Since I have been a Rabbi in Saint Paul, our Jewish Federation has hosted their annual dinner at Temple of Aaron. What an honor and privilege! We have hosted some amazing talent and speakers including Senator Al Franken and the Maccabeats. This year is no exception as Temple of Aaron once again will host the event and it will feature legendary Israeli singer David Broza. I hope you can all join and support our Federation.

Recently, I was in a meeting for a board in which I serve and there was a pitch from a Federation spokesman about the importance of Jewish Federations. 





Homeless Youth Need Help

There are over 4,000 homeless youth in Minnesota with majority in metro area. Many left home because it is no longer safe or have families that are unstable.

In 2011, Beacon Interfaith Housing Collaborative established a task force of four St. Paul congregations including Temple of Aaron Social Action Committee (represented by Howard Goldman) to identify pressing housing

needs. After hearing from housing experts, the task force is developing a new apartment building (Prior Crossing) in St Paul to house homeless youth. It will be the only one of its kind in St Paul and the 44 units will open this September.

A congregational team is coordinating the opening and meeting initial needs of the incoming residents through a donation program. Each new resident will receive household items needed for independent living. The Prior Crossing closet will be stocked by volunteer donations and coordinated by



member Irene Goldman. Donations will be gratefully accepted at Temple of Aaron. We need: new or gently used full or double size sheet sets, towel sets, silverware, brooms, dustpans, mid to large size frying pans, midsize pans with lids, dish sets, serving utensils, cooking utensils and full or queen size blankets/comforters. New only: pillows, shower curtain liners, bath/

body soap, dish soap, dish sponge, laundry soap, tall trash can, tooth brush, toothpaste, cleaning spray, toilet brush cleaner and brush. All dishes must be microwave safe. No tea cups/ saucers.
