The Blessings of a Grandparent

I am incredibly lucky and blessed to still have two grandparents alive and vibrant. My grandfather, especially, holds an incredibly soft spot in my heart. I consider him the reason I have been afforded the life I live, because of his relentless work ethic and his welcoming nature of everyone. This August he will be celebrating his 90th birthday. What an amazing simcha! Grandparents are both a privilege and a luxury. To have close grandparents not only means to learn from great experience but also to be unconditionally loved. I see this in the way my own parents treat my daughters; as if they could do no wrong and wallets are eternally open for business.

One of the most memorable scenes in the Torah involves Jacob and his blessings for his grandsons, Ephraim and Menasseh, or as many of you know it as the "Priestly Blessings." In Genesis 48:11 Jacob states "I never even hoped to see your [Joseph's] face, but now God has even let me see your

children." The raw emotion of this moment displays how meaningful it was for Jacob, who not only thought he had lost Joseph but came full circle to meet his grandchildren.

I write my *Aaronian* articles over a month in advance (due to printing times). As of this writing, I sit at my desk in a terrible amount of agony over two shootings; one in central Tel Aviv and the other in Orlando. Both were horrific acts of violence to people who will never see their loved ones again. These were people taken far too young because of senseless hatred towards Jews, Israelis, homosexuals and human beings. These innocent lives were taken without mercy to who might now live without them. The pain caused in so many lives was unbearable.

Symbolically, today I booked my ticket to Tel Aviv. I felt proud to press "purchase" in light of the tragedies. I think I got that sense of pride from my grandfather, who is not the most religious person I know but a deeply proud and committed Jew. In the Talmud Kiddushin 30a we learn "Rabbi Joshua ben Levi said, "Whoever teaches his grandson Torah is regarded as if he had received the Torah from Mount Sinai as it is said, 'Teach your children and children's children.'" In a sense my Papa has been teaching me for 90 years and I owe him a great deal of gratitude. It is important that we continue to teach Torah to our children and our children's children. And at the same time help the world heal with that same Torah.

In our Shabbat morning service we say; "May we see the day when war and bloodshed cease, when a great peace will embrace the whole world." May all of our lives and relationships to family, friends and strangers be like that of a grandparent. May this be a world full of love, compassion and an infinite amount of teachings to better understand ourselves, each other and everyone around us.



The Day the Jewish People Mourned

We walked into a darkened sanctuary. People lined the floor, some sitting cross-legged against the back wall of the sanctuary, others leaning up against the pews. Still others sat on the steps up to the bima. People were everywhere. Children were everywhere. It was night, dark outside. People held candles, or flashlights, faces iridescent in the glow of the flame with just enough light to make out the words of the Book of Eicha, the Book of Lamentations in front of them.

It was Tisha B'Av. We were in Jerusalem. And, an entire congregation of people gathered together for a late night reading of the Book of Eicha, the book that tells the story of the fall of Jerusalem, a city once great that now lay weeping in ruins.

Tisha B'Av, which literally translates to the 9th of the month of Av, marks the saddest day of the year in the

Jewish calendar. This is the day that the Jewish people mourn for not only the destruction of one Temple but two. This is the day that the Jewish people mourn that the Israelites who lost faith in the desert will never be allowed to enter the Land of Israel. And, this is the night when we mourn the destruction of the city of Beitar and the brutal murder of many Jews at the hands of Roman conquerors.

Tisha B'Av, like Yom Kippur, is the only other major fast day in the Jewish calendar, meaning we fast from sunset to sunset, in an effort to fully focus on the seriousness of the day before us. But, Tisha B'Av is not only about ancient losses, of a people and a temple long gone, but has come to be a day when we mourn the losses of our times. In the Middle Ages, Tisha B'Av came to include the many expulsions of the Jewish people from countries like England and Spain and for us, Tisha B'Av can be a time to reflect on the tragedies and losses suffered in our days as a result of war and violence, prejudice and hate.

Tisha B'Av commemorates the fall of the two Temples, which fell respectively at the hands of two different conquerors in 586 BCE and 70 CE, but it's also about much more than that. Tisha B'Av is a day for all of us, for all time, to reflect on the violence and instability in the world, the fragility of human life, and the pervasive forces that seek to disturb peace in every age. But, Tisha B'Av is not just a day of mourning and sadness. It is also an opportunity for rebuilding and hope. The city of Jerusalem, that lay in ruins in the beginning of the Book of Eicha, was rebuilt. Hope was restored to the walls of the city. And, so too, Tisha B'Av can be a day of looking forward, looking toward peace, and coming together in community.

Join us as the Jewish community of St. Paul, across synagogues and denominations, comes together as one people to observe this coming Tisha B'Av on Saturday night, August 13 at 9:15pm hosted at the Temple of Aaron. We'll begin with a brief learning and then turn to a beautiful and haunting reading of the Book of Eicha, led by members of all three synagogues (Temple of Aaron, Mt. Zion, Beth Jacob), at 9:45pm.

We look forward to being in community with you on this day of communal mourning and reflection.

In July I had my first chance to visit Camp Ramah in Wisconsin. I grew up attending JCC day camp in New Jersey and then Ramah Poconos for several years. Growing up attending Jewish summer camps gave me skills and experiences that are vital to who I have become today. There is truly nothing like a good Jewish Summer Camp experience as it can shape who you are in so many ways.

This is the precise reason Temple of Aaron leadership and generous donors have put so much emphasis on transformative Jewish camping and Israel experiences. We are so thankful to all of those who have made it possible for our youth to have these amazing Jewish experiences and opportunities during the summer months.

One program has just been launched this summer and we hope families take more advantage of it in the year to come: Judaism 365.This one-of-a-kind

program combining Temple of Aaron Hebrew/Religious school with a Jewish summer camp experience.

This new program for currently enrolled students in 4th, 5th, and 6th grade, will offer 50% scholarship for up to four weeks for an approved Jewish summer camp experience. The scholarship is a commitment to year-round Jewish experiences for Temple of Aaron's youth. All enrolled students (4th-6th grades) are eligible to receive this scholarship as it is not based on merit or need. Jewish summer camps play a vital role in developing Jewish identity, friendships and life-skills; and encourages home observances, synagogue-based program participation and community celebrations. The goal is to provide youth with an optimal immersive Jewish experience through Temple of Aaron and the Jewish summer camp opportunity. This is a three year pilot program so get your child enrolled today!

I am ecstatic that we are able to do this for the youth of our community and that we have so many local Jewish camps for our students to chose from. I am also thankful I get to visit some many of these camps and see our youth in action as campers and staff. I urge all of us to get our students involved in Jewish education programs like Judaism 365 as we shape the Jewish leaders of tomorrow.


