The first theater in linto was started in 162 by orter of the shoguns. Passing thru many chankes in the fast few centuries, it has now come down to the doings of ordinary men and women, and the addition of elathgrate scenery, many actors and many ew contithons. nected with a Japanese theater, one of which is a revolving stage. The theater gives more insight into Jama nese life than anything else. The superior classical plays are still partly historical. Thls danchester school of the theater concerns itself in so far as subject matter is concerned with the struggles. successes and domestle "alarums and excursions" of the trading or industrial community of the provinces, a type of soclety alien, yet interesting, to metropolitam menway be citel as tyolcal authors of thls wous and aitho no particttarly outstanding London or cuntry-wide success came from the Manchester alety the effect of this type of work has been tively recent growth, plays of lower middle-class fife, such as "Grumpy". "Quinneys" and so on Hut the repertory of the llornlman theater Was not bounded by such plays as these-sinake-
speare. "costume" plays, modern work, English and contipental, Greek blays were also to be seen. The company consisted of a group of unknown players who steadlly worked their way Into the esteem of the daneunians ind many of whom
have since won high places on the West End stage. There was no "starring", but llttle admuch hard work and the gradual putblic recognition of the fact that somethlng new had been born In the English theater
From the fiatoty sprang, either directly or by example. varlous other repertory theaters. O hese one of the carllest and most orlginal (also the most creatlve from the literary standpolnt) was the Ahbey Theater of Dublln with lts combany of Irish players. Here were produced plays hy one of the few modern masters of dramatic orm, synge. Veats and Lady Gregory kept the metic Coltic tradition alive after Synge's un unre high place must be given to Lemmox labinson, some of whose plays have achieved a whde popularity (notably "The White-Headed Hoy"", by o means the best work of this skillful aram folk and we may perhaps aspribe a measure of this acute critic-dramatist's knowledge and tech nlque to this early association with a lively and enthuslastlc adventure. The outcom is that what we read about is not the domes ticated musical influences of the people of an given locality, but the extraordinary success o

## About Seventy-Five Theaters

Paris, which is a city of ower $3,000,000$, has about seventy-llve city theaters. They are divlded ibout as follows: Thirty dramatic and meloHramatle, twelve comedy, ten musical comedy, seven musle halls, seven motlon picture honses, three indoor cireuses, four vandeville and two operatic houses. These theaters range in size from two houndred to soseral thousamd seats. Host of them are open seven days a week, with matinees on Thurway, Sunday and holldaye.

## American Stars Increase

 bach year sees an increase in the number of dmerican stars who appear in the musio halls. vandeville houses and in musleal comedies. In past yoars this was true only during the summer or tourist season, but now we tind them on the hills thruout the year. These clever artists, most very eordially received by French audiences.
## No Censorship

The first thing an Anerican notices in a French theater is its froedom from censorshlp. Since the war nudity has bocoind an art, for it is displated frankly and fromy without any attempt at vilgarity. This feature has of course made the theater inmensely more popmati. The general pratetice has been to use mulity in still have been this past summer and falme numbers and a promenade on the hoardwalk extending out in front of the stage. It is surprising how quickly Americans adapt themselves to this form of entertainment and patronize $i t$, as a family, whthout hesitation.

## Prices of Admission

Froin the standpolnt of the play unthusiast. the cost of entertainment is the first thing to be noticed. seats in the average theater, for what we would ,all a good production, range in price from $\$ 3.50$ for an orchestra seat to 50 cents for the third balcony. Vaudeville theaters get from 25 cents to a dollar And the opera from $\$ 3$ to 50 cents. Then conies the ulusance of having to buy your program, "hich also contains as much advertising as the American theater program: giving a tip to the usher, another to the young lady who gives the seat numbers at the
box-office, tho cloukroon girl and the uttendalit
in the toilet rooms. There has been a constant asitation for a tixed eharge to cover all these incidentals, but so far it has been of no avail.

## The Professional Claque

Another feature, whieh is humorous if not a hit disturbing, is the professional clacque. Its vociferous applause is so noticeable as to

A large percentage of the theaters have what scalled a promnoir. This is the space back of the last row of seats on the ground floor would perhaps call it the promenalie. Musical shows average from 30 to 40 scenes.
