




INDEPENDENT ACCREDITED 3RD PARTY CERTIFICATION

Independent 3rd Party Certification

- All certification bodies (CB) must be ISO 65 accredited
- Restricting initial non-accredited certification activities
- All certification bodies have had external system and witness assessments before entering large scale certification activities

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

2.1 Producer Registration Fee for all Options (1, 2, 3 and 4) Integrated Farm Assurance: Crop Based Scopes and Plant Propagation Material For Covered Crops¹






EFFECTIVE MANAGEMENT OF PRODUCER INFORMATION

Use the GLOBALG.A.P. database to get a structured overview of your suppliers

All information collected during the inspection can be made available through the database such as:

- name, address of producer
- certified products
- production size
- completed checklists
- pesticide application information

Comfortable database tools allow market participants to monitor their producers






CONCLUSION
