

## The NATIONAL REGISTER in ILLINOIS means PRESERVATION OF

Places important in America's past which are relatively unchanged. Demonstrate high architectural quality. Where significant events occurred or significant people lived and worked, and Where an investigation of the remains will probably increase our understanding of the past.

These places can include homes, offices, barns, dams, statues, farms, bridges, districts, and Indian villages and mounds.

#### BY

- 1. STOPPING the DAMAGE OR DESTRUCTION of such places by projects funded or licensed BY THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT in order to arrange plans to save or minimize the damage to National Register places. This DOES NOT affect projects funded with private money. The owner of a property on the National Register is not stopped from doing whatever he wants with his property unless the prospective development relies on federal funds or a federal license.
- Providing GRANTS-IN-AID helping to finance the development or, in some cases the purchase of National Register places. This money is reimbursable up to 50 percent for projects selected on the basis of worthiness.

- Offering GOVERNMENT GUARANTEED LOANS encouraging the rehabilitation of certain National Register places.

# HOW A PLACE GETS LISTED ON THE NATIONAL REGISTER

Supposing a place is suitable for the National Register, the following six steps must occur in order for a place to be listed:

- 1. The applicant provides information about the place to the Department of Conservation;
- 2. The Department of Conservation reviews the


information and advises the applicant to prepare a nomination form;

- The applicant prepares a National Register nomination form and submits it to the Department of Conservation;
- The board examines the nomination form and advises nomination;
- The Director of the Department of Conservation considers the advice and nominates the place; and
- The National Register office in Washington considers the place and lists the place in the National Register.

A more complete description of the process is given below.

#### HOW LONG DOES IT TAKE A PLACE TO GET LISTED ON THE NATIONAL REGISTER?

About 6 months depending mostly on how quickly the applicant provides a complete and correct nomination form.



# WHAT SHOULD AN APPLICANT DO FIRST TO HAVE A PLACE LISTED?

Decide whether the place satisfies the following criteria for listing. Places that do are districts, sites, buildings, structures, or objects that possess integrity of location, design, setting, materials, workmanship, feeling, and:

- That are associated with events that have made a significant contribution to the patterns of our history; or
- That are associated with the lives of psignificant in our past; or
- That embody the distinctive characteristics of a type, period, or method of construction, or that represent the work of a master, or that possess high artistic values or that represent a significant and distinguishable entity whose components may lack individual distinction; or
- 4. That have yielded, or may be likely to yield, information important in prehistory or history.

# ARE THERE PLACES WHICH CANNOT BE LISTED ON THE NATIONAL REGIST

Yes. Ordinarily cemeteries, birthplaces, or graves of historical figures, properties owned by religious institutions or used for religious purposes, structures that have been moved from their original locations, reconstructed historic buildings, properties primarily commemorative in nature, and properties that have achieved significance within the past 50 years.

# ARE THERE EXCEPTIONS MADE TO THE PLACES WHICH CANNOT BE LISTED THE NATIONAL REGISTER?

Yes. If the places are integral parts of districts that do meet the criteria, or if they fall within the following categories:

- A religious property deriving primary significance from architectural or artistic distinction or historical importance; or
- 2.1A building or structure removed from its original location but which is significant primarily for architectural value, or which is the surviving structure most importantly associated with a historic person or event; or

- A birthplace or grave of a historic figure of outstanding importance if there is no other appropriate site or building directly associated with his productive life; or
- A cemetery which derives its primary significance from graves of persons of transcendent importance from age, from distinctive design features, or from association with historic events; or
- A reconstructed building when accurately executed in a suitable environment and presented in a dignified manner as part of a restoration master plan, and when no other building or structure with the same association has survived; or
- A property primarily commemorative in intent if design, age, tradition, or symbolic value has invested it with its own historical significance; or
- A property achieving significance within the past 50 years if it is of exceptional importance.

# A STEP-BY-STEP DESCRIPTION OF THE LISTING PROCESS:

#### PRELIMINARY REVIEW

The process can be initiated by any individual or organization. Generally, the process is triggered when an applicant requests nomination forms or asks if a place is suitable for listing. In an attempt to save the applicant both time and effort, the Department of Conservation (DOC) will request photographs showing different views of the place as it exists today. The photographs can be taken with any camera and, at this stage of the review, can be either color or black and white and be no smaller than 3" x 3". The statement of significance should include an explanation of the place's importance, the date of construction, and the dates and description of the major physical changes to the place since it was built.

When this information is received, the place will be evaluated, and DOC will advise the applicant of whether the place satisfies the criteria for listing and whether the applicant should make the effort to prepare a nomination form. If the applicant is advised that the place satisfies the criteria, the applicant will receive a nomination form and instructions for its preparation. If the

applicant is advised that the place does not satisfy the criteria, the applicant will be notified. Despite this advice, the applicant is free to pursue the listing, and upon request, will receive a nomination form and instructions for its preparation.


#### PREPARATION OF THE NOMINATION FORM

The applicant must return a complete form including maps and photographs to DOC. If the form is incomplete or the information insufficient, DOC will explain to the applicant what is required. The applicant is responsible for providing any missing material and any necessary retyping of the form.

#### CONSIDERATION BY THE REVIEW BOARD

When a complete and correct form is received, it will be scheduled for consideration by the review board. There are deadlines for the receipt of these forms by DOC. Do not assume that your complete and correct form will be placed on the agenda of the next review board meeting. A fair, efficient, and legal processing of these forms necessitates these deadlines. Be sure you know the receipt deadlines of a form for the next review board meeting.

The owner of the property and the appropriate local government are notified of the review board's pending consideration and are given at least 30 days before the review board's meeting to comment on the consideration of the place for the National Register. Interested parties may also appear at the review board's meeting to comment. The length of presentations in person can be limited by the chairman of the review board. In cases where it is impractical to notify owners individually (usually historic districts) owners will be given general notice by means of a legal notice in an appropriate local newspaper.




The review board is the Illinois Historic Sites Advisory Council. It is comprised of 15 voting members appointed by the Director of DOC and 3 ex-officio members. These members are qualified by their professional or civic involvement with historic preservation. The Council meets at least 4 times a year. An applicant will be notified by the DOC of the Council's action and the reasons for the action on the nomination form. If the Council advises against nomination, the applicant must wait at least one year from the date of the Council's decision and submit new information justifying the place's further consideration by the Council.

#### NOMINATION OF A PLACE


If the Council advises nomination, the nomination form is forwarded to the Director of the DOC (the designated State Historic Preservation Officer for Illinois). The nomination of a place to the National Register occurs only when the Director of the DOC signs the nomination form.

#### FINAL STEP-LISTING A PLACE

After the place has been nominated, the nomination form signed by the Director of the DOC




Eads Bridge across the Mississippi River



is sent to: Keeper of the National Register, Washington, D.C. 20240—(202) 523-5483. The owner of the place will be given an opportunity to comment on the listing. If the National Register approves the nomination, the place is listed on the National Register of Historic Places.

# THE PROTECTION OF NATIONAL REGISTER PLACES THAT ARE LISTED

The Historic Preservation Act, section 106, pides that any federally financed, licensed, assisted project which will damage a Nation-Register place or its environment can be halted in order to provide time to examine and, hopefully, arrange for alternative plans which will minimize or avoid the damage. The resulting "stay of execution" does not insure that the place will be preserved; the original plan may have to be permitted for the public good. Every federal project affecting a National Register place in Illinois is reviewed by Illinois' Department of Conservation in order to protect Register places. Contact this office if you have a question about the protection of a place.

Public Health Nursing is a term applied to all afforts to prevent premature death and disease and prolong life of the population. Immunization of the children of Kankakee County is one affort to prevent disease and death.

The State of Illinois hes iesued reguletions regerding immunization requirements. It is the responsibility of the Kenkekee County Nurses to strive to prevent and control veccine preventeble diseases such as Diphtheria, Tatanus, Typhoid, Polio, Measlas, Mumps and Rubella. We must establish a system to maintain a 90% level of immunizations in Kankakee County. It may be of interest to know Kankakee County school children are 98% immunized.

The policy of dispensing vaccine hes been changed. In the pest the vaccine was supplied free of charge to the physicians, by the Illinois Department of Public Health. Now the physicians must purchase their vaccine on a private basis.

#### CLINIC SERVICES

- D.S.C.C. General Clinic for children with physical handicaps, ages 0 through 21.
- 2. D.S.C.C. Cardiec Clinic for children O through 21 with actuel or presumptive Cardiac Disorders.
- 3. D.S.C.C. Epilepsy Clinic-Neurological essessment and treatment of children with apilepsy ages O through 21.
- 4. D.S.C.C. Arthritis Clinic eges O through 21.
- 5. Public Heelth Clinic-Diegnosis end treatment of sexuelly trensmitted diseases.

#### COMMUNITY SERVICES

In eddition to direct petient services, end education the Nurses provide numerous community services, among these services ere counseling, ecting es e liaison to various community groups, elso Federel, State and Local egencies, Doctor's end Dentists, achool administrators end perents end students.

Services include essisting the County Medicel and Dentel Societies with Community projects, referring their petients to hospitels, egencies, or situetions where they may obtain help for their problems.

The County Nurses serve on various boards of directors, nemely, Kenkekee County Mental Heelth Board, Personnel Committee of Kenkekee County Mental Health and the Alcohol advisery committee of the Kenkekee County Mental Health Board, 708 Board, Poison Control advisory Board at St. Mery's Hospitel, Advisory Board for Olivet College School of Nursing.

The County Nurses Office has played e lerge role in assisting students in learning Public Health Nursing es well as School Nursing. We have essisted many students with research papers. In order to gain public health experience students are given femilies to counsel.

School Nurses in the community request the County Nurses to assist them with major problems in their schools for example mass screening for head lice, scabies and ringworm and immunization programs.

The County Nurses maintain records for the School Nurses in the County while the schools are closed for vacation also referring their patients on for care during the summer.

The County Nurses are the local liaison for all departments of the State Department of Public Health, however, due to a cut in State Health Department personel, the burden of many of the duties originally provided by the State, such as syphilis follow-up have become the responsibility of the Nurses Office.

The Nurses assist in containing cases of infection & contagious diseases, food borne illnesses, this is accompanied by intense investigation and case identification, laboratory testing and cooperating with the family physician. These results as well as weekly disease reporting from the schools and physicians are tallied and forwarded to the State Health Department. Great effort has been made to instruct families in proper hygiene and immunization procedures. This past year we have handled 8 Hepatitis, 7 Meningitis, 1 Reyes Syndrome, 50 Salmonella, 20 Shigellosis and many other childhood diseases.

The Nursas Office has been asked by the Department of Public Health to assist in the identification of all Sudden Infant Deaths. The State feels home visits by a Public Health Nurse might help find a common cause for SID. They are asking us to make a home visit to the family, be a listener and act in the role of a counselor and report to the State Department of Public Health. This year we have counseled 2 S.I.D. families.

Perinatal Program—This program consists of follow—up care of premature babies, who have been in the State Perinatal Centers and are residents of Kankakee County. We are notified when the baby arrives at the Center in order that a pre-discharge visit can be made in the home. This visit is made to assist the mother with plans for the babies home coming and also to observe the conditions of the home and competency of the parents. If the home is in a rural area where Public Water supply is not available a water sample is sent to the State for analysis. Following the babies discharge from the Center home visits are made the first 18 months and a raport of the Child's development, home condition, etc., are sent to the State.

The County Nurses Office has put forth an all out effort in cooperation with the Kankakae County Medical Society and Illinois Department of Public Health to assist in a Sexually transmitted disease control program. Active cases of gonorrhea and syphilis are raported by the physician to the State Health Dept. or the County Nurses Office. It is our duty to find the Patient's contacts and to encourage them to aeek medical advice and follow up treatment. This program also includes considerable health education, especially to the youth of the county. There is a joint agraement between the Kankakee County Board, St. Mary's Hospital and the Department of Public Health to establish a sexually transmitted disease clinic to be held at St. Mary's Hospital and to be staffed by personnel from St. Mary's Hospital and the Kankakee County Nurses Office. The County shall confirm adequate treatment for all persons with positive tests for Gonorrhea and eyphilie. We have had a total of 52 Clinics and have seen 1017 people at our clinics and have interviewed 2100 patients and contacts. 274 patients were

The Division of Services for Crippled Children is a Stete Agency that provides care for approximately 700 Kankakee County children at all times. This egency essumes care for orthopedic conditions, rheumatic fever, and heart disease, conditions of the nervous system, such as cerebral palsy, epilepsy, congenitel defects such as cleft lip and palate, hearing loss (hearing aid and complete hearing evaluation) also children needing plastic surgery following burns, injury, birth defects, etc. As the liaison between this service and the patient, the County Nurses complete all records, help arrange all clinic and surgical appointments for these patients and service the general, cardiac and epilepsy and Arthritis clinics.

#### SCHOOL HEALTH PROGRAMS

The County Nurses plen and execute the school heelth programs in 34 schools. They work with the Superintendents, Principals, Teachers, Students, Parents end the Department of Special Education for better health for school children in Kankekee County.

Heelth records were maintained on all the children in the 34 schools under the supervision of the County Nurses Office. These schools have a population of epproximetely 8,000 students. These health records ere reviewed, recorded end placed in the child's permanent school file. All defects are followed up. We have a universal health cerd for the entire State of Illinois.

This yeer children in grades Kindergarten, 1, 2, 3, 5, 7, 9 end 11 were ecreened for heering defects. A total of 4688 were tested, 146 were retested in two weeks. Of the 146 retested 39 were referred to a Doctor.

This year 4159 children in Kindergerten end gredes 1, 3, 5, 9 end 11 were screened for visual defects. 237 students failed the screening end were referred to their physician. 798 children were alreedy wearing glasses. 525 were screened for color defect end 23 of these failed.

The County Nurses Office heve essisted the schools with problems of contegion, senitation, the child with emotional or physical problems and essisting these femilies needing help in plenning for necessary care.

Fluoride Dental Program—An application of topical fluoride gel was offered to the school children in grades 2, 5 and 8. 2220 children received this treatment. This program is offered through the cooperation of the Kenkakee Dental Society, the schools and nurses.

The State of Illinois has emended the School code Section 27-81. The statute clerified and strengthened the immunization and health examination requirements. This statute applies to ell public, private end perochiel schools. Any child feiling to meet the Section 27-81 requirements by Oct. 15 shall be excluded by local attendance center authorities, unless there is a medical contraindication which must be accompanied by a written statement from the child's physician. The immunization status of each school is monitored by the County Nurses staff. We are anticipating immunization clinics in the near future to help these children to comply with this statute. Kankekee County Schools ere 98%

In the fall of 1981 the Kankekee County Nurses steffed free immunization clinics in the schools. The total children immunized in these clinics was 755. All of this extended effort made the Kankekee County Schools 98% in compliance with the State Law.

#### CONCLUSIONS

The County Nurses Office wish to express their sincere eppreciation to the Kenkakee County Board, especially the Heelth and Welfere Committee, County Medical and Dental Societies, The Elks Club, Lions Club, Exchange Club, Momence Lions Club, Rotary Club, Merch of Dimes, Catholic Charities, Women of

the B'nai Israel, St. Mary's Hospital, The Hamilton Foundation, Kankakee Medical Auxillary, all Federal, State and County Agencies. The County Nurses also wish to thank the nurses and mothers who donated their time to different programs in the schools. Without their generous assistance many of the programs would be impossible.



# Resolution of the County Board of Kankakee County, Illinois

WHEREAS, Salina Township residents and elected public officials have expressed concern as to the capacity for the Township to provide and/or extend services in said Township to meet existing demand and anticipated residential growth, and

WHEREAS, said concerns have been transmitted to the Planning and Zoning Committee of the County Board, such Committee being the responsible agent to address land use matters and related issues; and

whereas, existing soil conditions in certain areas of the Town-ship indicate severe limitations for residential use, specifically in terms of use of private sewage disposal systems, high potential for erosion and siltation to occur during construction periods, contamination of potable water sources due to seasonal high water table levels, and a high probability of foundations, slabs, walks, and streets subject to cracking and heaving due to the effects of frost heave and other weathering conditions; and

WHEREAS, analysis by the Planning Department of existing soil and drainage conditions and apparent land use activity in the Township has verified certain of these complaints and concerns expressed; and

WHEREAS, on-site inspections made by planning and building personnel have indicated land development occurring of a non-agricultural nature in agriculturally zoned areas contrary to existing land use policies and regulations designed to insure and protect the general health, safety, and welfare of area residents.

### SECTION I

MOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by this Board that any area which would become a hazard to public health by allowing subdivision of land for building purposes, construction of dwelling units, placement of mobile homes, or installation of private sewage disposal systems should not be subdivided, built upon or be approved for the placement of a mobile home

or installation of private sewage disposal systems.

EE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that since these problems are pronounced in the Salina Township area of the County, that this Board declares that further subdivision of land, issuance of building permits, placement of mobile homes, and installation of private sewage disposal systems in Salina Township shall be suspended for a temporary six (6) month period of time in the best interests of the health and welfare of the area residents.

#### SECTION II

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that individual exceptions be granted as to areas in said Township which are clearly free of such conditions in the opinion of the Planning and Zoning Committee which shall serve as the responsible County agent designated to review exception requests.

### SECTION III

That said moratorium be in full force and effect upon passage.
