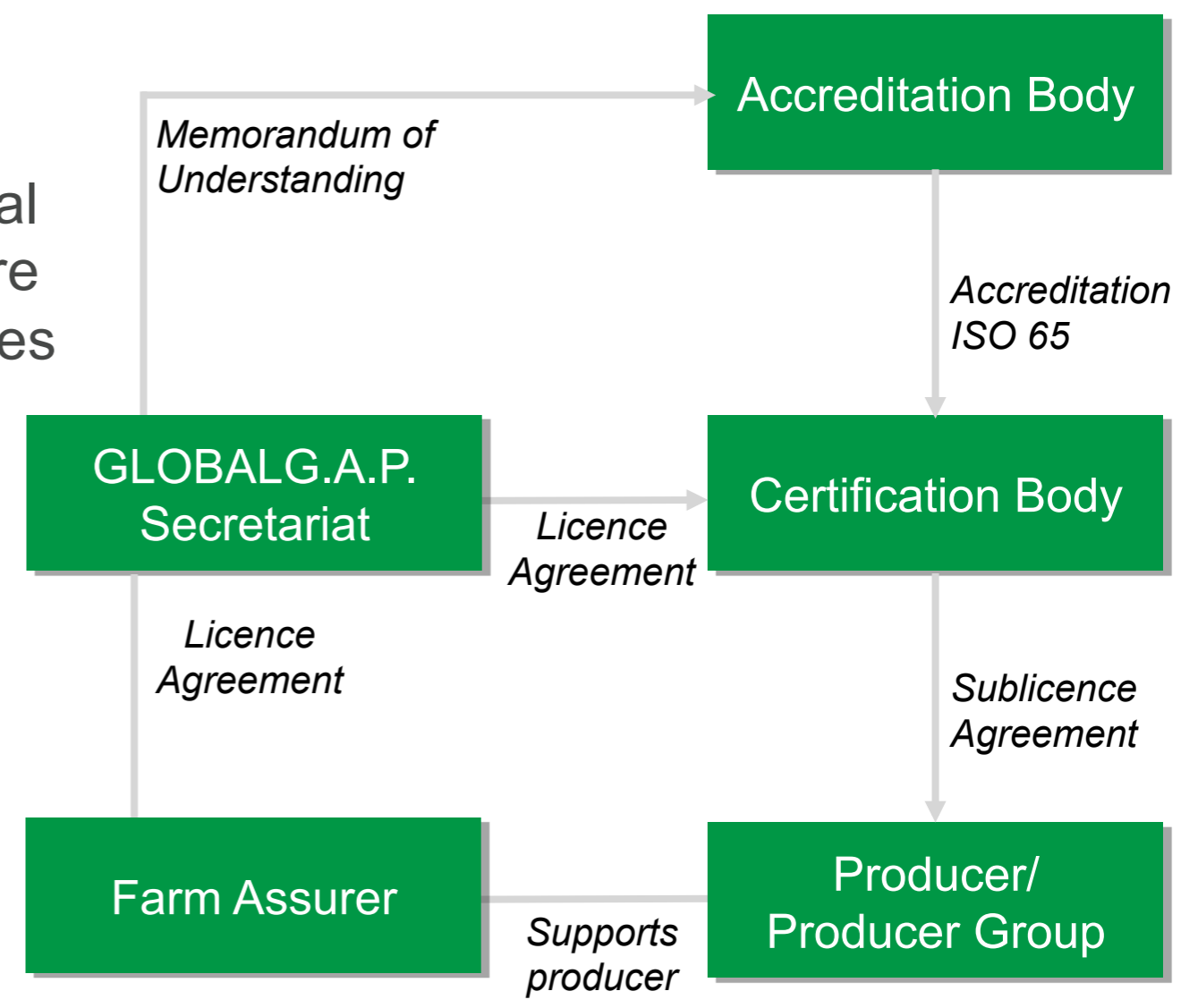
INDEPENDENT ACCREDITED 3RD PARTY CERTIFICATION

- All certification bodies (CB) must be ISO 65 accredited
- Restricting initial non-accredited certification activities
- All certification bodies have had external system and witness assessments before entering large scale certification activities

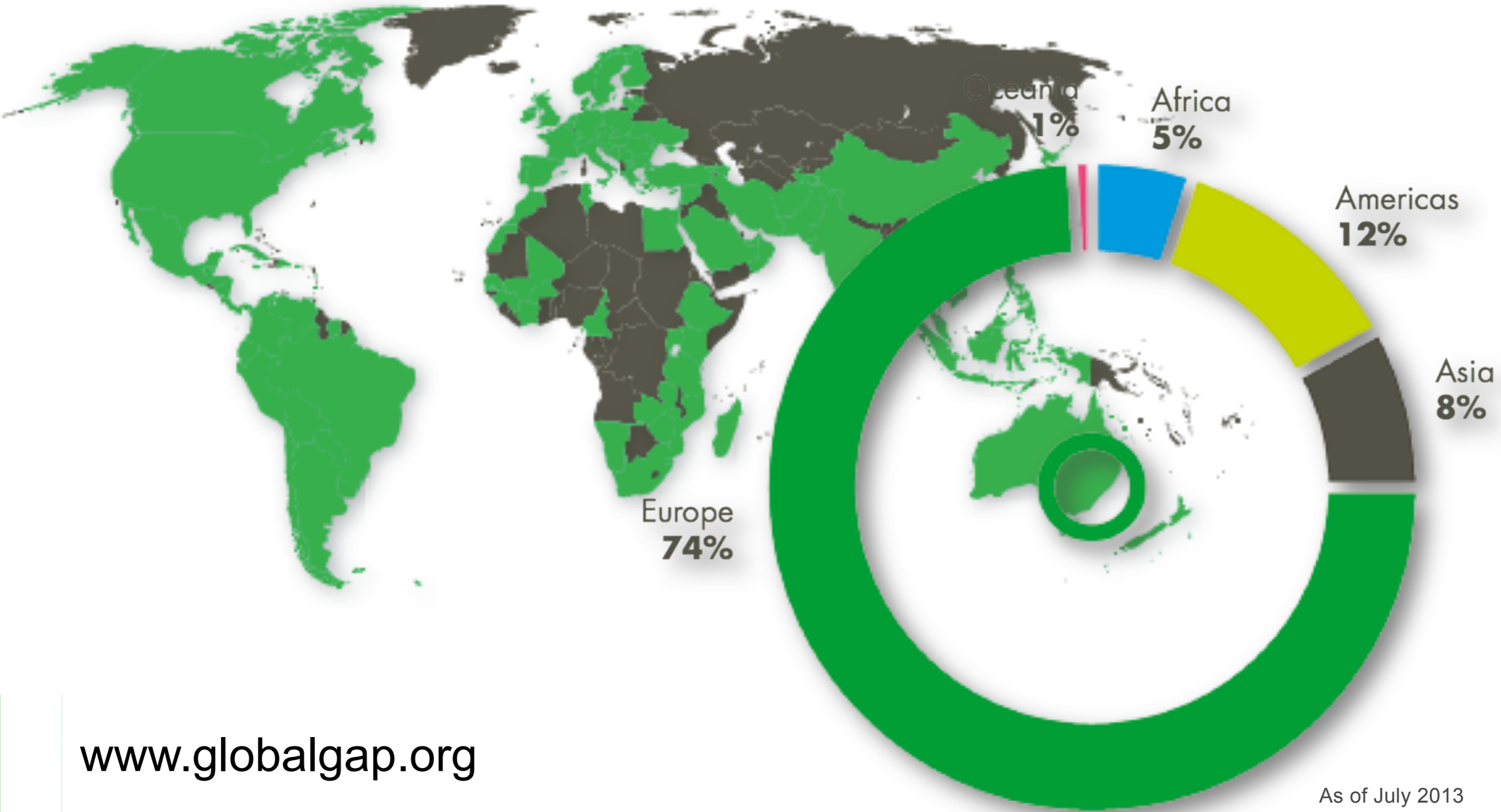

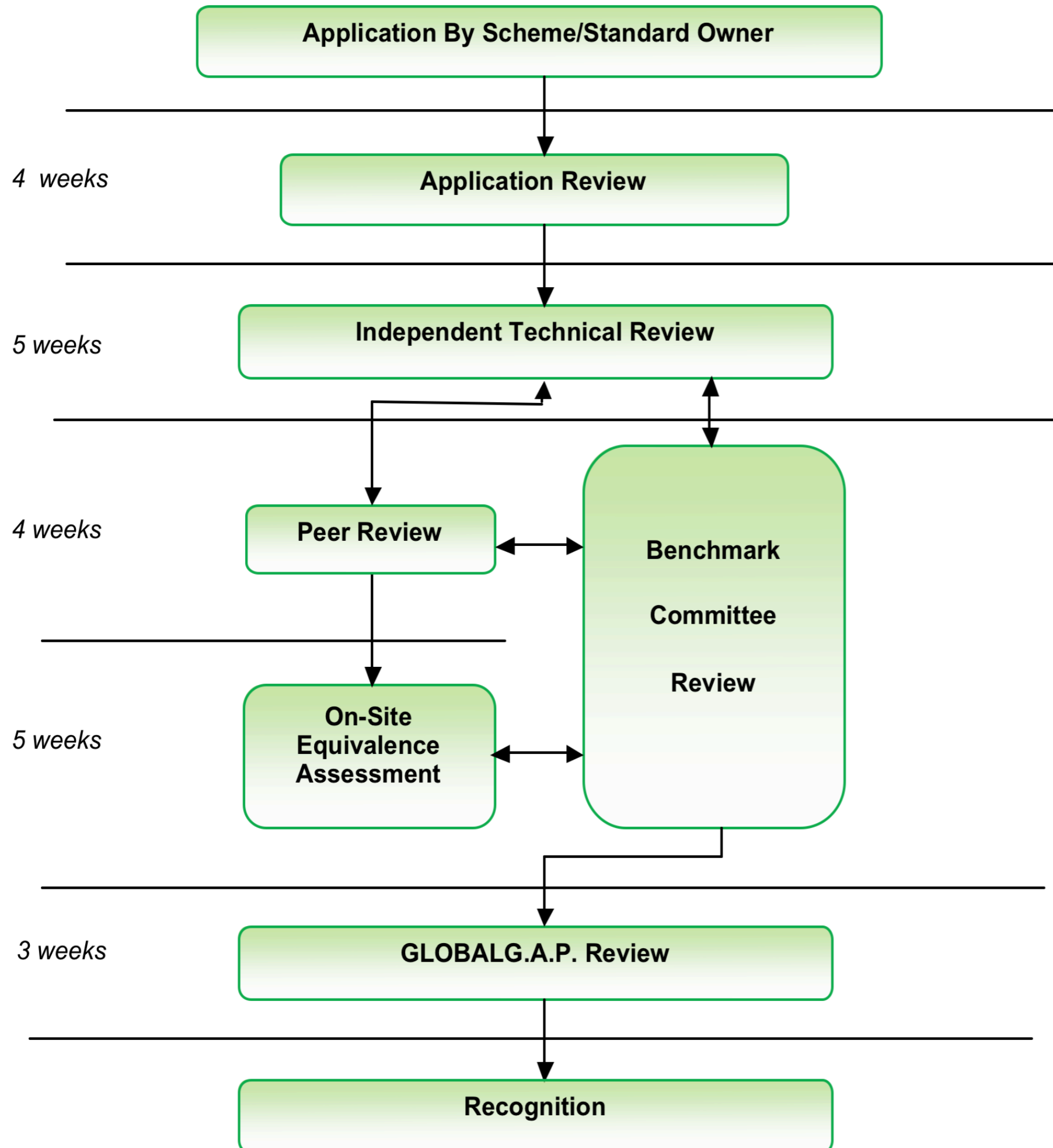

TRENDS IN EUROPEAN RETAIL

EFFECTIVE MANAGEMENT OF PRODUCER INFORMATION

Use the GLOBALG.A.P. database to get a structured overview of your suppliers

All information collected during the inspection can be made available through the database such as:

- name, address of producer
- certified products
- production size
- completed checklists
- pesticide application information

Comfortable database tools allow market participants to monitor their producers



CONCLUSION

POINTS FOR DISCUSSION

- Acceptance of private sector is key to assure a market
- National GAP Programs are a great support for local producers but not necessarily credible for the private sector
- Credibility needs:
 - Industry support
 - Comparability (benchmark to accepted standards)
 - Accreditation
 - Independent certification
 - Transparency
 - Integrity program
