

Visited ICDS Centre

The Integrated Child Development Services (ICDS) scheme is the country's most comprehensive and multidimensional programme.

The ICDS scheme (one of the world's <sup>largest</sup> highest, biggest and most unique programme for early child development) was launched on 2nd October 1975 under the 5th five year plan and in pursuance of the National policy for children in the 33 experimental blocks.

The ICDS is the most unique programme implemented by Department of Women and Child Development Ministry of Resources Development at the centre and nodal departments at the state which may be Social Welfare, Rural development and Tribal Welfare, Health and family welfare and Women and Child Development.

### Objectives of ICDS:-

The objectives of ICDS scheme are -

- To improve the nutritional and health status in the age group 0 to 6 years.
- To lay the foundations for proper psychological, physical and social development of the child.
- To reduce the incidence of ~~mortality~~, malnutrition and school dropout.
- To achieve effective co-ordination of policy and implementation amongst the various departments to promote child development.
- To enhance the capability of the mother to look after the normal health and nutritional needs of the child through proper nutrition and health education.

## SUMMARY OF THE ACTIVITIES OF THE ICDS CENTRE

The ICDS centre provided us with many informations regarding the various health and non-health referral service to its beneficiaries:-

- Age of the beneficiaries from children aged 0-5 years, lactating mother
- The ICDS centre serves nearly 25-26 candidates.

### Supplementary nutrition provision:-

- As full meal, they provide food on a 6 day basis in a week. On three days, they provide rice, egg and on other three days, they provide rice with dal, soyabean curry, other vegetables with half egg and banana.
- As special supplementary food they provide laddoo made of greengram dal, jaggery and peanut etc.

### Referral Services:-

- They provide health check up camp, twice in a month which is generally done on Thursdays where vaccinations are given. The health check up are done in the presence of medical personnel.
- They conduct regular classes on the maintenance of sanitation and hygiene to the beneficiaries.
- They monitor the growth of the children with WHO recommended growth chart every month.
- The workers also provides information about the importance of colostrum to the lactating mother. They discuss about the health products which should be performed during lactating period of the normal mother along with importance of breast care.

Teacher's Signature .....

- Nutrition education is also given to the lactating women which includes various health guidance.
- The workers teach the pre-schoolers various English poems and give pre-primary education which includes mathematics (basic form), rhyme etc.

The overall growth pattern of the children in the visited ICDS centre was found to be satisfactory and it can be said that the workers in the centre are providing the correct service to the beneficiaries.



## PEOPLE'S BIODIVERSITY REGISTER

Under the Biological Diversity Act, 2002 (No 18 of 2003), notified by the Government of India on 5th February 2003, it is mandatory that a People's Biodiversity Register to be maintained by Urban local body and validated by Biodiversity Management Committee (BMC). The Register shall contain comprehensive information on the availability and knowledge of local biological resources including Flora and Fauna and their uses (medicinal, etc). The preparation of a PBR involves the active support and cooperation of several people who share their common and specialized knowledge. In an urban situation, area where biodiversity's important need to be identified for the purpose of the study and documentation. The documentation process includes gathering information from individuals through online web entry of data, detailed questionnaires, focus groups discussions with local persons having knowledge and published secondary information.

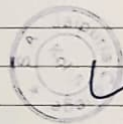

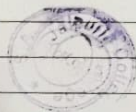
