GENERAL COUNSEL'S REPORT

I. BACKGROUND

This matter originated when the Senate Special Committee on Aging, in the course of its investigation of nursing home industries, obtained information which indicated that certain persons connected with California nursing homes may have violated FECA by making contributions in the names of others and by making corporate contributions. This information was referred to the Commission on February 10, 1978.

On March 7, 1978, the Commission found reason to believe that Robert Glenn Olels and Glenhaven Convalescent Hospitals, Inc. violated 18 U.S.C. §§ 610 and 614 (now 2 U.S.C. §§ 441b and 441f) and that Robert Litman violated 18 U.S.C. § 614 (now 2 U.S.C. § 441f). On June 1, 1978 the Commission found that William Bauer and Casa Blanca Convalescent Homes, Inc. violated 18 U.S.C. § 610 (now 2 U.S.C. § 441b).

Office of General Counsel staff members went to
California on June 21, 1978, for the purpose of taking the
depositions of Robert Glenn Olels, Robert Litman, Marjorie
Zaizar, Barbara C. Robertson, and John B. Robertson. All

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witnesses were represented by the same counsel. At the beginning of the deposition of Robert Glenn Olels, counsel raised the objection that 2 U.S.C. § 455 bars any Commission inquiry into matters and events occurring prior to January 1, 1975. The same objection was raised at the inception of Robert Litman's deposition. Counsel refused to allow the witnesses to answer any questions pertaining to pre January 1, 1975 activity. Staff members were able to question Mr. Olels and Mr. Litman about activities after January 1, 1975.

Witnesses Marjorie Zaizar, Barbara C. Robertson and John B. Robertson refused on First and Fifth Amendment Constitutional grounds to answer any questions asked by General Counsel staff members relating to activity either before or after January 1, 1975.

Two other witnesses, Edna Olels and William Bauer, were not deposed as service could not be made. The deposition of Rudolph Baron was postponed pending receipt of the bank records of the Friends of Earl Brian Committee.

II. ANALYSIS

On June 27, 1978, the Commission requested that the General Counsel's Office review the statute of limitation issue raised by the respondents. In addition, the Office of General Counsel was asked to reevaluate the evidence which has been obtained to date against the respondents. Although

Section 455 states that "[n]o person shall be prosecuted, tried or punished...unless the indictment is found or the information is instituted" within 3 years after the violation (emphasis added). Thus, the language of Section 455 refers to prosecution, try, and punishment, and to indictment and information. This language on its face infers that the statute of limitations only applies to the bringing of criminal proceedings. Also, the terms "information" and "indictment" are the operative words triggering the tolling of the statute. Since the Commission in a civil action may never obtain an "indictment" nor institute an "information," the Commission has no power to take an action which would ever toll the statute of limitations if Section 455 were applicable to civil actions.

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Further, the history of the incorporation of Section 455 into FECA and the legislative history make it clear that Congress was specifically distinguishing between civil and criminal penalties and established Section 455 only for

The FECA of 1971 included no specific statutory period of limitations. Under the Act at that time the provisions for enforcement by the Department of Justice were solely criminal. Accordingly, the relevant limitation period was contained in the Federal Corrupt Practices Act of 1925 which provides a general five year statute of limitations applicable to federal noncapital crimes where no specific statutory provision exists (18 U.S.C. § 3282). There is no general federal period of limitations for civil actions.

Section 455 was originally a part of the House bill (HR 16090) and then incorporated into the Senate bill (S 3044) in the Conference Committee. On October 15, 1974 Public Law 93-443 was signed into law adding Section 455 to FECA. Congress also inserted at this time a new provision for civil actions starting a process which culminated in the 1976 "decriminalization" by shifting to Title 2, sections previously contained in the criminal code, including Sections 608, 610, 611 and 613-616. That Section 455 only applies to criminal proceedings and not to the new civil provisions was made clear in both the House report (No. 93-1239, 93d Cong., 2d Sess., p. 31 (1974)),610-616.

C 0 civil investigation cencerning violations of 18 U.S.C. §§ 610 and 614 which occurred prior to 1975. Under the FECA of 1971, as it existed at the time of the alleged violations, criminal prosecution was the exclusive remedy for violations of Sections 610 and 614 and no remedy for civil enforcement was authorized by the Act. It is the General Counsel's opinion that the 1974 amendments to FECA authorizes the Commission to bring civil actions to enforce 18 U.S.C. §§ 610 and 614 violations which occurred prior to January 1, 1975.

The 1974 amendments did not create or alter the violations under investigation in this matter. They merely transferred the enforcement authority over the relevant sections to the Commission and changed the remedy from criminal to civil.

The Commission when created in 1974 was specifically given enforcement authority over "sections 608, 610, 611, 613, 614, 615, 616, and 617 of Title 18, United States Code." P.L. 93-443, §§ 310, 314, 88 Stat. 1281 (October 15, 1974). In 1976 when Section 610 was incorporated into Title 2, during the Senate debates on S. 3065 (the 1976 amendments to the FECA), Senator Cannon, the floor manager of the bill, explained that "...the provisions of Section 610, like a number of other Title 18 provisions related to the financing of campaigns, are transferred to the FECA of 1971, as amended, and made subject to the proposed new enforcement and penalty provisions of the bil." 122 Cong. Rec. § 3518 (daily ed., March 16, 1976)

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(emphasis added). In addition, the 1976 amendments provide that, except where otherwise stated, any "section or penalty (in effect prior to May 11, 1976—as was § 610 and § 614) shall be treated as remaining in force for the purpose of sustaining any proper action or prosecution for the enforcement of any penalty, forfeiture or liability." P.L. 94-283, Title I, § 114, May 11, 1976, 90 Stat. 495.

Further, courts have held that a change or addition to a remedy, such as reducing the remedy from criminal to civil, can be applied to events transpiring prior to the change in the statute. See, e.g., Dobbert v. Florida, 432 U.S. 282, 293 (1977); Montana Power Co. v. FPC, 445 F.2d 739, 747 (D.C. Cir. 1970); Barr v. Preskitt, 389 F. Supp. 496, 498 (M.D. Ala.). The Supreme Court has even found valid a repeal or extension of a statute of limitations which has the effect of reviving claims which would have otherwise been barred under the original limitation period. Chase Sec. Corp. v. Donaldson, 325 U.S. 304 (1945); Campbell v. Hold, 115 U.S. 620 (1885).

Thus, even though civil enforcement of Sections 610 and 614 was not added until the 1974 amendments to FECA, the Commission is not precluded from seeking a civil cause of action to redress pre January 1, 1975 violations.

-8-В. Evidence The investigation in this matter centers around the possibility that certain persons may have made contributions to federal candidates with the understanding that they would be reimbursed. It appears that if these reimbursements did occur, they were made with corporate funds. The basis for the Commission's investigation was the material supplied by the Senate Special Committee on Aging. In an attempt to expand on this evidence the Office of General Counsel reviewed numerous reports filed with the Commission, subpoenaed the bank records of the Friends of Earl Brian Committee, requested any information which the PBI could provide, and attempted to depose certain witnesses. The Senate Special Committee on Aging furnished the Commission with affidavits, investigative memoranda and depositions which were gathered pursuant to the Committee's investigation of the nursing home industry in California. All of the evidence indicating FECA violations pertains to pre-1975 activity and hinges on the statements of witnesses and the references which can be drawn from them. The evidence is set out as follows: Sworn affidavits and investigative memoranda by Chester Jones and Richard Houk, investigators in the California Department of Health and Welfare, stating that as a result of a conversation with pharmacist Robert Litman,

-9-Litman indicated that he had been approached by Robert Glenn Olels to make a contribution to the Earl Brian campaign, that he made a contribution of \$2,000, and that he was reimbursed by Olels for the contribution which was drawn on the account of Glenhaven Convalescent Hospitals, Inc. Sworn affidavit of Richard Sale, investigator with the Senate Special Committee on Aging, relating a telephone conversation Sale had with Robert Litman and stating in effect that Litman confirmed his involvement in the transaction with Robert Glen Olels. 3. Sworn affidavit of Dan Varner, former Comptroller of Casa Blanca Nursing Homes stating that Varner, at the request of William Bauer, Chairman of the Board at Casa Blanca Convalescent Homes, Inc. in 1974, made a contribution of \$300 to the campaign of Clair Burgener on behalf of Bauer and was subsequently reimbursed by Bauer with a corporate check drawn on the Casa Blanca account. The General Counsel's Office reviewed the reports of the Friends of Earl Brian Committee which were filed with the Commission in an attempt to determine which individuals associated with Robert Glenn Olels made contributions to the Brian Campaign. Those reports revealed that Marjorie Zaizar, comptroller of Glenhaven Convalescent Hospitals, Inc., contributed \$1,500. Robert Litman, a friend of Robert Glenn

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In December 1978, the FBI forwarded to the Commission cash disbursement records and bank statements for Glenhaven Convalescent Hospitals, Inc. These records indicate that on March 12, 1974, Robert Litman was paid \$2,000 by Glenhaven Convalescent Hospitals, Inc. for public relations expense. On March 15, 1974, Mr. Litman contributed \$2,000 to the Earl Brian Campaign. On August 7, 1974, Edna Olels was paid \$1,300 by Glenhaven Convalescent Hospitals, Inc. for employee bonus expense. On August 13, 1974 Ms. Olels contributed \$1,300 to the Earl Brian Campaign. It can be inferred from these transactions that Mr. Litman and Ms. Olels were reimbursed by Glenhaven Convalescent Hospitals, Inc. for their contributions to the Earl Brian Campaign.

Although none of the witnesses which were served with subpoena would testify to pre January 1, 1975 activity, two, Robert Glenn Olels and Robert Litman, did answer questions regarding their post January 1, 1975 activities. These examinations rendered no information which would indicate a violation of FECA during the post January 1, 1975 period.

C. Conclusion

It is the General Counsel's opinion that the Commission is not barred by 2 U.S.C. § 455 from proceeding against the respondents. However, the General Counsel's Office is of the opinion that other considerations warrant that the Commission take no further action in this matter.

-13resources of the General Counsel's Office dictate that the most serious and most recent cases be pursued. Based on these considerations, the General Counsel's Office recommends that the Commission terminate its investigation of this matter without a finding. III. RECOMMENDATIONS Close the file.

Terminate the investigation without a finding.

We are prepared to document the salient facts from which the aforementioned conclusion has been drawn, however believe that the same would result in an inappropriate and unwarranted expenditure of Mr. Bauer's resources and government time and funds by reason of the fact that contributions to the Clair Burgener for Congress Committee were apparently made in September, 1974. In connection with the foregoing your attention is directed to the provisions of Title 2 U.S.C. § 455 (3 year statute of limitations). Since the contribution under investigation was apparently made in September, 1974, any government claims in connection with same would be time barred. Accordingly, further investigation by the Federal Elections Commission can only constitute a wholly unjustified and unwarranted dissipation of public funds and an equally unjustified expenditure of Mr. Bauer's personal resources in contesting this matter.



The deposition of Rudolph Baron was postponed indefinitely pending receipt and analysis of the bank records of the Friends of Earl Brian Committee.

Sworn affidavits and investigative memoranda by Chester Jones and Richard Houk, investigators in the California 0 Department of Health and Welfare, stating that as a result of a Or. conversation with pharmacist Robert Litman, Litman told them that he had been approached by Robert Glenn Oleis to make a contribution to the Earl Brian campaign - that he did - and that he was reimbursed by Olels for the contribution which was drawn on Olels' nursing home corporate account in violation of § 441b and § 441f. 3. Sworn affidavit of Richard Sale, investigator with the Senate Special Committee on Aging, relating a telephone conversation Sale had had with Robert Litman and stating in effect that Litman confirmed his own involvement in the

transaction with Robert Glen Olels (referred to previously in the affidavits of Houk and Jones) . 4. Sworn affidavits of Victor Backus and Robert H. Brown, both then nursing home owners, detailing a meeting attended by several nursing home owners and convened by Robert Glen Olels and William Bauer for the purpose of collecting \$5,000 from each owner in an attempt to eradicate \$55,000 in campaign debts for Earl Brian. Although the names of Robert Olels and William Bauer do not appear as having made any contributions to the Brian committee, it does appear that Robert Olels may have used family members and nursing home employees to make his contribution to the campaign, and subsequently reimbursed each for their contributions in violation of § 441b and § 441f. We have been unsuccessful in expanding on the evidence given to us by the Senate Special Committee on Aging or in developing any evidence relating to post January 1, 1975 violations. The inquiries which we have made in this regard have proven fruitless or have been hindered because of the refusal of the witnesses subpoened to answer questions. III. ANALYSIS As we have not found continuing violations, any decision to proceed on pre January 1, 1975 violations would

have to take into consideration respondents' defense that the Statute of Limitations 2 U.S.C. § 455, bars Commission action. In view of our limited resources to continue the investigation, that we have been unsuccessful in developing any evidence relating to post 1975 violations, and that pursuing pre 1975 violations would involve litigating the applicability of \$ 455 to civil actions, the Office of General Counsel recommends the termination of the investigation without a finding. If further evidence comes to the attention of Commission staff, appropriate recommendations can be made at that time.

IV. RECOMMENDATIONS

- Terminate investigation without a finding.
- Close the file.



General Counsel's Report

In the course of an investigation of the California nursing home industry, the Senate Special Committee on Aging obtained information which suggested that numerous violations of the Act had occurred, including corporate contributions and contributions made in the names of others. This information was officially referred to the Commission on February 10, 1978.

On March 7, 1978, the Commission found reason to believe that Glenhaven Hospitals, Inc. and Robert Glen Olels violated 18 U.S.C. §§610 and 614 (now 2 U.S.C. §§441b and 441f) and that Robert Litman violated 18 U.S.C. §614 (now 2 U.S.C. §441f). The Commission also authorized an investigation to uncover possible additional violations.

As a result of that investigation, the Office of General Counsel obtained information which suggests that other parties, related in some way to the Earl Brian campaign of 1974, may have violated several provisions of the Act.

Violations Prior to January 1, 1975

The Commission previously found reason to believe that Robert Glenn Olels and Robert Litman violated certain provisions

butions she made to the Brian campaign. Zaizar originally informed Senate Committee investigators that she was reimbursed; Olels denied reimbursing her in his sworn testimony before the Senate Committee.

Edna Olels is the mother of Robert Glen Olels. She is shown in the Brian committee reports as having contributed \$1,300 to the campaign after the primary election. Barbara C. Robertson and John Bernard Robertson are the wife and the stepson of Robert Glen Olels and also made contributions to the campaign after the primary election. Barbara Robertson is reported as having contributed \$2,500 to the campaign. John Robertson, 17 years of age at the time, is reported as having given \$700. The total contributions from Marjorie Zaizar, Olels' mother, wife and stepson was \$5,000-the same amount Olels suggested that he was going to contribute in a meeting described hereinafter-though the Brian committee reports show no such contribution from Olels. We believe the information suggests that Olels contributed the \$5,000 in the names of a nursing home employee and relatives.

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A sworn affidavit of Victor Bachus (Attachment I) (a California CPA who during the Brian compaign owned four nursing home facilities,) states that in mid-July of 1974, after the primary election, Bachus and other nursing home operators attended a meeting convened by Robert Glen Olels and William Bauer for the purpose of discussing ways to eliminate Brian's campaign debts. Bachus stated that the debts "were in the neighborhood of \$55,000". Bachus said that Bauer and Olels requested all operators present to contribute at least \$5,000 and that Bauer and Olels would probably give more. Bachus' statement is corroborated by an affidavit of Robert H.

Brown (Attachment II) who was also a nursing home operator and gave \$5,000.

Rudolph F. Baron, Jr. was the treasurer for the four Earl
Brian committees in the State of California. On July 20, 1977,
the Attorney General of California released a report which dealt
with several accusations about the influence of nursing home
interests within the State Department of Health between 1970-1976.
Two pages in the report related to allegations with respect to
Earl Brian. The two pages essentially state that although investigators found no evidence of criminal violations, some of
the contributions from nursing home interests may have been
corporate contributions.

At this time, the Office of General Counsel requests that subpoenas for depositions and production of documents be issued to the following persons: Robert Glen Olels, Robert Litman, Marjorie Zaizar, Edna Olels, Barbara C. Robertson, John Bernard Robertson and Rudolph F. Baron, Jr. We also believe that the Commission should subpoena the bank account records of the Earl Brian Committee from the Westlands Bank of Santa Ana.

In the course of reviewing information referred to us by
the U.S. Senate Special Committee on Aging pertaining to MUR 524,
Office of General Counsel staff also learned that, at the direction of William Bauer, an apparent corporate contribution was
made in 1974 to the Clair Burgener for Congress Committee by Casa
Blanca Convalescent Homes, Inc. in violation of 18 U.S.C. \$610
(now 2 U.S.C. \$441b). In an affidavit (Attachment III) obtained
by the Senate Committee, Dan Varner, Comptroller of Casa Blanca from

1974-1976, stated that Bauer requested him to make a contribution on Bauer's behalf to the Burgener Committee. Varner said that he made such a contribution and that he was subsequently reimbursed by Bauer with a \$300 check drawn on the account of Casa Blanca Convalescent Homes, Inc.

It appears that Casa Blanca Convalescent Homes, Inc., and William Bauer may have violated 18 U.S.C. §610 (now 2 U.S.C. §441b) by making a contribution to the Clair Burgener for Congress Committee through Dan Varner and reimbursing Varner with funds drawn on Bauer's Casa Blanca account. We believe that Bauer should be subpoenaed for deposition and production of documents.

Violations after January 1, 1975

At the present time we have no information of any violations committed after January 1, 1975.

RECOMMENDATION

- 1. Find reason to believe that Casa Blanca Convalescent Homes, Inc. and William Bauer violated 18 U.S.C. §610 (now 2 U.S.C. \$441b).
- 2. Authorize subpoenas for deposition and production of documents for Robert Glen Olels, Robert Litman, Marjorie Zaizar, Edna Olels, Barbara C. Robertson, John Bernard Robertson, Rudolph F. Baron, Jr., and William Bauer.
- 3. Subpoena the bank account records of the Friends of Earl Brian Committee from the Westlands Bank of Santa Ana.

AFFIDAVIT OF VICTOR J. BACKUS

I, VICTOR J. BACKUS, aka VYTAUTAS BACEVICIUS, being duly sworn, do hereby state that the following facts are true to the best of my knowledge and recollection:

- That I am a Certified Public Accountant, and, although
 I do not practice actively, I maintain an office at 1120 S. San
 Gabriel Blvd., San Gabriel, California 91776.
- 2. That beginning in 1964, I began serving nursing homes in the State of California in my capacity as a Certified Public Accountant. At one point I was doing the accounting for more than twenty homes.
- 3. That in 1968 I acquired ownership of four facilities,
 Golden State Convalescent Center, Monterey Sanitarium, Greenacres
 Lodge and San Gabriel Convalescent Center, all in California, which is the convaled to the convalence of the convalence of
- 4. That in my career as a nursing home owner I have had a special interest in the problem of the developmentally disabled -- those patients in nursing homes with epilepsy, cerebral palsy or neurological disorders.
- 5. That in late 1973, I joined together with several other operators with similar interests in forming a group on the Developmentally Disabled. The purpose of this group was to negotiate higher rates with the State Department of Health.
- 6. That a meeting was held at a Long Beach Country Club, attended by some twenty nursing home owner/operators. R. Glenn Olels, of Santa Ana, who was elected Chairman, William Bauer of San Diego was elected Vice Chairman, and Linda Richards was

- 7. That we were asked to contribute a certain sum per bed or per home, that we owned. I remember I paid several hundred dollars, perhaps as much as \$2000.00 to fund the lobbying effort and associated expenses of the Committee members. No accounting was ever given to us concerning the use of these funds.
- 8. That in January 1974, I and other nursing owners learned that the State had authorized a pilot program to test whether an increase in Medi-Cal rates would result in better care for the developmentally disabled in nursing homes.
- 9. That on or about this time, a meeting was held at the Airport Marriott Hotel, attended by nursing home owners and State officials at which State Mental Health Director, Don Z. Miller, announced that five nursing homes would be selected to participate in the pilot project.
- 10. That I spoke with Mr. Miller at this time and asked that my facility, Golden State, be chosen as one of the five pilots. I was hoping to receive the \$5.00 per patient per day differential, over and above Medi-Cal rates, to be paid to the five pilot homes. Mr. Miller informed me that the pilot facilities would be chosen later.
- 11. That as far as I know, no invitation to submit proposals or request participation in the pilot project were ever sent out by State Health officials.
- . 12. Some time later, I learned that slots in the pilot project had been awarded to the three Committee members. Selec-

- 13. That I was very disappointed that I was not selected to participate in the pilot project. I expressed my disappointment to Glen Olels and Linda Richards.
- 14. That in or about June 1974, I attended another meeting near Los Angeles Airport, with nursing home operators in which it was decided to make an all out effort to have the \$5.00 differential rate received by the five pilot facilities extended statewide to all nursing homes caring for the developmentally disabled. The effort proved unsuccessful.
- 15. That in mid-July of 1974, Mr. Glen Oleis invited me to come to the Velvet Turtle Restaurant in Long Beach, California. Olels said he had invited a few other operators to discuss problems of mutual concern.
- l6. That I attended the meeting which was also attended by several people which included at least the following: William Bauer of San Diego, Glen Olels, Robert or Kenneth Brown of Elencanto, and possibly Vernon Will.
- 17. That we met in the mid-afternoon in the cocktail lounge of the restaurant. Mr. Olels and Mr. Bauer did all the talking. They explained to the rest of us that Earl Brian, the former California Health and Welfare Secretary, had substantial debts in connection with his recent loss in the California U.S. Senate primary election. They said the debts were in the neighborhood of \$55,000.00.
 - 18. That Bauer and Olels explained to us that Dr. Brian

had been very helpful in the past and that he could continue to provide assistance in the future because of his significant influence in Sacramento.

- 19) That we were told by Bauer and Olels that we would be expected to contribute a minimum of \$5000.00 to help Brian pay off his campaign debts. Bauer and Olels said that they personally were going to give more than \$5000.00 to help pay off the debts.
- 20. That I had some misgivings about the statement that Brian had been helpful to nursing homes, at least until late 1973 when we got an emergency Medi-Cal rate increase and authorization for the pilot project.
- 21. That despite my misgivings, I agreed to make a \$5,000.0 contribution and I said so at the meeting. Other than Olels and Bauer, no one else at the meeting volunteered.
- 22. That Glen Olels instructed me to obtain a cashier's check for \$5000.00. He said personal checks would not be acceptable. Olels told us to make the checks payable to the friends of Earl Brian and to mail the checks to attorney Robert Gerst, at 1901 Avenue of the Stars, Los Angeles, California, whom I believed to be counsel for the California Association of Health Facilities.
- 23. That Bauer and Olels said the contributions would be helpful in our efforts to get the benefits of the pilot program, specifically, the differential over and above Medi-Cal rates, extended to all nursing homes in the State. I thought the payment of money was a good investment.
 - 24. That a few days later I talked to two attorneys who

- 25) That on August 6, 1974, I drew a check representing accrued payroll to me on the account of Monterey Sanitarium, Inc. (my nursing home), in the amount of \$5,000.00 and used it to purchase two cashiers checks each in the amount of \$2,500.00 from the Bank of America in Rosemead, California and payable to Friends of Earl Brian.
- 26. That I sent these checks numbered 0574 57203 and 0574 57204, xerox copies of which are attached to this Affidavit, to attorney Robert Gerst with a hand written notation informing him they were from my wife Sophie and me. I identified myself as a CPA (although I was also a nursing home owner) and I identified Sophie as a housewife, both residing at 3650 Monon Street, #101, Los Angeles, California 90027.
- 27. That after I put these checks in the mail I called Glen Olels and notified him that I had done so. He thanked me.
- 28. The contributions referred to above are the only payments.
 I have ever made to candidates in Federal and State elections.
- 29. That other than the payments described in paragraphs
 7 and 25 of this Affidavit I have made no other payments related to increased Medi-Cal funding for nursing homes.
- : 30. That the purpose of both the contributions and other payments described above was to gain Brian's help in increasing

SUMMARY OF ALLEGATIONS

In the course of an investigation of the California nursing home industry, investigators of the Senate Special Committee on Aging obtained information which suggests a corporate contribution was made to the Friends of Earl Brian Campaign Committee by Glenhaven Convalescent Hospitals, Inc., under the direction of Robert Glenn Olels, in violation of 18 U.S.C. §610 (now 2 U.S.C. §441b). The information suggests that the contribution was made in the name of another, Robert Litman, in violation of 18 U.S.C. §614 (now 2 U.S.C. §441f). Robert Litman admitted to Senate Committee investigators that he permitted his name to be used and knowingly laundered the contribution from R. Glenn Olels to the Brian campaign in violation of 18 U.S.C. §614 (now 2 U.S.C. §441f).

LEGAL ANALYSIS Robert Glenn Olels was, according to information obtained by the Senate Committee, a primary fundraiser for the Earl Brian campaign. He was then president of Glenhaven Convalescent Hospitals, Inc., Mr. Olels apparently drew a \$2,000 check on the Glenhaven corporate account and made it payable to Robert Litman. Litman deposited the check into his personal account and contributed \$2,000 to the Brian Committee. See Attachment I. It appears that Glenhaven Hospitals, Inc., and Robert Glenn Olels may have violated 18 U.S.C. §610 (now 2 U.S.C. §441b) in effecting such a corporate contribution to the Brian campaign. It also appears that Glenhaven and Olels may have violated 18 U.S.C. \$614 (now 2 U.S.C. \$441f) in transferring the funds to Robert Litman under the guise that the latter, himself, would make the contribution in his own name to the Brian campaign. It appears that Robert Litman violated 18 U.S.C. §614 (now 2 U.S.C. \$441f) by knowingly permitting his name to be used to make a contribution to the campaign of Earl Brian. RECOMMENDATIONS 1. Find reason to believe that Glenhaven Hospitals, Inc. and Robert Glenn Olels violated 18 U.S.C. §§610 and 614. 2. Find reason to believe that Robert Litman violated 18 U.S.C. \$614. 3. Authorize field investigation to uncover possible additional violations. 4. Send attached letters.

SUMMARY OF ALLEGATIONS

Earl Brian was a candidate for the United States Senate from the State of California in the 1974 Republican primary election. He received 273,636 votes and lost the election. The Friends of Earl Brian Committee ("Brian Committee") spent approximately \$128,000 according to records on file with the Commission.

In the course of an investigation of the nursing home industry, the Special Senate Committee on Aging came across information that suggests substantial corporate contributions were made to the Brian Committee in violation of 18 U.S.C. §610 (now 2 U.S.C. §441b); that Brian and the Brian Committee knowingly accepted such contributions in violation of 18 U.S.C. §610 (now 2 U.S.C. §441b); that certain contributions were made in the name of another in violation of 18 U.S.C. §614 (now 2 U.S.C. §441f); and that Brian and the Brian Committee accepted such contributions in violation of 18 U.S.C. §614 (now 2 U.S.C. §441f).

Prior to January 1, 1974, and his becoming a U.S. Senate candidate, Brian held the position of Secretary of Health and Welfare for the State of California. According to investigators for the Special Senate Committee, Brian was able to exercise considerable influence on decisions made by the Health and Welfare department even after he had

resigned because he had selected many of the senior staff persons remaining with the department. It appears that certain persons in the nursing home industry made contributions to the Brian Committee in exchange for Brian's efforts to obtain increases in state payments to nursing homes under the California "Medi-Cal" program and other favorable action; some of these contributions appear to have been made from corporate funds and in the names of others. At this time, the Special Senate Committee has specific information on the following apparent and possible violations: 1. Robert Olels, former president of Glenhaven Convalescent Hospitals, Inc., drew a \$2000 check payable to Robert Litman on that corporate account, Litman deposited the check in his personal account, and Litman then contributed \$2000 to the Brian Committee. See Attachment I. Investigators from the Special Senate Committee have told us that Litman has admitted laundering the money for Olels. Marjorie Zaizar is reported as having contributed \$500 to the Brian Committee. She was Olels' Comptroller and she has admitted to Special Senate Committee investigators that Olels reimbursed her for the contribution. 3. William Bauer, president of Casa Blanca Convalescent Homes, Inc., pleaded guilty to violating California state law in using corporate employees as conduits for corporate contributions to a local elected official. Sidney Kent and Richard Wehemeyer, two of the employees who were involved in Bauer's illegal contribution to the local official, are reported as having made \$500 contributions to the Brian Committee. The Special Senate Committee has more general information on a large number of other similar possible election law violations. The California Attorney General looked into accusations about the influence of nursing home interests in the State Department of Health during the relevant time period. A report released on July 20, 1977, said that investigators found no evidence of criminal violations except for some corporate contributions; it added that the U.S. Attorney in San Diego was continuing an investigation. However, the Special Senate Committee was unable to find anyone in the U.S. Attorney's office who would acknowledge that any investigation was underway. In addition to the apparent violations of 18 U.S.C. \$610 and \$614, the Special Senate Committee checked the occupation of a random sample of contributors reported by the Brian Committee. at least a half-dozen instances, a contributor whose principal occupation is in the nursing home industry was misreported as being employed in some ohter unrelated business.

The Associate General Counsel and an investigator from the Special Senate Committee will be conducting a field investigation in California the week beginning February 12, 1978. The investigation wil include interviews with a number of informants and confidential sources who have been cooperative. Although the investigation will focus on abuses and violations other than those relating to election law, it seems clear that information about possible election law violations will inevitably arise during the investigation. The General Counsel of the Special Senate Committee has invited us to send a staff person to accompany its investigators in the field investigation. LEGAL ANALYSIS The information so far uncovered by investigators for the Special Senate Committee, if true, constitutes serious violations of 18 U.S.C. §610 and §614. It seems very possible that there may be many more people and substantially larger amounts of money involved than we are aware of at the present time. RECOMMENDATIONS 1. Find reason to believe that the Friends of Earl Brian Committee violated 18 U.S.C. \$610 and \$614. Authorize field investigation in cooperation with the Special Senate Committee on Aging. 3. Send attached letter.
