Demand is strong for dairy alfalfa and grinding alfalfa, moderate for alfalfa pellets, prairie hay and stock cow quality hay. Hay prices remain strong, for the most part yields have been disappointing. Irrigators have used a large portion of their water allotments with very little help from Mother Nature. With corn prices coming down corn silage may be an option for forage needs. 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Field day planned on teff, a unique crop, in northwest Kansas

Fields of growing teff, unique harvesting equipment, and the latest research on the benefits of no-till farming will be showcased at the August 1, Teff Field Day hosted by the Solomon Valley Resource Conservation and Development (RC&D) Area and the Kansas Black Farmers Association. The Teff Field Day will begin at 8:00 a.m. at the Graham County 4-H Building in Hill City when the bus will depart to visit teff fields in Phillips and Graham counties. At the field sites, farmers will share their experiences with growing teff in the first year

of a Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) Conservation Innovation Grant (CIG). Five area farmers currently have nearly 50 acres in production of teff.

A Flail-Vac seed harvester will be demonstrated at the Logan field site and a

comparison of conventional till and no-till seed beds will be featured near Nicodemus.

The bus will return to the Graham County Fairgrounds for a free, catered noon meal and presentations. Featured speaker for the event is Dr. Merle Vigil,

Soil Scientist with the Agricultural Research Service in Akron, Colorado. Dr. Vigil will share recent findings of the effects of different no-till crop rotations on soil nutrients.

Sweet corn makes its annual return

LAWRENCE (AP) — Sweet corn — it is the taste of summer.

Its appearance signals the true beginning of the nostalgic happenings of the season — backyard barbecues, pool parties and 90-degree heat.

Its disappearance by mid-August means it's time for the kids to go back-to-school shopping and cooler weather is around the corner.

"It's a rite of summer," says Connie Landes as she picked up six ears from Peters Family Farm at Thursday's Lawrence Farmers' Market. "This time of the year, you wait for this all year long, because the only time it's really that good is in the summertime."

The highly anticipated summer vegetable made its appearance as a local product of Douglas County at the beginning of the month, and now most growers are finally ready to get a glut of ears, just in time for the high heat of mid-July.

Nancy Ross of Bismarck Gardens in North Lawrence says she'll look out her window and see cars slowly driving past the Bismarck Gardens building, located behind her house. Regulars know Bismarck opens when the sweet corn is ready, and they're not shy about showing their anticipation.

"A lot of people come out and just see, and I know a lot of people just drive by the road right there and they call," Ross says. "I don't mind them calling."

For Ted Grinter of Grinter Farms, the calls start with snow still on the ground.

"I've had people ask about it back in January," Grinter says.

The persistence is for good reason, says Nancy O'Connor, director of education and outreach at the Community Mercantile in Lawrence. O'Connor says that if a farmer knows his or her crop, the corn is as perfect as it's going to get.

"The job of the farmers is to know when to pick their corn," O'Connor says. "When corn starts to mature, the sugars are converted to starches. And it's less delicious and sweet. So what you really need to do and want to do is pick corn literally at the peak. ... It's mature enough to eat, but not so mature it's starting to get starchy."

O'Connor says there's an old joke that the best way to eat corn on the cob is to bring a pot of boiling water into the field and cook it right there — something Marcia Peters of Peters Family Farm says is nearly true.

"Traditionally, corn has always been viewed as something that is best picked and eaten immediately. We know that it doesn't necessarily hold up to storage and shipping very well, usually tastes best from the patch," Peters says. "They do try to breed it now, so that it'll hold up to stor-

age, but still, corn is something that is just best — corn and tomatoes are best — as close to home as you can get them."

To enjoy that flavor, there are a number of ways to cook your precious ears — boiled, steamed, grilled or microwaved. Everyone has their own cooking method, but once the corn is piping hot and ready to eat, the healthful summer treat can easily turn into a tasty caloric nightmare as quick as you can say "pass the butter."

"Corn is a vehicle for butter," O'Connor says, likening it to a salad that becomes a vehicle for dressing. "What I say to people is, a lot of our eating habits are just that, they're habits and they're learned. And most people,

me included, when I have fresh sweet corn, my immediate reaction is to do that, to want to roll it around in butter. If it's a modest amount, that's OK. But if we eat a healthy salad and it becomes a vehicle for 30 grams of fat from ranch dressing, then we're kind of undermining what we're doing."

She suggests trying a row of corn before drowning it in a little glass butter trough, just to get a sense of the sweet local flavor.

Can do without the butter, but need a little salt to go with the corn's sweetness? O'Connor suggests looking beyond traditional table salt and being creative. She has a "far out" suggestion on how to get that salty taste without

needing the butter to keep the salt in place — umeboshi plums. The pickled Japanese condiment can add a salty sheen to your ear of corn.

"If you're trying to cut down on butter, but you need your salt to stick to your ear of corn, you can take one of these little umeboshi plums and just rub it up and down on the ear of corn and the paste from the plums sticks on the corn, so you get your little bit of salt, but you didn't have to use as butter," O'Connor says.

Buttered, peppered, salted or plain, sweet corn is ready to be enjoyed or frozen for a bit of summer late in the year, and shopper Landes and her clan couldn't be happier.

Block grant funds topic of July 29 meeting hosted by ag, commerce departments

The Kansas Department of Agriculture and the agriculture marketing division of the Kansas Department of Commerce will co-host a meeting at 1 p.m. Tuesday, July 29, to discuss how Kansas will award grants from two allocations the state will receive from USDA's specialty crop block grant program. The meeting is in the fourth floor meeting room of the Kansas Department of Agriculture, 109 SW 9th Street, Topeka.

Kansas already expected to receive \$104,504.80, in federal fiscal year 2009 as a result of the Specialty Crops Competitiveness Act of 2004 passed by Congress and authorized the U.S. Department of Agriculture to provide state assistance for specialty crops to enhance their competitiveness.

Specialty crops under

this allocation are defined as fruits and vegetables, tree nuts, dried fruits and nursery crops, including floriculture. Grants will be awarded for projects that enhance the competitiveness of specialty crops, such as through research, promotion, marketing, nutrition, food safety and security, plant health, education, "buy local" programs, addressing environmental concerns and developing cooperatives. Grant applications for this allocation are due Dec. 5, and awards will be announced in February.

The second allocation Kansas will receive is due to a provision in this year's farm bill, the Food, Conservation and Energy Act of 2008, which appropriated an additional \$10 million for the grant program for federal fiscal year 2008.

Kansas' share is \$106,240, and the deadline to apply is earlier — Aug. 15.

Specialty crops under this allocation include horticulture, including turfgrass sod and turfgrass sod seed, as well as fruits and vegetables, tree nuts, dried fruits, nursery crops and floriculture. Grants will be awarded for projects involving research, nutrition, trade enhancement, food safety and security, pest and disease, education, "buy local" programs, promotion, marketing, more efficient and cost-effective distribution systems, environmental and conservation concerns, product development and developing cooperatives.


Grant applications for this allocation are due Aug. 15, and awards will be announced in October. The grants are open to commissions, public entities, and associations and/or non-profit organizations that represent Kansas specialty agriculture and food producers. Applicants must be a legal entity and have the legal capacity to contract. Applicants also are strongly encouraged to provide a

cash match for their projects.

Grant applications will be reviewed by staff from the Kansas Department of Agriculture and the Kansas Department of Commerce, as well as by an advisory committee established specifically to review the proposals. Kansas Sec-

retary of Agriculture Adrian Polansky will make the final awards based on his own review the applications and feedback he receives from reviewers.

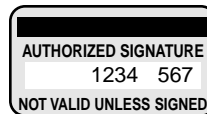

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

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K-State economist sees beef output cuts if production costs remain high

Soaring grain, oilseed and land prices helped bolster some rural Americans' incomes over the past year, but livestock producers have not reaped such gains.

"Feed is the largest single cost item for livestock and poultry production — accounting for 60 to 70 percent of the total cost in most years," said Kansas State University agricultural economist James Mintert. "Although energy, labor and other inputs have increased over the last two years, feed costs have jumped 40 to 60 percent, depending on whether a producer is feeding swine, cattle or poultry."

Mintert, who is a livestock marketing economist for K-State Research and Extension, said corn prices at Omaha, for example, averaged \$5.44 a bushel for the January-June 2008 period — a \$3.44 or 173 percent increase over the \$1.99 per bushel average set in January-June 2006. Plus, peak cash corn prices topped \$7 a bushel this year in late June and early July.

"The rising costs of production have largely been absorbed by livestock producers so far, but that cannot continue indefinitely," he said. "Ultimately, higher

prices throughout the marketing chain will be required to offset the large increase in production costs."

The beef industry is feeling the pinch just like all livestock sectors.

A monthly survey of feedlots conducted by K-State's Department of Animal Sciences and Industry indicated that the cost of feeding cattle in commercial feedlots averaged 74 cents per pound in 2007, up from 54 cents in 2006. Preliminary estimates indicate cattle feedlots' costs of gain could average near 85 cents a pound in 2008 — an increase of 58 percent in two years.

Cattle feeding returns estimated at Iowa State University show that cattle feeders experienced the largest loss on record — \$167 per head during February — that producers have had since modern records started being kept in the 1960s.

Similarly, production costs for cow-calf producers have jumped, mostly due to feed costs.

According to the Kansas Farm Management Association, its cow-calf producer members' feed costs rose to \$346 in 2007, up 21 percent from \$287 in 2006.

"Recent feed grain and protein supplement prices, along with a sharp increase in forage production costs, indicate that total feed costs will rise again in 2008, likely exceeding \$400 per cow," Mintert said. "That would be an increase of 40 percent or more in just two years."

The KFMA data indicates that returns for Kansas beef cow-calf operations still exceeded production costs in 2007 by about \$50 per cow. But, the overall anticipated rise in feed costs during 2008 "will almost certainly push returns below variable production costs," Mintert said.

That, he said, will spark herd reductions and encourage some producers to exit the industry.

"It's important to note that the losses experienced in the cattle sector were not associated with large cattle price declines," Mintert said. "In fact, prices for market-ready cattle in Kansas were record-high in 2007, averaging \$93 per hundredweight (cwt) or 8 percent higher than in 2006. So, the reduced profitability was directly attributable to rising costs, especially feed costs."

Higher beef prices from

stronger U.S. demand seem unlikely over the next few years. Beef demand has been weakening somewhat since 2004, Mintert said.

"Consumers' disposable income is a major determinant of their demand for beef. Slow or even negative growth in the U.S. economy during 2008 and 2009 will mean little likelihood in the short run for an increase in domestic beef demand," he said.

A bright spot in the beef outlook is that export demand has improved since plummeting in 2004, following the report of the first U.S. case of bovine spongiform encephalopathy (BSE). During January-May 2008, for example, U.S. beef exports to all destinations were 32 percent larger than during the same five-month span in 2007.

Even so, exports still are not close to where they

were prior to the BSE discovery, Mintert said. He cited data showing that U.S. beef exports during the first five months of 2008 were 34 percent below the exports for that same period in 2003.

"Based on the trend established early this year, U.S. beef exports in 2008 could total 6 to 7 percent of beef production — which effectively reduces the supply of beef available in the domestic market and hence supports beef and cattle prices," he said.

Added to current exchange rates, that will continue to boost U.S. beef exports and discourage imports, but it's unlikely to be enough to offset the dramatic rise in production costs.

"If beef demand — especially export demand — does not increase enough to boost beef and cattle prices high enough to offset the

rise in production costs, the industry will shrink in size to the point that fewer pounds of beef are marketed to U.S. and international consumers," the K-State economist said. "The magnitude of the supply shift will depend on how rapidly beef exports recover and on whether feed grain prices continue to increase or they stabilize at current levels."

Mintert noted that some U.S. beef herd reduction was already under way in 2007, with the beef cow herd down about 1 percent. Slaughter data through early July 2008 also suggests that liquidation is under way and, in fact, may have accelerated since January.

"Looking ahead, the U.S. beef industry could be facing several more years of herd reduction before prices rise sufficiently to offset the new production cost regime," he said.

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Court releases CRP acres

A district court ruled last Thursday, July 24, to lift a temporary restraining order (TRO) preventing haying and grazing on 24 million acres of Conservation Reserve Program (CRP) land, according to the National Cattlemen's Beef Association (NCBA).

The ruling was issued in response to legal action taken by the National

Wildlife Federation (NWF) to contest the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) decision to allow haying and grazing on 24 million acres of CRP ground.

According to NCBA, Judge John C. Coughenour of the United States District Court, Western District of Washington in Seattle, ruled that there will be no cap on eligible acres for

haying and grazing, and producers whose contracts had already been modified and approved for critical feed use can immediately proceed with haying and grazing and continue through Nov. 10, 2008, as originally announced by USDA.

All applications to hay or graze CRP acres that were filed but not approved

before the July 8, 2008, restraining order will now be processed, and producers will be subject to shorter usage periods. The haying period will end on Sept. 30 while the grazing period will end on Oct. 15. Additionally, producers who can document a re-

liance on the critical feed usage program as well as an investment of more than \$4,500 to prepare for haying and grazing of CRP acres are eligible to submit new applications. NCBA was among a coalition farmers and ranchers that filed an amici curiae brief in sup-

port of USDA's decision to allow for haying and grazing.

The National Farmer's Union (NFU) released a statement also voicing its approval. NFU President Tom Buis called it a fair resolution to a difficult situation.

Brush and pasture management field day coming in August

Dealing with unwanted trees and brush in pastures is a problem many face with little enthusiasm. However, there are a number of ways to treat this type of vegetation, through the use of herbicides, brush cutters, fire or combination thereof.

The Osage, Franklin, Douglas and Miami County Extension Councils have teamed with WIBW Radio to highlight numerous brush control and pasture management options. A field day is set for Thursday, August 28, 2008, beginning at 3:00 p.m. with registration and concluding at 1 1/2 miles east of the I-35/K-68 Junction at Ottawa on Highway K68, on the north side of the road.

In addition to brush control, producers will hear South East Area Extension Specialists talk about: pasture weed control; cool season grass fertility; seeding legumes into cool season pastures; stocking rates and other grazing management tools. A grass exclusion with fertility plots will be a highlight of the pasture management discussions.

Twenty-one brush plots will feature different brush control methods and chemical applications — including cut stump, basal

bark, and foliar treatments. Following a hamburger meal at 6:00 p.m. there will be a demonstration of brush control equipment including shears, tree saws, etc.

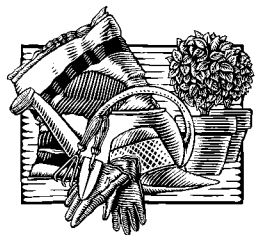

Yard & Garden Tips

Harvesting Your Vegetables

People have different gardening interests. I know of a gardening team where one likes the planting, another one the nurturing stage and another one the harvesting. They each have their part in gardening. I like the first two parts. For some reason, I have to push myself to harvest.

The Irish potatoes are done growing. They need to be dug so they don't rot in the ground. Remove the dirt from them. Let them dry to toughen the skin for a week in a well ventilated place. Then keep them in a dark and cool place until used. Use the smaller potatoes first since the larger will keep longer.

Some crops need regular harvesting to keep them actively producing. Summer squash, tomatoes and cucumbers are more productive when the fruit is regularly removed. This

keeps the plants in a state of flowering instead of thinking it is done for the season.

Tomatoes are best harvested when they start to turn color. At this point, they have everything they are going to get from the mother plant. Harvesting at this time prevents potential of cracking, fruit rots, a hail storm, insect feeding or other causes that could damage the fruit. Coloring is best when the fruit is where the temperature is below 95 which usually means in the house.

Watermelon harvest is fairly straightforward. On many varieties, the tendrils across from the fruit stem usually dries up at maturity. In the field, the underside of the fruit turns from a white color to yellow. This is also the best factor for purchasing a store

bought watermelon. If thumping works for you than keep it up.

Muskmelon or cantaloupe will slip or fall off the vine when mature. It is harder to figure out with a honeydew melon. Hopefully, you can get close by determining the days to maturity from the seed or plant label. Good luck because

these don't slip when ready.

There are several resources to help with harvest and storage of produce. The publication "Harvest and Storage of Fruits and Vegetables" is available from the office or on the website. Stupid On Steroids

The decision to locate the Bio-Research lab of highly contagious animal diseases on Plum Island, N.Y. over 50 years ago was based on a sound scientific reason, safety. It was remote and far from livestock when the inevitable accident happened. The G.A.O. and several congresspersons have slowly pried information out of the administration that confirms a series of accidents; one where foot-and-mouth disease was released into the cattle holding pens on Plum Island.

Why are our elected officials in Washington, D.C. willing to ante up their

Kansas constituents and our livestock industry as pawns in their political poker games?

Is the student body mere disposable chattels, to a college administration, bent on securing this dangerous facility?

Kansas Farm Bureau's support of this lethal misadventure makes one question what type "grass" their much vaunted grassroots policy is being derived from?

I steadfastly refuse to believe the two most rampant rumors; that the vegan movement promotes this more in hopes of an accident, crippling or destroying the U.S. livestock industry; or that the East Coast elite were so frightened by the Ebola virus mistake and near-miss, that they want all dangerous research moved to the less populated Midwest. Whatever the reason we need not invite terrorists into the heartland with a target.

Human brains capable of reason and plain old common sense should tell us none of the five proposed new locations are safe for the horrifically dangerous research being conducted at a Level 4 facility. This is not K-State versus four other locations, winner take all. This is safety versus insanity. Plum Island has over 800 acres and new facilities, if necessary, should be constructed at that safe location.

Call, write, holler or shout; but at least do something to prevent this human or economic potential tragedy from an already stressed nation.

Bad Decision

I am writing this letter to express my strong opposition to the location of the NBAF facility in Manhattan. Everyone agrees that re-

search and counter measures on foreign animal disease are vitally important. With the potential of a release however, there are many reasons why the facility should not be located here in the center of the United State in the heart of livestock country,

One of the diseases to be studied at NBAF is foot and mouth disease (FMD) which effects all cloven-footed animals including cattle, swine, sheep, bison, elk and deer.

In the UK, a FMD outbreak in 2001 resulted in over \$10 billion in losses to tourism and the agriculture sector and the slaughter of over four million animals. Another outbreak occurred in England in 2007 which was apparently caused by a drainage leak from a research facility. Estimates of direct costs of a similar outbreak in the U.S. run as high as \$24 billion, with the destruction of about 13 million animals. Global trading partner ban on imports from a single case of FMD could result in losses between \$6 and \$10 billion per year until the problems were eliminated. USDA estimates that an FMD outbreak could spread to 25 states in as little as five days.

According to the CDC, nearly 70% of human infectious disease episodes during a ten year period in the U.S. were attributed to zoonotic pathogens — those transferred from animals to people.

Two diseases that are zoonotic to be studied in this facility are rift valley fever virus (RVFV) and Nipah. According to information on the Internet, Nipah has about a fifty percent mortality rate for humans with no known vaccine or therapy.

If an accidental or deliberate zoonotic pathogen release occurred at this facility, would there be a human

quarantine? The environmental impact study — EIS June 2008 deals extensively with accident scenarios involving the release of pathogens, their effect on workers, the public and the environment.

A release of pathogens could affect the deer population and negatively impact the hunting industry. Likewise, deer could help establish the disease in the environment.

Advocates of locating the NBAF in Manhattan will tell you how safe this will be. As we are all aware from the June tornado, acts of God do the unimaginable. Will this site be built to withstand an EF5 tornado similar to the one that destroyed Greensburg?

How do we account for every scenario dealing with the potential of accident, or deliberate human release of pathogens?

The worst-case scenarios, while improbable, are a reality of life. They said the Titanic was unsinkable. Any release could affect not only the livestock industry but the entire community. What we stand to gain as individual's, as a community, or by Kansas should not be leveraged in light of what we risk.

It is difficult to understand how anyone who has really considered the implication could ever want to put this facility in the heartland. The jobs and dollars to the local economy are not worth the risk.

This facility should be built, but it should be built on Plum Island, New York which is owned by the DHS, has infrastructure already in place and affords more protection to animals and humans due to its location.

The objective of this facility should be to protect people and animals, not put them in jeopardy.

The information I've included was obtained from the DHS Environmental Impact Study dated June 2008.

Farmers and ranchers concerned about this potential threat to their livelihood should make their opinions heard at the KSU Union on July 31, 2008 when the DHS will hold two public hearings from 12:30-4:30 p.m. and in the evening from 6-10 p.m.
