 yards in the Virginia win -- the first time in modern Georgia Tech history (since 1950) that three different Yellow Jackets have rushed for 100 yards.

- The Jackets beat both of the ACC's newcomers -- Pitt and Syracuse -- by a combined score of 77-10.

- Robert Godhigh racked up 229 all-purpose yards at Clemson (126 rushing, 103 receiving) and became the first Jacket since Orwin Smith in 2011 to rush and receive for 100 yards in a game.

- In the regular-season finale, Tech jumped on Georgia 20-0 early and led 27-17 in the fourth quarter before surrendering the lead and falling to its rival in double overtime.

- Jeremiah Attaochu's four sacks against Georgia were the third-most single-game sacks in Georgia Tech history.

- Vad Lee rushed for two touchdowns and passed for two touchdowns against Georgia. The last time a Georgia Tech player had at least two rushing touchdowns and two passing TDs in the same game was Joshua Nesbitt on Oct. 31, 2009 against Vanderbilt.

- Based on available records, Georgia Tech is 31-30 all-time when playing in a pro sports venue.

### Tech's All-ACC Selections

Junior OG Shaquille Mason and senior DE Jeremiah Attaochu were named to the All-ACC teams announced by the Atlantic Coast Sports Media Association (ACSMA). Mason was named to the first team and Attaochu earned second-team honors. Three Jackets - senior RBs Robert Godhigh and David Sims, and senior OG Will Jackson -- were named honorable mention. The Coaches' All-ACC Team will be announced Dec. 11.

### Seniors Say Farewell

For 17 Georgia Tech seniors, the bowl game will mark an end to their respective collegiate careers. Over the last four years, this senior class has played in three bowl games (and will play in a fourth) and played in the 2012 ACC Championship game. Many redshirted as true freshmen in 2009 when Tech played in the ACC title game and the Orange Bowl.

### Coastal Living

Since the ACC began divisional play in 2005, Georgia Tech has won the third-most conference games in that span. Tech has averaged five ACC wins over this eight-year span and claimed the Coastal three times.

### Model Of Consistency

Finishing 5-3 in the ACC this season, Georgia Tech clinched its 19th consecutive season of finishing .500 or better in conference play -- extending the nation's longest such streak.

- Tech has won 47 games over the last six seasons combined for an average of 7.8 wins per season.

- Including the 2013 season, the Jackets have finished .500 or better overall in 15 of the last 16 seasons.

### D-Lightful Improvement

- Last year Tech's opponents averaged 2.52 points per possession. This season, just 1.80.
- Tech has allowed 35 touchdowns this season. Last year the Yellow Jackets allowed 51 touchdowns.
- The Jackets did not allow a play from scrimmage of over 17 yards in the win over Pittsburgh.
- Tech's defense has allowed just seven running plays of 20 yards or more all season.

### Attaochu Ties Tech's Sack Records

• Senior DE and All-American candidate Jeremiah Attaochu had a monster game in the Tech's regular-season finale versus Georgia, recording a career-best four sacks and moving into a tie for the Yellow Jackets' career sacks record with Greg Gathers (1999-02).

• Attaochu was a second-team All-ACC selection by the media this season (Coaches' All-ACC team announced on Dec. 11).

• The 31.0 career sacks by Attaochu lead all active players in the NCAA and rank fifth on the ACC's career lists. Attaochu has more sacks in his career than former ACC standouts Julius Peppers (30.5), Calvin Pace (29.0) and Mario Williams (25.5).

• Attaochu's four sacks against Georgia were the third-most single-game sacks in Tech history.

• Although not an official category, Attaochu has more career sack yards (223) than any player in Tech history.

• Attaochu's 43.0 career TFL are the sixth-most in Tech history.

• The senior is on a late-season sack surge, collecting 10 over the last five games, after just one over the first four games.

## The Little Guy Makes Big Plays

Robert Godhigh is a remarkable story. The 5-foot-7 A-back came to Georgia Tech as a walk-on and toiled on the scout team for two years. As a sophomore in 2011, he emerged as a blocking specialist and saw duty as a reserve. He's now started every game the past two seasons.

Overcoming three surgeries during the 2013 calendar year, Godhigh was named the ACC's Brian Piccolo Award winner, presented annually to the league's most courageous player.

He's Tech's most proficient at moving the chains -- 54 percent of his offensive touches result in first downs or touchdowns (34 of 69 rushes and 15 of 21 catches).

He's even better on third downs, touching the ball 13 times and converting 10 first downs (77 percent).

He put up career numbers at Clemson where he set career highs in both rushing (126) and receiving (103), becoming the first Tech player since 2011 to rush and catch for 100 yards in a game. He had four plays from scrimmage of 30+ yards at Clemson and scored twice on the ground.

A big-play machine, Godhigh has exploded for 14 plays from scrimmage of 30+ yards, which ranks fourth in the NCAA.

Among running backs nationally, Godhigh's 12.4 all-purpose yards per play average is the highest.

Of Godhigh's 1,114 yards from scrimmage this season, 445 yards (40.0 percent) have come after contact.

His last four games vs. FBS foes have been significant -- 35 carries, 397 yards, 11.5 avg., five touchdowns.

Of all the players in the history of the ACC who rushed for 1,000 career yards, Godhigh's 9.13 yards per carry average stands just shy of the ACC record. Tech players occupy seven of the top 11 spots on the ACC's career list.

## Second Half Is Godhigh Time

Godhigh has 16 career touchdowns, including six over the last five games. Ten of his 16 career TDs have been via rushing, six via receiving. Eleven of his 15 touchdowns have come on the road.

- More noteworthy is that 13 of Godhigh's 16 career touchdowns have come in the second half.
- Tech is 9-2 in games that Godhigh reaches the end zone.

## Running For Miles

Since Paul Johnson arrived on Georgia Tech's campus prior to the 2008 season -- Tech has rushed for more yards than any FBS team in the nation.

The Jackets have surpassed 24,000 yards rushing since 2008 and are the only team averaging more than 300 yards on the ground in that span.

- Since 2008, Tech's 24,102 yards equates to 13.7 miles.

## Tech: Second In Red Zone TD Pct.

Georgia Tech has scored 39 touchdowns on its 48 red-zone possessions this season, and its touchdown percentage of 81.3 is second in the FBS to Ohio State's 83.3.

Tech is 18th nationally (third in the ACC) in overall Red Zone offense, scoring 89.6 percent of the time (39 touchdowns, four field goals).

Defensively, the Jackets have been just as proficient -- ranking first in the ACC and 20th nationally by allowing 28 scores (24 TDs, four FGs) in 37 opponent possessions (75.7).

## Efficient Offense

Georgia Tech has reached the end zone on 42 percent of its drives this season (59 of 141), the eighth-highest percentage in the FBS of turning drives into touchdowns.

- Florida State is the national leader, scoring TDs on 52 percent of its drives.
- The Yellow Jackets are also eighth nationally in fewest offensive three-and-outs, logging just 28 this season -- a percentage of 19.0.

## Four 1,000-Yard Rushers

In the regular season finale against Georgia, sophomore quarterback Vad Lee became the 43rd player in Georgia Tech history -- and the fourth current Yellow Jacket -- to eclipse 1,000 career rushing yards.

Only eight FBS schools have more career 1,000-yard rushers -- Tech's bowl foe, Ole Miss, is one of those eight.

Lee joined current Jackets -- senior David Sims (2,214 yards), junior Zach Laskey (1,155) and senior Robert Godhigh (1,141) -- in the 1,000-yard club.

- Godhigh has accumulated 1,141 yards on just 125 rushing attempts.
- Lee is one of five quarterbacks in Tech history to rush for 1,000 yards.

- Seven of Thomas' nine career INTs have come in the fourth quarter, including four in which Georgia Tech led by two touchdowns or less.
- Tech is 5-3 in games that Thomas has an interception (he had two INTs in one game, vs. Clemson in 2011).
- Eight of his interceptions have come in ACC games, and the ninth was versus Georgia this season.
- Thomas' fourth-quarter INT in the 2012 ACC Championship Game gave Tech the ball with a chance to tie or take the lead in the eventual loss to Florida State.
- Thomas' interceptions have come against some of the top quarterbacks in recent ACC history, including Clemson Heisman Trophy candidate Tajh Boyd and current NFL players E.J. Manuel and Sean Renfree.

### Ironman iPod

- Jemea Thomas is just the 11th Yellow Jacket in history to play 50+ career games, and will tie Tech's record of 54 games played should he play in the bowl game.
- Jemea Thomas, nicknamed "iPod" by his teammates, had a monster game at Virginia, making a career-high 15 tackles (12 solo) and breaking up two passes. It was the most tackles by a Tech player since Morgan Burnett made 16 versus Georgia in 2009.
- He was named the ACC's co-Defensive Back of the Week for the Uva effort -- Thomas' second career ACC weekly honor and first since 2011. He repeated as the ACC's DBOW on Nov. 4 following the Pitt win.
- Thomas had a team-high seven tackles in the 56-0 win over Syracuse and his strip sack of QB Terrel Hunt was a key play in the second quarter that gave Tech the ball and a short field.
- Says defensive coordinator Ted Roof: "He's one of the best corners I've ever coached...he finishes with a purpose."

### Backfield Leader

- Senior B-back David Sims has put together back-to-back strong seasons and will finish his career with over 2,200 yards rushing. The St. Matthews, S.C., native rushed for 612 yards and four touchdowns last season, battling through a nagging injury.
- Sims is the **ONLY** running back in the nation with one or fewer negative rushes this season with a minimum of 100 attempts.
- In fact, Sims' first and only negative rush this season came at Clemson, snapping a streak of 171 consecutive carries without going in reverse, dating to last November vs. Duke.
- Sims has reached the end zone at least once in 12 of the last 17 games.
- After setting his career high of 99 yards on two previous occasions, Sims finally broke the 100-yard rushing mark this season at Virginia -- and his second of two rushing touchdowns put the game on ice with 1:55 left in the fourth quarter.
- The senior is coming off back-to-back 100-yard efforts, going for 111 yards and a touchdown versus Alabama A&M and 100 yards on a career-high 21 carries versus Georgia.
- Sims enters the bowl season fifth in the ACC in rushing (70.5). His 12 touchdowns this year are a career high and ranked tied for sixth in the league.
- In last year's Hyundai Sun Bowl win over USC, Sims established his previous career-high of 99 yards rushing and caught a TD pass.

### Sims Career Milestone Watch

- David Sims (2,214 career rushing yards) ranks 12th in Tech history. He is 12 yards shy of overtaking former QB Tevin Washington (2009-12) in 11th place, 61 yards shy of David Sims (1974-76) in 10th place and 152 yards shy from C.J. Williams (1994-96) in ninth.
- He surpassed 2,000 career yards at Clemson, becoming just the 13th 2,000-yard rusher in school history.
- For his career, Sims averages 5.17 yards per carry, which ranks 12th in Tech history.
- With his 23 career rushing touchdowns, he has tied PJ Daniels (2002-05) in seventh place.

## Paul Johnson: Impressive Numbers

• Johnson was the first coach in ACC history to be named Coach of the Year in each of his first two seasons.

• Only four coaches in ACC history won more games in their first four seasons than Johnson.

• Johnson is 6-2 at home against top 25 opponents.  
 • Johnson has at least eight wins in 13 of his 16 seasons as a head coach.

• Since head coach Johnson arrived at Georgia Tech, his Yellow Jacket teams have averaged 8.2 wins per season – the most of any Tech head coach. In second is Bobby Dodd, whose teams averaged 7.5 wins per year over 22 seasons.

• In 15 of the Jackets' 47 wins under Johnson, Tech trailed by seven points or more.

• A Yellow Jacket has earned Academic All-ACC honors 16 times in Paul Johnson's five seasons at Georgia Tech, and Tech's APR score has improved in each season under Johnson.

• Tech has scored 18 non-offensive touchdowns in Paul Johnson's five seasons as head coach (including three this season).

• Only four teams in Georgia Tech history rushed for 300 yards per game. Three of those teams have been under Johnson.

• In six seasons at Tech, Paul Johnson is 12-5 in games decided by five points or less. Since '04, when Johnson was at Navy, his teams are 25-11 in games decided by five points or less.

• Johnson has defeated all 13 other ACC opponents at least once, including newcomers Pitt and Syracuse.

## Johnson Exceeds Expectations

• No other team in the ACC has exceeded expectations like Georgia Tech, since Paul Johnson's arrival on the Flats in 2008.

• In the five seasons under Johnson, the Yellow Jackets' average pre-season predicted finish in the Coastal Division has been third place (3.0), with Tech's average actual finish checking in at 1.6 (a difference of +1.4).

• The Jackets were pegged fourth in the Coastal Division in this season's pre-season media poll, behind Miami, Virginia Tech and North Carolina -- Tech plays those three games in succession between Sept. 21 and Oct. 5.
