series notes

- The 2003 season opener will mark the 11th meeting between the two schools in football, although the Deacons and Golden Eagles have not met on the gridiron in more than 50 years.
- Boston College leads the all-time series, 5-3-2.
- All 10 previous meetings came between 1941 and 1953 with nine of the 10 meetings held in Boston.
- Wake's first win in the series came on Sept. 21, 1946 in the season opener - a 20-6 victory on the road.
- This games marks the fourth time WFU will open its season against the Eagles. The two teams also kicked off the 1946, 1950 and 1951 seasons - all in Boston.
- BC coach Tom O'Brien previously served six years as offensive coordinator at Virginia.
- Both head coaches - WFU's Jim Grobe (Air Force) and BC's O'Brien (Navy) - previously worked as assistant coaches at service academies.

- The Wolfpack has won three straight meetings against the Deacons, but WFU has prevailed in two of the last three games at Groves Stadium.
- WFU has defeated the 'Pack 31 times over the years, the second-most wins against any ACC rival.
- The Wake Forest-NC State series is the second-most played rivalry in Deacon history, as 2003 marks the 97th meeting on the gridiron. Only North Carolina (99) has played more games versus WFU.
- The last time NC State served as WFU's home opener (1999), the Deacs upset the 25th-ranked 'Pack, 31-7.
- The Deacs and 'Pack have played to a tie more times (6) than any other WFU rivalry.
- James Brim set a single-game record with 15 receptions versus NC State in 1986. That mark was tied by Marlon Estes - again versus NCSU - in 1995.

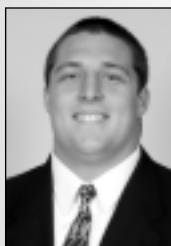
