



### Next Week in Jerusalem! Israel Comes Alive for Our Temple of Aaron Tour Group

In just a week's time, 15 of us from the Temple of Aaron will be setting off on a trip to Israel. The group includes: Roxanne and Gary Portnoy, Gary's brother Neil and sister-in-law Sharon Portnoy, Bob and Barbara Weinstine, Cheryl, George, Manny, Elias, and Ellie Bier, Terry and Chaya Zien, Susan Gonzalez, and Sue Rosner. We'll land in the seaside city of Tel Aviv, at once a mix of old and new as the ancient port of city of Jaffa collides with high-tech and fancy glass, multi-story malls. We'll continue up North to the artist colony of Tzfat where we'll revel in a city painted in turquoise, its walls and prayer spaces, its markets and stones. We'll raft down the Jordan River and visit

an Ethiopian Culture center, learning about the Ethiopian exodus to Israel and how they made their way. And, ultimately we'll end in Jerusalem, where we'll spend four days together as we visit the Western Wall, climb the heights of Mount Masada, and delight in the saltiness of the Dead Sea, all while Bat Mitzvah-ing two of our members in a special ceremony at Robinson's Arch.

Israel is a place whose stones are filled with history, so many stories and voices, perspectives and memories, calling out waiting to be heard. In preparation for this trip, I've been immersing myself in these voices, reading book after a book on Israel, trying to get a better sense of its depth and history. I've read *Like Dreamers* by Yossi Klein HaLevi, which documents the different paths of the paratroopers of the 55th Brigade, one of the units credited with the capture of Jerusalem in '67. Through the stories of these men, from kibbutzniks to secularists to religious Zionists, we see expressed a complicated love for Israel that spreads the political spectrum, including a deep range of opinions. I turned to Danny Gordis' book *Israel: A Concise History* (which incidentally is not so concise), which attempts to present a balanced picture of Israel's history, following the developing of the State from the early inklings of Modern Zionism in the late 19th century to the rising tensions in the '20s and '30s to the formation of the State and the successive wars of security and borders in the latter half of the 20th century.

What struck me in all of my reading is that the history of Israel, the many different perspectives and narratives, is as complex as our relationship to Torah. Just as the rabbis taught that the Torah was given with 70 faces in 70 languages, so too Israel has 70 faces, a different face, a different narrative for each person who lives there. Just as with Torah, we seek out new perspectives and meanings, so too with Israel, I hope that we can continue learning and listening about Israel with an open heart and mind. In doing so, we will learn and grow, clarifying our own perspectives and better understanding those of another.



little more in-depth before we had dessert. It's amazing how Israel has secular schools, religious schools and specialty schools free to everyone. This all comes as a burden to the taxpayers, but it really is amazing the wonderful option the children in Israel have to get a great education.

The whole family was warm and welcoming. We asked them how they felt in terms of being safe and raising a family in Israel and they shared with us their journey as they lived in many countries. Israel felt much safer to them compared to London and several other countries they lived in over the years. We had the same experience as we went to Paris for a few days after our trip and

Israel felt much safer. Being in Israel is magical. It's peaceful and it's a second home. We would like to thank the Swartz Family for generously allowing us to attend this trip.
